



# Installation, Care, and Service

# Installation

Follow these recommendations and precautions and heed all warnings when installing your TV:

15) Never modify this equipment. Changes or modifications may void: a) the warranty, and b) the user's authority to operate this equipment under the rules of the Federal Communications Commission.

DANGER: RISK OF SERIOUS PERSONAL 16) **INJURY, DEATH, OR EQUIPMENT** 

DAMAGE! Never place the TV on an unstable cart, stand, or table. The TV may fall, causing serious personal injury, death, or serious damage to the TV.



17) Never place or store the TV in direct sunlight; hot, humid areas; areas subject to excessive dust or vibration; or locations with temperatures at or below 41°F (5°C).




- 18) Always place the TV on the floor or a sturdy, level, stable surface that can support the weight of the unit.
- 19) Never place items such as vases, aquariums, or candles on top of the TV.
- 20) Never block or cover the slots or openings in the TV cabinet back, bottom, and sides. Never place the TV:
  - on a bed, sofa, rug, or similar surface;
  - · too close to drapes, curtains, or walls; or
  - in a confined space such as a bookcase, built-in cabinet, or any other place with poor ventilation.

The slots and openings are provided to protect the TV from overheating and to help maintain reliable operation of the TV.



- 21) Never allow anything to rest on or roll over the power cord, and never place the TV where the power cord is subject to wear or abuse.
- 22) Never overload wall outlets and extension cords.






23) Always operate this equipment from a 120 VAC, 60 Hz power source only.



24) Always make sure the antenna system is properly grounded to provide adequate protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges (see Section 810 of the National Electric Code).



# 25) DANGER: RISK OF SERIOUS PERSONAL INJURY OR DEATH!

• Use extreme care to make sure you are never in a position where your body (or any item you are in contact with, such as a ladder or screwdriver) can accidentally touch overhead power lines. Never locate the antenna near overhead power lines or other electrical circuits.



# Care

For better performance and safer operation of your TOSHIBA TV, follow these recommendations and precautions:

- 26) Always sit approximately 10–25 feet away from the TV and as directly in front of it as possible. The picture can appear dull if you sit too far to the left or right of the TV, or if sunlight or room lights reflect on the screen. Turn the TV off to check for reflections on the screen, and then remove the source of reflections while viewing the TV.
- Always unplug the TV before cleaning. Never use liquid or aerosol cleaners.



# WARNING: RISK OF ELECTRIC SHOCK!

Never spill liquids or push objects of any kind into the TV cabinet slots.

- 29) [*This item applies to projection TVs only*.] If the air temperature rises suddenly (for example, when the TV is first delivered), condensation may form on the lenses. This can make the picture appear distorted or the color appear faded. If this happens, turn off the TV for 6 to 7 hours to allow the condensation to evaporate.
- 30) For added protection of your TV from lightning and power surges, always unplug the power cord and disconnect the antenna from the TV if you leave the TV unattended or unused for long periods of time.
- 31) During normal use, the TV may make occasional snapping or popping sounds. This is normal, especially when the unit is being turned on or off. If these sounds become frequent or continuous, unplug the power cord and contact a Toshiba Authorized Service Center.
- 32) Possible Adverse Effects on TV Picture Tube: If a fixed (non-moving) pattern remains on the TV screen for long periods of time, the image can become permanently engrained in the picture tube and cause subtle but permanent ghost images. This type of damage is NOT COVERED BY YOUR WARRANTY. Never leave your TV on for long periods of time while it is displaying the following formats or images:
  - **Fixed Images**, such as PIP/POP windows, stock tickers, video game patterns, TV station logos, and websites.
  - **Special Formats** that do not use the entire screen. For example, viewing letterbox style (16:9) media on a normal (4:3) display (gray bars at top and bottom of screen); or viewing normal style (4:3) media on a widescreen (16:9) display (gray bars on left and right sides of screen).

# Introduction

# Welcome to Toshiba

Congratulations! You have purchased one of the finest projection TVs on the market. The goal of this manual is to guide you through setting up and operating your Toshiba TV as quickly as possible.

This manual applies to models 43H72 and 50H72. Before you start reading, check your model number by looking at the rear of the TV.

Instructions in this manual are based on using the remote control. You can also use the controls on the TV if they have the same name as those on the remote control.

Please read all the safety and operating instructions carefully, and keep the manual for future reference.

# Exploring your new TV

You can operate your TV by using the buttons on the front panel or the remote control. The back panel and front panel (behind the door) provide all the terminal connections you will need to connect other equipment to your TV. See "Connecting your TV" on page 7.


# Note regarding Quick Connect Guide

The Quick Connect Guide

automatically appears on-screen the first time the TV is turned on. This feature provides on-screen instructions to guide you through initial setup of your TV.

To stop the **Quick Connect Guide**, either press EXIT or turn off the TV.

# **Connecting your TV**

Note: Cables are not supplied with your TV.

- Coaxial cable is the cable that comes in from your antenna, cable TV service, or cable converter box. Coaxial cable uses "F" connectors.
- Standard A/V (audio/video) cables usually come in sets of three, and are typically color-coded according to use: yellow for video, red for stereo right audio, and white for stereo left (or mono) audio. On your TV's back panel, the standard A/V inputs are color-coded in the same manner as the cables.
- S-Video cable is for use with video equipment that has an S-Video input.
- **Component video cables** come in sets of three, and are for use with video equipment that has component video inputs. (ColorStream<sup>®</sup> is Toshiba's brand of component video.)

# NOTE REGARDING PICTURE QUALITY

When connecting video equipment to your Toshiba TV:


- For GOOD picture quality: Use a standard yellow video cable.
- For BETTER picture quality: If your equipment has an S-video input, use an S-video cable instead of a standard yellow video cable. (You still must connect the standard red and white audio cables for full system connection, but do not connect the standard yellow video cable at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.)
- For BEST picture quality: If your equipment has component video inputs, use component video cables instead of a standard video or S-video cable. (You still must connect the standard red and white audio cables for full system connection, but do not connect the standard yellow video cable or an S-Video cable at the same time.)


# Connecting a VCR

This connection allows you to watch local channels and video programs, play or record on the VCR while watching TV, and record from one channel while watching another channel.

You will need:

- one coaxial cable
- one pair of audio cables (one single audio cable for a mono VCR)
- one video cable (one S-video cable for an S-VHS VCR)





CAUTION: Do not plug in any power cords until you have finished connecting all equipment.

#### Note:

If you have a mono VCR, connect L/Mono to VCR Audio OUT using only one audio cable.

If vou have an S-VHS VCR. use an S-video cable (in the S-video jacks) instead of the regular video cable.

Do not connect a regular video cable and an S-video cable to Video-1 at the same time.


# Connecting a cable converter box

This connection allows you to watch basic and premium cable channels.

To use the TV's features, select ANT-1. To view premium channels, select ANT-2, tune the TV to channel 3 or 4 (whichever channel is vacant in your area), and use the converter box to change channels. You will need:




# Connecting a cable converter box and VCR

This connection allows you to watch and record basic and premium cable channels, watch videotapes, and record one channel while watching another channel. To use the TV's features, select ANT-1. To view premium channels or record with the VCR, select ANT-2, tune the TV to channel 3 or 4 (whichever channel is vacant in your area), and use the converter box to change channels.

You will need:

- two coaxial cables
- one pair of audio cables (one single audio cable for a mono VCR)
- one video cable (one S-video cable for an S-VHS VCR)

#### Note:

When you use a converter box with your TV, the remote control will not operate some features, such as programming your favorite channels, labeling channels, and locking channels.

#### Note:

If you have a mono VCR, connect L/Mono to VCR Audio OUT using only one audio cable.

If you have an S-VHS VCR, use an S-video cable (in the S-video jacks) instead of a regular video cable. Do not connect a regular video cable and an S-video cable to Video-1 (or Video-2) at the same time.

When you use a converter box with your TV, the remote control will not operate some features, such as programming your favorite channels, labeling channels, and locking channels.



# Connecting a DVD player or satellite receiver and a VCR

This connection allows you to watch DVD/satellite, VCR, and TV programs, and record one TV channel while watching another channel.

You will need:

- one coaxial cable
- two pairs of audio cables (one single and one pair of audio cables for a mono VCR)
- one video cable (between the TV and VCR)
- one S-video cable (between the TV and DVD player/satellite receiver)



# Note:

For the highest possible picture quality from a non-ColorStream DVD player/satellite receiver, you must use an S-video cable between the TV and DVD player/satellite receiver. (If your DVD player or satellite receiver is ColorStream-compatible, see page 10).

Do not connect both an S-video cable and a regular video cable between the TV and DVD player/satellite receiver at the same time. Doing so will distort the picture.

Do not connect the DVD player/satellite receiver and VCR to the same video channel on the TV. (See the illustrations, which show the DVD player/satellite receiver connected to Video-1 on the TV and the VCR connected to Video-2 on the TV.)

# Connecting a DVD player with ColorStream<sup>®</sup> (component video) and a VCR


This connection allows you to watch DVD, VCR, and TV programs, and record TV programs.

Your TV has ColorStream<sup>®</sup> (component video) inputs. Connecting your TV to a DVD player with component video inputs (such as a Toshiba DVD player with ColorStream<sup>®</sup>) can greatly enhance picture quality and realism.

- -To record one TV program while watching another TV program, tune the VCR to the channel to record, and tune the TV to the channel to watch.
- -To record a TV program while watching a DVD, tune the VCR to the channel to record, and select ColorStream HD1 on the TV (see "Selecting the antenna input" on page 20).

You will need:

- one coaxial cable
- three pairs of audio cables (two single and one pair of audio cables for a mono VCR)
- two video cables
- one set of component video cables (one S-video cable for a DVD player without component video inputs; see notes at right)

#### Note:

For the highest possible picture quality, use component video cables between the TV and DVD player. You can connect the component video cables from the DVD player to either ColorStream jack on the TV (HD1 or HD2).

The ColorStream HD1 and HD2 jacks can be used with Progressive (480p) and Interlace (480i, 1080i) scan systems.

If your DVD player does not have component video inputs, use the S-video connections (plus the standard audio connections) instead of the ColorStream connections; however, do <u>not</u> connect <u>both</u> S-Video and standard video cables between the TV and DVD player at the same time.

# Connecting your TV

This connection allows you to watch DTV (digital TV), VCR, and TV programs, and record DTV and TV programs.

Your TV has ColorStream (component video) inputs. Connecting your TV to a DTV receiver with component video inputs can greatly enhance picture quality and realism.

- -To record and watch a DTV program, select LINE IN on the VCR, and select ColorStream HD2 (or VIDEO 1 for a non-ColorStream connection) on the TV (see "Selecting the antenna input" on page 20).
- -To record a TV program while watching a DTV program, tune the VCR to the channel to record, and select ColorStream HD2 on the TV.
- -To record and watch the same TV program, tune the VCR to the channel to record, and select VIDEO 1 on the TV.
- -To record one TV program while watching another TV program, tune the VCR to the channel to record, and tune the TV to the channel to watch.

You will need:

- one coaxial cable
- three pairs of audio cables (two single and one pair of audio cables for a mono VCR)
- two video cables
- one set of component video cables (one S-video cable for a DTV receiver without component video; see notes at right)


#### Note:

For the highest possible picture quality, use component video cables between the TV and DTV receiver. You can connect the component cables from the DTV receiver to either ColorStream jack on the TV (HD1 or HD2).

The ColorStream HD1 and HD2 jacks can be used with Progressive (480p) and Interlace (480i, 1080i) scan systems.

If your DTV receiver does not have component video inputs, use the S-video and standard audio connections instead of the ColorStream connections. Do <u>not</u> connect <u>both</u> an S-video and a standard video cable between the TV and DTV receiver at the same time.

To monitor recording, set the TV to VIDEO 1.




# **Connecting two VCRs**

This connection allows you to record (dub/edit) from one VCR to another VCR while watching a videotape. You can also record from one TV channel while watching another TV channel.

You will need:

- one coaxial cable
- two pairs of audio cables (two single audio cables for mono VCRs)
- two video cables (two S-video cables for S-VHS VCRs)



# Note:

If you have S-VHS VCRs, use S-video cables instead of standard video cables for better picture performance. Do not connect <u>both</u> a standard video cable and an S-video cable to Video-1 (or Video-2) at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

Do not connect the same VCR to the output and input jacks on the TV at the same time.

To dub or edit, VCR 2 must select Line IN, and the TV must select VIDEO 1 (see "Selecting the antenna input" on page 20).

- \* The Video OUT jack does not output the PIP picture.
- \*\* The Audio OUT jacks can output the sound of either the Main or PIP picture (see "Selecting the Audio OUT sound" on page 48).



If you have an S-VHS camcorder, use an S-video cable between the S-video jacks on the camcorder and TV instead of a standard video cable. Do not connect <u>both</u> a standard video cable and an S-video cable at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

# **Connecting an audio system**

This connection allows you to use an audio amplifier to adjust the audio level. This also allows you to use external speakers.

To control the audio, turn on the TV and the stereo amplifier, and turn off the built-in speakers (see "Turning off the built-in speakers" on page 48).

You will need:

• one pair of audio cables

## Note:

To hear sound when using an external audio amplifier, the volume of both the TV and the amplifier must be set above 0 (zero).

For example, if the volume of the TV is set to 0, you will not be able to hear any sound, even the volume of the amplifier is at its highest level.


# Connecting an A/V receiver

This connection allows you to use an audio/video (A/V) receiver to enhance your TV's sound.

If you have a system with Dolby Pro Logic® surround sound, you can add to the realism of the sound by using the TV's internal speakers as center channel speakers.

You will need:

- one pair of audio cables
- one single audio cable for the audio center channel
- one video cable



#### Note:

Refer to the instructions provided with your A/V receiver for details about your surround sound system.

When the Audio Center Channel ON/OFF switch is in the ON position, the TV speakers will function only as center channel speakers. At this time, the SBS feature should be set OFF. See page 47.


Adjust the volume for the center channel speakers using the center level control on the A/V receiver.

To use the TV speakers as normal speakers, set the Audio Center Channel ON/OFF switch to the OFF position.

# Using the remote control

# Preparing the remote control for use


With the remote control, you can operate your TV, most VCR models, and cable TV converters together, even if they are different brands. If you will be using your TV with a Toshiba VCR, your remote control is already programmed and ready to use. If you own different brands of VCRs and/or converters, you first have to program your remote control. (See "Programming the remote control for use with a VCR or a cable TV converter" on page 15.)

# Installing the remote control batteries

To install the batteries:

1. Slide the battery cover off the back of the remote control.

2. Install two "AA" size alkaline batteries. Match the + and - signs on the batteries to the signs on the battery compartment.



3. Slide the battery cover back on to the remote control until the lock snaps.

# Using the remote control with a VCR or a cable TV converter

To control a Toshiba VCR:

Set the TV/CABLE/VCR switch to the VCR position. The buttons shown at right will then control the VCR. The unshaded buttons will operate the TV as usual.

If you own different brands of VCRs, program the remote control to recognize the brand of your VCR. (See "Programming the remote control for use with a VCR or a cable TV converter" on page 15.)

# Note:

Your TV's remote control may not operate certain features on your VCR, cable TV converter, or other electronic device.

Refer to the owner's manuals for your other devices to determine their available features.


If your TV's remote control does not operate a specific feature on a device, use the remote control that came with the device.

#### Caution:

- Dispose of batteries in a designated disposal area. Do not throw batteries into a fire.
- Do not mix battery types or combine used batteries with new ones.
- If the batteries are dead or if you will not use the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries to prevent battery acid from leaking into the battery compartment.

#### Note:

Battery life expectancy is about one year with normal use.



Introductio

To control a cable TV converter:

Program the remote control to recognize the brand of your converter. The shaded buttons shown at right will control the cable TV converter.

Set the TV/CABLE/VCR switch to the CABLE position.

# **Programming the remote control for use with a VCR or a cable TV converter**

This remote control is pre-programmed to operate Toshiba VCRs. To use VCRs or cable converters other than Toshiba models, you must follow the steps below before you operate your remote control.

1. Refer to the "VCR code table" or "Cable TV converter code table" on pages 16-17 to find the number that corresponds to the brand name of your VCR or converter.

If more than one number is listed, try each one separately until you find the one that works.

- 2. If you are reprogramming the remote control to operate your:
  - VCR, set the TV/CABLE/VCR switch on the remote control to VCR.
  - Cable converter, set the TV/CABLE/VCR switch on the remote control to CABLE.
- 3. While holding down the RECALL button, press the Number buttons (0-9) to enter the three-digit code of your brand of VCR or converter.
- 4. Point the remote control at the VCR or converter and press POWER to test the code.


If the VCR or converter turns on, you have entered the correct code.

If the VCR or converter does not respond to the remote control, you may have entered the wrong code. Repeat steps 1-4 with another code.

5. Reset the TV/CABLE/VCR switch to TV to control the TV.

# Note:

- Each time you replace the batteries, you must reprogram the remote control.
- Some newer VCRs are capable of working on either of two remote codes. These VCRs have a switch labeled "VCR1/VCR2."

If your VCR has this kind of switch, it may not respond to any of the code numbers for your VCR brand name. In this case, set the switch to the other position (VCR1 or VCR2) and reprogram the remote control.


# Adjusting the color convergence



- 2. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\triangledown$  to highlight CONVERGENCE (below left).





# Switching between two channels using Channel Return

The Channel Return feature allows you to switch between two channels without entering an actual channel number each time.



# Switching between two channels using **Advanced Channel Return**

The Advanced Channel Return feature temporarily "memorizes" one channel in the CH RTN button, so you can return to that channel quickly from any other channel by pressing CH RTN.

To memorize a channel in the CH RTN button:

- 1. Select the channel you want to program into the CH RTN button.
- 2. Press and hold CH RTN for about 2 seconds until the message "Channel Memorized" appears (flashing) on the screen. The channel has been programmed into the CH RTN button.






# Watching PIP/double-window


# Locking video inputs


You can choose your saved preferences by selecting PREFERENCE (see "Selecting the picture mode" on page 39).

# Using the flesh tone feature

This feature displays natural flesh tones by correcting the tint.

To turn on the flesh tone feature:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the PICTURE menu appears.
- 2. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  to highlight FLESH TONE.
- 3. Press  $\blacktriangleleft$  or  $\blacktriangleright$  to highlight ON.




# Using the Digital Noise Reduction (DNR) feature

This feature allows you to reduce visible interference in your TV picture. This is useful when receiving a broadcast with a weak signal or playing back a video cassette or disc damaged by repeated use.

To turn on the DNR feature:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ► until the PICTURE menu appears.
- 2. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacksquare$  to highlight DNR.
- 3. Press  $\blacktriangleleft$  or  $\blacktriangleright$  to highlight AUTO.




To turn off the DNR feature: Highlight OFF in step 3 above.

## Selecting the color temperature


You can change the quality of the picture by selecting from three preset color temperatures: cool, medium, and warm.

To select the color temperature:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the PICTURE menu appears.
- 2. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\triangledown$  to highlight COLOR TEMPERATURE.



#### Selecting the cinema mode

When you view a DVD movie (3-2 pulldown processed) from a DVD player connected to the ColorStream (component video) inputs on the TV, smoother and more natural motion can be obtained by setting the CINEMA MODE to FILM (auto).

To set the CINEMA MODE to FILM (auto):

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the THEATER menu appears.
- 2. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\triangledown$  to highlight CINEMA MODE.
- 3. Press  $\blacktriangleleft$  or  $\blacktriangleright$  to select FILM (auto).



To set the CINEMA MODE to VIDEO (off): Press ◀ or ► to select VIDEO in step 3 above.

# Selecting the video input source

Press TV/VIDEO button on the remote control or the TV to view a signal coming from another device connected to your TV, such as a VCR or video disc player (see illustrations below). Pressing TV/VIDEO on the TV




The closed caption feature has two options:

- Captions—An on-screen display of the dialogue, narration, and sound effects of TV programs and videos that are closed captioned (usually marked as "CC" in TV listings).
- Text—An on-screen display of information not related to the current program, such as weather or stock data (when provided by individual stations).

To view captions or text:

- 1. Tune the TV to the desired program.
- 2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ► until the CUSTOM menu appears.
- 3. Press  $\mathbf{\nabla}$  or  $\mathbf{A}$  to highlight CC.




- Press ◀ or ► to highlight the desired closed caption mode, as follows:
- To view captions, highlight C1, C2, C3, or C4 (C1 displays translation of the primary language in your area).

**Note:** If the program or video you selected is not closed captioned, no captions will display on the screen.




• To view text, highlight T1, T2, T3, or T4.

**Note:** If text is not available in your area, a black rectangle may appear on your screen. If this happens, turn the Closed Caption feature OFF.



To turn off the Closed Caption feature: Highlight OFF in step 4.

- when a videotape has been dubbed
- when the signal reception is weak
- when the signal reception is nonstandard


# Setting the sleep timer

To set the sleep timer to turn the TV off automatically:






# **Setting the clock**

To set the clock:

Using the TV's Features

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.

- 3. After the number position starts to blink, press the Number buttons (0-9) to enter the correct time. The clock operates on a 12-hour cycle.

# Muting the sound

Press MUTE to temporarily reduce (1/2 MUTE) or turn off (MUTE) the sound. While the sound is off, the screen will display "1/2 MUTE" or "MUTE" in the lower right corner. Every time you press the button, the mute mode will change in the following order.

 $\rightarrow$  Normal  $\rightarrow$  1/2 MUTE  $\rightarrow$  MUTE -

When you press MUTE, the closed caption feature is automatically activated. To deactivate this feature, press MUTE again. This feature works only when the closed caption mode is set to OFF. See "Using the closed caption feature" on page 43 for more information.

## Selecting stereo/SAP broadcasts

The multi-channel TV sound (MTS) feature allows you to listen to high-fidelity stereo sound while watching TV. MTS can also transmit a second audio program (SAP) containing a second language, music, or other audio information (when provided by individual stations).

When the TV receives a stereo or SAP broadcast, the word STEREO or SAP appears on-screen every time the TV is turned on, the channel is changed, or the RECALL button is pressed.

The MTS feature is not available when the TV is in VIDEO mode. To listen to stereo sound:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ► until the AUDIO menu appears.
- 2. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  to highlight MTS.
- 3. Press  $\blacktriangleleft$  or  $\blacktriangleright$  to highlight STEREO.




You can leave your TV in STEREO mode because it will automatically output the type of sound being broadcast (stereo or monaural). The word "STEREO" or "SAP" displays in yellow in the menu when the TV receives the signal.

If the stereo sound is noisy, select MONO to reduce the noise.

To listen to SAP (if available):

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.
- 2. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  to highlight MTS.
- 3. Press ◀ or ► to highlight SAP. You will hear the station's second audio program (if available) from the speakers, while viewing the original program's picture (see note at right).



#### Note :

A second audio program (SAP) can be heard only on those TV stations that offer it.

For example, a station might broadcast music as a second audio program. If you have SAP on, you will see the current program on the screen but hear music instead of the program's normal audio.

However, if you have SAP on, and the station you are watching is not currently broadcasting a second audio program, you will see the picture but not hear any sound. If this happens, put the TV in STEREO mode so

you can hear the station's normal audio.



# Using the SRS 3D surround sound feature

The SRS 3D surround sound feature expands the audio listening field wider and deeper to create exceptional sound quality from the TV's speakers. The feature uses stereo signals from a TV broadcast or video input.

To turn on the SRS 3D surround:

- 1. Select STEREO mode (see "Selecting stereo/SAP broadcasts" on page 45).
- 2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ► until the THEATER menu appears.
- 3. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  to highlight SRS 3D.
- 4. Press  $\blacktriangleleft$  or  $\blacktriangleright$  to highlight ON.



To turn off the SRS 3D surround:

Highlight OFF in step 4 above.


In general, you can leave SRS 3D in ON mode because it will automatically output the type of sound being broadcast (surround stereo or monaural).

## Adjusting the sound quality

You can change the quality of your TV's sound by adjusting the bass, treble, and balance.

To adjust the sound quality:



- < makes the sound quality weaker or decreases the balance in the right channel, depending on the item selected.
- The makes the sound quality stronger or decreases the balance in the left channel, depending on the item selected.

If the broadcast is monaural, the SRS 3D effect does not work.

The RESET function returns the audio adjustments to the following factory settings:

Bass ..... center (50) Treble ..... center (50) Balance ..... center (0)

To reset the audio adjustments:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ► until the AUDIO menu appears.
- 2. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  to highlight RESET.
- 3. Press ◀ or ►. The menu displays "DONE".



## Using the sub-bass system (SBS)

The sub-bass system allows you to enhance bass performance, even when the volume is low.

To turn on the SBS:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.
- 2. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  to highlight SBS.
- 3. Press  $\blacktriangleleft$  or  $\triangleright$  to highlight ON.




To adjust the SBS level:

- 4. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  to highlight SBS LEVEL.
- 5. Press  $\blacktriangleleft$  or  $\blacktriangleright$  to adjust the SBS level.



To turn off the SBS:

Highlight OFF in step 3 above.



#### Note:


The SBS signal does not pass through the "Variable Audio OUT" jacks (see "Connecting an audio system" on page 13); however, the AUDIO menu will appear when the buttons are pressed.

## Turning off the built-in speakers

Use this feature to turn the TV speakers off when you connect an audio system (see "Connecting an audio system" on page 13).

To turn off the built-in speakers:

- 1. Press MENU, then press ◀ or ▶ until AUDIO menu appears.
- 2. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  to highlight SPEAKERS.
- 3. Press  $\blacktriangleleft$  or  $\blacktriangleright$  to highlight OFF.



To turn on the built-in speakers:

Highlight ON in step 3 above.

#### Selecting the Audio OUT sound

This feature allows you to select the sound source (MAIN or PIP) that is output from the Audio OUT jacks. (See "Connecting two VCRs" on page 12.)

This is useful when amplifying or recording the PIP/double-window sound with external equipment while hearing the sound of the main picture through the built-in speakers.

To select the Audio OUT sound:


- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.
- 2. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacksquare$  to highlight AUDIO OUT.

- MAIN: Outputs the sound of the main program.
- PIP : Outputs the sound of the PIP/double-window program.

Make sure the volume control of your audio amplifier is set to a moderate listening level.



# Using the StableSound® feature


When the signal source is changed, the StableSound feature limits the highest volume level to prevent extreme changes in volume (for example, to prevent the sudden increase in volume that often happens when a TV program switches to a commercial).

To turn on the StableSound feature:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.
- 2. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacksquare$  to highlight STABLE SOUND.
- 3. Press  $\blacktriangleleft$  or  $\blacktriangleright$  to select ON.



To turn off the StableSound feature: Highlight OFF in step 3 above.







To start the demo: Press and hold MENU on the TV front panel for 4 seconds. To stop the demo: Press RECALL, EXIT, or POWER.

### Viewing the demo mode on model 50H72

To start the demo: Press DEMO on the TV front panel. To stop the demo:

Press DEMO again.

# Understanding the auto power off feature

The TV will automatically turn itself off after approximately 15 minutes if it is tuned to a vacant channel or a station that completes its broadcast for the day. This feature does not work in VIDEO mode.

# Understanding the last mode memory feature

If the power is cut off while you are viewing the TV, the Last Mode Memory feature turns the TV on automatically when the power is resupplied.

If the power is going to be off for a long time and you are going to be away from your TV, unplug the power cord to prevent the TV from turning on in your absence.
