





- If you want to get a better reception, disconnect the supplied FM antenna, and connect to an outdoor FM antenna (not supplied) using a 75  $\Omega$  wire with coaxial type connector (IEC or DIN45325).

# Installing the unit

Install the unit on a flat and level surface to ensure the best sound quality.


- The sound may be affected depending on the location in which you install it. To avoid such issues, change the location and orientation of the unit.
- For cathode-ray tube television (CRT): If you install the unit near the TV, color distortion may occur. To prevent this, turn off the TV's main power or unplug it before installing the unit. Wait at least 30 minutes before turning on the TV's main power again. If the TV is still affected, move the unit further away.

# **CAUTION**

• Do not drag or push the unit on the floor or table. Otherwise, the foot spacers at the bottom may peel off or drop from the unit.

### Installing on the wall

You can install the unit on the wall.



- The unit weighs approximately 3.4 kg (7.4 lbs). Sufficient care must be taken when installing it on the wall to prevent any accidents caused by its falling off. • Use screws, which are compatible with the strength and material of the pillar or wall to prevent the unit from falling
