



Main features

- 1. Powerful multi-function: Photo browser, movie&music player, e-book reader, digital calendar and analog clock, voice recorder...
- 2. On board memory ,store your photos directly
- 3. Slide show, and background music
- 4. USB Device to be connected to your PC for file management.
- 5. Built-in rechargeable battery

Note: The numbers of Photos, Songs, Movies and TXT files to be stored to the Onboard Memory will vary due to the size of the file being saved.






Chapter 1 Part Names

Electronic Frame:



UP Side

- 1.OFF POWER ON: Slide to left /right to turn on/off the Personal Digital Album.
- 2. SD/MMC: Insert one of the SD/MMC cards

Right Side


- 3.DC IN: Insert the DC power adapter to the Personal Digital Album player.
- 4.PHONE: Insert for earphone using.
- 5. USB: Connect to the USB cable from the Personal Digital Albumto PC .

Under side

6.MIC: Record the sound and store it in the Personal Digital Album.

Chapter 2 Power Connection

Power Connection



- 1. Connect the power adapter to the DC IN 5V jack on the Personal Digital Album.
- 2. Plug the AC Adapter to a power jack to supply power to the Personal Digital Album and charge for the built-in battery.

Note: The green indicator on AC adaptor and red indicator on the right side of the album will light. After a while, there will be an icon which stand for electrification appear on the screen.

- 3. After charging up for about 4 hours, the icon will be filled with green, which means that you have finished the electrification. Now you can take the joy brought by the album to anywhere.
- 4. During this process, if you want to use the album, turn the slide switch on and then touch its screen, there will be an icon appear on the right up corner of the screen, which means that the album is being charged. You can enjoy the album while charging up for it.

Chapter 2 PC Connection

Use the supplied USB cable to connect your PDA to your PC.



Note: The ASSP is a software in the internal memory developed by Sungale go manage the picture and audio files to optimize the utilization of the source of the memory. The ASSP is inapplicable to manage ebook and video files. Just use the unit as a regular storage device to manage ebook and video files after connecting the unit to the PC.

Start ASSP

On your computer, click "My computer", then, click "StorageDevice Disk", then, double click Fileconverter.exe, you will enter into ASSP interface.

- Tip: 1. If your PC has set as auto-run, you will enter into the ASSP interface directly, no operation needed.
 - 2. The PC installed the anti-virus software or other hold-up software will make the "autorun.inf" invalid. In this situation, the file is set as hidden file. If you want to autorun the ASSP, vou can set vour PC to display hidden files.

Chapter 2 PC Connection

LISE ASSP

1.Click "Add File", your computer's files and folders will appear, double click the audio file or photo to add them to your album.

2.Hold on "Shift" or "Ctrl", you can download multi audio files or photos to your album. In this way, the photos downloaded will be stored at 640 X480 pixels to suit your album's screen and the MP3 files will be transferred into WMA file. When you have finished the operation, please safely remove the USB cable from your PC.

Tip: You also can take the album as a regular storage device, select the photos from your computer, then paste them in the album's internal memory. In this way, the photos will be stored without compression. If you want to optimize your internal memory, you can select the photos, then click the "Convert".

Attention: You may find a series of files named "WMEncoder.exe". "FileConverter.exe", "encoder.exe", "Autorun.inf" and "gdiplus.dll" in the internal memory of the unit. It is the ASSP software, and not a virus. You can use it according to the instruction above.

Attention: Once you format the internal memory of your album, the ASSP software will be deleted.

In this situation, you can still use the album as a regular storage device. you can copy, paste and delete files after connecting your album to the PC.

Chapter 2 Card Connection

Memory Card Insertion

Insert card in the direction indicated by the arrow on the top of the card. (The side of the memory card on which the sticker is affixed should face to the front)

Aligning the memory card upside down or to the reverse side may cause damage that is the sole responsibility of the user. (Use SD, Memory Stick, MMC cards enabled)



- Note: 1. MS Due isn't compatible alone. But it can be supported with the help of MS Duo adapter.
 - 2. It is recommended that a full format be performed before using a memory card for the first time.
 - This device will read USB first and will not recognise the memory card if you insert a memory card and extra USB memory together at the same time.

Note: The product will display the images stored in the external devices first and will not display the images in the internal memory if you insert an external devices.

Chapter 3 Photo

Locate to the PHOTO Directory

In the main menu, touch Photo, then touch internal memory or memory card to enter into thumbnail browsing mode.


Step Show Pictues

Touch one of the thumbnail picture and it will enter into the stepshow mode. Touch the screen, there will be several icons in a row, their functions are as follow:

Rotate

In the step show mode, touch () repeatedly to rotate the picture clockwise





Tips: When you have chosen some functions such as rotate or background music, it will enter into the stepshow mode automatically, if you prefer slideshow after that, please touch the 🖫.

Touch the st to adjust volume, touch it again if you have finished adjustment.

Backgroud Music

Note: To utilize this feature you must have picture files (JPG, BMP, TIFF) and music files saved to the same file source (ie: Internal Memory/Memory Card/Flash Drive)

Slide Play Setup

In the step show mode, touch 🐚 to play the photos slidingly. Touch 🔅 to set the time intervals of slide play.



Exit

Touch M to return to the main menu, and touch \supset to the last interface.


Chapter 3 Music

Locate to the Music Directory

- 1. In the main menu, touch "Music", then choose internal memory or card to enter into the music file list.
- 2. Touch the desired music file in the file list to select it and play.

Play mode

- In the music playing interface, touch the screen, there will be several icons in a row appear on the screen.
- 2. Touch , there will be a remark which stand for related mode appear on the left side of the screen. The remarks and there related modes are as follow:



- 1. repeat all
- 2. play one song then return to the song lists
- 3. play all in order then return to the song lists
- 4. play all at random
- 5. repeat one song



Chapter 3 Music

Playing and Pausing Music

During play mode, touch II to pause music. Touch to continue playing music.

Adjust the Sound

During play mode, touch | to press +/- icon to adjust the volume.

Previous Music

Touch the to skip to the previous music, Touch to skip to the next.

Fast rewind and fast forward

Touch the ◀ to fast rewind,, touch ▶ to fast forward.

Exit

Touch M to return to the main menu, and touch to the last interface.

Chapter 3 Movie

Choose a Movie

- 1. In the main menu, touch "Movie" and then touch internal memory or memory card to enter into the movie files list.
- 2. Touch the desired movie file to select it and play.



Adjust Volume

- In the movie playing interface, touch the screen, there will be several icons appear on the screen.
- 2. Touch to make it mute, touch to recover the voice. Touch "+" to increase volume, touch "-" to decrease volume. The icons will disappear automatically after a few seconds if no operation.


EXIT

Viewing the Clock and Calendar

From the main menu, touch the icon Clock or Canlendar to enter the related interface respectively.

Clock and Calendar Setting

Touch the numbers in the white blank, the color of the touched blank will change, then touch the **\textstyle \textstyle **



Exit

Touch M to the main menu, and touch to return to the last interface.

Chapter 3 Recorder

Set up record

Enter into the recorder interface, touch 🗱 to set Quality, File Format or Play Back.



Set Quality

Touch the icon Quality to set the quality of recording (high or low).



Chapter 3 Recorder

Set File Format

In the record menu, touch 🗱 to enter into the setting interface, touch "File Format" to set up file format (mp3 or way format)

Start and Stop Recording

In the recording show mode, touch the icon "Start" to start recording, or touch the icon "Stop" to stop recording.

Note: After recording, the record will be stored automatically. You can find the record in storage or in the MUSIC folder. In the main menu, touch "Storage or MUSIC", touch internal memory, there will be a file list, you may find your record in it.

Play Back

After recording, touch the * , touch play back to play and repeat the record.

Exit

Touch M to the main menu and touch to the last interface.

Chapter 4 Storage

Viewing the Menu

In the main menu, touch "Storage" → touch "internal memory" or "card" to enter the file lists.



Copy and Paste Files

- 1. Select one file, by touching A (if you touch the desired file directly, it will play the file, at this situation, you may touch to return, then the file is selected).
- 2. Touch 🗱 to choose "copy". It will go to the interface with two choices:internal memory and card.
- 3. Touch \(\bigvee \) to choose which folder you want to copy the file to (the color of the selected folder will change).
- 4. Touch 🗱 , and finally touch OK to finish.

Chapter 4 Storage





Delete and Move Files

In the main menu, touch "Storage" → touch internal memory or memory card → Touch \(\brace \) \(\brace \) to select your desired file \(\rightarrow \) touch delete or move to, the interface will return to the "internal memory" and "card" automatically → touch \(\bigcup \) to select which folder you would like to copy or move the file to (the color of the selected folder willchange) → touch 🗱 , there will be a question mark appear (see the right picture above) → touch OK.

Exit

Touch M to the main menu and touch to the last interface.

Brightness and Backlight Off

In the main menu, touch "Setting", touch Brightness to set the kind you want. Also, touch Backlight Off to set the time when the backlight shall be off.





Device Information and Factory Default

From the menu, touch Device Information to see the version of the Personal Digital Album. Touch Factory Default to recover the system to original state.

Chapter 4 Settings

A (+) will appear on the left up corner, touch the center of the (+); Then, the (+) will move to the right up corner of the screen, touch it again, the (+) will move to right down corner, left down corner and center of the screen in the order, touch it in order.

Note: Please use the touch screen stick in order to adjust the screen exactly. When you touch the (+) on the screen, please make sure that you have touched the very center of the crosspoint exactly, or you may stay at the interface until you have done so. If you have touched correctly, the interface will return to the last menu automatically. And if you cannot make it and you want to quit at that time, the only way to exit is to turn off the power and restart the album.

Exit

After calibrating screen, the frame will return to the previous menu.
