#### 2. Power Sources

#### 3. Grounding or Polarization

This product is equipped with a polarized alternating current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. 

#### How to handle disc




- You can pick up disc without difficulty if you press the center of supporting part when extracting disc from the case.
- Please refer to the left illustration, and do not touch the surface of disc when moving the disc.
- Do not paste paper or adhesive tape on the disc. It might bend a disc.
- Be careful not to leave a fingerprint or stain on the disc. Wash your hands before handling the disc.

- <u>Caution</u> Be careful not to leave a dirt or other substance on the disc.
  - Do not play a cracked or scratchy disc.

## **Disc Storage**



Do not keep under direct sunlight.



Keep in a cool ventilated area.



Store vertically. Keep in a clean protection jacket.




Wipe the disc with dry cloth after cleaning with soft colth dampend with neutral detergent in cleaning the stained disc.


## **Installing Batteries in the Remote Control**



1. Slide and open the battery cover.



2. Insert new batteries and ensure that the polarities are correct when inserting.


## **Battery Handling Precaution**

- Do not impose heat or fire to the batteries. Do not disassemble or short-circuit the batteries
- Ensure that exhausted batteries are not inserted into the remote controller.
- Do not use different types of batteries together. Do not use old batteries together with new ones.
- If you don't use the remote controller for a long time, remove the batteries to avoid possible damage from battery corrosion.
- Replace the batteries with new ones if the remote controller does not operate smoothly
  or the operating distance comes to be short.
- If battery leakage occurs, clean the liquid completely from the remote control and insert new batteries.

## Remote Control Handling Precaution

- Do not give a shock to remote controller.

# Connecting to a TV



- 1. Connect the audio cables between the AUDIO OUT (L/R) jacks on the back of your DVD player and the corresponding Audio Input jacks on your TV. (If you have one Audio input jack on your TV, connect the audio cables on the left jack of your DVD player)
- 2. Connect the video cable between the VIDEO OUT jack on the back of your DVD player and the corresponding Video Input jack on your TV. (If you have S-video jack on you TV, connect this jack. You will watch a better picture.)


- When you connect the DVD player to your TV, be sure to turn off the power and unplug both units from the wall outlet before making any connection.





# Before Playing a DVD

When connecting to output componets, refer to "Connection" Chapter and output components' manual,. Turn on the power of the Amplifier, if it is connected.

- The player is automatically turned off, if "No disc" is on the screen for 8 minutes.
- If  $\bigcirc$  is on the screen when you pressed certain button, it means that this button is not used in this disc which is being played.

- Do not move DVD player when it is playing. This may cause damages to the disc.
- Be sure to press button to eject disc.

  If you eject disc by force, disc may be damaged.
- Do not insert any other object than disc in the slot.
- Certain function may not operate or operate differently depending on the disc.
   In this situation, refer to the contents of the disc case.

  - Refer to the page 34-35 to change language or subtitles while it is playing.
  - It may take several time in reading disc while it is playing, it is not a breakdown. So wait for a while.

- Eject the disc when it stopped completely.
- "No disc" is displayed on the screen, when you inserted disc upside down, damaged disc, and other unplayable disc.
- "REGION ERROR" is displayed on the screen, when regionally unmatched disc is inserted.


