# **Understanding This User Manual**

The sections of this manual generally follow the features of your device. A robust index for features begins on page 206. Also included is important safety information, beginning on page 155, that you should know before using your device. This manual gives navigation instructions according to the default display settings. If you select other settings,

Unless otherwise specified, all instructions in this manual assume that you are starting from a Home screen. To get to a Home screen, you may need to unlock the device. For more information, refer to "Securing Your Device" on page 15.

Note: Instructions in this manual are based on default settings and may vary from your device depending on the software version on your device and any changes to the device's settings. **Note:** Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this user manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

Note: All screen images in this manual are simulated. Actual displays may vary depending on the software version of your device and any changes to the device's settings.

# Special Text

In this manual, some text is set apart from the rest. This special text is intended to point out important information, share quick methods for activating features, define terms, and more. The definitions for these methods are as follows:

- Notes: Presents alternative options for the current feature, menu, or sub-menu.
- Tips: Provides quick or innovative methods or useful shortcuts.
- Important: Points out important information about the current feature that could affect performance.

 Warning: Brings important information to your attention that can help to prevent loss of data or functionality or damage to your device.

#### **Text Conventions**

This manual provides condensed information about how to use your device. To make this possible, the following text conventions are used to represent often-used steps:

→ Arrows are used to represent the sequence of selecting successive options in longer, or repetitive, procedures. For example:

From a Home screen, touch (Menu) → Settings → Wireless and network → Wi-Fi settings.

# **Setting Up Your Device**

Prior to use, it is necessary to install the battery into its corresponding internal compartment. The microSD card slot is also located in this same internal area.

# Removing the Battery Cover

To remove the battery cover:

- Place your fingernail into the slot (1) at the top, right side of the battery cover. If you have fragile nails, use a pointed object.
- 2. Lift the cover up (2) and off (3) the device.





# **Installing a Memory Card**

Your device supports removable microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards, for storage of music, photos, videos, and other files.

**Note:** You can only store music files that you own (from a CD or purchased with the device) on a memory card.

#### To install a memory card:

With the battery cover removed and no battery installed, push the microSD card into the slot (as shown) until it clicks. Make sure the microSD's gold contact pins face downward and the card is securely inserted.



**Note:** Your device has been tested to support up to a 32GB memory card.

# **Removing a Memory Card**

Important! To prevent damage to information stored on the memory card, unmount the card before removing it from the device.

- From a Home screen, touch (Menu) → Settings
   → Storage → Unmount SD card.
- With the battery cover removed and the battery removed, locate the Memory Card Slot as shown in the previous illustration.
- Gently press down on the memory card, so that it pops out from the slot, and carefully pull the card out.

#### **Installing the Battery**

To install the battery:

- Insert the battery into the opening on the back of the device, making sure the connectors align (1).
- **2.** Gently press down to secure the battery (2).

**Note:** Make sure the battery is properly installed before switching on the device.



#### Replacing the Battery Cover

To replace the battery cover:

- Place the battery cover onto the back of the device (1) and press down (2).
- Press down firmly along the edges of the cover (3) to ensure that the cover is flush with the phone. You should hear a light click as the cover locks in place.



# **Charging the Battery**

Your device is powered by a rechargeable, standard Li-lon battery. The Travel Charger that is used to charge the battery is included with your device. Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers.

Note: The battery comes partially charged. You must fully charge the battery before using your device for the first time.

After the first charge, you can use the device while charging.

Warning! Use only approved charging devices. Approved accessories are designed to maximize battery life. Using other accessories may invalidate your warranty and may cause damage.

#### **Battery Indicator**

The Battery icon in the Status Bar shows the battery power level. When battery power is 15% or less, your device prompts you to charge the battery. If you continue to operate the device without charging, the device powers off. For battery use information, see "About Device" on page 152.

#### **Using the Travel Charger**

1. With the battery installed, locate the Charger/ Accessory Port on the bottom of the device.

Important! Verify that the device battery is installed prior to connection. If the battery is not properly installed and the wall charger is connected, the device may power off and on continuously, preventing proper operation.

Plug the flat end of the Travel Charger into the Charger/ Accessory Interface connector on the device (1) and the other end into a standard AC wall outlet.



Warning! While the device is charging, if the touch screen does not function due to an unstable power supply, unplug the USB power adapter from the power outlet or unplug the USB cable from the device.

When charging is finished, remove the flat end from the Charger/Accessory Interface connector on the device. **Note:** Failure to unplug the wall charger before you remove the battery, can cause damage to the device.

# **Turning Your Device On and Off Turning Your Device On**



Note: Your device's internal antenna is located along the top back of the device. Do not block the antenna; doing so may affect signal quality and may cause the device to operate at a higher power level than is necessary.

#### **Turning Your Device Off**

- 1. Press and hold the Power/Lock Key \_\_\_\_\_\_\_.
- 2. At the prompt, touch Power off.

# **Setting Up Your Device**

When you first turn on your device, you are asked to set up a few things. To do that, the following screens display. Some screens can be skipped (touch **Skip**) or re-displayed (touch **Back**). Some screens display depending on the options you choose.

#### Welcome

When you first turn on your device, a Welcome screen displays and then a Location consent pop-up displays. If you want to allow Google's location service to collect anonymous location data:

Touch Agree. Otherwise, touch Disagree.
 The main Home screen displays.

#### **Change Language**

Your device defaults to English. To change to another language:

 Touch Change language at the bottom of the Welcome screen. Scroll through the available languages and touch the language to which you want to change, such as, English (United States).

To change to another language at any time, see "Select Language" on page 148.

#### **Enable Wi-Fi**

Use the Connect to Wi-Fi screen to enable Wi-Fi:

- Touch Connect to Wi-Fi.
  - Touch Add Wi-Fi network to enter a Network SSID that is not listed.
  - Touch one of the Wi-Fi networks in the list, enter the password, and touch Connect. Touch Back to connect to a different Wi-Fi network or touch Next to continue.

- or -

Touch **Skip** to perform this task later. For more information, refer to "Wi-Fi Settings" on page 131.

#### **Set Up Your Google Account**

Your new device uses your Google account to fully use its Android features, including Gmail, Maps, Navigation, Google Talk, and the Android Market.

The Set up your Google Account screen, allows you to create a new Google account or sign in, if you already have a Google account.

**Note:** You have to enable Wi-Fi before setting up your Google account.

- Touch Create and follow the prompts to create a new account.
  - or -
- Touch Sign in and then enter the email address and password of your existing account.
  - or -
- Touch Skip to perform this task later. For more information, refer to "Setting Up Your Gmail Account" on page 56.

#### **Use Google Location**

- Read the information on the screen and enable either or both of the Google location services.
- 2. Touch Next to continue.

# **Backup and Restore**

This screen also displays if you signed in to your Google account.

- 1. Read the backup and restore information.
- 2. Enable either or both options.
- Touch Next.

#### **Set Date and Time**

- Touch Set date and set the date (month, day, year), and then touch Set.
- Touch Select time zone and select the correct time zone.
- Touch Set time and set the time (hour, minute, and AM or PM), and then touch Set.

- Touch Use 24-hour format to enable or disable the 24-hour format.
- Touch Select date format to indicate how you want the date displayed.
- 6. Touch Next.

# **Retrieving Your Google Account Password**

A Google account password is required for Google applications. If you misplace or forget your Google Account password, follow these instructions to retrieve it:

- **1.** From your computer, use an Internet browser to navigate to <a href="http://google.com/accounts">http://google.com/accounts</a>.
- Once the URL loads, click on the Can't access your account? link and follow the on-screen instructions.

# **Using Google Maps**

In order to use some applications related to Google Maps, you must first connect Wi-Fi. For more information, refer to "Wi-Fi Settings" on page 131.

You must also enable location services to use Google Maps. Some features require Standalone or Google location services. For more information, refer to "Location and Security" on page 140.

# **Task Manager**

Your device can run applications simultaneously and some applications run in the background.

Use Task Manager to see which applications are running on your device and to end running applications to extend battery life. You can also uninstall applications from your device and see how much memory is used by applications.

Task Manager provides information about applications, including **Active applications**, **Downloaded**, **RAM**, **Storage**, and **Help**.

To access the Task Manager:

From a Home screen, touch Applications
 → Task manager.

– or –

From any screen, press and hold (Home), then touch Task manager.

Task Manager displays.

- Touch the Active applications tab to view applications running on your device. Touch Exit to end an application or Exit all to stop all running applications.
- Touch the **Downloaded** tab to view applications installed from Android Market. Touch **Uninstall** to remove an application from your device.
- Touch the RAM tab to display the amount of Random Access Memory (RAM) currently in use. Touch Clear memory to clear inactive and background processes.
- Touch the Storage tab to view internal and external storage memory statistics.
- **6.** Sweep the tabs to the left and touch the **Help** tab to view useful tips for extending battery life.

#### **Accessories**

The items supplied with your device may vary depending on the software and accessories available in your region.

- You can obtain additional accessories from your local Samsung dealer.
- The supplied accessories perform best for your device.
- Accessories other than the supplied ones may not be compatible with your device.

# **Securing Your Device**

By default, the device locks automatically when the screen times out or you can lock it manually. You can unlock the device using one of the default Unlock screens or, for increased security, use a personal screen unlock pattern.

For more information about creating and enabling a Screen unlock pattern, see "Set Screen Lock" on page 140.

For other settings related to securing your device, see "Location and Security" on page 140.

**Note:** Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this User Manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

# **Locking the Device Manually**

# **Unlocking the Device**

Touch and sweep across the screen, either to the left or right, as indicated on the screen.



**Note:** You can choose the type of Screen Unlock you want to use, from Pattern, PIN, or Password. For more information, refer to "Location and Security" on page 140.

# **Troubleshooting**

If your device has fatal errors, hangs up, or freezes, you may need to close all programs or reset the device to regain functionality.

- If your device is still responsive, but a program is frozen, close the program using the Task Manager. For more information, refer to "Task Manager" on page 14.
- If your device is frozen and unresponsive, press and hold the **Power/Lock Key** for 8 to 10 seconds.

# **Android System Recovery**

Android System Recovery is used for Google updates. The average user should never need to perform a system recovery.

Note: If you entered this menu by mistake, use the Volume Up/ Down key to select **reboot system now**, then press (Home). Your device then continues to boot up. To enter the Android System Recovery mode, follow these steps:

- 1. Turn the device off.
- 2. Press the Volume Up Key and the Home Key and then press the Power/Lock Key at the same time until the device switches on.

**Tip:** Volume Up is the end closest to the Power/Lock Key.

- Once the SAMSUNG logo appears, release the Power/ Lock key while continuing to press the Volume Up and Home keys until the Android system recovery screen displays.
- **4.** Release the Volume Up and Home keys. The following options are available:
  - reboot system now: Turns on your device.
  - apply update from sdcard: Used to apply an update file from your microSD card.

- wipe data/factory reset: Deletes all data from the device except captured pictures and videos. For more information, refer to "Factory Data Reset" on page 147.
- wipe cache partition: Deletes all cache data, such as log files.
- **5.** Press the Volume Up/down key to scroll up or down, then press (Home) to make a selection.

#### **Safe Mode**

You can boot your device into Safe Mode if you want to troubleshoot whether added applications are causing problems with the device. Safe mode only loads basic system software.

- 1. Make sure your phone is turned off.
- Press and hold the Power/Lock Key ( ) to boot up your device.
- After the animation starts to display, repeatedly touch (Menu).

When the Home screen is displayed, **Safe mode** is displayed in the lower left corner of the screen.

# **Section 2: Understanding Your Device**

#### **Front View**

The following items can be found on the front of your device as illustrated.

- Front-facing Camera Lens: Used when taking photos.
- **2. External Speakers**: Used for music or video playback, notification tones, and for other sounds.
- Display Screen: The orientation of the display screen rotates with the device as you turn it. You can turn this feature on and off. For more information, refer to "Icons" on page 24.
- Menu: Touch to display options for the current screen.
   Touch and hold to access Google Search.
- Home: Touch to display the Home screen. Touch and hold to display recent applications or to launch Task Manager. Touch to wake the screen for unlocking.
- 6. Back: Touch to return to the previous screen or option.
- 7. Microphone: Used for voice recording.



#### **Side View**

The following items can be found on the side of your device.

- Power/Lock Key: Press and hold to turn the device on or off. Press to lock the device or to wake the screen for unlocking.
- Volume Key: From a Home screen, press to adjust Master Volume. During music playback, press to adjust volume.



#### **Back and Bottom Views**

The following items can be found on the back and bottom of vour device.

 Memory Card Slot: Remove the cover to install a memory card for storage of files. For more information, refer to "Installing a Memory Card" on page 8.


#### **Home Screen**

The Home screen is the starting point for using your device.

Note: Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this User Manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

- Status Bar: Presents icons to show notifications, battery power, and connection details. For a list of icons, see "Status Bar" on page 25.
- Widgets: Applications that run on the Home screen. These widgets are found on the Home screen by default. For more information, refer to "Widgets" on page 28.
- Home screen: The starting point for using your device. Place shortcuts, widgets, and other items to customize your device to your needs.
- Shortcuts: Shortcuts to common applications. These shortcuts are found on the Home screen by default. For more information, refer to "Shortcuts" on page 30.

Primary Shortcuts: Shortcuts to common features. For more information, refer to "Primary Shortcuts" on page 27.



#### **Extended Home Screen**

The Home screen consists of the Home panel, plus six panels that extend beyond the display width to provide more space for adding shortcuts, widgets, and folders.

Slide your finger horizontally across the screen to scroll to the left or right side panels. As you scroll, the indicator at the top of the display shows your current position.

#### **Customizing the Home Screen**

To customize the Home screen to suit your preferences just navigate to the desired Home screen, then touch and hold on the screen to display the **Add to Home screen** menu. Then touch one of the options:

- Choose widget: For more information, refer to "Widgets" on page 28.
- Shortcuts: For more information, refer to "Shortcuts" on page 30.
- Folders: For more information, refer to "Folders" on page 31.
- Wallpapers: For more information, refer to "Wallpapers" on page 32.

## **Display Settings**

You can customize display settings to your preferences. For more information, refer to "Display" on page 138.

#### **Adding and Removing Home Screen Panels**

Your device comes with seven Home screen panels. You can customize the Home screen by removing or adding panels.

**Note:** The panel in the first position displays when you press **(Home)**.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch (Menu) → Edit.
- 2. Use these controls to configure panels:
  - 面

**Remove**: Touch and drag a panel to the Trash Can to remove the panel from the Home screen.



**Add:** Touch to add a new panel, up to a total of seven. This option is available when less than seven panels have been added.

**3.** To rearrange the order of panels, touch and drag a panel to a new location.

**Tip:** You can also display **Edit** options by pinching the Home screen.

# **Navigating Your Device**

Use command keys and the touch screen to navigate.

# **Command Keys**

#### Menu

Touch (Menu) to display options for the current screen or feature. Touch and hold to activate Google Search.

#### **Home**

Touch (Home) to display the first Home screen.

Press and hold (Home) to launch a menu of recent applications or to launch Task Manager.



#### **Back**

Touch (Back) to return to the previous screen, option, or step.

#### **Google Search**

Touch the **S** Google Search widget to search the web and your device. The Google Search widget is found on the Home panel by default. For more information, refer to "Google Search" on page 81.

#### Context-Sensitive Menus

Context-sensitive menus offer options for features or screens. To access context-sensitive menus:

- Touch (Menu).
- Touch and hold on an item.

# **Finger Gestures**

#### **Touch**

Touch items to select or launch them. For example:

- Touch the on-screen keyboard to enter characters or text.
- Touch a menu item to select it.
- Touch an application's icon to launch the application.

#### **Touch and Hold**

Activate on-screen items. For example:

- Touch and hold a widget on the home screen to move it.
- Touch and hold on a field to display a pop-up menu of options.

#### Swipe, Flick, or Slide

Swipe, flick, or slide your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen. For example:

- Unlocking the screen
- · Scrolling the Home screens or a menu.

#### **Pinch**

Use two fingers, such as your index finger and thumb, to make an inward pinch motion on the screen, as if you are picking something up, or an outward motion by sweeping your fingers out. For example:



- Pinch the Home screen to show customization options.
- Pinch a photo in Gallery to zoom in.

#### **Notification Panel**

The Notification Panel shows information about connections, messages, and other items.

To display the Notification Panel:

 Sweep your finger downward from the top of the screen.

From the Notification Panel, the following options are available:

- 1. Touch an icon to activate the feature.
- 2. Touch to clear all notifications.
- 3. Touch a notification to open the application.
- Touch and hold, then slide your finger up to close the Notification Panel or touch (Back).



#### **Icons**

Icons at the top of the Notification Panel show status for:

 Wi-Fi: Touch to enable or disable Wi-Fi. For more information, refer to "Wi-Fi" on page 101.

- Bluetooth: Touch to enable or disable Bluetooth. For more information, refer to "Bluetooth" on page 103.
- GPS: Touch to enable Standalone GPS services. For more information, refer to "Use GPS Satellites" on page 140.
- Sound / Silent / Vibration: Touch to toggle between sound and silent or vibration. For more information, refer to "Sound" on page 136.
- Auto rotation: Touch to enable or disable auto rotation. When enabled, the screen orientation changes when you rotate the device. When disabled, the screen locks in the current orientation (horizontal or vertical) and the orientation does not change when you rotate the device.

# **Clearing Notifications**

- Sweep your finger downward from the top of the screen to display the Notifications Panel.
- 2. Touch a notification to clear it.

- or -

Touch Clear to clear all notifications.

#### **Status Bar**

The Status Bar displays icons to show connection status, battery power, and other details.



System Alert: Check Notifications Panel for alerts.



**Battery Full**: Battery is fully charged. Disconnect device from power source.



Battery Level: Shown partially charged.




**Charging Indicator**: Battery is charging. Displays when connected to a standard AC wall outlet or to a computer by way of a USB cable.




**USB Connected**: Device is connected to a computer using a USB cable.



**USB Debugging**: Device is connected to a computer in debugging mode. For more information, refer to "USB Debugging" on page 143.





Download Successful: A recent software download was successfully downloaded.

Flight Mode: Indicates that the Flight Mode is active, which allows you to use many of your device's features, but it cannot access online information or applications.

New Email Message: You have new email.

New Gmail Message: You have new Gmail.

**Google Talk Invitation**: Someone has invited you to chat using Google Talk.

Refresh: An account is being refreshed.



**Alarm Set**: An alarm is active. For more information, refer to "Clock" on page 113.



**Silent Mode:** All sounds except media and alarms are silenced, and Vibrate mode is not active. For more information, refer to "Silent Mode" on page 136.



**Vibrate Mode**: All sounds are silenced, and Vibrate is set to Always or Only in Silent mode. For more information, refer to "Vibrate" on page 136.



Media Scanner: The media scanner is active.



Preparing SD Card: A memory card has been mounted and is being prepared for use. For more information, refer to "Storage" on page 147.



Bluetooth Active: Bluetooth is turned on.



**Music Player**: A song is playing. Touch the Music icon or display the Notification Panel to see the song title and music player controls. For more information, refer to "Music Player" on page 84.



**Wi-Fi Active:** Wi-Fi is connected, active, and communicating with a Wireless Access Point (WAP).



**Wi-Fi Action Needed**: Action needed to connect to Wireless Access Point (WAP).



GPS Active: Displays when GPS is active.



**Navigation Active:** The Navigation app is active. For more information, refer to "Navigation" on page 79.



Kies air: Displays when Kies air is active.



**Software update**: This is a notification for Software update. Follow the on-screen instructions.



**Event**: This is a notification for one or more events.



FM Radio: The FM Radio is playing.

# **Primary Shortcuts**

Primary Shortcuts appear at the bottom of the display.



**Music**: Play music stored on an optional installed memory card. For more information, refer to "Music Player" on page 84.



**Videos**: Play and manage videos stored on an installed memory card. For more information, refer to "Videos" on page 95.



Internet: Access the Internet. Appears on the Home screen by default. For more information, refer to "Internet" on page 68.



**Applications**: Access your device's applications. For more information, refer to "Applications" on page 32.

# Widgets

Widgets are self-contained applications that you can place on Home screens to access your favorite features.

# Adding Widgets to a Home Screen

- Navigate to the desired Home screen.
- 2. Touch and hold on the screen.
  - or -
  - Touch  $\blacksquare$  (Menu)  $\rightarrow$  Add.

The Add to Home screen menu displays.

- 3. Touch Choose widget.
- Scroll through the list of Widgets and touch a Widget.
   The Home screen displays and the Widget appears on it.

#### **Removing Widgets**

- Touch and hold the Widget until Remove appears at the bottom of the screen.
- Drag the Widget to the Remove icon and remove your finger to delete the Widget.

**AccuWeather.com**: Display the forecast from AccuWeather. Touch the widget to choose locations.



**Calendar**: Record events and appointments to manage your schedule. For more information, refer to "Calendar" on page 111.



Classic clock: Display a classic, analog clock.



**Digital clock**: Display the digital time, the day, and the date.



**Dual clock**: Display the date and time for two different locations. For more information, refer to "Dual Clock" on page 116.



Funky clock: Display a funky, analog clock.



**Google Search**: Display a Google Search bar. For more information, refer to "Google Search" on page 81.

**Simple clock**: Display a simple, analog clock.



Software update: May include bug fixes, enhancements to services (or parts thereof), products or devices, and updates and enhancements to any software previously installed (including entirely new versions). # **Section 3: Entering Text**

This section describes how to enter words, letters, punctuation and numbers when you need to enter text.

# Virtual QWERTY Keyboard


Your device uses a virtual QWERTY keyboard for text entry. Use the keyboard to enter letters, punctuation, numbers, and other characters into text entry fields or applications. Access the keyboard by touching any text entry field.

The virtual QWERTY keyboard displays at the bottom of the screen. By default, when you rotate the device, the screen orientation updates to display the keyboard at the bottom of the screen.

# **Using the Samsung Keypad**

The Samsung Keypad is a custom virtual QWERTY keyboard, featuring predictive text. Input characters by touching the on-screen keys with your finger or use speech recognition.

As you enter characters, predictive text matches your key touches to common words and displays them. Select a word from the display to insert it into your text.



# **Configuring the Keypad**

To configure the Samsung Keypad to your preferences:

While entering text, touch (Settings).
The Samsung keypad settings screen is displayed. For more information, refer to "Samsung Keypad" on page 148.

# **Entering Upper and Lower Case Letters**

The default case is lower case (abc). Enter upper and lower case alphabet letters by touching (Shift) to toggle the case, before touching the letter key(s).

- Touch once to switch from abc to Abc mode.
- Touch and hold to switch to ABC mode.

# **Entering Symbols and Numbers**

To enter a number, touch 7123, then touch the corresponding key.

To enter common symbols, touch 2123 to switch to Symbols mode, then touch the corresponding key.

There are three pages of symbols. Touch to the next page.

Touch and hold a vowel key (A, E, I, O, U, or Y) or the C, N, or S key to open a small window where you can touch an accented vowel or other alternate letter.

Touch and hold the Period key ( . ) to open a small window with a set of common symbols and Emoticons.

# **Using XT9 Predictive Text**

XT9 is a predictive text system that has next-letter prediction and regional error correction, which compensates for users touching the wrong keys on QWERTY keyboards.

- Touch (Settings) at the bottom of the keypad.
   The Samsung keypad settings screen displays.
- Touch the XT9 field so a green check mark appears next to the field.
- Touch the XT9 advanced settings field to modify XT9 associated settings. For more information, refer to "Samsung Keypad" on page 148.

**Note:** The XT9 option is available only when Abc mode has been selected.

- Begin typing a word. A list of word options displays.
   Touch one of the words to replace the word that has already been typed.
  - or -

Touch and then touch **Add word** to register a new word to XT9.



Continue typing your message. XT9 mode can be used in portrait or landscape mode.

# **Editing Text**

You can edit the text you enter in text fields by cutting, copying, or pasting text. These operations can be performed within and across apps. However, some apps do not support editing some or all of the text displayed while others may offer their own way to select text.

# **Editing Existing Text**

To edit text that you have entered:

- Touch the text at the point you want to edit.
   The Cursor displays at the point you touched.
- Touch and drag the Cursor to a better position, if necessary.
- Enter additional text or delete text by repeatedly touching (Delete).

## Copying, Deleting, or Replacing Text

To select and copy, delete, or replace text:

- Touch and hold the text or word you want to select.
   The Edit text pop-up displays.
- Touch Select word or Select all.
   The selected text is highlighted with a tab at each end of the selection.
- Drag a selection tab to expand or reduce the range of selected text.

**4.** Depending on the action you want to take for the selected text, in the pop-up touch:



Copy to save the selected text to the clipboard.



Cut to remove the selected text.



Paste to replace the previously saved text in the clipboard.

– or –

Enter text by typing or speaking to replace the selection with what you type.

- or -

Touch (Delete) to delete the selected text.

**Tip:** Touch on another area of the screen to unselect the text.

## **Pasting Text**

To paste previously copied text:

 Touch the text at the point you want to paste the copied text.

The Cursor find displays at the point you touched.

2. Touch and hold the **Cursor** and touch (Paste) in the pop-up.

# **Closing the Keyboard**

To close the keyboard:

■ Touch (Back).

# **Using the Handwriting Feature**

You can enter text simply by using your finger to handwrite letters on your screen.

1. From a screen where you can enter text, activate the keypad by touching a text input field on the screen.

Handwriting box 1 has four handwriting areas, two for characters (a), one for numbers (1), and one for symbols and special characters (?).


Handwriting box 2 has one handwriting area.

**Note:** Handwriting box 1 and Handwriting box 2 only display in portrait mode.

- 3. Use your finger tip to write out each character.
- 4. When you write single letters, suggestions are offered in the Letter Options area. The suggested letter appears in blue. If that suggestion is incorrect, touch one of the other letters.

## **Handwriting Tips**

- For uppercase letters, write the letter larger than the lowercase letters.
- Write a dash (horizontal line) to add a space.
- To write numbers and symbols with Handwriting box 1, write numbers in the lower left area and symbols in the lower right area. For Handwriting box 2, touch the Text Input Mode key.

# Handwriting Box Key

The keys are similar for both handwriting pads.

- Delete: Touch to delete letters or touch and hold to delete multiple letters.
- Line Return: Start a new line of text.
- Language / Space: Touch to add a space. If you have more than
  one language defined, touch and hold this key, then drag across
  the pop-up to change the language.

- Keypad Settings: Display the keypad settings. For more information, refer to "Handwriting Settings" on page 43.
- Text Input Mode: For Handwriting box 2, the current mode is displayed in the lower left corner of the handwriting area. Touch the Text Input Mode key to activate alphabetic (ABC), numeric (123), or symbols (?#+) mode.

## **Handwriting Settings**

To change the Handwriting settings:

- Touch (Settings), then touch Handwriting settings.
   The following settings can be changed:
  - Recognition time: Set the time it takes for your tablet to recognize what you write. Choose from 0.1, 0.3, 0.5, 1, or 2 seconds.
  - About: View information on the handwriting tool manufacturer and view Gesture Methods for Space, Enter, and Back Space.
- 2. Touch (Back) repeatedly to return to your message.

# **Using Speech Recognition**

You can use your voice to enter text using the Voice input feature, which lets you enter text by speaking. Samsung Keypad recognizes your speech and enters text for you.

Note: Enable Voice Input in Samsung keypad settings. For more information, refer to "Samsung Keypad" on page 148.

- Touch (Speech Recognition) on the Samsung Keypad.
- 2. At the **Speak now** prompt, speak clearly and distinctly into the microphone.

**3. Working...** is displayed while the software is converting your voice to text.

The text is displayed in the message.

**4.** Touch **Q** (Speech Recognition) again to speak and add more text.

**Note:** The feature works best when you break your message down into smaller segments.

# **Section 4: Contacts and Accounts**

This section explains how to manage contacts and accounts.

#### **Accounts**

Your device can synchronize with a variety of accounts. With synchronization, information on your device is updated with any information that changes in your accounts.

- Facebook: Add your Facebook account to sync Contacts.
- Twitter: Add your Twitter SNS Service to sync Contacts.
- MySpace: Add your MySpace SNS Service to sync Contacts.
- Microsoft Exchange: Add your Exchange account to sync Contacts, Calendar and Email.
- Google: Add your Google account to sync your Contacts, Calendar, and Gmail.
- ChatON: Add your ChatON account. For more information, refer to "ChatON" on page 65.

**Note:** You must register your device with your social networking site before using the device to access the network.

# **Setting Up Your Accounts**

Set up and manage your synchronized accounts with the **Accounts and sync** setting.

- From a Home screen, touch (Menu) → Settings
   → Accounts and sync.
- Touch Add account, then touch the account type.
- Follow the prompts to enter your account credentials to complete the set-up process.
- 4. The device communicates with account servers to set up your account. When complete, your account appears in the Manage accounts area of the Accounts and sync screen.

**Note:** Before you can set up an account, Wi-Fi must be enabled. For more information, refer to "Turning Wi-Fi On or Off" on page 131.

#### **Setting Up a Facebook Account**

Note: You must register your device with your social networking site before using the device to access the network.

- 2. Touch Next.
- Enter your Email and Password you use for MySpace, then touch Login.
- **4.** Follow the prompts to complete the set-up.

Store contact information for your friends, family and colleagues, to quickly access information or to send a message.

To access Contacts:

## **Creating Contacts**

To add a new contact:

  - Touch **Device** to save the contact information in your device's memory.

  - Touch an account for synchronizing the contact (available options depend on the accounts you have set up for synchronization).

  - Touch **First name**, then enter a first name for the contact.
  - Touch Last name, then enter a last name for the contact.

  - Touch Phone number to enter a phone number, then touch the Label button to choose a label, from Mobile, Home, Work, Work Fax, Home Fax, Pager, Callback, Other, or Custom to create a custom label. To add another number, touch
  - Touch Email address to enter an email address, then touch the Label button to choose a label, from Work, Home, Mobile, Other, or Custom to create a custom label. To add another address, touch
  - Touch Instant msg to enter an instant message address, then touch the Label button to choose a label, from Google Talk, AIM, Windows Live, Yahoo, Skype, QQ, ICQ, Jabber, or Custom to create a custom label. To add another IM, touch

- Touch **Groups** to assign the contact to a group. For more information about Groups, see "Groups" on page 52.
- Touch Postal address fields to enter a physical address.
- Touch Organization fields to enter a company name or job title.
- To add more fields, touch More to choose Notes, Nickname, Website, Internet call, Birthday, and Anniversary.

- To delete a contact, touch (Menu) → Delete. At the prompt, touch OK.

#### **Linked Contacts**

Your device can synchronize with multiple accounts, including Google, Corporate Exchange, and other email providers, plus social networking sites like Facebook, Twitter, and MySpace. When you synchronize contacts from these accounts with your device, you may have multiple contacts for one person.

Linking, or *joining*, imported contact records allows you to see all the contact's numbers and addresses together in one Contact entry.

Linking also helps you keep your contacts updated because any changes that your contacts make to their information in the respective accounts is automatically updated the next time you synchronize with the account.

#### **Linking contacts**

- 2. Touch a contact to display its information.
- Touch (Menu) → Join contact and then touch another contact to link.

The Contacts joined message displays.

#### **Unlinking contacts**

- From a Home screen, touch Applications
   → Contacts.
- 2. Touch a contact to display its information.
- Touch the Joined contacts field to display linked contacts.
- Touch next to the contact to unlink it from the displayed contact.

The Contacts separated message displays.

**Tip:** Touch **Join another contact** to join additional contacts to this contact.

#### **Get Friends**

Use the Get Friends feature to sync with your accounts. You can choose an account you have already added or add a new account.

- 3. Touch the **Group name** field to enter a group name.
- 4. Touch Save to save the new group.

## **Deleting a Group**

   → Contacts, then touch the Groups tab.
- 2. Touch (Menu) → Delete.
- Touch one or more groups to mark them or touch Select all to mark all groups. A check mark indicates marked groups.
- Touch Delete, then touch Group only, to only delete the group, or Group and group members, to delete the group and the members of that group.

#### **Editing a Group**

- From a Home screen, touch Applications
   → Contacts, then touch the Groups tab.
- 2. Touch a Group to display it.
- 3. Touch  $\blacksquare$  (Menu)  $\rightarrow$  Edit group.
- **4.** Use the keyboard to change the group name.
- 5. Touch Save to save the changes.

# **Adding and Removing Group Members**

- From a Home screen, touch 
   → Applications
   → Contacts, then touch the Groups tab.
- 2. Touch a Group to display it.
- Touch (Menu) → Add member.
   or -

Touch **(Menu)** → **Remove member.** 

 To add a contact, touch the contact name on the left side of the screen or touch Select all to add all contacts listed. Touch Add.

To remove a contact from the group, touch the contact name on the left side of the screen or touch Select all to remove all contacts listed. Touch Remove.

**Tip:** You can also change a contact's group associations by editing the contact. For more information, refer to "Creating Contacts" on page 47.

The Activities option allows you to view updated contact information that has been synchronized with Facebook, Twitter, or MySpace.

From a Home screen, touch Applications
 → Contacts → Activities.

Note: You must log in to an SNS account (Facebook, Twitter, or MySpace) before you can view the Updates.

2. The updates are displayed.

**Note:** Activity updates will not appear unless you have synchronized your device with your accounts. For more information, refer to "Accounts and Sync" on page 145.

# **Section 5: Messaging**

This section describes how to send and receive messages and other features associated with messaging.

# Types of Messages

Your device supports these types of messages:

- Gmail: Send and receive Gmail from your Google account.
- Email: Send and receive email from your email accounts, including Corporate Exchange mail.
- Google Talk: Chat with other Google Talk users.
- Google Messenger: Brings groups of friends together into a simple group conversation.
- ChatON: Use ChatON to send and receive instant messages from any device that has a mobile phone number.

Note: Your Wi-Fi-only device does NOT support voice calling and messaging services. Please disregard any "dial" and "message" related menus because some Gmail options are identically set in all Android devices.

#### **Gmail**

Send and receive email with Gmail. Google's web-based email.

Tip: To set up your Google account on your device, use Accounts and sync settings. For more information, refer to "Accounts and Sync" on page 145.

- From a Home screen, touch MG Gmail.

- or -

From a Home screen, touch | Applications

Gmail.

## **Setting Up Your Gmail Account**

The first time you launch Gmail, your device prompts you to set up your Google account.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch M Gmail.
- At the Add a Google Account screen, touch Next to begin, then touch an option:
  - Create: Follow the prompts to create a new account.
  - Sign in: Enter your Google Username and Password, then touch Sign In.
- The device communicates with the Google server to set up your account and synchronize your email. When complete, your Gmail appears in the Inbox.

# Refreshing Your Gmail Account

Refresh your account to update your device from the Gmail servers.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch MG Gmail.
- 2. Touch (Menu) → Refresh.

## **Managing Your Gmail Account**

Use menu options to manage your Gmail.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch MG Gmail.
- 2. Touch (Menu) for these options:
  - Refresh: Update your device from the Gmail servers.
  - Compose: Create and send new Gmail.
  - Accounts: Choose a Gmail account or add a Google account.
  - Go to labels: View Gmail by label.
  - Search: Enter keywords to search mail.
  - More:
    - Settings: Configure settings. For more information, refer to "Gmail Account Settings" on page 57.
  - Help: Learn about using Gmail.
  - About: View information about Gmail.

## **Composing and Sending Gmail**

- 1. From the Home screen, touch MG Gmail.
- 2. Touch  $\blacksquare$  (Menu)  $\rightarrow$  Compose.
- Touch the To field to enter recipients. As you enter names or email addresses, matching contacts display. Touch a contact to add it to the field.
- 4. Touch the Subject field to enter a subject.
- Touch the Compose Mail field to enter the text of your email.
- 6. While composing a message, touch (Menu) for these options:
  - Send: Send the message.
  - Save draft: Save the message as a draft for sending later.
  - Add Cc/Bcc: Create Cc (copy) and Bcc (blind copy) fields in the message. After creating the fields, touch to enter recipients.
  - Attach: Launch Gallery to select a photo to add to the message.
  - Discard: Close the message without saving.
  - Help: Learn about using Gmail.

7. Touch to send the message or to save the message as a draft.

#### **Gmail Account Settings**

- 1. From the Home screen, touch MG Gmail.
- Touch (Menu) → More → Settings for settings: General preferences
  - Message Actions: Set how you want message actions to show at the top of the screen. Options are: Always show, Only show in portrait, and Don't show.
  - Clear search history: Remove previous searches you performed.
  - Clear "Show pictures": Restores the default setting (do not show pictures automatically) for all the people who send you email, including those whose Show pictures setting you may have changed when reading messages from them.

#### **Account settings**

#### General settings

- Priority Inbox: This setting is only available if you have configured Gmail on the web to show Priority Inbox. If available, you can set Priority Inbox as the conversation list to open when you have new mail. rather than Inbox.
- Signature: Create a text signature to add to outgoing messages.
- Confirm actions: Have your device prompt you to confirm Archive, Delete, and Send actions.
- Reply all: Enable or disable Reply All as the default action when responding to messages.
- Auto-advance: Choose a screen to show after you delete or archive a conversation.
- Message text size: Set the size of text in message displays.
- Batch operations: Allow changes to labels on more than one conversation.
- Sync inboxes and labels: Choose which labels are synchronized.

#### · Notification settings:

- Email notifications: When enabled, notifications for new email appear in the Status Bar.
- Labels to notify: Set notification preferences for synced labels.
   Touch Inbox or Priority Inbox to set your preferences.

#### Add account

• Add a new Google account. For more information, refer to "Setting Up Your Gmail Account" on page 56.

#### **Email**

Use Email to view and manage all your email accounts in one application.

#### **Setting Up Email Accounts**

- At the Set up email account screen, enter an Email address and Password and touch Next.
- Enter an account name for the email account just added, which is displayed on the inbox for the email account.

- 4. Enter your name, which is displayed on outgoing messages.
- Touch Done.

The device communicates with the appropriate server to set up your account and synchronize your email. When complete, your email appears in the Inbox for the account.

**6.** Enter account credentials, then complete set-up by following the prompts to configure account options. Available options vary, depending on the provider. If the account includes synchronization of contacts and calendars, you can choose whether to synchronize these features with your device.

## **Adding Additional Email Accounts**

To add additional email accounts:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch | Applications
  - → M Email.

The list of email accounts displays.

**Note:** If you only have one email account set up, touch (Menu) → Accounts to display the list of email accounts.

- Touch (Menu) → Add account.
- Enter the Email address. Password, and so on.

# **Managing Email**

You can view email you receive for all accounts on the Combined inbox screen or you can view email accounts individually.

→ Mail.

**Note:** If you only have one email account set up, touch (Menu) → Accounts to display the list of email accounts.

  - Combined inbox: View all email in a combined inbox.
  - < account name>: Only view email for one email account.
- While viewing the Combined inbox, touch (Menu) for these options:
  - Compose: Create and send new email.
  - Accounts: Displays all email accounts. Touch an account or Combined inbox.

- **4.** While viewing email for one email account, touch (Menu) for these options:
  - Compose: Create and send new email. For more information, refer to "Composing and Sending Email" on page 60.
  - Refresh: Update your device from the email server.
  - Search: Enter keywords to search email.
  - Accounts: Displays all email accounts. Touch an account or Combined inbox.
  - List by: View email for this account by Date, Sender, or Read/ Unread.
  - More:
    - Account settings: Configure settings. For more information, refer to "Configuring Email Account Settings" on page 61.
    - Text size: Choose the text size for email in this account. Options are: Small, Medium, and Large.
    - View mode: Set the view mode to Standard view or Conversation view.

# **Composing and Sending Email**

- Touch the To field to enter recipients. As you enter names or email addresses, matching contacts display.

- Touch Cc/Bcc to enter recipients in the Cc or Bcc fields.
- 6. Touch the Subject field to enter a subject.

- 8. Touch Attach to add an attachment. Choices are:
  - File: Select a file from My files.
  - Pictures: Select a picture from Gallery.
  - Videos: Select a video from Gallery.
  - Audio: Select an audio file from My files.
  - Capture picture: Open the camera and take a picture.
  - Capture video: Open the video recorder and shoot a video.
  - Record audio: Open the voice recorder and make a recording.
  - Contacts: Open your contact list so contacts can be selected to attach a contact namecard file.
  - Calendar: Open your calendar so calendar events, like birthdays and anniversaries, can be selected to attach an invite file.
  - Memo: Open the Memo app and attach a memo.

The selected or created file is attached. Touch to remove the attachment.

- 9. While composing a message, touch (Menu) for these options:
  - Save as draft: Save the message in Drafts.
  - Add text: Lets you add text to your email from:
    - Contacts: Touch contact information to select it, then touch
       Add
    - Calendar: Touch a calendar event to add the event details to vou email.
    - Memo: Touch one or more memos, then touch **OK**.
- Touch Send to send the message or Discard to cancel the email.

# **Configuring Email Account Settings**

Account Settings lets you use settings to configure handling of email on your device.

**Note:** Available settings may depend on the email account and include setting how much email to synchronize, creating signatures for email you send, and other handling options.

To configure email account settings at any time:

- From a Home screen, touch Applications
   → Email.
- Touch an account, if you have set up more than one account.
- Touch (Menu) → More → Account settings.
   The following options display depending on the type of account:

#### **General settings**

- Account name: Enter a name to identify this account.
- Your name: Enter your name, to appear on email from this account.
- Email check frequency: Lets you configure how often the device queries the remote server for new email changes.
   Options are: Never, Every 5 minutes, Every 10 minutes, Every 15 minutes, Every 30 minutes, or Every hour.
- Default account: When enabled, email from your device is automatically sent from this account.

#### Notification settings

- Email notifications: When enabled, the New Email icon appears in the Status Bar when a new email arrives.
- Select ringtone: Choose a ringtone for email notifications for this account.
- **Vibrate**: When enabled, email notifications for this accounts are accompanied by vibration.

#### Server settings

- Incoming settings: Configure server settings.
- Outgoing settings: Configure outgoing settings.
- **Sync contacts**: When enabled, contacts from your account are synchronized with your device's Contacts.
- **Sync calendar**: When enabled, events from your account are synchronized with your device's Calendar.

## Common Settings

Recent messages: Set the number of recent messages.
 Options are: 25, 50, 75, 100, 200, or Total.

- Forward with files: Enable or disable forwarding of file attachments.
- Add signature: Enable or disable adding a signature.
- Signature: Enter a signature to add to email from this account.

# **Google Talk**

Google Talk is a free Windows and web-based application for instant messaging offered by Google. Conversation logs are automatically saved to a Chats area in your Gmail account. This allows you to search a chat log and store them in your Gmail accounts.

Tip: Talk requires that you have a Google account. To set up your Google account on your device use Accounts and sync settings. For more information, refer to "Accounts and Sync" on page 145.

1. From a Home screen, touch talk Talk.

From a Home screen, touch  ${\color{red} \blacksquare}$  Applications

→ talk Talk.

- or -

2. Touch Next to set up a Google account or to Sign in.

- 3. Touch Create to create a new Google account.
  - or -

Touch **Sign in**, if you have an existing Google account.

Note: If you have already set up your Google account, you are automatically logged in.

- After entering your user name and password, touch Done.
- Touch Sign in.Once sign in is complete, the Talk screen displays.
  - . Touch (Menu) to display the following options:
    - All friends / Most popular: List all friends or the most popular friends.
    - Add friend: Use the keypad to enter an invitation to a friend, then touch Send invitation.
    - Search: Enter a search term and search Google Talk.
    - **Sign out**: Close Google Talk and display the Home screen.
    - **Settings**: Offers various settings for Google talk.

- **More**: Displays the following options:
  - Close all chats: Terminates any chats that you have open.
  - Invites: Lists any pending invitations that you have sent.
  - Blocked: Lists any friends that you have blocked.
- Touch and hold a Friend entry to display the following options: Start chat, Friend info, Block friend, Remove friend, View contact, Always show friend / Auto show friend, and Hide friend.

Touch a Friend's entry to display the Chat entries for that Friend.

# **Google Messenger**

With Google Messenger, you can bring groups of friends together into a simple group conversation, putting everyone on the same page. When you get a new conversation in Messenger, Google+ sends an update to your device.

To get started, touch the Messenger icon on the home screen of the Google+ app or use the Messenger icon on your Applications screen.

- From a Home screen, touch Applications
   → Messenger.
   The Select account screen displays.
- Touch an existing account or touch Create a new account. For more information, refer to "Setting Up Your Gmail Account" on page 56.
   The Messenger screen displays.
- Touch Learn more in the center of the screen and then touch a topic to learn more about using Google Messenger.

#### **ChatON**

A smart-messaging app that gives you a host of innovative ways to stay connected with all your friends and family, regardless of their device or platform. Use ChatON to send and receive instant messages from any device that has a mobile phone number.

From a Home screen, touch Applications → ChatON.

The Select country screen displays.

- 2. Touch Select country.
- Touch the Search by country field and use the on-screen keyboard to enter the name of a country. The names of countries display as you type.
- Touch the desired country when it displays and then touch Next.

The Terms and privacy screen displays.

Read the Terms and conditions and Privacy policy and touch Accept.

The Registration screen displays.

If you are launching this application for the first time, follow the on-screen instructions to complete the account setup.

The ChatON Buddies screen displays.

- Follow the on-screen instructions to search for buddies, view your chats, and set up your status page
- Touch (Menu) → Settings → General → Help for more information.

# Section 6: Internet and Social Networking

This section describes the various Internet and social networking applications available on your device such as Google Play™ Books, Google+, Internet, Latitude, Maps. Navigation, Places, Google and Voice Search, and YouTube.

#### Books

Use the Books app to read eBooks from the Internet-based Google Play™ Books service. Google eBooks is a new way to discover, buy, and enjoy your favorite books online and offline.

You can read books online or mark them for availability offline, so you can read them when you have no Internet connection (such as on an airplane). You can also use Books as your starting point for browsing or searching for books on line.

1. From a Home screen, touch | Applications Books.

The Google Books main screen displays.

Note: You may be asked to create or sign on to your Google account. For more information, refer to "Setting Up Your Gmail Account" on page 56.

2. To add more books to your library, touch **Shop** in the Application bar.

A pop-up displays links to the Google Play™ Terms of Service, the Google Music Terms of Service, the Google Books Terms of Service, and the YouTube Rentals Terms of Service. Read each document and touch Accept.

Browse the selection of Google eBooks, which are arranged in categories like Featured. Top Paid. Top Free, Top Grossing, and many more.

3. To find a book by title or author name, touch Search on the Books main screen or touch Shop → Search.



- 4. On the Books main screen, touch (Menu) for these options:
  - Sort order: Set how books are displayed. Options are: Recently read, Title, or Author.
  - Manage library: Touch to delete the book for your library.
     Touch a pin to mark books to make them available offline.
     Touch a pin again to remove books from your device.
  - Refresh: If a book in your library does not appear on your device, use this option to update the display.
  - Accounts: Set the account to use.
  - Settings
    - Storage location: Set where to store books on your device.
  - About: The Books version number is displayed.
  - Terms of Service, Privacy Policy, Open-source licenses:
     Touch to read the documents.
  - Help: Displays various Book help information. Touch Help Center to get additional Google Play™ Book information.
- **5.** Touch the cover of a book to start reading.

## Reading a Book

Once the book displays:

- . Sweep across the screen to turn the page.
- 2. Touch (Menu) for these options:
  - Contents: Display the book's table of contents.
  - Settings: Set the Text size, Line space, Typeface, Justification, Themes, and Brightness.
  - Original pages / Flowing text: Display the pages of the book in their original format or use your format settings.
  - **Search**: Use the keyboard to enter a search term and touch the search key to search the book for the term.
  - **Share**: Share the book by using Bluetooth, ChatON, Email, Gmail, or Google+.
  - More
  - My library: Displays your library of books.
  - About: Displays the Market description of the book.
  - Help: Touch Quick tips, Help center, Contact us, or Report a problem to link the appropriate website.

# Google+

Share updates and see what is going on around you with Google+ for mobile.

- Share your thoughts and location.
- Instantly upload your photos and videos as you take them.
- Get updates from your circles in the stream.
- · Check in to a place.
- Make plans on-the-go with group messaging.
- View posts from people around you.

To get started:

- From a Home screen, touch Applications
   → g<sup>+</sup> Google+.
   The Google+ home screen displays.
- 2. Touch (Menu) → Help and then touch a topic to learn more about using Google+.

#### Internet

Your device is equipped with a full HTML Browser that allows you to access the Internet.

Tip: By default, Internet appears as a Primary Shortcut on Home screens.

From a Home screen, touch Internet.Your home page displays.

# **Navigating the Internet**

The following options are available for Internet navigation.

## **Command Keys**

- Touch (Back) to return to the previous page.
- Touch to display Bookmarks, Most visited, and History.
- Touch (Menu) → Forward to go forward to a recent page.



#### **Touching and Dragging**

 Touch and drag your finger on the screen to navigate pages and to reposition pages within the screen.

## **Entering Text in a Field**

 While browsing, touch a text field to display the virtual QWERTY keyboard to enter text.

#### Zoom

- Tap the screen twice to zoom in or out.
- Use two fingers, such as your index finger and thumb, to zoom out by making an inward pinch motion on the screen. To zoom in, make an outward motion by sweeping your fingers out.

Tip: For convenient browsing, you can rotate the device to landscape mode.

## **Selecting Items On a Page**

While browsing, use gestures and menus to navigate:

- Touch an item to select it.
- Touch a hyperlink to follow the link.

## **Using Internet Windows**

You can have multiple windows open at one time and easily switch between windows.

- To open a new window, touch **New window**.

Touch Windows → New window.

- **4.** To switch to another open window, touch **Windows**, then touch another open window to display it.
- To close an open window, touch Windows, then touch
   in the upper right corner of the window you want
  to close.

## **Entering a URL**

Access a website quickly by entering the URL.

- Touch the URL field at the top of the screen, then enter the URL using the virtual QWERTY keyboard.

As you enter characters, potential matches display.

Note: Use the Delete key to clear the URL field, if necessary.

Continue entering characters and touch to load the page.

## **Copying Fields or Text**

Copy information from a webpage to the clipboard for pasting, searching, or sharing.

#### **Selecting Text**

- From a Home screen, touch ( Internet.
- 2. Browse to a webpage.
- On the webpage, touch and hold on the text until the text viewer displays. When you see the text you want highlighted, stop touching the screen.The text is highlighted.
- **4.** Touch and drag the left or right text selector to select more or less text.

#### Copying a Hyperlink or URL

- 1. From a Home screen, touch ( Internet and browse to a webpage.
- 2. Touch and hold on the link or URL, then touch Copy link URL on the pop-up menu.

## Pasting Text. Hyperlinks, or URLs

To paste copied text, hyperlinks, or URLs:

- 1. Navigate to the desired field or to another application.
- Touch and hold in a text field.
- Touch Paste on the pop-up menu.

# **Using Bookmarks**

While browsing, bookmark a site to guickly access it later.

#### Creating a Bookmark

- 2. Touch → Bookmarks.

The **Add bookmark** prompt displays.

  - Share page: Use Bluetooth, ChatON, Email, Gmail, or Google+ to send the page's URL.
  - **Downloads**: View and manage recent downloads.
  - Settings: Customize the Internet settings (see "Internet Settings" on page 73).

## **Internet Settings**

- From a Home screen, touch

- 2. Touch (Menu) → More → Settings for the following options:

#### Page content settings

- **Default zoom**: Choose a default zoom level for webpages.
- Open pages in overview: When enabled, displays an overview of newly-opened pages.
- **Text encoding**: Choose a default character set for webpages.
- Block pop-up windows: When enabled, blocks pop-up windows.
- Load images: When enabled, images are automatically loaded when you visit a page. When disabled, images are indicated by a link, which you can touch to download the picture.
- Auto-fit pages: When enabled, the Browser automatically sizes webpages to fit your device's display.
- Landscape view only: When enabled, all pages display in the wider landscape orientation (rotate your device to view pages in landscape mode).

- Enable JavaScript: When enabled, the Browser automatically runs JavaScript scripts on pages you visit.
- **Enable plug-ins**: When enabled, the Browser automatically loads and runs plug-ins on pages you visit.
- Open in background: When enabled, new windows open behind the current window.
- **Set home page**: View and set the default first page that displays when you launch the Browser.
- **Default storage**: The default location for downloads.

#### **Privacy settings**

- Clear cache: Delete content and databases stored on the device.
- Clear history: Delete the list of previously-visited pages.
- Accept cookies: When enabled, allows Browser to save and read cookie information used by webpages.
- Clear all cookie data: Delete cookie information saved to the device.
- Remember form data: When enabled, stores information you enter into forms to make future forms easier.

- Clear form data: Deletes saved form information.
- **Enable location**: When enabled, sites you visit can request access to your location.
- Clear location access: Clear location access for all web sites.

#### Security settings

- Remember passwords: When enabled, saves usernames and passwords for sites you visit, to make future visits easier.
- Clear passwords: Clear all saved usernames and passwords.
- Show security warnings: When enabled, the Browser warns you if there is a problem with a site's security.

#### Advanced settings

- **Select search engine**: Select the search engine you want to use. Choices are: Google, Yahoo!, and Bing.
- Website settings: View and manage settings for individual web sites
- Reset to default: Clear all browser data and reset all settings to the factory defaults.

## Latitude

With Google Latitude, you can see the location of all of your friends on a map or on a list. You can also share or hide your location.

You must first set up your tablet to use wireless networks to help pinpoint your location. Also, Latitude works best when Wi-Fi is enabled.

#### To enable Wi-Fi:

- **1.** From a Home screen, touch  $\blacksquare$  (Menu)  $\rightarrow$  Settings.
- Touch Location and security → Use wireless networks.
   A green check mark indicates the feature is enabled.
- Touch Wireless and network → Wi-Fi settings → Wi-Fi
  to turn Wi-Fi on. For more information, refer to "Wi-Fi"

- 4. Log on to your Google account.

Your location is displayed on the map, accurate to 30 meters.

## **Sharing Your Location with Friends**

- 3. Touch Select from Contacts or Add via email address.
- 4. Touch a contact.

Enter an email address and touch Add friends.

5. At the Send sharing requests prompt, touch Yes.

Your friend will receive an email or text message with your location marked on a map. They will also receive instructions on how to view your location from the Internet or use Latitude on their device, if it is available. Once they acknowledge your request, their location will display on your device. They can share their location from their computer, phone, or device.

Compass: Set the map to always display north at the top of the screen or to automatically rotate like a compass, keeping north on the map facing north, and so on. Your device may have to be calibrated the first time you use this feature. Follow the on-screen instructions.

#### **Places**

Places is an application that uses Google Maps and your location to help you find Restaurants, Cafes, Bars, Attractions, and other businesses. You can also add your own locations.

The Places application allows you to find the best sources for business information across the web, including business listing details, reviews, photos, nearby public transit, and other related information. Business owners can provide additional details, such as photos, hours of operation, and coupons.

- 2. Touch one of the business categories to search for a particular business.
  - All of the businesses in that category that are close to you display.
- 3. Touch a business in the list to see more details about it. The business details such as address, phone, website, and location are displayed. You can also see reviews from around the web and from Google users.

# **Google Search**

Search the internet, and your device, using the Google search engine.

Tip: The Google Search widget appears on the main Home screen by default. For information about displaying widgets on the Home screen, see "Adding Widgets to a Home Screen" on page 28.

- **Home**: Display the main YouTube screen.
- Browse: View videos by category such as Comedy, Education, or Music.
- Search: Enter criteria to find videos.
- My Channel: Add an account and configure account settings.
- **Upload**: Transfer a video from your device to YouTube.
- Settings: Configure display and search settings and view information about the application.

- Feedback: Displays the YouTube feedback form. You must be at least 18 years old to fill out the form.
- Google Mobile Terms of Service / YouTube Terms of Service / Google Mobile Privacy Policy / YouTube Privacy Policy: Tap one of the items to read the selected terms of service or privacy policy information.
- Open source licenses: Displays the license details for open source software.
- **Application version**: Displays the YouTube version number.

## **Section 7: Music**

This section explains how to use the music features of your device including the Music Player and the FM Radio.

# **Music Player**

The Music Player plays songs from an installed memory card.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch 📦 Music.
- Music Player scans your memory card and displays songs on the All, Playlists, Albums, or Artists tabs.
- 3. Touch a song or playlist to begin playback.
- **4.** During playback, use the sound and playlist controls:
  - SoundAlive: Touch to set SoundAlive options. For more information, refer to "Music Player Settings" on page 86.
  - Shuffle: When enabled, songs play in random order. When disabled, songs play in the order they appear in List view.
  - Time indicators: The time indicators show, in minutes and seconds, how much of the song has played (left) and the length of the song (right).



Note: Tap the screen to hide or display the Shuffle, Repeat Section, and Repeat icons, the Progress Bar, and time indicators.

#### Playback controls:

- Touch to advance to the next song. Touch and hold to scan forward through the current song.
- Touch to go back to the previous song. Touch and hold
   to scan backward through the current song.
- Touch 
   ■ to pause playback. Touch 
   ■ to resume playback.
- List mode: Touch to switch to the All tab, which lists all songs.
- Progress Bar: Touch and drag the end of the progress bar to scan forward or backward through the current song.
- Repeat: Touch to repeat the current song, repeat all songs, or disable repeat mode.
- Repeat Section: Touch to select a section you want to repeat.
   Touch once to set the start of the section (A). Touch again to set the end of the section (B) and start the repeating section. Touch Clear A-B to clear and stop the repeating section.
- Volume: Touch to activate on-screen volume control, then touch and drag on the scale to set volume. You can also press the Volume Key on the side of the device to adjust playback volume.

## **Music Player Options**

To access additional options while playing a song, follow these steps:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Music, then touch a song or playlist to begin playback.
- 2. Touch (Menu).

The follow options are available:

- Add to quick list / Go to quick list: Adds the current music file to the Quick list or displays the Quick list.
- Via Bluetooth: Scan for devices and pair with a Bluetooth headset.
- **Share music via**: Share your music by using AllShare, Bluetooth, Gmail, or Email.
- Set as alarm tone: Use the current music file as an alarm tone.
- Add to playlist: Add the current music file to a selected playlist.
- More:
  - Details: View media information such as artist name, song title, album title, track length, genre, recording date, and so on.
  - Settings: Change your music player settings. For more information, refer to "Music Player Settings" on page 86.

## **Creating a Playlist**

- Touch (Menu) → Create, then touch the name field to enter a name for the playlist.

  - Play speed: Touch and drag the speed indicator from 0.7 to 1.3. The default speed is 1.0.
  - Music menu: Choose the types of menus to display as tabs in Music Player. A check mark indicates selected types.
  - Music play screen: Choose a background graphic for the music play screen. Touch Albumart, Lyrics, or Graphic 01, 02, 03, or 04. A green check mark displays on the graphic you choose. Touch **Done** to start using the graphic.

#### **FM Radio**

The built-in FM radio in your device provides free music from your local FM radio stations. You can manually or automatically scan for stations and create a Station List of your favorite stations.

To use the radio:

1. From the Home screen, touch FM Radio.

- or -

From a Home screen, touch Replications

→ FM Radio.

The FM Radio screen displays.

If you have not plugged in your headphones, an **Earphone not connected** message displays. Your headphones also serve as an antenna for your FM radio.

- Turn the Station Dial clockwise or counter-clockwise to find FM stations as indicated by the Current Radio Station indicator at the top of the display.
- 3. Touch the On / Off button to turn on or turn off the sound. (5) indicates that the sound is off.



- 4. Touch Media Volume to adjust the volume.
- Touch the Previous Station button or the Next Station button to step through the available stations.
- 6. Touch a Favorites button to set the current station as a favorite. Once a Favorites button is set, touch the button to go to that station.

- **7.** Touch (Menu) to display the following options:
  - Via speaker / Via earphones: Toggle between the headset and the device speakers.
  - **Normal frequency / Alternative frequency**: Toggle between normal frequencies and alternative frequencies.
  - All channels: Display the list of stations found after a scan and your favorites. This list may be empty, if no scan has been performed and no favorites have been set.

Touch **(Menu)** for the following options:

- Remove: Touch Select all or touch individual stations to remove them from the Station List. Touch Remove once you have made your selection.
- Rename: Touch the station you want to rename, enter the new name, and touch Save.
- Scan: Removes the existing Station List, if one exists, scans for FM stations, and adds them to the Station List. Touch All channels to remove your Favorites or Retaining favorites to keep your favorites.

- **Settings**: Displays the following options:
- Region: Touch the region that best describes where you are using FM Radio. Choices are: Europe and USA.
- Background playing: Enable the FM radio to play in the background after closing the application. Remove the check mark to disable this feature.
- Show Station ID: Display station information.
- Alternative frequency: Turn alternative frequency on or off.
- FM auto off: Enable the Fm radio to play and then automatically turn off after 30 minutes, 1 hour, or 2 hours.
   Touch Off to disable this feature.

# **Section 8: Photos and Videos**

This section explains how to use your device's built-in camera and camcorder, how to use the Videos app to view and manage videos, and how to use the Gallery app to view, capture, and manage photos and videos.

#### **Camera**

Use your device's built-in camera and camcorder to take photos and record videos.


■ From a Home screen, touch Applications → Camera.

The Camera screen displays.

**Important!** Do not take photos of people without their permission.

Do not take photos in places where cameras are not allowed.

Do not take photos in places where you may interfere with another person's privacy.



Options and Settings

## **Taking Photos**

- Using the display as a viewfinder, compose your photo by aiming the lens at the subject. To configure settings, see "Camera Options and Settings" on page 90.
- 3. To take the photo, touch the Camera Key.

## **Camera Options and Settings**

Camera options and settings are represented by icons on the left side of the screen. While in Camera mode, touch the following icons to configure the camera:



**Self shot**: Touch to switch to the front-facing camera lens and take a photo of yourself.



**Shooting mode**: Choose an automatic shooting mode, from:

- Single shot: Take a single photo.
- Continuous: Take consecutive photos by pressing and holding the Camera key.
- Panorama: Touch the Camera button to take a photo, then use the on-screen guideline to move the viewfinder and take the next 7 shots automatically.
- Smile shot: Touch the Camera button to automatically focus on the subject's face and take the photo.



Scene mode: Choose an automatic scene mode from None, Landscape, Night, Sports, Party/Indoor, Beach/ Snow, Sunset, Dawn, Fall colour, Firework, Candlelight, or Backlight.



**Brightness**: Set the brightness of the photo.



**Settings**: Touch for the following options:

- Timer: Set a 2, 5, or 10 second timer.
- Resolution: Set a size for the image. Options are: 2M (1600x1200), 1.3M (1280x960), 0.3M (640x480), or 0.1M (320x240).
- White balance: Set the light source. Options are: Auto, Daylight, Cloudy, Incandescent, or Fluorescent.
- Effects: Apply an effect to photos. Options are: Normal, Negative, Black and white, or Sepia.
- Metering: Set how the camera measures or meters the light source: Centre-weighted, Spot, or Matrix.
- Image quality: Choose a quality setting for photos.
   Options are: Superfine, Fine, or Normal.



**Settings**: Touch for the following options:

- Guidelines: Used to enable or disable the guidelines.
- GPS: Enable or disable tagging of photos with your GPS location.
   displays on the screen when this option is active.

Caution! Be aware that your location may be present on a photo when posting your photos on the internet.

- Review: Activate the instant review feature, which displays images immediately after capture.
- Shutter sound: Enable or disable one of the camera's three shutter sounds.
- Storage: Set the storage location. Options are: Internal memory or memory card.
- Reset: Set all Camera settings back to the defaults.

# **Viewing Photos with the Image Viewer**

After taking a photo, use the Image Viewer to view, share, or delete photos.

- 1. Touch (Image Viewer) to view the photo.
- Touch the screen to show or hide Image Viewer options.
- Touch the screen with two fingers or double-tap on the screen to zoom all the way in or out. For more information, refer to "Pinch" on page 24.
- Sweep across the screen to display the next or previous photo.
- Touch Share to use AllShare, Bluetooth, ChatON, Email, Gmail, Google+, or Picasa to share the photo.
- Touch Set as to assign the photo as a Contact icon, Home screen wallpaper, or Lock screen wallpaper.
- Touch Delete to delete the photo being displayed. Touch OK to delete the photo or Cancel to exit.
- 8. Touch (Back) to return to the Camera to take more photos.

Note: Photos are stored in the /sdcard/DCIM/Camera folder as jpg files. For more information, refer to "My Files" on page 123.

#### Camcorder

Use your device's built-in Camcorder to record highdefinition video in 720p resolution.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch R Applications
  - → Camera.
- 2. Touch the **Mode** icon to switch from the the Camera to the Camcorder.

Important! Do not take videos of people without their permission.

Do not take videos in places where cameras are not allowed.

Do not take videos in places where you may interfere with another person's privacy.

## **Camcorder Options and Settings**

Before you start recording videos, use the camcorder options and settings to configure the camcorder for best results. Camcorder options are represented by icons on the left side of the screen.

**Brightness**: Set the brightness of the video.



**Resolution:** Set the video size to either: 640x480 or 320x240.



**Settings:** Touch for the following options:

 Timer: Set a timer for how long to wait before recording a video. Options are: Off, 2 sec, 5 sec, and 10 sec.

- White balance: Set the light source. Options are: Auto, Daylight, Cloudy, Incandescent, or Fluorescent.
- Effects: Apply an effect to videos. Options are: Normal, Negative, Black and white, or Sepia.
- Video quality: Choose a quality setting for videos.
   Options are: Superfine, Fine, or Normal.



**Settings**: Touch for the following options:

- Guidelines: Used to enable or disable the quidelines.
- Audio recording: Enable to record sound along with video.
- Review: Enable or disable the instant review feature, which displays videos immediately after capture.
- **Storage**: Set the storage location. Options are: Internal memory or Memory card.
- Reset: Set all Camcorder settings back to the defaults.

## **Viewing Videos with the Image Viewer**

After recording a video, use the Image Viewer to play, share, or delete your video.

- 1. Touch (Image Viewer) to view the video.
- Touch the screen to show or hide Image Viewer options.
- Sweep across the screen to display the next or previous video.
- Touch Share to use AllShare, Bluetooth, ChatON, Email, Gmail. or YouTube to share the video.
- Touch Delete to delete the video being displayed. Touch OK to delete the photo or Cancel to exit.
- 6. While viewing a video, you can also adjust the screen view. Touch (Original Size), (Full-Screen in Ratio View), or (Full-Screen View). For more information, refer to "Adjusting Screen View" on page 96.

- Touch Play to play the video being displayed. Touch
   (Pause) to pause the video and touch
   (Resume) to resume playing the video.
- 8. Touch and drag the white dot on the progress bar to fast forward or rewind the video. Touch the left end of the progress bar to restart the video. Touch the right end of the progress bar to end the video playback. or —

Touch (Rewind) to restart the video or (Fast Forward) to end the video.

- 9. Touch (Brightness) to adjust the video brightness.
- **10.** Touch (Back) to return to the Camcorder.

Note: Videos are stored in the /sdcard/DCIM/Camera folder as mp4 files. For more information, refer to "My Files" on page 123.

#### **Videos**

Your device's 4.2-inch 800x480 WVGA TFT LCD touch screen provides playback of videos. Use the Videos app to view and manage videos stored on an installed memory card.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch **Videos**.
- 2. While viewing the Videos list, touch (Menu) for options:
  - Remove from list: Touch videos to select them or touch Select all to remove all videos. Touch Remove from list to delete the video files
  - List by: Display videos by Size, Name (default), Date, or Type.
- Touch a video to play it. While playing a video, touch the screen to display or hide on-screen playback controls.

- **4.** During playback, touch (Menu) for options:
  - Share video: Send the video by AllShare, YouTube, ChatON, Bluetooth, Gmail, or Email.
  - SoundAlive: Set the sound quality to Normal, Voice, Movie, or 5.1 ch.
  - Details: Provides details about the photo such as File name,
     Format, Resolution, File size, Date & Time, and Forwarding.
  - Add bookmark: Add a bookmark at the current spot in the video.
  - Bookmarks: Display all bookmarks for this video. Touch a bookmark to start playing the video at the bookmarked spot.
     Touch Delete, touch bookmarks, and then touch Done to delete bookmarks.
  - More: Touch for more options.
    - Via Bluetooth: Scans for a Bluetooth device on which to play the video.
    - Repeat: Set the video or all videos to repeat.
    - Subtitles: View subtitles for the video, if available.

## **Adjusting Screen View**

While viewing a video, you can also adjust the screen view. Screen view allows you to select Original Size, Full-Screen, or Full-Screen in Ratio to view your video.

Note: The screen view icons are a three-way toggle. The icon that is displayed, is the mode that appears after the icon is touched.

- Original Size ( ): Play the video in its original size.
- Full-Screen in Ratio View ( ): Enlarge the video as much as possible without becoming distorted.
- Full-Screen View ( ): Use the entire screen, which may cause some minor distortion.

#### Other Video Controls

The following controls are also available while viewing a video:

- Brightness: Touch to adjust the video brightness.
- **Volume**: Touch and use the slider to adjust the video volume.

- Pause / Resume: Touch to pause the video being played.
   Touch to resume playing.
- Previous / Rewind: Touch to jump to the previously played video or touch and hold to restart the video.
- Next / Fast Forward: Touch to jump to the previously played video or touch and hold to fast forward to the end of the video.
- Touch and drag the white dot on the progress bar to fast forward or rewind the video. Touch the left end of the progress bar to restart the video. Touch the right end of the progress bar to end the video playback.
- Exit: To return to the videos list, touch in the top right corner of the screen.

# **Gallery**

Your device's 4.2-inch 800x480 WVGA TFT LCD touch screen provides high-resolution display of photos and videos.

Use the Gallery app to view, capture, and manage photos and videos.

## **Gallery Options**

When you open the Gallery, various photo and video folders are displayed. The folders can be on your device or on your external memory card.

    - Details: Displays details about the folders selected.

# **Section 9: Connections**

Your device includes features to connect to the internet and to other devices by using Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, or a USB cable. Your device also supports removable microSD<sup>™</sup> or microSDHC<sup>™</sup> memory cards for storing music, photos, videos, and files.

## Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that provides access to local area networks. Use your device's Wi-Fi feature to:

- Access the internet for browsing or to send and receive email.
- Access your corporate network.
- Use hotspots provided by hotels or airports while traveling.

Wi-Fi communication requires access to an existing Wireless Access Point (WAP). WAPs can be Open (unsecured, as with most hotspots) or Secured (requiring you to provide login credentials). Your device supports the 802.11 b/g/n/a Wi-Fi protocol.

# **Configuring Wi-Fi Settings**

# Finding Wi-Fi Networks

You can have your device automatically notify you of available networks. For more information, refer to "Network Notification" on page 132.

# Turning Wi-Fi On or Off

Turn your device's Wi-Fi service on or off. When you turn Wi-Fi service on, your device automatically searches for available, in-range WAPs (Wireless Access Points).

## **Turning Wi-Fi On**

- 1. From any screen, sweep your finger downward from the top to display the Notification Panel.
- 2. Touch Wi-Fi to turn Wi-Fi On.

#### **Turning Wi-Fi Off**

- From any screen, sweep your finger downward from the top to display the Notification Panel.
- 2. Touch Wi-Fi to turn Wi-Fi Off.

# Scanning and Connecting to a Wi-Fi Network

When you turn on Wi-Fi, your device searches for available Wi-Fi connections, then displays them on screen.

- **1.** From any screen, sweep your finger downward from the top to display the Notification Panel.
- Touch Wi-Fi to turn Wi-Fi On. Your device automatically scans for available Wireless Access Points.
- When the scan is complete, touch a Wi-Fi network to connect. If the Wi-Fi network is open, your device automatically connects. If the Wi-Fi network is secured, enter the password at the prompt to connect.

# Adding a Wi-Fi Network Manually

- From a Home screen, touch (Menu) → Settings
   → Wireless and network → Wi-Fi settings.
- 2. Touch Wi-Fi to turn Wi-Fi On.
- Touch Add Wi-Fi network, then enter information about the network:
  - Network SSID: Enter the name of the Wi-Fi Wireless Access Point
  - Security: Select the type of security used by the WAP.
  - Password: If the WAP is secured, enter the password or hex key.

**Note:** Depending on the Security protocol used by the WAP, additional network information may be required.

Touch Save to save the settings.

#### **Bluetooth**

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology for exchanging information over a distance of about 30 feet.

You do not need to line up the devices to send information with Bluetooth. If the devices are in range, you can exchange information between them, even if they are in different rooms.

Configure your device's Bluetooth settings. For more information, refer to "Bluetooth Settings" on page 133.

# Turning Bluetooth On or Off Turning Bluetooth On

- 1. From any screen, sweep your finger downward from the top to display the Notification Panel.

- 2. Touch Bluetooth to turn Bluetooth off.

## Pairing with a Bluetooth Device

Search for a Bluetooth device and pair with it, to exchange information between your device and the target device.

Tip: After pairing, your device and the target device recognize each other and exchange information without having to enter a passcode or PIN.

- From a Home screen, touch (Menu) → Settings
   → Wireless and network → Bluetooth settings.
- 2. Touch Bluetooth to turn on Bluetooth.
- Enable the target device's discoverable or visible mode.
- 4. Touch Scan devices.

- 5. From the list of scanned devices, touch the target device, then follow the prompts to complete the pairing:
  - If the target device requires a PIN, enter a PIN for the target device and touch **Accept**. When prompted, enter the PIN on the target device.
  - If the device allows automatic or smart pairing, your device attempts to pair with the device automatically. Follow the prompts on your device and the target device to complete the pairing.

# **Samsung Kies**

Samsung Kies is a software that enables you to update your device firmware by connecting to the PC.

Your computer recognizes the connection and displays the Portable Device screen.

- Click the option to open Windows Media Player to synchronize music files.
- Select and drag the music files you want to the sync list and begin synchronizing.
- When finished, exit Windows Media Player and disconnect the USB cable.

### **Connecting as a Mass Storage Device**

You can connect your device to a PC as a removable disk and access the file directory. If you insert a memory card in the device, you can also access the files directory from the memory card by using the device as a memory card reader.

**Note:** The file directory of the memory card displays as folder external\_sd, separate from the internal memory.

- Insert a memory card into the device to transfer files from or to the memory card.

#### **Kies Air**

This mobile application enables Wi-Fi device-to-device connections and browser-based management. You can use Kies air without PC software or a USB connection. Kies Air makes it easy to transfer media files, play content, back up files, and more between your mobile device and your desktop - all through a simple web browser on the same wireless network. Simplify your content with Samsung's Kies air.

#### To use Kies air:

- Sign onto the same Wi-Fi network from your device and from your PC.
- 2. From a Home screen, on your device, touch

  Applications → Kies air.
- From the Kies air home screen, touch Start.A web URL is displayed on your device screen.

Tip: To open applications quickly, add the icons of frequentlyused applications to one of the Home screens. For details, see "Adding Shortcuts from Applications" on page 31.

# **GPS Applications**

GPS applications allow you to achieve real-time, GPSenabled, turn-by-turn navigation and to access local searches based on a variety of category parameters.

To receive better GPS signals, avoid using your device in the following conditions:

- inside a building or between buildings
- in a tunnel or underground passage
- in poor weather
- · around high-voltage or electromagnetic fields

in a vehicle with tinted windows

Global GPS turn-by-turn navigation, mapping, and Point of Interest content is available for three continents, including North America (U.S., Canada, and Mexico), Western Europe, and China, where wireless coverage is available.

Important! If you touch or cover the internal GPS antenna while using GPS services, it may impede the GPS signal resulting in the GPS services not working in an optimal manner. Refer to the following diagram to locate the approximate location of the internal GPS antenna.



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#### **AllShare**

AllShare allows your tablet to stream photos, music, and videos from its memory to other Digital Living Network Alliance (DLNA) certified devices. Your tablet can also play digital content streamed from other DLNA certified devices.

### **Configuring AllShare**

#### Files on a Remote Device

- 1. Touch the Remote device tab, which lists remote devices available through AllShare.
- Touch a remote device or touch Refresh to look for available devices.
- 3. Touch Videos, Photos, or Music to view files on the remote device.
- 4. Touch a file to view or play it. The Select device pop-up displays.
- Touch the playback device.
- Touch and hold a file to download it to your device or to view the details about the file, such as, Title, Date created. File location, and so on.

# **Angry Birds**

Angry Birds is a fun and addictive puzzle game. You must slingshot birds with various powers, across the screen to destroy various structures constructed by green pigs, who just happened to have taken some eggs from the birds. You can play Angry Birds with just the touchscreen. No buttons, keys, or joysticks are needed!

- 1. From the Home screen, touch | Applications → Mary Birds.
- 2. Touch PLAY and follow the on-screen instructions.

#### Books

Google eBooks is a new way to discover, buy, and enjoy your favorite books online and offline.

#### **Calculator**

The calculator provides the basic arithmetic functions: addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. You can also use this as a scientific calculator.

Tip: A shortcut to Calculator appears on the main Home screen by default.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Calculator.
  - or -

From a Home screen, touch | Applications



→ ‡ Calculator.

- 2. Enter the first number using the numeric keys.
- Enter the operation for your calculation by touching the + (add), - (subtract), x (multiply), or ÷ (divide) key.
- Enter the next number.
- **5.** To view the result, touch the **=** (equals) key.
- 6. Repeat steps 3 through 5 as many times as required.
- **7.** Rotate your device to display the calculator in landscape mode.

#### Calendar

Record events and appointments to manage your schedule.

- 2. Touch a tab to choose a calendar view:
  - Month: Display the current month. Sweep up or down the screen to display other months.
  - Week: Display the current week. Sweep across the screen to display other weeks.
  - Day: Display today's schedule by hour. Touch the arrowhead on either side of the day title to display another day.

- List: Display only event names and dates as of the displayed date. Touch Tap to look for more at the bottom of the screen to display more events.
- 3. Touch (Menu) for these options:
  - Search: Find an event. Use the on-screen keyboard to enter a search term. Possible events display as you type. Touch Go on the keyboard to start the search. Touch an event and then touch (Menu) to edit, delete, or send the event.
  - Create: Create a new event for any day or time period.
  - Go to: Display a specific date.
  - **Today**: Displays today's date, if it is not already being displayed.
  - **Delete**: Delete events for the day or for All this month.
  - Settings: Customize the calendar. For more information, refer to "Customizing the Calendar" on page 112.

# **Creating a Calendar Event**

To create a calendar event:

- **2.** Touch the **Month** tab and then touch a day.
  - or -

Touch the Week tab, touch a day, and then an hour.

- or -

Touch the Day and then touch an hour.

View the date and time in any time zone.

- Touch the World clock tab at the top of the Clock screen.
- Touch Add city or touch (Menu) → Add.

- Choose a city by typing a city name or scrolling through the list.
- 5. Touch (Menu) for the these additional options:
  - **Delete**: Select cities to remove from the display.
  - **DST settings**: Touch for a city to set daylight savings time.

### Flight Mode

Flight mode allows you to use many of your devices's features, such as Camera, Games, and more, when you are in an airplane or in any other area where accessing data is prohibited.

**Important!** When your device is in Flight Mode, it cannot access online information or applications.

- Touch the Flight mode check box to enable Flight mode.
   A check mark displayed next to the feature indicates Flight mode is active.

### Wi-Fi Settings

Your device supports Wi-Fi b/g/n/a. Use Wi-Fi settings to manage your device's Wi-Fi connections.

### **Turning Wi-Fi On or Off**

Turn your device's Wi-Fi service on or off. When you turn Wi-Fi service on, your device automatically searches for available, in-range Wireless Access Points (WAPs).

- Touch Wi-Fi settings, then touch Wi-Fi to turn Wi-Fi On or Off. When on, a check mark appears in the check box.

WPS can automatically set up a random network name and WPA wireless security for wireless Wi-Fi phones, routers, access points, computers, adapters, and other electronic devices. WPS allows you to push buttons instead of entering a

    - IP address: The Internet Protocol (IP) address assigned to the device by the Wi-Fi network to which you are connected unless the IP settings, below, are used to assign it a static IP address.

- IP Settings: Enter IP settings for configuring a connection to a network using a static IP, including:
  - Use static IP: Touch to turn static IP On or Off.
  - IP address: Enter the IP address.
  - Gateway: Enter the gateway.
  - **Netmask**: Enter the netmask.

  - Touch Set L2TP secret and enter a password, if desired, then touch OK
  - Touch Set user certificate, then touch OK.
  - Touch Set CA certificate, then touch OK.
  - Touch DNS search domains, add a name for DNS search using the keypad, then touch OK.

### Sound

#### General

#### Silent Mode

Temporarily silence all the sounds your device makes except for media playback and alarms.

Set the volume level for all types of sounds.

- 2. Touch and drag the sliders to set:
  - Ringtone: Adjust the sound for the incoming calls.
  - Media: Playback of music, videos, and other multimedia content.
  - Alarm: Adjust the volume of alarms.
  - **System volume**: Sets the volume levels for feedback and also controls sound when you power the device on or off.
  - Notification: Sets the volume levels for notifications.
- 3. Touch **OK** to save your setting.

**Tip:** You can also set **Media volume** from the Home screen by pressing the **Volume Key**.

Select a default ringtone for message, alarm, and other notifications.

# **Display**

In this menu, you can change various settings for the display such as wallpapers, font style, brightness, screen orientation, animation, screen timeout, and horizontal calibration.

- Under Lock screen, touch Wallpaper to choose None (no wallpaper) or wallpaper from the Gallery.
   Touch Clock position and then touch Top, Middle, or Bottom to set the location of the time, day, and date on the Lock screen.

### Font Style

Sets the fonts used on the LCD display. The default font, is the only font that comes with your device.

- From a Home screen, touch (Menu) → Settings
   → Display.
- 2. Touch Font style.
- 3. Touch Get fonts online to download additional fonts.

### **Brightness**

Configures the LCD brightness levels.

- From a Home screen, touch (Menu) → Settings
   → Display.
- 2. Touch Brightness.
- Touch and drag the slider to set the brightness and touch OK.

#### **Auto-Rotate Screen**

Used to switch the display orientation automatically when you rotate the device.

- From a Home screen, touch (Menu) → Settings
   → Display.
- Touch Auto-rotate screen to enable or disable the mode. When enabled, a check mark appears in the check box.

#### **Animation**

Sets whether some or all of the window elements animate.

- From a Home screen, touch (Menu) → Settings
   → Display.
- 2. Touch Animation.

Touch No animation, Some animations, or All animations.

#### **Screen Timeout**

Adjusts the delay time before the screen automatically turns off.

- From a Home screen, touch (Menu) → Settings
   → Display.
- 2. Touch Screen timeout.
- Touch 15 seconds, 30 seconds, 1 minute, 2 minutes, 10 minutes, or 30 minutes.

# **Gyroscope Calibration**

Lets you horizontally calibrate your display using the accelerometer.

- From a Home screen, touch (Menu) → Settings
   → Display.
- 2. Touch Gyroscope calibration.
- Place your device on a level surface and touch Calibrate.

# **Location and Security**

You value your privacy. So, by default, your device only acquires your location when you dial 911. To use Location-Based Services, you must first enable location services on your device.

### My Location

#### **Use Wireless Networks**

Before you use applications such as Google Maps and find your location or search for places of interest, you must enable the Use wireless networks option or enable the GPS satellites.

- From a Home screen, touch (Menu) → Settings
   → Location and security.
- Touch Use wireless networks to enable location information using the wireless network.

#### **Use GPS Satellites**

- From a Home screen, touch (Menu) → Settings
   → Location and security.

Choose settings for unlocking your screen. For more information about using the lock and unlock features, see "Securing Your Device" on page 15.

- Touch Set screen lock and select one of the following options:
  - None: Disables screen unlock security.
  - **Pattern**: Requires that you draw a pattern on the screen to unlock it. Follow the on-screen instructions.
  - PIN: Requires that you enter a numeric PIN number to unlock the screen. Enter a PIN number, confirm it, then touch OK.
  - Password: Requires that you enter a password to unlock the screen. Enter a password, confirm it, then touch OK. The password must contain at least one letter.

- Touch Allow mock locations to enable or disable the setting. When enabled, a check mark appears in the box.

### **Samsung Apps**

Using the Samsung Apps option, the device notifies you when there are new applications in Samsung Apps.

- For new application notification, touch On. Touch Off to disable new application notification.
- To delete Samsung Apps' locale data, touch Reset locale and then touch OK.

This section outlines the safety precautions associated with using your Galaxy Player. The terms "GALAXY" or "mobile device" are used in this section to refer to your Galaxy Player. Read this information before using your mobile device.

# **Exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) Signals**

Although GALAXY is not a cell phone, it can operate on the same network as cell phones and can use the same Radio Frequency (RF) signals to communicate with the network as a cell phone. Therefore, although the following information refers specifically to RF exposure from wireless phones, it may apply similarly to GALAXY when it is being used on a cell phone network.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has published information for consumers relating to Radio Frequency (RF) exposure from wireless phones. The FDA publication includes the following information:

## Do cell phones pose a health hazard?

Many people are concerned that cell phone radiation will cause cancer or other serious health hazards. The weight of scientific evidence has not linked cell phones with any health problems.

Cell phones emit low levels of Radio Frequency (RF) energy. Over the past 15 years, scientists have conducted hundreds of studies looking at the biological effects of the radio frequency energy emitted by cell phones. While some researchers have reported biological changes associated with RF energy, these studies have failed to be replicated. The majority of studies published have failed to show an association between exposure to radio frequency from a cell phone and health problems.

The low levels of RF cell phones emit while in use are in the microwave frequency range. They also emit RF at substantially reduced time intervals when in the stand-by mode. Whereas high levels of RF can produce health effects (by heating tissue), exposure to low level RF that does not produce heating effects causes no known adverse health effects.

The biological effects of radio frequency energy should not be confused with the effects from other types of electromagnetic energy.

Very high levels of electromagnetic energy, such as is found in X-rays and gamma rays, can ionize biological tissues. Ionization is a process where electrons are stripped away from their normal locations in atoms and molecules. It can permanently damage biological tissues including DNA, the genetic material.

The energy levels associated with radio frequency energy, including both radio waves and microwaves, are not great enough to cause ionization of atoms and molecules.

Therefore, RF energy is a type of non-ionizing radiation. Other types of non-ionizing radiation include visible light, infrared radiation (heat), and other forms of electromagnetic radiation with relatively low frequencies.

While RF energy does not ionize particles, large amounts can increase body temperatures and cause tissue damage. Two areas of the body, the eyes and the testes, are particularly vulnerable to RF heating because there is relatively little blood flow in them to carry away excess heat.

## Research Results to Date: Is there a connection between RF and certain health problems?

The results of most studies conducted to date say no. In addition, attempts to replicate and confirm the few studies that have shown a connection have failed.

The scientific community at large therefore believes that the weight of scientific evidence does not show an association between exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) from cell phones and adverse health outcomes. Still the scientific community has supported additional research to address gaps in knowledge. Some of these studies are described below.

## **Interphone Study**

Interphone is a large international study designed to determine whether cell phones increase the risk of head and neck cancer. A report published in the International Journal of Epidemiology (June, 2010) compared cell phone usage for more than 5,000 people with brain tumors (glioma and meningioma) and a similar number of healthy controls.

Results of this study did NOT show that cell phones caused brain cancer. In this study, most people had no increased risk of brain cancer from using cell phones. For people with the heaviest use of cell phones (an average of more than ½ hour per day, every day, for over 10 years) the study suggested a

slight increase in brain cancer. However, the authors determined that biases and errors prevented any conclusions being drawn from this data. Additional information about Interphone can be found at

Interphone is the largest cell phone study to date, but it did not answer all questions about cell phone safety. Additional research is being conducted around the world, and the FDA continues to monitor developments in this field.

## International Cohort Study on Mobile Phone Users (COSMOS)

The COSMOS study aims to conduct long-term health monitoring of a large group of people to determine if there are any health issues linked to long-term exposure to radio frequency energy from cell phone use. The COSMOS study will follow approximately 300,000 adult cell phone users in Europe for 20 to 30 years. ## Risk of Brain Cancer from Exposure to Radio Frequency Fields in Childhood and Adolescence (MOBI-KIDS)

MOBI-KIDS is an international study investigating the relationship between exposure to radio frequency energy from communication technologies including cell phones and brain cancer in young people. ## Surveillance, Epidemiology, and End Results (SEER) Program of the National Cancer Institute

The National Cancer Institute (NCI) actively follows cancer statistics in the United States to detect any change in rates of new cases for brain cancer. If cell phones play a role in risk for brain cancer, rates should go up, because heavy cell phone use has been common for quite some time in the U.S. Between 1987 and 2005, the overall age-adjusted incidence of brain cancer did not increase. ### **Cell Phone Industry Actions**

Although the existing scientific data do not justify FDA regulatory actions, the FDA has urged the cell phone industry to take a number of steps, including the following:

- Support-needed research on possible biological effects of RF for the type of signal emitted by cell phones;
- Design cell phones in a way that minimizes any RF exposure to the user; and
- Cooperate in providing users of cell phones with the current information on cell phone use and human health concerns.

The FDA also is working with voluntary standard-setting bodies such as the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE), the International Commission on Non-lonizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP), and others to assure that safety standards continue to adequately protect the public.

## Reducing Exposure: Hands-Free Kits and Other Accessories

## Steps to Reduce Exposure to Radio Frequency Energy

If there is a risk from being exposed to radio frequency energy (RF) from cell phones - and at this point we do not know that there is - it is probably very small. But, if you are concerned about avoiding even potential risks, you can take a few simple steps to minimize your RF exposure.

- Reduce the amount of time spent using your cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between your head and the cell phone.

### **Hands-Free Kits**

Hands-free kits may include audio or Bluetooth<sup>®</sup> headsets and various types of body-worn accessories such as belt-clips and holsters. Combinations of these can be used to reduce RF energy absorption from cell phones.

Headsets can substantially reduce exposure because the phone is held away from the head in the user's hand or in approved body-worn accessories. Cell phones marketed in the U.S. are required to meet RF exposure compliance requirements when used against the head and against the body.

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that hands-free kits reduce risks. Hands-free kits can be used for convenience and comfort. They are also required by law in many states if you want to use your phone while driving.

## Cell Phone Accessories that Claim to Shield the Head from RF Radiation

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that accessories which claim to shield the head from those emissions reduce risks. Some products that claim to shield the user from RF absorption use special phone cases, while others involve nothing more than a metallic accessory attached to the phone. Studies have shown that these products generally do not work as advertised. Unlike "hands-free" kits, these so-called "shields" may interfere with proper operation of the phone. The phone may be forced to boost its power to compensate, leading to an increase in RF absorption.

### **Children and Cell Phones**

The scientific evidence does not show a danger to any users of cell phones from RF exposure, including children and teenagers. The steps adults can take to reduce RF exposure apply to children and teenagers as well.

- Reduce the amount of time spent on the cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between the head and the cell phone.

Some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using cell phones at all. For example, The Stewart Report from the United Kingdom made such a recommendation in December 2000. In this report, a group of independent experts noted that no evidence exists that using a cell phone causes brain tumors or other ill effects. Their recommendation to limit cell phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists.

# Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) Certification Information

Your wireless mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the exposure limits for Radio Frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government.

These FCC RF exposure limits are derived from the recommendations of two expert organizations: the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement (NCRP) and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE). In both cases, the recommendations were developed by scientific and engineering experts drawn from industry, government, and academia after extensive reviews of the scientific literature related to the biological effects of RF energy.

The RF exposure limit set by the FCC for wireless mobile devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR is a measure of the rate of absorption of RF energy by the human body expressed in units of watts per kilogram (W/kg). The FCC requires wireless devices to comply with a safety limit of 1.6 watts per kilogram (1.6 W/kg).

The FCC SAR limit incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection to the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

SAR tests are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the mobile device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the mobile device while operating can be well below the maximum reported value. This is because the mobile device is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output of the mobile device.

Before a new model mobile device is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the SAR limit established by the FCC. Tests for each model mobile device are performed in positions and locations (e.g. near the body) as required by the FCC.

For typical operations, this mobile device has been tested and meets FCC SAR guidelines.

Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines. The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this mobile device with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines.

The maximum SAR values for this model device as reported to the FCC are:

- Head: 0.17 W/kg.
- Body-worn: 0.64 W/kg.

## **Battery Use and Safety**

The battery in GALAXY is not intended to be replaced by the consumer. If you believe the battery is damaged or needs to be replaced, take the GALAXY to a service center for inspection and replacement.

#### Extreme heat or cold

## **Responsible Listening**

### Caution! Avoid potential hearing loss.

Damage to hearing occurs when a person is exposed to loud sounds over time. The risk of hearing loss increases as sound is played louder and for longer durations.

Prolonged exposure to loud sounds (including music) is the most common cause of preventable hearing loss. Some scientific research suggests that using portable audio devices, such as portable music players and cell phones, at high volume settings for long durations may lead to

permanent noise-induced hearing loss. This includes the use of headphones (including headsets, earbuds, and Bluetooth<sup>®</sup> or other wireless devices).

Exposure to very loud sound has also been associated in some studies with tinnitus (a ringing in the ear), hypersensitivity to sound, and distorted hearing. Individual susceptibility to noise-induced hearing loss and potential hearing problem varies. Additionally, the amount of sound produced by a portable audio device varies depending on the nature of the sound, the device settings, and the headphones that are used. As a result, there is no single volume setting that is appropriate for everyone or for every combination of sound, settings, and equipment.

You should follow some common sense recommendations when using any portable audio device:

- Always turn the volume down before plugging the earphones into an audio source.
- Set the volume in a quiet environment and select the lowest volume at which you can hear adequately.
- Be aware that you can adapt to higher volume settings over time, not realizing that the higher volume may be harmful to your hearing.

- When using headphones, turn the volume down if you cannot hear the people speaking near you or if the person sitting next to you can hear what you are listening to.
- Do not turn the volume up to block out noisy surroundings. If you
  choose to listen to your portable device in a noisy environment,
  use noise-cancelling headphones to block out background
  environmental noise. By blocking background environment noise,
  noise cancelling headphones should allow you to hear the music
  at lower volumes than when using earbuds.
- Limit the amount of time you listen. As the volume increases, less time is required before you hearing could be affected.
- Avoid using headphones after exposure to extremely loud noises, such as rock concerts, that might cause temporary hearing loss.
   Temporary hearing loss might cause unsafe volumes to sound normal.
- Do not listen at any volume that causes you discomfort. If you
  experience ringing in your ears, hear muffled speech, or
  experience any temporary hearing difficulty after listening to your
  portable audio device, discontinue use and consult your doctor.

## **Operating Environment**

Remember to follow any special regulations in force in any area, and always switch your mobile device off whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger. When connecting the mobile device or any accessory to another device, read its user's guide for detailed safety instructions. Do not connect incompatible products.

## Using Your Mobile Device Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from Radio Frequency (RF) signals. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless mobile device. Consult the manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

## **Implantable Medical Devices**

A minimum separation of six (6) inches should be maintained between a handheld wireless mobile device and an implantable medical device, such as a pacemaker or implantable cardioverter defibrillator, to avoid potential interference with the device.

Persons who have such devices:

- Should ALWAYS keep the mobile device more than six (6) inches from their implantable medical device when the mobile device is turned ON:
- Should not carry the mobile device in a breast pocket;
- Should use the ear opposite the implantable medical device to minimize the potential for interference;
- Should turn the mobile device OFF immediately if there is any reason to suspect that interference is taking place;

 Should read and follow the directions from the manufacturer of your implantable medical device. If you have any questions about using your wireless mobile device with an implantable medical device, consult your health care provider.

#### **Other Medical Devices**

Hospitals or health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.

#### **Vehicles**

Although your mobile device is quite sturdy, it is a complex piece of equipment and can be broken. Avoid dropping, hitting, bending, or sitting on it.

## **Other Important Safety Information**

- Only qualified personnel should service the mobile device. Faulty service may be dangerous and may invalidate any warranty applicable to the device.
- Ensure that any mobile devices or related equipment used in your vehicle are securely mounted.

- Check regularly that all wireless mobile device equipment in your vehicle is mounted and operating properly.
- When using a headset in dry environments, static electricity can build up in the headset and cause a small quick static electrical shock. #### What is not covered?

This Limited Warranty is conditioned upon proper use of the Product.

This Limited Warranty does not cover: (a) defects or damage resulting from accident, misuse, abnormal use, abnormal conditions, improper storage, exposure to liquid, moisture. dampness, sand or dirt, neglect, or unusual physical, electrical or electromechanical stress; (b) scratches, dents and cosmetic damage, unless caused by SAMSUNG: (c) defects or damage resulting from excessive force or use of a metallic object when pressing on a touch screen; (d) equipment that has the serial number or the enhancement data code removed, defaced, damaged, altered or made illegible; (e) ordinary wear and tear; (f) defects or damage resulting from the use of Product in conjunction or connection with accessories, products, or ancillary/peripheral equipment not furnished or approved by SAMSUNG: (a) defects or damage resulting from improper testing, operation, maintenance, installation, service, or adjustment not furnished or approved by SAMSUNG; (h) defects or damage resulting from external causes such as collision with an object, fire, flooding, dirt, windstorm, lightning, earthquake, exposure to weather conditions, theft, blown fuse, or improper use of any electrical source: (i) defects or damage resulting from cellular signal reception or transmission, or viruses or other software problems introduced into the Product; or (j) Product used or purchased outside the United States. Any such dispute shall not be combined or consolidated with a dispute involving any other person's or entity's Product or claim, and specifically, without limitation of the foregoing, shall not under any circumstances proceed as part of a class action. The arbitration shall be conducted before a single arbitrator, whose award may not exceed, in form or amount, the relief allowed by the applicable law. The arbitration shall be conducted according to the American Arbitration Association (AAA) Commercial Arbitration Rules applicable to consumer disputes. This arbitration provision is entered pursuant to the Federal Arbitration Act. The laws of the State of Texas, without reference to its choice of laws principles. shall govern the interpretation of the Limited Warranty and all disputes that are subject to this arbitration provision. The arbitrator shall decide all issues of interpretation and application of this arbitration provision and the Limited Warranty.

For any arbitration in which your total damage claims. exclusive of attorney fees and expert witness fees, are \$5,000.00 or less ("Small Claim"), the arbitrator may, if you prevail, award your reasonable attorney fees, expert witness fees and costs as part of any award, but may not grant SAMSUNG its attorney fees, expert witness fees or costs unless it is determined that the claim was brought in bad faith. In a Small Claim case, you shall be required to pay no more than half of the total administrative, facility and arbitrator fees, or \$50.00 of such fees, whichever is less, and SAMSUNG shall pay the remainder of such fees. These are the only two forms of notice that will be effective to opt out of this dispute resolution procedure. Opting out of this dispute resolution procedure will not affect the coverage of the Limited Warranty in any way, and you will continue to enjoy the benefits of the Limited Warranty.

#### Severability

If any portion of this Limited Warranty is held to be illegal or unenforceable, such partial illegality or unenforceability shall not affect the enforceability of the remainder of the Limited Warranty.
