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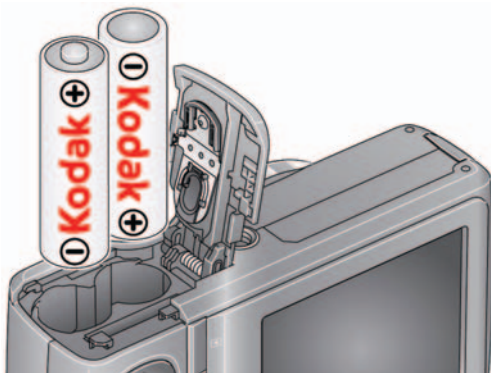

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## Using an (accessory) SD or SDHC Card

## Taking a video

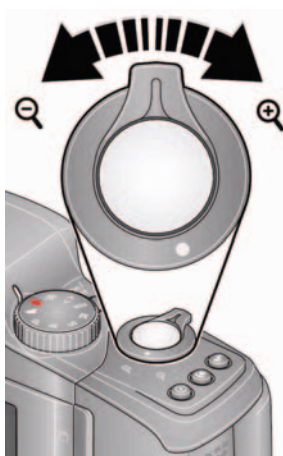

Portrait	Full-frame portraits of people.
Children	Action pictures of children in bright light.

<b>SCN mode</b>	<b>For</b>
<b>Backlight</b>	Subjects that are in shadow or “backlit” (when light is behind the subject).
<b>High ISO</b>	People indoors, in low-light scenes.
<b>Beach</b>	Bright beach scenes.
<b>Snow</b>	Bright snow scenes.
<b>Sunset</b>	Capturing the deep hues seen at sunset.
<b>Self-Portrait</b>	Close-ups of yourself. Assures proper focus and minimizes red eye.
<b>Night Portrait</b>	Reducing red eye of people in night scenes or low-light conditions. Place the camera on a flat, steady surface or use a tripod.
<b>Candle light</b>	Capturing the ambiance of candle light.
<b>Night Landscape</b>	Distant scenery at night. Flash does not fire. Place the camera on a flat, steady surface or use a tripod.
<b>Landscape</b>	Far-away scenes. The camera uses infinity auto-focus. Framing marks are not available in Landscape.
<b>Manner/Museum</b>	Quiet occasions, like a wedding or lecture. Flash is off.
<b>Stage</b>	People on a lit stage. Fast shutter speed, high ISO. Flash and sounds are off.
<b>Fireworks</b>	Bright, colorful light displays. Flash does not fire. Place the camera on a flat, steady surface or use a tripod.
<b>Flower</b>	Close-ups of flowers or other small subjects in bright light. Focus is Macro.
<b>Text</b>	Documents. Focus is Macro.

## Using optical zoom


Use optical zoom to get up to 10X closer to your subject while taking pictures/videos.



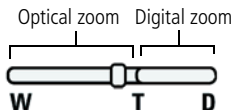
- 1 Use the LCD to frame your subject.
- 2 Press Telephoto (T) to zoom in. Press Wide Angle (W) to zoom out.
- 3 Take the picture or video.

NOTE: To get a focused picture every time, remember:

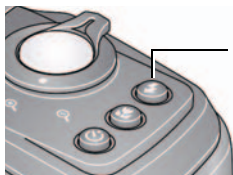
- Use the framing marks, [see page 4](#).
- As you zoom in, move away from your subject.

Use digital zoom to get up to 5X beyond optical zoom while taking pictures. Turn digital zoom on/off using the Setup  menu ([see page 16](#)). Digital zoom is not available in Smart Capture mode.

NOTE: You may notice decreased image quality when using digital zoom. The slider on the LCD turns red when the picture quality reaches the limit for an acceptable 4 x 6-in. (10 x 15 cm) print.



## Using the flash










Press the flash button repeatedly to scroll through flash modes.  
The current flash mode is shown on the LCD.  
(Flash settings are limited in some picture-taking modes.)

Flash modes		Flash fires
<b>Auto</b>		When the lighting conditions require it.
<b>Fill</b>		Every time you take a picture, regardless of the lighting conditions. Use when the subject is in shadow or is "backlit." In low light, hold the camera steady or use a tripod.  NOTE: (Not available in Smart Capture mode.)
<b>Red-eye Reduction</b>		A preflash fires, shrinking the eye pupil, before the picture is taken.
Choose Preflash or Digital Correction using the Setup  menu.		A preflash does not fire; the camera corrects red eye.
<b>Off</b>		Never.

## Using the menu button to change settings

You can change settings to get the best results from your camera.

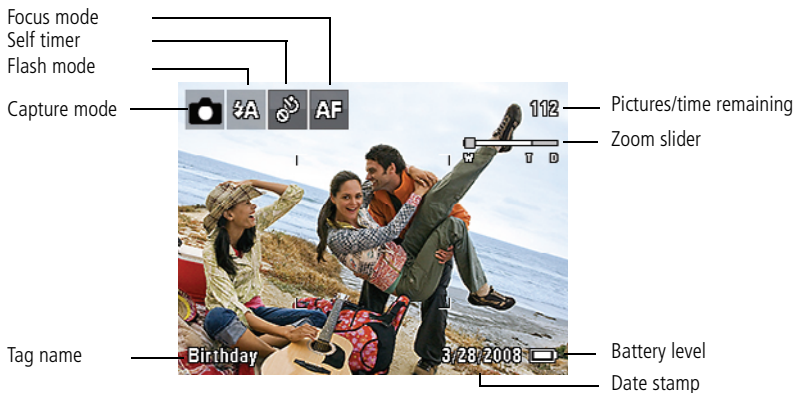
- 1 Press the Menu  button.
- 2 Press   to highlight a tab:
  - **Capture/Video** for the most common picture/video-taking settings
  - **Setup** for other camera settings
- 3 Press   to highlight a setting, then press OK.
- 4 Highlight an option, then press OK. (Some options let you use  .)

- 4 Follow the screen prompts.

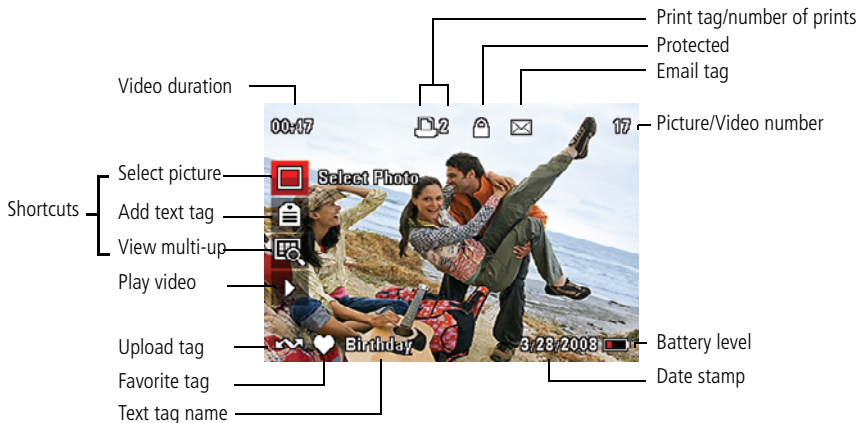
## Using the undo delete feature

If you accidentally delete a picture/video, you may be able to use Undo Delete to retrieve it. This feature is only available immediately after you delete a single picture/video while in Review (not during a Quickview).

## Viewing as thumbnails (multi-up)

- 1 Press the Review  button.
- 2 Press the Wide Angle (W) button to change from single-picture view to multi-up thumbnails.
- 3 Press Telephoto (T) to return to single-picture view.
  - Press the Review button to exit Review.

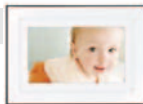
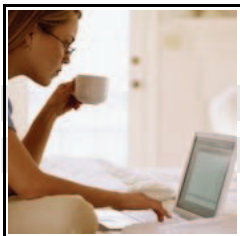

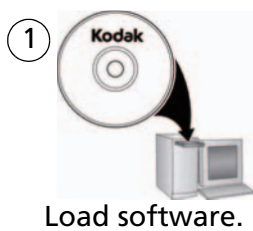
