Overview

Bluetooth™ is a low-power wireless networking standard which uses short radio waves to allow electronic devices to communicate with each other without using cables.

The following applications are supported by Bluetooth™ technology:

- Synchronize your Bluetooth™ PDA with your computer.
- Send your business card to anyone who has a Bluetooth™ device.
- Send or receive files to or from anyone who has a Bluetooth™ enabled device.
- Chat with anyone who has a Bluetooth[™] enabled computer.
- Play a one-on-one serial game without a cable.
- Send an e-mail without being wired to the network.
- Dial up to the Internet on your computer over your Bluetooth cellular phone.
- Send a fax from your computer over your Bluetooth™ cellular phone.

Most Bluetooth-enabled devices have the capability to act as:

- A Bluetooth server these devices provide one or more services, such as access to the Internet, or to other Bluetooth devices.
- A Bluetooth client these devices use the service(s) provided by Bluetooth servers.

Most Bluetooth devices that can act as both server and client, and can often do both at the same time.

Introduction

IOGEAR[®]'s Wireless Bluetooth[™] to USB Adapter is a Class 1 (for GBU311 and GBU312) device with a wireless working distance of 330 feet (100 meters). This device allows any computer with USB connections to become a Bluetooth[™] enabled computer. It complies with Bluetooth 1.2 and USB 1.1 specifications, and provides users with a 723 Kbps data transfer rate at ranges up to 330 feet. It also enables wireless Personal Area Network (PAN) connectivity to Bluetooth[™] enabled devices such as PDA's, printers, cellular phones, computers, etc.

The Wireless Bluetooth™ to USB adapter is compatible with both PC and Mac. It is easy to install and use, and very portable. Another great solution from IOGEAR® for home and mobile networking needs.

GBU211 is a class 2 device with a wireless working distance of 60 feet (20 meters).

1. Make sure that the IOGEAR Bluetooth™ Adapter is NOT plugged into the USB port of the computer. With the computer turned on and Windows 2000, or XP running (The support for 98SE and ME is limited), insert the IOGEAR Bluetooth™ Installation CD into the CD-ROM drive. The auto-start feature starts the installation. If auto-start is disabled on your computer, click Start>Run and type d:\setup.exe (d: being the CDROM drive).

The IOGEAR Bluetooth InstallShield Wizard will appear. Click the [Next] button.


Note: If you have other Bluetooth software already installed, please uninstall it completely before installing the IOGEAR Bluetooth software on the CD.



Next the License Agreement screen will appear. Click the "I accept the terms in the license agreement" and click [Next].




Click the [Next] button to accept the default destination installation folder or click the [Change] to choose the different installation folder.





4. Click the [Install] button to begin the installation

5. The installation may take a few minutes.





A Driver Signature Notice may appear. Click the [OK] Button to continue the installation.



 During the installation, a "Bluetooth™ device not found" window will appear. Please insert the Bluetooth to USB adapter into the available USB port of the computer, and then click OK.



8. Once the installation is complete, click the [Finish] button to complete the wizard. At this point, we recommend that you reboot the system.



- Now double click the Bluetooth[™] icon in the system tray. This will start the "Initial Bluetooth Configuration Wizard."
- Once the Initial Bluetooth™ Configuration Wizard has started, click [Next]





Next, enter a unique name for this computer.
 This name will be displayed to other
 Bluetooth™ devices. Select a computer type from the drop-down menu and click [Next].



 Click next to configure the services this computer will offer to other Bluetooth™ devices.



5. Choose the services that this computer will offer to other Bluetooth™ devices by placing a check in the box. To display the properties, click on the configure button. Click [Next] to proceed.



6. At this point, Windows will install the software necessary for the services you selected.

7. Once Windows is finished installing the software, the following window will appear. This window will allow you to configure your computer to use the service of another Bluetooth Device. If you do not have any additional devices you wish to connect to at this time, click [Skip]. Click [Finish] on the final screen.



 After the configuration, you can double click the Bluetooth icon to My Bluetooth Place, and search for the nearby Bluetooth devices

Note: If the desired device does not appear, click on the [Search Again] button.



9. Next you will need to Pair your computer with the device you wish to connect to. Enter a PIN code for the device and click the [Initiate Pairing] button. If the device you are connecting to does not require a PIN click the [Skip Pairing] button. 10. Next, the window will display the services available through the selected Bluetooth™ device. Check the box next to the service you want to access.





11. Once you check the box next to the service you wish to connect to, a properties window will appear. Click [OK] to continue.



12. Next, click [Finish] to proceed.

13. A window will appear advising you that a shortcut has been placed on the My Bluetooth™ Places screen. Click [OK] to close the window.



14. If you have another Bluetooth™ device and you want to configure to allow this computer to use its services, click [Next]. Otherwise click [Skip].



 You have completed the Initial Bluetooth Configuration Wizard. Click [Finish] to complete the wizard



Un-installation

- With your IOGEAR® Bluetooth™ USB Adapter inserted in the computer, click Start > Settings > Control Panel
- 2. Click on Add/Remove Programs
- 3. Click on *IOGEAR® Bluetooth™ Adapter* and click on [Remove].
- 4. When the uninstall is complete, remove the IOGEAR® Bluetooth™ Adapter, and restart your computer

Re-installation


Under normal circumstances, you will not need to re-install drivers for your IOGEAR[®] Bluetooth™ USB adapter; however, the need may arise if your hard drive is formated. To re-install the drivers, please follow steps 1-13 in the installation section.

How to connect to a Cellular Phone (Bluetooth Enabled)

 Double-click on the IOGEAR® Bluetooth ™ icon in the system tray.




Next, click on Search for devices in range. As illustrated below, the Bluetooth-enabled cell phone is detected.



3. Right-click on the cell phone, and select Pair Device. When prompted for passkey, simply type any four digits and click OK. On the phone, you will also be prompted to enter a passkey. Make sure you enter the same passkey as on the computer. Your devices should now be paired.



4. In our example, we used a Nokia 3650 cell phone. Double-click on the phone to see the available services. The services offered by your cell phone may depend on the features supported by your specific model and may or may not require additional software by the phone manufacturer.



In the case of Nokia phones, you can take full advantage of your Bluetooth phone by using the Nokia PC Suite software. Please check www.nokia.com to see the version of the software supported by your Nokia phone. Once you have the Nokia PC Suite software installed on your system, please proceed with the instructions below.



5. In order for the Nokia PC Suite software to detect the Bluetooth phone, we need to first have a Bluetooth Serial Port communication established. Therefore, right-click on the Bluetooth Serial port service and connect to it as illustrated below. You may be asked to authorize the connection or enter a passkey, enter the necessary information to proceed.



6. When you establish a connection, the Bluetooth icon will turn green, as shown below. At this point, you can now launch the Nokia PC Suite software.



In our example, we used Nokia PC Suite version 3.0, since it is what the Nokia 3650 supports. Below, you will find some illustrations of the tasks that you can perform with the Nokia PC Suite

Backup/Restore

Using the Nokia PC Suite, you can backup/restore your phone settings and critical information such as contacts, calendar, images, and so on. As shown below, you can select to backup/restore all data, or you can select only specific data.



Synchronize


The Synchronize function allows you to synchronize calendar and contact information between your cell phone and computer using Microsoft Outlook and Lotus.

 The first thing you have to do is select the type of information you wish to synchronize. Once you make your selection, click Sync Now.





Next, select the Application you use for your calendar/contacts from the list below, and then click OK. In our example, we use Microsoft Outlook 2000.




On the summary window, you are given a list of the tasks that will be performed. If you wish you customize the tasks to be performed, click on the Change button.






4. On the Entries tab, you can specify the information to synchronize and the date range

When you are done making your changes, click OK to proceed, and your selected tasks will be performed. Your PC and cell phone calendar/ contact information will now be synchronized.



Note: If you get any errors, you may not have your application (ex: Outlook) setup correctly. Please double-check all your selections and try again.



File Transfer

With file transfer, you can transfer files between your phone and computer. Normally files stored on your PC are much larger than what your cell phone's memory is capable of storing. Therefore, some file types (such as video, audio, pictures) are automatically converted/compressed when transferring from your PC to your phone.

To transfer a file, simply select the file and then click the button in the middle as shown below.



Image Transfer

With Image Transfer, you can copy image files between your phone and computer. For example, you can transfer all the pictures that you take on your phone, to your PC. You can also transfer pictures stoo big to fit on your phone, it will be automatically converted to fit on your phone.



How to Connect to Network Access (Bluetooth - Enabled Computer)

 Double-click on the IOGEAR Bluetooth Icon in the system tray.



Next, click on Search for devices in range. As illustrated below, the Bluetooth-enabled computer is found.





- Double click on the device to display a list of its services. To establish a network connection, right click on Network Access and select Connect to Network Access Point.
- When the connection is being established, you will be prompted to accept/deny the connection on your other computer. To allow access, click OK.





- 5. Once you establish the connection, the Network Access icon will turn green and say "Connected." Your device will be able to share its Internet connection (if the device has Internet access) and files. If a pass key has been set by either device, the pass key is required to connect both BluetoothTM enabled devices.
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
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- 6. At any time, when service requests are made from or to another Bluetooth™ device (e.g. File Transfer, Network Access, Serial Port Connection, etc.), a pass key is required to connect the devices. This authentication is not required once devices are paired (see Chapter: What's Pairing?).


How to connect to a Bluetooth™ Enabled Printer

 Double-click on the IOGEAR® Bluetooth™ icon in 2. Next double click on "Find Bluetooth™ Devices". the system tray.





- 3. Double click on the printer you wish to connect to. 4. Click OK to install the printer. If your printer is
 - Click OK to install the printer. If your printer is already installed, the printer properties window will appear.





5. If your printer is already installed, the printer properties window will appear. Click on [Print Test Page] to print a test page.



How to connect to a PDA (Personal Digital Assistant)

Double-click on the IOGEAR® Bluetooth™ icon in the system tray.
 Next double click on "Find Bluetooth™ Devices".





Once the search is finished, double click on the PDA to view the services it offers.



4. At any time, when service requests are made from or to another Bluetooth™ device (e.g. File Transfer, Network Access, Serial Port Connection, etc.), a pass key is required to connect the devices. This authentication is not required once devices are paired (see Chapter: What's Pairing?).

How to add Bluetooth™ to your MAC OS X system (requires OS 10.2.x or later)

- Plug in the Bluetooth™ USB Adapter to any available USB port on your PowerBook G4, iBook, PowerMac G4 or iMac (in the case of the PowerMac G4 and iMac, you can attach the Bluetooth™ USB Adapter to the free USB port on your keyboard).
- Open System Preferences and locate the Bluetooth icon under Hardware. Double-click on the Bluetooth icon to bring up the Bluetooth window.



Under the settings tab, make sure that the Bluetooth device is set to "discoverable" and change any other settings according to your preference.



4. On the File Exchange tab, you may customize how you want to share files with other Bluetooth devices and give the proper permissions.



5. On the devices tab, you may pair with your Bluetooth device(s) or search for other Bluetooth devices available to you. In this example, we will connect to a Bluetooth cell phone. The procedure for other Bluetooth devices is similar. Simply follow the Bluetooth setup assistant.



6. To proceed with the detection of your Bluetooth phone, click on Continue.



On the next window, select the type of device you want to configure. In this case, we want to configure a Mobile Phone.



 Once the system is done searching, it will display a list of all the Bluetooth phones available.
 Select the desired phone, and click Continue to proceed.



On the next window, the Setup Assistant will generate a passkey to pair your computer with your Bluetooth phone. Enter this key on the phone when prompted.



10. Next, select the services you want to setup and then click Continue.



11. Your computer is now set up to use your Bluetooth™ phone. Click the Quit button to complete the installation or click "Set up Another Device" to add another Bluetooth™ device.

What is "Pairing?"

Pairing is a Bluetooth™ function that enables Bluetooth™ devices to remain permanently linked to another.

What "Pairing" means in terms of security?

As mentioned, Pairing allows devices to permanently link with each other. The pass key authentication will also be perpetuated in Pairing, meaning that devices will not ask for a pass key once they are paired. Paired devices will remain linked, even if other paired devices are turned off. Once a paired device turns back on, it is ready to be used and service requests will not ask for the pass key again. The built-in 128 bit security encryption of BluetoothTM assures the privacy of your paired devices. Note: If devices are unpaired, it is necessary to enter a pass key each time a service request is made from or to another BluetoothTM device.

Pairing Devices

- 1. Right-click on the Bluetooth™ device and select on "Pair device".
- Enter a Pass Key when asked.

Note: The Pass Key on both devices must be the same!

Example: If Device 1 tries to pair with Device 2, Device 1 will prompt for a Pass Key. Enter any Pass Key. Device 2 will then ask for a Pass Key. Enter the Pass Key, which has been set for Device 1. Done!

3. The device is now paired with your computer.

Unpairing Devices

- Right-click on the paired Bluetooth[™] device in the list and select on "Unpair Device".
- 2. The device is now unpaired

Microsoft® Stack for Bluetooth™

Microsoft® has released Windows® XP support for Bluetooth™ wireless technology. Support for Bluetooth™ wireless technology is available only for Windows® XP Service Pack 1 (SP1) or later versions. The HID, HCRP, and DUN profiles are implemented.

1. First, open the Control Panel and double click on the Wireless Link icon.



 Next, a window will appear displaying a list of devices your computer is connected to. To add devices, click [Add] to start the Bluetooth[™] Connection Wizard.



 Once the Bluetooth[™] Connection Wizard starts, click [Next].




- The Wizard will then ask you whether the device requires authentication. Select the appropriate radio button and click [Next].
