





Plug and Play Capability

You can install the monitor in any Plug and Play-compatible system. The monitor automatically provides the computer system with its Extended Display Identification Data (EDID) using Display Data Channel (DDC) protocols so that the system can configure itself and optimize the monitor settings. If required, the user can select different settings, but in most cases monitor installation is automatic.

During the LCD Monitor manufacturing process, it is not uncommon for one or more pixels to become fixed in an unchanging state. The visible result is a fixed pixel that appears as an extremely tiny dark or bright discolored spot. When the pixel remains permanently lit, it is known as a "bright dot." When the pixel remains black, it is known as a "dark dot." In almost every case, these fixed pixels are hard to see and do not detract from display quality or usability. A display with 1 to 5 fixed pixels is considered normal and within competitive standards. For more information, see Dell Support site at: support.dell.com.

 To help maintain the best image quality on your monitor, use a dynamically changing screen saver and turn off your monitor when not in use.



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



Self-Test

Your monitor provides a self-test feature that allows you to check whether your monitor is functioning properly. If your monitor and computer are properly connected but the monitor screen remains dark, run the monitor self-test by performing the following steps:

Turn off both your computer and the monitor. Unplug the video cable from the back of the computer. To ensure proper Self-Test operation, remove the Analog (blue connector) cable from the back of computer.

3. Turn on the monitor

The floating dialog box should appear on-screen (against a black background) if the monitor cannot sense a video signal and is working correctly. While in self-test mode, the power LED remains white. Also, the dialog shown below will continuously scroll through the screen.



This box also appears during normal system operation, if the video cable becomes disconnected or damaged. 4. 5.

Turn off your monitor and reconnect the video cable; then turn on both your computer and the monitor

If your monitor screen remains blank after you have performed Step 5, check your video controller and computer system.


Built-in Diagnostics

Your monitor has a built-in diagnostic tool that helps you determine if the screen abnormality you are experiencing is an inherent problem with your monitor, or with your computer and video card.

MOTE: You can run the built-in diagnostics only when the video cable is unplugged and the monitor is in self-test mode.

To run the built-in diagnostics:

- Ensure that the screen is clean (no dust particles on the surface of the screen).
- Unplug the video cable(s) from the back of the computer or monitor. The monitor then goes into the self-test mode. On the front panel, press and hold the *shortcut button* 1 and *shortcut button* 4 keys on the front panel, simultaneously for 2 seconds. A gray screen 2. 3. appears.



- Carefully inspect the screen for abnormalities.
 Press the *shortcut button 4* key on the front panel again. The color of the screen changes to red.
 Inspect the display for any abnormalities.
 Repeat steps 5 and 6 to inspect the display in green, blue, and white colored screens.

The test is complete when the white screen appears. To exit, press the shortcut button 4 again.

If you do not detect any screen abnormalities upon using the built-in diagnostic tool, the monitor is functioning properly. Check the video card and computer.
