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### safety and usage information

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and ensure peak performance of your mobile phone.



### Keep your phone away from small children and pets

Keep your phone and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

#### Protect your hearing



Listening to a headset at high volumes can damage your hearing. Use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

### Install mobile phones and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile phones or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your phone and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly.

### Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your phone. Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your phone.
- Never dispose of batteries or phones in a fire.
   Follow all local regulations when disposing used batteries or phones.

#### Avoid interference with pacemakers


Maintain a minimum of 15 cm (6 inches) between mobile phones and pacemakers to avoid potential interference, as recommended by manufacturers and the independent research group, Wireless Technology Research. If you have any reason to suspect that your phone is interfering with a pacemaker or other medical device, turn off the phone immediately and contact the manufacturer of the pacemaker or medical device for guidance.

### Turn off the phone in potentially explosive environments

Do not use your phone at refueling points (service stations) or near fuels or chemicals. Turn off your phone whenever directed by warning signs or instructions. Your phone could cause explosions or fire in and around fuel or chemical storage and transfer areas or blasting areas. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts, or accessories.

### Reduce the risk of repetitive motion injuries

When sending text messages or playing games on your phone, hold the phone with a relaxed grip, press the keys lightly, use special features that reduce the number of keys you have to press (such as templates and predictive text), and take frequent breaks.



#### Drive safely at all times

Avoid using your phone while driving and obey all regulations that restrict the use of mobile phones while driving. Use hands-free accessories to increase your safety when possible.

### Follow all safety warnings and regulations

Comply with any regulations that restrict the use of a mobile phone in a certain area.

### Use only Samsung-approved accessories

Using incompatible accessories may damage your phone or cause injury.

### Turn off the phone near medical equipment

Your phone can interfere with medical equipment in hospitals or health care facilities. Follow all regulations, posted warnings, and directions from medical personnel.

### Turn off the phone or disable the wireless functions when in an aircraft

Your phone can cause interference with aircraft equipment. Follow all airline regulations and turn off your phone or switch to a mode that disables the wireless functions when directed by airline personnel.

### Protect batteries and chargers from damage

- Avoid exposing batteries to very cold or very hot temperatures (below 0° C/32° F or above 45° C/ 113° F). Extreme temperatures can reduce the charging capacity and life of your batteries.
- Prevent batteries from contacting metal objects, as this can create a connection between the + and - terminals of your batteries and lead to temporary or permanent battery damage.
- Never use a damaged charger or battery.

### Handle your phone carefully and sensibly


 Do not allow your phone to get wet—liquids can cause serious damage. Do not handle your phone with wet hands. Water damage to your phone can void your manufacturer's warranty.

- Avoid using or storing your phone in dusty, dirty areas to prevent damage to moving parts.
- Your phone is a complex electronic device protect it from impacts and rough handling to avoid serious damage.
- Do not paint your phone, as paint can clog moving parts and prevent proper operation.
- Avoid using the phone's camera flash or light close to the eyes of children or animals.
- Your phone and memory cards may be damaged by exposure to magnetic fields. Do not use carrying cases or accessories with magnetic closures or allow your phone to come in contact with magnetic fields for extended periods of time.

### Avoid interference with other electronic devices

Your phone emits radio frequency (RF) signals that may interfere with unshielded or improperly shielded electronic equipment, such as pacemakers, hearing aids, medical devices, and other electronic devices in homes or vehicles. #### Use your phone in the normal position

Avoid contact with your phone's internal antenna.

### Allow only qualified personnel to service your phone

Allowing unqualified personnel to service your phone may result in damage to your phone and will void your warranty.

### Ensure maximum battery and charger life

- Avoid charging batteries for more than a week, as overcharging may shorten battery life.
- Over time, unused batteries will discharge and must be recharged before use.

- Disconnect chargers from power sources when not in use.

### Handle SIM cards and memory cards with care

- Do not remove a card while the phone is transferring or accessing information, as this could result in loss of data and/or damage to the card or phone.

- Frequent writing and erasing will shorten the life span of memory cards.
- Do not touch gold-coloured contacts or terminals with your fingers or metal objects. If dirty, wipe the card with a soft cloth.

### Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) certification information

Your phone conforms to European Union (EU) standards that limit human exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy emitted by radio and telecommunications equipment. These standards prevent the sale of mobile phones that exceed a maximum exposure level (known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR) of 2.0 watts per kilogram. During testing, the maximum SAR recorded for this model was 0.649 watts per kilogram. In normal use, the actual SAR is likely to be much lower, as the phone has been designed to emit only the RF energy necessary to transmit a signal to the nearest base station. By automatically emitting lower levels when possible, your phone reduces your overall exposure to RF energy.



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

When the auto keypad lock is on, the keys will be locked automatically after the display turns off.

### assembling and preparing your mobile phone

Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.

#### Install the SIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module, or SIM card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.

To install the SIM cards and battery,


1. Remove the battery cover.





If the phone is on, press and hold [-----] to turn it off.


#### 2. Insert the SIM cards.





Place the SIM cards in the phone with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.

3. Insert the battery.



4. Replace the battery cover.



#### Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

- 1. Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the side of the phone.
- 2. Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.





Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.

- 3. Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- 4. When the battery is fully charged (the imit icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
- 5. Unplug the travel adapter from the phone.
- 6. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.


#### About the low battery indicator

When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

#### Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD<sup>™</sup> memory cards up to 8 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).

- 1. Remove the battery cover.
- 2. Unlock the memory card cover.



3. Lift the memory card cover and insert a memory card with the label side facing up.



4. Close and lock the memory card cover.

To remove the memory card, open the memory card cover and remove the memory card out of the memory card slot.

### using basic functions

Learn how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

#### Turn your phone on and off

To turn your phone on,

- 1. Press and hold [---].
- 2. Enter your PIN and press <OK> (if necessary).
- 3. Press <**OK**> and assign names to the new SIM cards.
- 4. Press <Next>.
- Select a primary SIM card and press <Save>.
   To turn your phone off, repeat step 1 above.

#### Switch to the Offline profile

By switching to the Offline profile, you can use your phone's non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as aeroplanes and hospitals.

To switch to the Offline profile, in Menu mode, select Settings  $\rightarrow$  Phone profiles  $\rightarrow$  Offline.



Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where wireless devices are prohibited.

#### Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

- 1. In Idle mode, press < Menu> to access Menu mode.
- 2. Use the navigation key to scroll to a menu or option.

- 3. Press <**Select**>, <**OK**>, or [**OK**] to confirm the highlighted option.
- 4. Press <**Back**> to move up one level; Press [••••] to return to Idle mode.

#### Customise your phone

Get more from your phone by customising it to match your preferences.

#### Adjust the volume of the key tones

In Idle mode, press the Volume key up or down to adjust the key tone volume.

#### Switch to or from the Silent profile

In Idle mode, press and hold [#] to silence or unsilence your phone.

#### Change your ringtone

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles.
- 2. Scroll to the profile you are using.
- 3. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$  Edit  $\rightarrow$  Voice call ringtone.
- 4. Scroll up or down to a ringtone category.
- 5. Select a ringtone.
- 6. Press <Save>.

To switch to another profile, select it from the list.

#### Create a phone profile

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles.
- 2. Press < Options $> \rightarrow$  Create.
- 3. Enter a name for the profile and press [OK].

- 4. Customise the sound settings as desired.
- 5. When you have finished, press <Save>.

#### Select a wallpaper (Idle mode)

- 1. In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → Home screen.
- 2. Scroll left or right to Images.
- Select Wallpaper → an image category → an image.
- 4. Press <Save>.

#### Select a theme for the display

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → My theme.
- 2. Scroll to a theme.
- 3. Press <Save> to apply the theme.

#### Set menu shortcuts

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone settings → Shortcuts.
- 2. Select a key to use as a shortcut.
- 3. Select a menu to assign to the shortcut key.

#### Lock your phone

- 1. In Menu mode, select Settings  $\rightarrow$  Security  $\rightarrow$  Phone  $\rightarrow$  Phone lock.
- 2. Select On.
- 3. Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and press <**OK**>.
- 4. Enter the new password again and press <OK>.

#### Select a primary SIM card

Your phone supports the Dual SIM mode, enabling you to use two SIM cards at the same time without changing them. Activate SIM cards and select a primary SIM card.

- 1. In Idle mode, press [🕀].
- 2. Scroll to the SIM card you want to use.
- 3. Select Default.
- 4. Press <Options $> \rightarrow <$ Save>.

#### Use basic call functions

Learn to make or answer calls and use basic call functions.

#### Make a call

- 1. In Idle mode, enter an area code and a phone number.
- 2. Press [-] to dial the number.
- 3. To end the call, press [-].

#### Answer a call

- 1. When a call comes in, press [-].
- 2. To end the call, press [-].

#### Adjust the volume

To adjust the volume during a call, press the Volume key up or down.

#### Use the speakerphone feature

- 1. During a call, press  $[OK] \rightarrow \langle Yes \rangle$  to activate the speaker.
- 2. To switch back to the earpiece, press [OK] again.

In noisy environment, you may have difficulty hearing the calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better performance, use the normal phone mode.

#### Use the headset

By plugging the supplied headset into the multifunction jack, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press and hold the headset button.
- To answer a call, press and hold the headset button.
- To end a call, press and hold the headset button.

#### Send and view messages

Learn to send and view text (SMS), multimedia (MMS), and email messages.

#### Send a text or multimedia message

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Create new message → Message.
- 2. Enter a destination number and scroll down.
- Enter your message text. ► p. 26
   For sending as a text message, skip to step 8.
   For attaching multimedia, continue with step 4.
- Press < Options> → Add multimedia → an item type.
- 5. Select the item you want to add and press  $\langle Add \rangle$ , or press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Add$ .

- 6. Press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Advanced \rightarrow Add subject.$
- 7. Enter a subject.
- 8. Press <**Options**> → **Send** to send the message.

#### Send an email

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Create new message → Email.
- 2. Enter an email address and scroll down.
- 3. Enter a subject and scroll down.
- 4. Enter your email text.
- Press <Options> → Attach multimedia or Attach organiser and attach a file (if necessary).
- 6. Press  $\langle \text{Options} \rangle \rightarrow \text{Send}$  to send the message.

#### Enter text

When entering text, you can change the text input mode:

- Press and hold [\*] to switch between T9 and ABC modes. Depending on your region, you may be able to access an input mode for your specific language.
- Press [\*] to change case or switch to Number mode.
- Press and hold [#] to switch to Symbol mode.

Enter text in one of the following modes:

Mode	Function
ABC	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key until the character you want appears on the display.
Т9	<ol> <li>Press the appropriate alphanumeric keys to enter an entire word.</li> <li>When the word displays correctly, press [#] to insert a space. If the correct word does not display, select an alternate word from the list that appears.</li> </ol>
Number	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a number.
Symbol	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to select a symbol.

#### View text or multimedia messages

- In Menu mode, select Messages → My messages → Inbox.
- 2. Select a text or multimedia message.

#### View an email

- In Menu mode, select Messages → My messages → Email inbox.
- 2. Press Check new email.
- 3. Select an email or a header.
- If you selected a header, press <Options> → Retrieve to view the body of the email.

#### Add and find contacts

Learn the basics of using the Phonebook feature.

#### Add a new contact

- 1. In Idle mode, enter a phone number and press <**Options**>.
- 2. Select **Save**  $\rightarrow$  a memory location (phone, SIM1, or SIM2)  $\rightarrow$  **New**.
- 3. Select a number type (if necessary).
- 4. Enter contact information.
- Press <Options> → Save to add the contact to memory.

#### Find a contact

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Enter the first few letters of the name you want to find.
- 3. Select the contact's name from the search list.
- Once you have found a contact, you can:
  - call the contact by pressing [---]
  - edit the contact information by pressing [OK]

#### Use basic camera functions

Learn the basics to capture and view photos and videos.

#### Capture photos

1. In Idle mode, press and hold the Camera key to turn on the camera.

- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- 4. Press [OK] or the Camera key to take a photo. The photo is saved automatically.
- Press < >> or the Camera key to take another photo (step 3).

#### View photos

In Menu mode, select My files  $\rightarrow$  Images  $\rightarrow$  My photos  $\rightarrow$  a photo file.

#### Capture videos

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold the Camera key to turn on the camera.
- 2. Press [1] to switch to Recording mode.

- 3. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 4. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- 5. Press [OK] or the Camera key to start recording.
- Press [OK], <[=>, or the Camera key to stop recording. The video is saved automatically.
- Press <>> or the Camera key to record another video (step 4).

#### View videos

In Menu mode, select My files  $\rightarrow$  Videos  $\rightarrow$  My video clips  $\rightarrow$  a video file.

#### Listen to music

Learn how to listen to music via the music player or FM radio.

#### Listen to the FM radio

- 1. Plug the supplied headset into the phone's multifunction jack.
- 2. In Menu mode, select FM radio.
- 3. Press [OK] to turn on the radio.
- Press <**Yes**> to start automatic tuning. The radio scans and saves available stations automatically.
- 5. Scroll up or down to select a radio station.
- 6. To turn off the FM radio, press [OK].

#### Create a playlist and listen to music files

Start by transferring files to your phone or memory card:

- Download from the wireless web.
  - Browse the web
- Receive via Bluetooth. ► p. 40
- Copy to your memory card. ▶ p. 37
   After transferring music files to your phone or memory card,
- 1. In Menu mode, select Music.
- 2. Press  $\langle \text{Options} \rangle \rightarrow \text{Add music from} \rightarrow a$ memory type.
- 3. Select the files you want to include and press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Add$ .
- 4. Press [OK] to begin playback.

5. Control playback using the following keys:

Key	Function
OK	Pause or resume playback
Volume	Adjust the volume up or down
Navigation	<ul> <li>Left: Restart playback; Skip backward (press within 3 seconds); Scan backward in a file (press and hold)</li> </ul>
Navigation	<ul> <li>Right: Skip forward; Scan forward in a file (press and hold)</li> <li>Up: Open the playlist</li> <li>Down: Stop playback</li> </ul>

#### Browse the web

Learn to access and bookmark your favourite web pages.

#### Browse web pages

- In Idle mode, press [OK] → a SIM card (if necessary) to launch your service provider's homepage.
- 2. Navigate web pages using the following keys:

Key	Function
Navigation	Scroll up or down on a web page
OK	Select an item
<back></back>	Return to the previous page
<options></options>	Access a list of browser options

#### Bookmark your favourite web pages

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Browser**  $\rightarrow$  **Bookmarks**.
- 2. Scroll left or right to a SIM card (if necessary).
- 3. Scroll to an empty location and press <**Options**> → Add bookmark.
- 4. Enter a page title and a web address (URL).
- 5. Press [OK].

### using advanced functions

Learn how to perform advanced operations and use additional features of your mobile phone.

#### Use advanced call functions

Learn about your phone's additional calling capabilities.

#### View and dial missed calls

Your phone will display calls you have missed on the display. To dial the number of a missed call,

- 1. Press <View>.
- 2. Scroll to the missed call you want to dial.
- 3. Press [-] to dial.

#### Call a recently dialled number

- In Idle mode, press [-] to display a list of recent numbers.
- 2. Scroll to the number you want and press [---] to dial.

### Hold a call or retrieve a held call

Press <**Hold**> to place a call on hold or press <**Retrieve**> to retrieve a held call.

### Dial a second call

If your network supports this function, you can dial another number during a call:

- 1. Press <Hold> to place the first call on hold.
- 2. Enter the second number to dial and press [--].
- 3. Press <Swap> to switch between the two calls.
- 4. To end the call on hold, press <Options>  $\rightarrow$  End  $\rightarrow$  Held call.
- 5. To end the current call, press [---].

# Answer a second call

If your network supports this function, you can answer a second incoming call:

- Press [-] to answer the second call. The first call is automatically placed on hold.
- 2. Press <Swap> to switch between the calls.

## Make a multiparty call (conference call)

- 1. Call the first party you want to add to the multiparty call.
- While connected to the first party, call the second party. The first party is automatically placed on hold.
- 3. When connected to the second party, press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Conference call.$

- 4. Repeat steps 2 and 3 to add more parties (if necessary).
- 5. To end the multiparty call, press [-.

### Call an international number

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold [0] to insert the + character.
- Enter the complete number you want to dial (country code, area code, and phone number), and then press [-] to dial.

# Call a contact from Phonebook

You can call numbers directly from Phonebook using stored contacts. ► p. 28

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- Scroll to the number you want to dial and press
   [--] to dial.

# Use advanced Phonebook functions

Learn to create namecards, set speed dial numbers, and create groups of contacts.

# Create a namecard

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow My$  namecard.
- 3. Enter your personal details and press <Options>  $\rightarrow$  Save.



You can send your namecard by attaching it to a message or email or transferring it via the Bluetooth wireless feature.

### Set speed dial numbers

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Scroll to a contact to assign to the number.
- 3. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$  Add to speed dial.
- 4. Select a number (if necessary).
