? A black arrow release button is located on the outside of each slide. (shown in Figure 1).





#### 4.8 Password

The password is disabled by default (i.e. There is no password required when you power on the KVM switch for the first time).

#### **Enable Password**

- 1. Press the KVM hotkey Scroll Lock + Scroll Lock + U
- 2. Logout the KVM by pressing the hotekey Scroll Lock + Scroll Lock + P

3. In SUPERVISOR level, enter "00000000" eight zeroz in the user name & password field (Do not use "0" on number pad)

4. In USER level, press Space Bar + Enter in user name & password field Remark: Automatic logout after 10 minutes of inactivity

#### Set your own user name and password

- 1. Login the KVM in SUPERVISOR level by pressing "00000000" eight zeros in user name & password field.
- 2. Call KVM OSD menu by pressing the KVM hotkey Scroll Lock + Scroll Lock + Space Bar
- 3. Press F1 tot he MAIN MENU
- 4. Selec "USER SECURIY"
- 5. Set password in SUPERVISOR & USER level
  - a. In the left-top row "S" (SUPERVISOR), press Enter to set your own user name & password
  - b. In the row 1 to 8 (USER), press Enter to set your own user name & password
- 6. Press Enter to save the setting or press Esc to cancel the editing without any change






