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## Loading Photos onto the Unit

	USB Play will allow you to browse and play photo content while the unit is powered by the USB connection.
	USB Download will allow you to download photos directly onto the unit.
Step 3:	Press the Menu Button.
Step 4:	A window will pop up on the connected PC computer asking "What do you want Windows to do?".
Step 5:	Double Click "Run the Program".
Step 6:	In this program, photos can be added or deleted to or from the unit.
Step 7:	Click on the "Select Files" button on the top left to find a photo to load.
Step 8:	After the desired image is selected, highlight it in the "File List" in the program, and crop it to size using the selection tool in the "Image Editor".
Step 9:	After the red box is placed, click the blue "Add" arrow, to add the photo to the unit.

## Adjusting the Display Mode

Step 1:	With the unit powered on, press the Menu Button.
Step 2:	Highlight "Display Mode" using the <b>Directional</b> <b>Buttons</b> , and press the <b>Menu Button</b> to select the highlighted option.
Step 3:	Select one of the following options using the <b>Directional Buttons:</b>
	Auto Slide - A slideshow of photos will automatically play when the unit is powered on.
	Manual Slide - The <b>Directional Buttons</b> must be pressed in order to cycle through loaded photos.
Step 4:	Press the <b>Menu Button</b> to select "Auto Slide" or "Manual Slide".

## **Control Definitions**

1.	Mini USB Connection
	Use the Mini USB Connection to connect the unit to a computer.
2.	Menu Button

- Press the Menu Button to access the unit's menu.
- 3. Power Switch

Adjust the Power Switch to turn the unit off or on.

- 4. Hook Connection
  - Use the Hook Connection to connect an ornament hook to the unit.

#### 6. Directional Buttons

The LCD Display displays photos, the time and date, and menu information.

## Setting the Date and Time

Step 1:	With the unit powered on, press the Menu Button.
Step 2:	Press the <b>Directional Buttons</b> to adjust the year, and press the <b>Menu Button</b> to set the year.
Step 3:	Press the <b>Directional Buttons</b> to adjust the month, and press the <b>Menu Button</b> to set the month.
Step 4:	Press the <b>Directional Buttons</b> to adjust the day, and press the <b>Menu Button</b> to set the day.
Step 5:	Press the <b>Directional Buttons</b> to adjust the hour, and press the <b>Menu Button</b> to set the hour.
Step 6:	Press the <b>Directional Buttons</b> to adjust the minute, and press the <b>Menu Button</b> to set the minute.
Step 7:	Press the <b>Directional Buttons</b> to adjust the second, and press the <b>Menu Button</b> to set the second.
Step 8:	The time and date are now set.
	• To view the time and date, select the "Clock Disp" option in the menu.

#### Deleting an Image

Step 1:	With the unit powered on, press the Directional
	Buttons to select a photo you wish to delete.

- Step 2: Press the Menu Button.
- Step 3: Highlight "Delete" using the Directional Buttons, and press the Menu Button to select the highlighted option.
- **Step 4:** The current photo will be deleted from the unit's memory.

### Adjusting the Brightness

Step 1:	With the unit powered on, press the Menu Button.
Step 2:	Use the <b>Directional Buttons</b> to select the "Brightness" feature, and press the <b>Menu Button.</b>
Step 3:	Press the <b>Directional Buttons</b> to adjust the brightness of the unit.
Step 4:	When the desired level of brightness is reached, press the <b>Menu Button.</b>
