Choosing Power Sources

Connecting the mains lead

When you locate a track numbered over 10, press >10 first, then the corresponding number buttons.

You cannot locate a specific track if "SHUF" or "PGM" is lit in the display. Turn off the indication by pressing \blacksquare .
