Follow these instructions to adjust and operate all the functions of your new mini system. Please read and perform the instructions in the order shown.

### **General Information**

- The typeplate (which contains the serial number) is located at the rear of the set.
- Recording is permissible if copyright or other rights of third parties are not infringed.
- 1 All unnecessary packaging material has been omitted. We have tried to make the packaging easy to separate into three mono-materials:
  - cardboard (box)
  - expandable polystyrene (buffer)
  - polythene (bags, protective foam sheet).
     Please observe the local regulations regarding the disposal of these packaging materials.
- 2 Your set consists of materials which can be recycled and reused if disassembled by a specialized company. Please follow local regulations on recycling your old set.
- 3 Do not dispose of dead batteries with your household waste. Dispose of batteries according to local regulations.
- 4 Note: Switching off the standby mode overnight (remove the AC power cord from the wall socket) will save energy.




# **Safety Information**

- Before operating the system, check that the operating voltage indicated on the typeplate (or the voltage indication beside the voltage selector) of your system is identical with the voltage of your local power supply. If not, please consult your dealer. The type plate is located at the rear of your system.
- When the system is switched on, do not move it around.
- · Place the system on a solid base (e.g. a cabinet).
- Place the system in a location with adequate ventilation to prevent internal heat build-up in your system.
- Do not expose the system to excessive moisture, rain, sand or heat sources.
- Under no circumstances should you repair the unit yourself, as this will invalidate the warranty.
- If the system is brought directly from a cold to a warm location, or is placed in a very damp room, moisture may condense on the lens of the CD unit inside the system. Should this occur, the CD player will not operate normally. Leave the power on for about one hour with no disc in the unit until normal playback is possible.
- Electrostatic discharge may cause unexpected problems. See whether these problems disappear if you unplug the AC power cord and plug it in again after a few seconds.
- To disconnect the system from the power supply completely, withdraw the AC power cord from the wall socket.

# Inserting the batteries into the Remote Control

 Insert two batteries (Type R03 or AAA) into the remote control as shown inside the battery compartment.



 To avoid damage from possible battery leakage, remove dead batteries or batteries that will not be used for a long time. For replacement use type R03 or AAA batteries.

# (A) AM Antenna Connection

Connect the supplied loop antenna to the AM AERIAL terminal. Adjust the position of the AM loop antenna for the best reception.


# **B** FM Wire Antenna Connection

Connect the supplied FM wire antenna to the FM 300  $\Omega$  terminal. Adjust the position of the FM antenna for the best reception.

#### **Outdoor Antenna**


For better FM stereo reception connect an outdoor FM antenna to the FM AERIAL 300  $\Omega$  terminal using a 300  $\Omega$  dipole wire.

# © Speaker Connections



- Connect the right speaker to terminal R, with the red wire to + and the black wire to -.
- Connect the left speaker to terminal L, with the red wire to + and the black wire to ---.
- · Clip the stripped portion of the wire as shown

# (D) Connecting other equipment to your system

You can connect the audio left and right outputs of TV, Laser Disc or VCR to the AUX IN terminal at the rear of the system.

# Subwoofer Out (optional)

You may connect an external active subwoofer (recommended Model FB 201) to the SUBWOOFER OUT socket to enhance the mini system. The subwoofer reproduces bass sound (e.g. explosions, the rumble of spaceships, etc.). For specifications of the subwoofer, see Specifications. Be sure to follow the instructions supplied with the subwoofer unit.

# (F) Wireless Surround Out (optional)

You may connect a wireless rear speakers infrared transmitter (recommended Model FB 206W) to the SURROUND OUT socket instead of the supplied wired rear speakers. Be sure to follow the instructions supplied with the wireless rear speakers.

# G Line Out (ready)



#### Line Out for remote active speakers

There is a possibility of locating additional front active speakers away from the system (e.g. in another room). It reduces the inconvenience of running long speaker wires across rooms. You can place as many remote speakers as you like provided that they operate at the same radio frequency. Connect the wireless radio frequency transmitter to the LINE OUT sockets. Place the active speakers at your preferred location. Be sure to follow the instructions supplied with the active speakers.

# (H) AC Power Supply

After all other connections have been made, connect the AC power cord to the set and to the wall outlet.





# **Dolby Pro Logic**

This Dolby Pro Logic mini system enables you to experience and enjoy a Home Cinema sound. The Pro Logic system allows more accurate, defined, individual sound sources. Pro Logic provides four outputs: Left, Center, Right and Surround (Rear). Front signals are produced from the Left, Right and Center speakers. The surround signal is reproduced by two speakers placed toward the rear of the listening area.

This Pro Logic decoder enables you to decode the following mode: Dolby Pro Logic Center Normal, Dolby Pro Logic Center Phantom, Dolby 3 Stereo or Stereo.


# Setting up the Dolby Pro Logic system

You must connect the speakers first.

#### **Five-Speakers Connection**


The Center and Rear speakers are included with this mini system.

- · Front speakers: Connect the black wires to the black FRONT terminals and the red wires to the red FRONT terminals.
- Center speaker: Connect the black or non-marked wires to the black CENTER terminal and the blue or marked wires to the blue CENTER terminal.
- Rear (surround) speakers: Connect the black or nonmarked wires to the black REAR terminals and the white or marked wires to the grev REAR terminals. You may also connect a pair of wireless rear speakers (not supplied) from the SURROUND OUT terminal



# **Positioning the Speakers**

To get the best surround sound effect, place the speakers as follows.



# Front Left and Right Speakers

For best listening effect, it is recommended to have the Left and Right speakers to form an angle of approximately 45 degrees to the listener. The speakers are shielded magnetically. Should the magnetic field from the speakers affect the picture of the television, you should increase the distance between the speakers and the TV.

#### Center Speaker

Try to have the center speaker at the same height as the left and right speakers and as close as possible to the screen. Place it directly above or beneath the TV. If you use other speakers make sure that it is magnetically shielded.

#### Surround (Rear) Speakers

The surround speaker should be placed at normal listening ear level. It can also be mounted on the wall at the back of the room. Experiment with the speakers' placement to obtain the best sound.

#### **Test Tone**

This feature enables you to adjust the Front Left, Front Right, Center, and Rear sound levels of the respective speakers in Dolby Pro Logic mode.

#### You must sit at the ideal sitting position to perform this operation.

- 1 Press CD, TAPE, TUNER or VIDEO/AUX on the remote control to switch on the set.
- 2 Press TEST TONE on the remote control.
  - A test signal moves through the Left, Center, Right and Rear speakers respectively.
  - The test signal will last for about 90 seconds.
- 3 Press BALANCE L to adjust the Front Left level setting
- → The display will show the sound level and BSL L +. 4 Press BALANCE R to adjust the Front Right level
- setting.
- ightarrow The display will show the sound level and BBL R=
- 5 Press CENTER +/- to adjust the center level setting.
  - → The display will show either EENT + or EENT -.

# **DOLBY PRO LOGIC**

- 6 Press REAR +/→ to adjust the surround level setting.
  - → The display will show either REAR + or REAR -.
- 7 Adjust the sound level of all the speakers until they are of the same apparent loudness. When you are satisfied with the setting, press TEST TONE again to switch off the test tone.

#### Note:

Set the speakers' level at a normal listening volume level.

When you have completed the Dolby Pro Logic setup, you are ready to experience and enjoy Home Cinema sound.

 Press DPL (DOLBY PRO LOGIC) on the remote control repeatedly to select and cycle through the various sound modes.



- Do not use solvents such as benzine, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or anti-static spray intended for analog records.



#### Cleaning the Heads and the Tape Paths

· To ensure good recording and playback quality, clean the heads (A) and (B), the capstan (C), and pressure roller (D) after every 50 hours of tape operation.



. Use a cotton swab slightly moistened with cleaning fluid or alcohol.




