### . Installing the Batteries

Four AAA-size batteries are supplied with the product. For more guidelines on battery usage, please see Using Your Batteries on page 87.

- To open the battery door, slide the button in the direction as shown to release.
- Insert the batteries as shown, ensuring you follow the + / signs correctly.
- 3. Close the battery door.



### • Turning the Camera On and Off

To turn on the camera, fully press and hold the Power button until the LCD screen is activated. Press and hold the Power button again, "Goodbye" will show on the LCD screen and the camera will turn off.



### Checking the Battery Level

Check the battery power level before taking pictures.

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- Check the power status level that appears on the camera LCD screen.

Battery power is full.

- Battery power is adequate.
- Battery power is low.
- Battery power is exhausted.



### • How to Navigate Menus

Menus are used to adjust capture and play settings, as well as other camera settings like the Date / Time and Auto Power Off. Press the Menu button to enter a menu.


Press the ▲ and ▼ buttons to scroll up and down through menu options. Press the OK button to enter a submenu or confirm your choice.


### • Checking Camera Status

Turn on the camera, view the camera LCD screen to check which camera settings are active. If a feature icon is not displayed, it means that particular feature is not activated.





#### Camera Mode

The camera has two working modes, Capture mode and Playback mode. You can switch between them by sliding the Capture / Playback selector at the back of the camera.



#### Capture Mode

Under this mode, you can select the image and video settings according to the shooting environment, and take pictures and video clips under the settings you have selected. For more details, please refer to "Taking Pictures" on page 27 and "Recording Video Clips" on page 36.

### Playback Mode

This mode allows the review or deletion of pictures and video clips from the camera. For more details, please refer to "Review and Managing Pictures and Video Clips" on page 40.


#### Drive Mode

The camera has two modes, one for taking pictures and the other for taking video clips.

- Still Image Mode
- Video Mode
- Audio Mode

You may switch between these two modes according to the following steps.

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Capture mode.






- Still Image mode is the default capture mode.
- This setting is also available in Video mode.

### Setup Menu

Setup menu can be accessed in both Still Image and Video modes. Here we take Still Image mode for an example.


- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Still Image mode.




### Setting the Current Date and Time

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- Follow the guidelines in "Setup Menu" on page 17 to access the Setup menu.

#### Setting the date and time:



Use the PREV or NEXT button to select a field, such as year, month, day, hour, minute. Use the ▲ or ▼ button to adjust the value in the field. Press the OK button after all fields are set.



### Auto Power Save Settings


The camera performs the following power save operations to conserve battery power.

1 / 3 / 5 MIN The camera is designed to switch off automatically to save battery life after the specified period of inactivity.

**OFF** The power save feature is not activated.

You can change the power save setting according to the following steps:

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- Follow the guidelines in "Setup Menu" on page 17 to access the Setup menu.






#### NOTE:

- Auto power off is automatically disabled under any one of the following conditions.
  - While an auto play is undergoing.
  - While the camera's USB port is connected to a computer or other external devices, or while the camera is being controlled by an external device.
- This setting is also available in Video mode.

### • Setting the Beep Sound On / Off

You can turn the beep sound on and off in Capture mode. When the beep sound is turned on, the camera will beep when you press the buttons.

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- Follow the guidelines in "Setup Menu" on page 17 to access the Setup menu.





#### NOTE:

### Setting Frequency

In order to take a better indoor picture, the camera needs to be set to suit the correct lighting frequency. Set the frequency to 60Hz for US and 50Hz for Europe.

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- Follow the guidelines in "Setup Menu" on page 17 to access the Setup menu.






### • Setting Display Language

Under this setting, you can select the language you prefer for the LCD screen.

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- Follow the guidelines in "Setup Menu" on page 17 to access the Setup menu.






### Setting the Date Stamp On and Off

Use the Date Stamp to imprint the date on your pictures and video clips. Make sure the camera clock is set to the correct date before setting the date stamp on.

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- Follow the guidelines in "Setup Menu" on page 17 to access the Setup menu.







### Resetting to Default Settings

You can easily change all the settings you made back to the camera default settings by the following steps.

- 2. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- Follow the guidelines in "Setup Menu" on page 17 to access the Setup menu.






#### NOTE:

### Formatting the Internal Memory

Formatting the internal memory deletes all data stored in it.

- Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- 3. Follow the guidelines in "Setup Menu" on page 17 to access the Setup menu.





#### NOTE:

- Data deleted by a format operation cannot be recovered. Make sure you do not have any useful data currently stored in the internal memory before you format it.
- Formatting the internal memory destroys all the pictures, even those are protected.
- With a memory card inserted, the above operation would format the inserted memory card only. The internal memory will not be formatted with a memory card inserted.
- This setting is also available in Video mode.

### 3 Taking Pictures

### Before you take pictures, please read this note first:



#### IMPORTANT!

Never remove batteries while a picture is being saved. Doing so will prevent the current picture being saved and may corrupt other pictures already stored in the camera's internal memory or on a memory card.


#### Outdoor Pictures Without the Flash

- · Avoid intense sunlight that may cause sun spots in pictures.
- Always make sure that the sun or other light source is in front of the subject.

### • Taking a Picture

Taking pictures at approximately 3.2 feet to infinity (1 meter to infinity).


- 1. Turn on the camera.
- Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- Frame your subject using the LCD screen or the viewfinder.
- Hold the camera steady. Press the Shutter button completely down to take a picture. A beep will sound (if the beep sound is turned on) when a picture is taken.



### Setting the Flash Mode

The Flash Range is approximately 3.2 feet to 4.9 feet (1 to 1.5 meters).

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- Press Flash ‡ button to cycle through the flash mode until the one you want is shown on the LCD screen.



- Flash mode off, the flash does not fire. Use this setting for outdoor pictures or where flash is prohibited or may be distracting. Also use when shooting toward a reflective surface, such as a window or mirror. If you do not have enough light when using this setting, your pictures will be too dark.
- **4**A Auto Flash mode, the flash fires automatically as needed. Use this setting to take most of the pictures.
- Flash mode on, the flash fires for every picture. Use this setting indoors in low light.

Please note that when flash mode is selected, the Status LED turns green and blinks until the flash finishes charging, then the Status LED will be on until pressing Shutter button to take a picture.




#### NOTE:

- Flash modes are not available in Video mode.
- Never touch or block the flash with your fingers. Doing so can soil these
  components and interfere with the correct flash operation.

### Setting Self-timer

Your camera is designed with a self-timer function, which allows you to take pictures with a 10-second built-in timer.

- Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Still Image mode.



- 3. The icon 🖒 will appear on the LCD screen. 3 10-second Self-timer indicates a countdown of ten seconds.
- 4. Capture procedures are the same as for taking a picture in the normal capture mode. Please see "Taking a Picture" on page 27.

#### NOTE:

Place the camera on a flat surface or use a tripod when using the self-timer function.

#### Zoom in and out

The PDC 3080 camera is designed with a 3X digital zoom feature. This feature lets you zoom in the central area of an image and photograph only the enlarged portion of the picture.

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- 3. Press the Zoom In button to zoom in the subject image. Press the Zoom Out button to return to the normal size.


This feature is available in Capture and Playback mode.

### Setting the Image Size and Quality

Picture resolution refers to the number of pixels in a digital picture. Picture quality depends on the JPEG file compression that the camera applies when the picture is taken. Higher resolution and less compression produces better quality but occupies more memory space. Smaller size pictures and normal quality are easier to email while larger size and fine quality are better for printing.

#### Image Size Setting


- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Still Image mode.



### **Quality Setting**


#### Via the menu

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Still Image mode.



#### Via a short-cut button

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- 3. Pressing the Quality button will alter the picture quality setting.



The chart below indicates the approximate numbers of pictures you can expect the camera to hold at each setting based on the 8MB / 16MB optional internal memory. You can expand the memory with SD card, please refer to "Capacity of SD Card" on page 84 for further details.


#### NOTE:

- Scene complexity affects a picture's file size. For example, a picture of trees in autumn has a larger file size than a picture of blue sky at the same resolution and quality setting. Therefore, the number of pictures you can store on the camera internal memory may vary. The number of pictures on the LCD screen is for reference only.
- It is recommended to use the 2048 x 1536 resolution for printing.

### • Setting Exposure Compensation

You can adjust the exposure compensation value (EV) within the range of -1.5EV to +1.5EV in order to compensate for current lighting conditions. This setting can be used to obtain better result when shooting with backlighting, indirect indoor lighting, a dark background, etc.

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Still Image mode.






#### NOTE:

- A higher EV value is best used for light-colored subjects and backlit subjects. A lower EV value is best for dark-colored subjects and for shooting outdoors on a clear day.
- When shooting under very dark or very bright conditions, you may not be able to obtain satisfactory results even after performing exposure compensation.
- Exposure compensation returns to its standard default setting (AUTO) after you turn off and turn on the camera again.

### Setting the White Balance for Pictures

Selecting the right type of white balance can help to make the color of a subject in a picture appear more natural under the type of lighting that is available.

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Still Image mode.

## 4 Recording Audio and Video Clips

### Recording Audio Clips

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Audio mode.
- Press the Shutter button completely down to start recording.
- Press the Shutter button again to stop recording, or recording stops when the current memory is full.





#### NOTE:

Change the drive mode from Still Image mode to audio mode before recording audio clips, since Still Image mode is the default capture mode. For more details, please refer to "Drive Mode" on page 16.

# Recording Video Clips

Use the Video mode to record video clips with audio. The recording time displayed on the LCD screen will decrease and the ● icon will blink while recording.

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Video mode.
- 3. Frame your subject using the LCD screen.
- 4. Press the Shutter button completely down to start recording.
- Press the Shutter button again to stop recording, or recording stops when the current memory is full.




# NOTE:

Change the drive mode from Still Image mode to Video mode before recording video clips, since Still Image mode is the default capture mode. For more details, please refer to "Drive Mode" on page 16.

# Setting Video Resolution

Video resolution refers to the number of pixels in a digital video clip. Video clip quality depends on the file resolution that the camera applies when the video clip is recorded. Higher resolution makes better quality which occupies more memory space.

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- Set the camera to Video mode.



Here are the approximate length of video clips you can expect the camera to hold at each setting based on the 8MB / 16MB optional internal memory. You can expand the memory with a SD card.


Resolution: 640 x 480 Approx. 0.1 or 0.4 minute (10 fps)

320 x 240 Approx. 0.3 or 0.9 minute (15 fps)

# Setting the White Balance for Video Clips

Selecting the right type of white balance can help to make the color of a subject in the video clip appear more natural under the type of lighting that is available.

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Video mode.

# 5 Reviewing and Managing Pictures and Video Clips



Change the camera mode from Capture mode to Playback mode before reviewing pictures and video clips. For a detailed guideline on setting the Playback mode, please see "Camera Mode" on page 15.

# Reviewing Pictures on the LCD Screen

- Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Playback mode.
- 3. Press the PREV or NEXT button to view the pictures taken.

The **D** icon is shown on the LCD screen when a picture is selected.

The currently displayed picture can be magnified up to 4 times using the Zoom In button. Press the Zoom Out button to view the picture in the original size.

# • Reviewing Picture and Video Clip Files in Thumbnail

You can view up to 9 picture and video clip files at a time on the LCD screen by using the thumbnail function.

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Playback mode.
- Press the Zoom Out button and up to 9 picture and video clip files will be shown on the LCD screen at a time. The latest viewed file will be highlighted.
- Use the PREV and NEXT buttons to select a thumbnail file and view it in full screen by pressing the Zoom In button.




### Auto Play

The Auto Play function enables you to view all the picture and video clip files stored in the camera one by one forward or backward on the LCD screen.

You can activate the Auto Play function and make Auto Play direction and interval according to the following steps:


- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Playback mode.
- 3. Press the Menu button and then press the down button to select the "AUTO PLAY" option.

### Set Auto Play Direction




Press the up or down button to choose the direction in which the camera will automatically run, and then press the OK button to confirm your choice.

# Set Auto Play Interval



### Start Auto Play



The camera will automatically run from the first file or from the last file stored. Every file will display for the specified period according to your interval setting. You may press the OK button to stop the auto play. The auto play will keep running as long as there is power.

# Playing the Video Clip

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Playback mode.
- Use the PREV or NEXT button to select the video clip you want to play.
- 4. Press the Shutter button to start playing a video clip. Press it again to stop.



The licon is shown on LCD screen when a video clip is selected.




### IMPORTANT!

Audio clips can only be played in PC/MAC when connected to the computer. Please refer to Transferring Pictures, Audio and Video clips to Your Computer for further details.

# • Protect or Unprotect One Picture or Video Clip

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Playback mode.
- Use the PREV or NEXT button to select the picture or video clip you want to protect.




The Om icon appears on the information display when you review the protection status of the protected picture or video clip.

To unprotect the protected picture or video clip, please repeat the above operation and choose "UNLOCK THIS". The On icon will disappear from the LCD screen.

# • Protect or Unprotect All Pictures and Video Clips


- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Playback mode.



To unprotect all protected pictures and video clips, please repeat the above operation and choose "UNLOCK ALL". The Om icon will disappear from the LCD screen.

# • Deleting One Picture or Video Clip

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to Playback mode.
- Use the PREV or NEXT button to select the picture or video clip you want to delete.



You can cancel the deletion by choosing "NO".




#### NOTE:

Protected file can not be deleted. Remove protection before deleting.

# **6 Print Settings**

### About PictBridge

PictBridge is a new industry standard that allows you to print images directly from a PictBridge enable digital still camera to a PictBridge compatible printer without using a photo editing software or a computer.

### **Printing Procedures**

1. Preparing the camera and the printer.

Camera	Be sure battery level is full before printing.
Printer	Refer to the user guide that comes with your printer and make preparations (paper, ink cassette, cartridge, etc.) as required.

Turn on the camera and the printer.

### 2. Selecting PictBridge mode

Set the camera to Playback mode and select the PictBridge mode. Refer to page 50 for details.

# 3. Connecting the camera to the printer Refer to "Camera / Printer Connection" on page 51 for details.

# 4. Select print settings.

Use the camera's function and navigation buttons to select the print settings. Refer to page 52 for details.

### 5. Printing

Press the OK button to start printing.

### **Cancelling Printing**

Press the OK button to cancel printing the print job. The printer will stop printing and eject the paper.



### **Printing Errors**

If for some reason an error occurs during or before printing, select "CANCEL" or "CONTINUE".





### NOTE:

- Please refer to the printer's user guide for the solutions. Printing may resume once the problem is solved.
- Printing operation may still fail with some errors even if you press the OK button after selecting "CONTINUE". In that case, select "CANCEL" and press the OK button.

### Selecting PictBridge Mode

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Set the camera to the Playback mode.






### NOTE:

To print a single image, select the image before enabling PictBridge mode.

# Camera / Printer Connection

Connecting with the USB Cable.



- Plug the labelled end of the USB cable into the socket marked of on your printer. Location of USB socket will vary from printer to printer.
- Plug the other end of the USB cable into the USB port on your camera.





- " DEVICE IS CONNECTED" displays on the LCD screen, indicating a proper connection to the printer.
- Do not connect the USB cable to the camera until PictBridge is enable and when prompted by the "PLEASE CONNECT TO DEVICE" screen. Or if you already have connected the cable to the camera, do not plug into printer until prompt to do so. Not following this sequence will result in connection failure.

## **Selecting Print Settings**

1. Press the up or down button to select the print mode.



2. The following options are available.

THIS IMAGE	Print the selected image in the camera's internal memory or a memory card according to specified settings. Use the PREV or NEXT button to designate the image you want to print before selecting the PictBridge mode.
ALL IMAGES	Print all images in the camera's internal memory or a memory card according to the specified settings.
ALL INDEX	All images in the camera's internal memory or a memory card are given an index and printed according to the specified settings.




## NOTE:

- To print a single image, select the image before enabling PictBridge.
  - Print settings are configured for images only. Make sure there are no video clips or other file besides images in the memory before printing, otherwise, an error will occur if trying to print using the "ALL IMAGES" or "ALL INDEX" option.
  - Not all printers will support all these print options. Please refer to the printer user guide for options available.

3. Press the OK button to select the print settings.





Select a setting item using the up or down button and select setting contents using the PREV or NEXT button.



#### NOTE:

"PRINTER SETTING NOT SUPPORTED" may appear on the LCD screen after selecting a particular setting. The camera's print settings are not supported by the printer. In this case, select "DEFAULT" for this particular setting, or visit http://www.polaroid-digital.com for possible solutions.



# Specifying the Number of Copies

- Press the PREV or NEXT button to specify the number of copies (from 1 to 99) you want to print for the selected image or all images.
- 2. Press the OK button to start printing.



#### NOTE:

"01" is the default setting.

### Selecting Print Layout

- Press the PREV or NEXT button to specify the number of printed images on one page.
- 2. Press the OK button to start printing.





# Setting the File Name On / Off

- Press the PREV or NEXT button to select "DEFAULT", "ON" or "OFF".
- 2. Press the OK button to start printing.



DEFAULT Print settings differ according to the printer model.

ON Add the file name to the printed image.

OFF Print without the file name.

## Setting the Date Stamp On / Off

- Press the PREV or NEXT button to select "DEFAULT", "ON" or "OFF".
- 2. Press the OK button to start printing.



DEFAULT Print settings differ according to the printer model.

ON Add the date stamp to the printed image.

OFF Print without the date stamp.

### Selecting Paper Size

 Press the PREV or NEXT button to select the paper size.

The following paper sizes are available: 8" x 10", 4" x 6", A4 and default.

2. Press the OK button to start printing.



DEFAULT Print settings differ according to the printer model.

### Selecting Print Effect

- Press the PREV or NEXT button to select the print effect.
- 2. Press the OK button to start printing.



ON Print right to the edge of the page.

OFF Print with a border.

DEFAULT Print settings differ according to the printer model.

# DPOF (Digital Print Order Format)

"DPOF" stands for "Digital Print Order Format", which is a format for recording on a memory card or other medium which captured images and how many copies should be printed. Then you can print on a DPOF-compatible printer or at a professional print service from the memory card in accordance with the file name and number of copies settings recorded on the card.


With this camera, you should always select images by viewing them on the LCD screen. Do not specify images by file name without viewing the file contents.



#### NOTE:

Print settings are configured for images only. Make sure there are no video clips or other file besides images in the memory before printing, otherwise, an error will occur if trying to print using the "ALL IMAGES" option.

- 1. Insert an SD card into the camera.
- 2. Turn on the camera.
- 3. Set the camera to Playback mode.
- 4. Select the images and specify how many copies should be printed.




THIS IMAGE The selected picture in a memory card will be printed out

up to 99 copies.

ALL IMAGES All pictures in a memory card will be printed out up to 99 copies for each picture.

To print a single picture, press the PREV or NEXT button to select the picture you want to print before the above operation. Press the  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  button to specify the number of copies. Press the Menu button to exit.

- Remove the memory card from the camera and insert it into the printer's card slot (as illustrated). Location of the card slot may vary from printer to printer model.
- 6. Press the Print button on the printer to start printing.



# 7 Using the SD (Secure Digital) Card

# Using the SD card

Your camera comes with a 8MB / 16MB optional built-in flash memory for storing pictures and video clips. You can expand the memory using a commercially available SD card (up to 1 GB). The camera senses whether a memory card is inserted, and automatically saves pictures and video clips accordingly. Note that you cannot save pictures or video clips to the built-in flash memory while a memory card is installed in the camera.

### **Memory Card Precautions**


- 1. Use only an SD memory card with this camera.
- Electrostatic charge, electrical noise, and other phenomena can cause data corruption or even loss. Always make sure that you always back up important data on other media device (Flash disc, computer hard disk drive, etc.).
- 3. If a memory card starts to behave abnormally, you can restore normal operation by reformatting it. However, we recommend that you always take along more than one memory card whenever using the camera far away from the home or office.
- 4. We recommend that you format a memory card before using it for the first time after purchasing it, or whenever the card you are using seems to be the cause of abnormal pictures. Remember to format a memory card if it was used in another digital camera or other devices.



- Make sure you turn off the camera before inserting or removing a memory card.
- Be sure to orient the card correctly when inserting it. Never try to force a memory card into the slot when you feel resistance.
- SD memory cards have a write protection switch that you can use to protect files from accidental deletion. However, you must remove the write protection whenever you want to record new files onto it, format it, or delete its files
- Files contained in the SD card recorded by other cameras may conflict with the PDC 3080 camera, and valuable data in your existing SD card may be distorted or lost when the card is inserted in the PDC 3080 camera. We strongly recommend the user to use a NEW or formatted SD card for the PDC 3080 camera. The manufacturer is not liable for losing or corrupting any valuable data or files in your SD card due to your improper operation.

### Inserting a SD Card


Turn off the camera and open the SD slot cover as illustrated. Insert the SD ensuring the card is inserted the correct position as illustrated. On the inner side of the SD slot cover, there is a diagram showing the proper insertion orientation.



The Dicon will appear on the LCD screen when a SD card is inserted into the camera.

### Removing the SD Card

To remove the SD, turn off your camera and open the SD slot cover. Gently push the SD inwards and then release it for the SD to eject. Take the SD card out and close the card slot cover.






### IMPORTANT!

- Never insert any other object into the camera's SD card slot. Doing so creates the risk of damage to the camera and card.
- Should water or any foreign objects ever get into the card slot, immediately turn off the camera, remove the batteries and contact your dealer or nearest service provider.
- Never remove a card from the camera while the camera is powered on.
   Doing so can cause the picture or video recording operation to fail, and even damage the memory card.

### Formatting the SD Card

Formatting the SD card erases all files stored in it, including the protected ones. Removing the SD card during formatting may damage the card.

- 1. Insert an SD card into the camera.
- 2. Turn on the camera.
- 3. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- 4. Follow the guidelines in "Setup Menu" on page 17 to access the Setup menu.






### IMPORTANT!

- You can format a memory card on the camera or on a computer. However formatting a memory card on a computer takes much longer time and is not recommended.
- Note that data deleted by a format operation cannot be recovered. Make sure you do not have any useful data currently stored on a memory card before you format it.
- Formatting a memory card destroys all the pictures, even those are protected.

# To Copy Pictures and Video Clips from Internal Memory to a Memory Card

- 1. Insert an SD card into the camera.
- 2. Turn on the camera.
- 3. Set the camera to Playback mode.



Please note that you cannot copy pictures or video clips from a memory card to the internal memory.








- Increase the separation between the equipment and receiver.
- Connect the equipment into an outlet on a circuit different from that to which the receiver is needed.
- Consult the dealer or an experienced radio / TV technician for help.
