Precautions When Displaying a Still Image

A still image may cause permanent damage to the TV screen.

 Digital Ready TV: When you select the regular screen (4:3) mode to watch an SD-grade digital broadcast (and the set-top box output is 480p).



 Digital Ready TV: When you select the wide screen (16:9) mode to watch an SD-grade digital broadcast (and the set-top box output is 1080i).



Although digital broadcasting must be in the wide screen (16:9) HD format, broadcasters sometimes show programs made originally in the regular screen format (4:3) by converting the signals into digital form, in which case the left and right side edges of the screen are cropped.

Note: If the borders at the left, right and the center of the screen remain fixed for an extended period of time, the amount of light transmission will also remain varied and as a result the borders may leave traces.

Do not leave the screen in pause mode for extended periods of time as you may experience the same problem with products by other manufacturers.

 Digital Ready TV: When the TV receives HD-grade signals (and the set-top box output is 1080i).



When you watch a digital HD-grade broadcast on a regular (4:3) TV with the screen size "16:9" or "Panorama" selected, you will be able to watch the program but the top and bottom edges of the screen will be cropped.

Note: If the borders at the top, bottom and the center of the screen remain fixed for an extended period of time, the amount of light transmission will also remain varied and as a result the borders may leave traces.

Do not leave the screen in pause mode for extended periods of time as you may experience the same problem with products by other manufacturers.

- Integrated Digital TV (Wide-screen): When the TV receives SD-grade (regular) broadcasting signals (receives 480p regular signals).
- Digital Ready TV (wide-screen): digital TV: When the TV receives SD-grade (regular) broadcasting signals (with a set-top box).
- When you watch an analogue (regular) broadcast on a wide-screen TV (with the 4:3 screen mode selected).



Although digital broadcasting must be in the wide screen (16:9) HD format, broadcasters sometimes show programs made originally in the regular screen format (4:3) by converting the signals into digital form, in which case the left and right side edges of the screen are cropped.

Note: If the borders at the left, right and the center of the screen remain fixed for an extended period of time, the amount of light transmission will also remain varied and as a result the borders may leave traces.

Do not leave the screen in pause mode for extended periods of time as you may experience the same problem with products by other manufacturers.

- When you watch a DVD, CD or a video in wide screen (21:9) format on a wide-screen (16:9) TV.
- When you connect a computer or a game console to the TV and select the 4:3 screen mode.



If you connect a DVD player, computer or a game console to the wide-screen TV and watch a movie or play a game in regular (4:3) or wide (21:9) screen mode, the left and right side edges, or the top and bottom edges of the screen will be cropped.

Note: If the borders at the left, right and the center of the screen remain fixed for an extended period of time, the amount of light transmission will also remain varied and as a result the borders may leave traces.

Do not leave the screen in pause mode for extended periods of time as you may experience the same problem with products by other manufacturers.



Displays a menu of all of the available input sources (TV - AV - S-Video - Component 1 - Component 2 - PC/DVI).

2 MENU

Opens the on-screen menu.

6 - +

Moves the selector left or right on the OSD. Increases or decreases the level of audio volume and the values of the selected function.

4 ∨ C/P. ७ ∧

Moves the selector up or down on the OSD. Increases or decreases the channel number.

⑤ ŮPOWER

Turns ON/OFF your set.

6 SPEAKER


7 REMOTE CONTROL SENSOR

Aims the remote control towards this spot on the TV.

8 POWER INDICATOR

Lights up when you turn the power off.
When you turn the power off after selecting On/Off
Timer, green light will appear.

Viewing the Connection Panel



Whenever you connect an audio or video system to your set, ensure that all elements are switched off.

Refer to the documentation supplied with your equipment for detailed connection instructions and associated safety precautions.

Viewing the Connection Panel

Connecting an Aerial or Cable Television Network (depending on the model)

To view television channels correctly, a signal must be received by the set from one of the following sources:

- An outdoor aerial
- A cable television network
- A satellite network

2 Connecting a Set-Top Box, VCR or DVD

- Connect the RCA cable to "L AUDIO R" on the rear of your set and the other end to "Audio Out" connector on the DVD, VCR or DTV Set-Top Box.
- The Y, PB and PR connectors on your component device (DVD) are sometimes labeled Y, B-Y and R-Y or Y, Cb and Cr.
- Connect RCA Cable to "Y", "PB" and "PR" on the rear of your set and the other end to "Component Out" connetor of the DVD, VCR, DTV Set-Top Box.
 Connect RCA audio cables to "L-AUDIO-R" on the rear of your set and the other ends to corresponding audio out connetors on the DTV or DVD.

3 Connecting a Computer

- Connect the 24 Pin DVI connector to the PC video connector.
- Connect the stereo audio cable to the "PC AUDIO IN" jack on the rear of your set and the other end to the "Audio Out" jack of the sound card on your computer.

Viewing the Connection Panel

1 Connecting a DVD Player or Set-Top Box to the TV with a DVI-D Cable

- Connect a DVI-D cable (sold separately) between the DVI-I INPUT connector on the TV and the DVI connector on the DVD player/Set-Top BOX.
- Connect a set of audio cables between the PC AUDIO INPUT jack on the TV and the AUDIO OUTPUT jacks on the DVD player/ Set-Top BOX.
 - If you are using a DVI-D cable to connect
 - Be sure to connect the audio cable (sold separately) as shown above to get normal TV sound.
 - ◆ See Appendix "Display Modes" for supported resolutions.
 - The screen may have shifted to the right or to the left after connecting the cable. Don't adjust the screen position in a Digital Signal.
 - ◆ Each external input Source device has a different back panel configuration.

5 Connecting External A/V Devices

- Connect RCA or S-VIDEO cables to an appropriate external A/V device such as a VCR, DVD, or Camcorder.
- Connect RCA audio cables to "L AUDIO R" on the rear of your set and the other ends to corresponding audio out connectors on the A/V device.
- Headphones may be connected to the headphone output () on the rear of your set.
 While the headphones are connected, the sound from the built-in speakers will be disabled.

6 Connecting Headphones

- Plug a set of headphones into the 3.5mm mini-jack socket on the rear of the set.

7 Using the Anti-Theft Kensington Lock

- This television has been designed to apply a burglarproof lock. (Refer to page 58)

Viewing Pictures From External Sources



Once you have connected up your various audio and video systems, you can view the different sources by selecting the appropriate input.

- 1 Check that all the necessary connections have been made (refer to pages 6 and 7 for further details).
- 2 PC button...
 Press the PC button to choose PC mode.
 - ◆ VIDEO button... Press the VIDEO button to choose video mode. The input sources are displayed in the following order: AV - S-Video - Component 1 - Component 2 - PC/DVI
 - ◆ TV button... Press the TV button to choose TV mode.


Inserting the Batteries in the Remote Control


You must insert or replace the batteries in the remote control when you:

- ◆ Purchase your set.
- ◆ Find that the remote control is no longer operating correctly.
- 1 Remove the cover on the rear of the remote control by pressing the symbol downwards and then pulling firmly to remove it.
- 2 Install two AAA size batteries.
 - + on the battery against + on the remote control
 - ◆ on the battery against on the remote control
- 3 Replace the cover by aligning it with the base of the remote control and pressing it back into place.
- Do not mix battery types, i.e. alkaline and manganese.
- If remote control doesn't work!


Check the following:

- 1. Is the TV power on?
- 2. Are the plus and minus ends of the batteries reversed?
- 3. Are the batteries drained?
- 4. Is there a power outage, or is the power cord unplugged?
- 5. Is there a special fluorescent light or a neon sign nearby?






- The performance of the remote control may be affected by bright light.
- You can use the remote control up to a distance of about 23 feet from the TV. When using the remote, always point it directly at the TV. You can also use your remote control to operate your VCR, Cable box, DVD player or Samsung Set-Top box.



Switching On and Off





The mains lead is attached to the rear of your set.

1 Plug the mains lead into an appropriate socket.

Result: When the adaptor is plugged in, the red power indicator appears on the front of your set.

- 2 Press the **POWER** button to switch on.
- 3 To switch off, press the **POWER** button again.

Placing in Standby Mode






Your set can be placed in Standby mode in order to reduce the power consumption.

The Standby mode can be useful when you wish to interrupt viewing temporarily (during a meal, for example).

- 1 Press the **OPOWER** button.
- 2 To switch back on, simply press the **OPOWER** button again or a numeric button.



Becoming Familiar with the Remote Control

The remote control is used mainly to:

- ♦ Change channels and adjust the volume.
- ◆ Set up your set using the on-screen menu system.

Plug & Play



When the set is initially powered on, you are automatically presented with a series of basic customer settings.

The following settings are available.

1 If the set is in standby mode, press the **POWER**(也) button on the remote control.

Result: The message **Plug & Play** is displayed. It appears for a little while, and then the

"Check antenna input." menu is displayed with the OK selected.

2 Press the **ENTER** • button.

Result: The country menu is displayed:

Asia/W.Europe - CIS/E.Europe - China -Hongkong/UK - Austrailia - NZL/Indonesia -South Africa - America

3 Select your **Area** by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the **ENTER** → button.

Result: The **Auto Store** menu is displayed with the **Start** selected.

4 Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: The channel search will start and end automatically.

- 5 Select the **Hour, min** or **am/pm** by pressing the ◀ or ▶ button. Set the **Hour, min** or **am/pm** by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. (Refer to "**Setting the Clock**" on page **36**)
- **6** Press the **MENU** button to confirm your setting.

Result: The message **Enjoy your viewing** is displayed, and then the channel which has been stored will be activated.

Plug & Play

If you want to reset this feature ...

1 Press the MENU button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Setup.

Result: The options available in the **Setup** group are displayed.


3 Press the ENTER button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Plug & Play.

Result: The message **Plug & Play** is displayed.

Selecting TV Mode or an Input Source

You can choose TV mode or change to an input source connected to the TV set. Use this button to choose an input source that you would like to watch.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Input.

Result: The options available in the **Input** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.

4 Press the ENTER button to select the Source List.

Result: The Source List is selected.

5 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to move to the input source that you wish to choose.

Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: The input source changes to the one you have chosen.





Editing an Input Source Name











Entering the names of the input source devices connected to the input ports on the TV set allows you to find and choose an input source that you would like to watch in a quick and convenient manner.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Input.

Result: The options available in the **Input** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER ← button.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Edit Name. Press the ENTER ⊕ button.

5 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to move to the input source that you wish to edit.

Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: The following options are available:

AV - S-Video - Component 1 - Component 2

- PC/DVI

6 Select the required device by pressing the ▲ or ▼ repeatedly.

Result: The following options are available:

---- - VCR - DVD - Cable STB - HD STB - Satellite STB - AV Receiver - DVD Receiver - Game -Camcorder - DVD Combo - DHR - PC

When you are satisfied with your choice, press the MENU button to return to the previous menu or press the EXIT button to return to normal viewing.

Choosing Your Language



The available language for on-screen menu and indicators in this TV is only English.

When you select the Setup menu, the Language is set to English and you cannot select the Language.

Storing Channels Automatically

You can scan for the frequency ranges available to you (and availability depends on your country). Automatically allocated programme numbers may not correspond to actual or desired programme numbers. However you can sort numbers manually and clear any channels you do not wish to watch.

1 Press the MENU button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Channel.

Result: The options available in the Channel group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER button.
- Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Auto Store. Press the ENTER ⊕ button.

Result: The Auto store menu is displayed with the Start selected.

Press the ENTER button to search the channels. The sub menu is changed from Start to Stop with channel search started.

Result: The search will end automatically.

Channels are sorted and stored in an order which reflects their position in the frequency range (with lowest first and highest last). The programme originally selected is then displayed.

- To return to the previous menu, press ◀ or ▶ button to select **Return** and then press the **ENTER** → button.
- To stop the search before it has finished, press the **ENTER** & button to search the channels.
- 6 After **Auto Store** proceeds, **Sort** menu appears automatically.
 - Sort them in the order required (refer to page 21)
- 7 When the channels have been stored, you can:
 - ◆ Add or delete the channels (refer to page 20)
 - ◆ Assign a name to the stored channels (refer to page 22)
 - ◆ Fine tune channel reception if necessary (refer to page 23)










Storing Channels Manually



You can store up to 100 channels, including those received via cable networks. When storing channels manually, you can choose:

- ♦ Whether or not to store each of the channels found.
- The programme number of each stored channel which you wish to identify.
- 1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the **Channel**.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER ← button.
- 4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Manual Store.
 Press the ENTER → button.

Result: The options available in the **Manual Store** group are displayed with the **Prog. No** selected.

- Press the ENTER button again. To assign a programme number to a channel, find the correct number by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button and then press the ENTER button.
- 6 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Colour System.

Press the **ENTER** button.

Select the **Colour System** required by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button repeatedly and then press the **ENTER** ⊕ button.

Result: The colour standards are displayed in the following order:

AUTO - PAL - SECAM - NT 4.43 - NT 3.58

7 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Sound System**.

Press the **ENTER** \bullet button.

Select the **Sound System** required by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button repeatedly and then press the **ENTER** ⊕ button.

Result: The sound standards are displayed in the following order: BG - DK - I - M

- For all the channels to move to the required channel numbers, repeat steps 5 to 6 after selecting Prog. No by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.
 - You can also set **Prog.No** by pressing number button on the remote control.

Storing Channels Manually

- **9** If you know the channel number to be stored,
 - Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Channel.
 Press the ENTER ⊕ button.
 - Select C (Air channel) or S (Cable channel) by pressing the
 ▲ or ▼ button and then press the ENTER → button.
 - ◆ Select the required number by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button and then press the **ENTER** → button.
 - If there is normal sound or no sound, re-select the sound system required.
 - You can also set Channel by pressing number buttons on the remote control.
- 10 If you do not know the channel numbers, press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Search.

Press the **ENTER** • button.

Start the **Search** by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.

Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: The tuner scans the frequency range until the first channel or the channel that you selected is received on your screen.

11 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Store**.

Press the **ENTER** button.

Select **YES** by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.


Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: The channel and associated programme number are

12 Repeat steps 8 to 10 for each channel to be stored.

Channel mode

- ◆ P (Programme mode): When tuning is completed, the broadcasting stations in your area will have been assigned to position numbers from P00 to P99. You can select a channel by entering the position number in this mode.
- C (Real channel mode): You can select a channel by entering the assigned number to each broadcast station in this mode.
- S (Cable channel mode): You can select a channel by entering the assigned number to each cable channel in this mode.



Editing the Channels









You can exclude any channels of your choice from the channels you have scanned. When you scan through the stored channels, those you have chosen to skip are not displayed.

All channels that you do not specifically choose to skip are displayed during scanning.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the **Channel**.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Add/Delete. Press the ENTER ⊕ button.

Result: The state of the current channel is displayed.

5 Press the P o or P ∨ button to select the channel that you wish to Add or Delete.

Result: If the channel that you wish to edit is not in the memory, **Add** is selected and displayed.

Otherwise, if the channel that you wish to edit is in the memory, **Delete** is selected and displayed.

6 Press the **ENTER** button to **Add** or **Delete** the channel.

- 7 To return to the previous menu, select **Return** by pressing the
 ◀ or ▶ button and then press the **ENTER** → button.
- 8 Repeat steps 5 to 6 for each channel to be added or deleted.

Sorting the Stored Channels

You can exchange the numbers of two channels, in order to:

- Modify the numeric order in which the channels have been automatically stored.
- Assign easily remembered numbers to the channels that you watch most often.
- 1 Press the MENU button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the **Channel**.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER ← button.
- 4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Sort**.

Press the **ENTER** → button.

Result: The current **Prog. No, Channel** and **Name** are displayed.


5 Select the channel number that you wish to change by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button repeatedly. Press the ENTER button.

Result: The selected **Channel number** and **Name** are moved to the right side.

6 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to move to the position which you would like to change and then press the ENTER → button.

Result: The selected channel is exchanged with the one previously stored to the chosen number.

7 Repeat steps 5 to 6 for another channel to be sorted.



Giving Channels Names









If channel name information is broadcast when you store the channels either manually or automatically, the names are assigned to the channels directly. You can however change these names or assign new names as required.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the **Channel**.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER → button.
- Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Name.
 Press the ENTER button.

Result: The current **Prog. No, Channel** and **Name** are displayed.

If necessary, select the channel to be assigned to a new name by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the ENTER → button.

Result: The selection bar is displayed around the name box.

Result: The horizontal bar is displayed.

6 Press the ◀ or ▶ button to reach the required setting.

When you are satisfied with the setting, press the MENU button to return to the previous menu or press the EXIT button to return to normal viewing.

Teletext Feature

Most television channels provide written information services via teletext.

Information provided includes:

- ◆ Television programme times.
- News bulletins and weather forecasts.
- ♦ Sports results.
- ◆ Travel information.

This information is divided into numbered pages (see diagram).

Teletext information is often divided between several pages displayed in sequence, which can be accessed by:

- ◆ Entering the page number
- ◆ Selecting a title in a list
- ◆ Selecting a coloured heading (FASTEXT system)



Displaying the Teletext Information



You can display Teletext information at any time on your set.

- For Teletext information to be displayed correctly, channel reception must be stable; otherwise:
 - ◆ Information may be missing
 - ◆ Some pages may not be displayed
- Select the channel providing the Teletext service using the P ((□)) or P ∨ ((□)) button.
- 2 Press the **TTX/MIX** (**\B**/**\Z**) button to activate the teletext mode.

Result: The contents page is displayed. It can be redisplayed at any time by pressing the (i) (index) button.

- 3 If you wish to display the actual broadcast at the same time as the teletext page, press the TTX/MIX (⟨≡/∠) button again.
- **4** To return to normal viewing, press the **□**X(cancel) button.
- **5** Press the **TV** button again to exit the teletext display.

Selecting a Page by Number

You can enter the page number directly by pressing the numeric buttons on the remote control.

1 Enter the three-digit page number given in the content by pressing the corresponding numeric buttons.

Result: The current page counter is incremented and the page is then displayed.

2 If the selected page is linked with several secondary pages, the secondary pages are displayed in sequence.

To freeze the display on a given page, press the (□3) (hold) button. Press the (□3) (hold) button again to resume.

Using FLOF to Select a Page



The various topics included in the teletext pages are colour-coded, and can be selected by pressing the coloured buttons on the remote control.

- Display the teletext contents page by pressing the TTX/MIX button.
- 2 Press the coloured button corresponding to the topic that you wish to select; the available topics are given on the status line.

Result: The page is displayed with other coloured information that can be selected in the same way.

- 3 To display the previous or next page, press the corresponding coloured button.
- **4** To display the subpage, see the following steps.
 - ◆ Press the **(subpage)** button.

Result: The available subpages appear.

Storing Teletext Pages

You can store up to four teletext pages to display them later at leisure.

- 1 Select the LIST mode using the (LIST/FLOF) button.
 - Result: Four 3-digit numbers are displayed in different colours.
 - The (LIST/FLOF) button is used to switch between the LIST and FLOF modes.
- Press the coloured button corresponding to the page that will be replaced.
- 3 Enter the new page number using the numeric buttons.
- 4 Repeat steps 2 and 3 for each page to be stored, using a different coloured button each time.
- 5 Press the (store) button until the corresponding blocks blink.



Troubleshooting: Before Contacting Service Personnel




Tilt the screen until you feel comfortable.


Using the Anti-Theft Kensington Lock


The Kensington lock is a device used to physically fix the system when using it in a public place. The locking device has to be purchased separately. The appearance and locking method may differ from the illustration depending on the manufacturer. Please refer to the manual provided with the Kensington lock for proper use.



- 1. Insert the locking device into the Kensington slot on the LCD TV (Figure 1), and turn it in the locking direction (Figure 2).
- 2. Connect the Kensington lock cable.
- 3. Fix the Kensington lock to a desk or a heavy stationary object.

How to connect the cables and stand base







Connect the cables as shown in the picture.




Replace the cover.



Attach the stand to the TV set as shown in the picture.

Note: The curved side of the stand base should be placed at the back of the TV set as shown in the above figure.





Do NOT lift the TV set by the stand.

If the stand is not screwed to the TV set, lifting the set by the stand may cause injury.
