
* Tap on touch screen with your fingertip.








- Do not use any sharp object other than your fingers to operate the touch screen.
 Otherwise, touch screen may be damaged.
- Do not tap on the touch screen if your fingers are not clean.



Charging the battery

Fully charge the rechargeable battery before using the player for the first time or when it has not been used for a while.



- Connect the USB cable to the USB port (¹√y) on your PC.
- Connect the other end of the USB cable to the USB Connection Port on the bottom of the player.
 - When connected with the USB cable, it takes about 4 hours for the player to fully charge although this may vary depending on your PC environment.

Battery Use

- Recharge and store within the temperature range of 5°C~35°C(40°F~95°F).
- Do not overcharge (longer than 12 hours).
 Excessive charging or discharging may shorten the battery's life.
- Battery life naturally shortens slowly over time.



If you are charging the player while it is connected to your Notebook, make sure the Notebook's battery is also fully charged.

Basic Use

Turning the Power On & Off



Turning the Power On

Slide and hold the [HOLD ▶] switch in the opposite direction of the arrow.

■ Power is turned on.

Turning the Power Off

Slide and hold the [HOLD ▶] switch in the opposite direction of the arrow again.

Power is turned off.



■ Power is automatically turned off when none of the buttons have been tapped for a preset period of time (Default: 1 minute) in the pause mode. ▶ Page 46

Playing Music



- Press and hold [) to move to the main menu.
- **2** Tap [\P \P] to select <Music> and then tap [\P].
 - The Music Menu will appear.
- 3 Use [△ ∨] and [] to select a music file of your choice.
 - Tap [🔘].
 - The music file will begin playing.



- Tap [②] to move to the previous screen.
- Press and hold [②] to move to the main menu screen.

Basic Use (Continued)

Volume Control



Tap [∧ ∨].

- You will see a volume control icon.
- Tap [♠] to increase the volume or [♦] to decrease it.


Lock Function



In Hold mode, all buttons are disabled. This function is useful when you are walking or jogging.

- 1 Slide the [HOLD ▶] switch in the direction of the arrow.
- 2 Slide the [HOLD ▶] switch in the opposite direction of the arrow to release the Lock function.


Using the Speaker



Slide the middle of the player in the arrow direction while listening to music or the radio.

- You can listen to music through the speaker.
- If you want to use the earphone for enjoying the music, close the speaker by sliding back to the original position.
- Please position the player horizontally when using the speaker.
- If you close the slide panel, the speaker will shut off.

Reset Function



If a player malfunction occurs, you can re-initialize the system by pressing the Reset hole.

Press the Reset hole at the rear of the player with a pointed object such as a safety clip.

- The system will be initialized.
- Your settings and files will not be affected.

Loading Your Desired File

Installing Samsung Media Studio Use Media Studio to transfer music files from your PC to the player.



If Media Studio is not installed automatically

CAUTION INSTALL the program on PCs running Windows 2000 or Windows XP after logging on with the Administrator account. Please refer to the PC user manual on how to log on with the Administrator account

Insert the installation CD provided with the player into the CD-ROM drive.



Click <Install now>.





Connecting to your PC

- 2 Connect the other end of the USB cable to the USB Connection Port on the bottom of the player.



If you connect the player through a USB hub, the connection may be unstable. Please connect the player to your PC directly.

Adding Files/Folders in Samsung Media Studio

Media Studio enables you to select and organize files and folders in preparation for transfer to your player.



Please refer to Help for more information on how to use Media Studio.

 \blacksquare Click <MENU> \to <Help> \to <Help> from the menu at the top of the Media Studio program.



- Connect the player to your PC.
- Media Studio must be installed on your PC.
- 1 Media Studio will automatically start when the player is connected to your PC.
 - If the program does not start automatically, double Click the Media Studio icon on the desktop.
- 2 Click the desired file icon.

 - Click ETC icon to display etc list. The ETC list includes file types (ex: TXT, XOV, etc) other than
 music and photo files.

To add folders

- 3 Click <Add Folder> on the bottom of Media Studio.
 - The Open Folder window will appear.
- 4 Select the folder to add and click <OK>.
 - The selected folder is added to the list on the left side the Media Studio Screen.





Transferring Files to the Player with Samsung Media Studio

Perform the following steps to transfer files from your PC to the player.

- Connect the player to your PC.
- Media Studio must be installed on your PC.
- 1 Media Studio will automatically start when the player is connected to your PC.
 - If the program does not start automatically, double click the Media Studio icon on the desktop.
- 2 Click the desired file icon.
 - Choose the file type you want to transfer by clicking on one of these icons.

 represents a music file and represents a photo.
 - Click ITTC icon to display etc list. The ETC list includes file types (ex: TXT, XOV, etc) other than music and photo files.
- 3 Select the file to transfer in the left file list.
- 4 Click icon.
 - The Selected file is transferred to the player.



■ Do not disconnect the USB cable during file transfer. This may cause damage to the player or your PC.



- When transferring a photo file to the player using <Media Studio>, it is automatically converted into JPG format before transfer. The file size is automatically adjusted, too.
- A photo file that is transferred to the player without using <Media Studio> can look different from the source on the screen of the player.

Using as a Removable Disk You can use the player as a removable storage device.

Before you start!

Connect the player to your PC.



- Open files/folders to transfer from your PC.
- 2 Open <My Computer> → <Removable Disk> from the desktop.
- Select the files/folders to transfer from your PC and drag and drop them to a folder of vour choice in the <Removable Disk>.
 - The selected folders or files are transferred to the player.




- The <Transferring Files·**> message will appear during file download or upload. Disconnecting the USB cable while <Transferring Files...> is displayed may cause malfunction of the player.
- The order of music files displayed in Windows Explorer may differ from the play order on your device.
- If you transfer a DRM file(charged file) to the removable disk, the file will not be played.


What is DRM?

DRM (Digital Rights Management) is a technology and service to prevent the illegal use of digital contents and protect the profit and rights of copyright holders. DRM files are charged music files applied with the illegal copy protection technology of legally purchased MP3 music.

Disconnecting from your PC Follow the steps below to prevent damage to the player and data when disconnecting from your PC.



- Place the mouse cursor on top of the icon on the taskbar at the bottom right corner of the desktop and click the left mouse button.
- 2 Click <Safely Remove USB Mass Storage Device Drive> message.




3 Disconnect the player from your PC.



- Do not disconnect the player from the PC during file transfer. This may cause damage to data and the player.
- You cannot remove the player while files within the player are being played on your PC. Please retry after playback is finished.

Listening to Music

Before you start! Connect the earphones, then switch on the player, and check the battery.



- Press and hold [②] to move to the main menu.
- **2** Tap [< >] to select <Music> and then tap [].
 - The Music Menu will appear.
- 3 Tap [♠♥] to select <File Browser> and then tap [1.

Music Menu

- Now Playing>: You can see information on the current song.
- <File Browser> : You can search for a music file
- <Playlists> : To play by Playlist



- The music files compatible with the player are MP3, WMA and Ogg.
- MP1 or MP2 files which only have a changed extension to MP3, may not play on the player.



- 4 Tap [∧ ∨] to select <MUSIC> folder, and then tap [].
 - The music files for the selected folder will appear.
- 5 Tap [∧ ∨] to select a music file to play, and then tap [].
 - The music will start playing.



If you select the <PHOTO> folder in the <File Browser>, only those music files transferred into the <PHOTO> folder are displayed.

Listening to Music (Continued)

To Pause

- 1 Tap [] while the music is playing.
 - The music playback will be paused.
- **2** Tap [] again.
 - The music will play from the point where it stopped.



The screen Display window automatically turns off when none of the buttons have been tapped for a preset period of time (Default: 1 minute) in the pause mode.

You can set the time duration before closing the screen display. ▶page 46

To search within a track

- Press and hold [< >] while the selected track is playing.
 - It searches to the beginning or the end of the track.
- 2 Release the button at the point you wish to start.
 - It starts playing from the point you release the button.

To Play from the beginning of the current track

Tap [<] after 3 seconds of play.

■ The current track starts playing from the beginning.

To play the previous/next track

Tap [◀] within 3 seconds of play.

■ The previous track will start playing.

Tap [🤌].


■ The next track will start playing.



■ When playing VBR files, the previous track may not play even if you tap [≤] within 3 seconds of play.

Creating a Playlist Using Samsung Media Studio

A playlist is a list of your favorite songs.



- Click <My Album> on the top of Media Studio.
 - The <My Album> window appears.
- 2 Click <New Album> on the bottom.
 - The Creation window appears.
- 3 Type in the album title and click <OK>.
 - A new album (playlist) will be created and stored in the My Album section of Media Studio.

Adding Music files to a Playlist



- Click <My PC> on the top of Media Studio.
 - The <My PC> window appears.
- 2 Click <My Album> in the right corner of the window.
 - The Album window appears.
- 3 Double click on a desired album in the right window.
- Select files that you want to transfer in the <My PC> window.
- **5** Click 🗻 icon.
 - The selected files will be added to the album (playlist).

Exporting a Playlist to your Player Using Media Studio



- **◀** Click <My Album> on the top of Media Studio.
 - The <Mv Album> window appears.
- Click <Portable> in the right corner of the window.
 - The <Portable> window appears.
- 3 Select a desired album in the <My Album> list.
- 4 Click icon.
 - The selected album will be transferred to the player and stored in <Music> → <Playlists>.

To Play a Playlist

Before you start!

- Press and hold [②] to move to the main menu.
- **2** Tap [< >] to select <Music> and then tap [].
 - The Music Menu will appear.
- 3 Tap [♠♥] to select <Playlists> and then tap [◎].
 - The Playlist(s) will appear.
 - If there is no playlist found, you will see a message of <No File> on the screen.
- **4** Tap [∧ ∨] to select the playlist of your choice, then tap [].
 - The music files saved in the selected Playlist will appear.
- 5 Tap [♠♥] to select a music file to play, then tap [◎].
 - The music file will start playing.

Using the Music Option Menu

To select the sound effect

Different sound effects can be selected that enable you to enhance the music you are listening to.



- 1 Tap [🖹] while listening to music.
 - The music option menu appears.
- **2** Tap [∧ ∨] to select <Sound Effect> and then tap [].
 - The sound effect menu appears.
 - Tap [\wedge \vee] to select the desired sound effect and then tap [\bigcirc].
 - You can select either <Normal> <Vocal> <Bass Boost> <3D Sound> or <Concert Hall>.

To select the graphic EQ display



- Tap [

] while listening to music.
 - The music option menu appears.
- **2** Tap [$\wedge \vee$] to select <Graphic EQ> and then tap [\bigcirc].
 - The graphic equalizer menu appears.
- **3** Tap [\wedge \vee] to select <On> or <Off> and then tap [\bigcirc].
 - <On>: The graphic equalizer will be displayed on the screen.
 - <Off>: The graphic equalizer will not be displayed on the screen.



Using the Music Option Menu (Continued)

To select the play mode



- 1 Tap [B] while listening to music.
 - The music option menu appears.
- f 2 Tap [\wedge ee] to select <Play Mode> and then tap [\odot].
 - The play mode menu appears.
- 3 Tap [$\wedge \vee$] to select the desired mode and then tap [\bigcirc].
 - <Normal> : To play all the files in order one time.
 - <Repeat Folder> : To repeat the current folder.
 - <Repeat All> : To repeat all files.
 - <Repeat One> : To repeat one file.
 - <Shuffle Folder> : To play files in the folder at random.
 - <Shuffle All> : To play files at random.

To add to alarm sound

You can add your favorite music file to the alarm sound list, so it can be heard the next time the alarm goes off. See page 42 to set the alarm.




- 1 Tap [🗉] while listening to music.
 - The music option menu appears.
- **2** Tap [$\wedge \vee$] to select <Add to Alarm> and then tap [\bigcirc].
- 3 Tap [⟨⟩] to select <Yes> and then tap [◎].
 - The selected music will be added to the alarm sound list. You can add only one music file at a time to the alarm sound list.

Photo Viewing

Before you start

See pages 20-21 to transfer Photo files to your player.





You will see thumbnail photos if the appropriate information is included in the file.

For a file with no information, you will see instead.

- 1 Press and hold [2] to move to the main menu.
- 2 Tap [< >] to select <Photo> and then tap [] 1.
 - The Photo list will appear.
- 3 Tap [∧ ∨ ⟨ ⟩] to select the photo file of your choice, then tap [◎].
 - The selected file will appear.
 - Large photos may take longer to display.

Slideshow Viewing

You can view you picture files in order as a Slide show.

- **1** Tap [◎] in Photo Viewing mode.
 - The slideshow will start.
- 2 Tap [] to stop the slideshow.

To view the previous / next photo

Tap [< >].

You can see the previous or next photo on the display.

Using the Photo Option Menu

To listen to music while viewing your photo

You can listen to the song that you last played while viewing your photo.



- 1 Tap [🗉] while viewing a photo.
 - The photo option menu appears.
- 2 Tap [] to select <Background Music On> or <Background Music Off>.
 - <Background Music On>: You can listen to the song that you last played while viewing your photo.
 - <Background Music Off>: No background music is played while viewing a photo.

To add a photo to the screen saver list



- 1 Select a photo file that you want to add to the screen saver list.
- 2 Tap [🖹] while viewing a photo.
 - The photo option menu appears.
- 3 Tap [∧∨] to select <Add to Screen Saver> and then tap [○].
 - The selected photo file is added to the list.




- Select <Photo> from <Settings> → <Display> → <Screen Saver> and the selected photo is displayed on the screen as a screen saver. ▶ page 45
- If you reset the player, the screen saver will be initialized to <Analog Clock>.

Listening to FM Radio

Before you start

Connect the earphones, then switch on the player, and check the battery.



- 1 Press and hold [🧿] to move to the main menu.
- 2 Tap [< >] to select <FM Radio> and then tap [].
 - FM radio reception will start.

To use Mute function

Tap [] while listening to the FM radio.

- Sound is muted.
- Tap [] once again to hear sound.



Always connect your earphones to the player when searching or setting frequencies. The earphones are used as antennas to receive FM radio reception.

Listening to FM Radio (Continued)

To switch to Manual Tuning mode

Select this mode if you want to manually search through the FM band one frequency at a time.



- 1 Tap [a] in <Preset Mode>.
- **2** Tap [∧ ∨] to select <Go to Manual Mode> and then tap [].
 - You will see <Manual Mode> on the screen.

To switch to Preset Mode

Select this mode if you want to search through your saved FM presets one preset at a time.



- 1 Tap [🗉] in <Manual Mode>.
- **2** Tap [$\wedge \vee$] to select <Go to Preset Mode> and then tap [\bigcirc].
 - You will see <Preset Mode> on the screen.
- 3 Tap [< >] to select the preset frequency.
 - Once <Preset Mode> appears on the screen, you can select a radio frequency and listen to it.



- If no preset frequencies are set, you will see <Preset list does not exist> and the player will not switch to <Preset Mode>.
- If you select (Preset List) on the FM option menu, you will see the preset frequencies.
- For more information on the preset setup, refer to pages 38~39.

To automatically search for frequencies



Press and hold [< >] in <Manual Mode>.

■ The broadcast station frequency nearest from the point the button is released will be searched.

To manually search for frequencies



Tap [< ▷] in <Manual Mode>.

■ Moves to next frequency whenever the button is tapped.

To automatically set Presets



- Tap [🗉] in FM Radio mode.
- $\boldsymbol{2}$ Tap [\wedge \vee] to select <Auto Preset> and then tap [\bigcirc].
 - You will see the Auto Preset window on the screen.
- **3** Tap [< ≥] to select <Yes> and then tap [◎].
 - Up to 30 presets are automatically saved.

To cancel during setting

Tap [< >] to cancel during auto scanning.

■ The auto preset setting is canceled and frequencies set up to then are stored.



Using <Auto Preset> deletes all previous presets.

To manually set Presets



- In <Manual Mode>, Tap [< >] to select the desired frequency.
- **2** Tap [🖹].
- 3 Tap [∧ ∨] to select <Add Preset> and then tap [].
 - The selected frequency will be added to the preset list. A maximum of 30 preset numbers are added to the list in sequential order.
- 4 To set a preset number for other frequencies, follow 1-3 steps above.



If a frequency that you try to add already exists in the list, you will see <This preset already exists.> and the selected frequency is not added to the preset list.

To search for presets in PRESET mode



- Tap [< >] in <Preset Mode>.
- The preset number is selected and you can listen to the stored radio frequency.



To Delete Presets



- 1 Tap [🖹] in <Preset Mode>.
- $\boldsymbol{2}$ Tap [\wedge \vee] to select <Delete Preset> and then tap [\bigcirc].
 - The preset frequencies will appear.
- 3 Tap [∧ ∨] to select the preset frequency you want to delete and then tap [].
 - The confirmation window will appear.
- 4 Tap [< >] to select <Yes> and then tap [].
 - The selected preset will be deleted.
- To select and delete other preset numbers, follow 1-4 steps above.

Listening to FM Radio

Setting FM Radio

To set FM Sensitivity



- 1 Tap [🗉] in FM Radio mode.
- **2** Tap [∧∨] to select <FM Sensitivity> and then tap [◎].
 - The FM Sensitivity menu appears.
 - **3** Tap [\wedge \vee] to select the sensitivity and then tap [\bigcirc].
 - You can select from <High>, <Middle> and <Low>.
 - The higher FM sensitivity is, the more frequencies that can be received.

Setting Alarm

This player has an alarm which can be set to go off at a scheduled time.

Before you start!

First, you should set the clock for the current time. ▶ page 47



Press and hold [②] to move to the main menu.

Z Tap [⟨⟩] to select <Alarm> and then tap [◎].

3 Tap [$\land \lor$] to select <New Alarm Set> and then tap [\bigcirc].

■ The Alarm Settings menu appears.

4 Tap [∧ ∨] to select a frequency and then tap [≥].

Select either <Once>, <Off>, <Saturday~Sunday>, <Monday~Saturday>,
 Monday~Friday>, or <Everyday>.






6 Tap [⋄⋄] to set the hour and then tap [滲].

7 Tap [∧ ∨] to set the minute and then tap [≥].

Tap [∧∨] to select an alarm sound and then tap [◊].

9 Tap [A V] to select an interval and then tap [].

■ The Confirmation window will appear.



The alarm setting is added to the alarm list.



To edit the alarm setting



- Press and hold [🧿] to move to the main menu.
- **2** Tap [< >] to select <Alarm> and then tap [].
- 3 Tap [∧ ∨] to select the alarm setting to edit in the alarm list and then tap [].
- 4 Use the [$\land \lor \lessdot \gt$] and [\bigcirc] to edit the setting.

To delete the alarm setting

- Tap [∧ ∨] to select the alarm setting to delete in the alarm list and then tap [□].
 - The Delete window will appear.
- **2** Tap [].
 - The Confirmation window will appear.
- $\mathbf{3}$ Tap [$\langle \ \rangle$] to select <Yes> and then tap [\bigcirc].
 - The selected alarm setting will be deleted.



■ The player will sound the alarm when it reaches the scheduled time. Then, tap [^ ∨] and use the [○] to select <Alarm after 3 min> or <Alarm Off>. To end the alarm, press and hold [○] button. You will return to the main menu.



■ If the USB cable is connected to the player, the alarm function does not work.

Setting Display You can adjust the screen saver and the turn-off time for the screen display.



- 1 Press and hold [2] to move to the main menu.
- **2** Tap [$\langle \cdot \rangle$] to select <Settings> and then tap [\bigcirc]. ■ The Settings menu appears.

- What is ID3-Tag?

This is what is attached to an MP3 to carry information relevant to the file, such as the title, artist, album, year, genre and a comment field.

Setting the System You can set various functions of the player.

 - Files: < Music> indicates the number of music files, < Photo> for the number of photos, and < Total> for the number of entire files.

<Yes>: Initializes all settings to default.

<No> : Cancels default settings.



If you reset the player, all functions you set are initialized to the default(factory) settings.


