



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## Introduction

Thank you for purchasing a JVC product.

Please read all instructions carefully before operation, to ensure your complete understanding and to obtain the best possible performance from the unit.

#### **Precautions**



#### Installation

- Install in a place which is level, dry and neither too hot nor too cold—between 5°C and 35°C (41°F and 95°F).
- Install the unit in a location with adequate ventilation to prevent internal heat buildup inside the unit.



DO NOT install the unit in a location near heat sources, or in a place subject to direct sunlight, excessive dust or vibration.

- Leave sufficient distance between the unit and the TV.
- Keep the unit away from the TV to avoid interference with TV.

#### **Power Sources**

• When unplugging the unit from the wall outlet, always pull on the plug, not the AC power cord.



DO NOT handle the AC power cord with wet hands.

#### **Internal Heat**





- Make sure there is good ventilation around the unit. Poor ventilation could overheat and damage the unit.
- DO NOT block the ventilation openings or holes. If they are blocked by a newspaper or cloth, etc., the heat may not be able to get out.

#### Others

• Should any metallic object or liquid fall into the unit, unplug the AC power cord and consult your dealer before operating any further.



DO NOT disassemble the unit since there are no user serviceable parts inside.

• If you are not going to operate the unit for an extended period of time, unplug the AC power cord from the wall outlet.

If anything goes wrong, unplug the AC power cord and consult your dealer.

## **Getting Started**

- In this manual, operations using the remote control are mainly explained; however, you can use the buttons and controls on the unit if they have the same (or similar) name and marks.
- In this manual, "iPod" means both iPod and iPhone devices. When iPhone device is especially mentioned, "iPhone" is used in this case.

#### **Supplied Accessories**

After unpacking, check to be sure that you have all the following items. The number in parentheses indicates the quantity of each piece supplied.

- Remote control (1)
- Lithium coin battery CR2025 (1) (The battery has been installed when shipped from the factory.)
- FM antenna (1)
- AC power cord (1)
- AC adaptor (1)

## If anything is missing, consult your dealer immediately.

#### **CAUTION:**

To avoid risk of fire and to prevent damage.


- Do not use AC adaptors except the supplied AC adaptor.

#### **Prepare the Remote Control**

When you use the remote control for the first time, pull out the insulation sheet.




#### Replacing the battery in the remote control

Insert the battery into the remote control by matching the polarity (+ and –) correctly.

• If the range or effectiveness of the remote control decreases, replace the battery.


Do not connect the AC power cord until all other connections have been made.

#### **Connecting the Antenna**

FM antenna (supplied):
Extend it so that you can obtain the best reception.


 Make sure the FM antenna does not touch any other terminals, connecting cords or the AC power cord. Also, keep the antenna away from metallic parts of the unit, connecting cords and the AC power cord. This could cause poor reception.

#### Connecting the Video Cord to View a Video/Picture from iPod


When viewing a video/picture from iPod on your TV, use a composite video cord (not supplied) to connect the VIDEO OUT jack on the unit and the composite video input on your TV.

After you have connected the unit, change the video input mode on your TV. For details, also refer

#### **Canceling the Display Demonstration (Demo)**

When you connect the AC power cord for the first time, the display demonstration starts automatically.

• When you operate the unit, the display demonstration stops temporarily. If no operation is done for about 2 minutes, the unit starts the display demonstration again.

#### **Turning on the Power Automatically (Motion Sensor)**

When you move your hand or an object closer to Motion sensor (P.7), the unit turns on automatically.

- iPod starts playback or an FM broadcast is received if you selected either of them last time.
- Motion Sensor works even if ECO mode is activated.







#### ■ To dim the display and illumination panel—DIMMER

You can change the brightness of the display and illumination panel.



• Dimmer is canceled when you turn off the unit.

#### ■ To activate ECO mode

Activating ECO mode allows you to reduce power consumption by turning off the display while on standby.



Press while the unit is on standby. "ECO ON" appears on the display for a while.

- The clock is not shown on the display when the unit is on standby.
- To cancel the mode, press ECO/DIMMER again. "ECO OFF" appears for a while then the clock is shown on the display.
- The battery of iPod is not charged in ECO mode.

#### ■ To turn off the unit after a certain period of time—Sleep Timer

Press repeatedly to specify the time (in minutes) as follows:



• To check the time remaining before the shut-off time, press SLEEP once. If you press the button repeatedly, you can change the shut-off time.

#### **■** To emphasize the sound—Sound Turbo

You can add the powerfulness to the sound.



Press to activate Sound Turbo.

⇔ "S-TURBO" appears for a while and S.TURBO lights up on the display.


• To cancel, press SOUND TURBO again. "OFF" appears on the display.

#### ■ To adjust the tone

You can adjust the bass and treble levels.



Select the item you want to adjust.





Adjust the bass or treble level (-5 to +5).



#### **Connecting iPod**

Connect iPod to dock A or B on the unit.

You can have 2 iPod devices connected at the same time.

• Make sure the unit is on standby when you connect iPod.



#### To detach the dock adapter from the dock:

Pull up the dock adapter with your fingernail or a sharp-pointed tool using the slot.

• Be careful not to injure your fingertips or damage the terminal of the dock.



#### NOTES:

- Be careful not to damage the terminal on the dock when connecting/disconnecting iPod.
- Close the cover of the dock when you do not connect iPod to the unit.

#### About the battery charge of iPod

The battery of iPod is always charged through the unit except when the unit is in ECO mode (see page 10).

- When 2 iPod devices are connected, both batteries are charged at the same time.







## **Setting the Clock**


Set the built-in clock before using Timer.

- To exit from the clock setting, press CLOCK/TIMER as required.
- To correct a misentry during the process, press MENU/CANCEL. You can return to the previous step.
- If a power failure occurs, the clock loses the setting and is reset to "AM12:00." You need to adjust the clock again.

#### **Using Timer**

Using Timer, you can wake up with music, etc.


- Deactivate Motion Sensor when you use Timer (P.6).
- When using iPod or other equipment as the playback source, connect it to the unit beforehand. (P.13, P.19)
- You can set Timer when the unit is turned on or on standby.
- The unit is turned off automatically 2 hours after it is turned on by Timer.





Activate the timer setting mode.

⇒ "TIMER 1," "TIMER 2" or "TIMER 3" appears on the display.



- To exit from Timer setting, press CLOCK/TIMER as required.
- To correct a misentry during the process, press MENU/CANCEL. You can return to the previous step.



## ■ To Turn off the Timer Sound briefly—Snooze

Using Snooze, you can have the timer sound stop and restart it 5 minutes later.

Set Timer following the steps 1 to 6 on pages 20 and 21.

When the timer sound starts, press SNOOZE. The unit turns off for 5 minutes to stop the timer sound. Timer remains activated.

2 (SNOOZE)

• "SNOOZE" flashes on the display while the unit turns off.

5 minutes later, the unit turns on and the timer sound restarts automatically.

- To stop the timer sound again, press SNOOZE.
- After stopping the timer sound 10 times by pressing SNOOZE, Snooze is canceled.
- When the timer sound starts:
  - If you do not press SNOOZE within 3 minutes after the timer sound starts, Snooze does not work.
- When you turn off the unit by pressing 𝒪⁄I, Snooze does not work.

#### Power does not come on.

☐ The power plug is not inserted securely. Plug it in securely (P.5).

## Power turns on even though you turned off.

□ Motion Sensor is activated (P.6).

## Adjustments or settings are suddenly canceled before you finish.

There is a time limit. Repeat the procedure again.

#### Operations are disabled.

□ The built-in microprocessor may malfunction due to external electrical interference. Unplug the AC power cord and then plug it back in.

## Cannot view a video/picture from iPod on the TV.

- Connect a composite video cord securely to your TV (P.5).
- ⇔ Change the video input mode on your TV. For details, refer to the instruction manual for your TV.

## Unable to operate the unit from the remote control.

- The path between the remote control and the remote sensor on the unit is blocked.
- Point it at the remote sensor on the front panel.
- ⇔ Signals cannot reach the remote sensor.
   Move closer to the unit.
- The batteries are exhausted.
- $\Rightarrow$  Pull out the insulation sheet (P.3).

#### The unit is suddenly turned off.

The unit is turned off automatically 2 hours after it is turned on by Timer (P.20).

#### IPod Operations

□ The battery is empty. Leave it connected for more than 10 minutes.

#### **Radio Operations**

## Hard to listen to broadcasts because of noise.

- The FM antenna connection is incorrect or loose (P.4).
