#### SERVICING

#### CLEANING THE CABINET

- If the disc's peripheral edge is rough, rub it with pen or pencil stem in order to fine the rough completely. If not, the disc may not be inserted correctly, or the plastic fragments may stick on the disc and cause skips of playback.







## About the Remote Control

#### Installing the Batteries for the Remote Control

Install two AA batteries (supplied) matching the polarity indicated inside battery compartment of the remote control.






Keep in mind the following when using the remote control:

- Make sure that there is no obstacle between the remote control and the remote sensor on the player (the receiver).
- The maximum operable ranges from the player (the receiver) are as follows.
- Beeline: approx. 23 feet (7m)
   Either side of the center: approx. 16 feet (5m) within 30°
   Above: approx. 16 feet (5m) within 15° Below: approx. 10 feet (3m) within 30°


#### Remote Control Operation for the DVD/CD Player



### Connections

#### Connection to the AV Receiver and the Speaker Unit

See the illustration below and connect the DVD/CD Player, the AV Receiver and the Speaker Unit by following the steps 1 to 5.




1) Turn on the switches of the Subwoofer (back of the unit) and the Wireless Rear speaker (back of the unit).

 Press [AMP POWER] to turn on the AV Receiver. The DVD/CD Player should turn on and off along with the AV Receiver.

HintBe sure to remove the disc from the player and unplug the AC power cords from the outlets before connecting the system.

If your TV has AUDIO/VIDEO input jacks, see the following instructions.



### Hint

Connect this player directly to the TV. If the Audio/Video cables are connected to a VCR, pictures may be distorted due to the copy protection system.


• When progressive scanning mode is selected, no video signal will be output from the VIDEO OUT jack.

# If your TV is compatible with 525p (480p) progressive scanning and you want to enjoy that high quality picture;

You must select the connection Method 2 above and progressive scanning mode. To set the mode, press and hold [PLAY ▶] on the front panel of the player for more than 5 seconds, so that PROGRESSIVE indicator will light up.

#### If your TV is not compatible with progressive scanning;

Use this player in interlace mode. Make sure that PROGRESSIVE indicator is off. If not, press and hold [PLAY ▶] on the front panel of the player for more than 5 seconds, so that PROGRESSIVE indicator will light off.



#### After you have completed connections

• Press the input selector button (usually TV/VIDEO, INPUT or AUX) on your TV to switch an appropriate external input channel (usually near channel 0) for viewing the picture from this player. If the picture does not appear, also refer to the manual accompanying your TV.



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If your TV has Antenna in jack only, it is still possible to connect this player to your TV by using a STEREO AUDIO/VIDEO RF Modulator (commercially available).

- In this case, follow the instructions below.
   Connect the AUDIO/VIDEO output jacks of this player to the AUDIO/VIDEO input jacks of your RF Modulator by audio and video cables.
- The antenna input jack of your TV may have been already occupied. If so, disconnect the RF cable from your TV, and then connect the RF cable to your RF Modulator (usually marked "ANT IN").
- 3) Connect your RF modulator to your TV by another RF cable.
- Set your RF modulator's channel 3/4 switch to either 3 or 4, whichever the TV channel is least used in your area. If your RF modulator has a Modulator/Antenna switch, set it according to your RF modulator's manual.
   Turn on your TV and choose the same channel as you set
- 5) Turn on your TV and choose the same channel as you set the RF modulator's channel 3/4 switch to. For more details, follow the instructions supplied with the RF Modulator.



#### Hint

The quality of picture may become poor if the player is connected to an RF Modulator.

### **Functions**

Operations described in this section are mainly based on the remote control use. Some operations can be carried out on the front panel.

### Playback

Before: Turn on the TV, the Subwoofer, the Wireless rear speaker and other equipment which are connected to the DVD/CD Player. Make sure the TV is set to the correct channel.

#### Normal Playback



- 1 Press [DVD POWER] to turn on the DVD/CD Player.
- Insert a disc with label facing to the left (facing up for horizontal installation).
- ③ Press [PLAY ▶] to start playback.



#### Hint

For playing back an MP3/WMA file, see page 13.

- A "prohibited icon" may appear at the top-right on the TV screen when the operation is prohibited by the disc or this player.
- Some DVDs may start playback from title 2 or 3 due to specific programs.
- During the playback of a two-layered disc, pictures may stop for a moment. This happens while the 1st layer is being switched to the 2nd layer. This is not a malfunction.
- Don't leave the disc exiting halfway from the slot.

#### TIP:

You can change the On-Screen language in "PLAYER MENU" setting. (Refer to pages 17-18.)

#### DVD menu

Some discs contain menus which allow you to customize DVD playback. Use  $[\land / \lor / \lhd / \blacktriangleright]$  to select an item, then press **[ENTER]** (or **[PLAY \triangleright]**), to select.

#### Calling Up a Menu Screen During Playback

- Press [MENU] to call up the DVD menu.
- Press [TOP MENU] to call up the title menu.

#### Hint

 Menu operations may vary depending on the disc. Refer to the manual accompanying the disc for more details.

#### Fast Forward/Reverse Search

#### Hint

 For DVDs, fast forward or reverse search speed is different depending on the disc. Approximate speed is 1(x2), 2(x8), 3(x20), 4(x50) and 5(x100).

For Audio CDs, approximate speed is 1(x2), 2(x8) and 3(x30).
For MP3/WMA, approximate speed is 1(x2), 2(x8) and 3(x30).
