1. Getting Started


1.1 Charging the Battery

Your device is powered by a rechargeable lithium polymer battery of capacity 600 mAh. When you see the low battery warning, please recharge the battery. Please charge the battery before your first use of the device.

Installing the Battery For the First Time

Follow these instructions to install the battery for the first time.

- 1. Turn your device over.
- 2. Open the battery cover on the back of the unit.
- 3. Insert the battery by gently connecting to the connector on your device.



- Make sure the battery fits snugly into the compartment after it is connected.
- 4. Replace the battery compartment door.


Charging the Battery with your Computer

Plug the wide end of a USB cable into a USB port on your computer and the smaller end of the USB cable into the USB port on your device. It generally takes a few hours to completely recharge the battery.

Charging the Battery with the AC Adapter

- 1. Find the AC adapter and the replaceable plugs included with your device.
- Note: It may be necessary to attach a

different component to the adapter. Refer to the diagram below to remove and replace the connector.



- 2. Plug the wide end of a USB cable to the AC adapter and the small end into the USB port on your device.
- 3. Insert the AC adapter to a power outlet.




 It generally takes a few hours to completely recharge the battery.

Removing the Battery

In case you need to remove the battery for replacement:

- 1. Open the battery cover on the back of the unit.
- 2. Remove the battery by unplugging from the connector on the device.



1.2 Battery Precautions

Your device is powered by a rechargeable lithium polymer battery.

- If the device is not used for a long period of time, the battery may lose its charge. Please recharge the battery following the steps described above in order to use your device.
- Rechargeable batteries are only to be charged under adult supervision.
- Use only the supplied chargers to recharge the battery. Improperly charging a battery may damage it or the device.
- Do not use an unauthorized battery. Use only the rechargeable battery that came with your product or that is listed in the user's guide.
- Open the device only to insert or change the battery. All other changes to this device are strictly prohibited and will invalidate the warranty.

- Do not attempt to open the rechargeable battery or battery pack. There are no user serviceable parts inside.
- Should a battery leak, the device may become damaged. Clean the battery compartment immediately, avoiding contact with your skin.
- Keep batteries out of reach of small children. If swallowed, consult a physician immediately.
- Leaving the battery in hot or cold places, such as in a closed car in summer or winter conditions, will reduce the capacity and lifetime of the battery. Always try to keep the battery between 15°C and 25°C (59°F and 77°F). A device with a hot or cold battery may not work temporarily, even when the battery is fully charged.
- Do not dispose of batteries in a fire as they may explode. Batteries may also explode if damaged. Dispose of batteries according to local regulations. Do not dispose as household waste.

1.4 Selecting Message Language


The first time you use this device (or following a product reset), you will be prompted to select the message language used for on-screen prompts and menu items.

 Press ◀/► to select the language you want and then press OK (the blank key at the center of the unit) or ◄-J.



• You can change the message language at any time in the Settings menu. See *7.3 Message Language*.

- Direction keys Moves up (▲), down
 (♥), left (◄) or right (►). The arrows at the top of the screen show which direction keys you can press to move around menus or view more text.
- 20. Scrolls up or down a screen page.
- 21. Enters a word, selects an item, submits a response or begins selection mode in an entry.

• This key is referred to as **OK** in this guide.

Combination Keys

More functions are available by combining keys. **Key 1** + **Key 2** means hold **Key 1** while also pressing **Key 2**.

 Volume adjustment

 Displays help instructions.
- FN + K⊲ / ▷▷ (▲ / ▼) Goes to the previous or next entry in the dictionary or in a list of multiple search results.

At a word entry screen, types an asterisk (*) to stand for any series of unknown letters or characters in a word.

1.6 Using the Main Menu

Press \bigcirc to access the main menu at any screens to quickly take you to different books and exercises in your device. The main menu contains five tabs: *Books*, *Learn, Exercises, Tools* and *Settings*. Press F1 to F5 to select a tab. Press $\triangleleft / \triangleright$ to select an option you want in the selected tab and then press **OK** / \triangleleft .

1.7 Browsing in the Device

Using the Soft Keys

Soft Key functions are represented by the labels displayed along the bottom of the screen. To perform a Soft Key function, press **F1** to **F5** at the top of the keyboard that correspond to the labels you want. These labels change to reflect the different functions available in the various books and exercises in this device.

- With each letter you type, the resulting list of potential matching entries is refreshed. If the letters you typed match an entry in the word list, it is automatically highlighted. Or, press ▲ / ▼ to select another word entry you see in the word list.
- When an entry is highlighted for about 3 seconds, a preview will show automatically on the right.
- 3. Press OK / ← to view the entry.

4. Press the letter key corresponding to the callouts in the diagram to view the word and translation in a pop-up window.



- If necessary, press AAA repeatedly to zoom in or out the diagram or change the font size. In an enlarged diagram, press the direction keys, if necessary, to move around.
- Press (J)) or (I)) to hear the headword or translation pronounced.
- Press *list* to save the current headword in My Word List for further study or review. See 3.16 Adding Words to My Word List and 4.5 My Word List.
- Press F1 [■A] to start a new search or press F5 [■] to return to the diagram or the list of categories.

3.7 Merriam-Webster's ALD Supplemental Data

This book contains supplementary data found in the Merriam-Webster's Advanced Learner's English Dictionary.

 In the Books menu, press ◀ / ► to select "M-W ALD Supplemental Data" and then press OK / ◄-I.



- Press ▲ / ▼ to select a topic and a sub-topic (if available) and then press OK / ←J.
- When a main topic is highlighted for about 3 seconds, a list of sub-topics will show automatically on the right.
- See 1.7 Browsing in the Device.

3.8 Franklin Thesaurus

 In the Books menu, press ◄/ ► to select "Franklin Thesaurus" and then press OK/←.



2. Type a word.

- See 3.17 Hints on Inputting Words.
- With each letter you type, the resulting list of potential matching entries is refreshed. If the letters you typed match an entry in the word list, it is automatically highlighted. Or, press ▲ / ▼ to select another word entry you see in the word list.
- When an entry is highlighted for about 3 seconds, its preview will show automatically on the right.
- 3. Press OK / 🖵 to view the entry.
- Press (F))) to hear the headword pronounced.
- 4. Type to start a new search.

3.9 Looking Up Inflections

Use this feature to look up inflections or conjugations that show changes in a word's gender, tense, number, person and other subtle variations. If you are looking up the inflections from the dictionaries by pressing [**Inflec.**], see step 4 below.

 In the Books menu, press ◀ / ► to select "English Conjugation" or "Spanish Conjugation" and then press OK / ◄Ⅰ.

• For example, you look for the conjugations of the verb "record" in English Conjugation.

3.10 Inflected Form Searching

The device is equipped with a smart system to retrieve results from an inflected word. For example, when you type "ate", the device will retrieve results from the word "eat".

3.11 Misspelling Words

If the letters you type do not find a match in the list, your word is misspelled or not in the dictionaries. A list of possible spelling corrections is displayed. Press ▲ /▼ to select the entry you want and then press **OK** / ←J.

3.12 Confusable Words

Confusables are homonyms,

homophones and spelling variants that are easy to confuse. When the word you looked up has confusables, the function label **Conf** appears. Press [**Conf**] to view the confusables.

3.13 Uncertain Spellings

If you are uncertain about how to spell a word, type the portion of the word you do know, and type a question mark (?) in place of each unknown letter. Type an asterisk (*) to stand for any missing portion of a word, including prefixes, suffixes, spaces, symbols, or any number of letters. **Note:** If you type an asterisk at the beginning of a word, it may take a little while to find the matching words.

- 1. At any word entry screen, type known letters, a ? in place of each unknown letter, and a * in place of any string of unknown characters.
- To type an asterisk, press 1 + ?*.
- 2. Press OK / 🛶.
- 3. Press ▲ / ▼ to select a word you want from the list and then press OK / ← .

3.14 Searching for Idioms, Usage Examples and Collocations

Looking Up from Searches

You may refine your searches to show only entries containing idioms, usage examples or collocations in the dictionaries.

1. In the search screen of the dictionaries, press the soft key [Idiom], [Example] or [Colloca].



- Some dictionaries contain less options.
- 2. Type a word.
- See 3.17 Hints on Inputting Words.
- With each letter you type, the resulting list of potential matching entries is refreshed. If the letters you typed match an entry in the word list, it is automatically highlighted. Or, press ▲ / ▼ to select another word entry you see in the word list.
- Press F5 [Range] to refine searches with multiple words. Select one of

the following optins from the menu: **All** = Look for entries with the search words, whenever they appear.

Items following specified order

= Look for entries with the search words, in the order as you typed.

Input words in succession = Look for entries with the search words, in the word successions as you typed.

- 3. Press OK / 🛶.
- If there are multiple entries, press ▲
 / ▼ to select the one you want and then press OK / ← .
- Press **FN** + KI⊲ / ▷▷I to go to the previous or next entry in a list of multiple search results.
- 4. Press ← to go back to the search results.
- 5. Press 🗂 to start a new search.

Looking Up from Entries

- 1. If an entry contains related idioms, usage examples or collocations, press the corresponding soft key [Idiom], [Example] or [Colloca].
- 2. The first entry is highlighted, press OK / ← to view.
- If there are multiple entries, press ▲
 /▼ to select the one you want and then press OK / ← I.

- 3. Press ← to go back to the list of entries.
- 4. Press ← to go back to the original entry in the dictionary.

3.15 Highlighting Words

Another way to look up words in the dictionaries is by highlighting them in an entry. **Note:** this feature may not be available on all screens.

- 1. At a text screen supporting word selection, press OK / ← .
- If the first word on the screen is highlighted, this feature is supported.
- 2. Use the direction keys to select an available word you want to learn and press OK / -1.







9.4 Backing Up Your Data

Because you have access to the folders in which any information you enter is saved, you can backup this important information on your PC. While your device is connected to your PC, rightclick any or all of those folders and then click "Copy". Find a location on your PC where you want to save this information, right-click in that window and then click "Paste" to save the information.

9.5 Restoring Your Data

If you accidentally erase or lose information, you can restore any important information you have previously saved to your PC. Connect your device to your PC. Next, find the location on your PC where you saved a backup copy of your information. Rightclick on those files or folders and click "Copy". Click the window containing your device's folders, right-click and then click "Paste" from the pop-up menu. You can then re-access your previously saved information.
