## Software Setup

The Music Management CD that comes with your player contains all of the necessary software components you need to make your player work properly.
These components do the following:

- enable you to transfer files from your computer to your player,
- convert video files and/or automatically update the player (if included on the CD).


## Inserting the included CD into CD drive

1. Turn on your computer and place the Music Management CD that came with your player into your computer.
2. If the setup screen does not appear, double-click My Computer, double click your CD drive icon, and double click Install to run the installer.

IMPORTANT: Don't connect the USB cable to the PC or the player before or during the CD installation.

Note: The Music Management CD also contains Yahoo! Music Jukebox that can help transfer music content to your player. Please refer to the section on your installed software for detailed operations.

Yahoo! Music Jukebox is supported only in Windows XP or higher operating system.

## Connecting the player to the computer

Connect the player to your computer with the mini USB cable provided. The player will turn on automatically. The player will appear as a Windows portable device (Windows XP) using the Media Transfer Protocol (MTP).


- It might take several seconds for the player to be detected. Click Refresh in My Computer or Windows Explorer to make sure the player has been detected.
- The player is capable of transferring files at USB 2.0. If a USB 2.0 port is available on your computer, use it to connect to your player. The player is still backward compatible with the older USB 1.1 ports. However, you will not be able to take full advantage of the potential speed increase.


## Connecting to the Computer

## Charging the battery

Your player is charged through the USB connection when it is connected to your computer. To fully charge the player, make sure your computer is on and the player is connected for at least 3 hours.

## Important battery information

- Charge the player for at least 3 hours before first use.
- Charge the player for at least 3 hours after putting away the player for a long time.
- Battery replacement should only be made by trained technicians. Refer to Limited Warranty for details.
- Do not attempt to open the player. No user serviceable parts inside.
- To reduce risk of injury, charge only rechargeable batteries recommended by the manufacturer for this player. Other types of batteries may burst causing damage and personal injury.

## Transferring files via Yahoo! Music Jukebox (Windows XP or higher only)

Yahoo! Music Jukebox lets you manage your music easily and organize like a pro. Create your own playlists: music for work, the gym, or even dinner. You can also buy download music and transfer to your player in seconds. Just drag and drop and you're done. 1. Launch the Yahoo! Music Jukebox.
2. Attach the player to your computer. The player's name should appear after a few seconds in the left navigation pane.
3. In the Yahoo! Music Jukebox, click My Music or click on a playlist on the left navigation pane.
4. Simply drag the playlist you want to the name of your player in the left navigation pane (you can also drag tracks, artists and albums directly from My Music).
5. The Yahoo! Music Jukebox will check to see if there is sufficient storage space on the player to copy the songs. If not, you will have to reduce the number of songs you are transferring.

- Yahoo! Music Jukebox is supported only in Windows XP or higher operating system and Internet Explorer 6 or above for installation.
- Required updates to Yahoo! Music Jukebox may be available from Yahoo! after installation. Please refer to the Yahoo! Music Jukebox Help for more information about these updates.


## Transferring Files to the Player

## Transferring files via Windows Explorer (drag-and-drop) (Windows XP only)

In Windows Explorer, when the RCA player is opened in MTP mode, and Windows Media Player 10 is installed, the "Data" and "Media" views will be displayed for the player.
The Data folder is used to manage data content on the player, such as text files. The Media folder is used to manage media content supported by the player for playback, such as mp3 and wma.


You can copy / delete files from the player through Windows Explorer, but you cannot open or edit the files directly from the player. If you want to edit the files, you will need to copy the files from the player to another location (drive) in the system.

## Note:

- Picture files should be copied to the "Media" folder for viewing. Video files cannot be drag and copied to the "Media" folder. They must be converted and transferred to the player via RCA Video Converter for playback (refer to page 28).
- If your computer has installed Windows Media Player 11, "Internal Storage" shows instead of the folders mentioned above. Copy files inside "Internal Storage".


Caution: Secure music download files must be transferred to your player through one of the provided Jukebox software packages or any applications recommended by the online music download service. Please visit the online music download service's website where you purchased your content from for more details on transferring secure music to your player.

## Disconnecting your player from the computer



Do not disconnect the USB connection during file download. Doing so may corrupt system files or the files being downloaded.

For Windows XP users, your player is connected in MTP (Media Transfer Protocal) mode to your computer by default, you may disconnect the USB cable directly when file download is completed.

## General Controls

## Before you begin

The following example illustrates what you should do before operating your player.

1. These instructions presume you've already done the followings:

- Installed all necessary applications.
- Transferred music from your computer to the player.
- Allowed your player to charge for at least 3 hours while connected to the computer.

2. If you haven't unplugged the player from your computer, detach the USB cable from the player.
3. Connect the earphones to your player.
4. If your player isn't already on, turn it on by sliding the power button downwards and hold it until the player turns on. The main navigation menu appears.

## Overview



1. Key lock - slide the key upwards to prevent accidental key activation. To unlock, slide the key to the middle position.
Power on/off - slide the key downwards and hold it until the player turns on/off.
Stop playback - slide the key downwards during music, picture or video playback and then release to stop the playback.

2. Microphone
3. The display
4. M - Enters or exits the player's menu. (During playback, touch once to access the previous navigation screen before playback, touch twice to access player's menu. Touch three times to go back to the playback screen.)

5. Touch sensitive keypad - touch or move your finger along the surface for operations.

Moving your finger clockwise along the control pad as seen in the circular arrow will increase the volume. To decrease the volume, just move you finger counterclockwise.
6. USB connector - Attach the small end (Type mini-B) of the mini-USB cable here. Attach the large end (Type A) to your computer's USB port. The player will enter USB mode automatically, and you can transfer files to and from the computer.
The player's battery will also be charged when connected to the computer.
7. Earphones jack - Insert the earphone plug here.
8. Reset button - If the player locks up, press the reset button with a non-metal pointed object (e.g. toothpick) to reset it.

1. Indicates whether the player is playing or paused.
2. Indicates if the shuffle mode is on or off.
3. Indicates what repeat mode is activated or off.
4. Indicates that the key lock function is activated.

* Showing Album Art of digital music - Depending on the format of the music file, album art and the application software used for transferring files to the player, not all different formats of the album art might be supported. For music files with displayed album art, you can select displaying either the album art or the track information by using the up/down button.
** Touch 144 within the beginning 4 seconds of the current music or sectioned audible file to skip to previous file/section. Otherwise, you will return to the beginning of the current file/ section.

## Video converter

Before transferring any video files to your player, they must be converted to a compatible format for optimal playback. To do so, you need to install the RCA Video Converter in your computer. The video converter only works on Windows XP or higher.

1. Load the music management CD included with this player in your computer. Installation will start automactically. Follow the on screen instructions to properly install the RCA Video Converter.
2. After installation is complete, launch the RCA video converter and connect the player to the computer.
3. Drag-and-drop the selected video files from Windows Explorer onto the Video Converter's list control.

- If the video file is already compatible with the player, "Ready to be downloaded" shows under "Status".

4. Select the target folder you wish to save the converted video file too by clicking "Browse" under the list control.

- If you want to transfer the video output file to the player automatically after the conversion is complete, check the box underneath to allow transfer to player when conversion is complete.

5. Select the type of player from the pull-down menu under "Player". For this player, select "M51 series" in the pull-down menu. Once the type of player is selected, optimum settings for file conversion will be made automatically.
6. To edit the name of the output video, click on the box that is just to the right of the Destination box at the lower right corner of the Video Converter application.

7. If you prefer to convert only a portion of the video file, select the start and end time for conversion by increasing or decreasing the box to the right of Start and End at the lower right corner of the Video Converter application.
8. To rotate the output file by $90^{\circ}$ after conversion, select "Yes" from the pull-down menu to the right of "Rotate" at the lower right corner of the Video Converter application.
9. Once all selections and changes above have been made, click "Convert" to start the file conversion.

- If all the video files are ready to be downloaded without conversion, the "Convert" button will change to "Download". Click "Download" to start the file transfer.

Tip: For operation details of the video converter, please open the help file by pressing the 'F1' key on your computer.

Note: If Windows Media Player 10 is installed, picture files should be copied to the"Media" folder for viewing. Video files cannot be dragged and dropped to the "Media" folder. They must be converted and transferred to the player via RCA Video Converter for playback. Alternatively, converted video files can also be transferred via Windows Media Player in the same way as you transfer music files to the player. Please refer to the instructions of Windows Media Player for operation details.


This video converter software relies on the video codecs already installed in your computer. Make sure the video file you wish to convert plays on your computer before using the video converter software. Note that some video files that play on your computer may rely on specialized video playback applications that are not compatible with the video converter software.

The video converter can only convert files that play on your PC. If a file cannot play on your PC, then it will be necessary for you to download the appropriate PC media player for that file format from the Internet. Enter the file type or file format into a common Internet search engine to find links where the PC media player can be downloaded and installed to your PC.

2. While "Go to" is highlighted, touch $\boldsymbol{> 1}$.

Touch $14 \boldsymbol{\alpha}$ or $\Perp$ to select frequency.
Tip: touch and hold 144 or $\boldsymbol{~}{ }^{1}$ to search the frequency at a faster rate.

## Automatic station search

Touch and hold $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ in the radio mode until "Searching..." shows on the display. The search will stop when the next available radio station is found.

## Saving preset stations

1. Select a radio frequency.
2. Touch $\mathbf{M}$ and then touch $\mathbf{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ to highlight "Save to Preset".
3. Touch $\leadsto 1$ or $\boldsymbol{I I}$ to make the selection.
4. The next available preset station number will show, touch $\mathbf{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ to select another number if so desired.
5. Touch $>I I$ to save the frequency as the assigned preset station number.

## Record duration

3. Touch $\mathbf{M}$ to exit the player's menu.

## Deleting radio recording

3. Touch $\mathbf{\Delta}$ or $\mathbf{V}$ to highlight "Voice Recording". Then touch $\leadsto>$ to access voice recording mode.

## Tips and troubleshooting

- Problem: Player repeats same tracks or all tracks.
- Repeat play is turned on. Touch the MENU button (M) to change the play mode.
- Problem: Audio distorted at high volume.
- Select another DSP setting.
- Turn down the volume.
- Problem: The audio tracks on my player keep skipping or popping.
- You'll need to re-record the audio track - make sure you close all other applications on your PC when you record.
- Try recording with Error Correction setting turned on.
- Problem: Player turns itself off.
- Your player turns itself off if you leave it in pause mode or navigation mode for the duration specified in PowerSave setting.
- Problem: The player cannot be turned on.
- Reset the player by pressing the RESET button.
- If the player still cannot be turned on after resetting, perform a firmware upgrade to restore it.

## - Problem: Player does not respond to key presses.

- The key lock may be active. Unlock by sliding the power key to the middle position.
- If your player stops responding to key presses, you can reset it by pressing the RESET button with a non-metal pointed object (e.g. toothpick). Most of your settings will be preserved; only the settings that you have changed after your last power off will be lost.

- Why can I not view picture files on my player?
- The player only supports .jpg extension file, and does not support other formats like .bmp, .tiff, .jpeg.
- All picture files need to be put in the \Media folder of the player (if Windows Media Player 10 installed).
- Why does my player not play the video files that were transferred from the computer?
- All video files must be converted by the video converter which comes with the player (please refer to the CD). Other video file formats are not supported.
- Why does my player report that it is full?
- You have filled the capacity of the player's memory.
- You have exceeded the maximum number of items that this player supports. Your player can only support up to 2000 files and folders on the player.
- Problem: Contents transferred to my player doesn't show up on other computers.
- For Windows XP users with Windows Media Player 10 installed, your player is connected in MTP mode to PC by default, those contents transferred in MTP mode can only be seen on a PC with Windows XP and connected in MTP mode.
- Problem: Cannot playback tracks on the player.
- Make sure audio tracks are encoded in the mp3 or Windows Media formats at supported bitrates.

mp3-32 to 320 kbps
wma - 48 to 192 kbps
- WMA files may be DRM protected and you don't have the proper rights (license) to play the files.

- What is MTP mode?
- MTP (Media Transfer Protocol) mode is essential if you want to transfer DRM content to your player. In MTP mode your player will no longer show up as a drive letter. So programs that were designed to work with a player that shows up as a drive letter will not be able to work directly with the player.
