

Understanding Your Device




Screen in lid: The screen of your device is contained in the lid. To expose the keyboard, the lid must be moved up. Apply light pressure with your thumbs to the bottom of the device until you hear the lid move past the catch. Continue pushing the lid until you hear a snap, indicating that the lid can go no further.

Microphone: The microphone is located at the upper right corner of the top of the device, just above the key.

Power: The power button is located on the bottom of the device, to the right side of the device.

Understanding Your Device



Speaker: The speaker is located in the upper right corner on the back of your device. For best results, do not cover the speaker.

Headphone Jack: The headphone jack is located on the bottom right side of your device, when looking at the back. The headphone jack is designed for 2.5 mm, 32 ohm impedance stereo headphones. **Caution**: monophonic headphones will not work with this unit.


USB port: The USB port is a standard 5-pin mini-B type port. It is located on the bottom left side of your device, when looking at the back. Plug the provided USB cable into this port to connect your device to your PC when your device is turned on. When your device is turned off, connect your device to your PC to charge its battery. In addition, you can charge your device's rechargeable battery using the provided AC/DC adapter/charger with a USB 5-pin mini-B type connector. Plug the small end into your device and the other end into a power source. The AC/DC adapter requires regulated 5 volts output of at least 500 milliamperes.

Control Wheel: The selection wheel is located on the upper left side of your device, when looking at the back.

Resetting Your Device

If the keyboard fails to respond, or if the screen performs erratically, perform a system reset by following the steps below.

Use a paper clip to gently press the reset button on your unit.
 The reset button is recessed in a pin-sized hole on the back of the unit, below the speaker.



Warning! Pressing the reset button with more than light pressure may permanently disable your product. In addition, resetting the product resets the settings to their default settings and may erase any recently entered data.

Battery Information

Your TGA-495 uses a rechargeable battery of capacity 530 mAH. Battery power lasts for about 1 week of normal translator use or 6 hours of continuous MP3 music play. When you see the low battery warning, please recharge your battery. The first time you use your device, it requires approximately 3 hours of charging before use. Thereafter, your device can take up to 6 hours for a full charge.

Follow these instructions to recharge the battery.

- Find the USB cable or AC adapter included with your device.
- 2. Make sure your device is turned off.
- Plug the wide end of the USB cable into a USB port on your PC and the smaller end of the USB cable into the USB port on your device.

Battery Information

If you are using the AC adapter, plug one end into a power source and the USB end into the USB port on your device. The battery icon is displayed with the power bars filling the battery from right to left. When the battery is completely charged, the battery icon will stay solid. **Note**: It generally takes about 4 hours to completely recharge the battery.

Battery Precautions

- If the device is left unused for a long period of time, the battery may lose its charge. Please recharge the battery following the steps outlined above in order to use your device.
- Rechargeable batteries are only to be charged under adult supervision.

Product Care

Your device is designed to be light, compact and durable. However, it is an electronic device and must be treated carefully. Putting unnecessary pressure on it or striking the device against other objects can cause damage. In order to avoid damage to your device, please:

- Do not drop, crush, bend, or apply excessive force to the device.
- Do not use excessive force when sliding the top of the device up to expose its keyboard. Do not attempt to do remove the top of the device.

Product Care

- Do not expose your device to moisture, extreme temperatures or other adverse conditions. Avoid storing it in damp, humid or wet places. It is not waterproof.
- Clean the device by wiping it with a soft, dry cloth. Do not use harsh chemicals.
- If the device is left unused for a long period of time, the battery may lose its charge. Please recharge the battery following the steps outlined above in order to use your device.

Getting Started

Before you can use your device, the battery must be charged for approximately 3 hours. You can do this by connecting your device to your PC using the provided USB cable or by connecting your device to a power source using the provided AC adapter. For instructions on attaching the device to your computer or a power source, please see "Battery Information" on page 9.

Once your device is charged, turn your device on. The first time you use this translator, and any time you reset your device, you must set the message language. The message language is the language of screen instructions and menu items.

Getting Started

You can select one of the following 12 languages: English, French, German, Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, Polish, Russian, Japanese, Chinese, Arabic, or Turkish. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the language you want and then press —.

After you select the message language, the Settings menu displayed.

Changing the Settings

Your TGA-495 allows you to adjust the volume, adjust the shutoff time, set the clock, turn a key tone on or off, change the device language, adjust the contrast, check your battery life, and view how much memory is available.

1. Press 🖏 .

The Setup menu is displayed with *Volume* highlighted.

 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight Volume, Clock Setup, Device Language, Shutoff Time, Memory, Battery, Contrast or Key Tone.

Volume determines the loudness of the speaker during the playback of translations, phrases, voice memos and songs.

Clock Setup displays the Clock Setup menu and allows you to format your clock.

Changing the Settings

Device Language allows you to change the message language, that is, the language used for all screen instructions and menu items.

Shutoff Time sets how long this translator stays on if you forget to turn it off.

Memory displays how much device memory is available.

device memory is available.

Battery displays how much battery power remains.

Contrast determines how dark or light the screen is.

Key Tone allows you to hear a tone every time you press a key.

3. Press ◀or ▶ to change the current setting to your choice.

Note: When Clock Setup is highlighted, press — to go to the Clock Setup menu and set the clock. Battery and Memory are displayed for your information only and are not settings that can be adjusted.

Setting the Clock

Setting the Clock

1. Press 🕦.

- 2. Use ▼ to highlight Clock
 Setup and then press ←.
 The Clock Setup menu is
 - displayed with *Home City* highlighted.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight Home City, Time, Date, Home City DST, Time Format, Date Format, World City, World City DST, or Time Zone.

Home City determines your home city, that is, the city closest to your own.

Time allows you to set the hour and minutes according to the selected clock format.

Date allows you to set the day, month and year according to

the selected date format.

Home City DST sets whether or not you are currently in Daylight Saving Time.
Time Format determines whether you use a 12 hour or 24 hour clock.
Date Format determines how you display the date.
World City determines your world city.
World City DST sets whether or not your world city is in

Time Zone lets you view the time of various time zones around the world.

Daylight Saving Time.

4. Press ← to see your options.

Setting the Clock

5. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight your choice and then press ← to select it

Note: For the Time and Date settings, press ► to move to the next field. Press ← only when all the fields are set. For Time Zone, press ◀ or ► to move to the previous or next time zone. Press ▼ to view the cities saved in this device that fall within that time zone. Press ← to return to the world map. Press ← to select the time zone you want to set as the clock for your home city.

Using the Main Menu

Your TGA-495 contains a top-level menu to help you find the features contained in your device.

- 1. Press until you cannot go any further.
- The main menu is displayed.
- 2. Press ▼ or ▲ to highlight the feature you want to see and then press → to select it.

 Word Translation goes to the translation input screen.
 - Short Phrases goes to the Categories menu.
 Conversion opens the metric and currency converters.

Using the Main Menu

Clock Mode displays the clock. MP3 opens the MP3 player. Setup opens the Settings menu. Calculator displays the calculator.

Voice Memo opens the list of voice memos.

Alarm opens the alarm set up screen.

Contact List displays the contact list.

Game displays the list of games.

Using the Alarm

- 1. Press © until you see Alarm at the top of the screen.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight Alarm Switch, Clock, Time Setup, or Alarm Mode.

Alarm Switch determines whether the alarm is on or off. Clock allows you to set the

alarm by the home clock or world clock. *Time Setup* allows you to set the

time the alarm is to go off.

Alarm Mode sets whether the alarm is set to go off once or to repeat at the set time every day.

Using the Alarm

- 3. Press ← to see your options.
- 4. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight your choice and then press ← to select it

Setting the Source and Target Languages

The source language is the language in which you enter a word at the translator entry screen. The target language is the language in which you wish to view the translation. The initial source and target languages are assigned when you select a message language. No matter what message language you select, the default source language is English and the default target language is Spanish. To change the source and target languages, do the following.

1. Press 🗎 .

The translation input screen is displayed.

You can also change the source and target languages from the phrases menu. Press 🕞 to go there.

Setting the Source and Target Languages

- 2. Press 🗪.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the source language you want and then press ←.
- 4. Press 🕶.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the target language you want and then press ←.

Note: If you change the target language while a word is typed at the translation entry screen, the translation is automatically displayed in the new target language.

Translating Words

You can use this translator to translate words from a source language to a target language. You can change the source and target languages at any time. Please see "Setting the Source and Target Languages" to learn how.

1. Press (to go to the translator entry screen.

The entry language is your source language.

2. Begin to type a word to look up.

As you type letters, a word list is displayed and the first word in the translator that matches the letters you type will move to the top of the word list. You may not have to type the entire word in order to find the one you want.

Translating Words

Press • to delete letters or press × to clear the input box. You can type accent marks, diacritical marks and capital letters, but they are not needed to find matches. To type accents, first type the letter and then press [abb] repeatedly, until you see the accent you want. To type a punctuation mark, type the letter first then press [vv] repeatedly until you

 When the word you want is on the screen, press ▼ until the word you want is highlighted.

see the one you want.

Or you can continue typing letters until the word is complete and the matching word, if available, is automatically highlighted.

Translating Words

4. Press — to search for the highlighted word.

The message Found: # flashes on the screen, where # indicates the number of matching entries. A list of entries that match the highlighted word is displayed.

 Press ▼ or ▲, if necessary, to highlight the match you want and then press ←.

Press ▶ or ◀ to go to the next or previous match. If there is more than one screen of data, use ▼ to read.

Press □(□) to hear the source word or phrase pronounced. Press □(□) to hear the target word or phrase pronounced.

Translating Words

Note: For Arabic, Chinese, Japanese and Russian a spelling of the word using Roman letters is also included. Press ▼ or ★ to move to the next or previous word.

 Press to return to the translator entry screen and then press to clear the input box and type a new word.

√ Viewing Alternate Forms

If you enter a correct word that is not in the word list, it might be an alternate form of a word. For example, "spoke" is the past tense of the English verb "speak". If you type "spoke" and then press —, the list of entries matching "speak" is

displayed. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the match you want to see and then press ← to see its entry. Press ← to return to the translator entry screen and then press ☒ to clear the input box and type a new word.

✓ Misspelling Words

If you enter a misspelled word or a word not in this translator, you see the message "Near" followed by a list of words similar to the word you typed. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the word you want to see and then press — to see its entry. Press — to return to the translator entry screen and then press ⋉ to clear the input box and type a new word.

Understanding Input Methods

When entering a word in Arabic, Chinese, Japanese, or Russian source language, there are a few differences from the languages with Roman-based alphabets.

For **Arabic**, type letters according to your device's keyboard. Note: Arabic letters are indicated at the upper right of the keys. Because the Arabic alphabet contains more letters than a Roman alphabet, the rest of the letters are located on the math operator keys. Some keys contain two Arabic letters. To enter the second letter. press the key containing that letter, then press the accent key (aaaa) to switch to the second letter. Pressing the accent key again changes the entry back to the first letter on the key.

Understanding Input Methods

- For **Chinese**, type Roman letters to search for words. Your list of results is also displayed using Roman letters. It is only when you select an entry to view that you will see the word written in Chinese. **Note**: For best results, type the entire word at the entry screen. Do not try to find words by entering them character by character.
- For Japanese, type Roman letters. As you type letters, the Japanese characters matching what you type will be displayed at the entry screen. Note: To enter the long vowel character, press ["], use the arrow keys to highlight the character and then press to select it.

Understanding Input Methods

 For Russian, type letters according to your device's keyboard. Note: Russian letters are indicated at the lower right of the keys. Because the Cyrillic alphabet contains more letters than a Roman alphabet, the rest of the letters are located on the math operator keys. Some keys contain two Russian letters. To enter the second letter, press the key containing that letter, then press the accent key ([asas]) to switch to the second letter. Pressing the accent key again changes the entry back to the first letter on the kev.

Translating Phrases

Note: The phrases in this product are listed in the current source language. To find translations of phrases, do the following.

- 1. Press 🕏 .
- 2. Use ▼ or ▲ to move the highlight to the category you want and press — to select it.
- 3. Use ▼ or ▲ to move the highlight to the phrase you want.

You can also search for phrases containing specific words. Once you type a letter, a small input box appears. Finish typing the letters you want, then press

← . The list of matching phrases is displayed. Use ∇ or ▲ to highlight the phrase you

want and then press \leftarrow .

4. Press ← to see the translation

If there is more than one screen of data, use ▼ to read.

Press (□(□)) to hear the source word or phrase pronounced. Press (□(□)) to hear the target word or phrase pronounced.

- Press ➤ or ◀ to go to the previous or next phrase.
- 6. Press to return to the list.

Using the Contact List

This product has a contact list where you can save names, phone numbers and other contact information. The total amount of entries that you can save depends upon the number of characters in each entry and the amount of free memory available in your device. Available memory is shared among MP3 files, Contact List data and yoice memos.

Adding Entries

1. Press 🗁 .

The first time you access the contact list you see the message "No record" because no entries have been saved. Each subsequent time you access the contact list you see the list of entries.

- 2. Press N to add an entry.
- 3. Enter your contact's information.

Using the Contact List

Each name can contain up to 30 characters, including spaces. To delete a character, press ←. Press ★ to clear the current line.

Using the Contact List

Press again to return to lowercase input. In the phone number fields, number input is automatically active.

4. Press ▼ to move to the next field.

Press ▲ to move to the previous field.

- 5. Continue entering information in the available fields.
- 6. Press to save the record. You are asked to confirm the addition. Press Y to add the record or press N to cancel the addition.

Viewing or Editing

1. Press 🗁 .

Your list of entries is displayed in alphabetical order.

- Press ▼ or ▲ to scroll down or up through the list one line at a time or press ▼ or ★ to page down or up through the list.
- 3. Press to view the highlighted entry.
- Press ¥ or ★ to move to the next or previous field if the information you want to view is too long to fit on the screen.
- Press ▲, ▼ or ← to edit the current entry.

6. Make your changes.

To delete a character, press ←.

Press ★ to clear the current line. Press ★ and then the letter to type a capital. Type a letter and then press ★ to add an accent to the letter you just typed. Press ७ to open the symbol menu, use ◀ and ▶ to highlight the symbol you want and then press ★ . Press ♥ or ▶ to move to the next or

▲ to move to the next or previous field.

7. Press ← when done.

You are asked to save your changes. Press **Y** to save your changes or **N** to cancel.

You are asked to confirm the deletion. Press Y to delete the entry or N to cancel the deletion.

Using the Calculator

Making Calculations

- 1. Press until you see the calculator.
- 2. Type a number.

You can type up to 10 digits. To enter a negative number, use **G(+/-)**. To type a decimal point, press **M(.)**.

- 4. Type another number.
- 5. Press ←.

Or press **L(%)** to calculate the percentage.

To repeat the calculation, press

6. Press x to clear the current calculations.

Using the Calculator

Using the Calculator Memory

Try the following equation to practice using the calculator memory: $(32 \times 12) - (8 \times 8) = 320$.

- 1. Press : until you see the calculator.
- Press N(MC) to clear the calculator memory, if necessary.
- 3. Type 32, press ^{x ⋅ s}_s, type 12 and then press ← .
- Press C(M+) to add the result to memory.

M indicates a number is stored in memory.

- 5. Type 8, press [**], type 8 and then press -.
- Press V(M-) to subtract the result from memory.
- Press B(MR) to retrieve the number from memory.
- 8. Press x to clear the current calculations.

Using the Converters

The converter allows you to easily convert measurements and currency.

Making Metric Conversions

- Press

 until you see the converter.
- Press ▼ to highlight the conversion category and then press ←.

If there is a sub-menu, repeat Step 2.

3. Type a number after one of the units.

Press ▼ or ▲ to move between the lines. Press ← to delete a number. To type a decimal point, press M(.).

4. Press 🕕 to convert it.

Press \times to clear the current field.

Making Currency Conversions

- Press

 until you see the converter.
- 2. Press ▼ to highlight Currency and then press ←.

Note: The first time you use the currency converter, you must set the exchange rate.

3. Type an exchange rate in the "Rate" field.

The rate should be in units of the other currency per one unit of the home currency (*n*) other/1 home). For example, to convert between U.S. Dollars and Euro, enter an exchange rate of 1.256. This means that 1.256 U.S. Dollars is the equivalent of 1 Euro.

Press + to delete a number.
To type a decimal point, press
M(.).

- 4. Press ←.
- 5. Type the amount for the home or other currency.

Press ▼ or ▲ to move between the Home and Other fields. Press ← to delete a number. To type a decimal point, press M(.).

6. Press ← to convert it.

Hangman (English)

Hangman (English) selects an English mystery word and challenges you to guess it letter by letter. The letters of the mystery word are hidden by question marks. The number of guesses remaining is indicated by #s.

- 2. Press ▼ or ▲ to highlight

 Hangman (English) and then

 press ← .
- Type a letter you think is in the word.

If you are correct, the letter appears in place of the question mark. If you are wrong, it replaces an # on the screen and another part of the man appears.

- 4. Press to show the word and end the round.
- 5. Press ← to play a new round.

Quiz

Quiz tests your translation skills.

- 1. Press W.
- 2. Press ▼ or ▲ to highlight *Quiz* and then press ←.

A word or phrase appears on the screen.

To change the source language, press ¬, press ¬ or ↑ to highlight the source language you want, and then press ¬. To change the target language, press ¬, press ¬ or ↑ to highlight the target language you want, and then press ¬.

Magic Lottery

Use Magic Lottery to generate a set of numbers based on your criteria.

Set indicates how many numbers you want picked, between 1 and 9. The default is 6. Max indicates the range of numbers from set to max. That

is, there are at least as many possibilities as the amount of numbers you want picked. The default is 49

- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select how many numbers you want in your set and then press ←.
- 4. Press ▲ or ▼ to set your range of numbers.
- 5. Press ← to generate your numbers.

Press — again to generate a new set of numbers using the same criteria. Press — to change the values in *Set* and *Max*

Memory

Memory challenges you to find pairs among the hidden set of cards.

1. Press 💯 .

Playing the Games

- 2. Press ▼ or ▲ to highlight

 Memory and then press ←.
- Use the arrow keys to move to the card you want to flip over.
- 4. Press ←.

The card reveals its value.

5. Use the arrow keys to move to the card you think is its match and press again.

The second card reveals its

The second card reveals its value. If the two cards match they stay revealed. If the two cards do not make a pair, they flip back over.

- 6. Continue flipping cards until you have located all the pairs.
- 7. Once all the pairs are displayed, the next round automatically begins.

Press to return to the list of games.

Keyboard Wiz

Keyboard Wiz challenges you to press a key on the keyboard as fast as the letters cross the screen.

- 1. Press 🍱 .
- 2. Press ▼ or ▲ to highlight Keyboard Wiz and then press

3. Press — when you are ready to begin.

A letter moves across the screen form right to left.

4. Press the corresponding button on the keyboard.

Playing the Games

Continue to press the buttons of the letters as they appear on the screen.

As you press letters, you advance levels and the letters increase their speed. If the letters move across the screen faster than you can press them, you still have time. The letters just pile up on the left side of the screen. However, you must remove letters from the left side of the pile in order to catch up. If the stack of letters gets too long, you lose.

6. Press — to play again.

Press to return to the list of games.

Using Voice Memos

Your TGA-495 contains a voice memo feature where you can record reminders or ideas and play them back later.

Recording a Voice

1. Press 🔍.

The voice memo start screen is displayed.

- Press ← to begin recording.
- Speak your message into the microphone.

The microphone is located above the top right corner of the screen.

4. Press ← to pause the recording.

Using Voice Memos

5. Press ← to save the message.

Or press ► to continue recording.

Note: When there are 15 minutes or less remaining of available memory, a message is displayed to remind you that memory is running out. When time runs out during a recording, the recording will stop and you are asked to save what you have or to delete the recording.

Hearing a Voice Memo

Press \(\exists \).

The list of saved voice memos is displayed.

Press ▼ or ▲ to highlight the memo you want to hear and

Using Voice Memos

then press $\overline{}$.

Press — to stop playback at any time and return to the beginning of the voice memo.

Note: While listening to a voice memo, you cannot access the MP3 player. In order to go to the MP3 player while a voice memo is playing, first press and then press MP3.

While viewing the list of saved voice memos, you can delete a memo to clear memory for new voice memos. Use ▼ or ▲ to highlight the memo you want to delete and then press ☑. Press ← to delete the voice memo or ⊜ to cancel the deletion.

Using the MP3 Player

Your device comes with a built-in MP3 player. Your MP3 songs will continue to play even if you leave the MP3 player to look up a word or perform another function. Press MP3 to open the MP3 player.

√ Adjusting the Volume

You can adjust the volume while playing a song. Press ▲ or ▼ while a song is playing. The volume bar is displayed.
Continue to press ▲ or ▼ until the volume is to your liking.
After a few seconds the volume bar will disappear. You can also use the control wheel to adjust the volume while a track is playing. Simply press the control wheel up or down.

Sorting Your Song List

Ordering Your Playback

You can select how you want to hear the songs saved in your device.

- 2. Press ▶ or ◀ to highlight

 Setting and then press ←.

A menu of playback options is displayed.

Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the option you want.

None sets your MP3 player to play only the selected song. Repeat sets your MP3 player to play all the songs in your device in order and then start from the beginning once they have all been played.

Random sets your MP3 player to randomize the order of all the songs.

Repeat and Random sets your MP3 player to randomize the playback order of all the songs in your device and then start all over once they have all been played.

4. Press — to save your setting.

Deleting a Song

In addition to deleting a song using your computer (see "Saving Songs"), you can delete them using your device.

- 1. Press MP3.
 You see the list of songs.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the song you want to delete.
- Press ► or ◀ to highlight Delete.
- Press to delete the song.
 You are asked to confirm the deletion.
- 5. Press to delete the song or press to cancel the deletion.
