





FRONT PANEL



1. POWER (ON/STANDBY) button

Each time the POWER button is pressed, this unit is turned on to enter the operating mode or off to enter the standby mode.

2. STANDBY Indicator

In the standby mode, the STANDBY indicator lights up.

3. Remote sensor

This receives the signals from the remote control unit.


4. HDMI1, 2 and AV Indicators

Press this button to select the desired input source.










System Connections

1. CONNECTING TV AND THE SOURCE EQUIPMENT WITH COMPONENT VIDEO OUTS



Connecting the source equipment with the COMPONENT VIDEO OUTs

- When you connect the COMPONENT VIDEO OUTs of the source equipment to this unit, this unit can convert the component video signals to the digital video signals and output them from the HDMI OUT connector of this unit.
- In addition, when you connect the OPTICAL OUT to this unit, this unit can output the digital signals as they were input from the HDMI OUT connector, too.
- When making the component video connections, connect "Y" to "Y", PB" to "PB"(or "B-Y", "CB") and "PR" to "PR"(or "R-Y", "CR").

Connecting the display equipment with the HDMI IN connector

- The HDMI connection can carry uncompressed digital video signals and digital audio signals.
- If your display equipment (TV, projector, etc.) has the HDMI IN connector, connect it to the HDMI OUT connector of this unit using the supplied HDMI cord.
- Among the HDMI IN connector equipped TV or projector, etc., some do not support audio output(for examples, projectors).

In such a case, make the digital audio connection(and the analog audio connection if needed) between the source equipment and the display equipment(or A/V amp, receiver).

Connecting the display equipment with the DVI IN connector

• If your display equipment has the DVI IN connector compatible with DVI and High-bandwidth Digital Content Protection (HDCP), connect it to the HDMI OUT connector of this unit using a commercially available HDMI-DVI converter cord.

Since the HDMI-to-DVI connection cannot carry audio signals, you should make the digital audio connection(and the analog audio connection if needed) between the source equipment and the display equipment (or A/V amp, receiver).

Notes:

- This unit supports HDMI(High Definition Multimedia Interface) version 1.1
- This unit supports HDCP(High-bandwidth Digital Content Protection), a protection system for digital video. If not, the image will not be output properly.
- This unit supports 480p(576p), 720p, 1080i as the resolution of video signals.

Therefore, when making COMPONENT VIDEO connections, be sure to output the progressive video signals (480p or 576p) from your source equipment.

- If your source equipment outputs the interlaced video signals (480i or 576i), the HDMI OUT of this unit will output no video signals or abnormal video signals.
- Depending on the equipment, using a DVI connection may result in unreliable signal transfers.
- Depending on the display equipment, you may specify the resolution and the audio format on the source equipment to match them the display equipment supports.



Source equipment (DVD player, set-top box, etc.)

- This unit can output digital video and digital audio signals from the HDMI OUT of this unit without any conversion as they were input into the HDMI IN.

Connecting the source equipment with the HDMI OUT connector

• If your source equipment (DVD player, set-top box, etc.) has the HDMI OUT connector, connect it to the HDMI IN 1 or 2 connector of this unit using a commercially available HDMI cord.

Connecting the source equipment with the DVI OUT connector

• If your source equipment has the DVI OUT connector compatible with DVI and High-bandwidth Digital Content Protection (HDCP), connect it to the HDMI IN 1 or 2 connector of this unit using a commercially available HDMI-DVI converter cord.



- To control this unit from another room with the remote control unit, connect the IR IN jack to the output of the connecting block.
- If this unit is located inside a cabinet or other enclosure where the infrared beams from the remote control unit cannot enter, then operation with the remote control unit will not be possible.

 In such a case, connect the IR IN jack to the output of the connecting block.

Note:

 Remote operation may become unreliable if the IR receiver is exposed to strong light such as direct sunlight or inverted fluorescent.








Operations



- Each time the POWER(ON/STANDBY) button on the front panel is pressed, this unit is turned on to enter the operating mode (the STANDBY indicator lights up in bule) or off to enter the standby mode (the STANDBY indicator lights up in red).
- On the remote control, press the POWER ON button to enter the operating mode or press the STANDBY button to enter the standby mode.
- In the standby mode, the STANDBY indicator lights up in red. This means that the unit is not disconnected from the AC mains and a small amount of current is retained to support the operation readiness.



• Each time the "INPUT" button on the front panel is pressed, the input source changes as follows;



 Each time the input source is changed, the corresponding indicator lights up.

Definition of Terms

HDMI

HDMI(High Definition Multimedia Interface) is a new connection format that supports both video and audio on a single digital connection.

The HDMI connection carries uncompressed, standard or high definition digital video signals and multi-channel audio signals to AV components such as HDMI equipped TVs, in digital form without degradation.

Since the video signals from HDMI jack are compatible with the current DVI(Digital Visual Interface) format, HDMI jacks can be connected to DVI jacks by way of an HDMI-DVI converter cord. The HDMI specification supports HDCP(Highbandwidth Digital Contents Protection), a copy protection technology that incorporates coding technology for digital video signals.

HDMI, the HDMI logo and High-Definition Multimedia Interface are trademarks or registered trademarks of HDMI licensing LLC.

HDCP

HDCP(High-bandwidth Digital Content Protection) is a specified method from Intel for protecting copyrighted digital entertainment content that uses the Digital Video Interface (DVI) by encrypting its transmission between the video source and the digital display (receiver). The video source might be a computer, set-top box, or digital versatile disc (DVD) player, and the digital display might be an liquid crystal display (LCD), television, plasma panel, or projector.

DV

DVI(Digital Video Interface) is a specification created by the Digital Display Working Group(DDWG) to accommodate analog and digital monitors with a single connector. There are three different DVI configurations: DVI-A, designed for analog signals, DVI-D, designed for digital signals, and DVI-I(intergrated), designed for both analog and digital signals

Using a DVI connector and port, a digital signal that is sent to an analog monitor is converted into an analog signal. If the monitor is a digital monitor, such as a flat panel display, no conversion is necessary. Many monitors now include a DVI connection and many video adapters include a DVI port along with, or instead of, the traditional 15-pin Video Graphics Array (VGA) port.

Component Video

Video signals with three channels of separate information that makes up the picture. There are some types of component video, such as Y/CB(PB)/CR(PR) and R/G/B.

Dolby Digital

Dolby Digital provides multichannel surround sound in cinemas from 35mm film and in the home from laser discs, DVDs, and digital broadcast television, cable, and satellite systems. It enables the transmission and storage of up to five full-range audio channels, plus a low-frequency effects channel(LFE), thus 5.1 channels, in less space than is required for just one linear PCM-coded channel on a compact disc.

Manufactured under license from Dolby Laboratories. "Dolby" and the double-D symbol are trademarks of Dolby Laboratories.

DTS

DTS(Digital Theater Systems) is a newly-developed surround system which can handle more amount of data, providing better audio quality. Though the number of audio channels is 5.1 which is same as Dolby Digital, discs bearing the " provides fat sound and better signal-to-noise ratio, thanks to the lower audio compression ratio format. It also provides wide dynamic range and better separation, resulting in magnificent sound.

"DTS" and "DTS Digital Surround" are registered trademarks of Digital Theater Systems, Inc.

Bitstream

The digital signal form of multichannel audio data (e.g., 5.1 channel) before it is decoded into its various channels.

Linear PCM

PCM stands for Pulse Code Modulation. Linear PCM is the usual digital method without compression, used for audio playback of audio CDs, DVD Videos, etc.

Packed PCM

A lossless compression system that enables more PCM audio to be stored on a DVD-Audio disc than would otherwise be possible.


