

INTRODUCTION

Your router accessory has many features for making routing operations more pleasant and enjoyable. Safety, performance and dependability have been given top priority in the design of this product, making it easy to maintain and operate.



WARNING: Do not attempt to use this product until you thoroughly read and completely understand the operator's manual. Pay close attention to the safety rules, including Dangers, Warnings, and Cautions. If you use this product properly and only as intended, you will enjoy years of safe, reliable service.

FEATURES

Before using the router, familiarize yourself with all operating features and safety requirements. However, do not let familiarity with the tool make you careless.

Your new router accessory is equipped with the following features. See Figure 1.

STOP BAR AND DEPTH INDICATOR

The stop bar and depth indicator allow you to adjust the depth of cut.

LOCKING KNOB

The locking knob secures the motor housing for the plunge base.

VACUUM ATTACHMENT

The vacuum attachment allows you to connect to a 1-1/4 in. diameter dust collection hose to help keep the work area clean.

ERGONOMIC DESIGN

The design of the router base provides for easy handling. It is designed for comfort and ease of grasp when operating in different positions and at different angles.



ASSEMBLY



WARNING: The router should never be connected to a power supply when you are assembling parts, making adjustments, cleaning, performing maintenance, or when the tool is not in use. Disconnecting the tool prevents accidental starting that could cause serious injury.

INSTALLING THE VACUUM ATTACHMENT See Figure 2.

Follow these steps to install the vacuum attachment.

1. Unplug the router.



WARNING: Failure to unplug the tool could result in serious injury due to accidental starting.

- 2. Place the vacuum attachment on the base as shown.
- 3. Secure the attachment with the screws provided.



INSTALLING THE ROUTER MOTOR IN THE BASE

See Figure 3.

Follow these steps to install the router motor in the base.

1. Unplug the router.



WARNING: Failure to unplug the tool could result in serious injury due to accidental starting.

- 2. Place the base on a flat surface.
- 3. Loosen the locking knob.



CAUTION: Do not tighten the locking knob without the motor installed in the base. Failure to heed this caution may result in permanant damage to the locking mechanism.

- 4. Align the slot on the motor housing with the groove on the base.
- 5. Depress and hold the spindle lock button.
- 6. Slide the motor housing into the base.
- 7. Tighten the locking knob.



