



### **Getting the Telephone Ready for Use**

- 1. Choose a desired location for the unit (mounted or on a flat, level surface).
- 2. Adjust the removable tab located above the speaker on the base of the phone.









 For wall mounted units, the side of the tab with the lip must be situated toward the top of the base to allow the handset to hang on the base without falling. The lip fits into the opening under the earpiece on the handset.




3. Plug one end of the coiled telephone cord into the jack on the handset, and the other into the matching jack on the left side of the unit's base.






### **Getting the Telephone Ready for Use-continued**

4. Plug one end of the flat telephone cord into the jack in the rear of the unit's base (marked TEL-LINE), and the other end into the wall jack which supplies telephone service.






### Mounting the Phone on the Wall

5. Hang phone on nails or picture hangers making certain that the phone is flush with the wall.


# **Connecting the Stand for Flat Surface Placement**

When using the JT-P531 on a flat surface, it is recommended that you use the included stand.


- 1. Remove the stand from the plastic wrapper.
- 2. Turn the phone upside down with the battery compartment closest to you.
- 3. The stand attaches above where the battery compartment is located.

### Connecting the Stand for Flat Surface Placement-continued


4. There are four (4) slots. The top two (2) slots are situated closer together and are on the bottom surface of the unit. The bottom two (2) slots are situated further apart and are located in indented rectangular sections which are cut into the bottom surface.



Line up the top two lips on the stand with the top two (2) slots on the bottom of the unit and place the lips into the slots.



6. Using your thumbs, gently press the stand just above the bottom two (2) lips until the stand clicks into position.




7. Return the phone to the upright position.


### Installing the Batteries

The JT-P531 requires three (3) AAA batteries, which are used to operate the speakerphone, the LCD display, and to retain Caller ID data and any settings programmed into the phone. Using an optional AC adapter (see Notes below) will increase the battery's life span, requiring less frequent battery replacement.

 Remove the battery compartment cover at the bottom of the unit.



2. Carefully install three (3) AAA batteries by observing the polarity direction shown in the battery compartment.



3. Replace the cover.

### Notes:

- Whether installing batteries for the first time or replacing them, do not mix old and new batteries, nor should alkaline, standard (zinc-carbon), or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries be used together.
- When not using the phone for a long period of time, remove the batteries to
  prevent possible leakage and corrosion. Keeping the phone powered by the
  optional AC adapter, discussed below, will preserve all data and settings in the
  phone's memory.

### **Using an AC Adapter (Optional)**

If an optional AC power adapter (not included) is used, it plugs into the DC 9V jack on the rear of the unit and converts common household AC electricity into low voltage DC power, suitable for the phone's operation. Such adapters are commonly available, but before buying, be sure that it can provide the necessary +/- polarity, as indicated on the unit's rear panel, just below the DC 9V jack. Once connected, plug the adapter's other end into an un-switched (always on) AC outlet, outlet strip, or extension cord. Even when an AC adapter is employed, the use of batteries is recommended as a backup in case AC power is ever lost.

### Notes:

- If neither the batteries nor an AC adapter are connected, the JT-P531 will still be
  able to place and receive calls, but the speakerphone, the ability to store Caller
  ID data, and the LCD display functions will not operate.
- When batteries are used without an AC adapter, they should be replaced when the display dims.
- When replacing the batteries without an AC adapter connected, it's the best to
  pick up the handset before removing the batteries. Doing so prevents the loss of
  stored Caller ID data and programmed settings while the batteries are being
  replaced. If not done, it's possible that all settings and data in the phone's
  memory will be lost.

### **Description of the Display**

The JT-P531 features a three-line LCD. The top line displays basic information; the middle line shows the telephone number of the incoming call; and the bottom line displays the name of the caller. Also included on the display is helpful information such as:


- The word, "LOW" appears on the screen when the battery power is low.
- The word, "NEW" appears on the screen when there are new incoming calls.
- The word, "CALL#" indicates the total number of incoming calls received.
- Hour: Minute Morning/Afternoon Day/Month are displayed. For example: "10:15 AM 21/03" (Year is not displayed)
- If the time and date programmed into the telephone differ from the telephone company's record, the telephone will automatically adjust to the service provider's information when receiving calls.
- When there has been no operation on the telephone for more than 20 seconds, the LCD will only display the time and date, amount of received calls and amount of incoming calls.
- The JT-P531 can store up to 94 incoming calls. Once 94 calls have been received, the oldest call will automatically erase when a new call is received.

**Note**: Please be sure the telephone lines are connected well and batteries or AC adapter are installed before starting setting.


### HOW TO ENTER THE SETUP MODE


- Long Press (Approx. 4 seconds)
   [DIAL] to enter setup menu.
- The LCD display will appear as shown here, however, you must use [▲]or [▼]to select from the menu including Select Language, Local Area Code, Regional AC's (Area Codes), and Date/Time Setting.





- When the LCD displays "DATE / TIME", press [DIAL] to enter this function.
- Press [▲] or [▼] to set the month.
- Press [DIAL] to confirm.
- Use the same procedure to set the day hour, and minute.

# OPERATIONAL INSTRUCTIONS

### **Basic Setup-continued**

- 3. SET AREA CODE
  - When the LCD displays "LOCAL AREA CODE", press [DIAL] to enter this function.
  - Use [▼] to select the each digit of area code.
  - Use [A] to confirm each digit and move to next digit
  - Press [DIAL] to confirm the first digit.
  - Use the same procedure to set the rest digits.




- When the LCD displays "REGIONAL AC'S-1", press [DIAL] to enter.
- Use [▼] to select the first digit of the regional area code.
- Use [▲] to advance to the next digit
- Press [DIAL] to confirm each digit.
- Store up to two (2) regional area codes.

### 5. SET LANGUAGE

- When the LCD displays "SELECT LANGUAGE", press [DIAL] to enter menu.
- Use [▲] or [▼] to select the desired language, ENGLISH (English), ESPANOL (Spanish), FRANCAIS (French), ITALIANO (Italian).







- When the LCD displays "T/P DIAL MODE," press [DIAL] to enter this menu.
- Press [▲] or [▼] to choose TONE (T) or PULSE (P).
- Press [DIAL] to confirm.





### EXIT MENU

 When the LCD displays, "EXIT SETUP," press [DIAL] to exit the setup menu.

### **Basic Setup-continued**


- LCD ADJUSTMENT
  - Press [VIP/LCD] to adjust the brightness of the LCD screen.
  - There are six (6) levels of brightness (Level 3 is the default setting)

### SAVING NUMBERS IN THE PHONEBOOK 9.

- Press [STORE]
- Press [▲] or [▼] to scroll phone listings Press [STORE] again to enter phone number
- Enter number you wish to save.
- Press [STORE] again to save number. Cursor will blink below the number
- Enter the name of the person whose number you entered.
- Press [STORE] again to save.
- Press [STORE] once more to exit phonebook menu.

### 10. FLASH TIME SELECT

- Press [STORE] followed by [FLASH], "FLASH=600MS," will display on the screen.
- Press [▲] or [▼] to select a suitable flash time (100/200/300/400/500/600/700/ 800/900MS).
- Press [STORE] again to confirm and exit the setting.



### 11. RINGER VOLUME CONTROL

When phone is not in use or when there is an incoming call ringing, press [VOL] to adjust the ringer volume from 1 to 3.

### 12. HANDSET VOLUME CONTROL

- Pick up the handset
- Press [VOL] to adjust the handset volume from 1 to 4.

### 13. SPEAKER PHONE VOLUME CONTROL

- Press [SPEAKER] and [VOL].
- Adjust the speaker phone volume from 1 to 4.

# **Basic Instructions for Making a Phone Call**

- Remove the handset from base and listen for dial tone.
- Listen for a dial tone to indicate that the phone is connected. 2.
- Dial the number you wish to call using the number pad.

# **Basic Instructions for Receiving a Phone Call**

Telephone will ring to alert the user of an incoming call.

- Lift the handset, hold earpiece to your ear and speak into the mouthpiece.
- 2. To hang up, return the handset to the base at the conclusion of call.

# **Using the Last Number Redial Function**

- 1. Remove the handset from base and listen for dial tone.
- 2. Use the [REDIAL/P] button redial the last number dialed (typically most helpful when the line is busy).

### **Receiving Caller ID Information**

Your telephone service provider must offer caller ID service in order to activate the caller ID function on this unit.

- 1. Incoming Call Display.
  - When there is an incoming call, the LCD will display the number, area code, name, time and date of the call.
- 2. Make note of the following indicators.
  - "UNKNOWN NUMBER": The call is made through a telephone company that does not offer caller ID service or does not transfer such information long distance.
  - "BLOCKED NUMBER": Some areas allow callers the option of preventing their telephone data from display on other telephones.
  - "MESSAGE WAITING": This will appear if you have a message service through your telephone service provider and someone has left a message.

### Reviewing the Caller ID List

Press [▲] or [▼] to review incoming calls (up to 94 calls).

### **VIP Function**

- When reviewing the caller ID list using [▲] or [▼], press [VIP] to store a specific number from the list into the VIP record.
- 2. Press [VIP] again to cancel the VIP function.

**Note:** The number cannot be deleted from the caller ID list once it has been saved to the VIP record.


## **Erasing Data from the Caller ID List**

- Press [▲] or [▼] to find the number you wish to erase.
- Press [DEL] to erase the number from the list.
- Press [DEL] for approximately 3 seconds for the LCD to show "ERASE ALL?"
- 4. Press **[DEL]** again to erase the entire caller ID list.



### Calling a Number from the Caller ID List

- With the handset is on the hook, press [▲] or [▼] to find the number you
  wish to call.
- Press [DIAL] once; the LCD will display "PICK UP OR ADJ," (for a 10 digit number) or "PICK UP PHONE." (for a 7 or 11 digit number).
- 3. Pick up the handset and the number on the display will automatically dial.
- With the handset off the hook, press [▲]
  or [▼] to find the number you wish to
  call.
- Press [DIAL] once. For 7 and 11 digit numbers, the number will automatically dial. For 10 digit numbers, the phone will add the number "1" automatically as the first digit.






### Storing One-Touch Memory

- While the handset is on the hook, press [M1] or [M2].
- 2. The LCD will show "E1" or "E2."
- 3. Press [STORE] to enter.
- 4. Input the number you wish to save.
- 5. Press [STORE] again to confirm.

**Note:** Press **[DEL]** to cancel the current number while entering.




# **Dialing from One-Touch Memory**

- Pick up the handset or press [SPEAKER].
- 2. Press [M1] or [M2] to dial the number automatically.

## **Storing Two-Touch Memory**

- 1. While the handset is on the hook, press [STORE].
- 2. The LCD will display "M0-M9"
- 3. Select and press the number from the keypad 0-9
- 4. Press [STORE] to enter
- 5. Input the desired telephone number
- 6. Press **[STORE]** to confirm and advance to Name Input mode.
- 7. Input the name using the letters on the phone keypad (For example, to enter the letter "C," press the number 2 three times).
- 8. Press [STORE] again to confirm.

**Note:** Press [**DEL**] to cancel the current number or name while entering.



### Dialing from Two-Touch Memory

- 1. Pick up the handset or press [SPEAKER].
- 2. Press [DIAL] and number (0-9). The number in memory will dial automatically.

# **Using the Flash Function**

When the JT-P531 is used in an office equipped with centralized phone system PABX, this telephone can transfer and hold calls.


- 1. Ask the calling party to hold.
- 2. Press and release [FLASH].
- 3. Dial the number or extension to which the call is directed.
- 4. When the intended call recipient answers, announce the call and hang up.
- If there is a busy signal or no answer, press and release [FLASH] to reconnect to the calling party.

**Note:** Not all PABX systems are compatible with JT-P531. Please check with your telephone service provider for compatibility.

### Pause Function

In some places, PABX or long distance service requires a pause function within the dialing sequence. The JT-P531 provides an adjustable pause time preset function.


- 1. Press [STORE] and [REDIAL/P].
- 2. The LCD will display "PAUSE=4S."
- 3. Press [▲] or [▼] to select pause time from 1/2/3/4/5/6/7/8/9S (1-9 seconds).
- 4. Press [STORE] to confirm and exit.



### Placing a Call on Hold

While speaking on the phone, it may be necessary to place a call on hold. It is suggested that before placing a call on hold, ask the caller if it would be okay to place them on hold for a moment.

- 1. Press the [HOLD].
- 2. The LCD will display "MIC MUTE."
- 3. Music will play indicating that the caller is now on hold.
- 4. If you place the handset back into the receiver, the music will play through the speaker on the main unit base until the call is picked up.



- 5. If you simply put the handset down without placing it back on the receiver, the music will play through the earpiece until the call is picked up again.
- To return to the original call, press [HOLD] again or press [SPEAKER] and resume the call as normal.

# TROUBLESHOOTING & SPECIFICATIONS

### **Troubleshooting**

- No Display on LCD Screen
  - Brightness on display may be turned down.
    - Increase brightness level.
  - No batteries or batteries are improperly installed.
    - If no batteries, install 3 AAA batteries as directed or
    - Install optional AC Adapter (not included).
    - Make sure batteries observe to polarities (+/-) as indicated inside the battery compartment.

### No Dial Tone when handset is picked up

- Phone may not be connected properly.
  - Make sure the handset jack is connected to the base jack using the colled wire.
  - Make sure the base jack (TEL-LINE) jack is connected to the wall telephone jack using the flat wire.
- Telephone service may be interrupted by the telephone company
  - Contact your telephone company to check the status of your service.

### · Static or interruptions during phone conversation

- Bad connection between phones
  - Hang up and dial number again
- Harsh weather conditions and/or lightning
  - Hang up and dial number when weather conditions improve

### . Can only receive incoming calls and cannot make outgoing calls

- Telephone service may be limited or suspended by your telephone company
  - Contact your telephone company to check the status of your service.
