Introduction

Introduction

Save a list of German and English vocabulary that you want to learn, study and remember. Add a list of words and definitions not found in the dictionaries in this device. Most of these books include a word search feature that helps you find words just by typing the first few letters. If you can't find the words you want, phonetic spell correction is available to show you other possibilities. In addition, a word search feature is included which allows you to type a "?" in place of any single letter and a "*" in place of zero, one or more letters in a word so that you can search based on the letters you are sure of. Verbs are conjugated in all tenses to make learning and comprehension easier. Hear English words and English and German phrases pronounced in high-quality speech so you can practice saying them correctly. Use the listen, record and playback feature to practice pronouncing words. Listen to a word or phrase, record your pronunciation, then play

them both back to see how you compare. In addition, use the audio player that comes with your LDE-1900 to listen to audio books and music.


Purchase titles and expand your content by loading it from MMC/SD (MultiMediaCard/Secure Digital). These convenient cards (sold separately) slip easily into the side of your LDE-1900. Transfer files directly from your PC to an MMC/SD and you can carry more books, music, and other documents around with you.

Use the Franklin PC View™ feature of the Franklin PC Desktop to view content from the LDE-1900 on a personal computer. Just connect your device to a PC and you can use the dictionary features on a PC screen.

Installing Batteries

Your unit is powered by two AA batteries. Follow these easy instructions to install or replace them.

- 1. Turn your unit off and turn it over.
- Open the battery cover on the back of your unit by pushing in the direction of the arrow.
- 3. Remove the old batteries, if necessary.
- Install the batteries following the +/- markings in the battery compartment.



5. Replace the battery cover.
Warning! If the batteries wear out completely, or if you take more than a few seconds while changing the batteries, the volume, contrast, date and time settings are reset and any recently entered information may be erased. You should always keep written


copies of your important information. **Battery disposal**: Do not dispose of batteries with normal household waste. Please obey your local regulations when disposing of used batteries.

Installing Batteries

Battery Precautions

- Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be re-charged. Never recharge batteries that come with the device.
- Rechargeable batteries are to be removed from the device before being charged.
- Rechargeable batteries are only to be charged under adult supervision.
- Only batteries of the same or equivalent type as recommended are to be used.
- The supply terminals are not to be short-circuited.
- Do not expose batteries to direct heat or try to take batteries apart.
 Follow the battery manufacturer's instructions for battery use.
- Always remove a weak or dead battery from the device.
- To avoid damage caused by leakage of the battery fluid, replace the battery or batteries once every two years regardless of how much the device has been used during that time.
- Should a battery leak, the device may become damaged. Clean the battery compartment immediately, avoiding contact with your skin.
- Keep batteries out of reach of small children. If swallowed, consult a physician immediately.

Understanding Your Device




Screen in Lid: The screen of the LDE-1900 is contained in the lid, so you can tilt the screen for optimum viewing.

Speaker: The speaker is located in the bottom left corner on the front of your device. For best results do not cover the speaker.

Microphone: The microphone is located at the upper right corner of the speaker. Speak into this when recording.


Understanding Your Device



AC Adapter Jack: The AC/DC adapter input requires regulated 5 volt output of at least 500 milliamperes.

This symbol indicates that the inner core of the plug of an AC adapter is positive and that the outer part of the plug is negative. If the symbol on your AC/DC adapter does not match the above symbol, confirm its compatibility at its place of purchase. **Headphone Jack**: The headphone jack is designed for 3.5 mm, 35 ohm impedance stereo headphones. **Caution**: Monophonic headphones will not work with this unit.

USB Port: Plug the cable into this port to connect your device to your PC. **MMC/SD Slot**: Insert MMC/SD here. Slide the MMC/SD into the slot with the contacts facing the back of the device. Push gently until it clicks into place. To remove an MMC/SD from the slot, put your thumb on the MMC/SD and push it in slightly. You hear a click and the MMC/SD pops out. Slide it out of the slot.



Note: Your device comes with a placeholder in the MMC/SD slot. You cannot save anything to this card.

Navigation Button



Moves in the indicated direction. In text, press the left (◄) or right (▶) part of the button to highlight the next or previous link, when available. When no links are available, pages up or down. In text, press the up (▲) or down (▼) part of the button to highlight the previous or next link, when available. When no links are available, scrolls up or down one line at a time.







Product Care

Soft Keys

In this device, up to five extra functions are available depending on what you are doing and what you are reading. They are indicated by "tabs" or "labels" across the bottom of the screen. Because they can change from location to location, they are called "soft". To use a Soft Key, press the unlabeled key at the top of the keyboard that corresponds to the label you want.



For example, at the Library, the following Soft Keys are available:

Opens the list of eBooks.

eNews Opens the list of eNews.

Opens the list of miscellaneous text and HTML files.

_____ Opens the list of audio files.

Setup Displays the Settings List.

Please read each individual section for information on what Soft Keys are available.

Your LDE-1900 is designed to be light, compact and durable. However, it is an electronic device and must be treated carefully. Putting unnecessary pressure on it or striking the device against other objects can cause damage.

In order to avoid damage to your LDE-1900, please:

- Keep the lid closed when you are not using it. This will protect the screen from being broken, scratched or marred in any way.
- Do not drop, crush, bend, or apply excessive force to the device.
- Do not expose your LDE-1900 to moisture, extreme temperatures or other adverse conditions. Avoid storing it in damp, humid or wet places. It is not waterproof.
- Clean the device by wiping with a soft, dry cloth. Do not use harsh chemicals.


Resetting Your Device

If the keyboard fails to respond, or if the screen performs erratically, perform a system reset by following the steps below.

1. Use a paper clip to gently press the reset button on your unit.

If nothing happens, try step 2.

The reset button is recessed in a pin-sized hole on the back of the unit, below the battery compartment.



Warning! Pressing the reset button with more than light pressure may permanently disable your product. In addition, resetting the product resets the volume, contrast, date and time settings to their defaults and may erase any recently entered information.

2. Hold CLEAR and press the reset button.

Warning! This restores factory defaults, so all saved information and settings will be erased.

Getting Started

The first time you turn on your device, a contrast bar is displayed. The contrast indicates how dark or light the screen is.



- 2. Press ENTER when done.



The eBooks tab of the Library is displayed.

If you would like to change the font size, you can do so at this time. Simply hold **FN** and press **M** repeatedly until you reach the desired font size.

Changing the Language

Initially, the language of the LDE-1900 is set to German. You can change the message language to English, French, Spanish, or Italian.

- 1. Press Setup.
- 2. Press ENTER to select Persönliche Voreinstellungen.



- Press ▼ to move ► to Sprache (Language).
- 4. Press ▶.



5. Press ▲ to highlight *English* and then press ENTER.

Using the Library

Using the Library

The Library is your home screen.



This is the hub of the LDE-1900 and the place to start in order to access all of the dictionaries and other books stored in your device. At any time, and from any location, press

to return to this location. The Library consists of five tabs: eBooks, eNews, Other, Audio and Setup. The first four of these tabs keep track of the different kinds of files that you can store on your device, and the Setup tab opens the Settings List. To select a tab, simply press the Soft Key that refers to that tab, that is, the blank key at the top of the keyboard that lines up with the name of the tab where it is displayed on the screen.

Try it now by pressing the five Soft Keys at the top of the keyboard to see what happens. Then press

•Books

to return to the list of books.

Utilities

From anywhere within the Library, press (to open the Utilities Menu. From this menu, you can

reset your device to its factory defaults or format an MMC/SD. **Warning!** Resetting to the factory defaults returns the device to its initial settings, as it was when you purchased it, and erases any saved information. Formatting an MMC/SD enables you to erase an MMC/SD without connecting to your PC.

- 1. Press 🕮
- 2. Press 📧.



 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the one you want and then press ENTER.

Restore Factory Default Settings resets all settings to what they were the first time you turned on your device.

Format MMC/SD Card erases all information from an installed MMC/SD.

You are asked to confirm the selected action.

4. Press ok to confirm or cancel to cancel.

Changing the Settings

At the Library, press Setup to display the Settings List. From the Settings List, you can change your user preferences, game settings, date and time settings, and view the version and identification information. For information regarding your game settings, please see "Game Settings" on page 44. For information regarding your date and time settings, please see "Setting the Date and Time" on page 47. Press ▲ and ▼ to highlight the menu item you want and then press ENTER to select it.

User Preferences

- 1. Press (III).
- 2. Press Setup.



- Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight User Preferences and then press ENTER.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to move ► to Contrast, Font Size, Language, Learn A Word, Auto-shutoff, Justification, or Margins.

Changing the Settings

Contrast determines how dark or light the screen is.

Font Size determines how large or small the text is in this device.

Language determines the language used for helptext, menu items and pop-up messages.

Learn A Word determines whether or not you see a word every time you turn on your device.

Auto-shutoff determines how long your device stays on if you forget to turn it off.

Justification determines whether or not the text of your books is fully justified.

Margins determines whether or not books have margins.

5. Press ➤ to open the menu of options.

Note: For *Contrast*, there is no menu of options; ▶ and ◀ simply adjust the screen contrast when the pointer is there.

- 6. Press ▲ or ▼ to move the highlight to your choice.
- 7. Press or ENTER to accept the setting.

Press (=) to exit the menu without changing the setting.



Changing the Settings

✓ Learn A Word

Your LDE-1900 comes with a Learn A Word feature to help you increase your English or German vocabulary. Each time you turn on your device, you can see a different word taken from one of the dictionaries in your device.





From the User Preferences menu, open the *Learn A Word* options menu. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the book you want to use and then press **ENTER**. You can learn

English words from either the Langenscheidt Handwörterbuch Englisch-Deutsch or the Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary or German words from the Langenscheidt Handwörterbuch Deutsch-Englisch.

Information

The information screen displays version and identification information about your LDE-1900 as well as your Personal ID number (PID). You may be asked for your PID when you register your device or purchase books and other content from Franklin or Mobipocket.

✓ Help is Always at Hand

For additional assistance while you use your device, a help message is available at any screen by pressing (1). Use the navigation button to read the message. Press (5) to exit help. This information is also available by selecting *Tutorial* in the Library.

Selecting a Book

In your LDE-1900, you can select from a variety of reference material that comes with your device. You can look up English and German translations using the Langenscheidt English-German and German-English dictionaries, English definitions using the *Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary*, and everyday and travel phrases in the English and German phrasebooks. You can learn German and English grammar rules and topics. You can study English words included in the TOEFL® Test.

1. Press .

The eBooks tab is displayed.



 Press ▲ and ▼ to move the highlight to Langenscheidt Handwörterbuch Deutsch-Englisch and then press ENTER to select it.

Selecting a Book



Note: This is the method to select any book or file in any of the tabs. That is, use the navigation button to scroll through your list of files, and press **ENTER** to open the highlighted file.


Note: eNews is only available through the Mobipocket Reader for Franklin, made available through the Franklin PC Desktop. For more information on using your device on your PC, please see "Using the Franklin PC Desktop" on page 57.

After selecting Langenscheidt Handwörterbuch Deutsch-Englisch, you see a word search screen. Type words at this screen for instant access to all the translations in this book.


Note: You can type and search for words in all of the dictionaries in your LDE-1900.

1. Begin to type a German word, for example *Eisenbahn*.

As you type letters, the first word in the book that matches the letters you type will move to the top of the word list. You may not have to type the entire word in order to find the one you want. In this example, note that "Eisenbahn" appears on the screen after you type "eise".



When the word you want is on the screen, press ▼ until the word you want is highlighted.



Looking Up a Word

Or you can continue typing letters until the word is complete and the matching word in the list is automatically highlighted.

3. Press ENTER to look it up.



4. Use the navigation button to read the entire definition.

Press • to hear the word.

Note: Only English headwords can be pronounced.

✓ Spell Correction

If you type a misspelled word, inflected form, or a word not in a book, nothing in the word list will be highlighted as a match. Press **ENTER** to view a list of possible spelling corrections for the word as you typed it.



Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the word you want, then press ENTER to look it up.

✓ MatchMaker

If you are uncertain about how to spell a word, type a question mark (?) in place of each unknown letter. To find prefixes, suffixes, and other parts of words, type an asterisk (*) in a word. Each asterisk stands for zero, one or more letters.

Note: If you type an asterisk at the beginning of a word, it may take a little while to find the matching words.

^{*} In the Langenscheidt Handwörterbuch Englisch-Deutsch, this item reads ♣→ E and goes to the empty German word search screen. In addition, the ♣offus Soft Key is displayed when an English word you look up contains Confusables.





Finding Idioms

Some of the dictionaries in your device include idioms in addition to their basic dictionary entries.

From an Entry Screen

Both the Langenscheidt English-German and German-English dictionaries and the *Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary* contain an idiom entry screen.

- 1. Press 🕮.
 - The eBooks tab is displayed.
- Press ▲ and ▼ to move the highlight to the dictionary you want and then press ENTER to select it.
- 3. Press Idioms.



The idiom entry screen is displayed. Press Close to return to the word entry screen.

4. Type a word, for example *Katze,* and then press ENTER.



The list of idioms that contain "Katze" is displayed. Press

Close
to return to the entry screen.

 Press ▲ and ▼ to move the highlight to the idiom you want to view and then press ENTER to select it.



The entry is displayed that contains the idiom you selected.

6. Use the navigation button to read the entire definition.

Press • to hear the word.

Note: Only English headwords
can be pronounced.

7. Press CLEAR when done.

From a Dictionary Entry

Another way to find idioms is from a dictionary entry.

Note: The Idons Soft Key is only available in an entry in the Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary.

- 1. Press 🕮.
 - The eBooks tab is displayed.
- Press ▲ and ▼ to move the highlight the dictionary you want and then press ENTER to select it.
- 3. Type a word, for example *jump* and then press ENTER.



The dictionary entry for "jump" is displayed.

4. Use the navigation button to read the entire definition.









- 3. Press Examples.



The example entry screen is displayed. Press Close to return to the word entry screen.

4. Type a word, for example *spoil* and then press ENTER.



The list of usage examples that contain "spoil" is displayed. Press to return to the entry screen.

 Press ▲ and ▼ to move the highlight to the example you want to view and then press ENTER to select it.



The example entry is displayed.

6. Use the navigation button to read the entire entry.

Press Entry to see the entry for the word. Press Close to return to the list of examples.

7. Press CLEAR when done.


Using the Examples Link

Another way to find examples in the Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary is in an entry. Examples are indicated by the examples link.

- Press ▲ and ▼ to move the highlight Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary and then press ENTER to select it.




Notice **E**^X. This link indicates examples are available.

4. Press ▶ until you highlight EX.



5. Press ENTER.



The example entry is displayed.

6. Press CLEAR when done.

Highlighting Words

Another way to look up words is by highlighting them in text. You can then find their definition or translation, copy the word to the clipboard, highlight the word in the entry, add a note, or edit the word.

1. At any text, press ENTER to start the highlight.



To turn the highlight off, press (=).

Use the navigation button to move the highlight to the word you want.

If you want to highlight more than one word, move the highlight to the first word you want to highlight, then hold (1) and press the navigation button to move the highlight to the last word.



Highlighting Words

3. Press ENTER.



A menu is displayed at the location of the highlight.

Lookup searches for your word in any available dictionary of the same language as the highlighted word.

Translate searches for your word in any available dictionary that translates from the language of the highlighted word to another language.

Copy copies your word to the clipboard.

Highlight saves a highlight over your word or words in the text.

Add note allows you to add an explanatory note regarding that word.

Modify allows you to replace the selected word or words with your own preference.

- Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the option you want and then press ENTER.
- 5. Press CLEAR when done.

Using Annotations, Modifications and Highlights

Your device contains three special features that help you to customize your books. The *Highlight, Modify* and *Add note* menu items allow you to mark, edit and expand the text of any of the books in this device. To review how to highlight a word or words in text, please see "Highlighting Words" on page 24.

Annotations

Customize your learning by entering annotations that explain, in your own words, the meaning and usage of the words you selected. Write examples you can apply in your job or in any other of your daily routines. When you select *Add note* from the menu, a note screen is displayed prompting you to add a note to the text.



Begin typing your note. Use the navigation button to move the cursor. Press () to delete letters. Hold **FN** and press a letter, or press **AKZENT**, to type punctuation marks

and other symbols. Press **CLEAR** to clear the screen. When you are finished typing, press Rdd to add the annotation or press Cancel to exit without adding it.



Your selected word or words are shaded so that you can remember you added a note regarding that section of text.

To edit an annotation, highlight the shaded section of text and press **ENTER**. Then select *Edit annotation* from the menu to see and edit your note. Press Delete to delete the annotation, press Apply to accept any changes to the note, or press Cancel to exit without accepting any changes.

Modifications

When you select *Modify* from the menu, a note screen is displayed containing the highlighted word or words.

Using Annotations, Modifications and Highlights



Begin typing your modification to this text. Use the navigation button to move the cursor. Press (=) to delete letters. Hold FN and press a letter, or press AKZENT, to type punctuation marks and other symbols. Press CLEAR to clear the screen. When you are finished typing, press Red to add the modification or press Cancel to exit without adding it.



Your selected word or words are crossed out in the text, so they stand out as a modification.

Using Annotations, Modifications and Highlights

To edit a modification at a later time, highlight the crossed out section of text and press ENTER. Then select Edit modification from the menu to edit your modifications. Press

Delete to delete the modification, press

Press

Delete to accept any changes to the modification, or press

Cancel to exit without accepting any changes.

Highlights

When you select *Highlight* from the menu, your selected word or words are shaded in the text (a little darker than the shading for annotations) so they stand out and are easy to spot.



To delete your highlight at a later time, highlight the highlighted section of text and press **ENTER**. Then select *Delete highlight* from the menu to erase the highlight.

Viewing Inflections

Inflections show changes in a word's gender, tense, and form. When you see a _______ Soft Key, it means that the dictionary includes extensive inflections of nouns, verbs, modifiers and other words. In this device, inflections are available in the Langenscheidt English-German and German-English dictionaries and in the Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary.

Note: Bilingual dictionaries may include translations of each inflected form.


- 1. Press .
- Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary and then press ENTER.
- 3. Type *play* and then press ENTER.

Copying Files to Your Device

Your device is not limited to the books it comes with. You can copy eBooks, RSS eNews, text documents, HTML files, mp3 music files and other files to expand and personalize your device.

Note: Once you have begun using your Mobipocket Reader for Franklin to download and install RSS eNews subscriptions, any updates to these files will automatically update to your device when you connect it to your PC.

Try copying an mp3 file to your device:

Franklin Flash refers to a drive that stores general purpose files, including your phone book files and My Vocabulary List. You can write to this drive, but available memory is limited. This may appear labelled as My Stuff.

Franklin SD/MMC refers to the drive of any removable MMC/SD installed in your device. Available memory is determined by the size of the card. If you have formatted the card using the Utilities in your device, this will appear as My Card. This may appear labelled as Removable Disk.

Note: When you open **My Computer**, you also see the drive labelled *My Handheld*. This refers to a drive that contains your device's primary content. This drive is read-only.

Right-click in the window where you want to copy the mp3 file and then click Paste from the pop-up menu.




