

1. Read these instructions.

2. Keep these instructions.

The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.

3. Heed all warnings.

All warnings on the product and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.

4. Follow all instructions.

All operating and use instructions should be followed.

5. Do not use this apparatus near water.

Do not use this product near water and moisture, for example: near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink or laundry tub; in a wet basement; or near a swimming pool.

6. Clean only with dry cloth.

Unplug this product from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a dry cloth for cleaning.

7. Do not block any ventilation openings. Install in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.

Slots and openings in the cabinet and in the back or bottom are provided for ventilation, to ensure reliable operation of the product and to protect it from overheating. 
18. Object and liquid entry.

Never push objects of any kind into this product through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short out parts that could result in fire or electric shock. Never spill or spray any type of liquid on the product.

19. Outdoor antenna grounding.

If an outside antenna is connected to the product, be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built up static charges. Section 810 of the National Electric Code ANSI/NFPA 70 provides information with respect to proper to grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge product, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge product, connection to grounding electrodes and requirements for the grounding electrodes.

21. Replacement parts.


NOTE: Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel Servicing is required when the unit has been damaged in any way such as the following: the power-supply coredor plug has been damaged, liquid has been spilled into unit, the unit has been exposed to rain or moisture, the unit has been dropped or the unit does not operate normally.

POWER SOURCE

AC Operation:

Unwind the AC power cord and extend it to its full length. Insert the small plug of the AC power cord to the unit. Insert the AC plug of the cord into any convenient 120V 60Hz household outlet.

Please note that this unit is equipped with a polarized AC plug which has one blade wider than the other. This is a safety feature to




reduce the likelihood of electric shock. This polarized AC plug will only fit in a polarized AC outlet. If you find that you cannot insert this plug you're your outlet, you may have an obsolete non-polarized outlet. Please do not try to defeat this safety feature by using a non-polarized adaptor or by filling the wider blade to make it fit into your outlet. If this plug does not fit into your outlet, you should contact a qualified licensed electrician to replace your obsolete outlet.

Protect Your Furniture:

This model is equipped with non-skid rubber 'feet' to prevent the product from moving when you operate the controls. These 'feet' are made from non-migrating rubber material specially formulated to avoid leaving any marks or stains on your furniture. However certain types of oil based furniture polishes, wood preservatives, or cleaning sprays may cause the rubber 'feet' to soften, and leave marks or a rubber residue on the furniture. To prevent any damage to your furniture we strongly recommend that you purchase small self-adhesive felt pads, available at hardware stores and home improvement centers everywhere, and apply these pads to the bottom of the rubber 'feet' before you place the product on fine wooden furniture.

Battery Install:



NOTE:

- 1. The button cell battery contains mercury, don't put in the trash. Recycle or dispose as hazardous waste.
- 2. Remove the protective covering from the remote's battery compartment before using the remote control at first time.


BATTERY PRECAUTIONS:

Follow these precautions when using a battery in this device:

- 1.Use only the size and type of battery specified.
- 2.Be sure to follow the correct polarity when installing the battery as indicated in the battery compartment. A reversed battery may cause damage to the device.
- 3.Do not mix different types of batteries together (e.g. Alkaline and Carbon-zinc) or old batteries with fresh ones.
- 4.If the batteries in the device are consumed or the device is not to be used for a long period of time, remove the batteries to prevent damage or injury from possible battery leakage.
- 5.Do not try to recharge the battery not intended to be recharged; it can overheat and rupture. (Follow battery manufacturer's instructions.)
- 6.Do not dispose of battery in fire. Battery may explodes or leak.
- 7. Clean the battery contacts and also those of the device prior to battery installation.

Connecting the Speakers


1. Connect the external speakers to the unit by plugging the speaker cables into the corresponding speaker jacks on the unit.




Connecting the Headphone

For private listening, connect headphone (not included) into the Phones Jack on the rear of unit. The speakers will be disconnected when headphone are inserted into the jack.

Control Definitions

1 Standby Button

Press the Standby Button to turn the unit on or off (Standby mode)

2 CLOCK SET Button

Press and hold this button then press the HOUR button at the same time to set hour. Press the MIN button to set minute.

- 3 Hour Button
- 4 Minute Button

5 DBBS Button (Dynamic Bass Boost System)

Press to turn DBBS on, the DBBS Indicator will lit. Press again to turn it off, the DBBS Indicator will not lit.

6 Volume Knob

Turn to adjust volume.

7 LCD Display

8 AUX - iPod - RADIO Function Selector

- ~ Slide to RADIO position to turn on the radio.
- ~ Slide to iPod to playback the music from the connected iPod.
- ~ Slide to AUX to playback the music from the connected external audio device via AUX IN Jack.

9 Band Switch

- ~ Slide to AM when receiving the AM band Radio stations.
- ~ Slide to FM when receiving the FM band radio stations.

10 IR

Infrared Sensor

11 Play/Pause ► II Button

Press to play or pause the playback of the docked iPod

12 & 13 Skip/Search►►I/ I◄ Buttons

- ~ Press the Skip/Search Buttons to skip tracks on a docked iPod.
- ~ Press and hold the Skip/Search Buttons to search through individual tracks on a docked iPod.

14 Tuning Knob

Turn to searching the radio stations.

- 15 Headphone Jack
- 16 AUX IN Jacks
- 17 Speaker Jacks
- 18 DBBS On Indicator

Setting the Clock

- 1. Press and hold the **CLOCK Set Button**
- 2. While holding the **CLOCK Set Button**, press the **Hour Button** to adjust the hour and the **Minute Button** to adjust the minute.
- 3. When finished, release the **CLOCK Set** Button.

Radio Operations:

- 1. Press the Standby Button on the unit or Remote Control to power on the unit.
- 2. Slide the **RADIO/iPod/AUX** selector to RADIO position.
- 3. Slide the **Band Switch** to AM or FM as desired. (Note: If stereo FM radio station is receiving, the unit will play it in stereo mode automatically without any indicators.)
- 4. Turn the **Tuning Knob** to receive the desired radio station. The radio frequency of the selected station will appear on the display.
- 5. Turn the **Volume Knob** to adjust volume as desire.
- 6. When finished listening, press the Standby button to power off the unit.

ANTENNAS

- AM This unit has a build in ferrite rod antenna, which provides adequate reception in most areas. If reception is weak, turn the unit to improve reception.
- FM The FM Wire Antenna is for FM reception only. If reception is weak, adjust the location of the antenna.

Connecting to an External Audio Player using the AUX IN Jack

- 1. Insert one side of the 3.5mm audio connection cable (not included) to the AUX IN Jack on the rear of unit.
- 2. Insert the other side of the connection cable to the Phones jack /Line out jack/Aux Out jack of the external audio device. (Such like the non-dockable iPod Player, MP3 Player, CD Discman ..etc)
- 3. Slide the AUX/iPod/RADIO Selector to AUX IN position.
- 4. Power on both units.
- 5. Play the music in the connected external audio device as usual.
- 6. Turn the VOLUME Knob to adjust volume.

Docking an iPod

1. Select the correct iPod adapter as the table below to matching your iPod.

iPod Adapter #8 - iPod Nano (1st Gen, 2nd Gen, 4th Gen)

iPod Adapter #10 - iPod (4th Gen, 5th Gen (Video), iPod Classic)

iPod Adapter #13 - iPod Nano (3rd Gen)

iPod Adapter #14 - iPod Touch (1st Gen, 2nd Gen)

- 2. Insert the selected iPod adaptor to the docking on the unit then insert the iPod to the docking as the figure on the right.
- 3. Slide the RADIO/iPod/AUX IN Selector to iPod position
- 4. Power on the unit as previous procedures. The unit will start playback the music in the connected iPod automatically.
- 5. Turn the VOLUME Knob to adjust volume.
- 6. During playback:
- A. Press the Play/Pause Button on the unit or Remote Control to pause, press again to resume normal playback.
- B. Press the Skip/Shearing Button repeatedly to skip tracks as desire.
- C. Press and hold the Skip/Searching Button to fast searching the specify section as desire.
- D. Press the Stop Button on Remote Control to stop playback.
- E. Press the REPEAT Button on the remote Control to set the repeat mode to Repeat One (play the current track repeatedly) or Repeat All (play all the tracks in the iPod repeatedly.) as desire. The correspondence icon will appear on the iPod's screen.
- F. Press the SHUFFLE Button on the Remote Control to turn the random playback mode ON or OFF. The correspondence icon will appear or disappear on the iPod's screen.
- G. Press the CHAPTER + or Buttons on the Remote Control repeatedly to select the pervious/next chapter as desire.
- H. Press the PLAY LIST Buttons on the Remote Control repeatedly to select the pervious/next play list as desire.
- I. Press the ALBUM Buttons on the Remote Control repeatedly to select the pervious/next album as desire.
- J. Press the MENU Button on the Remote Control to return to pervious menu as press the MENU Button on the iPod.
- K. Press the direction buttons on the Remote Control to moving the cursor on the iPod's menu.
- L. Press the SELECT Button on the Remote Control to confirm your selection as press the center Button on the iPod.



NOTES ON CLEANING:

- ~ Use a soft, dry cloth for cleaning.
- ~ For stubborn dirt, soak the cloth in a weak detergent solution, wring well and wipe. Use a dry cloth to wipe it dry. Do not use any type of solvent, such as thinner and benzene, as they may damage the surface of the unit.
- ~ If you use a chemical-saturated cloth to clean the unit, follow that product's instructions.
