1. The Basics

Front View of Your Phone



Key Features

- 1. Earpiece lets you hear the caller and automated prompts.
- Main LCD (display) displays the phone's main menu, features, modes, etc.
- **3. Softkey (left)** lets you select the menu corresponding to the bottom left line on the Main LCD.
- 4. Navigation Key lets you navigate quickly and easily through the menu options. You can access the menu shortcuts by pressing Right: Contacts, Left: Shortcut, Up: Messaging, and Down: Downloads.
- MENU/OK lets you access the phone's menus and select menu options.
- Camera Key lets you access the Picture & Video menu and take pictures and videos.
- TALK Key lets you place or receive calls, answer Call Waiting, or use Three-Way Calling.
- 8. Microphone to speak into or record your voice.
- **9. Accessories Connector** connects accessories such as the travel charger (included).
- 10. Keypad lets you enter numbers, letters, and characters, and navigate within menus. Press and hold keys 2-9 for speed dialing.
- SPEAKER Key lets you place or receive calls in speakerphone mode.
- END/POWER Key lets you turn the phone on/off, end a call, or return to standby mode.
- Side Camera Key lets you activate the camera and video mode and take pictures and videos.
- **14. BACK Key** lets you display the previous page or clear characters from the screen.
- **15. Side Call Key** lets you place calls without opening the phone.
- **16. Softkey (right)** lets you select the menu corresponding to the bottom right line on the Main LCD.

- 17. **Speaker** lets you hear different ringers and sounds. You can mute the ringer when receiving incoming calls by pressing (NOTO), (ASC), or any of the side keys.
- **18. LED Indicator** shows your phone's connection status at a glance.
- **19. Sub LCD** lets you monitor the phone's status and see who's calling without opening the phone.
- Flash the built-in flash lets you take pictures and videos in low light.
- **21. Camera Lens** the built-in camera lens lets you take pictures and videos.
- **22. Antenna** fully extend the antenna for the best reception.
- Headset Jack allows you to plug in an optional headset for convenient, hands-free conversations.
- **24. 10-4 Button** allows you to access the 10-4 List. (See "Displaying the 10-4 List" on page 93.)
- **25. Side Up/Down Key** lets you adjust the receiver volume during a call or ringer volume in standby mode. You can also use it to scroll up or down to navigate through the different menu options.

Viewing the Display Screen

This list identifies the symbols you'll see on your display screen.

- ▶ ¶₁ shows your current signal strength. The more lines you have, the stronger your signal.
- ▶ 🖹 means your phone cannot find a signal.
- ► Gindicates the call is on hold.
- ▶ indicates a call is in progress.
- ▶ ∏indicates 1X Services/10-4 access is available.
- ▶ M indicates 1X Services/10-4 access is not available.
- ▶ ¶ indicates 1X Services/10-4 access is dormant. (Voice calls can still be made or received.)
- ▶ **1** indicates 1X Services/10-4 access is active.
- ▶ ⊞indicates you are roaming on an analog service network.
- ▶ indicates you are roaming on a digital service network.
- ▶ 🖪 indicates you are on an analog service network.
- ▶ 💺 indicates you have missed voice calls.
- ▶ 📥 indicates you have missed 10-4 calls.
- ▶ **□** indicates the 10-4 service is enabled.
- ▶ 🖹 indicates the 10-4 service is unavailable.
- ▶ indicates the 10-4 service is enabled and the speakerphone mode is set to ON.
- ▶ indicates you have schedule events or call alarms.
- indicates you have alarm clock notifications.
- ▶ ☑ indicates you have new voicemail messages. Press and hold ☐ to call your voicemail box.
- Indicates you have new text messages, picture messages, and video messages.
- ▶ 📆 indicates you have new voicemail and text messages.
- ▶ !!! indicates you have urgent messages.
- ! indicates you have two or more different types of missed calls, schedule events, call alarms, or alarm clock notifications.

- IIII shows the level of your battery charge. The more black you see, the more power you have left.
- ▶ **!** indicates your battery is charging.
- ▶ ♦ indicates you have menus to scroll (in four directions).
- ▶ }ा{indicates the vibrate feature is set to ON.
- ▶ Mindicates volume level 4 or 1 and vibrate feature are set to ON.
- An indicates a beep sounds once when you receive a phone call or message, etc.
- ▶ 🔭 indicates the voice call ringer setting is OFF.
- M indicates all the sound settings are OFF.
- $\blacktriangleright \ \oplus$ indicates the Location Service of your phone is enabled.
- ▶ 🕅 indicates the Location Service of your phone is disabled.

- ▶ 🜓 indicates the Screen Call Auto setting is ON.

- ▶ **|** indicates the speakerphone mode is set to ON.

Turning Your Phone ON and OFF

Turning Your Phone ON

► To turn your phone on, press END/O.

Once your phone is ON, it displays "Looking for service..." which indicates that your phone is searching for a signal. When your phone finds a signal, it automatically enters standby mode. At this point, you are ready to begin making and receiving calls.

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. When a signal is found, your phone automatically returns to standby mode.

In Power Save mode, your phone searches for a signal periodically without your intervention. You can also initiate a search for service by pressing any key (when your phone is turned ON).

Tip: The Power Save feature helps to save your battery power when you are in an area where there is no signal.

Turning Your Phone OFF

Press and hold until you see the powering down animation on the display screen.

Your screen remains blank while your phone is off (unless the battery is charging).

Using the Battery

Installing the Battery

To install the Lilon battery:

➤ To install, insert the battery into the opening on the back of the phone and gently press down until the latch snaps into place.



Removing the Battery

To remove your battery:

- **1.** Make sure the power is off so that you don't lose any stored numbers or messages.
- **2.** Press the battery release latch up and remove the battery from the phone at a 45-degree angle.



Charging the Battery

Your phone comes with a rechargeable battery. You should charge the battery as soon as possible so you can begin using your phone.

Keeping track of your battery's charge is important. If your battery level becomes too low, your phone automatically turns off and you will lose all the information you were just working on. For a quick check of your phone's battery level, glance at the battery charge indicator located in the upper-right corner of your phone's display screen. If the battery charge is getting too low, the battery icon papears and the phone sounds a warning tone.

Always use an approved travel charger or vehicle power adapter to charge your battery.

Warning! Using the wrong battery charger could cause damage to your phone and void the warranty.

Note: Long backlight settings, searching for service, vibrate mode, and browser use affect the battery's talk and standby times.

Using the Travel Charger

To use the travel charger provided with your phone:

- 1. Plug the travel charger into a wall outlet.
- Plug the other end of the travel charger into the phone's charger jack (with the battery installed).

Charging when your phone is turned on:

The battery icon appears on the display while charging. The battery icon turns to the when charging is complete.

Charging when your phone is turned off:

The battery icon appears, and the message "BATTERY CHARGING-Power Off-" is shown on the display while charging. When the battery is completely discharged, you may wait for several minutes until the message is shown on the display. The battery icon turns to , and message changes to "CHARGING COMPLETE-Power Off-" when charging is complete.

Tip: Be sure to watch your phone's battery level indicator and charge the battery before it runs out of power.

Displaying Your Phone Number


- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Contacts and press 🐯.
- 3. Highlight My Phone# and press ...

Note: To access the phone's main menu, press from standby mode. Menu items may be selected by highlighting them with the navigation key and pressing , or you can press the number corresponding to the menu item on your keypad.

Changing the Faceplate

Removing the Faceplate

 Press down on both edges of the faceplate and slide it to remove.



Installing the Faceplate

Fit the hooks into the notches and slide the faceplate until it snaps into place.



Making and Answering Calls


Making Calls

To place a call using your keypad:

- 1. Make sure your phone is on.
- 2. Enter a phone number from standby mode. (If you make a mistake while dialing, press to erase one digit at a time. Press and hold to erase the entire number.)
- 3. Press TALK or SPEAKER.
- **4.** When you're finished, press (END/O).

Tip: To redial your last outgoing call, press TALK or SPEAKER twice.

Important: When you use your phone to maximize performance, extend the antenna and do not touch the antenna.



To place a call with the flip closed:

- 1. Make sure your phone is on.
- **2.** Press and hold on the right side of the phone.
- **3.** Follow the system prompts. (The call will be made in speakerphone mode, unless you have a headset attached to the phone.)
- ▶ **Redial** to redial the last number you called.
- ➤ Voice Dial to use the Voice Dial function (see "Using Voice-Activated Dialing" on page 84).

Tip: This function is available only when the Side Key Guard setting is off. See page 51 for the Side Key Guard.

Note: To use a Voice Dial, you must have stored Voice Dial entries (see "Programming Voice Dial Tag to Your Phone" on page 84).

Dialing Options

Dialing options are displayed when you press Options (right softkey) after entering numbers in standby mode.

To select an option, highlight it and press .



- ▶ **Call** to dial the phone number.
- ▶ Call:Speaker On to dial the phone number in speakerphone mode.
- ▶ **Send Message** to send a text, picture, or video message (mobile numbers only). (See page 112, 140 or 141.)
- ▶ Save Phone# to save the phone number in your Contacts list. (See "Saving a Phone Number" on page 21.)
- Find to display Contacts list entries that end with the digits you entered. (See "Finding a Phone Number" on page 22.)
- ▶ **H** Hard Pause to insert a hard pause. (See "Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 22.)
- ▶ **1 2-Sec. Pause** to insert a 2-second pause. (See "Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 22.)
- **Hyphen** to insert a hyphen manually where you like.

Tip: To Speed Dial a phone number, press and hold the appropriate Speed Dial location from 2-9. See page 69 for setting.

Answering Calls

To answer an incoming call with the flip open:

- 1. Make sure your phone is on. If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail.
- 2. Press TALK or FEALER to answer an incoming call. (Depending on your phone's settings, you may also answer incoming calls by opening the phone or by pressing any number key. See "Setting Any Key Answer" on page 44 for more information.)

To answer an incoming call with the flip closed:

- **1.** Make sure your phone is on. (If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail.)
- 2. When your phone rings or vibrates, press and hold the 10-4 button (••••) on the left side of the phone or press and hold the Side Call key (•••) on the right side of the phone. (The call will be answered in speakerphone mode.)

- or -

Open the phone to use the earpiece.

Note: If the setting for Open Flip is not set to **Answer Call**, opening the phone will not answer the call. (See "Setting the Open/Close Flip Option" on page 50.)

Your phone notifies you of incoming calls in the following ways:

- ► The phone rings or vibrates.
- ▶ The LED flashes.
- ► The backlight illuminates.
- ► The screen displays an incoming call message.
- ▶ If available, the phone number of the caller is displayed.
- If the phone number is in your Contacts list, the contact's name is displayed.

The following options are also displayed by pressing **Options** (right softkey).

To select an option, highlight it and press 🐯.

- Answer to answer the call.
- ▶ **Answer:Speaker** to answer the call in speakerphone mode.
- Answer on Hold to put the call on hold. (See "Setting Answer on Hold" on the next page.)
- ➤ Screen Call to answer the call by using pre-recorded announcement. (This feature appears when you are in service area or digital roaming area.) See page 89 for setting up.
- ► Quiet Ringer to mute the ringer. (This feature appears when the ringer is set.)

Note: If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail.

Setting Answer on Hold

This feature allows you to hold an incoming call when you cannot answer immediately.

To set Answer on Hold:

- **1.** When you receive an incoming call, press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight **Answer on Hold** and press . (The caller hears a message while waiting for you to answer. While will display on the screen while the call is on hold.)

To resume the call:

► Press Answer (left softkey) or TALK.

- or -

Press **Options** (right softkey), highlight **Answer** or **Answer:Speaker** and press *****.

Note: Answer on Hold is not available in analog areas.

Ending a Call

With the flip open:

► Close the phone or press END/O.

With the flip closed:

Press and hold •••.

Note: If the setting for Close Flip is not set to **End**, closing the phone will not end the call. (See "Setting the Open/Close Flip Option" on page 50.)

Tip: Time/Date is displayed when you press while the phone is in use.

Using the Speakerphone

The speakerphone feature lets you hear audio through the speaker and talk without holding the phone. When the speakerphone is activated, use the Side Up/Down key or press the navigation key up or down to adjust the volume.

To turn the speakerphone on during a call:

Press SEARES.

- or
Press Options (right softkey), highlight Speaker On, and press ...

To turn the speakerphone off during a call:

Press FEARE.

- or
Press Options (right softkey), highlight Speaker Off, and press ...

Changing the Ringer Volume

To change the ringer volume, adjust the Side Up/Down key when the phone is in standby mode.

Note: To change the ringer volume from the main menu, see "Adjusting the Phone's Volume Settings" on page 32.

Adjusting Volume During a Conversation

Whether you need to hear more or less of a conversation, adjust the Side Up/Down key or press the navigation key up or down during a call.

Muting a Call

To mute a call:

▶ Press Options (right softkey), highlight Mute, and press . (When the phone is muted, "**Muted**" appears on the display.)

To unmute a call:

▶ Press Options (right softkey), highlight Unmute, and press ♥.



Tip: To use this feature with the flip closed, press (located on the side of your phone).

Displaying the Missed Call Notification

When an incoming call is not answered, your phone displays the Missed Call log and the 🌄 icon are displayed on your screen.

To call the Missed Call entry:

Press TALK or SPEAKER.

Tip: If you have two or more notifications, the event list will appear.

To erase the Missed Call log:

▶ Press **Dismiss** (right softkey).

Tip: If you press before checking your notification, Events (right softkey) appears in standby mode. Press **Events** (right softkey) to display the notification list. To call the entry, highlight the entry and press | Call (left softkey).

Calling Emergency Numbers

You can place calls to 911 (dial **QUE**) (with and press **TALK**), even if your phone is locked or your account is restricted. Once the dial is made, you will enter Emergency mode.

To select an option, press **Options** (right softkey), highlight it, and press **W**.

Options:

- Speaker On to activate speakerphone mode. (If you are in speakerphone mode, the option will appear as Speaker Off to deactivate.)
- Unlock Phone to unlock your phone (appears only if the phone is locked).
- Close Menu to close the pop-up menu (appears only if the phone is unlocked).

Tip: Press My Phone (left softkey) to display your phone number during Emergency mode.

To exit Emergency mode:

- 1. Press END/O.
- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey) to display the options.
- 3. Highlight Exit Emergency and press .

Note: When you are in Emergency mode, you can only exit from the options menu.

To select Emergency mode options:

- **1.** Press (END/O) during a 911 call.
- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- ► Call 911 to call 911.
- ► Call 911:Speaker to call 911 in speakerphone mode.
- **Exit Emergency** to exit Emergency mode.
- 3. Select an option and press .

In-Call Options

During a call, your phone displays menu options by pressing **Options** (right softkey).

To select an option, highlight it and press .



- ► Flash to answer an incoming call while putting the current call in Call Waiting or connect a third party for a Three-Way Call.
- ▶ Mute to mute your phone's microphone. Select Unmute to reactivate the microphone.
- Speaker On or Speaker Off to activate or deactivate speakerphone mode. You can adjust the speakerphone volume using the Side Up/Down key.

Warning! Due to higher volume levels, do not place the phone near your ear during speakerphone use.

- ► Three -Way Call to call a third party.
- ► Call History to access the Call History menu. (See "Managing Call History" on page 62.)
- ▶ **Contacts** to access the Contacts menu. (See "Contacts Directory" on page 65.)
- ▶ **Messaging** to access the Messaging menu. (See "Messaging" on page 110.)
- ▶ **Settings** to access the Settings menu. (See "Your Phone's Settings" on page 29.)
- ▶ Tools/Extras to access the Tools/Extras menu. (See Calendar menu instructions on page 73.)

Note: The Flash menu only appears in Call Waiting and in Three-Way Calling. Mute menu does not appear during a 911 call.

End-of-Call Options

To display the following options, press **Options** (right softkey) within 10 seconds after disconnecting a call.

To select an option, highlight it and press .



- ► Call Again to dial the phone number.
- ► Call:Speaker On to dial the phone number in speakerphone mode.
- ▶ Save Phone# to save the phone number in your Contacts list. Go to Phone Book appears when the number is already in your Contacts list. (See "Saving a Phone Number" below.)

Note: The End-of-Call options are not displayed for calls identified as No ID or Restricted.

Saving a Phone Number

Your phone can store up to seven phone numbers in each of 300 Contact entries with up to 500 total numbers. Each entry's name can contain 16 characters. Your phone automatically sorts the Contacts alphabetically.

- 1. Enter a phone number.
- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 3. Highlight Save Phone# and press .
- 4. Select a label by highlighting Mobile, Home, Work, Pager, Fax, Other, or No Label and press ...
- **5.** Enter a name and press . Once you have stored an entry in the Contacts list, you are prompted to select the following entry modes:
- ▶ **New Name** to enter a name directly.
- ▶ From Ph. Book to select a name from the Contacts entry list.
- **6.** Press **Save** (left softkey).

Finding a Phone Number

You can search Contacts list entries for phone numbers that contain a specific string of numbers.

- Enter the last four or more digits of the number and press
 Options (right softkey). The more numbers you enter, the more specific the search becomes.
- **2.** Highlight **Find** and press **3.** The Contacts entry that ends with the digits you entered appears.
- 3. Highlight your desired entry.

 Press to display the entry details.

 Press TALK or FFARED to dial.

Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses

You can dial or save phone numbers with pauses for use with automated systems, such as voicemail or credit card billing numbers.

There are two types of pauses available on your phone:

- ► Hard Pause sends the next set of numbers when you press TALK.
- 2-Sec. Pause automatically sends the next set of numbers after two seconds.

Note: You can have multiple pauses in a phone number and combine 2-second and hard pauses.

- **1.** Enter the phone number and press **Options** (right softkey).
- **2.** Highlight either **Hard Pause** or **2-Sec. Pause** and press **3.** Hard Pauses are displayed as a "H" and 2-second pauses as a "T".
- 3. Enter additional numbers.
- **4.** To dial the number, press TALK or SPEAKED. (When dialing a number with a hard pause, press TALK to send the next set of numbers.)
 - or -

To save the number in your Contacts list, press **Options** (right softkey), highlight **Save Phone#**, and press **Options**.

Dialing From the Contacts Directory

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- **2.** Highlight **Contacts** and press **(SP)**.
- 3. Highlight Find/Add Entry and press 🐯.

Shortcut: Press the navigation key right to list entries.

- **4.** Use your navigation key to scroll through the Contacts list and highlight one of the appropriate entries and press .
- 5. Highlight the number you wish to call.
- **6.** Press **Options** (right softkey) for the menu options.
- 7. Highlight Call or Call:Speaker On and press 🐨.

Tip: You can also make a call by pressing TALK, SPEAKER, or Call (left softkey) during step 5 above.

Note: The icon next to each entry represent the Contacts labels (for example, Mobile, Home, Work, etc.). A triangle next to an icon means there is another number for the entry. Press the navigation key right or left to select the desired label/number.

Using One-Touch Speed Dialing

With this feature, you can dial Speed Dial entries using one key press for locations 2-9. (See page 69 for storing a Speed Dial number.)

To use speed dial for voice calls:

From standby mode, press and hold the appropriate key for approximately two seconds.

- or -
```

From standby mode, press the appropriate key and press TALK or GRAKED.

The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows "Connecting...".

To use speed dial for 10-4 calls:

The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows "10-4 calling...".

Selecting a Character Input Mode

Your phone provides convenient ways to enter words, letters, punctuation, and numbers whenever you are prompted to enter text (for example, when adding a Contacts entry or when sending Email, text, picture or video messages).

- 1. When you display a screen where you can enter text, press Mode (right softkey).
- 2. Select a character input mode, highlight it and press 🐯.
- ► Add Word to store words that you use frequently.
- Canned Messages to enter canned messages. (For Text Message only.)
- ► Recent Messages to enter messages you have used recently. (For Text Message only.)
- ▶ **Signature** to enter your signature. (For Text Message only.)
- T9 Word to enter characters using T9 Text Input (see next page).
- ▶ **Alphabet** to enter characters by using the keypad.
- ► **SYMBOL** to enter symbols.
- ▶ **NUMBER** to enter numbers.
- ▶ **PRESET SUFFIX** to enter a preset suffix.
- ► **SMILEYS** to enter smiley pictures.
- ► **Emoticons** to enter an emotion icon. (For Text Message only.)
- ▶ **Select Language** to select the language (English or French).
- ▶ **Erase All** to erase all text (if applicable).
- ▶ **Paste** to paste copied or cut text (if applicable).
- ▶ **Select Text** to select stored text for copying or cutting.

Tip: When entering text, press the **Section** key to change letter capitalization (**Abc> ABC> abc**).

Entering Characters Using T9 Text Input

T9 Text Input lets you enter text in your phone by pressing keys just once per letter. (To select the **T9Word** mode when entering text, see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on the previous page.)

T9 Text Input analyses the letters you enter using an intuitive word database and creates a suitable word. (The word may change as you type.) To accept a word and insert a space, press ...*

If you make a mistake, press at to erase a single character. Press and hold as to delete a word.

Adding a Word to the T9 Database

If a word you want to enter does not display as an option when you are using T9 Text Input, you can add it to the database.

To add a word to the T9Text Input database:

- 1. Highlight Add Word mode and press . (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 25.)
- **2.** Enter the word using the keypad (Alphabet) and press Save (left softkey).
 - or -
- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Settings** and press ...
- 3. Highlight Others and press .
- 4. Highlight **Text Entry** and press .
- 5. Highlight Add Word and press 🐯.
- **6.** Enter the word using the keypad (Alphabet) and press **Save** (left softkey).

Tip: To confirm the words you have added, select My Words and press during step 5 above.

To edit or erase the words you have added:

- 1. Follow steps 1-4 on page 26.
- 2. Highlight My Words and press ...
- **3.** Highlight your desired word and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 4. To select an option, highlight it and press 🐯.
- ▶ Edit to edit a word in My Words.
- ▶ **Erase** to erase a word in My Words.

Customizing the T9 Settings

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press .
- 3. Highlight Others and press .
- 4. Highlight **Text Entry** and press ******.
- 5. Highlight **T9 Settings** and press **89**.
- **6.** Highlight your desired option and press **3.**
- Predict.Txt Mode to allow T9 text input to recognize words you have added to the T9 database.
- ▶ Word Choice List to display word choice list.
- Show aft enter to select digits number (1-3 digits) to display the words choice list. The word choice list will display based on the number of digits you selected.
- Show aft wait to select how many seconds the phone should wait to display the word choice list.

Entering Characters Using the Keypad

To enter characters using the keypad, select the **Alphabet** mode (see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 25). Press the corresponding key until the desired character appears. By default, the first letter of a word is capitalized and following letters are lowercase.

After a character is entered, the cursor automatically advances to the next space after two seconds or when you enter a character not on the same key.

- Minute Beep sets a minute reminder that beeps ten seconds before the end of each minute during a call.
- Signal Fade sets alert to notify you when your phone loses a signal during a call.

TTY Use

A TTY (also known as a TDD or Text Telephone) is a telecommunications device that allows people who are deaf or hard of hearing, or who have speech or language disabilities, to communicate via a telephone.

Your phone is compatible with select TTY devices. Please check with the manufacturer of your TTY device to ensure that it supports digital wireless transmission. Your phone and TTY device will connect via a special cable that plugs into your phone's headset jack. If this cable was not provided with your TTY device, contact your TTY device manufacturer to purchase the connector cable.

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Settings** and press *****.
- 3. Highlight Others and press .
- **4.** Highlight **TTY** and press (You will see a message on the display.)
- **5.** Press or **OK** (left softkey) to continue.
- 6. Select **Enable** or **Disable** and press .

Note: When you connect TTY devices, your phone will display 📾 in TTY mode.

Note: If TTY mode is enabled, the audio quality of non-TTY devices connected to the headset jack may be impaired.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: 911 Emergency Calling

It is recommended that TTY users make emergency calls by other means including cellular and landline communications.

Airplane Mode

When your phone is in Airplane mode, it cannot send or receive any calls (except for 911 dialing) or access online information. You may still use the phone's other features, such as Voice Memo, Calculator, Calendar, etc., while you are in Airplane mode.

- **4.** Highlight **Airplane Mode** and press **(**)**. (You will see a message on the display.)

You can place calls to 911, Customer Service, and to your special numbers when in lock mode.

To place an outgoing call in lock mode:

► To call an emergency number, special number, or Customer Service, enter the phone number and press TALK.

Restricting Calls

You can restrict phone numbers your phone dials or receives. (The Restrict Calls setting does not apply to 911 or Customer Service.)

- 1. From the Security Menu display (See "Accessing the Security Menu" on page 53), highlight **Others** and press ...
- 2. Highlight Limit Use and press 🐯.
- 3. Highlight Outgoing Calls or Incoming Calls and press ...
- 4. Highlight your desired option and press 🐯.

Options:

- ▶ Allow All: You can make or receive all calls.
- Phone Book Only: Only Contacts entries, voicemail or special numbers (see below) are available to make or receive calls.
- Special #s Only: Only three special numbers are available to make or receive calls.

Note: Restricted incoming calls are forwarded to voicemail.

Using Special Numbers

You can save three special numbers in addition to your Contacts entries (the same number may be in both directories). You can make and receive calls from special numbers even when your phone is locked.

To add or replace a special number:

- 1. From the Security Menu display (See "Accessing the Security Menu" on page 53), highlight **Others** and press ...
- 2. Highlight Special#s and press 🐯.
- 3. Highlight the box under the entry number and press ...
- 4. Enter the number you wish to add and press ...

Press Options (right softkey), then highlight From Ph. Book or Voicemail and press .

Note: Special numbers cannot be called in the voice call locked state.

Erasing the Contacts Directory

- 1. From the Security Menu display (See "Accessing the Security Menu" on page 53), highlight **Erase Ph. Book** and press ...
- **2.** Press **OK** (left softkey) to continue.
- **3.** If you're sure you want to erase your Contacts, highlight **Yes** and press ******.

Erasing the Downloads

- From the Security Menu display (See "Accessing the Security Menu" on page 53), highlight Erase Download and press .

- 3. If you're sure you want to erase all data downloaded from the Web, highlight Yes and press .
- If you have assigned downloaded data, the function returns to its default setting.

Resetting Your Pictures Account

This option resets your authentication ID for your picture account.

- 3. If you are certain that you would like to reset your pictures

After resetting, you are prompted to reenter the password when vou use Online Pictures.

Note: Your account will be locked if you enter wrong password 10 times after resetting your account. In this case, please contact Customer Service.

Resetting Your Phone

Resetting the phone restores all the factory defaults, including the ringer types and display settings. The Contacts, Call History, Scheduler, and Messaging are not affected.

Understanding Roaming

Recognizing Icons on the Display Screen

Your phone's display screen always lets you know when you're off the home network and whether your phone is operating in analog or digital mode. The following chart indicates what you'll see depending on where you're using your phone.

Roaming on Digital Networks

When you're roaming on digital networks, your call quality and security will be similar to the quality you receive when making calls on the home network. You may not be able to access certain features, such as the Web.

Roaming on Analog Networks

When you roam on analog networks, you will experience a similar quality provided by other analog carriers today. Although some features, such as Web, will be unavailable, you can still make and receive calls. You will experience a few differences:

- You are more likely to experience cross-talk, fade-out, and dropped calls.
- Some features which are standard on the home network are unavailable.
- There are security and privacy risks (eavesdropping and cloning) that exist with conventional analog services today.
- Your battery needs recharging sooner when you use your phone for analog roaming.

Note: When using your phone in analog mode, the handset may feel warm. This behavior is normal for analog operation.

Setting Your Phone's Roam Mode

Your phone allows you to control your ability to roam. By using the **Roaming** menu option, you can determine which signals your phone accepts.

Set Mode

Choose from four different settings on your dual band/tri mode phone to control your roaming experience.

- 1. Press to access the main menu.

- **4.** To select an option, select it and press **...**
- ▶ Automatic: This setting seeks a service. When a service is unavailable, the phone searches for an alternate system.
- Home Only: This setting allows you to access the home network only and prevents roaming on other networks.
- Digital Only: This setting forces the phone to seek a digital system.
- ► Analog Only: This setting forces the phone to seek an analog system.

6. Managing Call History

Viewing History

You'll find the Call History feature very helpful. It is a list of the last 20 phone numbers (or Contacts entries) and the last 10 10-4 calls for each call or 10-4 call that you placed, accepted, or missed. Call History makes redialing a number fast and easy. It is continually updated as new numbers are added to the beginning of the list and the oldest entries are removed from the bottom of the list.

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Call History and press 🐯.
- 3. Highlight Outgoing, Incoming, or Missed and press



Tip: You can switch the Voice Call history to the 10-4 call history by pressing 10-4 (left softkey). To return to the Voice Call history, press Voice Call (left softkey).

Call History Options

For additional information and options on a particular call, highlight a Call History entry and press Options (right softkey).

- ▶ Call to dial the phone number.
- Call:Speaker On to dial the phone number in speakerphone mode.
- Send Message to send a text, picture, or video message. See page 112, 140 or 141 for details.
- ➤ Save Phone# to save the phone number (if applicable). If the caller's phone number is already saved in your Contacts list, Go to Phone Book appears. (See "Saving a Phone Number From Call History" on the next page.)
- Prepend to add numbers to the beginning of the phone number. (See "Prepending a Phone Number From Call History" on page 64.)
- ► Copy to Personal to copy the phone number to the 10-4
 Personal List. (Only appears when 10-4 mode is set to Enable

- ▶ **Prepend** to alter a phone number by adding numbers to the beginning of the entry. (See "Prepending a Phone Number From Call History" on page 64.)
- ➤ Copy to Personal to copy the phone number to your 10-4
 Personal List. (Only appears when 10-4 mode is set to Enable
 and the number does not match any stored entry in your
 Personal List.)

Tip: You can view the next entry by pressing the navigation key right or view the previous entry by pressing the navigation key left.

Assigning Speed Dial Numbers

With this feature you can dial Contacts Directory entries with one key press for locations 2-9. Save your memory locations 2-9 for speed dialing your most commonly used phone numbers. Speed Dial numbers must be stored in your Contacts to use this feature.

To set Speed Dial:

Managing Schedules

Calendar

Use the Calendar to remind you of events or important calls you need to make. You can schedule up to 100 events, 15 Call Alarms and 20 To Do Items.

Displaying Your Calendar

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press 🐯.
- 3. Highlight Calendar and press 🐯.

Note: In a no-service area or an analog service area, it's necessary to set the actual time and date to use the Calendar function after removing and installing your battery.

Setting Holidays

You can set your personal holidays by displaying the date in red on the Calendar display. The default holidays displayed in red are Sundays and National holidays.

Note: You can set holidays from Jan 1, 2000 to Dec 31, 2020.

- 1. From the Calendar display, highlight the day you want to set to the holiday by using the navigation key (Left: previous day, Right: next day, Up: previous week, Down: next week, Side Up/Down key: previous/next month).
- 2. Press Options (right softkey), highlight Holiday, and press ...
- 3. Highlight Set Date or Set Weekly, and press ...

Tip: The current day is framed by a rectangle.

Adding an Event to the Scheduler

- 1. From the Calendar display, highlight the day you want to add an event by using the navigation key and press ...
- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey) to display the options.
- 3. Highlight Add Event and press 🐯.
- 4. Highlight **Schedule** and press **3.**
- **5.** Enter the description and press (or press Mode [right softkey] to select a description from "From To Do List").

Note: The "From To Do List" option will not appear if there are no items stored in the To Do List. See "Adding To Do Items" on page 78 for details.

- **6.** Select the following options and press **(38)**:
- ▶ Description Entering a description of your event (up to 14 characters).
- ▶ From Scheduling the start time.
- ▶ **To** Scheduling the end time.
- ► **Location** Editing the location of your event (up to 14 characters).
- ▶ Alarm Select the ringer you wish to set.
- Alarm Time Editing the alarm time (number of hours or minutes before the event starts). Default alarm time is 10 minutes.
- Repeat Repeating the event. Select None, Daily, Weekly, Monthly, or Yearly.
- 7. Press Save (left softkey) to schedule the event.

Tip: Press the navigation key up or down to scroll by week through the Scheduler calendar, and the Side Up/Down key to scroll by month.

Tip: The date you have scheduled events for is indicated by "\rightrightarrow".

Event Alerts

There are several ways your phone alerts you of scheduled events.

- By playing the alert tone (depending on the Alert and Ringer Volume setting).
- ▶ By blinking the LED.
- By displaying the event's description on the Main LCD when the flip is open.
- By lighting the LCD backlight (depending on the backlight setting).

Event Alert Menu

When your phone is turned on and you have an event alarm scheduled, your phone alerts you and displays the icon and the event summary.

To silence an event alert:

 Press any key to silence an event alert. (The alarm will snooze again after 10 minutes.)

Other options available include:

- Press and hold the side camera key to cancel snoozing.
- ▶ Press **Dismiss** (right softkey) to dismiss the event.

Note: If you press any key before checking your event, Events (right softkey) appears in standby mode. Press Events (right softkey) to display the event and press to see the event details. To cancel snoozing, press Dismiss (right softkey) while the event list is displayed.

Adding a Call Alarm to the Scheduler

- 1. From the Calendar display, highlight the day you want to add an event by using the navigation key and press ...

- Repeat Repeating the Call Alarm. Select None, Daily, Weekly, Monthly, or Yearly.
- 7. Press Save (left softkey).

Call Alarm Alerts

There are several ways your phone alerts you of scheduled call alarms.

- ▶ By playing the alert tone (depending on the Alert and Ringer Volume setting).
- ▶ By blinking the LED.
- By displaying the call alarm notification on the Main LCD or Sub LCD.
- By lighting the LCD backlight (depending on the backlight setting).

Call Alarm Menu

When your phone is turned on and you have scheduled a call alarm, your phone alerts you and displays the icon and the name or phone number.

To respond to a call alarm:

Press TALK or SPEAKER to dial the phone number.

Other options available include:

- ▶ Press •••• to make a 10-4 call (if applicable).
- Press any key (except or while the phone is closed) to repeat the alarm in 10 minutes.
- Press and hold the side camera key to cancel snoozing.
- ▶ Press Dismiss (right softkey) to dismiss the call alarm.

Editing an Event or Call Alarm

- 1. From the Event list display, highlight one of the events or call alarms and press .
- 3. Enter or select a new setting and press .
- 4. Press Save (left softkey).

Erasing a Day's Event or Call Alarm

- 1. From the Event list display, highlight one of the events or call alarms and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight Erase Event and press 🐯.
- 3. Highlight **Yes** and press ...

Viewing a Future/Past Day's Scheduled Events

- **1.** From the Event list display, press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight Go To Date and press 🐨.
- **3.** Enter the date by using numeric keys and the navigation key and press or **OK** (left softkey).
- 4. Press again to view the day's Event List.

Adding To Do Items

Your phone can store and manage 20 To Do items.

- 1. From the Calendar display, press Options (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight To Do List and press 🐯.

- 4. Highlight Add Item and press 🐯.
- **5.** Enter the description and press (up to 14 characters).
- 6. Highlight **Priority** and press to edit the To Do's priority. You can select from **Normal**, **§ Urgent**, or **√ Done**.

Adding a To Do Item to the Schedule

- **1.** From the To Do List display, highlight the item you want to add to schedule and press **Options** (right softkey).

To check all boxes, press (ptions) (right softkey) and highlight Check All and press then press (left softkey), and press .
- **Erase All** erases all the To Do items.
- 3. Highlight **Yes** and press ...

Note: If you have saved a To Do List item to the scheduler, deleting it from the To Do List will not delete it from the scheduler. To remove an item saved to the scheduler, see "Purging All Events, Call Alarms or To Do List Items" below.

Viewing Used and Free Memory in Your Scheduler

- 3. Highlight Schedule, Call Alarm, or To Do List and press 🐨.

Purging All Events, Call Alarms or To Do List Items

- **1.** From the Event list display, press **Options** (right softkey).

- **3.** Highlight one of the following Option items and press **3.** Options:
- ► Erase Old deletes the old events, call alarms, and completed To Do items.

Displaying Advanced Information

- 4. Highlight Advanced and press 🐯.

Using Your Phone's Tools

Setting the Alarm Clock

To set the alarm clock:

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press 🐯.
- 3. Highlight Alarm Clock and press 🐯.

Tip: Press Settings (right softkey) to set the Ringer Length or Snooze Interval.

- **4.** Highlight the desired entry and press **t** to access the Alarm Clock menu.
- ► Alarm to set the alarm On or Off.
- ► **Time** to enter the alarm time. Enter the desired alarm time and press ...
- ▶ Repeat to select the alarm frequency.

To stop the alarm:

Using the Calculator

To record the other party's voice during a phone call:

- **2.** Highlight **Tools/Extras** and press ******.
- 3. Highlight Voice Services and press ...
- 4. Highlight Voice Memo and press 🐯.
- **5.** Highlight **Record** and press .
- **6.** Start recording after the beep.

To end the recording of voice memo:

Press or ARC while recording.

- or -

Press and disconnect the call when recording in Use State.

Recording also stops when the other party hangs up the call.

Memo recording during a phone call is disabled while you are roaming in analog service areas. When the recording capacity is full, highlight an old memo, press Frase (left softkey), highlight Yes, and press to make room for additional memos.

Note: Your phone can store up to 12 memos and the total available recording time is 72 seconds (maximum of 18 seconds per memo).

- You can change the message playing speed by pressing **Slow** (left softkey) or **Fast** (right softkey).
- To play the newer/older memo, press the navigation key right or left.

Tip: To set the speakerphone mode on or off, press **Options** (right softkey), highlight **Speaker On/Off**, and press we during step 6 above.

Erasing Voice Memos

To erase all voice memos:

To erase an individual memo:

- **3.** Display the memo list, highlight the memo you want to erase, and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 4. Highlight **Erase** and press ...
- **5.** Highlight **Yes** and press .

Setting Up Screen Call

This feature enables you to answer incoming calls by using prerecorded announcements, either one that is pre-recorded or one that you record. You can also record the caller's message into the Voice Memo list. To listen to the message, see "Reviewing Voice Memos" on page 87.

10.10-4

10-4 allows you to enjoy quick, two-way, "walkie-talkie-style" communication with your friends, family, and co-workers. You can make 1-to-1 or 1-to-many calls (up to 5 others on the same call) to any other 10-4 user, anywhere on the Network. You can make and receive 10-4 calls when your phone displays.

Setting 10-4 Mode

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Settings** and press .
- 3. Highlight 10-4 and press .
- 4. Highlight Enable/Disable and press 🐨.
- **5.** Select **Enable** and press **3.** (The default setting is **Disable**.)
- Enable: Lets you make or receive 10-4 calls any time your phone is not in use.
- ▶ **Disable:** Disables your phone's 10-4 service; you will not be able to make or receive 10-4 calls or access your 10-4 contacts.

10-4 Call Alerts

There are several ways your Phone alerts you during 10-4 calls.

When you make or receive a 10-4 call:

- ► The phone beeps (depending on the Ringer Type).
- ► The backlight illuminates.
- ► The screen displays a 10-4 call message.
- The other party's 10-4 number and name (if available) are displayed.
- ► The screen displays who has the floor.

The status of a 10-4 call:

- The Green LED On indicates you have the floor and may speak.
- ▶ The Red LED On indicates another contact has the floor.
- ► The LED Off indicates the floor is open. (You can take the floor and speak by pressing and holding ...)

Displaying the 10-4 List

From standby mode, press 10-4 (left softkey) or the 10-4 button on the side of your phone (to access the 10-4 List.

Tip: The first time you access the list, the 10-4 Help message will appear. Press **Yes** (left softkey) and **Next** (left softkey) to read a brief introduction of 10-4

Selecting Contacts Lists

When your phone displays a 10-4 List, the left softkey is labeled **Go to**. To switch to another contacts list, press the left softkey, highlight your desired list, and press .

- ▶ Company List/Company Grps. contain company-provided contacts (up to 200 entries). Your company list can only be created and modified by an authorized administrator on the 10-4 server. When the lists are empty, Company List/ Company Groups will not appear on the display. You cannot add, edit, or delete Company List items, but you can copy entries to your Personal List/Personal Groups.
- ▶ Personal List/Personal Grps. contain your personal 10-4 contact names and numbers, separately or in groups. You can create and edit your own Personal List. Your phone can store a total of 200 entries (you may include up to five contacts per group).
- ▶ **Outgoing** shows the last 10 different 10-4 calls you placed.
- ▶ **Incoming** shows the last 10 different 10-4 calls you accepted.
- ▶ **Missed** shows the last 10 10-4 calls you missed.

Tip: You can also select Enter 10-4# from Go to option to enter a 10-4 number directly. See page 96 for details.

Note: The 🕥 icon next to the group name indicates a group.

Making a 10-4 Call (1-to-1 Call)

You can place a 1-to-1 10-4 call by entering a 10-4 number or by selecting a contact from the 10-4 List.

- 1. Press 10-4 (left softkey) or press •••• to access the 10-4 List.
- 2. Press Go to (left softkey), highlight the list from which you want to place a call (Company List, Personal List, Outgoing, Incoming, or Missed), and press .
- 3. Highlight the contact you want to call, and press and hold to place the call and get the floor. (You will see 10-4 calling... and Connecting... followed by "You have floor." You can now begin speaking.)

- or -

Highlight the contact you want to call and press and release to place the call. (The call will connect as described above, but "Floor is open." will appear on the screen and either you or your contact may press and hold to take the floor and speak.)

Note: During a 10-4 call, the "**floor**" is the right to speak. When you see "**Floor is open.**," the first person to press the 10-4 button (can speak (while holding the button). Only the person who has the floor can speak. The phone beeps if you press the 10-4 button when another contact has the floor.

- 4. Continue holding ••• as you speak. When you are finished speaking, release the 10-4 button to allow other contacts to speak. (When the other party takes the floor, you will see the speaker's name and phone number and the text "has floor.")
- **5.** When you are finished, press END/O.

Note: When neither party has the floor during a 10-4 call, "**Floor is open.**" appears on the display. If no one takes the floor for 20 seconds, the 10-4 call ends automatically.

Tip: If you press TALK or SPEAKED during step 3 above, you can make a standard voice call.

Making a 10-4 Call (Group Call)

You can make a 10-4 call to all members in a Group entry, which you have in your 10-4 List. You can communicate with up to five members at a time.

- 1. Press 10-4 (left softkey) or press •••• to access the 10-4 List.
- 2. Press Go to (left softkey), highlight the list from which you want to make a Group call (Company Grps., Personal Grps., or Outgoing), and press ...
- 3. Highlight the group you want to call, and press and hold to place the call and take the floor. (You will see10-4 calling... and Connecting... followed by "You have floor."Continue with the 10-4 call as described previously.)
- ➤ To make a 10-4 call to a group member, select your desired group, highlight your desired group member, and press and hold
- ▶ The phone beeps if you press the 10-4 button when another contact has the floor.
- **4.** When the call is finished, press **END/O**.

Tip: You can also make a Group Call after checking the group member. Press to display group members, highlight **<Call Group>** and press and hold **and** during step 3 above.

Making a 10-4 Call by Entering a Number

- 1. From standby mode, enter the 10-4 number you want to dial.
- **2.** Press •••• to place the 10-4 call.
- ► The contact's name appears if there is a matched number in your 10-4 List.
- 3. Continue with the 10-4 call, pressing and holding to speak and releasing it to allow others to reply.
- **4.** When the call is finished, press (END/O).
 - or -
- 1. Press 10-4 (left softkey) or press •••• to access the 10-4 List.
- 2. Press Go to (left softkey), highlight Enter 10-4# and press ...
- 3. Enter the 10-4 number you want to dial.
- **4.** Follow steps 2-4 above.

Missed Call Notification for 10-4 Calls

When an incoming 10-4 Call is not answered, the Missed Call Notification is displayed on your screen.

To call the last Missed 10-4 Call:

➤ Simply press and hold while the Missed Call Notification is displayed. (Continue with the 10-4 call as described previously.)

To erase the Missed 10-4 Call Log:

▶ Press **Dismiss** (right softkey).

Note: When you display Missed Calls entries, you will see the icon next to the name. Once you confirm the entry by pressing, the icon turns to the icon. The icon will remain until you make or receive a 10-4 call to or from the entry.

Receiving a 10-4 Call

- 1. Make sure your phone's 10-4 mode is enabled (see "Setting 10-4 Mode" on page 92).
- 2. When you receive a 10-4 call from a contact, "10-4 Call," the contact's name, and the 10-4 number appear on the display.
- ▶ When you receive a group call, "Group Call" appears.
- **3.** If the person placing the call has kept the floor (held the 10-4 button), you will see the contact name and 10-4 number along with "has floor," and you will hear the caller speaking.
- **4.** When the caller finishes speaking and releases , you will see "Floor is open." on the display screen. Press and hold to take the floor and reply to the caller. (You will see "You have floor." and hear a tone confirming that you may speak.)
- **5.** When the conversation is finished, press (END/O).

Tip: You can also receive a 10-4 call with the flip closed. Press and hold to take the floor when the floor is open.

10-4 Options

When you use 10-4, several user options are available by pressing **Options** (right softkey). To select an option, highlight it and press **3.**

- ➤ Copy to Personal to copy a contact to the Personal List.

 Copy Group appears when you highlight a group. (This option doesn't appear if the entry is already in the Personal List or when you select Personal List/Personal Groups.)
- ▶ Edit to edit a 10-4 number and/or name. (See page 103.)
- ► **Send Message** to send a text, picture, or video message. (See page 112, 140 or 141 for details.)
- ▶ Copy to Ph. Book to copy a contact to the Contacts List.
- Erase to erase a contact. Erase Group appears when you highlight a group.
- ► Add Contact to add a new contact. (See page 101 for details.) Add Group appears when you highlight a group list. (See page 102 for details.)
- ► Erase 10-4 List to erase entries saved in the 10-4 List (except Company List/Company Groups).
- ▶ **Help** to see the 10-4 instruction page.

Copying an Entry to Personal List or Personal Group List

You can copy an entry to your Personal List/Personal Groups from several different sources. If the selected entry is already stored in the Personal List/Personal Groups, the "copy" option does not appear.

- 1. Press 10-4 (left softkey) or press ••• to access the 10-4 List.
- Press Go to (left softkey), highlight the list from which you want to copy an entry (Company List, Company Grps., Personal Grps., Outgoing, Incoming, or Missed), and press .
- 3. Highlight the entry you want to copy (or scroll to highlight the **Redial** entry at the top of your screen) and press Options (right softkey). To select an option, highlight it and press .
- Copy to Personal to copy the contact to the Personal List (if available).
- ► **Copy Group** to copy the group to the Personal Group List (if available).
- **4.** Press **Yes** (left softkey) to copy and save the entry to your Personal List or Personal Group List.

Saving a 10-4 Number

You can save a 10-4 number from the ending display to your Personal List/Personal Groups.

- **1.** From the ending display, press **Save** (right softkey).
- 2. Enter a name and press .
- 3. Press Save (left softkey).
- 4. Press Yes (left softkey).

Tip: If the entry already has a name, skip step 2 and 3 above.

Note: If the number is already stored in the Personal List/Personal Groups, the "Save" softkey does not appear.

You can find your desired entry by entering a few letters.

- The display shows the list beginning with the letter(s) you entered.
- **4.** Scroll through the list and press to select your desired entry.

Adding a New Contact to Your Personal List

You can store the total of 200 entries in the Personal List/Personal Groups.

- **1.** Press 10-4 (left softkey) or press to access the 10-4 List.
- **2.** Press Go to (left softkey), highlight Personal List, and press ...
- 3. Highlight <Add Contact> and press ...
 - Highlight an entry and press **Options** (right softkey). Then highlight **Add Contact** and press **@**.
- **4.** Enter a name for the new contact and press (This is the name you will see when calling or receiving a call from the contact.)
- **5.** Highlight the **10-4 Number** field, enter the contact's 10-digit 10-4 number (their phone number) and press **3.**
- **6.** Press Save (left softkey) to save the new contact to your Personal List

Tip: You are not allowed to use the following symbols during step 4: (@, ;, /, *,), and (.

Adding a New Group to Your Personal Group List

You can add new groups to the Personal Group List. Each group can include up to five members. You can enter a group member directly, or select the member from the Company List or Personal List.

- 2. Press Go to (left softkey), highlight Personal Grps., and press ...
- 3. Highlight <Add Group> and press
 or Highlight an entry and press
 Options (right softkey). Then highlight Add Group and press
- **4.** Enter a Group Name, press , and press Next (left softkey).
- **5.** To add contacts to the group, press Add (right softkey).
- **6.** Highlight one item from the following and press ******:
- ▶ **New** to add a new contact. See the previous page for details.
- from Company to add a contact from your Company List (if applicable).
- ▶ from Personal to add a contact from your Personal List.
- 7. Scroll to select the contacts you want to add and press or Pick (right softkey) to include the entries.
- **8.** Press **Done** (left softkey) when you are finished selecting contacts, then press **Update** (left softkey) to update your Personal Group List with the new group entry.

- Add (Company) to add a new group member from the Company List.
- Add (Personal) to add a new group member from the Personal List.
- ▶ **Details** to display a group member's information.
- 7. Highlight **Edit** and press **.**
- **8.** Highlight the field you want to edit (**Name** or **10-4 Number**) and press **...**
- **9.** Edit the entry, press **OK** (left softkey), and press **Save** (left softkey) to save your changes.

Erasing a 10-4 List

You can erase all entries saved in the 10-4 List (except Company List/Company Groups).

- 5. Press Go to (left softkey), highlight the list from which you want to set a speed dial (Company List, Company Grps., Personal List, or Personal Grps.) and press ...
- **6.** Select the contact and press 🖫.
 - or -Select the group and press , select an option, and press .
- Set as to assign the selected group as a speed dial.
- ▶ **Details** to display the group details. You can select the group member from the group list.

To use Speed Dial for a 10-4 entry:

From standby mode, press the appropriate key and press and hold

Setting 10-4 Guard

This feature enables you to display the warning message when you cannot receive 10-4 calls. The warning message appears when you are launching the Web.

- ▶ To deactivate this feature, select **Off** during step 6 above.

Setting Ringer Types for 10-4 Calls

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- **2.** Highlight **Settings** and press .
- 3. Highlight 10-4 and press .
- **4.** Highlight **Sounds** and press **.**
- 5. Highlight Ringer Type and press ...
- 6. Highlight 10-4 Calls, 10-4 Missed, or 10-4 Floor Tone and press 😱.
- 7. Highlight your desired ringer type and press 🐨.
- ► To confirm the ringer, press Play (right softkey).

Setting an Alert Notification for 10-4 Calls

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 3. Highlight 10-4 and press .
- **4.** Highlight **Sounds** and press **.**
- 5. Highlight Alerts and press .
- 6. Highlight 10-4 Calls or 10-4 Missed and press 🐨.
- 7. Use the navigation key to select **Once**, **Repeat Alert** for 10-4 Calls or **Once**, **Repeat Alert**, or **Off** for 10-4 Missed.
- **8.** Press to save the setting.

Setting the Speakerphone for 10-4 Calls

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Settings** and press 🐯.
- 3. Highlight 10-4 and press 🐯.
- 4. Highlight **Speakerphone** and press **8**.
- 5. Select **On** or **Off** and press **SP**.

Note: If the phone's ringer volume is set to Vibrate, Ringer off, or Silence All, the speakerphone turns off.

Setting the Default View of the 10-4 List

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Settings** and press ...
- 3. Highlight 10-4 and press .
- **4.** Highlight **Default View** and press (The default setting is Personal List.)
- **5.** Highlight your desired list and press **8.**

Setting the Floor Display of the 10-4 Calls

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Settings** and press *****.
- 3. Highlight 10-4 and press .
- 4. Highlight Floor Display and press 🐨.
- **5.** Highlight your desired display and press 🐯.

11. Messaging

New Messages

To read a message:

When you receive new messages, the message notification and the icon will appear. Press (left softkey) to display the message details.

To reply to a message:

- 1. While the message is open, select Reply (left softkey).
- **2.** Compose your reply or press **Mode** (right softkey) to select a character input mode. (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 25.)
- 3. Review your reply and press **Send** (left softkey).

Displaying Messages

To display a Message from the main menu:

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Messaging** and press ...

Shortcut: Press the navigation key up to display the Messaging menu.

- 3. Highlight **Text Msgs** and press 🐯.
- **4.** Highlight **Inbox**, **Sent**, **Outbox**, **Drafts**, or your defined folder and press .
- **5.** Highlight the header of the message you want to see and press . (To display the message options, press Options [right softkey].)

To display Web Alerts:

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- **2.** Highlight **Messaging** and press \$P.
- 3. Highlight Web Alerts and press 🐯.
- **4.** Highlight the header of the message you want to see and press . (To display the web alerts options, press Options [right softkey].)

To read other messages:

- ▶ Press the navigation key right to read the next message.
- ▶ Press the navigation key left to read the previous message.

Note: Web Alerts are URLs. When you buy a ringer or image through your computer for your phone, your phone will receive Web Alerts. Press **Go** (left softkey) to go to the website and follow steps to download it to your phone.

Sending a Text Message

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Messaging and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Send Message and press 🐯.
- 4. Select **Text** and select the entry method you prefer:
- ▶ Phone Book Entry to select recipients from your Contacts list. Highlight the box next to an entry and press to select. Or select <Add Entry> to enter a new entry. Press Done (left softkey) when you are finished selecting/entering recipients.
- ► Company List Ent. to select recipients from your Company list (if applicable).
- ▶ Personal List Ent. to select recipients from your Personal list.
- Personal Grps. Ent. to select recipients from your Personal Group list.
- ▶ Mobile Phone# to enter a mobile phone number directly.
- ▶ Email Address to enter an email address directly.
- From Recent List to select recipients from a list of recent message recipients.

Tip: If you have unsent messages, you are prompted to send the messages during step 4 above. Press OK (left softkey) to send the messages. Press Cancel (right softkey) to create a new message.

Tip: Company List Ent., Personal List Ent., and **Personal Grps. Ent.** options appear only when 10-4 mode is enabled. See page 92 for the setting.

5. Press Next (left softkey) when you are finished selecting/entering recipients (you may include up to 10 recipients).

Tip: To add recipients, press Options (right softkey) and select Add Recipient during step 5 above.

6. To enter a message, select the box under Message and press .

7. Use your keypad to enter a text message (or press the right softkey to select from **Canned Messages**, **Recent Messages**, or **Signature**) and press **OK** (left softkey).

Tip: See page 48 for Canned Messages.

- **8.** To set the message priority, select the box under Priority and press .
- 9. Highlight Normal or Urgent and press 🐨.
- **10.** Press **Send** (left softkey) to send the message.

To change the recipients or to save the message as a draft, press **Options** (right softkey) and select **Chg Recipients** or **Save to Drafts** during steps 6-9 on the previous page.

- ► Chg Recipients to change Recipients.
- ➤ Send Callback# to select from None, My Phone#, or Other to notify your recipients of your callback number. (See "Setting Your Callback Number" on page 49.)
- ▶ Save to Drafts to save the message to a Drafts folder.

Note: If there is a failure when sending a message, you are prompted to select to send the message automatically. Press Yes (left softkey), and the message goes to the Outbox folder with If you press No (right softkey), the message goes to the folder with .

12. Using your Phone's Camera

Taking Pictures

Taking pictures with your phone's built-in camera is as simple as choosing a subject, pointing the lens, and pressing a button. You can activate the phone's camera mode whether the phone is open or closed.

To take a picture with the phone open:

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Picture&Video and press .
- 3. Highlight Camera and press to activate camera mode. (Additional camera options are available through the camera mode **Options** menu. See "Camera Mode Options" on page 117 for more information.)

Shortcut: To activate camera mode, you can also press 🚳 twice or just press the side camera key (see illustration on page 2).

- 4. Using the phone's main LCD as a viewfinder, aim the camera lens at your subject.
- **5.** Press Capture (left softkey), , or the side camera key until the shutter sounds. (The picture will automatically be saved in the In Camera folder.)
- ► To return to camera mode to take another picture, press .



- **6.** Press Next (right softkey) for more options:
- ▶ **Send Picture** to send the picture to up to 10 contacts at one time. (See page 138 for details.)
- Go to Camera to return to camera mode to take another picture.
- ▶ **Upload to Albums** to upload the picture you just took to the online picture/video messaging web site. Depending on your settings, you may be prompted to accept an Internet connection.

- ► **Set as** to assign the picture. Select **Picture ID** or **Screen Saver** and press **...**
- ▶ Display/Edit to edit or display your picture's details. (See "In Camera Folder Options" on page 125 for details.)
- ▶ **Delete** to delete the picture you just took.
- Pics In Camera to go to the In Camera folder to review your saved pictures.

To take a picture with the phone closed:

- 1. Press and hold the side camera key to activate camera mode.
- 2. Point the camera lens at the desired subject.

Note: When taking a picture with the phone closed, the subject appears as a mirror reverse image on the external display. The captured image will not be saved in reverse.

3. Press the side camera key to take the picture. (The picture will automatically be saved in the In Camera folder.)

Creating Your Online Picture/Video Messaging Password

The first time you use any of the picture/video management options involving the online picture/video messaging web site, you will need to establish an online picture/video messaging password through your picture/video messaging enabled phone. This password will also allow you to sign in to the online picture/video messaging web site at https://mypictures.bell.ca to access and manage your uploaded pictures/videos and albums.

To create your online picture/video messaging password:

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Picture&Video and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Online Albums and press 🐯.
- **4.** Highlight **View Albums** and press (You will be prompted to create a online picture/video messaging password.)
- **5.** Enter a four- to eight-digit password and press **3.** (You will be prompted to confirm your password.)
- **6.** Please wait while the system creates your account.

Tip: Write down your online picture/video messaging password in a secure place.

Once you have received confirmation that your account has been successfully registered, you may upload and share pictures and access the online picture/video messaging web site.

Camera Mode Options

When the phone is open and in camera mode, press **Options** (right softkey) to display additional camera options:

- Picture Mode to select picture mode from Normal, Night/Dark, Beach/Snow, Scenery, or Soft Focus.
- ► Flash to activate the flash. (See "Setting the Flash" on page 118 for details.)
- ➤ **Zoom** to zoom in on a subject. You can adjust the zoom from 1x to 20x. (See "Using the Zoom" on page 120 for details.)
- ➤ **Self-timer** to activate the camera's timer. (See "Setting the Self-timer" on page 118 for details.)
- ► **Fun Tools** to select an option from the following:
 - **Multiple Shots** to shoot multiple shots on multiple targets (see page 119).
 - **Stitch Shot** to take a stitch shot by stitching separate images together (see page 120).
 - Fun Frames to select your favorite fun picture frame to decorate your picture.
 - Color Tone to select a wide variety of color tones for the picture.

Note: Zoom and Stitch Shot are not available when the resolution setting is High (see "Selecting Camera Settings" on page 122 for details).

- ▶ **Image Controls** to select an option from the following:
 - Brightness to select Auto or Manual brightness control.
 - White Balance to adjust white balance based on changing conditions.
- ► Camera Settings to select your settings. (See "Selecting Camera Settings" on page 122 for details.)
- ▶ Pics In Camera to go to your phone's In Camera folder. (See "In Camera Folder" on page 124 for details.)
- ► Go to Camcorder to switch to video mode. (See "Recording Videos" on page 129 for details.)
- ► **Key Guidance** to indicate the key functions in camera mode.

Setting the Flash

To activate the flash:

- 1. From camera mode, press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight **Flash** and press .
- 3. Select one of the following options and press 🐯:
- ▶ **Off** to deactivate the flash.
- ▶ On This Shot to activate the flash for one shot.
- ▶ **On Always** to activate the flash for all pictures.
- ▶ **Auto** to activate the flash automatically.

Note: While the phone is open and in camera mode, press **1** to switch between flash modes.

Setting the Self-timer

To activate the Self-timer:

- 1. From camera mode, press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight **Self-timer** and press 🐯.
- 3. Highlight the length of delay you want the timer to use (10 seconds or 5 seconds) and press .
- ► To deactivate the Self-timer, highlight **Off** and press ******.
- **5.** Get ready for the picture. (When the timer is down to three seconds, the Self-timer icon will turn red and the phone will begin to beep.)

To cancel the Self-timer after it has started:

► Press Cancel (right softkey).

Note: While the Self-timer is active, all keys are disabled except , and Cancel (right softkey).

Taking Multiple Shots

This feature allows you to take up to nine continuous shots of one moment. When you take multiple shots, the icon will appear in the viewfinder.

To take multiple shots:

- **1.** From camera mode, press **Options** (right softkey).
- **2.** Highlight **Fun Tools** and press **89**.
- 3. Highlight Multiple Shots and press ...

Note: If your phone's memory is full, the **Multiple Shots** option will not appear.

- **4.** Select one of the following options and press ******:
- Off to deactivate the multiple shots option.
- ▶ **3 Shots** to take a series of three pictures.
- ▶ 6 Shots to take a series of six pictures. (Only appears when the resolution setting is Low or Medium.)
- ▶ **9 Shots** to take a series of nine pictures. (Only appears when the resolution setting is Low.)
- Select the duration of the interval between shots (Normal or Fast) and press .
- **6.** Press **Capture** (left softkey), **(a)**, **(b)**, or the side camera key to take the pictures. (The Multiple Shots folder will display up to nine thumbnail pictures per screen.)

Note: After taking multiple shots, the pictures are automatically saved in the In Camera folder. (See "In Camera Folder" on page 124 for details.)

Taking Stitch Shots

Stitch shot allows you to stitch separate images together. With this feature, your phone's viewfinder is divided in two and you can shoot each part separately. When you shoot the first part, the camera displays a section of the first part, so you can line up the next picture with the first one.

To take a stitch shot:

- 1. From camera mode, press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight Fun Tools and press 🐯.
- 3. Highlight Stitch Shot and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight Vertical or Horizontal and press 🐨.
- ▶ Use your navigation key to switch the stitch display.
- **5.** To take the first picture, press .
- **6.** To take the second picture, press

Note: This option is not available when the resolution setting is High (see page 122).

Using the Zoom

This feature allows you to zoom in on an object when you take a picture. Depending on your resolution settings, you can adjust the zoom from 1x to 20x.

To use the zoom:

- From camera mode, press the navigation key right or left, or the Side Up/Down key to adjust the zoom. (The gauge bar appears.)
- 2. Press Capture (left softkey), , , or the side camera key to take the picture. (The picture will automatically be saved in the In Camera folder.)

Note: The Zoom gauge will not appear when the resolution setting is High.

Using the Mini-Flashlight

This function allows you to use the phone's camera flash as a miniature flashlight. To use this function, your phone must be in standby mode with the Side Key Guard unlocked. (See page 51 for the Side Key Guard.)

To use the mini flashlight:

With the flip closed and in standby mode, press and hold the Side Up/Down key (■■). (The light remains on for 8 seconds.)

Note: This function doesn't apply when a Missed Call or Notification is displayed.

Setting Auto Delete

With this feature, pictures and videos that have been uploaded to your online picture/video messaging account will be erased automatically from your phone. (Default setting is Off.)

To set Auto Delete:

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Picture&Video and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Settings & Info and press 🐯.
- 4. Highlight Auto Delete and press .
- 5. Highlight **On** or **Off** and press ...

Selecting Camera Settings

To select your camera settings:

- 1. From camera mode, press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight Camera Settings and press 🐯.
- **3.** Select one of the following options and press **3**:
- ► Resolution to select a picture's file size (High-640x480, Medium-320x240, or Low-160x120).
- ► Quality to select the picture quality setting (Fine, Normal, or Economy).
- Shutter Sound to select a shutter sound (Default, Say "Cheez", or Off).
- ► Full Screen to expand the camera display to full screen view without icons (except the flash icon).

Storing Pictures

Your phone's picture storage area is called **My Pictures**. There are two types of folders in My Pictures that can be used separately according to your needs:

- ► In Camera (see below)
- ► Saved to Phone (see page 127)

In Camera Folder

Once a picture is taken, it is automatically saved to the

In Camera folder. From the In Camera folder, you can view all of the pictures you have taken, store selected images in your phone, send pictures to the online picture/video messaging web site, delete images, and access additional picture options.

To review your stored pictures in the In Camera folder:

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Picture&Video and press ...
- 3. Highlight My Pictures and press 🐯.
- **4.** Highlight **In Camera** and press **..** (Thumbnail pictures will display, up to nine pictures at a time.)
- **5.** Use your navigation key to view and scroll through the pictures.

In Camera Folder Options

When you are viewing the In Camera folder, press **Options** (right softkey) to display the following options:

- **Expand** to switch to the Expand view mode.
- ▶ **Thumbnail** to switch to the Thumbnail view mode.
- ▶ **Upload to Albums** to upload pictures from the In Camera folder to the online picture/video messaging web site. Depending on your settings, you may be prompted to accept an Internet connection. Choose from the following options:
 - This Picture to upload the currently highlighted picture.
 - Selected Pictures to upload the selected pictures.
 Press to select a picture (the check box on the lower right corner will be marked).
 - All Pictures to upload all pictures in the In Camera folder.

Note: If this is the first time you have accessed the online picture/video messaging account, you will be prompted to create your online picture/video messaging password. See "Creating Your Online Picture/Video Messaging Password" on page 116.

- ▶ **Set as** to assign the picture.
 - **Picture ID** to display the currently highlighted picture for incoming calls from a specific Phone Book entry. Select the desired entry and press .
 - Screen Saver to display the currently highlighted picture as a screen saver. Select Main LCD or Sub LCD and press

Note: Pictures assigned as Picture ID or Screen Savers will automatically be copied to the Saved to Phone folder.

- ▶ **Display/Edit** to display the following options:
 - Special Effects to apply special effects on your pictures.
 You can select from Color Tone, Fun Stamps, or Rotate.
 - **Text Caption** to edit the selected picture's caption.
 - **Picture Info** to display information such as the picture's caption, time/date, and size.
 - Full Screen to display the selected picture in full screen mode without any icons or Info Bar.
 - Info Bar to display the selected picture's information bar. (Expanded view only.)
 - Slideshow to view your pictures in slideshow mode.
 (Only available when two or more pictures are saved to the folder.)
 - Sort by to sort pictures by Name, Size, Date-Taken or Date-Uploaded. (Thumbnail view only.)
- Delete to delete pictures in the In Camera folder. Select
 This Picture, Selected Pictures, or All Pictures.

Note: Deleting pictures will free up memory space in your phone to enable you to take more pictures. Once deleted, pictures cannot be uploaded to your online picture/video messaging account or saved to the Saved to Phone folder.

 Save to Phone to save the selected pictures in the Saved to Phone folder

Note: Save to Phone and Upload to Albums copy pictures from your phone's In Camera folder to your Saved to Phone folder or your online picture/video messaging account. Pictures that have been stored in your Saved to Phone folder or uploaded to your online account will remain available in the In Camera folder until you erase them.

- ► Go to Saved to Ph. to display the Saved to Phone folder.
- ▶ Go to Camera to activate Camera mode.

Saved to Phone Folder

When you assign a picture, it will automatically be saved in the **Saved to Phone** folder. The Saved to Phone folder allows you to store copies of pictures on your phone and to assign pictures to various phone tasks.

To save a picture to the Saved to Phone folder:

1. From the In Camera folder (see "In Camera Folder" on page 124), select a picture you wish to save to the Saved to Phone folder and press . (You may select multiple pictures.)

Tip: If there is no selected picture, the currently highlighted picture will be selected.

- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- **3.** Highlight **Save to Phone** and press **(a)**. (A copy of the picture will be saved to the Saved to Phone folder.)

To view pictures stored in the Saved to Phone folder:

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Picture&Video and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight My Pictures and press 🐨.
- **4.** Highlight **Saved to Phone** and press **(3)**. (Thumbnail pictures will display, up to nine pictures at a time.)
- Use your navigation key to view and scroll through the pictures.

Saved to Phone Folder Options

When you are viewing the Saved to Phone folder, press Options (right softkey) to display the following options:

- ► **Set as** to assign the picture. Select **Picture ID** or **Screen Saver** and press **...**
- ▶ Display/Edit to edit or display your picture's details. (See "In Camera Folder Options" on page 125 for details.)
- ▶ Delete to delete pictures in the Saved to Phone folder. Select This Picture, Selected Pictures, or All Pictures.

Note: Deleting pictures will free up memory space in your phone to enable you to take more pictures.

- ▶ Pics In Camera to display the In Camera folder.
- ▶ **Go to Camera** to activate Camera mode.

Note: Assigned pictures will be identified with the @ icon.

Recording Videos

In addition to taking pictures, you can also record, view, and send videos to your friends and family with your phone's built-in video camera.

To record a video:

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Picture&Video and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Camcorder and press to activate video mode. (Additional video options are available through the video mode Options menu. See "Video Mode Options" on page 131 for more information.)
- **4.** Using the phone's main LCD as a viewfinder, aim the camera lens at your subject.
- **5.** Press Record (left softkey), , , or the side camera key to begin recording. (Maximum recording time is 30 seconds.)
- **6.** Press , Stop (right softkey), or the side camera key to stop recording. (The video will automatically be saved in the In Camcorder folder.)
- To return to video mode to record another video, press or the side camera key.
- **7.** Press Next (right softkey) for more options:
- ▶ **Send Video** to send the video. (See page 141 for details.)
- ▶ **Go to Camcorder** to return to video mode to take another video.
- ▶ **Upload to Albums** to upload the video you just took to the online picture/video messaging web site.
- Set as to assign the video. Select Ringer or Animation and press .
- ▶ **Playback** to play back the video you just took.
- ▶ **Delete** to delete the video you just took.
- Videos In Camcord. to access the In Camcorder folder to review your saved videos.

To take a video with the flip closed:

- 1. Press and hold the side camera key to activate camera mode.
- **2.** Press and hold the side camera key to activate video mode.
- **3.** Point the camera lens at the desired subject.

Note: When taking a video with the phone closed, the subject image appears in reverse on the external display. The captured image will not be saved in reverse.

- 4. Press the side camera key to start recording.
- **5.** Press the side camera key to stop recording. (Your video will be saved automatically in the In Camcorder folder.)

Video Mode Options

Several options are available from video mode.

Press **Options** (right softkey) to display additional options:

- Video Mode to select video mode from Normal, Night/Dark, Beach/Snow, Scenery, or Soft Focus.
- Video Light to select a Video Light setting. Select On to light the video light.
- ➤ **Zoom** to zoom in on an object. You can adjust the zoom from 1x to 18x in Medium-resolution, or 1x to 12x in Goodresolution.
- ➤ **Self-timer** to activate the timer function. (See "Setting the Self-timer" on page 118 for details.)
- ▶ **Image Controls** to select an option from the following:
 - Brightness to select Auto or Manual brightness control.
 - White Balance to adjust white balance based on changing conditions.
- ► Camcord.Settings to select your settings. (See "Selecting Camcorder Settings" on page 132 for details.)
- Videos In Camcord. to go to your phone's In Camcorder folder (if applicable).
- ▶ **Go to Camera** to switch to camera mode (if applicable).
- ▶ **Key Guidance** to indicate the key functions in video mode.

Selecting Camcorder Settings

To select your camcorder settings:

- **1.** From video mode, press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight Camcord.Settings and press 🐯.
- 3. Select an option from the following and press
- Resolution to select a file size (Good-176x144 or Medium-128x96) for a video.
- ▶ Video Quality to select video quality from Rich-15sec., Normal-20sec., or Economy-30sec.
- Silent Movie to select On to record without sounds. Select Off to deactivate this feature.
- ▶ Cue Sound to select a cue sound (Default, "Action&Cut", or Off).
- ▶ **Skin Frames** to select your favorite frame. (Only appears when the resolution setting is Medium.)

Note: Recording time varies depending on the Video Quality.

Storing Videos

Your phone's video storage area is called **My Videos**. There are two types of folders in My Videos that can be used separately according to your needs:

- ► In Camcorder (see below)
- ► Saved to Phone (see page 136)

In Camcorder Folder

Once a video is recorded, it is automatically saved to the **In Camcorder** folder. From the In Camcorder folder, you can view all of the videos you have taken, store selected videos in your phone, send videos to the online picture/video messaging web site, delete videos, and access additional video options.

To review your stored videos in the In Camcorder folder:

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Picture&Video and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight My Videos and press .
- **4.** Highlight **In Camcorder** and press **(Part of the Camcorder)**. (Thumbnail stills will display, up to nine at a time.)
- **5.** Use your navigation key to scroll through and select a video.
- **6.** Press Play (left softkey) to play the selected video.

Tip: Press the Side Up/Down key up or down to adjust the video volume while playing a video or in the Expanded view mode.

In Camcorder Folder Options

When you are in the In Camcorder folder, several options are available. Press **Options** (right softkey) to display the following options:

- **Expand** to switch to the Expand view mode.
- ▶ **Thumbnail** to switch to the Thumbnail view mode.
- ▶ **Send Video** to send video files. (See page 141 for details.)
- Upload to Albums to upload videos saved in the In Camcorder folder to the online picture/video messaging web site. Choose from This Video, Selected Videos, or All Videos.
- Set as to assign the video. Select Ringer or Animation and press ...
- ▶ **Display/Edit** to select an option from the following:
 - **Text Caption** to edit the caption of a video.
 - Video Info to display information of a video, such as caption, time/date, size, etc.
 - **Sort by** to sort videos by Name, Size, Date-Taken or Date-Uploaded. (Thumbnail view only.)
- ▶ Delete to delete videos in the In Camcorder folder. Select This Video, Selected Videos, or All Videos.

Note: Deleting videos will free up memory space in your phone to enable you to take more videos. Once erased, videos cannot be uploaded to your online picture/video messaging account or saved to the Saved to Phone folder.

- Save to Phone to save the selected videos in the Saved to Phone folder.
- ▶ **Go to Saved to Ph.** to display the Saved to Phone folder.
- ▶ **Go to Camcorder** to activate video mode.

Note: Upload to Albums and Save to Phone copy videos from your phone's In Camcorder folder to your Saved to Phone folder or your online picture/video messaging account. Videos that have been stored in your Saved to Phone folder or uploaded to your online account will remain available in the In Camcorder folder until you erase them.

Note: If this is the first time you have accessed the online picture/video messaging account, you will be prompted to create your online picture/video messaging password. (See "Creating Your Online Picture/Video Messaging Password" on page 116.)

Saved to Phone Folder

When you assign a video, it will automatically be saved in the **Saved to Phone** folder. The Saved to Phone folder allows you to store copies of videos on your phone and to assign videos to various phone tasks.

To save a video to the Saved to Phone folder:

1. From the In Camcorder folder (see "In Camcorder Folder" on page 133), select a video you wish to save to the Saved to Phone folder and press (2). (You may select multiple videos.)

Tip: If there is no selected video, the currently highlighted video will be selected.

- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- **3.** Select **Save to Phone**. (A copy of the video will be saved to the Saved to Phone folder.)

To review your stored videos in the Saved to Phone folder:

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Picture&Video and press 🐯.
- 3. Highlight My Videos and press 🐨.
- **4.** Highlight **Saved to Phone** and press (Thumbnail stills will display, up to nine at a time.)
- **5.** Use your navigation key to scroll through and select a video.
- **6.** Press Play (left softkey) to play the selected video.

Tip: Press the Side Up/Down key up or down to adjust the video volume while playing a video or in the Expanded view mode.

Saved to Phone Folder Options

When you are viewing the Saved to Phone folder, press **Options** (right softkey) to display the following options:

- **Expand** to switch to the Expand view mode.
- ▶ **Thumbnail** to switch to the Thumbnail view mode.
- Set as to assign the video. Select Ringer or Animation and press ...
- ➤ **Display/Edit** to display the currently highlighted video's details or edit the videos (see page 134).
- Delete to delete videos stored in the Saved to Phone folder.
 Select This Video, Selected Videos, or All Videos.
- ▶ Videos In Camcord. to display the In Camcorder folder.
- ► Go to Camcorder to activate video mode.

Note: Assigned videos will be identified with the 🍑 icon.

Sending Pictures/Videos

Once you've taken a picture, you can use the messaging capabilities of your picture/video enabled phone to instantly share it with family and friends. You can send a picture or video to up to ten people at a time using their email addresses or their mobile phone number (if compatible phone).

Sending Pictures From the In Camera Folder

To send pictures from the In Camera folder:

- 1. Press to access the Picture & Video menu.
- 2. Highlight My Pictures and press 🐯.
- 3. Highlight In Camera and press .
- **4.** Highlight a picture you wish to send and press (The check box on the lower right corner will be marked. You can select multiple pictures.)
- **5.** Press **Send** (left softkey). (You will see a message on the display.)

Note: The first time you send a picture/video message (if compatible phone), you will be prompted to establish an online picture/video messaging web site account and password. (See "Creating Your Online Picture/Video Messaging Password" on page 116.)

- 6. Highlight **Recipients** and press 🐯.
- 7. Select one of the following options and press 🐯:
- ▶ Phone Book Entry to select recipients from your Phone Book. Highlight a recipient and press ⊕ to select.
- ► Company List Ent. to select a recipient from your company list.
- ▶ Personal List Ent. to select a recipient from your personal list.
- Personal Grps. Ent. to select a recipient from your personal group list.
- ▶ **Mobile Phone#** to enter a mobile phone number directly.
- ▶ Email Address to enter an email address directly.
- ► From Recent List to select from a list of recent picture/video message or messaging recipients.

- **8.** Press Next (left softkey) when you are finished adding recipients. (You may include up to ten recipients per message.)
- 9. If you wish to include a text message, scroll to **Message** and press the appropriate softkey. Enter your message using your keypad (or press **Mode** [right softkey] to select a character input mode) and press **@**. (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 25.)
- **10.** If you wish to include a voice memo with the picture, highlight the box next to **Audio** and press **Record** (right softkey) to record. Press to start recording. (Maximum recording time is ten seconds.)
- 11. Confirm the recipients, message, voice memo, and picture.
- ▶ To change a recipient, highlight the recipient, press the appropriate softkey, and follow the instructions in step 7 to select or edit the recipient.
- To change the text message, scroll to Message and press the appropriate softkey.
- ➤ To change the voice memo, highlight the box next to **Audio** and press the appropriate softkey to display options:
 - Play to play the attached voice memo.
 - Record New to re-record the voice memo.
 - **Erase** to delete the voice memo from the message.
- ► To change the attached picture(s), select the thumbnail picture and press the appropriate softkey. Select From My Pics. or Take Picture and press . After selecting the new picture(s), press Next (left softkey).
- 12. Press the appropriate softkey to send the picture.

Sending Pictures From Messaging

You can also send picture messages from your phone's Messaging menu.

To send pictures from the Messaging menu:

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- **2.** Highlight **Messaging** and press **.**
- 3. Highlight Send Message and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight **Picture** and press *****.
- **5.** Highlight **From My Pics** and press **.** (The In Camera folder will display, with up to nine thumbnail pictures per screen.)
- **6.** Use the navigation key to select the picture you wish to send and press (You can select multiple pictures.)
- 7. Press Next (left softkey). To complete and send the picture, follow steps 6-12 in "Sending Pictures From the In Camera Folder" on page 138.

Tip: To take and send a new picture from Messaging, select **Take Picture** during step 5 above, take the new picture, press Next (right softkey), and follow steps 6-12 in "Sending Pictures From the In Camera Folder" on page 138.

Tip: You can also send pictures from Online Albums by selecting Online Albums during step 5 above.

Sending Videos From the In Camcorder Folder

To send videos from the In Camcorder folder:

- 3. Highlight In Camcorder and press 🗫.
- **4.** Highlight a video you wish to send and press **3.** (The check box on the lower right corner will be marked. You can select multiple videos.)
- 5. Press Options (right softkey) and select Send Video.
- **6.** To complete and send the video message, follow steps 6-12 in "Sending Pictures From the In Camera Folder" on page 138.

Sending Videos From Messaging

To send videos from the Messaging menu:

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Messaging and press 🐯.
- 3. Highlight Send Message and press .
- **4.** Highlight **Video** and press .
- Highlight From My Videos and press . (The In Camcorder folder will display, with up to nine thumbnail videos per screen.)

Once you have uploaded pictures from your phone to your online picture/video messaging account (see "In Camera Folder Options" on page 125), you can use your personal computer to manage your pictures. From the online picture/video messaging web site you can share pictures, edit album titles, add captions and organize images.

To access the online picture/video messaging web site:

- From your computer's Internet connection, go to https://mypictures.bell.ca.
- Enter your mobile phone number and online picture/video messaging password to register. (See "Creating Your Online Picture/Video Messaging Password" on page 116.)

Managing Online Pictures and Videos From Your Phone

You can use your phone to manage, edit, or share pictures and videos you have uploaded to the online picture/video messaging web site.

To view your online pictures and videos from your phone:

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Picture&Video and press .

Shortcut: Instead of steps 1 and 2 above, press .



- 3. Highlight **Online Albums** and press .
- 4. Highlight View Albums and press . (Depending on your settings you may be prompted to accept an Internet connection.) (The **Uploads** folder and your albums appear.)
- 5. Highlight **Uploads** or an album title and press we to display.
- 6. Highlight **Picture** or **Video** and press . (Thumbnail pictures or videos, up to nine per screen, are displayed.)
- 7. Use your navigation key to select a picture or video.
- **8.** Press Options (right softkey) to display your online picture or video options.

Uploading Pictures and Videos

To upload pictures:

- 1. Press to access the Picture & Video menu.
- 2. Highlight Online Albums and press 🐯.
- **3.** Highlight **Upload Pics** and press **3.** (Thumbnail pictures will display.)
- **4.** Select the picture(s) you wish to upload and press **Upload** (left softkey).
- 5. Highlight This Picture, Selected Pictures, or All Pictures and press .
- 6. Highlight "Uploads" Area and press 🐨.
 - or -

Highlight **Other Albums**, press and then select your desired album and press .

To upload videos:

- 1. Press to access the Picture & Video menu.
- 2. Highlight Online Albums and press 🐯.
- 3. Highlight **Upload Videos** and press . (Thumbnail videos will display.)
- **4.** Select videos and press **Upload** (left softkey).
- Highlight This Video, Selected Videos, or All Videos and press .
- 6. Highlight "Uploads" Area and press 🐨.

- or -

Highlight **Other Albums**, press , and then select your desired album and press .

Downloading Your Online Pictures and Videos

From your online picture/video messaging albums display, you can select pictures or videos to download to your phone's folder.

To download pictures from the online picture/video messaging web site:

- 1. From the online pictures display, select the picture you wish to download and press **Options** (right softkey). (See "Managing Online Pictures and Videos From Your Phone" on page 143.)
- 2. Highlight Save to Phone and press 🐨.
- 3. Select one of the following options and press **3**:
- Set as to assign the picture (Picture ID or Screen Saver).
- Download Only to download the picture to the In Camera folder.

To download videos from the online picture/video messaging web site:

- 1. From the online video display, select the video you wish to download and press Options (right softkey). (See "Managing Online Pictures and Videos From Your Phone" on page 143.)
- **2.** Highlight **Save to Phone** and press **.**
- ► **Set as** to assign the video (**Ringer** or **Animation**).
- Download Only to download the video to the In Camcorder folder.

Sending Online Picture/Video Messages

To send pictures using the online Address Book:

- 1. From the online picture display, select a picture you wish to send and press **Send** (left softkey). (See "Managing Online Pictures and Videos From Your Phone" on page 143.)
- 2. Highlight Recipients and press ...
- 3. Highlight Online Addr. Book and press 🐯.
- 4. Highlight a recipient or recipients (up to 10) from your Online Address Book and press .
- **5.** Press **Done** (left softkey) when you are finished selecting recipients.
- **6.** To include a text message, highlight the box under **Message** and press Add (right softkey). Enter your message and press ...
- 7. Confirm your recipients and attached data.
- **8.** Press **Send** (left softkey) to send the online picture/video message.

To send videos from the online Address Book:

- 1. From the online video display, select a video you wish to send and press Options (right softkey). (See "Managing Online Pictures and Videos From Your Phone" on page 143.)
- 2. Highlight **Send Video** and press **8**.
- **3.** To complete and send the video message, follow steps 2-8 above.

To send an album from the online pictures menu:

- 1. From the online albums display, select an album you wish to send and press **Send** (left softkey). (See "Managing Online Pictures and Videos From Your Phone" on page 143.)
- **2.** Follow steps 2-8 in "To send pictures using the online Address Book" above to complete and send a picture album.

Accessing Online Picture and Video Options From Your Phone

To access your online Picture and Video options from your mobile phone:

- Select a picture or video from your online picture/video messaging account (see "Managing Online Pictures and Videos From Your Phone" on page 143).
- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey) to display options.
- 3. To select an option, highlight it and press ...
- **Expand** to switch to the Expand view mode.
- ▶ **Thumbnail** to switch to the Thumbnail view mode.
- ➤ **Send Video** to send videos. (See "Sending Online Picture/ Video Messages" on page 146 for details.) (Videos only.)
- Copy/Move to copy or move pictures or videos to a selected album.
- ▶ **Display/Edit** to display the details of currently highlighted picture/video or edit the picture/video.
- ▶ Delete to erase pictures or videos saved in the current album (or Uploads folder).
- Save to Phone to select Set as to assign pictures or videos to phone tasks or Download Only to download the pictures or videos to the In Camera or In Camcorder folder.
- Create Album to create a new album (from Uploads folder only).
- ▶ **Online Albums** to switch the display to the online album list.

Note: The online picture/video messaging options may vary depending on the item you select.

To access your online Albums options from your mobile phone:

- 1. Display the album list in the online picture/video messaging menu (see "Managing Online Pictures and Videos From Your Phone" on page 143).
- 2. Use your navigation key to select an album (or Uploads folder).
- **3.** Press **Options** (right softkey) to display options.
- 4. To select an option, highlight it and press 🐨.
- Create Album to create a new album. Enter a new album name and press Save (left softkey).
- ▶ **Delete Album** to delete the selected album.
- Rename Album to rename the selected album. Enter a new name and press Save (left softkey).
- ▶ **Album Info** to display detailed information about the album.

Note: The Uploads folder cannot be erased or renamed.

13. Service Features

Using Voicemail

All unanswered calls to your phone are automatically transferred to voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off.

Voicemail Notification

There are several ways your phone alerts you to new voicemail messages:

- By displaying a message on the screen.
- ▶ By playing the assigned ringer type.
- By blinking the LED.
- ▶ By displaying 📆 at the top of your screen.

Displaying Voicemail Details

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Messaging and press .
- 3. Highlight Voicemail and press 🐯.
- 4. Highlight **Details** and press .

Retrieving Your Voicemail Messages

- Press and hold 1. (Your phone will dial your voicemail box.)
 - or -
- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Messaging** and press **...**
- 3. Highlight Voicemail and press 🐯.
- 4. Highlight Call Voicemail and press ...

Note: You are charged for airtime minutes when you are accessing your voicemail from your phone.

Clearing the Message Icon

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- **2.** Highlight **Messaging** and press \$.
- 3. Highlight Voicemail and press 🐯.
- 4. Highlight Clear Count and press 🐯.
- **5.** Highlight **Yes** and press ******.

Editing Your Voicemail Number

To edit your voicemail number:

- 1. Press 🐯 to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Messaging** and press *****.
- 3. Highlight Voicemail and press .
- 4. Highlight Edit Voicemail# and press 💨.
- 5. Edit your voicemail number and press ...
 To reset your voicemail number:
- 1. Follow steps 1-4 above.
- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey).

Responding to Call Waiting

When you're on a call, Call Waiting alerts you to incoming calls by sounding beeps. Your phone's screen informs you that another call is coming in and displays the caller's phone number (if it is available and you are in digital mode).

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

Press TALK (or press Options [right softkey], highlight Flash or Flash:Speaker and press . This puts the first caller on hold and answers the second call.

To respond to an incoming call when Answer on Hold is activated:

Press (or press options) [right softkey], highlight Flash or Flash:Speaker and press). (The Answer on Hold will be automatically deactivated. See page 16 for Answer on Hold.)

To switch back to the first caller:

Press (or press options) [right softkey], highlight Flash and press again.

Note: Call Waiting may not be available while roaming off the home network.

Making a Three-Way Call

With Three-Way Calling, you can talk to two people at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls.

- 1. Enter a number you wish to call and press TALK or SPEAKER.
- 2. Once you have established the connection, press **Options** [right softkey], highlight **Three-Way Call** and press **Options** to put the first caller on hold.
- 3. Enter the second number you wish to call and press **Options** [right softkey], highlight **Call** or **Call:Speaker On** and press **(3)**).
- 4. When you're connected to the second party, press again (or press **Options** [right softkey], highlight **Flash** and press to begin your three-way call.

If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all three callers are disconnected.

Web

With Web on your phone, you will be able to browse full-color graphic versions – not just text versions – of your favorite website, making it easier than ever to stay informed while on the go. Check sports scores, trade stocks, and shop all on your phone.

Launching the Web

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Web and press 🐯.

Net Guard

With the Net Guard setting, the confirmation display will appear to connect to the Internet. This feature helps you avoid accidental connections. You can disable the Net Guard in the future by selecting **Always Auto-Connect** when the Net Guard is displayed.

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Internet and press 🐯.
- 4. Highlight **Net Guard** and press .
- 5. Select **On** or **Off** and press .
- On to make the Net Guard appear when connecting to the Internet.
- ▶ **Off** to avoid the Net Guard when connecting to the Internet.

Note: When enabled, the Net Guard appears only once per session. The Net Guard does not appear if the phone is merely re-connecting due to a time-out.

Browsing the Web

Creating a Bookmark

Bookmarks allow you to store the address of your favorite websites for easy access at a later time.

- 1. Launch the Web page you want to mark.
- **2**. Press (right softkey) to go to the browser menu.
- **3.** Highlight **Mark this page** and press **OK** (left softkey).
- **4.** Press **OK** (left softkey) to save the bookmark.

Note: Bookmarking a page does not store the page contents, just its address. Some pages cannot be bookmarked. Whether a particular Web page may be marked is controlled by its creator.

Accessing a Bookmark

- **1.** Access the browser menu by pressing (right softkey).
- **2.** Highlight **View Bookmarks** and press **OK** (left softkey).
- **3.** Highlight the bookmark you'd like to access and press **OK** (left softkey) to go to the website.

Deleting a Bookmark

- 1. Access View Bookmarks menu as outlined above in steps 1-2.
- **2.** Highlight the bookmark you wish to erase and press (right softkey).
- **3**. Highlight **Delete** and press $\boxed{\mathbf{0K}}$ (left softkey).
- 4. Press Yes (right softkey).

Going to a Specific Website

- Launch the Web and press (right softkey) to display the browser menu.
- **2.** Highlight **Go to URL...** and press **OK** (left softkey).
- **3.** Highlight **Address** and press **OK** (left softkey).
- **4.** Use your keypad to enter the URL of the website you wish to go to, and press **OK** (left softkey).

Note: Not all websites are viewable on your phone.

Reloading a Web Page

- 1. Launch the Web and press (right softkey) to display the browser menu.
- **2.** Highlight **Refresh this page** and press **OK** (left softkey).

Restarting the Web Browser

If the Web browser appears to be malfunctioning or stops responding, you can usually fix the problem by simply restarting the browser.

- 1. From an active Internet connection, press (right softkey) to display the browser menu.
- **2.** Highlight **More...** and press **OK** (left softkey).
- **3.** Highlight **Restart Browser** and press **OK** (left softkey).

Adjusting the Browser Sound Volume

- Launch the Web and press (right softkey) to display the browser menu.
- **2.** Highlight **More...** and press **OK** (left softkey).
- 3. Highlight **Preferences** and press **OK** (left softkey).
- **4.** Highlight **Sound Volume** and press **OK** (left softkey).
- **5.** Highlight your desired volume level by pressing the navigation key up or down and press **3.**

Downloading through the Wireless Web

Your phone allows you to download images (screen savers), ringers, games, etc., from a website. It is also possible to download from certain menus (Contacts list, Ringer Setting, or Display Setting).

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- **2.** Highlight **Downloads** and press *****.

Shortcut: Instead of steps 1 and 2 above, press the navigation key down.

- Highlight your desired data folder (for example, Games, Ringers, or Screen Savers) and press
- 4. Highlight **Get New** and press to start up the browser.
- **5.** Select your desired image or ringer file, and follow the system prompts.

Note: The maximum number of downloaded files that can be stored in each folder is 500 files.

Confirming the Downloaded Data

The downloaded data will be automatically classified as games, ringers, images (screen savers) or an application folder. However, if any data has a different category, it is classified as a Dynamic folder. If data doesn't belong to any of the above categories, it is classified in the Others folder.

To confirm the downloaded content in the downloaded games folder:

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 3. Highlight your desired data folder (for example, Games, Ringers, or Screen Savers) and press .
- **4.** Highlight the downloaded data you want to confirm and press .

Tip: The names of dynamic folders are variable depending on data.

Downloaded Data Options

Selecting Download Settings

This feature is available when you select a Java application.

To select the settings for the downloaded data:

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- **2.** Highlight **Downloads** and press *****.
- 3. Highlight Games or Applications and press 🐯.
- **4.** Highlight the data for which you want to select settings and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 5. Highlight **Settings** and press *****.
- **6.** Highlight your desired option and press **3.**

Assigning the Downloaded Data

To assign the downloaded data:

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- **2.** Highlight **Downloads** and press *****.
- 3. Highlight Ringers or Screen Savers and press
- **4.** Highlight the data you want to assign and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 5. Highlight **Set as** and press .
- 6. Highlight the menu you want to assign and press

Sorting the downloaded data

The files downloaded via website are stored in alphabetical order. You can sort the data by name, size, or date.

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press **@**.
- 3. Highlight each folder that includes the downloaded data you want to sort and press .
- 4. Press Options (right softkey).
- 5. Highlight **Sort by** and press ...
- 6. Highlight Name, Size or Date and press .

Viewing the Downloaded Data Size

This feature allows you to confirm each downloaded data size and the rest of the download capacity.

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- **2.** Highlight **Downloads** and press *****.
- 3. Highlight each folder that includes the downloaded data you want to confirm and press .
- **4.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- **5.** Highlight **lcon/Size** and press (a). (Data size is displayed at the left of the downloaded data name.)

Viewing the memory space for downloading

This feature allows you to confirm how much memory is left and used for downloading.

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press ...
- 3. Press Options (right softkey).
- **4.** Highlight **View Memory** and press **.** (Used and Free memory size are displayed.)

Erasing the Downloaded Data

- 1. Press to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press .
- 3. Highlight a folder and press 🐯.
- **4.** Highlight the downloaded data you want to erase and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 5. Highlight **Erase** and press .
- **6.** Follow the onscreen prompts to erase the data.

Tip: To erase all data, select Erase All during step 5 above.

Note: Erasing downloaded data may take a considerable amount of time.

14. Using your Phone's Media Player

Your Multimedia Channel Options

Your new phone offers a variety of accessible audio or video channels, depending on your service plan and multimedia subscriptions. Your subscription options include a comprehensive basic service as well as a full menu of a variety of additional channel options.

- ▶ **Preview Channel:** This free channel lets you sample clips from all of the available channels before you make a decision to subscribe. It's like viewing the movie preview before deciding whether you want to spend the money to go see the full motion picture.
- ▶ Available Individual Channel Options: You also have the option of subscribing to individual channels from an extensive menu offering. These channels are available for a monthly subscription fee and allow you unlimited access as long as you continue to pay your monthly subscription fee.

Accessing Your Media Player's Channel Listings

It's easy to access and view the multimedia Channel Listings on your SCP-8300 by Sanyo from the phone's main menu.

To access your media player and Channel Listings:

- 1. Press from standby mode to display the phone's main menu.
- Select Media Player. Your Channel Listings will display, divided into the following two sections:
- ▶ My Channels: These include the complimentary Previews channel and any available individual channels for which you have purchased access.
- ▶ Available Channels: These are channels that have not yet been purchased but are available to access for a monthly subscription fee. Use your navigation key to scroll through and select a channel, and follow the onscreen instructions to purchase access to it. Upon purchasing access to one of these channels, the channel will be listed, along with its corresponding channel number, in the My Channels section of your media player's Channel Listings. You will see it displayed in this section the next time you access your phone's media player.

Playing a Video or Audio Clip

To select and play a media clip:

- 1. Press from standby mode to display the phone's main menu
- 2. Select Media Player to display your Channel Listings.
- **3.** Use your keypad to enter a channel number (or use your navigation key to scroll to a channel and press ...).
- ▶ **My Channels:** If you have selected a channel that you've already signed up for (or if it's a channel with no monthly fee), you will see a list of available clips.
- ▶ Available Channels: If you have selected a channel you have not yet signed up for, you will be prompted to accept the corresponding monthly charge. Follow the onscreen prompts to subscribe to the selected channel. (A list of available clips will display.)
- **4.** Scroll to the clip you would like to play and press **Select** (left softkey) or . (The clip will automatically load and begin playing.)

Note: The first time you access one of your Available Channels, you will be prompted to accept the corresponding monthly fee (unless it's a channel that doesn't have an associated monthly fee). Accepting the charge gives you access to the channel for as long as you continue to pay the monthly fee. If you accept the fee, the next time you access your phone's media player, this channel will appear in the My Channels section of your Channel Listings.

Tip: When entering the specific channel number, channels 01 - 09 do not require you to enter a "0." For example, to access channel "07," just press the "7" key.

Multimedia FAOs

 How does my phone's Multimedia Service differ from video messaging?

Multimedia Service lets you access high-quality video and audio clips provided by external sources. Video messaging lets you capture, upload and share videos that you personally create with your phone's built-in camcorder.

Will I know if I'm receiving an incoming call while I'm viewing or listening to an audio clip?

No. All incoming calls will roll into voicemail while you are playing a clip. If the caller leaves a voicemail, the voicemail icon will appear on the screen.

3. How long are the clips? Will I know the estimated time it will take to play the clip prior to accessing it?

Once you have selected a channel, you will see a listing of the available clips, with the clip's length appearing after the clip's title. In general, a clip's duration will depend on the story or content being provided, and can be fairly short or as long as a few minutes.

4. Can l'access a multimedia clip wherever l'am, as long as l'have my phone?

As long as you are on the home network, you will have access to the audio and video clips.

Note: Multimedia Service does not work while roaming off of the home network or where service is unavailable.

5. After purchasing access to an Available Channel for a monthly fee, do I receive any confirmation? That is, how do I know it has been purchased?

The next time you access your media player's Channel Listings, the purchased channel title and corresponding number will appear in the My Channels section.

6. How can I easily access a channel without having to scroll through all the channels in my Channel Listings?

Each channel will have a number to the left of it. You can simply press this number to quickly access the clips located within that channel.

Tip: When entering the specific channel number, channels 01 - 09 do not require you to enter a "0." For example, to access channel "07," just press the "7" key.

7. What does it mean when the video pauses and I see the word "loading" at the bottom of the screen?

This happens when the media player is in the process of loading the data necessary to play the clip. It typically occurs when there is heavy traffic on the network.

8. If I place my stereo headphones on and insert them into the phone's headset jack, can I close the flip while I am playing an audio (or video) clip without interrupting the clip?

Yes. When you insert your stereo headset into the phone's headset jack, the phone automatically goes into "headset mode," allowing you to close the flip and continue playing the clip (likewise, if your phone is in "headset mode," a phone call will not become disconnected by closing the flip).

9. Can I surf to a different channel while I am playing a clip?

Yes. While you are playing a clip, you can use the up and down navigation keys to surf to a different channel. A small pop-up screen will appear that tells you which channel you are watching as well as other channels you have access to. Use the navigation keys to scroll through the different channels. Once you find a channel that you want to watch, scroll to it and press (or simply wait approximately three seconds) and the channel will begin loading.

15. Safety Guidelines

Maintaining Your Phone's Peak Performance

- ▶ Try not to hold, bend, or twist the phone's antenna.
- Don't use the phone if the antenna is damaged.
- Avoid exposing your phone and accessories to rain or liquid spills. If your phone does get wet, turn the power off and immediately remove the battery.

Using Your Phone While Driving

Talking on your phone while driving (or operating the phone without a hands-free device) is prohibited in some jurisdictions. Laws vary as to specific restrictions.

- Let the person you are speaking to know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions.
- ▶ Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving.

Following Safety Guidelines

To operate your phone safely and efficiently, always follow any special regulations in a given area. Turn your phone off in areas where use is forbidden or when it may cause interference or danger.

Using Your Phone Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radiofrequency (RF) signals. However, RF signals from wireless phones may affect inadequately shielded electronic equipment.

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic operating systems and/or entertainment systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or their representative to determine if these systems are adequately shielded from external RF signals. Also check with the manufacturer regarding any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Consult the manufacturer of any personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids, to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF signals.

Note: Always turn off the phone in health care facilities and request permission before using the phone near medical equipment.

Turning Off Your Phone Before Flying

Turn off your phone or set your phone to Airplane mode before boarding any aircraft. To prevent possible interference with aircraft systems, Transport Canada regulations require you to have permission from a crew member to use your phone while the plane is on the ground.

Turning Off Your Phone in Dangerous Areas

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn your phone off when in a blasting area or in other areas with signs indicating two-way radios should be turned off. Construction crews often use remote-control RF devices to set off explosives.

Turn your phone off when you're in any area that has a potentially explosive atmosphere. Although it's rare, your phone and accessories could generate sparks. Sparks can cause an explosion or fire, resulting in bodily injury or even death. These areas are often, but not always, clearly marked. They include:

- Any area where it is very humid and with inflammables.
- Fueling areas such as gas stations.
- Below deck on boats.
- ▶ Fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities.
- Areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust, or metal powders.
- Any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle's engine.

Note: Never transport or store flammable gas, liquid or explosives in the compartment of your vehicle that contains your phone or accessories.

Restricting Children's Access to Your Phone

Your phone is not a toy. Do not allow children to play with it as they could hurt themselves and others, damage the phone or make calls that increase your telephone bill.

Protecting Your Battery

The guidelines listed below help you get the most out of your battery's performance.

- Use only approved batteries, AC adapters, and chargers. These chargers are designed to maximize battery life. Using other batteries or chargers voids your warranty and may cause damage.
- ► In order to avoid damage, charge the battery only in temperatures that range from 0° C to 45° C (32° F to 113° F).
- ▶ Don't store the battery in a high humidity environment.
- Don't use the battery charger in direct sunlight or in high humidity areas, such as the bathroom.
- ▶ Never dispose of the battery by incineration.
- ► Keep the metal contacts on top of the battery clean.
- ▶ Don't attempt to disassemble or short-circuit the battery.
- ▶ Don't store the battery in high temperature areas for long periods of time. It's best to follow these storage rules:

Less than one month:

-20° C to 60° C (-4° F to 140° F)

More than one month:

-20° C to 45° C (-4° F to 113° F)

Disposal of Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) Batteries

For safe disposal options of your Li-Ion batteries, please ensure that disposal of this in accordance with law and regulation.

- ▶ Do not dispose of the battery in fire; the cell may explode.
- Do not open or puncture the battery; the released electrolyte is corrosive and may cause damage to the eyes and skin.

Special Note: Be sure to dispose of your battery properly. In some areas, the disposal of batteries in household or business trash may be prohibited.

Note: For safety, do not handle a damaged or leaking Li-Ion battery.

Cautions

Any changes or modifications to your phone not expressly approved in this document could void your warranty for this equipment and void your authority to operate this equipment. Only use approved batteries, antennas and chargers. The use of any unauthorized accessories may be dangerous and void the phone warranty if said accessories cause damage or a defect to the phone.

Although your phone is quite sturdy, it is a complex piece of equipment and can be broken. Avoid dropping, hitting, bending or sitting on it.



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
