





Titles, Chapters and Tracks

- DVDs are divided into "titles" and "chapters". If the disc
 has more than one movie on it, each movie would be a
 separate "title". "Chapters" are sections of titles.
- Audio CDs are divided into "tracks". A "track" is usually one song on an Audio CD.



Note: Numbers identify each title, chapter, and track on a disc. Most discs have these numbers recorded on them, but some do not.

REMOTE CONTROL

Using the Remote Control

- This remote control is magnetic and can be attached to most refrigerators. Some refrigerators panels
 are not metallic. In this case, try attaching the magnetic remote control to the side of the refrigerator.
- · Point the remote control at the REMOTE SENSOR located on the unit.
- When there is a strong ambient light source, the performance of the infrared REMOTE SENSOR may
 be degraded, causing unreliable operation.
- The recommended effective distance for remote operation is about 16 feet (5 meters).

To Install Batteries

1. Open the battery door.



2. Insert two AAA batteries.



Battery Replacement


When the batteries become weak, the operating distance of the remote control is greatly reduced and you will need to replace them.

Caution: Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent type.

- Do not place the remote control near magnetic devices or magnetic cards.
- If the remote control is not going to be used for a long time, remove the batteries to avoid corrosion damage caused by battery leakage.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Do not mix ALKALINE, standard (CARBON-ZINC) or rechargeable (NICKEL-CADMIUM) batteries.
- · Always remove batteries as soon as they become weak.
- · Weak batteries can leak and severely damage the remote control.

1) FUNCTION Button

Use to select DVD, TV or RADIO mode.

2) PICTURE Button

Selects from preset screen display settings to match the type of show you are watching.

3) MEMORY Button

Sets title/chapter in a favorite order. Enter the number of a selected station.

4) EXIT/RETURN 🔊 Button

Press to exit the TV menu and return directly to normal viewing.

5) DVD MENU Button

Press to enter the main menu of the DVD you are watching.

6) VOLUME (+/-) Buttons

Adjusts the volume.

← : Fast reverse playback.

▶ : Fast forward playback.

◄ TUNING ► : Scans all available radio stations.

8) ► PREV Button

Selects previous titles, chapters or tracks on a disc.

9) ANGLE Button

During DVD playback, switch the camera angle of the video presentation when scenes with multiple camera angles are recorded on a DVD.

10) GOTO Button

Goes directly to a location on a DVD/CD.

11) AUDIO Button

Selects audio soundtracks of a DVD or change the output mode of a CD.


Press to select MONO sound, STEREO sound or Secondary Audio Program (SAP).

12) FORMAT Button

Press to select the picture format.

13) STANDBY/ON Button

Turns on the unit and puts it in standby mode.

15) LAST CH Button

Press to switch repeatedly between the last two channels displayed.

17) CURSOR (**△**, **▼**, **◄**, **▶**) Buttons

Use to highlight selections on a screen and make adjustments to certain settings.

▲ CH+ / ▼ CH- buttons

Use to change TV channels.

ENTER Button

Confirm selections on a menu screen.

Press to turn off the sound.

19) ■ STOP/BAND Button

Stops playback.



Use to enter the sub-menu and confirm selections in TV mode.

MOUNTING INSTRUCTIONS

TOOLS NEEDED: 1) Electric drill with 1/4" bit; 2) Phillips-head (cross style) screwdriver.


STEP '

If your cabinet does NOT have an overhang:

a) Place the Mounting Template in the desired location inside or underneath the cabinet (whichever has less obstructions, and will be easier for you to reach to drill holes), flush with the front edge of the cabinet and tape it down. Go to STEP 2.

If your cabinet DOES have an overhang:

 a) Measure the thickness of the cabinet overhang (see Figure 1).



- b) Fold the Mounting Template along the guideline that is closest to the thickness of your cabinet overhang.
- c) Tape Mounting Template to the underside of the cabinet with the folded portion of the Mounting Template flush up against the cabinet overhang (see Figure 2). Go to STEP 2.




STEP 2

Use an electric drill with a ¼" drill bit (not included) to drill all four holes marked on the Mounting Template (see Figure 3). To reduce splintering, place a small piece of masking tape over each hole location before drilling. Go to **STEP 3.**



STEP 3

If your cabinet does **NOT** have an overhang:

- a) Eight screws are included with this unit, but you will only need four of them. Select the screw length which will go completely through your cabinet bottom, and provide at least 3/8" of thread to screw into the main unit.
- b) Insert the four selected screws through each hole from the inside of the cabinet going down (see Figure 4).



- c) Hold the unit up against the bottom of the cabinet, and align the four holes on the top of the unit with the screws. Partially tighten each screw, but do not fully tighten the screws until all of them have been started.
- d) Gently tighten each screw until they are firmly holding the unit in place.

If your cabinet **DOES** have an overhang:

- a) Eight screws are included with this unit, but you will only need four of them. Select the screw length which will go completely through your cabinet bottom, and extend at least 3/8" past the bottom of your cabinet overhang.
- b) This unit includes three sets of four spacers of various lengths. The spacers can be put together to form longer spacers to accommodate various cabinet overhang thicknesses. Determine the best combination of spacers which is equal to or longer than the cabinet overhang thickness.

 c) Insert the four selected screws through each hole from the inside of the cabinet going down (see Figure 5).




d) Hold each screw head down and push the unit and spacers onto the screws, then hold the unit up until spacers are firmly against the bottom of the cabinet (and fully nested within each other if you are using multiple spacers for each screw). e) Partially tighten each screw, but do not fully tighten the screws until all of them have been started (see Figure 6).



f) Gently tighten each screw until they are firmly holding the unit in place. The top front edge of the unit should clear the overhang.


MOUNTING SUGGESTIONS

- If your cabinet has obstructions inside it which prevent you from using the template, cut out the corresponding area on the template, but do NOT cut out or through the screw holes.
- If your cabinet has obstructions underneath it, which will interfere with the mounting of the unit, remove the obstruction before mounting the unit, or find another location to mount the unit.
- 3) It is recommended that you wear safety glasses while drilling to prevent eye injuries.
- 4) For wood cabinets, you may want to mark the hole locations with a nail, pressed gently but firmly into the wood so that a slight impression is made. This will also help keep the drill bit centered in the right location.
- 5) Hold the drill firmly against the cabinet to keep the drill from "walking".


Connecting the TV Antenna

Connect a TV antenna or CATV cable or Satellite system to the TV antenna terminal.




Connecting the Unit to a TV or other Video Equipment

Use the Audio/Video cable (not supplied). Connect the VIDEO OUT and R/L (right/left) AUDIO OUT jacks on the rear of the unit to the VIDEO IN and R/L (right/left) jacks on your TV or other video equipment.



Connecting the Unit to a Stereo Receiver or Amplifier ANALOG CONNECTION

Use the Audio cable (not supplied). Connect the R (right) AUDIO OUT and L (left) AUDIO OUT jacks on the rear of the unit to the R (right) AUDIO IN and L (left) AUDIO IN jacks on your other source.





Plugging in the Unit

Plug the AC power cord into the wall outlet


- a) Before plugging in the power cord, make sure the voltage of the unit matches your local voltage.
- b) Plug the power cord directly into the nearest wall outlet, and wrap the remaining cord around the cord storage knob at the rear of the unit.

UNIT OPERATION

Turning the Unit On

While the power cord is connected and the unit is on standby, power will be consumed and only the clock display will flash.

Press the **OPOWER** button to turn the unit on and the DVD indicator lights up.
 After a short period of time, "DVD" will appear on the front display and the DVD logo (start-up picture) will appear on the screen.



Press the DVD/TV/RADIO button (the FUNCTION button on the remote control) to TV mode and the TV indicator lights up.

After a short period of time, "TV" will appear on the front panel display and the TV program will begin on the screen.



 Press the DVD/TV/RADIO button (the FUNCTION button on the remote control) to RADIO mode and the radio indicator lights up.

After a short period of time, "TUNER" and the FM frequency will appear on the front panel display.



SOUND SYSTEM

Dolby Digital (for DVD)

Dolby Digital is a technology developed by Dolby Laboratories. Soundtracks encoded in Dolby Digital can reproduce from one to 5.1 discrete channels of excellent quality audio.

The unit automatically recognizes the Dolby Digital bitstream and provides a downmix suitable for twochannel listening. An additional Dolby Digital decoder is required for reproduction of the discrete multichannel soundtracks available on many DVDs.

SETTING THE CLOCK

To adjust the clock, the unit must be in standby mode. To enter standby mode, make sure that the unit is plugged in, but not turned on.

- Check that the rated voltage of the unit matches your local voltage.
- When the AC power cord is plugged in, the clock display will blink.




Press the SET CLOCK button until the HOUR blinks



 Press the I◄◄ / ►►I buttons to set the current hours then press the SET CLOCK button once to confirm. Then, the MINUTE blinks.




 Press the ■◀ / ▶▶■ buttons to set the current minutes then press the SET CLOCK button once to start the clock.




SETTING THE COOKING TIMER

1. Press the **TIMER** button. The "TIMER" indicator appears and the cooking time "10" blinks.



- Press the I◄◄ / ►►I buttons to select your desired time from 1-99 minutes.
 - Press the TIMER button repeatedly to select time: 10, 15, 30, 45, 60, 75, 90 minutes.
 - Press and hold the I◄◄ / ▶▶I buttons to fast forward/reverse the cooking time.





 To turn OFF the ALARM, press the TIMER button once. Otherwise, the ALARM will automatically turn off after 60 minutes if no button is pressed.

CANCELLING THE COOKING TIMER

 Press the TIMER button until the time of the cooking timer shows "OFF". The "TIMER" indicator will disappear.


PLAYING A DISC

This owner's manual explains the basic instructions of this unit. Some DVDs are produced in a manner that allows specific or limited operation during playback. Such as, the unit may not respond to all operating commands. This is not a defect in the unit. Refer to the instruction notes of discs.

" \otimes" may appear on the screen during operation. A " \otimes" means that the desired operation is not permitted by the unit or disc.

Playing a Disc

- 1. Press the **O POWER** button to turn on the unit.
- Press the DVD/TV/RADIO button (the FUNCTION button on the remote) to select DVD mode.
 See CUSTOMIZING THE FUNCTION SETTINGS (page 22 to 23) before proceeding to step 3.
- 3. Press the ▲ OPEN/CLOSE button. The disc tray opens.
- 4. Place a disc onto the disc tray with the label side up.
- Press the ▲ OPEN/CLOSE button. The disc tray closes.
 It takes a short while for your unit to load the disc. After loading, the unit will automatically either bring you to the main menu of the DVD or start playback of the disc.
- 6. If the unit does not automatically start playing the DVD, press the ▶ PLAY button.
 - When MUTE is pressed, the sound is mute and the "L O" indicator always blinks on the LCD display until MUTE is pressed again or VOL is pressed.



Pausing Playback (Still Mode)

Press the ■ PAUSE button on the remote. To resume normal playback, press the ▶ PLAY button. Each time you press the ■ PAUSE button, the picture advances one frame.

Stopping Playback

Press the ■ STOP button at the location where you want to interrupt playback. To resume playback at the position where the disc was stopped, press the ▶ PLAY button.

If you press the ■ STOP button twice, the unit's memory will be cleared and pressing the ▶ PLAY button will reset the disc to the beginning.

Skipping to a Different Chapter/Track

- Press the I◄◄ button repeatedly to skip to the start of the current or previous chapter/track.
- Press the ▶▶I button to skip to the next chapter/track.
- For an audio CD, use the number buttons (remote control only) to go directly to that track number.

Fast Forward/Fast Reverse

- 1. Press the **TUNING** ▶ or ◀ **TUNING** button on the remote control when a disc is playing.
 - The disc begins fast scan at x2 speed.
 - Four speeds are available. Each time the TUNING ▶► or ◄ TUNING button is pressed, the speed
 of fast scan changes in the following sequence:



Press the ► PLAY button when you have reached the desired point to resume playback at normal speed.

- The DVD player mutes sound during reverse and forward scan of DVD video discs.
- · The fast playback speed may differ depending on the disc.

PLAYING A DISC


Angle Selection



Some DVDs contain scenes which have been shot from a number of different angles. For these discs, the same scene can be viewed from each of these different angles.

- While you are playing a DVD with different angles recorded, press the ANGLE button to view the number of current angles available.
- Press the ANGLE button repeatedly to change the scene to the next angle in those recorded.
 - About two seconds later, playback continues from the new angle selected.
 - If no button is pressed within 10 seconds, playback continues without changing the current angle.

Sequence of angle shots (Example)



Notes:

- This function can only be used for discs on which scenes shot from multiple angles have been recorded.
- If only one angle is recorded, " " is displayed.

Subtitle Selection



- While a DVD is playing, press the SUBTITLE button to display the current language setting, as shown in the example below.
- 2. Press the SUBTITLE button repeatedly to select the desired subtitle language.



Notes:

- If only one language is recorded, the language does not change.
- · About two seconds later, playback continues with the new subtitle selected.
- · The number of languages recorded differs depending on the disc.
- If no button is pressed within a few seconds, playback continues without changing the current subtitle.
- This function can only be used for discs on which subtitles have been recorded in multiple languages.
- On some DVDs, subtitles are activated from the main menu of the DVD. Press the DVD MENU button
 to activate the main menu.

Audio Selection





On some discs, the sound is recorded in two or more formats. Follow the directions below to select the type of playback.

- 1. While a disc is playing, press the AUDIO button to show the current audio format number.
- 2. Press the AUDIO button repeatedly to select the desired audio format.

- - 1/3 □ 6 Ch Eng

- If only one audio format is recorded, the number does not change.
- Some DVD discs allow you to change audio selections only via the disc menu. If this is the case, press the DVD MENU button and choose the appropriate language on the disc menu.
- You can select different audio channels (Left, Right, Mix or Stereo) on an audio CD by pressing the AUDIO button repeatedly.

PLAYING A DISC

Display Function (



While the disc is playing, press the DISPLAY button on the remote control repeatedly to display information on operation status.

Time: The elapsed time from the beginning of the title

which is currently playing.







When playing CD/JPEG discs, you can modify the Play Modes through the Toolkit which appears on the right in the window. Press the ◀ or ▶ button on the remote control to navigate between the left/right windows and the ▲ or ▼ button on the remote control to select files/tracks or play mode items. Then press the ENTER button.

CD Track/JPEG File Programmed Playback

MAINTENANCE

Cleaning the Disc

A defective or soiled disc inserted into the unit can cause sound to drop out during playback. Handle the disc by holding its inner and outer edges.

- Do NOT touch the surface of the unlabeled side of the disc.
- · Do NOT stick paper or tape on the surface.
- · Do NOT expose the disc to direct sunlight or excessive heat.
- Clean the disc before playback. Wipe the disc from the center outward with a cleaning cloth.
- NEVER use solvents such as benzine or alcohol to clean the disc.
- Do NOT use irregular shaped discs (example: heart shaped, octagonal, etc.). They may cause malfunctions.



Cleaning the Unit

Clean plastic cover over screen if it becomes dirty with oil, grease, dust, etc while cooking. Please follow below steps.

- · Be sure to turn the unit off and disconnect the AC power cord before cleaning the unit.
- Wipe the unit with a dry soft cloth. If the surfaces are extremely dirty, wipe clean with a cloth which has been dipped in a weak soap-and-water solution and wrung out thoroughly. Then wipe with a dry cloth.
- Never use alcohol, benzine, thinner, cleaning fluid or other chemicals. Do NOT use compressed air to remove dust.

Important Note

Before transporting the unit, remove the disc from the disc compartment.
