Where to Install Your Micro-Compact System


To take full advantage of your new micro-compact system, follow these installation instructions before connecting the unit.

- ♦ Install the system on a flat, stable surface.
- Never place this unit on carpeting.
- ♦ Never place this unit in an outdoor area.
- ◆ Maintain an open space of approximately 6 inches (15 cm) on the sides and rear of the system, for ventilation purposes.
- ♦ Make sure that you have enough room to open the compact disc compartment easily.
- ♦ Place the loudspeakers at a reasonable distance on either side of the system to ensure good stereo sound.
- Direct the loudspeakers towards the listening area.
- ♦ For optimum performance, make sure that both speakers are placed at an equal distance above the floor.



Connecting your System to the Power Supply


- ► Before plugging your system into a main socket, you must check the voltage.
- Plug the main lead into an appropriate socket.
- Press the ψ (POWER) button to switch your micro-compact system



Inserting Remote Control Batteries

Insert or replace remote control batteries when you:

- Purchase the micro-compact system
- Find that the remote control is no longer operating correctly
- When replacing the batteries, use a new set of batteries and never mix alkaline and manganese batteries.
- Place your thumb on the position marked ▶ on the battery compartment cover (rear of the remote control) and pull the cover in the direction of the arrow.
- Insert two AAA, LR03 or equivalent batteries, taking care to respect the polarities:
 - + on the battery against + in the battery compartment
 - ♦ on the battery against in the battery compartment
- Replace the cover by sliding it back until it clicks into position.
- If you will not be using the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries to prevent corrosion.
- The remote control can be used up to approximately 7 meters(23 feet) in a straight line. It can also be operated at a horizontal angle of up to 30° from the remote control sensor.




Connecting the Loudspeakers

The loudspeaker connector terminals are located on the rear of the system.

There are two terminals on the system:

- ♦ left speaker (marked L)
- right speaker (marked R)

To achieve the correct sound quality, insert those speaker connector cables to the speaker connector terminals of the system.



Connecting to an External Source

The auxiliary input can be used to take advantage of the sound quality of your micro-compact system when listening to other sources.

Examples: ♦ A television

♦ A DVD player

A VCR

To connect to the external source, the source must have an audio output. In addition, you need an connection cable.


- 1 Set the system to standby mode and disconnect it and the external source from the main socket.
- 2 Connect the audio cable to the rear of the micro component system.


> Be sure to match connector colors.

- Plug the system back into the main socket and press **POWER** to switch it on.
- Select the AUX source by pressing AUX. Result: AUX is displayed.
- Switch the external source on.
- Adjust the volume and balance as required:

 Volume
 Equalizer

<u>Example</u>: You can watch a film and take advantage of stereo sound provided that the original sound track is in stereo (as if you were in a cinema).







Connecting the FM Aerial

How to connect a COAXIAL TYPE aerial.

- ♦ Connect a antenna to the FM antenna terminal.
- ◆ Plug the connector on the FM aerial supplied into the coaxial socket marked FM on the rear of the system.
- Follow the instructions given on Page 16 to tune into a radio station, and determine the best position for the aerial.
- If reception is poor, you may need to install an outdoor aerial.
 To do so, connect an outdoor FM aerial to the FM socket on the rear of the system using a coaxial cable (not supplied).








Connecting an iPod



You can listen to audio from an iPod through the main unit. For iPod operation with this Micro System, see this page and page 11.



- Connect the iPod dock connector to the iPod jack on the Micro System.
- 2. Press the USB button on the remote control to select IPOD to listen to music.
 - You can also use the FUNC. button on the main unit.
 The mode switches as follows:
 MP3/CD → TUNER → USB → IPOD → AUX.
- A iPod is for audio iPod.
- Depending on the type of iPod, you may need to insert one of the dock slots which are provided when you purchase the iPod. (see next page).
- Adjust the volume to a moderate level before you connect your iPod and Micro System.
- When the unit is powered on and you connect an iPod, the unit will charge your iPod's battery.


You can enjoy playback of your iPod using the supplied remote control.

Listening to Music (iPod function)

You can play music files stored in the iPod player by connecting it to the Micro Component system.

- 1. Connect the iPod dock connector to the iPod jack on the Micro System.
- 2. Place the iPod in the Dock.
 - Your iPod is automatically turned on.
- Press the USB button on the remote control to select IPOD mode.
 - If the iPod player is connected to the Micro System, each time you press the the USB button, it will be toggled in the order of USB → IPOD.
- After connecting iPod, Audio clip of iPod is played automatically.
- 5. You can use the remote control or main unit to control simple playback functions such as PLAY, PAUSE, STOP, (**)/(**), (**)/(**) and REPEAT.
 - See page 11 for compatible iPods.
 Compatibility depends on the software version of your iPod.


DEMO/DIMMER function



All functions available on the system can be viewed on the display and the display's brightness can be switched between "on" and "off".

- Press the **DEMO/DIMMER** button. <u>Result:</u> All functions available on the system appear on the front panel display.
- Each of these are explained in detail in this guide. Please refer to the relevant section.
- Press the **DEMO/DIMMER** button.

 Result: The Dimmer function is selected and the display darkens.
- 3 Press the DEMO/DIMMER button once again to brighten the front panel display.
- A display brightness control can only be performed while the system power is on.



Setting the Clock


Your system is equipped with a clock which allows you to turn your system on and off automatically.

You should set the clock:

- ♦ When you first purchase the micro-compact system
- After a power failure
- After unplugging the unit
- For each step, you have a few seconds to set the required options. If you exceed this time, you must start again.
- 1 Switch the system on by pressing POWER.
- Press TIMER/CLOCK twice. Result: CLOCK is displayed.
- 3 Press PROGRAM/SET. Result: The hour flashes.

- When the correct hour is displayed, press PROGRAM/SET. Result: The minutes flash.
- - ◆ You can display the time, even when you are using another function, by pressing TIMER/CLOCK once.
 ◆ You can also use I◁◁ or ▷▷ buttons on the main unit to instead of TUNING button or in step 4. 6.





To play the CD/MP3/WMA-CD

You can play 5 inches or 3 1/2 inches compact disc without an adapter.

You can play 5 inches or 3 inches compact discs without an adapter. This unit has been designed to playback the CD: Audio CD, CD-R, CD-RW and MP3/WMA-CD.

Continued use of irregular shape CD (heart-shape, octagonal, etc.) can damage the unit.

- 1 Press the **FUNC**. button to select the CD function.
- 2 Press the Open/Close(♠) button. Result: The compartment opens.
- Place your disc in the compartment, with the label on the disc facing upwards.
- 4 Close the compartment by pressing the Open/Close(♠) button again.
- Fress the PLAY/PAUSE(▷||) button.
 - Your CD Player will take a few moments to scan through all the tracks recorded on a particular MP3/WMA-CD.
 - The English name of the song may be indicated on the display only if directly downloaded from the PC or if the purchased MP3/ WMA-CD is sorted according to titles(directory).
 - (Other languages besides English may not be indicated.)
 - The English name of the track may not be indicated depending on the characteristics of the MP3/WMA-CD.
- 6 Adjust the volume according to needs with the following procedures. Press the VOLUME button of the main unit.

Press the VOLUME+or –button of the remote control. The volume level can be adjust in(VOL MIN,VOL 1- VOL 29,andVOL MAX).




To pause playback temporarily, press the PLAY/PAUSE(▷||) button. Press PLAY/PAUSE(▷||) again to continue playing the disc.

Remote control:

To pause playback temporarily, press the PAUSE(II) button. Press $PLAY(\triangleright)$ button to continue playing the disc.

- R Press the STOP() button when you have finished.
- ➤ Press and hold OPEN/CLOSE(♠) button for 5 seconds, "LOCK"will be displayed and the compartment doesn't open. In this way you must press and hold OPEN/CLOSE(♠) button for a long time until "UNLOCK" will be displayed, the compartment can open.





Selecting a Track

You can select the track you wish to listen to when a disc is playing.

To play the previous track

Press the Isl within 3 seconds after the current track started playing. Press the Isl twice 3 seconds after the current track started playing.

To play the next track

Press the DDI.


To play the current track


Press the 144 3 seconds after the current track started playing.

To play the track of your choice

Press the Is or Is the appropriate number of times.

♦ You can also use the ◄ or ▶ buttons on the remote control to select a track.





Searching for a Specific Music Passage on a CD

When listening to a compact disc, you can quickly search for a specific music passage on a track.

You can also press and hold down III on the main unit to auto search through the tracks.







What is WMA?



WMA means Windows Media Audio, the global standard for audio signal compression technology.

What is MP3?



MP3 means MPEG1 Layer 3, the global standard for audio signal compression technology. It uses digital compression technology to compress original sound data by up to 12 times without sound quality degradation.

File Compatibility

- The unit will playback files created in MP3 format (Mpeg1. Layer3) with *.mp3 as their extension,and some WMA files with.WMA extension can't be playback.
- ♦ Playback will be impossible for the file of MP2 or 22KHz.
- ♦ DTS-CD can not playback.

How many MP3 files can a CD-R or CD-RW disc record?

The maximum capacity of one CD-R or CD-RW disc is 680 MB.

Normally, one MP3 file has a capacity of 4MB, therefore approximately 170 files can be recorded on a single disc.

Regarding the playback of CD-R/RW

- In the case of an original CD-R(Recordable) recorded in audio CD format, CD-RW(Rewritable) and editing by the user, playback is processed on the respective completed status. (The player may not be played back according to the characteristics of the CD or recorded status.)
- ◆ The CD-RW is comparably less reflexive than CD which causes more time delay to read.


Display Function

(This function is not available during playback of an MP3/WMA-CD.)

You may check the total tracks of the disc.

1 Press the DISPLAY button.

Result: The total tracks number of the disc is displayed, and it will be disappeared after 3 seconds.



Function to skip through 10 tracks at a time

Press the +10 button briefly while playing back a CD and MP3/WMA-CD . The track 10 tracks after the current one will then be played back.

Example: If you want to select track 43 during playback of track 5, press the +10 button four times, and then press the ▶
button three times .

 $5 \rightarrow 10 \rightarrow 20 \rightarrow 30 \rightarrow 40 \rightarrow 41 \rightarrow 42 \rightarrow 43$

















Remain Function

You can check the remaining time.

- 1 Press the REMAIN button .
 - If you press the REMAIN button, the remaining time is displayed.
- **2** To cancel this function, press the **REMAIN** button again.



Repeating One or All Tracks on the Compact Discs


You can repeat indefinitely:

- ♦ A specific track on a compact disc.
- ♦ All tracks on the compact disc selected.
- 1 Press REPEAT button.

Each time you press the REPEAT button, the repeat mode will change as follows:

MP3: RPT TRK \rightarrow RPT DIR \rightarrow RPT DISC \rightarrow RPT SHF \rightarrow RPT OFF. CD: RPT TRK \rightarrow RPT DISC \rightarrow RPT SHF \rightarrow RPT OFF.


- When you wish to stop the repeat function, press REPEAT until RPT OFF is displayed.
 - ♦ RPT TRK: Repeatedly plays the selected track.
 - ♦ RPT DIR: Repeatedly plays all tracks in the selected folder.
 - ◆ RPT DISC: Repeatedly plays the entire disc.
 - RPT SHF: Plays tracks in random order. (Each track can be played one time.)
 - ♦ RPT OFF: Cancels Repeat Playback.



A-B Repeat Playback

You can repeatedly playback a designated section of a CD/MP3/WMA-CD.


- Press the REPEAT A-B button at the ending of desired part.
 'RPT A-B' shows.
- 3 To cancel REPEAT A-B function, press REPEAT A-B button again.
- Point B cannot be set until 5 seconds of playback has elapsed from point A.



Programming the Order of CD Playback (This function is not available of an MP3WMA-CD.)

You can decide:

- The order of the track desired to listen
- The track not desired to listen
 - → You can program up to 24 tracks.
 - ♦ You must stop the compact disc player before selecting the tracks.



Press PROGRAM/SET.


Result: The following indications are displayed:

(01 = Program no., -- -- = Track no. on the disc)

- 3 Select the required track by pressing the ► button:
 - Press the def button to move back through the tracks.
 Press the button to move forward through the tracks.
- Press the Dutton to move lorward through the tracks.
- 4 Press **PROGRAM/SET** to confirm your selection.

Result: The selection is stored and PGQ= is displayed.

- 5 To select other tracks, repeat steps 3 to 4.
- 6 Press PLAY (►) to listen to the track selection in the order programmed.
- When press button one time, compact disc player is stopped, and press button again to cancel the selection.
 - → If you open the compartment or turn off the power, the selection will be canceled.
 - ♦ If you select other functions, the selection will be canceled.





Checking or Changing Programmed CD Tracks



You can check or change your selection of tracks at any time.

- 1 Press once if you have started listening to the selection.
- Press PROGRAM/SET.


 Result: The following indications are displayed:

FHOI: 01

(CH = Check, 01=Program No., -- -- = Track No. on the disc)

- If you have already programmed 24 tracks, **CH** is displayed instead of **PG** when you press **PROGRAM/SET**.
- 3 Press PROGRAM/SET once or more times until the track to be changed is displayed.
- 4 Press

 → button to select a different track.
- 5 Press PROGRAM/SET to confirm your change.
- 6 Press PLAY (►) to start listening to the selection. Result: The first track selected is played.



Playing USB

You can play MP3/WMA files by connecting to various external USB storage devices such as USB flash memory or HDD(Hard Disc drives).

- 1 Connect the external USB storage device to your player.

Cleaning Your Micro-Compact System

Outer Casing

 ♦ If the unit emits an unpleasant odor when in use, unplug it from the main supply and contact the after-sales service.

- Handle your compact discs with care. Always hold them by the edges to avoid leaving fingerprints on the shiny surface.
- When you have finished playing a compact disc, always put it back in its case.
- Do not fix paper or adhesive tape to the discs and do not write on the label.
- ◆ Clean them with a special-purpose cloth.
- Store your compact discs in a clean place, out of direct sunlight, where they will not be exposed to high temperatures.
