OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

















WARNING (FOR USE IN THE UNITED KINGDOM)

This appliance is supplied with a fitted three pin mains plug. A 13 amp fuse is fitted in the plug.

Should the fuse need to be replaced, use a 13 amp fuse approved by ASTA or BSI to BS 1362. When replacing the fuse, you must ensure that any removable fuse covers are correctly refitted.

If you should lose the fuse cover, please contact your nearest AIWA dealer.

Do not cut off the plug from this appliance

If the plug fitted is not suitable for the power points in your home, or the cable is too short to reach a power point, obtain an appropriate safety approved extension lead or adaptor. If in any doubt please consult a qualified electrician.

If the plug is cut off, remove the fuse and dispose of the plug immediately.

There is a danger of severe electrical shock if the cut off plug is inserted into any 13 amp socket.

If a new plug is to be fitted please ensure it contains a 13 amp fuse, otherwise the circuit should be protected by a 5 amp fuse at the distribution board.

IMPORTANT

The wires in the mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following code:

BLUE — NEUTRAL BROWN — LIVE

As the colours of the wires in the mains lead of this appliance may not correspond with the colour markings identifying the terminals in your plug, proceed as follows:

The wire which is coloured BLUE must be connected to the terminal which is marked by the letter N or coloured BLACK.

The wire which is coloured BROWN must be connected to the terminal which is marked by the letter L or coloured RED.

DO NOT connect either the BLUE or BROWN wire of the mains lead to the earth terminal (marked with the letter E or by the earth symbol $\frac{1}{2}$ or coloured GREEN or GREEN/YELLOW) of a three pin plug.



IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Read the Operating Instructions carefully and completely before operating the unit. Be sure to keep the Operating Instructions for future reference. All warnings and cautions in the Operating Instructions and on the unit should be strictly followed, as well as the safety suggestions below.

Installation

- 1 Water and moisture Do not use this unit near water, such as near a bathtub, sink, swimming pool, or the
- 2 Heat Do not use this unit near sources of heat, including heating vents, stoves, or other appliances that generate heat. This unit should not be placed in temperatures less than 5°C (41°F) or greater than 35°C (95°F).
- 3 Mounting place Place the unit:
 - on a flat, even surface
 - away from strong magnetic fields
 - at least one metre away from any radios or receivers
 Do not place heavy objects on the unit.
- 4 Ventilation The unit should be situated with adequate space around it so that proper heat ventilation is assured. Allow a clearance of 10 cm (4 in.) from the rear and the top of the unit, and 5 cm (2 in.) from each side.
 - Do not place the unit on a bed, rug, or similar surface that may block the ventilation openings.
 - Do not install the unit in a bookcase, cabinet, or airtight rack where ventilation may be impeded.
 - To avoid internal heat build-up, do not cover the ventilation openings on the rear panel.
- 5 Foreign objects and liquid Be careful that foreign objects or liquid do not enter the unit through the ventilation openings.

Electric power

1 Power sources — Connect this unit only to power sources specified in the Operating Instructions, and as marked on the unit.

2 AC power cord

- When disconnecting the mains lead, pull it out by the mains plug. Do not pull the mains lead itself.
- Never handle the mains plug with wet hands, as this could result in fire or electrical shock.
- Mains lead should be firmly secured to avoid being severely bent, pinched, or walked upon. Pay particular attention to the mains lead from the unit to the mains.
- Avoid overloading mains plugs and extension leads beyond their capacity, as this could result in fire or electrical shock.
- 3 When not in use Unplug the mains lead from the mains if the unit will not be used for several months or more. When the mains lead is plugged in, a small electrical current continues to flow into the unit, even if the power is turned off.
- 4 In case of lightning Immediately disconnect the mains lead from the mains.

Maintenance

Clean the unit only as recommended in the Operating Instructions.

Damage requiring service

Have this unit serviced by a qualified service technician if:

- The mains lead or plug has been damaged
- A foreign object or liquid has entered the unit
- The unit has been exposed to rain or water
- The unit does not seem to operate normally
- The unit exhibits a marked change in performance
- The unit has been dropped, or the cabinet has been damaged

DO NOT OPEN THE CABINET AND ATTEMPT TO SERVICE THE UNIT YOURSELF.

BEFORE USE

Please read the following before operating the DVD player.

Supported disc formats

This DVD player can play discs with the following marks only.

VIDEO	DVDs (8 cm disc/12 cm disc)
CIGITAL VIDEO	Video CDs (VCDs) (8 cm disc/12 cm disc)
COMPACT DIGITAL AUDIO	Audio CDs (8 cm disc/12 cm disc)

In addition, this unit can play back a CD-R or CD-RW that contains audio titles or MP3 files.

NOTES

- Depending on the condition of the recording equipment or the CD-R/RW disc itself, some CD-R/RW discs can not be played on this unit.
- The unit can not play back the CD-R/RW discs that contain no data or different kinds of formatted data other than MP3.
 - For more information about MP3, see page 35.
- Do not attach any seal or label to either side (the labeled side or the recorded side) of a disc.
- Do not use irregular shape CDs (example: heart-shaped, octagonal ones). It may result in malfunctions.

Notes on colour system

Although this unit is designed for the PAL,NTSC and Multi colour system, the default setting sets to the PAL colour system. When connecting to a TV set which is NTSC or Multi colour system, you need to change the TV SYSTEM SELECT switch(see page 10).

Notes on DVDs and video CDs

Some playback operations of DVDs and video CDs may be intentionally fixed by software manufacturers. As this player plays DVDs and video CDs according to disc contents designed by the software manufacturer, some playback features of this player may not be available, or other functions may be added.

Also refer to the instructions supplied with the DVDs and video CDs.

Some DVDs made for business purposes may not be played on this player.

Region code of the DVD player and DVDs

This DVD player is designed and manufactured for playback of region "2" encoded DVD software. Region code labels appear on the labels of some DVD discs to indicate which type of player can play those discs. Unless "2" is included in these labels, or "ALL" appears on the DVD disc labels, those discs cannot be played on this player. If you try to play these discs, the message "Check Regional Code" will appear on the TV screen. Some DVD discs may not have a region code label even though their playback is prohibited by area limits.

Note on DTS-encoded CDs

When playing DTS-encoded CDs, excessive noise will be exhibited from the analogue stereo outputs. To avoid possible damage to the audio system, the consumer should turn down the volume before playing back such a disc, adjust the volume gradually, and keep the volume level low. To enjoy DTS Digital SurroundTM playback, an external 5.1 channel DTS Digital SurroundTM decoder system must be conneted to the digital output of this unit.

Disc-related terms

Title (DVD only)

The longest section of a picture or a musical piece on a DVD; a movie for a picture piece on video software, or an album for a musical piece on audio software. Each title is assigned a title number enabling you to locate the title you want.

Chapter (DVD only)

Sections of a picture or a musical piece that are smaller than titles.

A title is composed of several chapters. Each chapter is assigned a chapter number, enabling you to locate the chapter you want. Depending on the disc, there may be no chapters recorded.

Track (Video CD and audio CD only)

Sections of a picture or a musical piece on a video CD or an audio CD. Each track is assigned a track number, enabling you to locate the track you want.

Scene

On a video CD with PBC (playback control) functions, moving pictures and still pictures are divided into sections called "Scenes". Each scene is displayed in the menu screen and assigned a scene number, enabling you to locate the scene you want.

A scene is composed of one or several tracks.

Types of video CDs

There are two types of video CD (VCD)s.

Video CDs equipped with PBC (Version 2.0)

PBC (playback control) allows you to interact with the system via menus, search functions or other typical computer-like operations. Moreover, still pictures of high resolution can be played, if they are included in the disc.

Video CDs not equipped with PBC (Version 1.1)

Operated in the same way as audio CDs, these discs allow playback of video pictures as well as sound, but they are not equipped with PBC.

BEFORE USE (CONTINUED)

Handling the unit

When shipping the DVD player

The original shipping carton and packing materials come in handy. For maximum protection, re-pack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.

When setting the DVD player

The picture and sound of a nearby TV, VCR or radio may be distorted during DVD playback. In this case, position the player away from the TV, radio or VCR, or turn off the player after removing the disc.

To keep the surface clean

Do not use volatile liquids, such as insecticide spray, near the player. Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the player for a long period of time. They will leave marks on the surface.

Handling discs

Do not touch the playback side of the disc.

Hold the disc by the edges so that fingerprints will not get on the surface.

Do not stick paper or tape on the disc.

Cleaning the unit

To clean the cabinet

Use a soft, dry cloth. If the surfaces are extremely dirty, use a soft cloth lightly moistened with a mild detergent solution. Do not use strong solvents, such as alcohol, benzene or thinner, as these might damage the surface of the player.

To obtain a clear picture

The DVD player is a high-tech, precision device. If the optical pick-up lens and disc drive parts are dirty or worn down, the picture quality will be poor.

Regular inspection and maintenance are recommended after every 1,000 hours of use. (This depends on the operating environment.)

Cleaning discs

Fingerprints and dust on the disc can cause poor picture quality and sound distortion. Before playing, clean the disc with a clean cloth. Wipe the disc from the center out.



Do not use strong solvents such as alcohol, benzene, thinner, commercially available cleaners or anti-static spray intended for analogue records.

Storing discs

After playing, store the disc in its case.

Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or sources of heat, or leave it in a parked car exposed to direct sunlight, as there may be a considerable temperature increase inside the car.

It is forbidden by law to copy, broadcast, show, broadcast via cable, play in public, or rent copyright material without permission.



PARTS AND CONTROLS

The instructions in this manual refer mainly to the buttons on the remote control. Buttons on the main unit with the same names as those on the remote control can be used as well.



Press to display the menu programs on the DVD.

Press to execute a forward slow playback when playing back a DVD or Video CD.



Display window

This player shows On-Screen Display messages on the screen of the TV set to which the DVD player is connected, as well as those on the display window of the unit.

The On-Screen Display messages, which accompany each operation of the unit, make operation simple and easy especially when playing DVDs or video CDs. They are also displayed when pressing the ON SCREEN DISPLAY ON /OFF button on the remote control.

The instructions in this manual refer mainly to the On-Screen Display messages.



- 1 Operating status indicator
 - Rotates when loading and playing back a disc.
- 2 VCD indicator
 - Lights when a Video CD is loaded.
- 3 CD indicator
 - Lights when a CD is loaded.
- 4 DVD indicator
 - Lights when a DVD is loaded.
- 5 TITLE indicator
 - The title number indicates the number of the title being played during a DVD playback.
- 6 CHP/TRK indicator
- The chapter number indicates the number of the chapter being played during a DVD playback.
- "PBC" is displayed and the CHP/TRK indicator disappears when a Video CD that supports PBC is loaded.
- The total number of tracks in stop mode and the number of the track being played during a playback are displayed, when a CD or Video CD that does not support PBC is loaded.
- 7 PROG. indicator
 - Lights during a programmed playback.
- 8 RANDOM indicator
 - Lights during a random playback.
- ALL ACDB repeat indicator
- CD: One track is played back repeatedly.
- ALLCD: All tracks on the disc are played back repeatedly.
- ACDB: A desired portion is played back repeatedly.

10 Time counter

- The total playing time of a Video CD or CD is displayed during stop mode. (The total playing time is not displayed when a DVD or MP3 disc is loaded.)
- The elasped time of the chapter or track is displayed.
- 11 ANGLE indicator

Blinks when a multi-angle scene comes on during a DVD playback.

12 MP3 indicator

Lights when an MP3 disc is loaded.

CONNECTIONS

At first, decide the outline of the connection among this unit, your TV set and the amplifier, etc. It is necessary to set the setup menu of this unit according to the connection.

Before connection, identify the type of your audio equipment or of the TV set referring to the following chart. Then decide the connection and the setup menu according to the types.

Before making connections

- Connect the AC cords of the unit and external equipment at the end, after finishing the other connections.
- Insert the plugs completely into the jacks. Loose connections may produce a humming sound or other noise interference.
- When using an optical connection, remove the dust cap from the DIGITAL OUT (OPTICAL) jack on the rear of this unit. Keep the cap in store. When not using optical connections, the dust cap should be in place.
- Refer to the instructions for the connected equipment.


Do not select "DOLBY DIGITAL/PCM or Stream/PCM" in the "Digital Audio Output" when connecting to an AV amplifier not equipped with a Dolby Digital decoder or DTS decoder (with an optical or coaxial connecting cord). TV SYSTEM SELECT switch

This switch enables you to make use of a TV set which is NTSC or Multi colour system. The default setting is "PAL".





REMOTE CONTROL

Installing batteries

Detach the battery cover on the rear of the remote control, and insert two R6 (size AA) batteries with **⊕** and **⊕** aligned correctly.




When to replace the batteries

The maximum operational distance between the remote control and the sensor of the units should be approximately 7 meters. If this distance decreases, replace the batteries with new ones.

NOTES

- When operating with the remote control, point the top of the remote control toward the player.
- If the unit is not going to be used for an extended period of time, remove the batteries to prevent possible electrolyte leakage.
- The remote control may not operate correctly when:
 - The line of sight between the remote control and the unit is exposed to intense light, such as direct sunlight
- There is fluorescent lighting near the remote sensor in the display window.
- Other remote controls are used nearby (those of a TV set, etc.).

PLAYBACK



About the **○** symbol display

- The
 Symbol will be displayed on the screen if you
 press a button which cannot be used or enter an
 incorrect number.
- Some DVD discs may have places where they do not allow pressing of the STOP, SKIP, or other buttons. The mark will be displayed on the screen if you press a button that is not allowed in such a place.

Getting ready to play

- Turn on the television, and set its video source (Video 1, Video 2, Video 3, etc.) to the one connected to the DVD player.
- Turn on the audio device connected to the DVD player.
 Set its input source to the one connected to the DVD player.

Press POWER.

The power comes on, and the **OSTANDBY/ON** indicator turns green.



Press ≜OPEN / CLOSE.

The disc tray opens.



2 Load a disc.


Place a disc in the tray guides (depression), with the label side facing up. When loading an 8-cm disc, place it in the inner depression.

Press ≜OPEN / CLOSE.

The disc tray closes, and the DVD player automatically begins to play the disc.

If the disc does not begin to play, press ▶.

 If a disc is placed in upside down, "DISC Error" will be indicated.

"CD" is displayed when loading a CD.

When the menu screen is displayed

The menu screen may be displayed first after loading a DVD or VCD which contains a menu.

DVD: Use ▲▼◀▶ to select the program you would like to view, then press **ENTER** to begin playback. Press **TOP MENU** or **MENU** to return to the menu screen.

VCD: Use the numbered buttons to select the program you would like to view.

Press or RETURN to return to the menu screen.

For either DVD or VCDs, menu continuations and the exact operating procedures for using the menu may vary from disc to disc. Follow the instructions on the menu screen.



This unit equips the Playback Control(PBC) On/Off function. After turning off the PBC, the unit can be play back the entire Video CD without returning to the menu screen, just like audio CDs. See "CHANGING SETUP VALUE", page 39.

To turn the power off

Press **POWER**. The unit enters the power standby mode, and the ΦSTANDBY/ON indicator turns red.

If 8 minutes have elapsed without performing any operation

The unit enters the standby mode. Therefore, if you start repeat playback, for example, and leave the unit without performing any other operation for 8 minutes, the unit will stop and enter the standby mode.

Still (Pause)

Press II during playback.

To return to normal playback Press ▶.

Frame Advance (DVD, VCD)

Press **II** while the disc is paused.

Each time you press the button, the program advances one frame. There is no audio when doing Frame Advance.

To return to normal playback

Press ►.

Stopping playback

Press .

When ■ is pressed during playback, the DVD player remembers the point at which playback stopped.

To resume play from the point where it stopped Press ▶.

To clear the point to be resumed

Press again.

When ▲ OPEN/CLOSE is pressed to open the disc tray or POWER is pressed to turn the power off, the point to be resumed is also cleared.

NOTES

- The disc continues to spin while the menu screen is displayed even if ■ is pressed. When you are finished using the DVD player, turn the power off after pressing
- During a VCD playback with the PBC feature turned on, resume function does not work.

Performing fast forward, fast reverse, or skipping operations during VCD playback with PBC on may cause the DVD player to return to the menu screen.

PLAYBACK (CONTINUED)

Fast Forward, Reverse

Press **▶▶** or **◄◄** on the remote control during playback.

Each time you press the button, the playback speed becomes faster as shown below.

DVD:



Video CD:



The playback speed is fixed to ×2 during playback of CDs.

To return to normal playback

Press ►.

NOTES

- There is no audio during DVD or Video CD playback.
- The search speed is the value of a disc which has an average bit rate. In some discs, the speed displayed on the display window may be different from the actual speed.

Slow Playback (DVD/VCD)

Press F.SLOW or B.SLOW during playback.

The playback speed changes each time the button is pressed, as shown below.

To return to normal playback

Press ►.

NOTES

- The B.SLOW playback does not work during VCDs playback.
- There is no audio during slow playback.
- Subtitles do not appear on the TV screen during slow playback.

Skipping

Press $\mathbb{I} (\mathbb{I} / \mathbb{I})$ or $\mathbb{I} (\mathbb{I} / \mathbb{I})$.

Skip to the next chapter or track: ▶▶I

The disc position advances one chapter or track each time the button is pressed.

Return to the previous chapter or track: I◄◀

In each disc, pressing I◄◀ once skips to the beginning of the chapter (track) currently being played, and pressing I◄◀ twice skips to the previous chapter.

When pressing I◄◄(I◄◄/◄◄) during VCD playback, the reverse skipping playback only skips to the beginning of the track currently being played.

To skip to the desired chapter or track directly using the remote control (VCD without PBC/CD)

When stopped or during playback, enter the desired track number using the numbered buttons on the remote control.

Example: To play track 3

Press 3 on the remote control.



On Screen Display (OSD) menu





Title search

Specify a title number.

To use this feature with Video CDs that support PBC, turn off PBC first. (See"CHANGING SETUP VALUE" on page 39.)

Chapter search

Specify a chapter number.

Time search

Specify the elapsed time of the desired location.

Title search (DVD)/Track search (VCD without PBC/CD)

Press ON SCREEN DISPLAY ON/OFF, either while playing or when stopped.

Go to step 3, if you press it while a DVD disc stops.

Press ▲ or ▼ to select "TITLE" or "TRACK".



Press ◀ or ▶ to enter the desired title or track number.



 Numbered button is also available to select the desired title number.

Press 1, 0.

If you enter the wrong number

NOTE

Chapter search will not work if you specify a chapter number which does not exist on the disc.

Time search (DVD)

With a DVD which allows displaying of elapsed time, you can specify a time on the disc to search for a desired location.

- Press ON SCREEN DISPLAY ON/OFF during playback.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select "TIME".



Use the numbered buttons to enter the time of the desired location.



How to enter numbers

Example: start play at 1 hour, 17 minutes, 30 seconds

(1:17:30)

Press 1(hour), 1,7 (minutes), then 3, 0

(seconds).

Example: start play at 8 minutes 7 seconds (0:08:07)

Press 8 (minutes), then 0, 7 (seconds).

If you enter the wrong numbers



Mark search (DVD)

Playback can restart from a memorized point. Up to 5 points can be memorized within the same title number.





Zoom function (DVD)



Random playback (Karaoke DVD/CD)

NOTES

- This function only works with DVD Karaoke discs and audio CDs.
- Video CDs that are not equipped with PBC only allow Random playback as well as audio CDs.

To turn off the PBC, see page 39.

Press RANDOM either while playing or when stopped.

The DVD player automatically begins Random Playback and "RANDOM" indicator turns on.

To resume normal playback

Press RANDOM. "RANDOM" indicator turns off.





- TRACK repeat playback will be cancelled, when changing a track by pressing ▶►I(▶►) or I◄◄(◄◄).
- All repeat playback will be cancelled, when the DVD player is stopped.

Repeating a portion between two specified points (A-B Repeat)

Allows you to select a portion of a track to be repeated. The portion to be repeated may not span a track boundary, but must be within a single track.

During playback, press A-B at the starting point of the section you want to repeat.



Press A-B again at the ending point of the section you want to repeat.

The player returns to point A and plays the section between A and B.





CREATING A 3D SURROUND EFFECT



The DVD player can produce a 3D Surround effect, using Spatializer™ N-2-2™ technology, which simulates multichannel audio playback from two conventional stereo speakers, instead of the five or more speakers normally required to listen to multi-channel audio from a home theater system. This feature works with DVD discs encoded with Dolby Pro Logic, Dolby Digital (AC-3).

Press SURROUND during playback.

Each time this button is pressed, the TV screen display changes:




Press SURROUND repeatedly until the desired sound is selected.



NOTES

- This 3D Surround effect may not be available on some DVD discs, such as those recorded with a mono audio soundtrack.
- Turn off the TV surround sound and other surround effects when using this 3D surround effect.
- For best 3D Surround effect using only two speakers it is recommended that the two speakers be positioned approximately 2m to 2.5m apart, and the listening position should be 2m to 2.5m away from the speakers.
- Do not press SURROUND while recording the music. The sound signals which come from this unit are intermitted.

CHANGING THE AUDIO TRACK



- When playing a DVD with soundtracks in multiple languages, the audio will automatically be played in the language which was selected when the DVD player was set up. If there is not a soundtrack in that language on the disc, the disc will determine which audio track is played.
- The audio track may only be changed for discs which contain multiple audio tracks.
- The number of audio tracks available differs from disc to disc.

Some discs have more than one audio track, such as soundtracks with different languages. While playing such a disc, the audio track can be changed to hear the different soundtracks.

Changing audio tracks (DVD)

1 Press AUDIO SELECT during playback.

Number of the audio soundtrack language being played back is displayed.



Press AUDIO SELECT repeatedly until the desired language is selected.



Changing audio tracks (VCD/CD)

Press AUDIO SELECT during playback.




Press AUDIO SELECT repeatedly until the desired sound is selected.

Each time you press the button, the display changes as follows.





DISPLAYING AND CHANGING SUBTITLES



When playing DVD discs which contain subtitles, you can display the subtitles on the screen or change the language of the subtitles.

Press SUBTITLE SELECT during playback.

When no subtitles are recorded, "OFF" will be displayed instead of the language number.



Press repeatedly SUBTITLE SELECT until the desired language is selected.

Number of the subtitle language being played back is displayed.



- The Symbol will be displayed if you try to show subtitles with a disc which does not contain them.
- The first subtitles displayed will be in the subtitle language selected with the subtitle setting (see page 39). If there are no subtitles in that language on the disc, the disc will determine which subtitles are shown.
- Subtitles may only be changed with discs which contain more than one set of subtitles.
- The number of subtitle languages varies from disc to disc.
- With some discs, it may take a few moments after you press SUBTITLE SELECT for the new subtitles to be displayed.

To eliminate the On Screen Subtitles.

Press **SUBTITLE SELECT** repeatedly to select **OFF** at step 2.

NOTE

When a disc supporting the closed caption is played, the subtitle and the closed caption may overlap each other on the TV screen. In this case, turn the subtitle off.

PLAYING BACK AN MP3 DISC

The DVD player can play back MP3 recorded on a CD-ROM, CD-R or CD-RW discs.

Before playing back an MP3 disc, read the following notes.

Notes on MP3 disc

About MP3

- An MP3 file is audio data compressed by using MPEG1, the audio layer-3 file-coding scheme. We call files which have the ".mp3" extension "MP3 files".
- The unit cannot read an MP3 file which has a file extension other than ".mp3".
- S is displayed on the MP3 menu if a non-MP3 file was included in a directory or folder.
- Noises may be heard if you play a non-MP3 file that has the ".mp3" extension.

The restriction of playing back MP3

- This unit can recognize up to 256 including files and folders per disc. A disc recorded with more than 256 cannot be played, including files and folders.
- The maximum allowable depth of nested folder is 50, including files.
- The unit may not play MP3 files in the order that you recorded them on the disc.
- The unit plays only the first session with a multi session disc.
- The unit plays only audio tracks if a disc contains both audio tracks and MP3 files.
- It may take over 30 seconds to read the MP3 files, depending on the complexity of the folder tree.

The limitation of indications

- Up to 14 characters are displayed for the name of a folder or track.
- Characters other than uppercase letters ("A" to "Z"), numerals ("0" to "9") and underscore ("_") may not be displayed, or may be displayed in different characters.
- The elapsed playing time on the display window may not be correct when playing MP3 files.
- Depending on the condition of the recording equipment or the CD-R/RW disc itself, a false folder or file which cannot be played on this unit is displayed on TV screen.

Tips on recording MP3

 Enjoying high quality sound, we recommend to convert to MP3 files with a sampling frequency of 44.1kHz and a fixed bit rate of 128 kbps.

To playback MP3 files in the order that you recorded

- 1 Writing software which is capable of recording MP3 files in numerical and alphabetical order is required.
- 2 Include a two or three digit number at the beginning of each file name. (e.g. "01", "02", ... or "001", "002", ...)
- 3 It's recommended that you use only the root folder (do not create child folder under the root folder).

Glossary

Extension:

An extension is the last three characters which divide a file name by period. The extension shows the attribution of the file


The extension of the MP3 file is "mp3".

Session:

A session is one section on a disc between the beginning of written data and the end of written data.

A multi-session disc is a disc which has more than two sessions.




From the following explanations, we refer to what are called "MP3 file" and "folder" in PC terminology as "track" and "album", respectively.

Playing back with MP3

Load an MP3 disc.

The MP3 menu is displayed.



NOTES

- It may take over 30 seconds to read the MP3 files, depending on the complexity of the folder tree.
- If you press of RETURN, MENU or TOP MENU during playback, the playback stops.

Press ▲/▼ to select the album with the track that you want to play back.



To return to the previous MP3 menu Press & RETURN.

To move to the first MP3 menu Press MENU.

Press ENTER and Press ▲/▼ to select the desired track.



To return to the top of page within the album Press TOP MENU.

Pressing **TOP MENU** repeatedly, the pages within the album will change by turns.

Press ENTER or ►.

Playback starts and will stop after playing back all of the tracks within the album.

To skip to the desired track during playback

Press ▶▶I or I◄◄ repeatedly during playback.

Or press ▲/▼ to select the desired track and press ENTER.


Playback skips to the desired track within the album.

To stop playback

Press ■.

To pause playback

Press **II** during playback. To return to play back, Press **▶**.



NOTE

<u>Comparing with Audio CD operations</u>, the following playback and functions do not work when playing back an MP3 disc.







The programs are also cleared when the disc is removed.

To return to the normal playback

Press ◀. Then select a desired track or an album.

NOTES



CHANGING SETUP VALUES



Your DVD player comes from the factory with all the basic items set properly.

- Check the "Digital Audio Output" and "TV Aspect" settings to make sure they are correct for the type of equipment connected to your DVD player. For more information, please refer to the "Connections" section, which begins on page 10.
- Change any other settings according to your individual setup and preferences.

Basic operations

Press SETUP either while playing or when stopped.

The setup menu is displayed.



Press ▲/▼ to select the desired item.

Disc Audio*

Sets the audio soundtrack language.

Disc Subtitle*

Sets the subtitle language.

Disc Menu*

Sets the language used in the menu screen.

* If the language selected by these settings does not exist on the disc, the disc's default language is used.

Rating

When playing discs with preset restriction level encoding, this setting allows the unit to automatically cut scenes of excessive violence, etc.

Password

Sets the password to prevent children from changing the restriction level.

TV Aspect

Sets the aspect ratio of the televison set to which the unit is connected.

Menu Language

Sets the language on this setup menu.

TV Output Select

Selects the video output jacks to be output video signals.

CAUTION

Do not select "S-Video" when connecting to the TV set with the 21pin scart cable. Video signals are not output from the 21pin scart connector of this unit.

Others

Sets the Pseudo PAL and PlayBack Control(PBC) function On/Off.

Digital Audio Output


Sets the digital audio output to be output from the unit according to the type of audio equipment connected to the unit.

Press ▶ and then ▲/▼ to select the desired setting and press ENTER.

• Some items require additional steps.

To exit SETUP menu

Press SETUP or RETURN.



Disc Audio

The audio sound track language on a DVD disc can be changed. If the language selected is not available on the disc, the original language designated by each disc will be selected.

1 At the SETUP menu, press ▲/▼ to select "Disc Audio" and press ▶.



Press ▲/▼ to select the desired language and press ENTER.

Original: The original language of each

disc will be selected.

English: The English will be selected. French: The French will be selected. German: The German will be selected. Spanish: The Spanish will be selected. Italian: The Italian will be selected. Chinese: The Chinese will be selected. Polish: The Polish will be selected. Hungarian: The Hungarian will be selected. Russian: The Russian will be selected. Other: Another language can be

selected. You can input a 4-digit language code. (Refer to the language codes on page 47. Press CLEAR if an incorrect language code is entered.)

Disc Subtitle

The subtitle language on a DVD disc can be changed. If the language selected is not available on the disc, the original language designated by each disc will be selected.

At the SETUP menu, press ▲/▼ to select "Disc Subtitle" and press ▶.



Press ▲/▼ to select the desired language and press ENTER.

Disc Menu

The language used in the DVD menu can be changed. If the language selected is not available on the disc, the original language designated by each disc will be selected.

At the SETUP menu, press ▲/▼ to select "Disc Menu" and press ▶.




Rating

Some DVD discs contain a restriction level which enables parents to remove scenes or prevent playback of discs by children. The unit is equipped with a password designed to prevent children changing the level.

At the SETUP menu, press ▲/▼ to select "Rating" and press ▶.



Press ▲/▼ to select the desired level and press ENTER.



You cannot play DVD discs rated higher than the level you selected unless you cancel the parental lock function. For example, when you select level 6, discs rated higher than level 6 are blocked and cannot be played.

The parent lock level is equivalent to the following USA movie ratings.


The password (4-digit) can be set not to change the Rating easily. After setting the password, the Rating can not be changed unless you input the password.

Password

A 4-digit password can be set to prevent playback of discs with higher ratings.


At the SETUP menu, press ▲/▼ to select "Password" and press ▶.




Input a 4-digit password using the numbered buttons, then press ENTER.

Example: 1234

Do not forget your password.



Input the 4-digit password again to verify, then press ENTER.



Setting is finished and the SETUP menu is displayed.



The rating is locked. Any discs whose rating is higher than the setting cannot be played back unless the correct password is entered.

To change the settings

To change the rating level, enter your 4-digit password and follow the steps on page 41 again.

To change the password

- 1 At the SETUP menu, select "Password" and press ▶.
- 2 Input the 4-digit password and press ENTER.
- 3 Select "Change" and press ENTER.
- 4 Follow step 2 to 3 on the left.

To clear the password

- 1 At the SETUP menu, select "Password" and press ▶.
- 2 Input the 4-digit password and press ENTER.
- 3 Select "Clear" and press ENTER.

When you forget your 4-digit password

If you forget your password, follow the procedure below.

- 1 At the SETUP menu, select "Password".
- 2 Enter the 6-digit number "210499" and then press ENTER.

The 4-digit password is cleared.


TV Aspect

Select the appropriate screen type according to your TV set; conventional size screen (4:3) or wide-screen (16:9).

At the SETUP menu, press ▲/▼ to select "TV Aspect" and press ▶.



Press ▲/▼ to select the desired Aspect and press ENTER.



4:3 Letterbox: Setect when a conventional TV set is connected. Media recorded in wide (16:9) format will be played in "letterbox" style, with black bands at the top and bottom of


the screen.

4:3 Panscan:

Media recorded in wide (16:9) format will be played at the full screen height, with the left and right portions cut off, for media which contains pan-scan encoding. Other media will be played in "letterbox" style.




Played in "FULL" size. (Setting the widescreen TV to "FULL" mode is also necessary.)

Menu Language

At the SETUP menu, press ▲/▼ to select "Menu Language" and press ▶.



Press ▲/▼ to select the desired language and press ENTER.



English: The setup menu is displayed in English. Spanish: The setup menu is displayed in Spanish. French: The setup menu is displayed in French. German: The setup menu is displayed in German. Italian: The setup menu is displayed in Italian.


TV Output Select

Select "S-Video" when connecting to a TV set with an S-Video cord.

CAUTION

Do not select "S-Video" when connecting to the TV set with the 21pin scart cable. Video signals are not output from the 21pin scart connector of this unit.

At the SETUP menu, press ▲/▼ to select "TV Output Select" and press ▶.



Press \triangle/∇ to select the desired items and press ENTER.

Video output settings

S-Video:

Video signals are output from the S-VIDEO OUT jack on the unit.

SCART R-G-B:

Video signals are output from the 21-pin scart connector on the unit.


NOTE

Video signals are always output from the VIDEO OUT jack on the unit regardless of these settings.

Others (Pseudo PAL/PBC)

The Pseudo PAL and Playback Control settings(PBC) can be changed.

At the SETUP menu, press \triangle/∇ to select "Others" and press ▶.



Press ▲/▼ to select the desired items and press ENTER.

Pseudo PAL settings

Pseudo PAL On:

A NTSC DVD disc can be played back with the PAL colour system TV set, depending on the disc.

Pseudo PAL Off:

A NTSC DVD disc cannot be played back with the PAL colour system TV set.

NOTE

The Pseudo PAL function only works when TV SYSTEM SELECT switch on the rear panel is set to "PAL".

PlayBack Control (PBC) settings

PBC On:

Video CDs are played back according to the PBC.

PBC Off:

Video CDs can be played back in the same way as Audio CDs.

Digital Audio Output


Each DVD disc has a variety of audio output options. Set the player's Digital Audio Output according to the type of audio system you use.

CAUTION

If the AV amplifier is not equipped with a Dolby Digital decoder or DTS decoder, do not select "DOLBY DIGITAL/PCM or Stream/PCM" in the "Digital Audio Output" when connecting the AV amplifier with an optical or coaxial connecting cord.

Merely attempting to play a DVD may cause a high level of noise which could be harmful to your ears and damage the speakers. In such a case, be sure to select "PCM".

At the SETUP menu, press ▲/▼ to select "Digital Audio Output" and press ▶.



Press ▲/▼ to select the desired output and press ENTER.



DOLBY DIGITAL/PCM:

Select this when connecting to an AV amplifier or other equipment that is equipped with a Dolby Digital (AC-3) decoder or a Dolby Pro Logic Surround decoder.

Stream/PCM:

Select this when connecting to an AV amplifier or other equipment that is equipped with a DTS decoder or a MPEG decoder.

PCM:

The default setting is "PCM". Select this when connecting to an audio system without a Dolby digital(AC-3), DTS or other special decoder.
