#### Removing the Plastic Cover from the Front Panel

A thin, plastic cover may protect the front panel of your VCR. Before using the VCR, lift a corner of the plastic, then peel it off.

#### Putting Batteries in the Remote Control

**Remove the battery compartment lid** on the bottom of the remote control by sliding it in the direction of the arrow.

Place two AA batteries inside the battery compartment with their + and – ends aligned as indicated.

Replace the battery compartment lid.

#### Using the Remote Control

- Point the remote control at the VCR, then press the VCR button, when using the remote control to operate the VCR.
- Point the remote control at the TV, then press the TV button, when using the remote control to operate the TV.
- Point the remote control at the Cable Box or Direct Broadcast System (DBS), then press the CBL/DBS button, when using the remote control to operate the Cable Box or DBS.

#### **Erasure Prevention**


Video cassette tapes have record tabs to ensure that recordings are not accidentally erased.

To prevent erasure, break off the tab with a screwdriver.


To record again, cover the hole with cellophane tape.

#### VCR maintenance

- Use only tapes with the **VHS** mark.
- Remove any light adhesive stick-on notes from the video cassette tape before putting the tape in the VCR. Removable labels can jam the VCR.
- Periodic maintenance is required to maintain your VCR's excellent performance. This VCR has an Automatic Head Cleaner. However, the video heads will require replacement eventually. Only an authorized service center should perform this service.










### 6 Hookups Without a Cable Box / Direct Broadcast System

The basic VCR/TV connection – antenna/cable to VCR to TV – is shown below. If you have a Cable Box or a Direct Broadcast System, please see pages eight-nine. If you have a Stereo TV, please see page 10. After you hook up the VCR, go to page 11 to turn on the VCR.


#### Disconnect the antenna or cable from your TV.



**Z** Connect the antenna or cable to the ANT(enna) IN Jack of your VCR.




Connect the RF coaxial cable (supplied) to the OUT Jack on the back of the VCR and to the ANTENNA IN Jack on the TV. (You may use either a snap-on type (supplied) or screw-on type of coaxial cable, whichever you prefer.)



Plug in the TV and the VCR.

### 5

Set the CH3/CH4 switch on the back of the VCR to CH3 or CH4, whichever channel is not used or least used in your area. Set the TV to the same channel. For example, when playing a tape, if the CH3/CH4 switch is set to CH3, the TV should be on channel 03.




You are ready to turn on the VCR. Please go to page 11 before turning on the VCR.

### 8 Hookups With a Cable Box / Direct Broadcast System

There are two ways to connect your Cable Box/DBS to the VCR. With this connection:

- You may view any channel.
- You must select channels at the Cable Box/DBS. Channels cannot be changed at the VCR.
- You may not view a channel other than the one you are recording.
- You may not program channels at the VCR.
- You can only program a timer recording for one channel at a time. Set the TV and the VCR to the Cable Box/DBS output channel (channel 03 or 04), and set your Cable Box/DBS to the channel you want to record. When you enter the channel you want to record in a timer recording, select channel 03 or 04 (the Cable Box/DBS output channel). (This is step 5 on page 35.) Leave the Cable Box/DBS on for a timer recording.
- If you use the VCR Plus+ Programming system, set the Cable/TV channel to 03 or 04 (Cable Box/DBS output channel) for every VCR Plus+ channel in the VCR Plus+ Cross Reference Map. You must set the Cable Box/DBS to the channel you want to record; leave the Cable Box/DBS on for the timer recording. Details are on page 39.



#### Connections

Connect a Cable signal to the IN Jack on the Cable Box/DBS.

# 2

Use an RF coaxial cable (supplied) to connect the OUT Jack on the Cable Box/DBS to the ANT(enna) IN Jack on the VCR.

### 3

Use a second RF coaxial cable to connect the OUT Jack on the VCR to the TV's ANTENNA IN Jack.

#### **Recording/Viewing Any Channel**

With the VCR on and in VCR position (the VCR light will appear on the display panel), set the VCR to the Cable Box/DBS output channel (03 or 04).

Set the TV to the same channel to which you set the VCR. Set the CH3/CH4 switch on the VCR to the same channel.


### 3

Select the channel you want to view/record at the Cable Box/DBS.

### Hookups With a Cable Box / Direct Broadcast System (cont'd) 9

With this connection:

- You may watch one channel while recording another.
- You may not record scrambled channels.



#### Connections



Connect a Cable signal to the VCR's ANT(enna) IN Jack.

Use an RF coaxial cable (supplied) to connect the OUT Jack on the VCR to the IN Jack on the Cable Box/DBS.

### 3

Use a second RF coaxial cable to connect the OUT Jack on the Cable Box/DBS to the ANTENNA IN Jack on the TV.

#### **Recording One Channel/Watching Another**

# Put the Cable Box/DBS on the same channel as the VCR's CH3/CH4 switch. Set the TV to the Cable Box/DBS output channel (03 or 04). Then, with the VCR in VCR position (the VCR light will appear on the display panel), use the CH(annel) $\land/\checkmark$ buttons to select the channel you want to record at the VCR. Start the recording.


Press the VCR/TV button once to put the VCR in TV position. (The VCR light will disappear.)

### 3

Select the channel you want to watch at the Cable Box/DBS.

#### Helpful Hint

• When you play a tape, make sure the Cable Box/DBS is set to the same channel as the CH3/CH4 switch on the VCR. Set the TV to the Cable Box/DBS output channel (03 or 04).



• Audio and Video cables are not supplied.

Connect the antenna or cable to the ANT(enna) IN Jack on the back of the VCR.

### 2

Connect a video cable to the yellow VIDEO OUT Jack on the back of the VCR. Then, connect the other end of the video cable to the VIDEO IN Jack on your TV.

### 3

Connect an audio cable to the white AUDIO OUT Jack on the back of the VCR. Then, connect the other end of the audio cable to the AUDIO IN Jack on your TV. (If your TV has Right and Left AUDIO IN Jacks, you must use a "Y" splitter audio cable as illustrated to deliver audio to the TV's right and left channels.)

### 4

**Turn on your TV**, making sure it is in Line Input mode. Please refer to your TV owner's manual for details.

#### Helpful Hint

 This hookup will not give you stereo sound. To get stereo sound, use the connections on pages six - seven and select the channel to be viewed at the TV (with the VCR turned off).

### Turning on Your VCR 11

Before turning on your VCR, make sure there are batteries in the remote control and the VCR and TV are connected correctly.

- Follow the steps on this page only when you plug the VCR power cord into the wall outlet for the first time.
- You can not program channels if you are using a Cable Box or a Direct Broadcast System.
- If you are not using a Cable Box/DBS, the clock may set itself automatically after you connect the antenna/Cable signal to the VCR and plug in the power cord. The time will appear on the display panel.

**Press the VCR button**, then press the POWER button. The VCR light and the PWR. (power) light will appear on the display panel.


Turn on the TV. Set it to the same channel as the CH3/CH4 switch on the back of the VCR. The display shown below will appear. (If the display does not appear, check your hookups, then follow the steps on page 12 to set up channels and page 20 to select a language.)



Within 60 seconds, press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select English or Spanish on-screen displays.


Press the MENU button. The display shown below will appear.



Within 60 seconds, press the CH(annel)  $\blacktriangle$  button to begin automatic channel programming. AUTO CH PRO-GRAMMING IN PROCESS PLEASE WAIT will appear on-screen. The VCR will memorize all available channels. When all channels are programmed, CHANNELS ARE SET will appear on-screen briefly, then TV programming will appear.

Now, when you press the CH(annel)  $\blacktriangle$ / $\checkmark$  button, you'll only scan through channels that you receive.


Turn on the TV.



- To skip this feature and play a tape immediately, insert a tape with its record tab removed. Or, to skip step 3, press the MENU button. All onscreen displays will be in English. To skip step 5, press the STOP/▼ button. Channels will not be programmed, and CHANNELS NOT SET will appear on-screen.
- When you turn on the VCR again later, you may see a message regarding AUTO CLOCK. Details are on pages 15-18.
- If you try to program channels when there is no antenna or cable connected to the VCR, programming will appear to take place, but eventually a NO TV SIGNALS message will appear. Connect an antenna or cable to the VCR's ANT(enna) IN Jack and press the CH(annel) ▲ button again. You may need to follow the steps on page 12.

### 12 Automatic Channel Setup

Although your VCR may automatically memorize the channels you receive when you turn it on for the first time, this function lets you set up the channels again.





Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select AUTO PROGRAMMING, then press the F.FWD/▶ button. The VCR distinguishes between TV channels and cable channels, and the VCR will place all the channels you receive into its



memory.

Wait for a few minutes while the VCR sets up the channels. When this is complete, CHANNELS ARE SET will appear on-screen. Then the programming of the lowest channel number placed in the VCR's memory will appear on-screen. Now when you press the CH(annel)  $\checkmark/\checkmark$  button, you will scan only through channels you receive.

#### Helpful Hints

3-4

- You can not enter the TUNER SET UP menu when you are in Line Input mode (channel 001 or 002). When you select channel 001 or 002, AV REAR or AV FRONT will appear on-screen briefly.
- You can not program channels if you are using a Cable Box or DBS.
- If you have an antenna, channels 2-69 will be available. If you have a cable connection, channels 1-125 will be available.


Adding/Deleting Channels

Press the VCR button.

Press the MENU button.

Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select TUNER SET UP, then press the F.FWD/▶ button.


Press the PLAY/ $\blacktriangle$  button or the STOP/ $\checkmark$  button to select ADD/DELETE CH, then press the F.FWD/ $\triangleright$  button.



NOTE: If you have an antenna, channel numbers 2-69 will appear on the ADD/DELETE CH menu.


### 5

Press the PLAY/ $\blacktriangle$  button or the STOP/ $\checkmark$  button until the channel number you want to add or delete appears beside the arrow.



**Press the F.FWD**/> **button to select ADDED or DELET-ED.** Repeat steps 5 and 6 until you have added or deleted all the channels you wanted to add or delete.


Press the STATUS/EXIT button.



- If you want the TV screen to be solid blue when a weak signal is received, set BLUE BACKGROUND to ON. The screen will be blue and the sound will be muted. Or, if you want to receive the weak signal, set BLUE BACK-GROUND to OFF. When you select a channel that is receiving a weak signal, you will see and hear the static in the TV programming. To set BLUE BACKGROUND to ON
- or OFF, follow these steps.
- 1. Press the VCR button.
- 2. Press the MENU button.
- 3. Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select VCR SET UP, then press the F.FWD/► button.
- Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select BLUE BACK-GROUND. Then, press the F.FWD/► button repeatedly so that OFF (or ON) appears beside BLUE BACKGROUND.
   Press the STATUS/EXIT button.

### 14 Automatic Channel Setup (cont'd)

#### **Reviewing Memorized Channels**



# Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select CH MEMORY REVIEW, then press the F.FWD/▶ button.

A list of programmed channels will appear on-screen.

- If all the programmed channels don't fit on the screen, press the F.FWD/▶ button to see the remaining channels. Then press the REW(ind)/◄ button to return to the first screen of channels.
- If you do not press any buttons within 10 seconds, you will either go to the next screen of channels or you will return to the previous menu.

### 5

Press the STATUS/EXIT button once or twice to exit.

# Setting the Clock 15

There are two ways to set the clock. With manual clock setting, you tell the VCR the current time. With automatic clock setting, the VCR gets the current time from your local PBS station. It keeps track of the time by constantly referring to the time broad-casted by your PBS station.

### If you are using a Cable Box or Direct Broadcast System, you must set the clock manually.

Follow the instructions under either manual clock setting or automatic clock setting (page 17) to set the VCR's clock. Before you begin, make sure:


- The VCR is hooked up and turned on, and channels are programmed into the VCR's memory (see pages six - 12).
- The VCR is in VCR position. The VCR light will appear on the display panel. If it does not, press the VCR/TV button once.


Do each step within 60 seconds of the previous step.

#### Manual Clock Setting


Press the VCR button.

Press the MENU button.





Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select SET CLOCK, then press the F.FWD/▶ button.



Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select SET MANUAL CLOCK, then press the F.FWD/▶ button.




- To display the time on the TV screen, press the STATUS/EXIT button. Details are on page 26.
- Power failures that last for more than one minute can cause you to lose your clock setting if you set the clock manually. If this happens, reset the clock.
- This VCR is ready for the year 2000 and the years beyond. To set a date in the year 2000, enter 00 for the year in step 6.

### 5

#### Press two Number buttons for the hour(s) and two Number buttons for the minute(s). Then press 1 for AM or 2 for PM. For example, for 2:15 PM, press 02, 15, 2.


- Enter a 0 before a single-digit number.
- Entries that do not match the VCR's internal calendar will cause a question mark (?) to appear on-screen.
- To make corrections, press the CLEAR button until the space for the number you want to correct is flashing. Then enter the correct number.



Press two Number buttons for the month, two Number buttons for the day, and two Number buttons for the year. For example, for July 1, 1999, press 07, 01, 99. The day of the week will appear automatically.

TIME 02:15 PM DATE 07/01/99 THU. TO CORRECT PUSH CLEAR TO END PUSH EXIT

**Press the STATUS/EXIT button to start the clock**. The screen will return to the program you were watching. The time will appear on the VCR display panel.



### Setting the Clock (cont'd) 17

#### Automatic Clock Setting

Press the VCR button, then press the MENU button.



Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select SET CLOCK, then press the F.FWD/▶ button.


If OFF appears to the right of AUTO CLOCK, press the F.FWD/ button to select ON. Then, press the MENU button. Or, if ON appears to the right of AUTO CLOCK, press the MENU button. Go to step 4.



If you want the VCR to locate a local PBS station from which to take the time, press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select SET PBS CH. AUTO. Then press the F.FWD/▶ button. When the current time appears on-screen, you're finished. Press the STATUS/EXIT button. Or, you may be prompted to turn off the VCR. Turn off the VCR power, and leave it off for several minutes. When the current time appears on the VCR display panel, the clock is set. You may turn on the VCR again.

If you want to tell the VCR the PBS station from which to take the time, press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select SET PBS CH. MANUAL. Press the F.FWD/▶ button, then use the Number buttons to enter the channel number of the desired PBS station. When the current time appears on-screen, you're finished. Press the STATUS/EXIT button.

NOTE: CANNOT FIND PBS CLOCK DATA may flash on-screen. Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to choose SELECT NEW PBS CH., then press the F.FWD/► button. Use the Number buttons to enter the channel number of another PBS station. Or, press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select SET PBS CH. AUTO. Press the F.FWD/► button. You will be prompted to turn off the VCR. Turn off the VCR power, and leave it off for several minutes. When the current time appears on the VCR display panel, the clock is set. You may turn on the VCR again.




- If you enter an incorrect PBS channel number at step 4, press the CLEAR button, then enter the correct channel number.
- If you have an antenna, you may select channels 2 - 69 at step 4. If you have a cable connection, you may select channels 1 - 125.
- The clock cannot be set automatically if you don't receive a channel that carries a time signal in your area. Set the clock manually.
- If there are only a few channels in your area that carry time signals, setting the clock automatically may take several minutes. If nothing happens even after you wait several minutes, set the clock manually.
- You cannot select AUTO CLOCK at step 3 during tape playback.

### 18 Setting the Clock (cont'd)

#### Time Zone


When using the AUTO CLOCK function, you can specify your time zone. That way, the VCR will update the clock according to your time zone.

Press the VCR button, then press the MENU button.







Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select SET CLOCK, then press the F.FWD/▶ button.




Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select SET TIME ZONE, then press the F.FWD/▶ button.



Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select your time zone. ON will appear beside your choice.



**O** Press the STATUS/EXIT button.

• SET TIME ZONE will not appear in the menu if AUTO CLOCK is set to OFF.

You may program the VCR so its clock will automatically move forward one hour in April and turn back one hour in October. Daylight-Saving Time is set to ON when you receive your VCR. Turn Daylight-Saving Time ON or OFF by following the steps below. Before you begin:

• Make sure the clock is set.










Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select SET CLOCK, then press the F.FWD/▶ button.







Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select DAYLIGHT SVG TIME. Then, press the F.FWD/▶ button so that OFF (or ON) appears beside DAYLIGHT SVG TIME.

Press the STATUS/EXIT button.


### 20 Language Selection

Follow the steps below to change the language of the on-screen displays.

Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select

English or Spanish on-screen displays.

Press the STATUS/EXIT button.



- If you accidentally select Spanish on-screen displays and need English on-screen displays:
- 1. Press the VCR button.
- 2. Press the MENU button.
- 3. Press the PLAY/ button or the STOP/▼ button to select PREPARE EL VCR, then press the F.FWD/► button.
- 4. Press the PLAY/ button or the STOP/▼ button to select LENGUA-JE, then press the F.FWD/► button.
- 5. Press the PLAY/ button or the STOP/▼ button to select ENGLISH.
- 6. Press the STATUS/EXIT button.

#### Child Lock prevents use of the VCR by deactivating the VCR feature buttons on the VCR and the remote control. To set the Child Lock, turn on the VCR power, then follow the steps below.

You may let the OTR continue; the timer recording will not take place. Or, stop the OTR and turn off the VCR immediately. The timer recording will take place if you turn off the VCR before the timer recording's scheduled start time.

**Press the STATUS/EXIT button**. PROGRAM WAS COM-PLETED / PLEASE TURN OFF VCR FOR TIMER RECORDING should appear on-screen briefly.

**Press the POWER button to turn off the VCR power.** The Timer light will appear. The Timer light will flash if there is not a tape in the VCR.

If the timer recording will take place several hours or days from now, you may use the VCR until time for the recording. Just turn off the VCR a few minutes before the recording starts. If you forget to turn off the VCR, PLEASE TURN OFF VCR FOR TIMER RECORDING flashes on your TV screen two minutes before a timer recording starts. Remove the message by pressing the CLEAR button.

- Slow and Still modes will automatically switch to Stop mode after five minutes to protect the VCR and the tape from damage.
- SP/LP/SLP means this feature will work with tapes recorded in Standard Play, Long Play, or Super Long Play.

The following playback features will always operate.

#### **Automatic Playback**

When you put a tape in the VCR, the power will come on automatically. If the tape's record tab is missing, playback will begin. If a timer recording is set, the power will not come on automatically when you insert a tape with the record tab intact. If a timer recording is set and the VCR power is off, the VCR will eject the tape if the record tab is missing.

#### Automatic Rewind, Eject, Off

When a tape is played, fast forwarded, or recorded to its end, the VCR will rewind the tape, stop, eject the tape, then turn itself off. If the real-time counter memory is set, the VCR will only rewind the tape to the point at which the counter is set to zero, then stop. The VCR will not eject the tape automatically or shut itself off.

#### Tape Eject

A tape can be ejected with the VCR power on or off (but the VCR must be plugged in). If a timer recording is set, a tape can only be ejected with the power on. Make sure you insert a tape and turn off the VCR power for the timer recording.

#### Automatic Tracking Adjustment

The VCR adjusts tracking automatically to give you the best possible picture quality. With some recordings, however, you may get a better picture using the manual tracking controls (see below).


#### Manual Tracking

To manually adjust the tracking during playback and slow motion playback, press the CHANNEL  $\blacktriangle/\checkmark$  buttons on the VCR. (The CH(annel)  $\bigstar/\checkmark$  buttons on the remote control will not adjust tracking.)

Tracking will return to Automatic Tracking Adjustment when you press the STOP/ $\checkmark$  button or insert a tape.

You cannot manually adjust the tracking of a Still picture. However, you may press the CHANNEL  $\blacktriangle/\checkmark$  buttons on the VCR to remove vertical jitter in a Still picture.

#### No power

- · Make sure the power plug is completely connected to an AC (alternating current) outlet.
- Make sure the power is turned on.

#### **Power Failure**

• Timer recordings and the clock setting may be lost if the power fails for more than one minute. See page 15 to reset your clock if you set the clock manually. See pages 34 - 41 to reprogram your timer recordings.

#### A TV program cannot be recorded.

- Check the connections between the VCR, TV, antenna/cable, and Cable Box/Direct Broadcast System (if applicable) (pages six - 10).
- Make sure the tape has a record tab (page five).
- Check the TV/VCR position (page 28).
- Check the CH3/CH4 switch (pages six nine).

#### The VCR will not perform a timer recording.

- Make sure the recording start and stop times are set correctly (pages 34 41).
- Make sure a tape is in the VCR and the tape has a record tab (page five). If, after programming a timer recording, you turn off the VCR power without putting a tape in the VCR, the Timer light will blink.
- If the record tab on a tape is missing, the VCR will eject the tape. The Timer light will blink.
- Make sure the VCR power is off.
- Make sure the clock is set (page 15).
- The VCR may not perform or continue a timer recording if a power interruption of more than one minute occurs.
- If you have a Cable Box/Direct Broadcast System, timer recordings are programmed differently. (See page eight for details.)
- Finish programming a timer recording at least five minutes before the recording is set to begin.
- 12 p.m. is noon; 12 a.m. is midnight.

#### There is no playback picture or the playback picture is noisy or contains streaks.

- Make sure the TV is on the same channel as the VCR's CH3/CH4 switch.
- · Make sure the VCR is in VCR position. (The VCR light will appear on the display panel.)
- Make sure channel 03 or 04 is properly adjusted at the TV.
- · Adjust the tracking (page 47).
- TVs placed too close to the VCR can cause interference during tape playback. Move the VCR away from the TV.

#### The VCR cannot be controlled with the remote control.

- Press the VCR button, then try the other VCR feature buttons.
- · Make sure the VCR light appears on the display panel. If it does not, press the VCR/TV button once.
- Aim the remote control directly at the VCR's remote sensor (page 28).
- · Remove all obstacles between the remote control and the VCR.
- Inspect and/or replace the batteries in the remote control (page five).

#### The VCR cannot be controlled.

• Check the Child Lock (page 21).

#### The Number buttons won't work for channels above 69.

• Enter channel numbers as a two-digit number. If you want to select channels 100 and above, enter channel numbers as a three-digit number. (See page 24 for details.)

#### TV programs cannot be watched normally.

- Put the VCR in TV position. (Press the VCR/TV button so that the VCR light disappears from the display panel. For details, see page 28.)
- Check the connections between the VCR, TV, antenna/cable, and Cable Box/Direct Broadcast System (if applicable). (See pages six 10 for details.)

#### Tape cannot be inserted.

- Insert the tape, window side up, with the record tab facing you.
- Make sure a tape isn't already in the VCR by pressing the STOP/EJECT button on the VCR.
- Gently push on the center of the tape when putting it in the VCR. Never force the tape into the VCR.
- If a timer recording is programmed and the VCR power is off, you can not insert a tape without a record tab.

#### Tape cannot be removed.

- Make sure the power plug is completely connected to a power outlet.
- You have set a timer recording. Turn the VCR power on, then eject the tape. Be sure to insert a tape and turn off the power for your timer recording.

### VCR ejects the tape when the REC(ord)/OTR button is pressed or when the VCR power is turned off to set a timer recording.

• Make sure the tape has a record tab (page five).

#### **Poor reception**

• You may need to tune your TV again.

#### The motor (cylinder) rotates even when the VCR is in Stop mode.

• To enable the quick play mechanism, the cylinder will rotate for about five minutes. This is normal. The quick play mechanism allows the tape mechanism to switch from Stop mode to Play mode in one second.

#### **Direct Broadcast System Hookups**

- Watching one TV channel while recording another may not be possible if you have a DBS hookup. You may have to set your TV to channel 03 or 04, then make your channel selections at the DBS.
- With many DBS hookups, if you use accessory audio and video cables to connect your VCR to your TV, you will have to put your VCR in Line Input mode (channel 001 or 002).

#### Line Input mode

• If you accidentally enter Line Input mode (AV FRONT or AV REAR will appear on your TV screen briefly), press the CH(annel) ▲/▼ buttons or use the Number buttons to select another channel.

### 50 Glossary

AUDIO IN/OUT Jacks: jacks located on the front and back of

the VCR which are used to record audio from another source (IN) or to send audio to another system (OUT).

<u>Automatic Channel Setup</u>: process in which the VCR memorizes all available channels. Then, when you press the CH(annel) ▲/▼ buttons, you only scan through channels you receive.

Bands: settings that allow you to tune channels.

- Antenna VHF (very high frequency; channels 2 13) and UHF (ultra high frequency; channels 14 69).
- Cable all standard channels can be received without a Cable Box.

#### Cable Box/DBS Output Channel: 03 or 04.

**Dubbing:** copying a tape using a second VCR.

Frame: a still picture.

<u>HQ:</u> high quality; a feature in the VCR circuitry which provides enhanced picture detail.

**Line Input:** The channel to which you set your VCR during dubbing. If you use the AUDIO and VIDEO In jacks on the front of the VCR, select channel 002 (AV FRONT). If you use the AUDIO and VIDEO IN jacks on the back of the VCR, select 001 (AV REAR).

If you accidentally enter Line Input mode, press the CH(annel) ▲/▼ buttons or use the Number buttons to select another channel.

**<u>OTR</u>**: One-Touch Recording; a timed recording that starts immediately and records for 30 minutes to eight hours.

**<u>Remote Control</u>**: the small electronic unit that came with your VCR; allows you to operate your VCR from a distance. You may be able to operate your TV, Cable Box, or Direct Broadcast System with the remote control.

**<u>RF</u> coaxial cable:** The cable supplied with your VCR. Use it to connect your VCR to your TV (or Cable Box or DBS). The supplied cable is a snap-on type. However, you may use a screw-on type if you prefer.

**Special Effects:** forward and reverse searching; a still picture; slow motion playback.

<u>**Tape Speeds:**</u> how fast the tape travels during a recording or playback.

- **SP** (standard play) fastest tape speed (recording time for a T120 tape is approximately two hours); best picture quality.
- LP (long play) average tape speed; playback only.






