Region 1 in order to play on this TV/DVD Player. You can not play Discs that are labeled for other regions. Look for the symbols above on your DVDs. If these region symbols do not appear on your DVDs, you can not play the DVD in this TV/DVD Player.

# **BASIC TV AND REMOTE OPERATION**

#### TELEVISION

Your television has a set of controls located on the font of the cabinet for use when the remote control is not needed.

Press the POWER button to turn the TV ON.


Press the VOL (+) button to increase the sound level or the VOL (-) button to lower the sound level.

Pressing both buttons at the same time will display the onscreen menu. After you are in the menu, use these buttons to make adjustments or selections.

Press the CH - (down) or + (up) button to select TV channels. Use these buttons to make adjustments or selections in the onscreen menu.

There is also a set of Audio and Video Input jacks located on the side of the television cabinet. This jack panel also contains a headphone jack that when used will mute the TV speakers. These jacks are great for connecting a video camcorder or any accessory device that will only be hooked up temporarily.

SLEEP Button - Press the Sleep button to set the TV to automatically turn itself off after a set period of time..

**MODE (TV or VCR) Button -** Press to place the remote in the TV or VCR mode. When the desired mode is selected the green LED will light for a second to indicate the present mode, TV or VCR.

POWER Button - Press the Power button to turn the TV on or off.

FORMAT Button - Allows you to choose between the 4:3 04 EXPAND 4:3 screen modes

EJECT Button (DVD) - Opens/Closes the DVD disc tray and places the TV in the DVD mode.

SYSTEM MENU (OSD) Button (DVD) - Allows you to delete stored chan-

SMILEY Button - Press to add channels in the "Quadra Surf" lists. Works with all four colored buttons.

AUDIO Button (DVD) - Press to display the Audio menu when the DVD player is active.

**REPEAT Button (DVD)** - When using the DVD player, press to repeat the playback of a chapter, title, track or the disc.

**SMART SOUND Button** - Press repeatedly to choose from different factory pre-defined sound settings. Choose from Personal (how you set the Sound Menu options), Voice (for programming with speaking), Music (for musical programming), or Theatre (for watching movies).

MENU Button (TV) - Press to display the onscreen menu. Also can be used to back out of the onscreen menu until it disappears from the TV's screen.

CURSOR Right, Left, Up or Down Buttons - Press to navigate, select and adjust controls within the onscreen menu after the Menu button is pressed. These buttons also can be used with a VCR, DVD or similar device and when in that mode. Press the del Left or Right to use as fast forward or fast reverse in the VCR or DVD mode.

**VOL(ume) + or – Buttons -** Press the VOL + button to increase the TV's sound level. Press the VOL - button to decrease the TV's sound level.

MUTE Button - Press to eliminate the sound being heard from the TV. Press again to restore the TV's volume to it's previous level.

OK • Button - Press the OK button to confirm selections and adjustments within the on-screen menus. Also used with the Play button to start a VCR recording when in the VCR mode.

Pause Button (DVD) - Press to pause the playback of a DVD disc or audio CD. Pressing repeatedly will show frame-by-frame playback of a DVD disc.

**CC Button -** Press to activate the Closed Captioning options. Repeatedly press the CC button with scroll the options available on the TV screen.

FROWNIE Button - Allows you to delete stored channels within the "Quadra Surf" lists for the colored buttons.

SUBTITLE Button (DVD - Press to select the subtitle language.

- **REPEAT A-B Button (DVD)** When using the DVD player, press to repeat the sequence in a title.
- SMART PICTURE Button Press repeatedly to choose from 4 different factory pre-defined picture settings. Choose from Personal (how you set the Picture Menu adjustment controls), Movies (when watching movies), Sports (for any sporting event), or Weak Signal (used when the signal being received is not the best).
- TV/DVD Button When in the DVD Mode, press to toggle between DVD viewing and TV viewing. When in the TV mode, this button will have no functionality.
- **DVD MENU Button** Press to display the onscreen menu that is on the DVD disc being played.
- CH(annel) + or Buttons Press to select channels in ascending or descending order.
- PLAY Button When in VCR or DVD mode, press to start the play back of a DVD disc or VCR tape.
- STOP Button When in VCR or DVD mode, press to stop the play back of a DVD disc or VCR tape.
- NUMBERED (0-9) Buttons Press the numbered buttons to select TV channels or to enter certain values within the onscreen menu. For single channel entries, press the numbered button for the channel you desire. the TV will pause for a second or two before changing to the chosen channel.
- A/CH Button (Alternate Channel) Press to toggle between the last view channel and the channel presently being viewed.

## CABLE/CABLE BOX TV

**E BOX TV** Direct Cable Connection:


Your Cable TV input into your home may be a single (75 ohm) cable or use a cable box decoder. In either case the connection is very simple.


Follow the steps below to connect your cable signal to your new television.

## **Direct Cable Connections:**

This connection will supply Stereo sound to the TV.

Connect the open end of the round Cable Company supplied cable to the  $75\Omega$  input on the TV. Screw it down finger tight.






**Connect the open end of the round Cable Company supplied cable** to the cable signal IN(put) plug on the back of the Cable Box.


Using a separate round coaxial cable, **connect one end to the OUT(put) (TO TV) plug on the back of the Cable Box.** 

**Connect the other end of the round coaxial cable** to the 75Ω input on the back of the television. Screw it down finger tight.

**NOTE:** Be sure to set the OUTPUT CHANNEL SWITCH on the back of the cable box to CH 3 or 4, then tune the TV to the corresponding channel. Once tuned, change channels at the cable box, not the television.

#### Cable Box (w/Audio/Video Outputs):


This connection will supply Stereo sound to the TV.
Connect the open end of the round Cable Company supplied cable to the cable signal IN(put) plug on the back of the Cable Box.

Using a RCA type Video Cable, **connect one end of the cable to the Video** (or ANT, your cable box may be labeled differently) **Out jack** on the cable box and the other end to the AV1 Video Input on the TV.

Using a RCA type Audio Left and Right Cable, **connect one end to the left and right Audio Out L & R jacks on the cable box.** Connect the other end to the AV1 Audio L & R Input jacks on the TV.

**NOTE:** Use the Channel +, or – buttons on the TV remote control to tune to the AV1 channel for the cable box signal. Once tuned, change channels at the cable box, not the television.

#### Cable Box with Audio/Video Outputs Connection:





#### Antenna TV

A combination antenna receives normal broadcast channels (VHF 2–13 and UHF 14–69). Your connection is easy because there is only one  $75\Omega$  (ohm) antenna plug on the back of your TV, and that's where the antenna goes.

**If your antenna has a round cable** (75 ohm) on the end, then you're ready to connect it to the TV. **If your antenna has flat, twin-lead wire** (300 ohm), you first need to attach the antenna wires to the screws on a 300- to 75-ohm adapter.

**Push the round end** of the adapter (or antenna) onto the  $75\Omega$  (ohm) plug on the back of the TV. If the round end of the antenna wire is threaded, screw it down finger tight.



# HOOKING UP THE TV

# AVI & AV2 INPUTS

The TV's audio/video input jacks are for direct picture and sound connections between the TV and a VCR (or similar device) that has audio/video output jacks. Both the AV1 and AV2 Input Jack connections are shown on this page, but either one can be connected alone. Follow the easy steps below to connect your accessory device to the AV1 and AV2 in Jacks located on the back of the TV.

**Connect the VIDEO (yellow) cable** to the VIDEO **AV1 in** (or AV2 in) jack on the back of the TV.

**Connect the AUDIO (red and white) cables** to the AUDIO (left and right) **AV1 in** (or AV2 in) jacks on the rear of the TV.

**Connect the VIDEO (yellow) cable** to the VIDEO OUT jack on the back of the VCR (either one or two) or accessory device being used.

**Connect the AUDIO (red and white) cables** to the AUDIO (left and right) OUT jacks on the rear of the VCR (either one or two) or accessory device being used.


Turn the VCR (either one or two) or accessory device and the TV ON.

**Press the CH + or – buttons** on the remote control to select the AV1 channel for accessory device number one, or the AV2 channel for accessory device number two. AV1 or AV2 will appear in the upper left corner on the TV screen depending on the channel chosen.

With either of the VCRs (or accessory devices) ON and a prerecorded tape (CD, DVD, etc.) inserted, **press the PLAY button** to view the tape on the television.

#### CHECK IT OUT


**Note:** The Audio/Video cables needed for this connection are not supplied with your TV. Please contact your dealer or Philips at 800-531-0039 for information about purchasing the needed cables.



## COMPONENT VIDEO INPUTS

Component Video inputs provide for the highest possible color and picture resolution in the playback of digital signal source material, such as with DVD players. The color difference signals (Pb, Pr) and the luminance (Y) signal are connected and received separately, which allows for improved color bandwidth information (not possible when using composite video or S-Video connections).

**Connect the Component (Y, Pb, Pr) Video OUT** jacks from the DVD player (or similar device) to the (Y, Pb, Pr) in(put) jacks on the TV. When using the Component Video Inputs, it is best not to connect a signal to the AV1 in Video Jack.

**Connect the red and white AUDIO CABLES** to the Audio (left and right) output jacks on the rear of the accessory device to the Audio (L and R) AV1 in Input Jacks on the TV.

Turn the TV and the DVD (or digital accessory device) ON.

**Press the CH +, – buttons** to scroll the available channels until CVI appears in the upper left corner of the TV screen.

Insert a DVD disc into the DVD player and **press the PLAY** ▶ **button on the DVD Player.** 

#### HELPFUL HINT

The description for the component video connectors may differ depending on the DVD player or accessory digital source equipment used (for example, Y, Pb, Pr; Y, B-Y, R-Y; Y, Cr, Cb). Although abbreviations and terms may vary, the letters b and r stand for the blue and red color component signal connectors, and Y indicates the luminance signal. Refer to your DVD or digital accessory owner's manual for definitions and connection details.

# HOOKING UP THE TV

#### S-VIDEO INPUTS

T he S(uper)-Video connection on the rear of the TV can provide you with better picture detail and clarity for the playback of accessory sources than the normal antenna picture connections.

**NOTE:** The accessory device must have an S-VIDEO OUT(put) jack in order for you to complete the connection on this page.

**Connect one end of the S-VIDEO CABLE** to the S-VIDEO jack on the back of the TV. Then connect one end the AUDIO (red and white) CABLES to the AV2 in AUDIO L and R(left and right) jacks on the rear of the TV.

**Connect other end of the S-VIDEO CABLE** to the S-VIDEO OUT jack on the back of the VCR. Then connect the other ends of the AUDIO (red and white) CABLES to the AUDIO (left and right) OUT jacks on the rear of the VCR.

Turn the VCR and the TV ON.

**Press the CH + or – buttons** on the remote to scroll the channels until SVHS appears in the upper left corner of the TV screen.

Now your ready to place a prerecorded video tape in the VCR and **press the PLAY**  $\triangleright$  **button**.

## **MONITOR OUTPUTS**

The Monitor (Audio/Video) out jacks are great for recording with a VCR or used to connect an external audio system for better sound reproduction.

#### For Audio System Connection:

Connect one end of the R(ight) and L(eft) AUDIO (Monitor Out) jacks on the TV to the R and L audio input jacks on your amplifier or sound system. Set the audio system's volume to a normal listening level.

**Turn the TV and audio system ON.** You can now adjust the sound level coming from the audio system with the VOLUME (+) or (-) button on the TV or remote control.

#### For Second VCR Connection/Recorder:

**NOTE:** Refer to page 9 for the proper hookup of the first VCR. Follow the instructions on how to tune to the AV 1 channel to view a pre-recorded tape.

The following steps allow you to connect a second VCR to record the program while your watching it.


Connect one end of the yellow Video Cable to the Monitor out VIDEO plug. Connect the other end to the VIDEO IN plug on the second VCR.

**Connect one end of the red and white Audio cable** from the **Monitor out** AUDIO L and R plugs on the TV to the AUDIO IN plugs on the VCR.


**Turn the Second VCR ON,** insert a black VHS tape and it's ready to record what's being viewed on the TV screen.



tion of a VCR, to playback video from a camera or attach a gaming device. Use the CH + or - buttons on the remote control to tune these inputs.

**Connect the video (yellow) cable** from the Video output on the Camera (or accessory device) to the Video (yellow) Input located on the Side of the TV.

**For Stereo Devices:** Connect the audio cable (red and white) from the Audio Left and Right Outputs on the Camera to a Stereo to Mono adapter. Then plug the single end of the adapter to the Audio In (white) jack on the Side of the television.

**For Mono Devices:** Connect one end of the audio cable from the Audio Out jack on the device to the Audio In (white) jack on the Side of the television.

Turn the TV and the accessory device ON.

**Press the CH + or – buttons** on the remote control to tune the TV to the side input jacks. "Front" will appear on the TV screen.

**Press the PLAY** ▶ **button** on the accessory device to view playback, or to access the accessory device (camera, gaming unit, etc.).
