



FEATURES



First Time Set Up - automatically sets the TV for local channels, the correct picture signal (antenna or cable), and assists in the setting of TV's Smart Clock feature.

Infrared Remote Control - operates your TV set and a variety of wireless remote control VCRs, Cable TV Converters, and other accessory equipment.

Standard TV broadcast (VHF/UHF) or Cable TV (CATV) channel capability.

Closed Captioning - allows the viewer to read TV program dialogue or voice conversations as on-screen text.

Automatic Programming of channels - for quick and easy selection of favorite stations available in your area.

Picture-In-Picture (PIP) - can show a TV program and the direct video output from an accessory (VCR, etc.) onto the TV screen at the same time.

Parental Control for "Censoring" - this feature can block out channels to keep children from watching undesirable programming. Parental Guideline and Movie Rating settings can also be used as part of the new Content Advisory Data system available with TV programming.

Stereo-TV - with a built-in audio amplifier and a twin speaker system, reception of TV programs in both broadcast stereo sound or (SAP) bilingual broadcast are available.

Twin Antenna (A/B) Inputs - for easy displaying of two separate signal sources on the TV. An A/B button on the remote control switches the TV's Main screen between the two Antenna (A & B) Input options.

Audio/Video Jacks - for direct connections with VCRs (and other accessories) for quality TV picture and sound playback.Component Video Input connectors are also available for high fidelity color and picture resolution when using digital video source material, such as DVD.

Surround Sound - this TV set contains external; audio speaker connections for a more dynamic sound effect.

Sleep-Timer - automatically turns the TV OFF at preset time intervals.

Smart Button - for the control of TV Sound and the Picture levels. Use the Smart Button on the remote to quickly adjust Smart Sound (to select various audio modes matched to specific types of TV programming); Smart Picture (for programmed video level adjustments on a variety of program sources); and Smart Surf (for quick one button channel selection of up to 10 of your favorite channels).

Digital Ready - Projection Television capable of connecting to both the current analog television signals of today as well as interfacing with new upcoming digital source playback products and devices. This TV includes multiple signal connectors (Component Video, S-Video, Composite Video) which give you a variety of equipment playback options for digital set top boxes, satellite receivers, cable boxes, and other digital devices.

While there may exist some digital devices with connections not available on this television, you should be adequately prepared for the vast majority of products coming onto the digital consumer electronics' market. Note: You should always use the connection output on digital devices that gives the highest level of picture quality possible. As listed above the Component Video (or Y PB PR) input delivers the best color and picture reproduction; followed by S-Video; and then Composite Video. In addition to the above listed inputs, your television also includes the standard 750hm cable signal connector for use with antennas or analog cable boxes.




To adjust your TV color and picture controls, select a TV channel and follow the steps shown below:

1 Select BRIGHTNESS,

SHARPNESS picture control.

With the PICTURE MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (M) buttons. Then press the MENU button.







SMART HELP

Remember. When the bar scale is centered, control settings are at normal mid-range levels.


BRIGHTNESS Press (-) **or** (+) until dark parts of the picture show good detail.

<u>PICTURE</u> Press (-) or (+) until whitest parts of the picture are as bright as you prefer.

<u>COLOR</u> Press (-) **or** (+) to add or eliminate color.

<u>TINT</u> Press (-) or (+) to obtain natural skin tones. (Also see Flesh Correction on page 9 for more information).

 $\underline{SHARPNESS}$ **Press** (-) or (+) to improve detail in the picture.



CLEARVIEW

Clearview is a sharpness feature which smoothes out background snow (or picture noise) without losing picture image detail or crispness.







RED/BLUE CONVERGENCE

Convergence is the correct lining up of the red and blue light paths on the TV screen.

NOTE: If no color fringing (see Smart Help) shows, then no Convergence adjustments are necessary for your TV.

(BEGIN)

Select CONVERGENCE control.

With PICTURE MENU (2 of 2) on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (M) buttons.

Then press the MENU button.

- If there is RED or BLUE color fringing on the White cross, press the MENU button to continue.
- Press the MENU buttons
 to move the red or blue cross
 directly over the white cross on the
 TV screen.


The red or blue cross is properly adjusted when it is completely merged with the white cross. (No color appears around the edge of the white cross).

Press the STATUS button to clear the screen when convergence adjustments are complete.



SMART HELP

Remember. Convergence has been set at the factory for best viewing, but if one or more of the (red or blue) colors appear around the edges of objects (color fringing) follow the steps given in this section.



FLESH CORRECTION

Use the Flesh Correction control to keep skin tone hues (or facial tint) from varying from TV channel to TV channel.

(BEGIN)

Select FLESH | CORRECTION control.







FEATURE MENU CONTROL ADJUSTMENTS

PICTURE SOURCE

The picture for the TV can come through either the ANTENNA plug or the AUDIO/VIDEO INput jacks (on the rear of the TV). The Picture Source control simply tells the TV which one of these picture sources it is to show on the TV screen.



With the FEATURES MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (M) buttons. Then press the MENU button.

Press the MENU ▲▼ buttons
to move the RED highlight. Press
the MENU button to turn the
desired PICTURE SOURCE
control ON (▶).

ANT A or B- for a picture signal coming from either the ANT(enna) A or B Input plugs on the TV.

AUX 1 VIDEO- for a picture signal coming from the AUX 1 Video Input jack on the rear of the TV.

AUX 1 Y PB PR- for picture signals coming from the component (Y PB PR) luminance and color input jacks on the rear of the TV.

AUX 2 VIDEO- for a picture signal coming from the AUX 2 Video Input jack on the rear of the TV.

SIDE VIDEO- for a picture signal coming from the Video Input jack on the right side panel of the TV.


3 Press the STATUS button to clear the screen.



SMART HELP

Remember, the Auxiliary

Input modes (AUX 1 VIDEO, etc.) must have a compatible video signal source properly connected (to the INPUT plug on the rear of the TV), or the TV screen will be blank.



CLOSED CAPTION

Closed Captioning (CC) allows you to read the voice content of television programs on the TV screen. Designed to help the hearing impaired this feature uses on-screen "text boxes" to show dialogue and conversations while the TV program is in progress.

(BEGIN)

Select CLOSED
| CAPTIONING control.

With the FEATURES MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (M) buttons. Then press the MENU button.

2 Press the MENU **▲▼** buttons

to move the RED highlight. Press the MENU button to select () the desired Closed Caption mode - For Example: "ALWAYS ON" and "CAPTION 1".

CAPTION 1, 2, 3, 4:

dialogue (and descriptions) for the action on the captioned TV program shows on-screen. (See Important Note on this page.)

TEXT 1, 2, 3, 4:

often used for channel guide, schedules, or bulletin board information for CC programs.

3 After making your Caption mode selection, press the STATUS button to clear the TV screen. The selected Closed Caption mode will be active.


To cancel, set the Closed Captioned feature to OFF when finished.



SMART HELP

Remember. Broadcast stations will often use spelling abbreviations, symbols, dropouts and other grammatical shortcuts in order to keep pace with the on-screen action. These type factors vary upon the source of the captioned text material and do not indicate a need for service on the part of the TV.

NOTE: Not all TV programs and product commercials are made for broadcast with Closed Caption (CC) information included. Neither are all Closed Caption modes (CAPTION 1-4; or TEXT 1-4) necessarily being used by a broadcast station during the transmission of a closed caption program. Usually "CAPTION 1" is the most used mode to view captioned material. Refer to your area's TV program listings for the stations and times of Closed Caption shows.



CABLE TUNING

You need to make sure the TV is set to pick up either Cable TV or Antenna signals. In other words, the TV needs to know if you connected a Cable TV signal or a normal antenna to its ANTENNA plug.

NOTE: If you went through First Time Setup (in your Quick Use Guide), this task has already been completed for you.

(BEGIN)

Select CABLE CHANNEL TUNING control.

With the FEATURES MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (M) buttons. Then press the MENU button.


to move the RED highlight. Press the MENU button to select (✓) the desired mode - For Example: CABLE.

CABLE- If you DO have
Cable TV connected
to the TV. Channels
1-125 available.

NORMAL- If you have an
Antenna connected
to the TV. Channels
2-69 available.

CHANNEL MEMORY AUTO-PROGRAMMING

Your TV can automatically set itself for local area (or Cable TV) channels. This makes it easy for you to select only the TV stations in your area when the CHANNEL ▲▼ buttons are pressed.

NOTE: If you went through First Time Setup (in your Quick Use Guide), this task has already been completed for you.

(BEGIN)

Select CHANNEL MEMORY
(START AUTO-PROGRAMMING)
control.

With the FEATURES MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (M) buttons. Then press the MENU button.

Press the MENU button to turn AUTO-PROGRAMMING ON .

The TV shows which channel numbers are "SAVED" (►) as they are added into memory.

"Auto-programming CHANNEL MEMORY is finished" shows when the TV is through adding channels.

Press the STATUS or Menu (M) button to clear the screen.






Try it out. **Press the CHANNEL** ■ **buttons**

and see which channels you can select.

Remember, an Antenna or Cable TV signal must first be connected to your TV so that channels can be saved.

If you want to delete any unwanted channels from the TV's memory, see "ADD/DELETE CHANNELS" on the next page.



ADD/DELETE CHANNELS

A uto-Programming (see previous page) adds all the channels it can find (on your Antenna or Cable TV system) into the TV's memory. Add/Delete Channels makes it easy for you to add other channels, or drop unwanted channels, from the list of channels in the TV's memory.

(BEGIN)

Select CHANNEL MEMORY
(ADD/DELETE CHANNELS)
control.

With the FEATURES MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (M) buttons. Then press the MENU button.

- Press the CHANNEL ▲▼ or number buttons to select the channel you want to add or delete.
- 3 Press the MENU ▶ button to ADD the channel into the TV's memory.

Press the MENU ◀ button to DELETE the channel from memory.

Repeat steps 2 and 3 for each channel you wish to add or delete.








Remember. You can also add the AUX 1 VIDEO,

Note: AUX(iliary) VIDEO modes are located between the lowest and highest channel numbers within the ADD/DELETE CHANNEL control screen.







NOTE: A separate ADD/DELETE CHANNEL memory may also be created for the ANT(enna) B Input on the rear of the set (if an Antenna or Cable TV signal has been connected). Just press the ▲■■ button on the remote, while in the ADD/DELETE CHANNEL mode, to switch between the ANT A and ANT B channel memory lists. Then follow steps 2 and 3 as shown to the left to add or delete the desired channels.



Your TV comes with an onscreen clock. During normal operation the clock appears on the screen with every channel change (and when the STATUS button is pressed).

BEGIN

Select SET CLOCK control.

With FEATURES MENU (2 of 5) on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (M) buttons.

Then press the MENU button.

Press the remote's number | buttons to set the time clock.

Press the STATUS button to set the clock in operation and clear the screen.





SMART HELP

Remember, be sure to press "0" first and then the hour number for single digit entries.

The remote's MENU (M) buttons can also be used to set the hours, minutes and AM/PM portions of the clock.

TV Clock settings may be lost when the TV is unplugged (or AC power to the set is interrupted).





SET ALARM TIMER

Just like an alarm clock you can set the TV to turn itself on at the same time everyday.


(BEGIN)

Select SET ALARM TIMER control.

With FEATURES MENU (2 of 5) on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (M) buttons.

Then press the MENU button.

- Press the MENU ▲▼ and
 MENU (M) buttons to highlight
 and select "ON" ().
- 3 Press the MENU ▲ v and then the MENU (M) buttons to select "SET ALARM TIME".
- 4 Press the remote's number
 buttons to set the "TURN ON"
 time for the TV. (Press MENU ▲
 ▼ for AM or PM.)
- Set the "ALARM TIME" and clear the screen.



SLEEP TIMER

Have you ever fallen asleep in front of the TV only to have it wake you up at two in the morning with a test pattern screeching in your ears? Well, your TV can save you all that trouble by automatically turning itself off.

(BEGIN)

Press the SLEEP button on the remote control.

Note: you can also select the SLEEP control with the TV's onscreen FEATURES MENU (2 of 5). Move the RED highlight with the MENU (M) buttons. Then press the MENU button.

2 Press the SLEEP button

repeatedly to pick the amount of time (15 minutes to 2 hours ahead) before the TV will turn itself off.

The (+), (-) buttons can also be used to set the amount of time.

(M) button to clear the screen after you have set the time for the TV to turn off.




SMART HELP

Remember, to see how many minutes are left before the TV shuts itself off, reselect the SLEEP TIMER control screen.

To stop a SLEEP TIMER setting, reset the timer back to OFF. (Turning the TV off and on, or pressing a button during the last minute of a timer setting, will also cancel a setting.)

A few seconds before the TV is to shut off a message will come on the screen telling you *GOOD NIGHT*.



CHANNEL DISPLAY

With the Channel Display control you can change the size and location of the on screen channel and clock information.

Select CHANNEL DISPLAY

| control.



HALF HOUR REMINDER

With the Half Hour Reminder control the TV automatically shows you the current time and channel every thirty minutes.

Select HALF HOUR REMINDER control.







PARENTAL CONTROL CONTENT ADVISORY

nother new area available to $oldsymbol{1}$ parents for the censoring of program material is through the TV Guidelines and Movie Ratings system. Program Content Advisory data will soon be contained within the broadcast signals of received TV programs. When setup by the parent or viewer, the TV can respond to transmitted advisory data by blocking out or denying access to TV shows (based on whether the program meets or exceeds the limitations you select as viewable). The TV program can then only be viewed by entering the correct and current Parental Code Access number.

The Content Advisory system uses both "Movie Ratings" and a "Parental Guidelines" form of censoring. Refer to the following page sections for explanations on the different Rating system levels and their uses.

- **G General Audience:** Most parents would find this program suitable for all ages. This type of programming contains little or no violence, no strong language, and little or no sexual dialogue or situations.
- PG Parental Guidance: This programming contains material that parents may find unsuitable for younger children. It may contain one or more of the following: Moderate violence, some sexual situations, infrequent coarse language, or some suggestive dialogue.
- PG-13: This programming contains material that parents may find unsuitable for children under the age of 13. It contains one or more of the following: violence, sexual situations, coarse language, or suggestive dialogue.
- **R Restricted:** This programming is specifically designed for adults. Anyone under the age of 17 should only view this programming with an accompanying parent or adult guardian. It contains one or more of the following: intense violence, intense sexual situations, strong coarse language, or intensely suggestive dialogue.
- NC-17 No one under 17 admitted: This type of programming should be viewed by adults only. It contains graphic violence, explicit sex, or crude indecent language.
- X Mature audience only: This type of programming contains one or more of the following: very graphic violence, very graphic and explicit or indecent sexual acts, very coarse and intensely suggestive language.

CONTENT ADVISORY PARENTAL GUIDELINES

Parental Guidelines can be even more defined and specific in the degree and extent of material parents may allow for TV program viewing. Sub-settings for Language, Violence, and other blocking factors can be manually switched On or Off for use within the major Parental Guideline categories (TV-Y7, TV-PG, etc.).







The TV-Y7; TV-PG; TV-14; and TV-MA guidelines also include customized settings for various additional items such as V (violence), S (sexual situations), L (coarse language), D (suggestive dialogue), and FV (fantasy violence). These additional settings are category specific and can be individually selected for use as desired.







- TV-Y Appropriate for all children: Designed for a very young audience, including children ages 2-6. This type of programming is not expected to frighten younger children.
- TV-Y7 -Appropriate for children seven and older: It may be more appropriate for children who have acquired the development skills needed to distinguish between make-believe and reality. This programming may include mild fantasy and comic violence (FV).
- TV-G General Audience: This type of programming contains little or no violence, no strong language, and little or no sexual dialogue or situations.
- TV-PG Parental Guidance suggested: This type of programming contains one or more of the following: Moderate violence (V), some sexual situations (S), infrequent coarse language (L), or some suggestive dialogue (D).
- TV-14 Unsuitable for children under 14: This type of programming contains one or more of the following: intense violence (V), intense sexual situations (S), strong coarse language (L), or intensely suggestive dialogue (D).
- TV-MA Mature audence only: This type of programming contains one or more of the following: graphic violence (V), explicit sexual situations (S), or crude indecent language (L).
- (V) Violence
- (S) Sexual situations
- (L) Language
- (D) Inappropriate dialogue
- **(FV) Fantasy Violence** may frighten children under seven. Some cartoons may have this rating. Available in the TV-Y7 category only.





Note: Remember that Content Advisory data or encoded information is not available with all received TV programming (this also includes commercials, and other program spot announcements). Broadcaster's can decide **not to encode** any kind of content advisory ratings with their programming, or they can actually choose to **encode programs to be "unrated**."

The TV Blocking Options allow the viewer to block any program without content advisory data with the use of its "NO RATING INFORMATION" control. And to block programs that are encoded as "unrated" with its "UNRATED PROGRAMMING" control option.

Since the reception of Content Advisory data can take a few seconds, you may want to use the "CHANNEL CHANGE" option to be sure no viewing is allowed during blocked program channel changes. This can eliminate the display of a few seconds of undesirable video on the TV, or receiving scenes from a Ratings blocked channel source.




SECOND AUDIO PROGRAM

Second Audio Program (SAP) is part of the stereo broadcast system. Sent as a additional audio channel SAP can be heard apart from the current TV program sound. TV stations are free to use SAP for any number of purposes, but many experts believe it will be used for foreign language translations of TV shows (or for weather and news bulletins.)

NOTE: If a SAP signal is not present with a selected program, the SAP option can not be selected. "This program does not contain SAP information" will show on the TV screen.





INCREDIBLE STEREO

The Incredible Stereo control can be used to add greater depth and dimension to both monaural (MONO) and STEREO TV sound.

BEGIN

Select INCREDIBLE STEREO control.

With the SOUND MENU on the screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (M) buttons. Then press the MENU button.

Press the MENU ▲▼ and MENU (M) buttons to highlight and turn ON (✓) the INCREDIBLE STEREO mode.



NOTE: The TV's FIXED AUDIO OUTPUT jacks can also be used for the playback of TV program sound with an external audio amplifier, or home theater hi-fi system, Connection of the FIXED AUDIO OUT(puts) is similar to the Variable Audio Outputs (as shown above). However, specific sound level adjustments will be made with the controls at the external amplifier or home sound system (instead of through the TV's audio level controls.)

NOTE: The TV's PIP AUDIO OUTPUT jacks can also be used for additional stereo playback options such as wireless transmitter headphone hook-up, or as an external amplifier connection source. However, with normal PIP feature operations (when the ANT A and ANT B Input sources are connected for use), the PIP AUDIO OUTPUTs will switch from stereo to monaural (mono) sound. Stereo sound will only be available with the TV's Main screen (or ANT A supplied signal) at that time.

SURROUND SOUND

By adding optional external speakers to the TV's sound system, you can create the feeling of reflected sound that surrounds you at a movie theater or concert hall.

(BEGIN)

Connect both external speakers to the speaker wire terminals on the TV.

Recommended speakers: 80hm, 15 watt minimum. Be sure the (+) and (-) speaker wires are connected to the correct R(ight) and L(eft) speaker terminals on the TV.

- Place the speakers so the viewing area is between the TV and the rear surround speakers. (See overhead view drawing.)
- Turn TV ON and place the STEREO control to the "STEREO IF AVAILABLE" () position.

After setup whenever a stereo signal is received the audio will be heard in Surround Sound.



VARIABLE AUDIO OUTPUT

The TV's Variable Audio Output jacks can also be used for Surround Sound. Once they are connected to an external hi-fi system its speakers can be used for the playback of Surround Sound.



Also, if you have added AUX 1 to the TV's channel memory, you can just press the CHANNEL ▲▼ buttons to select the S-VIDEO mode (when active).



Using the Audio/Video Input Jacks (continued)

COMPONENT VIDEO INPUTS

Component Video Inputs provide for the highest possible color and picture resolution in the playback of digital signal source material such as with DVD players. The color difference signals (PB, PR) and the luminance (Y) signal are connected and received separately which permits for improved color bandwidth information (not possible when using composite video or S-Video connections).

(BEGIN)

PR) VIDEO OUT jacks from the DVD player to the (Y PB PR) VIDEO IN(put) jacks on the TV.

- 2 Connect the AUDIO OUT
 jacks R(ight) and L(eft) from the
 DVD player to the AUX 1 AUDIO
 IN jacks on the TV.



SMART HELP

The description for the component video connectors may differ depending on the DVD player or accessory digital source equipment used (e.g. Y PB PR; R-Y/B-Y/Y; Cr/Cb/Y, etc.). Although abbreviations and terms may vary, the letters "B" and "R" stand for the blue and red color component signal connectors and "Y" indicates the luminance signal. Refer to your DVD or digital accessory Owner's Manual for definitions and connection details.



Using the Audio/Video Output Jacks (continued)

AUDIO/VIDEO OUTPUTS

The Audio/Video Output jacks on the TV can be used to record TV programs on VCRs which have Audio/Video Input jacks.

To record TV programs by using the Audio/Video jacks on the TV:

(BEGIN)

- Connect the VIDEO OUT jack from the TV to the VIDEO IN jack on the VCR.
- jacks R(ight) and L(eft) from the TV to the AUDIO IN jacks on the VCR.
- Select the "ANTENNA A"
 PICTURE SOURCE control on the TV.

With the FEATURES MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (M) buttons. Then press the MENU button.

Select the channel on the TV that you want to record.


Turn the VCR ON. Put a cassette tape in the unit and place the VCR in the RECORD mode.



SMART HELP

Remember, If the VCR has an INPUT SELECTOR switch, place it in the LINE or CAMERA position.

Unattended Timer Recordings with a VCR are possible, but not recommended with this connection since the TV must be left ON for the VCR to record.



SMART PICTURE

With Smart Picture you can set a number of video and audio controls to your own personal preference. Once the individual controls have been adjusted to the levels you desire, use the list of Smart Picture feature category titles to quickly reselect these "personalized" settings contained within the memory of the TV. (See the next page for more details on the labeling options and use of Smart Picture.)

(BEGIN)

Press the SMART button on the remote.


Press the MENU (M) button to select the Smart Picture feature (highlighted in RED).

- Press the MENU ▲▼ buttons to highlight the category list for Smart Picture. Press the MENU button to select (▶) the desired title.
- Press the MENU(M) buttons to choose any of the individual controls you wish to adjust for the Smart Picture selected title. Then press the Menu (M) button to select the highlighted control.
- Press the Menu (M) buttons to adjust the selected control.
- Press the STATUS button on the remote to clear the screen after you have finished with all of your Smart Picture feature control adjustments.

Note: Select the "FACTORY SETTINGS" category to automatically return the TV to the video and audio control levels preset at the factory prior to product shipment.





SMART PICTURE

Following your initial setup adjustments (see previous page), just select the desired Smart Picture category in order to place the TV to the personalized set of audio and video control settings for that title.

BEGIN

Press the SMART button on the remote.

Then press the MENU button to select the SMART PICTURE control feature.





SMART SOUND

A re you tired of the sound of commercials following you throughout the house? Smart Sound allows you to preset a desired volume level that the TV sound will not go above. This makes for an even, more consistent sound by reducing the "peaks" and "valleys" that can occur during commercials.

(BEGIN)

Press the Smart button on the remote.

with the SMART Menu on screen, move the RED highlight with the Menu buttons. Then press the MENU (M) button to select the highlighted Smart Sound control.

3 Press the Menu ▲ or ▼ and then the Menu (M) button to turn the Smart Sound control ON (or OFF.)

Press the STATUS button to clear the screen when completed.



SMART HELP

Remember, Smart Sound works for sound levels coming from either the Antenna/Cable input on the rear of the TV (RF audio); or the Auxiliary (VCR/AUX IN) audio inputs.

When using a Cable Converter Box with the Smart Sound Control ON, the TV's volume level may take up to ten seconds to gradually increase to normal listening levels (when the TV's first turned on). This is considered NORMAL with various Cable Converter Box use.



2-CHANNEL SURF/SMART SURF

A "list" or series of previously viewed channels can be selected with the SURF button on your remote control. With this feature you can easily switch between different TV programs that currently interest you. The Smart Surf control allows you to set up to 10 channels in its quick viewing "list".

(BEGIN)

Press the Smart button on the remote.

- with the SMART Menu on screen, move the RED highlight with the Menu (M) buttons. Press the MENU button to select the highlighted Smart Surf control.
- ③ Press the Menu ▲ or ▼, then the Menu (M) button to select either Smart Surf or 2-Channel Surf. (See explanation of Surf options with the illustration on this page.)
- Press STATUS button on the remote control to clear the screen.





SETTING THE TV REMOTE TO WORK ACCESSORY DEVICES

Your remote control is set to work your TV and many infrared remote (IR) control VCRs, Cable TV Converter Boxes, DVD players, Home Satellite receivers, etc.
However, an easy one-time step may be necessary before the remote will work with your accessory device.

To begin, try this initial check to see if going on to the following section is necessary.

(BEGIN)

ACC(essory) System button on the TV remote for the desired accessory device category.

Note: The ACC(essory) system button contains product codes for Cable TV Converters, DVD players, and Satellite receivers.

- Point the TV remote toward the desired accessory device and press the POWER button.
- 3 Does the remote turn the accessory device ON?

 IF YES, and try other function buttons on the TV remote. If they also work the accessory device, then the remote is ready and no further steps are needed.



SETTING THE REMOTE TO WORK OTHER DEVICES - SEARCH

SEARCH METHOD

Your TV remote can be set to work various accessory devices (VCRs, Cable Converters, Satellite Receivers) by what is called the SEARCH method.

Note: The Search Method only works with devices equipped with Channel Display Indicators or capability. If the "Direct Access" code number method (shown in the previous section) did not set your remote to work your accessory device, then follow the easy steps listed below.

BEGIN

- Turn ON the desired device.

 Press the correct VCR or ACC system button on the remote.
- from the front of the accessory device. Point the remote toward the unit. HOLD DOWN the SURF and the desired System (VCR or ACC) buttons at the same time. KEEP HOLDING BUTTONS DOWN.
- watch the Channel Indicator
 on the unit. Channel Numbers will
 SCAN UP when the unit has been
 identified. This may take up to
 two minutes.
- Release the SURF and System
 (VCR or ACC) buttons as soon
 as channel numbers start to scan
 up. The code has been identified
 and the remote is ready to operate
 with the accessory device.




SMART HELP

Remember, a minute or two can seem very long, but the code should be located within two minutes.

Don't let the accessory device scan up more than five channels. The remote may pass up the right code and another two minute search cycle will have to be repeated.

If no channel change happens within two minutes, repeat steps 1-4. Should a channel change still not occur, the remote will not work with the desired unit.

USING THE REMOTE'S VCR BUTTONS



When using the TV remote with a VCR, first make certain it is set to control your VCR (by the REMOTE CODE or SEARCH method - see earlier sections).

(BEGIN)

Press the VCR System button on the remote.

Point the top of the remote toward the front of the VCR (remote sensor window) when pressing buttons.



Record Button

Hold the RECORD button down, and then press the PLAY button to begin a VCR recording.

Rewind Button

Press to rewind tapes. For some VCRs you may need to press STOP button first then REWIND. In playback mode, hold button down to view picture moving rapidly in reverse.


Pause Button

Press to temporarily stop the tape during a playback, or recording. Press again to release Pause.

Press to the VCR position ("VCR"

TV-VCR Button

indicator on the VCR will light) to view the playback of a tape. Press again to place in the TV position ("VCR" indicator on the VCR will go OFF) to view one program while recording another program. When used with the TV the TV/VCR button works as a source button. Each press cycles the TV between the AUX(iliary) Input modes, ANT A/B inputs, and the the last view channel. It is a quick one-button way to select these channels and modes (without directly entering the TV's Menu system.)

How to Use the Picture-In-Picture (PIP) Feature

Picture-in-Picture (PIP) is the showing of two pictures on the TV screen at the same time. (One main screen picture and one small inset picture - or PIP). For your ease and convenience this TV has two separate inputs (ANTenna A and ANTenna B) for your home's Antenna and/or Cable TV system signal.

The ANT A input is primarily for the TV's main screen picture. The ANT B input is provided as a second, dedicated source option for the TV's PIP "window" and its feature operations. The signal connected to the ANT B input can be either a Split Signal Input (as described in the section on this page), or another type of external signal source (such as a satellite dish system, additional home antenna, video accessory, etc.).

See the following steps on how channels connected to the ANT(enna) B Input can be shown and used within the PIP window:

(BEGIN)

Connect your Antenna or Cable TV signal to the single 75 ohm INPUT plug on a two-way Signal Splitter (not supplied).

Connect two lengths of RF Coaxial Cable (F-type connectors on both ends) to the two OUTPUT plugs on the two-way Signal Splitter.


2 Connect the twin OUTPUT plugs on the Signal Splitter to the ANT A and ANT B Inputs on the rear of the TV.





USING PIP WITH THE REMOTE CONTROL

By using the PIP buttons on the remote the PIP picture can be moved and swapped with the main screen. The main screen picture can also be frozen in the PIP window.

(BEGIN)

Press the PIP ON/OFF button to show the PIP picture.

PIP appears in a corner of TV screen. Press PIP ON/OFF again to remove PIP from the main screen.

Press the PIP POSITIONbutton to move the PIP picture (from corner-to-corner on the TV screen.)

This feature allows you to move PIP and avoid blocking off any main screen action.

- With PIP on the TV screen, press the SWAP button to swap the main screen picture with the PIP picture. See "Smart Help" note on this page.


Select "HELP" on the TV's Main Menu.





TIPS IF SOMETHING ISN'T WORKING



Please make these simple checks before calling for service. These tips can save you time and money since charges for TV installation and adjustment of customer controls are not covered under your warranty.

CAUTION: A video source (such as a video game, Compact Disc Interactive - CDI, or TV information channel) which shows a constant non-moving pattern on the TV screen, can cause picture tube damage. When your TV is continuously used with such a source the pattern of the non-moving portion of the game (CDI, etc.) could leave an image permanently on the picture tube. When not in use, turn the video source OFF. Regularly alternate the use of such video sources with normal TV viewing.

No Power

- Check the TV power cord. Unplug the TV, wait 1 minute, then reinsert plug into outlet and push POWER button again.
- Check to be sure outlet is not on a wall switch.

No Picture

- Check antenna connections on the rear of the TV. Are they properly secured to the antenna plug on the TV?
- Check the CABLE TUNING control for correct position.
- Check PICTURE SOURCE control for correct position ANT A or B; AUX 1/2 VIDEO; AUX Y PB PR; or SIDE VIDEO position without a signal source will result in a blank screen.
- Check the CLOSED CAPTIONS control. Some TEXT modes could block the screen.

No Sound

- Check the VOLUME and MUTE buttons on the TV and remote.
- Check the TV SPEAKER NORMAL/OFF sound control for the correct position.
- If attempting auxiliary equipment hook-ups, check audio jack connections and that the auxiliary equipment is on and in the proper operating modes.

Remote Does Not Work

- Check VCR-ACC-TV "System" buttons on the remote. Press the remote's <u>TV</u> System button to send commands to the TV; <u>VCR</u> System to sent to VCR; etc.
- Check batteries. Replace with AA Heavy Duty (Zinc Chloride) or Alkaline batteries if necessary.
- Clean the remote and the remote sensor window on the TV.

TV Displays Wrong Channel or No Channels Above 13

- Repeat channel selection.
- Add desired channel numbers (ADD/DELETE CHANNELS control) into TV memory.
- Check CABLE TUNING control for correct position.

This TV is equipped with protective circuitry that shuts the TV off in case of moderate power surges. Should this occur turn the TV back on by pressing the POWER button once or twice, or unplug and then replug the power cord at the AC outlet. This feature is NOT designed to prevent damage due to high power surges such as those caused by lightning, which is not covered by your warranty.

Cleaning and Care

- To avoid possible shock hazard be sure the TV is unplugged from the electrical outlet before cleaning.
- When cleaning the TV screen take care not to scratch or damage the screen surface (avoid wearing jewelry or using anything abrasive- do not use household cleaners). Wipe the front screen with a clean cloth dampened with water. Use even, easy, vertical strokes when cleaning.
- Specially designed screen cleaning kits are also available which contain anti-static cleaners and cloths designed to get into the ridges of the TV screen. If interested, ask your dealer about an optional Projection TV Screen Cleaning Kit or call our toll-free Accessory Parts ordering number 1-800-851-8885.
- Gently wipe the cabinet surfaces with a clean cloth or sponge dampened in a solution of cool clear water and a mild soap or detergent. Use a clean dry cloth to dry the wiped surfaces.
- Occasionally vacuum the ventilation holes or slots in the cabinet back.
- Never use thinners, insecticide sprays, or other chemicals on or near the cabinet, as they might cause permanent marring of the cabinet finish.



GLOSSARY TO TELEVISION TERMS

Audio/Video Inputs * Located on the rear of the TV these connectors (RCA phono type plug) are used for the input of audio and video signals. Designed for use with VCRs (or other accessories) in order to receive higher picture resolution and offer sound connection options.

Coaxial Cable * A single solid antenna wire normally matched with a metal plug (F-type) end connector that screws (or pushes) directly onto a 75 Ohm input found on the Television or VCR.

Display * An on screen message or graphics that help the user operate and adjust TV feature controls. See On Screen Displays (OSD).

Identify* Method by which a remote control searches and finds an operating code for another product (such as a VCR or Cable Converter). Once the code has been "identified" then the TV remote can operate and send commands to the other product.

LED * Light Emitting Diode or indicator.

Menu * An on-screen listing of feature controls shown on the TV screen that are made available for user adjustments.

Multichannel Television Sound (MTS) * The broadcast standard that allows for stereo sound to be transmitted with the TV picture.

On Screen Displays (OSD) * Refers to the wording or messages generated by the TV to help the user with specific feature controls (color adjustment, programming, etc.).

Picture -In-Picture (PIP) * Term used when two pictures are shown on the TV screen at the same time. The smaller PIP picture is supplied by a VCR (or other tuner/video playback source). The PIP picture can also be moved and swapped with the TV's main screen picture.

Pre-Amplifier * The control center of a hi-fi system. Not only amplifies source inputs, but also allows for source selection, volume, tone, balance and all other controls that affect the sound.

Programming * The procedure of adding or deleting channel numbers into the TV's memory circuits. In this way the TV "remembers" only the locally available or desired channel numbers and skips over any unwanted channel numbers.

PTV * Projection Television (Rear and/or Front projection design systems are available.)

Remote Sensor Window * A window or opening found on the TV control panel through which infrared remote control command signals are received.

RF * Radio Frequency or modulated signal design used as the carrier for television broadcasts.

Second Audio Program (SAP) * Another or additional audio channel provided for in the Multichannel Television Sound (MTS) broadcast standard. A monaural soundtrack included within the recorded or video signal (usually containing a second language translation for the displayed programming.)

Status * Allows the user to quickly confirm what channel number is currently being viewed. Status can also be used to clear the TV of on-screen displays or information (rather than waiting for the displays to "time out" or automatically disappear from the screen).

Subwoofer * A speaker designed for audio playback of only the lowest-frequency notes (under 100 Hz.)

S-Video Input * Allows direct connection of high-resolution video sources, such as a Super VHS videocassette recorder, Laser Disc player, etc. Provides improved picture resolution, sharpness, and clarity.

Twin Lead Wire * The more commonly used name for the two strand 300 Ohm antenna wire used with many indoor and outdoor antenna systems. In many cases this type of antenna wire requires an additional adapter (or balun) in order to connect to the 75 Ohm Input terminals designed into the more recent Televisions and VCRs.

Variable Audio Output * An adjustable audio output which allows for volume variations at the source.


