

# **Startup**

The steps below will get your TV connected and ready for watching. For more details, see the page numbers listed.

## 1. Hook up your TV

Details are in the Connections Guide.




Hook up any antennas, cables or other equipment to your TV before you follow the steps below.

**CAUTION**: Matching stands were designed to be used with the table model TVs included in this book. The recommended stands are provided with hardware to secure the TV to the stand so that it cannot be easily pulled off or tipped over. Your GE dealer can help you choose the appropriate stand for your TV.

Stands are not available by mail order. To locate your nearest GE dealer call 1-800-447-1700.


If you choose not to use the stand recommended for your TV, take precautions that the stand or furniture the TV is placed on is properly located and of adequate size and strength to prevent the TV from accidentally being tipped over or pulled off. This could cause damage to the TV and/or personal injury.

## 2. Plug in the TV



Plug the cord into the outlet, matching the wide and the small end of the plug with the outlet.

### 3. Put Batteries in the Remote



- A. Pull off the cover of the battery compartment.
- B. Place two AAA batteries as shown, matching the + and end of each battery in the compartment.
- C. Replace the cover.



Press POWER on the remote.




5. Place all available channels in memory (Autoprogram)

Details for adding and deleting channels are on page 11.



- A. Press MENU until the Setup menu is selected. This menu is white.
- B. Press VOLUME + to place channels in the TV's memory (Autoprogram).
- C. Wait until TV has cycled through all the channels and returns to original channel.

6. Set the Time



- A. Press MENU until the Alarm menu is selected. This menu is green.
- B. The Clock is automatically highlighted the first time you set it. If it is not, press CHANNEL down to highlight it.
- C. Press VOLUME to set the hour.
- D. Press VOLUME + to set the minutes.
- F. The menus will automatically disappear from the screen, after a brief period of time.



# **Menu Basics**

## **Colors**

Press MENU repeatedly to see each of the four menu colors. Each menu has a different color background as shown at the left.



## Moving through the Menus

- 1. Press MENU to move from menu to menu.
- 2. Press CHANNEL up and down to move through the features in the menu.
- Press VOLUME + and to move left and right on the menu lines.

# **Using Your Remote**

# With Remote Buttons



### **DISPLAY**

Shows displays on the screen.

Clears menus from the screen.

#### **POWER**

Turns the TV on and off.

### **MUTE**

Switches the TV sound on or off.

PREV CH (Previous Channel) Changes back and forth between

two channels.

Select a channel and then select another. Press PREV CH to switch between the two channels. CHAN ∧ and ∨ (Channel up and down) Scans up and down through channels in the TV's memory.

Moves up and down menus. See Menu Basics on page 5.

VOL + and -(Volume up and down) Raises and lowers sound.

Moves left and right on a menu line. *See Menu Basics on page 5.* 

Changes a feature setting.

# **Using Your Remote**

# With Remote Buttons



#### **CLEAR**

Clears menus and displays from the screen.

#### **MENU**

Shows menus on the screen and moves from menu to menu.

#### **RESET**

Returns the picture adjustments to the original settings.

#### **Number Buttons**

Selects any channel number.

Two numbers must be pressed for each channel. Press 0 and 6 for channel 6.

For three digit channels, press and hold 1 until 1-- appears on the screen. Then press the other two numbers.

#### **INPUT**

Switches between the TV channels and Video 00 if another component is connected.

SKIP (Commercial Skip) Allows you to look at other channels during commercials.


Each press adds 30 seconds. Use the CHANNEL or number buttons to scan the other channels. TV switches back to original channel when time runs out. Press CLEAR to cancel SKIP.

# **Overall Picture**


Follow the steps below to lighten or darken the overall picture without changing the color levels.

## 1. Select the Controls Menu



Press MENU repeatedly to select the Controls menu. This menu is yellow.

# 2. Highlight Picture



Press CHANNEL down to highlight Picture.

# 3. Use VOLUME + and – to adjust the Picture



Press VOLUME + to lighten the picture.


# Placing Channels in Memory (Autoprogramming)

Only channels 2–13 appear in the TV's memory when you first turn it on. The channels available in your area must be programmed into the TV's memory when you hook up your TV. Using CHANNEL up and down allows you to scan through these channels.

You may want to add or delete a few channels if some stations have weak signals or were off the air when the TV was programmed. *Refer to the Add or Delete Channels section below.* 


# 1. Place channels in memory (Autoprogram)






- A. Hook up an antenna, cable or components before you begin these steps or you will not be able to add channels into memory.
- B. Press MENU repeatedly to select the Setup menu. This menu is white.
- C. Press CHANNEL down to highlight Autoprogram.
- D. Press VOLUME + to start the TV adding all active channels into memory.
- E. Wait until the TV has cycled through all the channels and returns to the original channel.

#### 2. Add or delete channels






- A. Press MENU on the TV front panel repeatedly to select the Setup menu. This menu is white.
- B. Press CHANNEL down to highlight Channel Memory.
- C. Press VOLUME + to underline the channel number.
- D. Select the channel number you want to add or delete with the number buttons.
- E. Press VOLUME + to add or delete a channel (you will see Stored on the screen when added and Erased when deleted).
- F. Repeat D and E for more channels.

# **Naming the Channels**

You can name at least 20 channels with four characters in each name. **Full** appears beside Label when the memory is used up. **Fixed** appears when a channel number cannot be named. Below are the characters that can be used in a name.


#### 1. Name a channel





- A. Press MENU repeatedly to select the Setup menu. This menu is white.
- B. Press CHANNEL down to highlight Label.
- C. Press VOLUME + to underline the channel number.
- D. Select the channel number with the number buttons.
- E. Press VOLUME +to underline the first character of the name.
- F. Choose the character using VOLUME + and -.
- G. Repeat E–F to complete the name.
- H. Press VOLUME + to move backward if you want to change an item.

### 2. Erase a name



- A. Follow A and B above.
- B. Press VOLUME + until clear is underlined.
- C. Press VOLUME + and to clear the name.



# **Setting the Sleep Timer**

You can set your TV to turn itself off. If you're watching TV at night and fall asleep, the TV will turn off for you.

## 1. Set Sleep Timer




- A. Press MENU to select the Controls menu and highlight Sleep Timer. This menu is yellow.
- B. Press VOLUME + to enter the amount of time you want to watch TV before it shuts off. Each press equals 15 minutes.
- C. Press VOLUME to subtract time from the sleep timer.

## 2. Add more time



When 0:01 appears on the screen, the TV will shut off in one minute. Press VOLUME + to add more time.

### 3. Cancel the Timer




- A. Press MENU to select the Controls menu and highlight Sleep Timer.
- B. Press VOLUME until the time reaches -:--.

# **Setting the Alarm Clock**


The TV can be set to turn on each day like your alarm clock. You can set it to turn on to your favorite channel at a certain time. You can also set it to turn itself off again. The Alarm cannot be used until the clock is set.

### 1. Turn on the Alarm




- A. Press MENU to select the Alarm menu and highlight Alarm. This menu is green.
- B. Press VOLUME + or to select On or Off.


## 2. Set the Alarm Channel



- A. Press CHANNEL down to highlight the Alarm Channel.
- B. Press VOLUME + to highlight the channel number.
- C. Enter the channel that you want the TV to turn on to with the number buttons.

### 3. Set On and Off Times






- A. Press CHANNEL down to highlight the On or Off Time.
- B. Press VOLUME to set the hour.
- C. Press VOLUME + to set the minutes.
- D. Press and hold VOLUME to choose Disabled. This turns the TV only on or only off at a certain time each day.

# Selecting a Language

The on-screen displays in this TV can be displayed in three languages: English, French, and Spanish. When you select a language, most of the displays will be shown on the screen in your preferred language.

1. Select the Setup menu

2. Select Language



Press MENU repeatedly to select the Setup menu. This menu is white.

Press VOLUME + or — to select English, Français (French), or Español (Spanish).


# Watching Closed Captioning

Closed captioning displays the audio portion of a program as words on the TV screen. It is useful for the deaf, hearing impaired, or anyone who wants to watch a program without sound. If you have turned Closed Captioning on and it does not appear on the screen, it is not available on the channel you are watching. This TV does not support the text mode. Text information typically consists of program information, weather bulletins, local activities, etc.

1. Select the Controls Menu

2. Highlight Closed Captioning

3. Select Setting



Press MENU to select the Controls menu. This menu is yellow.

Press CHANNEL down to highlight Closed Captioning.




Your TV automatically adjusts this feature when the TV places channels in memory (Autoprogram). Follow the steps below to change the setting as needed.

## 1. Select the Setup menu




Press MENU repeatedly to select the Setup menu. This menu is white.

## 2. Highlight Cable/Air



Press CHANNEL down to highlight Cable/Air.

## 3. Select Cable or Air



Press VOLUME + or — to select Cable or Air. Select Cable if you have cable. Select Air if you have a home antenna connected to your TV.



# **Trouble Checks**

You may have problems that can be fixed with a few minor adjustments. Look for the type of problem you are having below and then try the suggestions to get your TV going again.

## Trouble Checks and Adjustments

**Power** 

TV will not turn on Plug TV in.

Plug something else into the outlet to make sure it is working.

Make sure batteries in the remote are not dead. Aim the remote at the TV and press POWER.

Make sure batteries are placed in the remote the right way. See batteries

Unplug TV for a few minutes and then turn it on again.

# **Glossary**

#### Antenna

A device used to receive broadcast signals from TV stations.

### **Audio**

Sound reproduced by the TV.

## Audio/video cables

Cables that carry sound and picture signals from one component to another.

#### Autocolor

Adjusts the Color and Tint of the picture signals to the proper balance for all channels.

### Autoprogram

A procedure that automatically adds only the active channels in your area to the TV's memory.

## Brightness

Light and dark areas of a picture.

## **Channel Memory**

Where channels are stored after they have been placed in memory. Channels can be added or deleted from channel memory.

## **Commercial Skip**

A feature that allows the viewer to scan other channels during commercials, and return to the original channel after a timed break.

### Component

Device such as VCR, laserdisc player, audio equipment, camcorder, etc.

#### **Disabled**

Turns off feature.

## **Display**

A word, words or graphics that appear on the TV screen.

### **Inputs**

Located on back of the TV for connection of a component to the TV. Used to route signals into the TV from components.

#### **Jacks**

Connectors located on the back of the TV for connecting antennas or other components.

#### Menu

A listing of features, controls, and adjustments shown on the TV screen that can be changed.

#### Mono

Slang for monaural. Sound comes through one channel.

### **On-Screen Display**

See Display.

## **Picture Reset**

Returns all of your TV picture adjustments back to the factory setting.

## **Sharpness**

Clearness of a picture.

## **SKIP** See Commerical Skip.

## Signal

Electrical waves that are sent or received through cables or through the air

## **Sleep Timer**

A feature where the TV can be set to turn off at a specific time within four hours.

### Source(s)

Components or devices that are connected to the TV.

#### Stereo

Sound signals that come through two channels (left and right).

### **Tone**

Quality of the sound.

### **Tuner**

A device that receives and selects signals. The desired signal is selected by the tuner.

## **Unusable Signal**

A message that shows no signal is coming in on the video input.

### Video

Picture reproduced by the television.
