

**LED Display**The LED Display displays the time, an PM indicator, and an Alarm indicator

Radio Frequency Indicator
Use the Radio Frequency Indicator to view the current AM or FM radio station

A wire FM Antenna is attached to the unit. Adjust the wire to improve the FM radio reception.

The AM Antenna is built into the unit. To improve AM reception, adjust the position of the unit.

Turn the Tuning Dial to adjust the AM or FM radio station.

Auto/Off/On Switch

Adjust the Auto/Off/On Switch to On to power on the unit's FM or AM radio.

Adjust the Auto/Off/On Switch to Off to power off the unit's FM or AM radio

Adjust the Auto/Off/On Switch to Auto turn the alarm on

Press the Hour Button to adjust the hour when setting the time.

10 FM/AM Switch

Adjust the FM/AM Switch to select AM or FM radio.

Volume/Buzzer Dial

Turn the Volume/Buzzer Dial to adjust the unit's volume

Turn the Volume/Buzzer Dial towards "Buzzer" until the dial won't turn anymore to set the alarm to wake

Sleep Button

Press the Sleep Button to reset the sleep timer to it's default time of 59 minutes.

Press and hold the Sleep Button to allow the sleep time to be edited.

13 Minute Button

Press the Minute Button to adjust the minute when setting the time.

Press the Snooze Button to delay the alarm for an additional 9 minutes after it has sounded.

#### **Powering the Unit**

Use the AC Power Input to connect an AC adapter to the unit. Plug the other end of the AC adapter into a standard AC outlet (120V ~60Hz).



#### Setting the Time

Step	1:	Press and hold the <b>Time Button</b> .
Step	2:	Press the <b>Hour Button</b> to adjust the hour.
Step	3:	Press the <b>Minute Button</b> to adjust the minute.
Step	4:	Release the <b>Time Button</b> to set the adjusted time.

tting the A	larm
Step 1:	Press and hold the <b>Alarm Button</b> .
Step 2:	Press the <b>Hour Button</b> to adjust the hour.
Step 3:	Press the <b>Minute Button</b> to adjust the minute.
Step 4:	Release the Alarm Button to set the adjusted alarm time.
Step 5:	Adjust the Auto/Off/On Switch to the "Auto" position.
Step 6:	Turn the Volume/Buzzer Dial towards "Buzzer" until the dial won't turn anymore to set the alarm to wake to the buzzer.
Step 7:	Turn the Volume/Buzzer Dial to the desired volume level to wake to the radio.
	When waking to the radio, the unit will play whichever radio station the unit was last set to.
Step 8:	After the alarm sounds, press the <b>Snooze Button</b> to delay the alarm for a additional 9 minutes.

#### Setting the Sleep Timer

Step 1:	Tune the radio to the desired station.
Step 2:	Press and hold the <b>Sleep Button</b> .
Step 3:	Press the <b>Hour Button</b> to adjust the hour.
Step 4:	Press the <b>Minute Button</b> to adjust the minute.
Step 5:	Release the <b>Sleep Button</b> to set the adjusted sleep time.

If the Sleep Button is pressed after the sleep time has been set, the adjusted sleep time will be reset to the default of 59 minutes.

#### Tuning the Radio

Step 1:	Adjust the Auto/Off/On Switch to the "On" position.
Step 2:	Adjust the FM/AM Switch to the desired option.
Step 3:	Turn the <b>Tuning Dial</b> to adjust the current radio station.
	The Radio Frequency Indicator, located on the front of the unit, will display the current radio station.
Step 4:	Turn the Volume/Buzzer Dial to adjust the volume of the unit.


