

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CAUTIONS ON USING THIS PLAYER

CAUTIONS ON USING THIS PLAYER

1. DO NOT MOVE THE PLAYER DURING PLAYBACK

During playback, the disc spins at high speed. So do not lift or move the player. Doing so may damage the disc.

2. TRANSPORTING THE PLAYER

Before transporting the player, be sure to remove the disc and turn off the power, then unplug the power cord.

3. PLACE OF INSTALLATION AT HOME

Select a stable place upon which to site the DVD player.

Do not place the player on top of a TV or color monitor.

Install the player away from cassette decks or other devices which are easily affected by magnetic forces.

4. DO NOT PLACE OBJECTS ON TOP OF THE PLAYER

Do not expose this apparatus to rain, moisture, dipping or splashing and no objects filled with liquids, such as vases, shall be placed on the apparatus.

5. TURN OFF THE POWER WHEN NOT USING THE PLAYER

If the player is in use, switch the power off.

6. SPECIAL NOTE REGARDING USE OF PLAYER IN VEHICLES

- We strongly advise against using the player in the front seat whilst driving.
- Most countries and states have laws which prohibit or severely restrict the use of the player in the front of vehicles while driving.
- Do not leave the player in places where the temperature is extremely low (About-10°C or lower) or extremely high (About 60°C or higher), such as inside the vehicle or luggage compartment in midsummer. Doing so may warp the outer case or reduce the performance.

7. WHEN USING THE DVD PLAYER IN A CAR

Always switch the engine on, before connection power to the DVD player.

8. CLEANING THE PLAYER

Normally clean the player with a soft, dry cloth. For tough dirt, apply some neutral detergent diluted in 5 to 6 parts water to a soft cloth, wring out thoroughly. Wipe off the dirt, then wipe off the player with a dry cloth. Note that alcohol, thinner, benzene, insecticides, etc., may cause the print or coating to peel off. Also avoid leaving rubber or plastic products in contact with the player for long periods of time, as this may damage the cabinet. When using chemically treated cloths, read the cloth's instructions carefully. Always unplug the power cord from the power outlet before cleaning the player.

TOP PANEL BUTTON DEFINITION



1 Volume UP/ down button

Press "+" button to increase the volume.

Press "-" button to decrease the volume.

In the menu state, press +/- buttons to move the cursor right/left.

2 PREV/NEXT button

Press | to locate the previous track or chapter.

Press ▶►I to locate the next track or chapter.

In the menu state, press ▶▶| / ◄◄ buttons to move the cursor down/up.

3 OPEN

Press it to open the disk cover.

4 PLAY / PAUSE button

Press it to play. When pressing during playback, pause mode is set. Press again to resume playback.

In the menu state press PLAY/ PAUSE to accept a menu operation as OK.

5 STOP button

Press it to stop playback.


6 Power ON/OFF button

Press for 3 seconds to turn the unit ON or OFF.


REAR SIDE

HOW TO STAND




- 1) Pull out the support to the full extent.

REMOTE CONTROL



KEY DESCRIPTION OF REMOTE CONTROL

1 SFTUP

Press this button to display setup screen when at stop status.

2 AUDIO

Press this button to switch the audio languages on the DVD.

3 SUBTITLE

Press this button to switch the DVD's subtitle language.

4 MENU

Press this button to display the DVD's menu screen.
While playing VCD disk, press it to switch between menu on or off

5 MODE

It is the shortcut key for AV IN founction

6 ()

Move the cursor up.

7 OSD

Press this button to display the disc's information.

8 PROGRAM

Program playing order of tracks.

9 (←)

Move the cursor left.

10 OK

Confirm and enter the selected item

11 (→)

Move the cursor right.

12 SEARCH

Locate title/ chapter/ playtime to play.

13 PREV(►)

Jump to previous track.

14(♥)

Move the cursor down.

15 NEXT(►►)

Jump to next track.

16 STOP(■)

Press this button to stop playback.

17 REV(**◄**◀)

Fast backward key.

18 PLAY/PAUSE (►II)

Press this button to play or pause playback.

19 FWD(▶▶)

Fast forward key.

20 STEP/SLOW(I►)

During playing status, press it to switch to SLOW mode, while switch to STEP mode at pause status.

21 ZOOM

Zoom the picture on screen.

22 RETURN

Return back to menu screen.

If menu setting is off when playing VCD, the key is invalid.

23 TITLE

Press this button to display the DVD's title.

24 CLEAR

Clear the numbers inputted before.

25 REPEAT

For DVDs, use this button to play titles or chapters repeatedly. For CDs, use this button to play tracks or the entire disc repeatedly.

26 A-B REPEAT

Press this button during playback to set two points and play the section between them repeatedly.

27 ANGLE

Press this button to switch angle.

28 SHIFT

Press this button to switch between number & function. (Default: function)

29 MUTE

Press this button to mute the player.

30 Vol -

Press it to decrease the volume

31 Vol +

Press it to increase the volume

32 NUMBER KEYS



NOTES ON USING THE REMOTE CONTROL UNIT


- Do not drop or step on the remote control unit or subject it to shocks.
- Note that the remote control unit may not work if there are obstacles between the remote sensor and itself.
- Do not expose the remote sensor to strong light. Doing so may make operation impossible.
- Use the remote control unit within the specified operating range.

REPLACING THE BATTERY

1 Insert your finger nails into A and B on the diagram below, press A according to the direction, then pull out the battery holder.



3 Fit the battery holder back to its place.



2 Remove the old battery, then insert the new battery into the battery holder with the + side facing upwards.



Lithium battery (CR2025)

NOTE:

- To prevent leakage of fluid from the lithium battery, remove the battery when not using the remote control unit for long periods of time (one month or more). If the battery leaks fluid, carefully wipe it out of the battery case, then change to a new lithium battery.
- Caution: The battery may present a risk of fire if mistreated. Do not recharge, disassemble, or heat it above 100°C.
- Replace battery with the same type. Dispose of used battery properly, keep away from children and do not dispose of in fire.

PARTS AND CONTROLS

FITTING HEADREST MOUNT

The headrest mount is designed to fit the wide variety of shapes and sizes of headrests in modern cars. The foam pad allows you to set the angle of the screen and will eliminate vibration when the car is moving.

- Place the two mounting straps over your headrest with the mount's sponge facing headrest, and release button on top.
- Adjust to your desired viewing angle, then firmly secure the mount by tightening the straps.See diagrams below.





FITTING PORTABLE DVD PLAYER TO HEADREST MOUNT


Gently slide the Portable DVD player down by aligning the backpanel groove with the headrest mount, until you hear the click sound. See diagram below.



NOTE:


The headrest is a primary safety device in a car. Always adjust the headrest for optimum safety of the seat occupant. Fit & adjust the headrest mount thereafter.

CONNECTING THE PLAYER TO A TV SET



Use the supplied AV cable to connect between the DVD player and your TV set, as shown.


CONNECTING THE ADAPTER TO THE DC IN 12V SOCKET



NOTE:

Do not connect to 24V supply or damage will result.

USING THE EARPHONE



- 1. Set the volume control to minimum sound level.
- 2. Connect the plug of earphone to the player's " Ω " jack.
- 3. Adjust the volume control to the preferred sound level.


NOTE:

Connecting the earphones will result in the disconnection of the internal speaker of the DVD player.

CONNECTING TO A DOLBY DIGITAL/MPEG DECODER OR AN AMPLIFIER WITH BUILT-IN DECODER

With this player, you can enjoy powerful Dolby Digital or MPEG sound. Output the digital signals from the player's digital output to a decoder or amplifier with built-in decoder.




Hint:

For a compatible decoder or amplifier, 5 speakers (Front left/ right, center and surround left/ right) and a subwoofer are required to enjoy Dolby Digital channel sound.

CONNECTING THE PLAYER TO OTHER DEVICES

CONNECTING TO A DOLBY DIGTAL AMPLIFIER THAT IS NOT DOLBY DIGITAL / MPEG COMPATIBLE

Output the digital signals from the player's digital output to a digital amplifier that is not Dolby/ MPEG compatible. For instructions of audio settings, refer to AUDIO OUT of AUDIO SETUP.




Notes:

Carefully check the player's digital output settings before connecting the player to an amplifier equipped with a digital audio input jack which is not Dolby Digital / MPEG compatible. Do not play DVDs when the audio settings are not correct. Or it may cause strong noise and damage your speakers.

CONNECTION BETWEEN PLAYERS


AVP CABLE (Audio / Video / Power Cable)



NOTE: The AVP Cable has different size plugs and colors at either ends. Pay carefully attention to ensure correct orientation. Do not force.

Connect the two players with AVP cable as described below:

- 1. Disconnect any 12V DC supply from both master & slave DVD players.
- Connect the AVP cable into the master unit by inserting the DC OUT section of the cable to the DC OUT socket of the master unit.
- 3. Plug the DC IN section of the cable to the DC IN socket of the slave unit.
- Connect the white Audio plug of the AVP cable to the audio IN/ OUT socket on both DVD players.
- Connect the yellow video plug of the AVP cable to the video IN/ OUT socket on both DVD players.



NOTE:

There's no actual difference between master unit and slave DVD players. Either of them can be appointed as master unit, then the other one acts as slave unit accordingly.

MOVIE SHARE OPERATION

■ WHEN SHARING THE SAME MOVIE: IN CAR

- Connect the two players with AVP cable first, and then plug the car power cable to DC IN socket of the master unit.
- 2. Turn on the two players.
- 3. Switch the SLAVE unit to AV IN status to stop normal playback and let it act as a monitor. Press the MODE button on the remote control to select AV IN function.

CONNECTION BETWEEN PLAYERS



- 4. Put a disc into the master unit to play the movie.
- 5. Both DVD players now show the same movie.
- WHEN ENJOYING TWO DIFFERENT MOVIES: IN CAR



- Connect the two players with AVP cable first, and then plug the car power cable to DC IN socket of the Master unit.
- 2. Turn on the two players.
- 3. Put two different discs into these two players respectively.
- 4. The fantastic thing is that you can enjoy two different movies on these two players at the same time


NOTE:

- There's no actual difference between master unit and slave unit. Any of them can be appointed as master unit, then the other one acts as slave unit accordingly.
- 2. One AC/DC adapter cannot supply enough power for two DVD players simultaneously. For home using, two adapters are provided. Each adapter can only service one DVD player. Simply Connect each adapter to the DC IN socket upon the two DVD player. Video & Audio jacks of both DVD players should be connected with the AVP cable, but no need to connect the "DC OUT" jack.
- For car using, the car power cable can be used for two DVD players to enjoy movie-share or two different movies simultaneously.

CONNECTION BETWEEN PLAYERS

■ IR TRANSMITTER'S CHANNEL ADJUSTMENT

- When sharing the same movie, i.e. one DVD player acts as a monitor, the two DVD players can choose the same IR channel option simultaneously.
- 2.When enjoying two different movies, the IR channels of the two DVD players must be adjusted to channel A and channel B respectively. Or interference will occur. See diagram below.
- 3.The relevant IR headphones should be switched to the corresponding channels in compliance with the IR channel options of DVD players.





TURNING ON THE POWER





- 1 Connect the AC/DC adapter to socket, or connect the cigarette plug to the outlet on your vehicle.
- 2 Connect the DC output plug of the cable to the DC input jack on the main DVD player.
- 3 Hold on the Power button for 3 secs to turn on the unit.


The included AC/DC adapter is compatible with voltage from 100 V to 240 V, you can use it on trips overseas.

Note that you may need a converter plug (Available in stores) suited for the region in which you are travailing.

TURNING OFF THE POWER

- 1. When the power is on, press and hold on the Power ON / OFF button for 3 Secs to turn off the player.
- Unplug the power cord from the power outlet, or disconnect the cigarette power cable.
- 3.Disconnect the DC plug from the player's DC input jack.

LOADING



 Open TFT cover first, the disc cover will be opened thereafter.

Place in a disc and press down the disc with your fingers near the center hole.

A click is heard.

Notes:

- Set the disc securely. Failure to set it securely could result in damage.
- Do not use cracked or warped discs.
 Doing so could result in damage.
- Place single-sided DVDs or CDs in with the label (Printed) side facing upwards.

For double-sided DVDs, check each side carefully, then place the disc in securely (Until a click is heard).


- For CDs or one-sided DVDs, you do not have to worry about touching the label (Printed) side of the disc with your fingers. Since two-sided DVDs have signals recorded on both sides, so be careful not to scratch them when removing them from the player.
- 3. Close the disc cover.



PLAYBACK

28 ENG ■

- 1. Turn on the power of the player.
- 2. Open the disc cover.
- 3. Insert a disc correctly.
- 4. Close the cover.
- The player will load the disc and play automatically. If the disc does not play, push the ►■ button.




STOP PLAYBACK

- Press on the key board or on the remote control while playing.
- 2. The player remembers the stopping place.
- Resume playback from the point where it stopped by pressing the ►II key.
- To clear stopping mark, press again at stop status. The player will not play from the stopping place when pressing ►∎next time.




PAUSE PLAYBACK

- Press ►II on the key board or on the remote control during playback.
- 2. Press ►II again to resume normal playback.



PLAYING AT FAST SPEED

- Press ➤ or ◄ button on the key board or on the remote control during playback.
- The playback speed will be changed each time you press the ►► or ◄
 The speed will be changed to 2X, 4X, 8X, 20X. 1X.




PLAYBACK IN SLOW MOTION

- 1. Press the I▶ button on the remote control during playback. The playback speed becomes 1/2, 1/3, 1/4, 1/5, 1/6 or 1/7 of the normal speed each time you pressing the button.
- When press ▶ during pause status, the player will show still picture on the screen.
 The picture will be changed one piece each time the button is pressed.




NOTE:

During fast or slow motion playback, the sound is muted expect playing CD & MP3 disc. To resume normal playback press ►II.



A-B/REPEAT PLAYBACK

- 1. A-B playback
- When pressing A-B button on the remote control during playback, the current point would be located on the remote control, and "REPEAT A-" appears on the screen.



- Press A-B button again, B point would be located and the player would play from A point to B point repeatedly.
- Press A-B button again. "A-B" playback would be cancelled and the player resume normal playback.
- 2. Repeat a Title, Chapter or Track
- Press REPEAT button on the remote control during playback.
- The chapter or the title (For DVD) and the track or entire disc (For CD) will be played repeatedly.
- The REPEAT mode will be changed each time when the repeat button is pressed.

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ZOOM FUNCTION

- Press ZOOM on the remote control during playback. The picture on the screen will be zoomed.
- The zooming rate changes each time when the ZOOM button is pressed.
 The sequence is 2X, 3X, 4X, 1/2X, 1/3X, 1/4X, 1X.

SEARCHING FOR A SPECIFIC SCENE

- 1. Press the SEARCH button on the remote control.
- 2. Press the UP, DOWN and OK button to move to desired section.
- Input valid number to choose specific time or title, chapter or track.
- 4. press OK button to play the specific scene.
- Press SEARCH button to resume normal screen.

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SELECTING SUBTITLE

You can select a preferred subtitle from those included on the DVD video disc by pressing SUBTITLE button on the remote control during playback.

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CHANGING THE ANGLE

Press the ANGLE button on the remote control while playing a scene recorded with multiple angles. If your DVD disc is not recorded with multiple angles, pressing ANGLE button will not effect at all.



CHANGING THE AUDIO LANGUAGE


- Press the AUDIO button on the remote control during playback. You can select different audio languages included on the DVD video disc.
- 2. For VCD or CD, you can choose the channel to play.



PROGRAM PLAYBACK


The program playback function can automatically play titles, chapters, or tracks in accordance with the programmed order.

1. Insert a disc and then press the PROGRAM button on the remote control. At this time, menu appears as below.





 Using ←/♠ /♣ /→ and the number buttons to select the title and chapter in your preferred order.



- Using ← / ↑ / ↓ / → to move the cursor to PLAY and press OK button. The player starts PROGRAM playback.
- 4. To exit, press the PROGRAM again.

NOTES:

- When the DVD video player is turned off or the discs are removed, the programmed items will be removed.
- Referring to the disc, some may not have this function.
- Selecting an inexistent title or chapter, program playback will be canceled automatically.

USING THE ON-SCREEN DISPLAY

- This DVD video player allows you to view the operational status and disc's information on screen.
- Press OSD button on the remote control during playback. The disc's information will be displayed on screen.
- 3. Press OSD button again, the information will disappear.

- 3. MP3 ICON

Use ♠/ ♣/♣/➡ to move the cursor to a folder, a file, MP3 ICON or JPEG ICON. In order to play MP3 files, move the cursor to MP3 ICON and press OK button. In order to play JPEG files, move the cursor to JPEG ICON and press OK button. Choose the desired file and press OK to play.

Press A-B button to get A-B REPEAT function. Press REPEAT button to switch repeat mode(REP1,REP DIR, REP ALL, REP OFF).

REP1 means repeating the track; REP DIR means repeating the folder; REP ALL means repeating the whole disc.

PLAYING DivX FILES

Your player is an Official DivX Certified product that plays DivX.5, DivX.4, DivX.3 and DivX.VOD video content, in compliance with DivX Certified technical requirements.

NOTE:

To guarantee playback of DivX files the audio must be MP3 format. DivX Certified devices can play any interleaved MP3 audio at any bitrate, both CBR and VBR. The audio must be sampled at standard frequencies, such as 32 kHz, 44.1 kHz, and 48 kHz, and must conform to the AVI file specification. Apart from MP3, the audio formats recognised by your player are MPEG laver 1/2. AC3. PCM. Formats such as AAC and Ogg Vorbis are not supported by this player.

- 1. Open the compartment by pressing the OPEN button.
- 2. Place the disc with the printed side facing up and close the compartment.

NOTE:

When there are music, images and DivX files contained on one disc, press several times the ← button to access the Play type at the bottom of the screes, then use the ←or → button to select the DivX icon and press OK to confirm.

4. Select a file using the ♠ and ↓ buttons on the remote control.

NOTE:

To go back to the folder list, press ←.

- Press ►II to start playback.
- 6. Press STOP to stop playback.



USING THE USB PORT

- 1. Turn on the power of the player.
- Plug the USB stick into the USB port of the DVD player. Chose the USB option which is then displayed.

GENERAL STEPS OF SETUP




The pressing of the following buttons will turn off the setup menu, and the choices that have been changed will be saved at the same time: Subtitle, Title, Return, Stop, Play / Pause, Step, Next. Prev, Zoom, Program, Repeat, Angle, Mute.

The system setup options are illustrated below:

TV SYSTEM

If you want to connect the player to a TV, please choose a correct TV system first.

- AUTO: Choose this setting if your DVD player is connected to a multi-system TV.
- NTSC: Choose this setting if your DVD player is connected to a NTSC TV.
- PAL: Choose this setting if your DVD player is connected to a PAL TV.
- The default setting is AUTO.



NOTE:

Setting with incorrect TV system will result in black and white picture on your TV screen.

TV TYPE

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16:9 (Wide Screen): Choose this setting if your DVD player is connected to a wide screen TV. If you choose this setting and you don't have a wide screen TV, the images on the screen may appear distorted due to vertical compression.

4:3 LB (Letter Box): Choose this setting if your DVD player is connected to a normal ratio TV. You'll see the movies in their original aspect ratio (height -to width ratio). You'll see the entire frame of the movie .The movie might appear with black bars at the top and bottom of the screen.

4:3 PS (Pan& Scan): Choose this setting if your DVD player is connected to a normal ratio TV. You can fill the movie to the entire screen of your TV. This might mean that parts of the picture (the left and right edges) won't be seen.


- The image display ratio is related to the recorded disc format. Some discs can not be displayed in the aspect ratio preferred.
- If you play a disc recorded in 4:3 format on a wide screen TV, black bars will appear on the left and right sides of the screen.




PASSWORD







AUDIO LANG.

Highlight the AUDIO LANG. option, and press the Arrow buttons to choose the audio language you prefer. Press OK to confirm. If the disc you are playing has that language available, it will output audio in that language. There are 8 optional audio languages: Chinese, English, Japanese, French, Spanish, Portuguese, German and Italian.



SUBTITLE LANG.

Highlight the SUBTITLE LANG option, and press the arrow buttons to choose the subtitle language you prefer. Press OK to confirm. If the disc you are playing has that language available, it will display subtitles in that language. There are 7 optional subtitle languages: Chinese, English, Japanese, French, Spanish, German and Italian. Choose off to remove all subtitles from being displayed.



MENU LANG.

Highlight the MENU LANG option, and press the arrow buttons to choose the menu language you prefer. Press OK to confirm. If the disc you are playing has that language available, it will display menu in that language. There are 8 optional menu languages: Chinese, English, Japanese, French, Spanish, Portuguese, German and Italian.



NOTE:

If your preferred language isn't available, the disc's default language will be played. The default language of your DVD player is English.

AUDIO OUT

Highlight the AUDIO OUT option, and press the arrow buttons to choose the audio output mode you prefer. Press OK to confirm:

There are 3 optional audio output modes: SPDIF/OFF, SPDIF/RAW and SPDIF/PCM.

- SPDIF / OFF: Choose this setting to output analog signal, and there will be no digital signal output from an coaxial output jack.
- SPDIF / RAW: Choose this setting if your DVD player is connected to a power amplifier with a coaxial cable. When playing a disc recorded with Dolby Digital and MPEG audio formats, the corresponding digital signals will be outputted from the coaxial Output jack.
- SPDIF / PCM: Choose this setting if your DVD player is connected to a 2-channel digital stereo amplifier. When playing a disc recorded with Dolby Digital and MPEG audio formats, audio signals will be modulated into a 2-channel PCM signal, and it will be outputted from the coaxial Output jack.



IR HEADPHONE

Highlight the IR HEADPHONE item and use the arrow buttons to choose the following options: CHANNEL A, CHANNEL B and OFF. Press OK to confirm.

The selected IR option on the DVD player should be conformed to the adjustment of the receiving IR earphone. Or no sound can be heard.

The default setting is OFF.



Note:

Compatible IR cordless headphones are available from your NEXTBASE distributor.

FM TRANSMITTER (Optional)

- 1. The FM transmitter is an optional function.
- Press direction buttons to enter transmission frequency in MHZ press OK to input FM frequency. The prompting message "PLEASE PRESS ENTER TO INPUT FM" will appear at the bottom of the screen.
- 3. Press OK button. The prompting message will be changed to "PLEASE INPUT FM 87.6-107.9" to enter the transmission frequency input modes.
- 4. There are two frequency input modes: one is to input numbers directly; the other is to increase or decrease frequencies by the direction buttons. By pressing the Left/ Right buttons, the frequency will decrease and increase by 1 MHZ, while the Up/ Down buttons decrease and increase by 0.1 MHZ.






- The input frequency range is from 87.6-107.9 MHZ for Europe and 87.0-108.0 for Asia. The default is OFF.
- 6. If the input number is out of the range, the display frequency will be empty and the prompting message will be "FM SHOULD BE 87.6-107.9" (Europe); or "FM should be 87.0-108.0" (Asia). If the increased or decreased frequency is out of the permissible range, the frequency will be displayed in MHZ from the start once again.
- 7. Press OK button to save the choice after selecting the preferable frequency with in the permissible range. Then the player will transmit audio signal according to this frequency. Choose "OFF" to turn off the FM function.
- 8. Adjust your receiving set (eg. car stereo) to the corresponding frequency to receive the transmitted audio signal from the player.
- The transmission range will be within approximately 3 meters for Europe and 10 meters for Asia.


SOUND EFFECT

DYNAMIC RANGE

Choose this setting to adjust the line out compressing ratio and get different effects. If adjusting to FULL, the audio signal peak value will be compressed to be minimum; while adjusting to OFF, to be maximum.



DivX(R) VOD (VIDEO ON DEMAND)

DivX VOD files are downloaded after paying a rental from certain commercial websites. Prior to downloading a VOD you need to input the registration number of your DVD player on the purchase form on the site.

Write down the VOD 8-character registration number so that you can fill in the form on the website you purchase your DivX VOD files from.

Note: If you cannot play a DivX VOD file recorded on a CD-R disc after downloading it, the rental period allocated during purchasing from the website may have expired. It is also possible that the recorded file is not compatible with your player because of different versions or incorrect download parameters. The parameters used when copying to CD-R may be another reason for this.

Since it is not possible here to supply all the information, parameters and advice relating to the use of DivX VOD files, we recommend that you visit speciallist websites such as www.divx.com/vod.



BATTERY OPERATION INSTRUCTION

NAMES OF BATTERY PARTS AND THEIR FUNCTIONS



- 1 DC IN connector
- Connect the power adapter to recharge.
- 2 Player terminals Supply power to the player. Do not short-circuit the terminals.
- 3 Battery indicator LED

When the battery is discharging, LED is off. When recharging the battery, LED is red. When the LED turns from red to off, it means finishing recharging.

- 4 Slide fitting mount
- 5 battery stand

ATTACHING THE BATTERY PACK TO THE PLAYER

- 1 Attach the battery pack to the rear of the DVD player.
- 2 Slide the battery from the bottom, in an upward direction, to engage the slide fitting mount, Ensure the battery is pushed to the top of the slide to engage the connection.



Remember to insert back the rubber cover of the unit to BATTERY CONNECTOR after using the battery pack.

RECHARGING THE BATTERY PACK



Connect the output plug of AC/DC adapter to the battery pack.

Notes:

- The battery pack can be used for about 300 cycles of recharging and operations, though this is variable depending on the operating conditions.
- 2. Charge the battery pack fully before using it for the first time. Place the battery pack and AC/DC adapter on a flat surface for recharging. Do not short-circuit the terminals of the battery pack and AC/DC adapter. If the battery pack is fully recharged, the player can play DVD's continuously for about 2 hours.
- 3. The battery charger(AC/DC adapter) is compatible with supply voltage between 100V and 240 V AC and can be used universally. When you want to use it on an overseas travel, be sure to prepare a power plug adapter matching the local power outlet.
- The battery will be charged if connected to the DVD player and the DVD player is supplied with 12V DC.

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TROUBLE SHOOTING

NO PICTURE

Is screen damaged? "See smashed Screen Identification" section.

Is power applied and power light on?

Is disc cover (screen) closed correctly?

NO SOUND

Is the volume turned down?

Are headphones plugged in?

Is the wrong audio track selected from the DVD?

DISC RESET TO THE BEGINNING DURING PLAYBACK

Disc cover (LCD screen) is not firmly shut, close firmly.

DISC WON'T PLAY

Check that the disc is loaded correctly.

Check disc for dirt / scratches, change the disc.

Check disc is a good quality MPEG2 or MPEG4 standard.

Check the lens. See separate section for procedure.

Wrong region message - choose a different disc.

REMOTE CONTROL DOESN'T WORK

Approach player more closely or remove obstructions.

Replace battery for new. Type Cr2025

USB WON'T PLAY

MPEG4 is an open format, use only officially recorded quality media.

No correct format files found (Mp3 JPG etc.) on the USB stick.

DIVX MOVIE NOT SYNCHRONISED FOR SOUND

Reset the movie.

Record movies using only official DivX software.

POWER PROBLEMS

No power from car power cable. Check the fuse in the cable and check for cable damage check the player works on the mains adaptor.

No power from mains adaptor check the cable for damage. Check the player works on the car power cable.

PIXEL FAILURE

The LCD screen contains 336,960 pixels, pixels can fail during normal product life. 1 pixel = 0.0003% failure rate.

One pixel failure per year of operation is considered normal and not a cause for concern.

USE OF DVD RECORDABLE MEDIA

DVD + RW format disks may not read correctly on this DVD player as the DVD +RW format is not a fully recognized format with the DVD forum. There are significant variations in the recording / media. Use DVD-RW or DVD +/- R media in preference.

HEADREST MOUNT NOT FITTING CORRECTLY


Adjust the straps and tension them to fit correctly. Angle the mount towards the rear seat occupants.

HEADREST MOUNT SLIDES DOWN

Tighten the straps to prevent slippage.

LENS CLEANING

Poor playback may be caused by dirt on the laser lens, which could come from even a fingerprint... The first approach is to expose the DVD mechanism and clean the lens. Use a clean, dry cotton bud (add pure alcohol sparing if available) and wipe across the lens VERY gently. The lens is held is sprung suspension so be very gentle and careful.



SMASHED SCREEN IDENTIFICATION

A Liquid Crystal Display (LCD) screen is a multilayer complex component.

Under the tough outer plastic layer, the glass sandwich beneath holds the LCD crystals in place, which are themselves suspended in fluid. In the unfortunate event of an accident, particularly a sharp localized impact, the glass will break. The tough plastic outer sheet on the surface of the glass keeps all the glass intact underneath, preventing shards from falling out. This is a specific safety feature, particularly implemented for the younger user and also for in-car use. The broken glass normally shows signs of the impact mark and also cracks radiating away. The resultant fluid leakage renders the panel inoperable.

Symptoms are often a dark round mark, a white screen without picture and maybe some multicolored lines. Depending on the individual break, an element of the TV picture may remain for a while, but not for long, as the fluid leaks away. Some inky black staining may also appear upon the crack lines, as the fluid escapes.

Unfortunately a break of this nature is not covered under the manufactures warranty, as it is accidental damage to the product, rather than an original defect from manufacture. Please see below for some sample images of broken LCD panels for reference.





DAMAGE REQUIRING SERVICE

Have the unit serviced by a qualified service technician if:

- The unit has been exposed to rain or water.
- The unit does not seem to operate normally.
- The unit exhibits a marked change in performance.
