- 40MB of available hard disk space
- USB port (2.0) supported

- Windows 98 SF/MF/2000/XP
- CD-ROM drive (double speed or greater)
- DirectX 8.0 or above

Installing the USB Driver

- Install the operating system in Administrator Account (main user) for Windows 2000 or XP.
 Otherwise, installation will not be completed.
- Windows ME, 2000 and XP can recognize the driver without installing the provided program.
 However, you must install the program in order to format the player and upgrade firmware.
- On Windows98SE, you will not be able to use the player as a removable disk if the USB driver is not installed. You must install the USB driver file first.



Connecting the player to PC with the USB cable

- $oldsymbol{I}$ Connect the USB cable to the USB port on the computer.
 - If you disconnect the USB cable from your PC while implementing a command or initializing during USB driver installation, your PC may not function correctly.
- 2 Connect the other end of the USB cable to the USB cable connection port on the bottom of the player.
 - If you disconnect the USB cable from your PC while implementing a command or initializing during USB driver installation, your PC may not function correctly.
- 3 The USB driver is installed with a message saying that it is searching for a new device. You may not see the display screen during installation. Go to the device manager to check that installation has been successfully completed.
- 4 Upon installation of the USB driver "Samsung YP-T55 USB Device" will appear in the [System Properties] → [Device Manager].







Transferring Files to your Player


When the MP3 player is connected to your PC, the PC will see it as a removable disc. Music and other files can then be dragged and dropped into the removable disc for playback on the MP3 player.

- 1 Connect the player to PC.
 - For information on how to connect it to your PC, refer to Connecting the player to your PC. (See page 14).
- 2 Move the mouse over [Start] on the bottom of the screen, and right-click it.
- 3 Click [Explore] to Open Windows Explorer on PC.
 - [Removable Disk] is displayed in Windows Explorer.



Transferring Files to your Player

- 4 Select the file to save and drag-and-drop it into the removable disk icon. (Files appear on the player in numerical, alphabetical order)
 - For example, if you change the name of music files in Windows Explorer to 001***, 002***..., the files will be played in the numerical order you set.

- During file download or upload, "USB Transferring" message is displayed. Disconnecting the USB cable while the "USB Transferring" message is displayed may cause the malfunction of the player.
- The music file order displayed in Windows Explorer may differ from the play order on your player.


Disconnecting the player

After completing the file transfer, you must disconnect the player in the following way:

1 Double-click on the green arrow in the taskbar on the bottom right of the window.



2 When the [Stop a Hardware device] message appears, press the [OK] button and disconnect the player.





- If you disconnect the player improperly, the files on the device may be damaged and will not play.

Installing Media Studio


Media Studio is the program that enables you to download music files to the player, and play back music files on your PC.

 - Samsung Media Studio icon will be created on the desktop.





I Downloading Music Files

- ${\it 1}$ Connect the player to your PC.
 - A device connection window will appear on the right side of the screen.
 Select [Device] → [Show device Window] at the top of the screen if device connection window does not automatically appear.
- 2 Select the folder with the file(s) you want to transfer from the [Library] window.
 - The music files within the folder appear in the center of the screen.



- 3 When music files appear, select the file(s) you want to transfer, and then press the [Transfer] 🖶 button.
 - The selected file(s) are transferred to the player.






| Creating a Folder on your Player

- ${\it 1}$ Connect the player to your PC.
- 2 Press the [Create Folder] 📵 button at the bottom of device connection window.
- 3 Enter the name of the new folder when an input screen appears.
 - A new folder is created
 - If you open a new folder and transfer a file, the file is transferred to the newly created folder.



| Deleting Files

- \boldsymbol{I} Connect the player to your PC.
- 2 Press the [Delete] im button at the bottom of the connection windows after selecting required files or folders you want to delete.
- ${f 3}$ Press the [Confirm] button when an Confirm Deletion screen appears.
 - A selected folder or file is deleted.



 Formatting deletes all files on the MP3 player so maximum memory is available for new file storage. It saves you the trouble of deleting unwanted files one at a time.

I Formattimg the Player in Media Studio

- \boldsymbol{I} Connect the player to your PC.
- 2 Press the [Device] → [Format] at the top of the screen.
- 3 Press the [Start] button when the Format screen appears.
 - The memory of the player is formatted and all the saved files will be deleted.







- If you format the player, all the menus you set are initialized.
- Care must be taken as formatted files can not be recovered.


• Using the audio format conversion function, you can lip tracks from an audio CD as MP3 files.

| Ripping Tracks from an Audio CD

- \boldsymbol{I} Insert the Audio CD into the CD-ROM drive of your PC.
- 2 Press the [Search Audio CD] button on the lower part of the screen.
 - The tracks on the CD are displayed.



- 3 Select tracks to be ripped and press the [Rip a CD] 🕞 button.
 - The selected file is converted into an MP3 file.
 - Select [Tools] → [Audio Source Format Conversion Settings] on the top of the screen to change rip settings.

Playing Music and Turning Off the Device

Make sure the earphones are connected.

Turning Power On and Off

Power On: Press and hold the ►II button to turn on the power.

Power Off: Press and hold the ►II button to turn off the power.

| Playing Music

Press the ▶II button.

Playback starts.

| Pausing Music

Press the ▶II button to pause playback.

- While in Pause mode, press the ▶∥ button again to resume playback.
- If no buttons are pressed within 10 seconds (changes depending on settings), the player automatically powers off. You can set power off time by selecting [Settings] → [Time] → [Auto Off Time].

Adjusting the Volume

Press the -, + button to adjust the volume from 00 to 30.

Mote

- If the file name is not displayed correctly, move to [Settings] → [Language] → [ID3-Tag] and then change the language setting.
- WMA files can only be played as music files with a compression rate of 48Kbps-192Kbps.

HOLD Function

In Hold mode, all buttons are disabled. This function is useful when you are walking or jogging.

Slide the switch in the direction of the arrow.

₩ When the button is pressed, the " Hold" message will appear on the display.

Recording Voice

- * To move to other modes from the Voice mode, refer to "Changing Mode".
- 1 Press and hold the **REC** button to start voice recording.
- 2 Press the **REC** button again to stop the recording and save the voice file.
 - The files are recorded in the order of V001,V002......, and saved as WAV file in the VOICE folder after recording.



🙆 Note

- If the Memory is full, Voice Recording is stopped automatically.
- Voice recording does not work in FM mode or when the line in cable is connected.
- Beeps are disabled while recording.
- For voice recording, the bit rate is fixed to 32Kbps.

Searching for Music/Voice Files

To search for specific parts during play

- Turn the I◄, ▶►I lever up or down during playback to search for the part you want to listen to.
- Release the lever to resume play normally.

To change tracks during play

- Turn the lever in the direction of > during playback to play the next track.
- Turn the lever in the direction of I

 within 5 seconds after playback starts, to move to and play the previous track. Turn the lever in the direction of I

 after 5 seconds to play the current track from the beginning.

To change tracks when stopped

Turn the I
 I lever up or down in stop mode to move to the previous/next track.

Mote

- VBR(Variable Bit Rate) file: A file that constantly changes the compression rate according to the type of sounds, such as their pitch, in the file.
- In the case of a VBR file, you cannot move to and play the previous track even if you
 press within 5 seconds after playback starts.
- Files that were downloaded in MP2 or MP1 and had their file extension changed to MP3 may not play.

Loop Repeating

Move to [Settings] → [System] → [User Button Mode] in the menu and select [Repeat AB].

| Starting Point

While playing music files, press the **USER** button briefly at the beginning of the loop you want to set.

A↔ appears in the display.



| Ending Point

Press the **USER** button briefly again to set the end of the loop.

- A↔B appears in the display.
- The loop is played repeatedly.

Press the USER button briefly to cancel the loop.





- Loop Repeat is automatically released if you Speed Search the | 4, > lever .

Recording MP3s

* To move to other modes from LINE_ENC mode, refer to "Changing Mode".

- 1 Connect the Audio OUT port (or Line OUT) on the external audio source to the ENC port on the device with the Line in cable.
 - Press the play button on the external device to play the music to record.



- 2 Press and hold the REC button to start MP3 recording.
 - If the ►II button is pressed, recording is paused and if the ►II button is pressed again, the recording resumes.
- 3 If the REC button is pressed during recording, the recording stops and an MP3 file is created.
 - The files are recorded in the order of L ****001, L ****002.... and saved as MP3 files in the [LINE ENC] folder after recording.

Mote

- Bit Rates can be set within the range of 32Kbps~192Kbps.
- Beeps are disabled while recording.

Motice


- Do not disconnect the Line in cable during recording.
- If the battery is not sufficiently charged, the player will not completely record the file.
- Adjust the volume of the external audio source to a suitable level and record it. If the volume level is too high or low, the sound quality might be poor.

MENU Options

Press the MENU button to switch to the Menu Mode.

Move to a menu item by using the \bowtie , \bowtie I lever and press the NAVI button to select the menu.

Press the MENU button once again to exit the Menu Mode.



- Music : To view the file currently playing.
- Navigation : To move to Navigation Mode and browse files and folders on the player.
- Playlist: To play back only the files you want
- FM Radio : To listen to FM radio
- Settings: To adjust the settings on the player.
- Exit : To exit MENU



- Menu mode will be cancelled if no buttons are pressed within 25 seconds

 - USER: When there is not a lower folder, the selected file will be designated as part of the playlist.
- 3 Press the ▶II button.
 - The selected file will be played.

FM Recording



Mote

 - DNSe is a sound quality enhancement function for MP3 players developed by Samsung and provides 3D and Bass Enhance modes. 3D provides stereophonic surround effect and Bass Enhance reinforces bass sound of music.

Setting the EQ mode

I 3D User Setting

3D User Setting is available only when the DNSe is set to 3D-User.

[3D]

- Use the I◀, ▶►I lever to move to the 3D level you want
- 3D level can be set within the range of off to 5.



[Bass Enhance]

- Use the I◄, ▶I lever to move to the bass enhance level you want
- Bass Enhance level can be set within the range of off to 3.



Setting the EQ mode

User FQ Set

- Select User EQ in DNSe to set the equalizer to your preference in the User EQ Set.

Press the NAVI button after completing the setting.



Setting the Play Speed |

- 1 Press the MENU button. Select [Settings] \rightarrow [Play Speed].
- 2 Use the \bowtie , \bowtie lever to move to the desired Play Speed and press the NAVI button.
 - The smaller the number is, the slower play speed is, and vice versa. Play speed x1.0 is normal play speed.





- If the power is turned off and on, the play speed is reset to the normal (x1.0).





| Backlight

- When set to Always On, the light stays on continuously.



| Contrast

 Use the ◄, ► lever to set the contrast from 00 to 10 to adjust the brightness of the screen.



I Tag

- Use the ◄, ▶ lever to select Tag On or Off.
- On: Display the Tag information if the music file has Tag information. Display the file name if the music file has no Tag information.
- Off: Display the name of music file.



| Bitrate

- Use the I◀, ▶▶I lever to select Bitrate On or Off.
- On: Bit rate is displayed at the top of the screen.
- Off: The total number of tracks is displayed at the top of the screen.



Language Settings

Press the MENU button. Select [Settings] → [Language].

ID3-Tag

- What is an ID3 Tag?
- This is what is attached to an MP3 to carry information relevant to the file, such as the title, artist, album, year, genre and a comment field.
- Supported languages can be changed or added.


Press the MENU button. Select [Settings] → [Record].

| Bit Rate

- Use the | | lever to select the recording bit rate.
- When recording music into an MP3 file, you can select one of the following bit rates: 32Kbps, 48Kbps, 64Kbps, 96Kbps and 128Kbps.



- For voice recording, bit rate is fixed to 32Kbps.



| Auto Sync

- Use the I◄, ▶ lever to select the Auto Sync Time from Off to 5 seconds.
- AutoSync Time is a function for separating and saving MP3 files when there is no sound for a set time during MP3 recording.
- In SYNC 1 setting, recording stops when there is no sound for over 1 second during recording.
- If AutoSync Time is set to Off, recording keeps going even if there is no sound, and then it is saved as one file.



FM Radio Settings


Press the MENU button. Select [Settings] → [FM Radio].

Auto Preset

- If you select Auto Preset, frequencies within the range of 87.5MHz to 108.0MHz are automatically selected and stored
- Frequencies are automatically stored, starting from 1.

I FM Region

- Use the ◄, ► lever to select your FM reception region.
- Worldwide: Search FM frequencies between 87.50MHz to 108.00MHz in increments of 50 kHz.
- US: Search FM frequencies between 87.5MHz to 108.0MHz in increments of 100 kHz.
- Japan: Search FM frequencies between 76.0MHz to 108.0MHz in increments of 100 kHz.







- The default FM region setting may vary depending on the target region of the player.

| FM Search Level

- Use the I◀, ▶►I lever to select the FM tuner sensitivity.
- The higher the FM search level, the more frequencies can be received
- High → Middle → Low

Auto Off Time

Press the MENU button. Select [Settings] → [Time].

Auto Off Time



- Check the battery capacity
- Connect the player to PC and run YP-T55 Updater in the desktop to update the player.

In PLAY mode, music is not played after pressing the ▶II button

- Check to see if MP3 or WMA files are saved in the built-in memory.
- Check to see if the HOLD button is locked.

Files cannot be downloaded.

- Check to see if the driver is installed correctly in the computer.
- Check the connection between the player and PC.
- Operating system limits the number of files you can save.
 Please save your music files by creating a subfolder.
- Check if the memory is full.

Backlight does not work.

- Check the backlight setup.
- When the battery power is low, the backlight will go out.

Troubleshooting

The player keeps being turned off.
