## Getting started

## About this user's guide

For ease of reference, the "Getting to know your phone" chapter gives a quick overview of the main functions of the phone, shortcuts and general information.

## Available services

Some services and functions described in this user's guide are network- or subscription-dependent. Because of this, all menus may not be available in your phone.

This symbol indicates that a service or function is network- or subscriptiondependent.

Please consult your network operator for more information about your subscription.

## The SIM card

When you register as a subscriber with a network operator, you get a SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card. The SIM card contains a computer chip that keeps track of your phone number, the services included in your subscription, and your phone book information, among other things.

## Assembly

Before you can use your phone you need to:

- insert the SIM card.
- attach and charge the battery. See "SIM card and battery information" on page 4.

Note: Always turn off the phone and detach the charger before you insert or remove a SIM card.


## SIM card and battery information

1. Insert the SIM card. Make sure the SIM card is placed under the silvery holder.
2. Slide the battery into the cradle as shown in the picture and press the battery down flat.
3. Place the back cover as shown in the picture and slide it into place.
4. Connect the charger to the phone at the flash symbol. The flash symbol on the charger plug must face upwards.
5. It can take up to 30 minutes before an icon is shown in the display.
6. Wait approximately four hours or until you see the battery is fully charged.
7. Remove the charger by tilting the plug upwards.

Note: You have to insert the SIM card and charge the battery before you can use the phone.

Talk time - up to 11 hrs . Standby time - up to 250 hrs. ( $>10$ days)

## Making and receiving calls



To turn on the phone

- Press and hold no until you hear a tone.
- Enter your PIN (Personal Identity Number), if you have one for your SIM card. Your PIN is provided by your network operator.

Note: If you make a mistake while entering your PIN, delete the wrong number by pressing C. If you enter the wrong PIN three times in a row, the SIM card is blocked and the message PIN blocked appears. To unblock it, you need to enter your PUK
(Personal Unblocking Key). Your PUK is provided by your network operator.

To make and receive calls

- Enter the area code and phone number, and press Yes to make the call.
- Press no to end the call.
- When the phone rings, press Yes to answer the call.


## Getting to know your phone

## Online services

Online services are customized services offered by network operators, independently of mobile phones and mobile phone manufacturers.

A SIM card which supports Online services works in the same way as a normal SIM card. When you have inserted your SIM card and turned on your phone, your network operator can download data to your SIM card. After the first data download and after restarting your phone, a new menu appears in your phone as the first submenu under the Extras menu.

## To enter your new menu system

- Scroll to Extras, yes, Online services, yes.

Note: This menu only appears if your SIM card supports this service. Some operators may not use the name Online services. Your phone may not support all of the services offered.

Your network operator can download new data, for example a new feature, to your SIM card. You may be notified by a message in your display.

## Menus



## Entering letters

You can enter letters, for example, when you add names to the phone book, write text messages or enter WAP addresses.

## Language

Before you start entering letters, you need to select the language that you want to use when writing.

## To select a language

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Language, yes, Input, yes.
2. Scroll to the language that you want to use for entering letters and press *adA.
3. Repeat step 2 if you want to use another language.
4. Press yes to exit the menu.

When writing, you can switch to one of your selected input languages by pressing and holding (\#) and then selecting, input language.

## Multitap text input

When saving names in the phone book or when writing WAP addresses, you enter letters using multitap text input. You press each key as many times as needed to show the letter you want.

In the following example, we will start writing a name in the phone book:

To enter letters using multitap text input

1. Scroll to Phone book, yes, Add contact, yes. Press YEs again.
2. Press the appropriate key, (1)- (9), 0 or (\#) repeatedly until the character you want appears in the display. See the table of the Latin alphabet below:

Multitap example

- To enter an 'A', press 2 once.
- To enter a 'B', quickly press 2 twice.
- To shift between capital and lower-case letters, press *am , then enter the letter.


## Chinese input

Your phone has different input methods for entering Chinese characters. These include:

- Stroke input
- Pinyin input

You can use these methods, for example, to create Chinese names in your phone book and to send Chinese text messages.

## Before you start

Before you start entering Chinese characters, you need to select the input language that you want to use when writing, Chinese.

To select Chinese as the input language

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Language, yes, Input, yes.
2. Scroll to Chinese and press *ath . Confirm and exit by pressing YEs.

## Switching between Chinese input methods

 In the Chinese editing mode, you can switch to another input language by pressing (B) and then selecting input language. Scroll to the input language you want and press YEs.
## General instructions for entering Chinese characters

Regardless of which input method you choose, your phone has a function to speed up the entry of Chinese characters. Whenever you enter a stroke or a Pinyin letter, a candidate row of the most frequently used characters containing that stroke, or relating to that letter, appears at the bottom of the display. These characters are displayed in order of frequency. The most frequently used character always appears in the middle of the candidate row and is highlighted automatically by the cursor. The next most frequently used characters appear at either side, in the pattern 42135. If the character that is highlighted is the one that you want, press Yes to enter it, or use - or - to go to the character that you want.

If the character that you want is not displayed in the candidate row, press $\quad$ and a new candidate row is displayed. Press (I again until the character you want is displayed, or enter the next stroke or letter and a new set of characters will be displayed in the candidate row. To go back to a row that was previously displayed, press (D or C. In this way, you can quickly and easily enter Chinese characters and reduce the number of key presses that you need to make.

## Input methods in detail

## Stroke input

A Chinese character is built up of strokes. There are more than 30 basic strokes, which are grouped into 8 stroke categories. Each category is represented on the keyboard by one of the keys 1 - 7 and (9). Key 8 has a special function. You can press 1 to display more characters. The Wildcard key, 8 , is used when you are not sure of which stroke to use. See "Example of stroke input:" on page 15 .


## Stroke categories

The Wild Card key， 8 ，is used to supplement unclear strokes in entering characters．For example， if you want to enter 互，but you only know that over stroke－is the first and the last stroke of the character and that the total number of strokes is four：
－Enter 1881.
The character is displayed in the candidate row．

## Components

Components are building units，made up of strokes， within a Chinese character．Components are similar to radicals found in the characters．

After entering the first stroke of the desired character，the component and character candidates that started with that stroke are displayed according to their frequency of usage．Using components is a fast method for entering complex characters．

Note：The components and characters can be distinguished by their font size－the smaller candidates are components and they are surrounded by dotted frames，the bigger candidates are characters．

## Example of stroke input：

Your phone has an association function which is designed to associate a stroke with a component，a component with a character，a character with words or phrases．

## To enter words

In this example，we are going to enter the words信息。
1．Enter the first stroke／．
Components and characters starting with left slope appear in the candidate row，see also＂General instructions for entering Chinese characters＂on page 12．Press yes．
2．Enter another stroke，dot ，．
信 is displayed．
3．Move the cursor to highlight the character you want， press YEs．
The character is moved up to the text row．
4．The other character 息 is displayed in the candidate row．
5．Repeat 3.
The character is moved up to the text row．

## Sequence rules

To enter a Chinese character into the phone，you have to enter it stroke by stroke．It is important that the strokes are entered in the right order，otherwise you may not get the character you want．

The general rules for the sequence of strokes and components are：
－Over first then down：

－Left slope first then right slope：
－From top to bottom：
－From left to right：
－From outside to inside：
－Middle first then sides：
－Inside first and then close：


## Easily confused stroke sequences

Some of the sequences of strokes and components are easily confused because of the sequence rules． The following is a list of some of the components and characters that are easily confused：

Pinyin input
Pinyin is a phonetic based Chinese input method． You enter the character by entering the Latin letters corresponding to the pronunciation of the Chinese character．

Below is the key mapping of Pinyin letters on the keypad．

Note： 12345 are tone marks in phonetic scheme， they are the first，the second，the third，the fourth and the light tone respectively．On the keyboard the letter $u ̈$ is replaced by $v$ ．

## Complete Pinyin

You enter the complete sequence of Pinyin letters， normally for one character，before you choose a character from the candidates in the candidate row．

## Continuous Pinyin

You enter a sequence of Pinyin letters representing more than one character（mostly common words）， and in the candidate row a proposed series of characters appears．

## Simplified Pinyin

You enter Pinyin consonants until the desired charac－ ter appears in the bottom．

## Example of continuous and simplified Pinyin

To enter the phrase 不见不散 using Continuous Pinyin：
－Enter buJi，press yes four times to select the suggested characters．The phrase 不见不散 appears．

To enter the phrase 不见不散 using Simplified Pinyin：
－Enter bjb，press yes four times to select the sug－ gested characters．The phrase 不见不散 appears．

Input of Chinese punctuation marks
To enter Chinese punctuation，briefly press＊adA ， and punctuation marks appear row by row．

## Personalizing your phone

Your phone has been designed for easy personalization．

## Sound settings

－Set the ring volume．
－Set an increasing ring．
－Set the vibrating alert．
－Set a specific ring signal for a caller．
－Select an existing ring signal．
－Compose a melody．
－Receive a melody．
－Set the key sound．
With all the above：
1．Scroll to Settings，yes，Sounds \＆alerts，Yes．
2．Respond to the simple requests or follow the easy instructions shown in the display．

## Composing your own ring signal

You can compose eight different ring signals．
To compose or edit a ring signal
1．Scroll to Settings，yes，Sounds \＆Alerts，yes，My Melodies，YEs．
2. Select one of the melodies and press YES.
3. Press (C) to remove notes.
4. Use the keypad to enter notes:

- Press and hold a key to enter a long note.
- Press (0) to raise the note one octave.
- Press \# once to raise the note one semitone.
- Press \# twice to lower the
 note one semitone.

5. To listen to your melody, press yes. Press yes again to save it or press no to continue composing.

## Pictures

Your phone comes with a number of pictures.
Scroll to Extras, yes, Pictures, yes, where you can view pictures that you can use as:

- Background pictures when in standby mode.
- Contact pictures in the phone book. When that person calls, the picture appears in the display (provided your subscription supports the Calling Line Identification service).
- Pictures in a text message.


## Display settings

You can change the following display settings:

- Display light to automatic, off or on.
- Turn on the sleeping display to save power.
- Change the display's contrast.
- User greeting.

With all the above:

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Display, yes.
2. Respond to the simple requests or follow the easy instructions shown in the display.

## Greeting text

When you turn your phone on and off, a start-up and shutdown show appears in the display. You can also write your own greeting.

## To write a new greeting

1. Scroll to Settings, Yes, Display, yes, User greeting, YES.
2. Select Custom and press yes.
3. Write your new greeting.
4. Press Yes to confirm your setting.

## My numbers

My numbers shows your phone number(s). If your phone number cannot be retrieved from your SIM card, you can enter it yourself.

To enter your phone number

1. Scroll to Phone book, yes, Special numbers, Yes, My numbers, Yes, Voice, YEs.
2. Enter the number and press YEs.

## Menu language

To change the menu language

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Language, yes, Menus, yes.
2. Select a language and press YES.

## Time settings

You can change the following time settings:

- Set the time and date.
- Set the time, date format.
- Set the time zone.
- Select auto time zone.

With all the above:

1. Scroll to Settings, YEs, Time and date, YEs.
2. Select the setting you want to change, YES.

## Profiles

A profile is a group of settings which suit a certain environment. Some phone accessories select a profile automatically. For example, when you place your phone in a car handsfree unit, the In car profile is chosen. There are seven pre-programmed profiles:

- Normal, Meeting, In Car, Outdoors, Port h-free (portable handsfree), Home and Office.

If you select a profile other than Normal, an icon is shown in standby. See "Icons" on page 58.

A profile with no accessories associated with it, such as Meeting or Normal, must be chosen manually.

## To select a profile

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Profiles, yes, Select profile, yes.
2. Select a profile and press YEs.

## Changing the profile settings

You cannot create more profiles, but you can change the settings for a profile.

## To change a profile setting

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Profiles, yes, Edit profile, yes.
2. Select a setting and press YEs. Change the profile setting according to your wishes. The settings remain until you change them again.

## To change the name of a profile

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Profiles, Yes, Edit profile, Yes, Profile name, YEs.
2. Enter a new name and press Yes.

## To reset the profile settings

- Scroll to Settings, yes, Profiles, yes, Reset profiles, yes.


## Accessories

A specific profile is chosen automatically when you use the phone together with a certain accessory.

## Adding accessories to a profile

You can add one or more accessories to any profile, except the Normal profile.

To add an accessory to a profile

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Profiles, Yes, Edit profile, yes, Accessories, yes.
Now you are in the list of the accessories already associated with the profile.
2. Select Add accessory? and press YEs.
3. Select an accessory and press Yes.

To remove an accessory from a profile

1. Scroll to Settings, Yes, Profiles, yes, Edit profile, yes, Accessories, Yes.
2. Scroll to the accessory that you want to remove and press YEs.
3. Scroll to Save and Exit?, YEs.

## My shortcuts

You can place your favourite functions that you want to reach quickly and easily in the My shortcuts menu.

To select your settings for the shortcuts menu

1. Scroll to My shortcuts, YES, Edit shortcuts, YEs.
2. Select a function from the list by pressing (\#).
3. Enter the position number that you want for this function in the menu, YES.
To add another function repeat steps 2 and 3 .
To remove a function repeat steps 1 and 2.
4. Press yes to exit the list.

When you buy your phone, the menu My shortcuts contains a few settings which you can remove if you wish.

Tip: Press and hold $\Theta$ from standby to reach the shortcut saved in the first position in My shortcuts.

## Calling

This chapter gives information about the calling functions that your phone supports.

## Making and receiving calls

Before you can make and receive calls, you need to turn on the phone and be within range of a network.

## Making a call

1. Enter the area code and phone number.
2. Press yes.

## Ending a call

- Press no to end the call.


## Changing the earpiece volume

During a call, you can change the listening volume by pressing the volume keys on the side of the phone.

- Press the upper key to increase the volume.
- Press the lower key to decrease the volume.


## Turning off the microphone

During a call, you can turn off the microphone.

- Press and hold © to turn off the microphone.
- Press and hold © again to resume the conversation.


## Re-dialling a previously called number

In the Call list you can find the numbers for calls that you have made, answered or missed.

To re-dial a previously called number

1. Press yes from standby mode to enter the Call list.
2. Press $\quad$ or to scroll through the list.
3. When the number you want to call is highlighted, press Yes to make the call. See "Call list" on page 26.

## Making international calls

1. Press and hold $\bigcirc$ until a + sign appears. The + replaces the international prefix number of the country from which you are calling.
2. Enter the country code, area code (without the leading zero) and phone number.
3. Press yes.

## Making emergency calls

1. Enter 112 (the international emergency number).
2. Press yes.

Your phone supports the international emergency number 112. This means that it can normally be used to make an emergency call in any country, with or
without a SIM card inserted, if a GSM network is within range.

Note: Some network operators may require that a SIM card is inserted, and in some cases that the PIN has been entered as well.

## Emergency numbers

Some countries may not promote the international emergency number, 112. Your
 operator may therefore have stored local emergency numbers on the SIM card, which work in addition to the international emergency number.

## Receiving calls

When you receive a call, the phone rings and the display shows Answer?

If your subscription includes the Calling Line Identification service and the caller's network sends the number, the caller's number is shown in the display. If you have saved the caller's name and number in the phone book, the caller's name is displayed. If the network does not send the number, the display shows Withheld or Unknown.

## Answering a call

- Press yes to answer a call.


## Rejecting a call

- Press no, or
- Press either of the volume keys on the side of the phone twice to reject a call.

The caller hears a busy tone if this is supported by the caller's network. If "Divert Calls When Busy" is on, the call is diverted to the number you have specified. See "Diverting incoming calls" on page 31.

## Missed calls

If you have missed a call, the message Missed calls: 1 appears in standby mode. (The number indicates the number of missed calls.)

## To check your missed calls

1. Press yes.
2. If you wish to call a number from the list, select the number and press YES.

## Showing and hiding your phone number

You can choose to show or hide your number for a particular call, if this service is supported by your subscription.

To hide or show your phone number

1. Enter the phone number you wish to call.
2. Press $\rightarrow$ until the Call info menu appears.
3. Press until Next call is highlighted, press yes.
4. Select Hide my number or Show my numb. and press YES to make the call.

## Ciphering

Ciphering is a built-in feature that encodes your calls and messages to provide additional privacy.

An exclamation mark inside a triangle is shown in the display during a call to indicate that ciphering is currently not being provided by the network.

## Call list

The Call list is a phone number log that saves information (time, date, phone number and name) about the last 20 dialled, answered and missed calls. Once your list exceeds 20 calls, the oldest one is deleted.

The calls are saved in chronological order, except for the last dialled number, which is always displayed in the first position. If you check a call within 24 hours, the time of the call is displayed. Otherwise, the time is replaced by the date.

If the incoming call is a restricted number, the display shows Withheld.

To call a number from the call list

1. Press yes when the phone is in standby mode.
2. Select the number you want to call and press YEs.

Tip: You can also select the Call list from the Call info тепи.

## To clear the call list

- Select Clear call list from the Call info/Options menu.

To turn the call list on or off

1. Scroll to Call info, yes, Options, yes, Call listing, YES.
2. Select $O n$ or $O f f$ and press yes.

The list is cleared if you select $O f f$, and then accept to clear the list.

## Phone book

Your phone has a phone book, in which you can save information about your contacts.

To add a new contact

1. Scroll to Phone book, yes, Add contact, yes.
2. Press yes and enter a name, yes.
3. Press yes and enter a number, yes.
4. Save and exit?, YEs.

Note: You can add a picture and a ring signal to a contact. See "To add an item to a contact" on page 28.

## To call a contact

1. Scroll to Phone book, yes, Call contact, yes.
2. Enter the first letter of the contact, Yes. If the contact shown is not the one you want, scroll to the contact you want to call, YEs.

## Shortcuts to contacts

From standby, press and hold one of the keys 2-9 to find a contact beginning with a letter on that particular key.

## Shortcuts to phone numbers

From standby, you can find a phone number on the SIM card by:

- Entering its position number followed by \#.

To see the position of the phone numbers that you have saved, go to Phone book, yes, Options, yes, Position list, yes.

Speed dialling
You can call the phone numbers that are saved in positions 1-9 on the SIM card.

- From standby, enter the position number and press yes.

To edit a contact

1. Scroll to Phone book, yes, Edit contact, Yes.
2. Enter the first letter of the contact, YEs.
3. Scroll to the contact that you want to edit, YES.
4. Scroll to the details that you want to edit, YEs.
5. When you have made your changes, press Yes.

Scroll to Save and exit?, YEs.

## To delete a contact

1. Scroll to Phone book, Yes, Edit contact, Yes.
2. Enter the first letter of the contact, YES.
3. Scroll to the contact that you want to delete, press (C) Yes.

Organizing your phone book
You can organize your phone book so that the phone numbers you use most frequently are easily available.

To change position numbers

1. Scroll to Phone book, yes, Options, yes, Position list, YEs.
2. Scroll to the phone number you want to move, press YES.
3. Scroll to the position to which you want to move the phone number and press yes. The phone numbers switch positions.
4. When you have finished, press no. A question appears. Press yes if you want to copy the changes to the SIM card.

Copy to and from the SIM card
Your contacts are saved in the phone. If you want to speed dial or if you want to use your contacts in another phone, you first need to copy the contacts to the SIM card. The contacts on the SIM card are then replaced by the contacts in the phone.

To copy all contacts to the SIM card

- Scroll to Phone book, yes, Options, Yes, Copy all to SIM, yes.

To copy all contacts to the phone

- Scroll to Phone book, yes, Options, Yes, Copy from SIM, yes.

To call a contact saved on the SIM card

1. Scroll to Phone book, YEs, Call from SIM, YEs.
2. Enter the first letter of the contact, YES.
3. Press yes to call the contact.

To check the status of your phone book memory

- Scroll to Phone book, yes, Memory status, Yes.


## Pictures, personal rings and voice commands

You can add a picture or a personal ring signal to a contact.

To add an item to a contact

1. Scroll to Phone book, YEs, Edit contact, Yes.
2. Enter the first letter of the contact, YEs.
3. When the contact is highlighted, press YEs.
4. To add a picture, scroll to Picture, YEs. This takes you to Pictures. Select a picture and press Yes. See "Pictures" on page 21.

To add or modify a personal ring signal, scroll to Ring signal, yes. This takes you to Personal rings. Select a ring signal and press yes. See "Sound settings" on page 20.

## Groups

You can create groups of contacts to send messages to.

## To create a new group

1. Scroll to Phone book, yEs, Groups, yes.
2. Select Add group and press YEs.
3. Enter a name for the group and press Yes.
4. Select Add member, yes.
5. Enter the first letter of the contact you want to add, YES. Scroll to the contact you want to add, YES.
6. To add the next member, select a group, YEs, Edit, YES, Add member, YES.

## Your voice mail service

The answering service of your network allows callers to leave a voice message.

You can save the number of your voice mail service to be able to call your voice mail service by simply pressing and holding 1 . The number is provided by your network operator.

To save your voice mail number

1. Scroll to Messages, yes, Options, yes, Voice mail no., YES.
2. Enter your voice mail number and press YEs.

To call your voice mail service

- Press and hold 1 from standby mode, or
- Scroll to Messages, yes, Call voice mail, yes.

To change the message alert signal

1. Scroll to Messages, yes, Options, Yes, Message alert, YEs.
2. Select a signal and press yEs.

## Call time and call cost

To check the call time of the last call

- Scroll to Call info, yes, Call timers, yes, Last Call, yes.
You can also check the time of outgoing calls and the total call time.

To reset the total call time

1. Scroll to Call info, yes, Call timers, yes, Reset timers, YES.
2. Select Total time or Outgoing time and press yes.

To check the cost of the last call

- Scroll to Call info, yes, Call costs, Yes, Last call, YES.

To check the total call cost

- Scroll to Call info, yes, Call costs, yes, Total cost, YES.

To reset the total call cost

1. Scroll to Call info, yes, Call costs, yes, Clear total cost, YES.
2. Press Yes to confirm your choice.

## Setting the call cost

You can use the Tariff function to specify the price per call unit. The price entered is saved on your SIM card.

To enter the price per call unit

1. Scroll to Call info, yes, Call costs, yes, Set tariff, yes.
2. Enter your PIN2 and press Yes.
3. Select Change tariff and press yes.
4. Enter the currency you want, for example GBP for Pounds Sterling, and press Yes.
5. Enter the price per call unit, for example 0.75 , and press Yes. To enter a decimal point, press *adA.

To revert to call units

1. Scroll to Call info, yes, Call costs, yes, Set tariff, yes.
2. Enter your PIN2 and press Yes.
3. Select Units and press yes.

## Credit limit for calls

You can enter a total amount of money that can be used for making calls.

## To set a specific credit limit

1. Scroll to Call info, yes, Call costs, yes, Set credit, YEs.
2. Enter your PIN2 and press Yes.
3. Select Change credit and press yes.
4. Enter the amount, for example 30 pounds, and press yes.

## To set unlimited credit

1. Scroll to Call info, Yes, Call costs, Yes, Set credit, YEs.
2. Enter your PIN2 and press Yes.
3. Select Unlimited and press YEs.

To turn the minute minder on or off

1. Scroll to Call info, yEs, Call timers, YEs, Minute minder, Yes.
2. Select On or Off and press Yes.

## Diverting incoming calls

You can use the Divert calls service to divert incoming calls to another phone number when you are unable to answer.

## To turn on the divert calls function

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Call options, Yes, Divert calls, yes.
2. Select a divert alternative and press YES.
3. Select Activate and press Yes.
4. Enter the phone number, including the area code, to which you want your calls to be diverted and then press YEs.

## To check the status of divert calls

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Call options, Yes, Divert calls, yes.
2. Scroll to the divert you want to check and press YES.
3. Select Get status and press Yes.

## More than one call

You can handle more than one call simultaneously.

## Call waiting service

If the call waiting service is activated, you hear a beep if you receive another call during an ongoing call.

To turn on the call waiting service

- Scroll to Settings, yes, Call options, yes, Call waiting, Yes, Activate, Yes. There may be a short delay before the network responds.

To make a second call

1. Put the ongoing call on hold by pressing Yes.
2. Enter the number you wish to call and press Yes or press and hold - to retrieve the number from your phone book.

To put the ongoing call on hold and answer the waiting call

- Press yes to answer the waiting call.

The ongoing call is now put on hold.
To continue the ongoing call and reject the waiting call

- Select Busy and press yes.

The waiting call is rejected.
To end the ongoing call and answer the waiting call

- Select Release \& answer and press YES.


## Handling two calls

When you have one ongoing call and one call on hold, you can do one of the following:

To switch between the two calls

- Press yes.

To end the ongoing call and return to the call on hold

1. Press no. The question Retrieve call? appears.
2. Press yes.

If you press no, the call on hold is also ended.
To end both calls

- Scroll to Ongoing call, yes, Release all, yes.

To connect the two calls

- Scroll to Ongoing call, yes, Transfer call, YES.
The two calls are now connected to each other, and you are disconnected from both. Please contact your network operator for charging details.

To join the two calls into a conference call

- Scroll to Ongoing call, yes, Join calls, YEs. See "Conference calls" on page 33.


## Receiving a third call

You cannot answer a third call without ending one of the first two calls unless you create a conference call.

To end the ongoing call and accept the waiting call

- Select Release \& answer and press yes.

The waiting call becomes active and the call on hold remains on hold.

To reject the waiting call

- Select Busy and press yes. The caller hears a busy tone. The third call is rejected.


## Conference calls

In a conference call, you can have a joint conversation with up to four other people.

Creating a conference call
To create a conference call, you must have one ongoing call and one call on hold.

To join the two calls into a conference call

- Scroll to Ongoing call, yes, Join calls, Yes.


## To add a new participant

1. Press yes to put the conference group on hold.
2. Call the next person you wish to include in the conference group.
3. Scroll to Ongoing call, YES, Join calls, YEs.

To extract a participant

1. Scroll to Ongoing call, YEs, Extract part, YEs.
2. Select the participant and press YEs.

You may now have a private conversation with the participant.

To rejoin the participant to the conference group

- Scroll to Ongoing call, yEs, Join calls, Yes.

To release a participant

1. Scroll to Ongoing call, YEs, Release part, YEs.
2. Select the participant and press Yes.

To release all participants

- Scroll to Ongoing call, yEs, Release all, YEs.

To put the conference group on hold and make a new call

1. Press yes.
2. Enter the number you want to call and press YEs.

To switch between the new call and the conference group

- Press yes.

To end the new call and return to the conference group

- Press no and then Yes.

To end the conference call

- Press no.


## Restricting calls

You can use the Restrict calls service to restrict certain types of calls.


To turn a call restriction on or off

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Call options, yes, Restrict calls, YEs.
2. Scroll to an option and press YES.
3. Select Activate or Cancel and press Yes.
4. Enter your password and press YEs.

## Fixed dialling

The Fixed dialling function allows calls to be made only to certain numbers saved on the SIM card.

Note: Emergency calls can still be made, even when Fixed dialling is on.

To turn fixed dialling on or off

1. Scroll to Phone book, yes, Options, yes, Fixed dialling, YEs.
2. Enter your PIN2 and press Yes.
3. Select On or Off and press Yes.

To save fixed numbers

1. Scroll to Phone book, yes, Special numbers, yes, Fixed numbers, YEs, Add new?, Yes.
2. Enter your PIN2 and press Yes.
3. Enter the fixed number and press Yes.
4. Enter the name you want to associate with the number and press YEs.

## Closed user groups

The Closed user group function is another way of lowering call costs. On some networks it is cheaper to make calls within
a call group. Your network operator can place certain numbers in groups. You can have a maximum of 10 groups.

To add a closed user group

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Call options, yes, Closed groups, YEs, Edit list, Yes.
2. Scroll to Add new? and press YES.
3. Enter the name of the user group and press Yes.
4. Enter the index number of the group and press YEs. The index numbers are provided by your network operator.

To activate a closed user group

1. Scroll to Settings, Yes, Call options, YEs, Closed groups, YEs, Edit list, Yes.
2. Scroll to the group you want and press YES.
3. Select Activate and press Yes.

Calls can be made only within the selected user group.

## To call outside closed user groups

1. Scroll to Settings, Yes, Call options, yes, Closed groups, YEs, Open calls, YEs.
2. Select On and press yes.

## Accepting calls

With the Accept calls service, you can choose to receive calls only from certain numbers. You have to save the numbers in an Accepted list. The phone numbers are saved in the Call list in the Call info menu.

To add numbers to the list of accepted callers

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Call options, YEs, Accept calls, YES, Edit list, Yes, Add to list?, Yes.
2. Select Phone book. Enter the first letter of the contact or group and press YES.
3. Scroll to the number or group you want to add, YES.

To set the accept options

1. Scroll to Settings, Yes, Call options, Yes, Accept calls, YES, Accept options, Yes.
2. Select an option, YEs.

## Two voice lines

If your subscription supports the Two line service, your phone has two voice lines
 with different phone numbers. When you buy your phone, the names of the lines are normally line 1 and line 2, but you can change their names.

To change the name of a line

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Display, yes, Edit line tags, YES.
2. Select a line, yes.
3. Enter a new name, yes.

## Changing lines

Once you have chosen a line, all outgoing calls are made on this line until you change it again. An icon indicates the line currently chosen for outgoing calls.

Note: Incoming calls can be received on both lines, irrespective of the line currently chosen.

To change phone lines

1. Scroll to Call info, yes, Next call, yes.
2. Select Switch to line 1 or Switch to line 2, yes.

## Locking one line

You can choose to lock one of the lines, so that it cannot be used unless you enter the PIN2.

To lock a phone line

1. Scroll to Settings, Yes, Locks, yes.
2. Select the phone line you want to lock: Lock line 1 or Lock line 2, YEs.
3. Enter your PIN2, YEs.

To unlock a phone line

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Locks, yes.
2. Select the phone line you want to unlock: Unlock line 1 or Unlock line 2, yes.
3. Enter your PIN2, YEs.

## Calling card calls

When making international or long distance calls, you may want to use the calling card service to redirect the charges to a credit card account, instead of your normal account.

Note: You cannot use the calling card service when making a fax or a data call.

To turn on the calling card service

1. Scroll to Phone book, Yes, Options, Yes, Usecalling cards, YEs.
2. Enter your phone lock code, YEs.

Select On, yes.

## To save a card number

1. Scroll to Phone book, Yes, Calling cards, YEs.
2. Enter your phone lock code, YES.
3. Select Add new?, yes.
4. Enter the access number of the calling card server, YES.
5. Enter a name that you want to associate with your calling card server, YEs.
6. Enter the verification code of the calling card server, YES.
7. Select which you want to send first - the number that you want to call or the verification code - and press YES to confirm your choice.

## To edit a card number

1. Scroll to Phone book, yes, Calling cards, yes.
2. Scroll to the card number that you want to edit, YES.
3. Select Edit and edit the card number.
4. Press yes to confirm the new number.

## Choosing a card

If you have saved two card numbers, you must choose which card you want to use before making a calling card call.

## To select a card

1. Scroll to Phone book, yes, Calling cards, yes.
2. Enter your phone lock code, YEs.
3. Select the card that you want to use, YEs.
4. Select Activate card, yes.

## Making a calling card call

1. Enter the phone number you wish to call or retrieve it from the phone book by pressing and holding $\rightarrow$.
2. Press and hold yes.

The access number of the calling card server is called. During the connecting phase, you are asked to send the phone number that you want to call and the verification code, in the order chosen earlier (see above).
3. Press yes when the display shows Send or wait a few seconds and the number and code are sent automatically.

## Messaging

You can use the Short Message Service (SMS) to send and receive text messages consisting of up to 70 characters. The number of characters can vary, depending on what services your network operator supports.

If the number to your service centre is not saved on your SIM card, you must specify the number yourself. Otherwise you cannot reply to received messages or send your own. This also applies to chat messages. See "Mobile chat" on page 40.

To check the service centre number

1. Scroll to Messages, Yes, Options, yes, Service centres, YEs.
If no number is found, select Add new? and press yEs.
2. Enter the number, including the international + sign and country code, and press YES.

Note: The number to your service centre is provided by your operator.

## Sending a text message

- You can send a text message, and also insert pictures, melodies, sounds and animations in it. When you send messages containing such items, you use the Long messages function. See "Long messages" on page 39 .


## Sending text messages

For information about entering letters, see "Entering letters" on page 10.

To write and send a text message

1. Scroll to Messages, yes, Write new, yes.
2. Write your message, YEs.
3. Enter the recipient's phone number or press $\rightleftharpoons$ to retrieve a number from the phone book.
4. Press yes to send the message.

If you want to send the message later, press no twice when you are asked to enter the phone number. The message is saved in the Unsent list in the Message menu.

To insert an item in a text message

1. Change the input language to $A B C \ldots$. See "To select a language" on page 10 .
2. Scroll to Messages, yes, SMS, yes, Write new, yes.
3. While writing your message, press \#.
4. Select Insert object and then select Picture, Sound, Melody or Animation, yes.
5. Select an item, yes. Then press yes again to confirm.

## Receiving text messages

When you receive a text message, the phone beeps and the message New message Read now? appears.

- Press yes to read the text message, or no if you want to read the message later. The message is saved in Inbox.
- When you have read the text message, press yes to select one of the following options: Reply, Forward or Delete the text message.
- While reading the text message you can, for example, start a chat session with the sender or go to a WAP address found in the text message.
- Press no to close the text message.

To save an item in a text message
When the phone number, WAP address, picture, animation or melody is highlighted, press yes. Then select to save the item and press YEs.

- A picture or animation is saved in My Pictures.
- A melody is saved in My melodies.
- A phone number is saved in Phone book.
- A WAP address is saved in Bookmarks.


## Long messages

A text message can contain up to 70 characters. You can send a longer message by linking two or more messages. Please note that you are charged for the number of linked messages.

## To turn long messages on

- Scroll to Messages, yes, Options, yes, Long messages, yes, On, yes.


## Templates

If you have one or more messages that you send often, you can save these as templates. Your service provider may also have saved some templates in your phone.

## To create a template

1. Scroll to Messages, yes, Templates, yes, Add new?, YES.
2. Write the message, yEs.
3. Press yes if you want to send the message now. Press no to save the template.

## Message options

You can set a default value for the message options below, or you can turn on the Set on send option which means that you choose the settings each time you send a message.

- Validity period - If your message cannot be delivered, for example, if the recipient has turned off the phone, your service centre can save the message to send it later.
- Request reply - Include a reply request if you want the recipient of your message to reply.
- Status request - Check if a message has been delivered.

To set a default message option

1. Scroll to Messages, Yes, Options, YEs.
2. Select an option, Yes.
3. Select Set default, yes.
4. Select an option from the list, YEs.

To turn set on send on or off

- Repeat steps 1 and 2 above, then select Set on send, YES.

To request a status report

1. Scroll to Messages, yes, Sent items, yes.
2. Select a message, press Yes twice.
3. Select Status request, YES.

To check the status of a sent message

- Scroll to Messages, yes, Sent items, yes, select a text message, YEs, View status, YES.


## Mobile chat

The mobile chat function works in the same way as a chat on the Internet.

To start a chat session

1. Scroll to Messages, yes, Chat, yes.
2. Enter the recipient's phone number, or retrieve it from the phone book.
3. Write your message, yes.

## Receiving a chat session invitation

When you receive a chat session invitation, the phone beeps and the message Chat message Chat now? appears.

- To read the chat message, press yes.
- Write your chat message reply and press Yes.
- To suspend a chat session, press no.
- To resume a chat session, scroll to Messages, Chat, Resume.
- To end a chat session, press and hold no.


## Using mobile Internet

Your phone has a WAP (Wireless Application Protocol) browser which is designed to bring a modified Internet to your mobile phone. A wide range of services are available, for example, news, entertainment, timetables, reservations, banking and e-commerce.

## Before you start

To use the mobile Internet you need

1. A phone subscription that supports data transmission.
2. A correctly set data account for access to an Internet server.
3. A correctly set WAP profile for WAP browsing.

The settings may already be entered when you buy the phone, or you can receive the settings from your network operator or your service provider in a text message.

To request settings from Sony Ericsson Mobile Internet

1. Use a PC to go to www.SonyEricsson.com. By using the WAP Configurator, you can request that a text
message be sent to your phone with the settings you need.
2. When the message arrives, New settings. Install? appears:

- Press yes to install the new settings or
- Press no to cancel installation. A new request for settings is then required, as in step 1.


## Using WAP

To select a WAP profile

1. Scroll to WAP services, YEs, Select profile, YEs.
2. Select a WAP profile, YEs.

## To start browsing

There are three different ways in which you can start browsing:

- Press and hold the access key to connect to your homepage from standby, or
- Press the access key, select a bookmark, yes, or
- Scroll to WAP services, Yes, Enter address, yes, Enter the WAP address, yes.

To exit the browser

- Press and hold no. Remain connected? appears.
- Disconnect completely, press no.
-Leave the browser temporarily but stay connected, press the access key and select Go to menu.


## Options when browsing

When browsing, you can reach different browsing options such as links or special features by pressing the access key. The options may vary depending on the WAP page you are visiting.

To change the homepage of a WAP profile

1. Scroll to WAP services, Yes, WAP settings, Yes.
2. Select the profile whose homepage you want to change, YES.
3. Scroll to Chg homepage, YES.
4. Enter the name of the homepage, YES.
5. Enter the address of the homepage, YEs.

To work with your bookmarks when not browsing

1. Scroll to WAP services, Yes, Bookmarks, Yes.
2. Select the bookmark you want to work with, YES.
3. Select one of the following submenus, YES:

- Go to bookmark. Go to the marked WAP page.
-Edit bookmark. Edit the name and/or the WAP address of the bookmark.
-Delete. Delete the bookmark.
- Send as link. This creates a text message in which the WAP address is sent as a link. You can add a comment if you wish.

To empty the cache memory

1. Scroll to WAP services, yes, Clear cache, yes.
2. Empty cache? appears, YES.

## Security

To establish secure connections when using certain WAP services, you need to have certificates saved in your phone. Your phone may already contain certificates when you buy it. You can also download certificates from certain WAP sites, or receive them from a service provider.

To turn on a secure connection

1. Scroll to WAP services, YEs, WAP settings, Yes.
2. Select the profile you want to edit.
3. Select Gateway, yes, IP settings, yes, Security, yes.
4. Select On, Yes.

To check the certificates in your phone

1. Scroll to WAP services, YEs, WAP settings, YEs, Common, Yes.
2. Scroll to Security, YEs, select Trusted certif. or Client certif., YES.

## Locks (PIN codes)

PIN codes are used to protect your subscription from unauthorized use, when accessing certain WAP sites, and to authorize transactions. Your PIN code acts as a signature when you confirm a transaction.

Note: These codes are supplied by your network operator or service provider.

A Locks setting may appear in the Security submenu.
To go to the Locks menu

- Scroll to WAP services, YEs, WAP settings, YEs, Common, yes, Security, Yes, Locks, yes.


## Transaction contracts

You can check which transactions you have made with your phone when browsing. Each time you confirm a transaction with your signature lock code, a
record is saved in your phone. The contract contains details of the transaction.

To check your transaction records

- Scroll to WAP services, Yes, WAP settings, Yes, Common, yes, Security, yes, Contracts, yes.


## WAP push messages

A service provider can send updated news or new WAP settings to your phone in a push message.

## Accepting or rejecting push messages

If you do not want to receive push messages, you can turn off the Push access. This setting is valid for all your WAP profiles.

To turn the push access on or off

1. Scroll to WAP services, YEs, WAP settings, YEs, Common, yes, Push access, yes.
2. Select On or Off.

## Receiving push messages

When you receive a push message, it comes to the Push inbox. You can respond to a push message as follows:

- Postpone. Saves the push message so that you can load and see it later.
- Load. The browser starts and loads the pushed WAP page.
- Delete. Deletes the push message.


## More features

## Calendar

To add a new appointment

1. Scroll to Extras, Yes, Calendar, Yes, Add appointm., YES.
2. Press yes and enter a subject, location and description if required, YEs.
3. Scroll to Continue?, yEs.
4. Scroll to and enter start date, time, end date, time (if required), YEs.
5. Scroll to Continue?, yes.
6. Select a reminder interval, for example 5 min before, YES.

Note: If you select Other reminder, enter a reminder date, YES and time, YES.
7. If the appointment is recurrent:

- Select Recurrent app. from the options list, yes.
- Select the recurrence you want, YEs.
- Confirm with Save and exit?, yEs.


## Viewing your calendar

To view your calendar content, scroll to Extras, yes, Calendar, YES and then select one of the following:

- View month. This shows a whole month, with the current day in a square. Move within and among the weeks by using the arrow keys. Press yes to enter a certain day. Days on which you have tasks are marked in bold.
- View week. This shows a whole week. All your tasks are shown as grey boxes. You enter a certain day by pressing YES when that day is highlighted.

Tip: In these views, you can go to next week by pressing 3, to next month by pressing 6 and to next year by pressing 9. You can go back a week, a month or a year by pressing 1, 4 or 7 respectively.

## Calendar settings

To view your calendar options, scroll to Extras, yes, Calendar, YEs, Options, YEs, and then select one of the following:

- Status. Check available space.
- Delete all. Deletes all appointments in the calendar.
- Reminders. Turn on this function if you want your phone to remind you even though the phone is turned off.
- Profile switch. If you set the switch reminder function to On, the question Switch profile? appears when a meeting is about to start. Press yes to view the list of profiles and select a profile. After the meeting, you are asked to switch profile again.


## Games

Your phone features a number of games.

## To start a game

1. Scroll to Extras, Yes, Games, Yes.
2. Select a game, YEs.
3. Select New Game or Resume game, yes.
4. Start the game.

To control the games, use the keys as follows

## Alarm clock

To set an alarm

1. Scroll to Extras, YEs, Time, Yes, Alarms, yes, Alarm, YES.
2. Enter the time and press YEs to confirm your setting.

Note: Press any key to turn the alarm signal off when it rings. If you do not want the alarm to be repeated, press YES.

To set a recurrent alarm

1. Scroll to Extras, yes, Time, yes, Alarms, yes, Recurrent alarm, yes.
2. Enter the time and press YES.
3. Press *ata to select the days you want to recur.

Press yes to exit the menu. You can view the days in the Recurrence rule sub-menu.

To change the alarm signal

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Sounds \& alerts, yes, Alarm signal, yes.
2. Select a signal, yEs.

## To run the stopwatch

1. Scroll to Extras, Yes, Time, yes, Stopwatch, yes.
2. Press yes to start the stopwatch. Press yes again to stop it.
By pressing (\#) when the stopwatch is running, you can save up to nine lap times. Press $\leftrightarrows$ or - to check your saved lap times.

To reset the stopwatch

- Press (C) when the stopwatch is not running.


## To set the timer

1. Scroll to Extras, yes, Time, yes, Timer, yes.
2. Enter the hours, minutes and seconds and press yes. When the alert sounds, press any key to turn it off.

## Calculator

The phone has a built-in calculator, which can add, subtract, divide and multiply.

- Press \# to get $+,-, x, /$.
- Press (C) to delete the figure to the left of the cursor.
- Press *ara to enter a decimal point or to use the $\%$ function.


## To use the calculator

In this example, we are going to divide 134 by 32 .

1. Scroll to Extras, Yes, Calculator, Yes.
2. Enter 134.
3. Press (\#) repeatedly until the division sign (/) appears.
4. Enter 32.
5. Press yes to get the answer.
6. To clear the display, press (C).

## Security

You can protect your phone and subscription from unauthorized use in several ways.

## Locking the SIM card

The SIM card lock protects your subscription, but not your phone itself, from unauthorized use. If the SIM card lock is on, you have to enter your PIN every time you turn on your phone. If you enter your PIN incorrectly three times in a row, your SIM card is blocked. You need the PUK (Personal Unblocking Key) which is supplied by your network operator to unblock it.

To unblock your SIM card

1. PIN blocked appears.
2. Enter your PUK (or PUK2) and press Yes.
3. Enter a new four-to-eight-digit PIN (or PIN2) and press YES.
4. Re-enter the new PIN (or PIN2) to confirm and press YES.

Note: If you enter the wrong PUK ten times in a row, your card is permanently blocked. If this happens, you should contact your network operator.

To change your PIN

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Locks, yes, SIM lock, yes, Change PIN, Yes.
2. Enter your old PIN and press YEs.
3. Enter your new PIN and press yes.
4. Re-enter your new PIN to confirm and press yes.

To turn the SIM card lock on or off

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Locks, YEs, SIM lock, yEs, Protection, Yes.
2. Select On or Off, enter your PIN and press Yes.

## Locking the phone

The phone lock protects the phone against unauthorized use if it is stolen and the SIM card is exchanged. You can change the phone lock code (0000) to any four-to-eight digit code.

## Troubleshooting

Here are some problems that you might have while using your phone.

Error messages concerning the SIM card
Problems related to your SIM card can be corrected by contacting your network operator.

No indication of charging
With an empty battery it can take up to 30 minutes for the charging icon to appear in the display.

Master reset
You can reset the phone's settings to the way they were when you bought your phone.

To reset the phone

1. Scroll to Settings, yes, Master reset, yes, Reset all, YES.
2. Enter the phone lock code (0000) or the number you have changed it to. Press yes.

## Number not permitted

The Fixed dialling function is on and the number you have dialled is not on your fixed numbers list.

## Cannot access a certain function

The function or service may be dependent on your SIM card or the network. Contact
 your network operator.

Cannot receive any calls

- You may have diverted your incoming calls to another phone number.
- You may have set the Accept Calls option to From no one or From list. Select From all.

Your mobile phone is a low-power radio transmitter and receiver. When it is turned on, it emits low levels
of radio frequency energy (also known as radio waves or radio frequency fields).

Governments around the world have adopted comprehensive international safety guidelines, developed by scientific organizations*, e.g. ICNIRP (International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection), through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. These guidelines establish permitted levels of radio wave exposure for the general population. All Sony Ericsson mobile phone models are designed to operate within these stringent levels. Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) is the unit of measurement for the amount of radio frequency energy absorbed by the body when using a mobile phone. The SAR value is determined at the highest certified power level in laboratory conditions, but the actual SAR level of the mobile phone while operating can be well below this value.

This is because the mobile phone is designed to use the minimum power required to reach the network. Therefore, the closer you are to a base station, the more likely it is that the actual SAR level will decrease.

Variations in SAR below the radio frequency exposure guidelines do not mean that there are variations in safety. While there may be differences in SAR levels among mobile phone models, all mobile phone models must be designed to meet radio frequency exposure guidelines.

## DRIVING
