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INSTALLER NOTES

If you are installing an IntelliControl® ICS DMS4 Digital Music Server for the first time you may wish to take notice of the following items to assist with the configuration process:

- Your DMS4 Digital Music Server is configured by default for use with an NTSC television. If you are using a PAL television the DMS4 Digital Music Server's TV user interface may not display correctly. For information about configuring this setting, see page 31
- The Niles DMS4 Digital Music Server is equipped with the ability to update its internal software via the Internet.
 It is strongly recommended that you perform an online update once the unit is installed. For more information, see page 35

AUTOMATIC SHUTDOWN

This product contains sensors that continually monitor its operating temperature. Should the temperature exceed the product's maximum safe operating temperature then an automatic shutdown will be initiated. Notification of the shutdown will be displayed on the TV user interface with a countdown before it is commenced.

Automatic shutdown is necessary to help prevent component damage through overheating. To prevent automatic shutdown, ensure that the ambient temperature surrounding the product does not exceed 40°C/104°F. This can be achieved by ensuring the product's ventilation grills are not obstructed and, where the product is installed in an enclosure, there is plenty of ventilation for air flow. The current operating temperature can be viewed in the **System Information** menu in **Settings**.

GENERAL PRECAUTIONS

When installing the equipment ensure that:

- it is not moved while in operation

CD HANDLING PRECAUTIONS

- Handle discs carefully so as not to damage or scratch the front side. Always keep the disc surface clean
- To protect the disc avoid placing it in the following locations:
 - In direct sunlight or near a source of heat
 - In a place which is damp or dirty
 - In a place which could be exposed to rain, such as near a window
- Do not use a disc with a special shape
- For best performance when recording from a CD ensure the temperature never exceeds 35°C/95°F where the DMS4 Digital Music Server is located

DTS ENCODED DISCS PRECAUTION

CAUTION - when playing DTS encoded discs excessive noise will be heard on the analog output jacks of the DMS4 Digital Music

Server. To avoid possible damage to the system you should ensure that the correct connections are made to your amplification system for replaying this type of disc.

IMPORTANT IF USED IN THE UK:

How to connect a plug

- The BLUE wire must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter "N" or colored BLACK
- The BROWN wire must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter "L" or colored RED
- The GREEN/YELLOW-GREEN wire must be connected to the terminal which is marked by the letter "E" or by the safety earth symbol

 or colored green or green-andvellow

Before replacing the plug cover, make certain that the cord grip is clamped over the sheath of the lead - not simply over the three wires.





Your DMS4 Digital Music Server also lets you organize your music collection and create selections for different occasions to suit your mood.

Your DMS4 Digital Music Server allows you to compile personal playlists and then automatically play tracks from the playlist you have selected. Playlists let you customize your DMS4 Digital Music Server for each member of the family, or for matching the music to the occasion or mood. Playlist creation is performed via the front panel, handheld remote buttons and TV interface.

CONTROLS AND CONNECTIONS

FRONT VIEW




Fig. 1-1 DMS4 Front Panel

This section provides information about the controls and connections available on your IntelliControl® ICS DMS4 Digital Music Server.

1 DISC TRAY

Discs should be inserted with the label side up.

OPEN/CLOSE button

Pressing the OPEN/CLOSE button opens the disc tray. Place a compact disc on the tray with the label side facing up. Press the button again to close the tray.

3 MENU button

Press the MENU button to display the Main Menu screen.

4 ACTION buttons

Action buttons allow you to perform specific operations dependent on the current menu screen. For more information on using the action buttons, refer to **The Front Panel Interface** section.

(5) DISPLAY

The display shows information about the music available on the unit, the status of the DMS4 Digital Music Server (for instance if the unit is currently playing), and the current configuration of the unit.

(6) SELECT button

Selects the option currently visible on the display.

NAVIGATION buttons

The navigation buttons allow you to move up, down, left or right through the menus shown on the display.

8 ■ OUTPUT button

This button is used to select the current audio output.

When the button is pressed briefly during playback, play restarts at the beginning of the current track. A second brief press moves to the beginning of the previous track. When the button is held for a longer period of time the music will rewind at high speed.

10 M button

When the button is pressed briefly during playback, play restarts at the beginning of the next track. When the button is held for a longer period of time the music will fast forward at high speed.

11 PAUSE button

Press the pause button to interrupt playback temporarily.

12 PLAY button

Press the play button to resume playback if the music has been stopped or paused.

STOP button

Press the stop button to halt playback on the current audio output.

(14) STANDBY

Press the standby button to turn your DMS4 Digital Music Server off, press again to switch your DMS4 Digital Music Server back on

(15) REMOTE SENSOR

This window receives signals transmitted from the remote control unit.

REAR VIEW




Fig. 1-2 DMS4 Rear Panel

(1) IR RECEIVER

The IR Receiver connection allows remote control information to be carried from other devices directly into the DMS4 Digital Music Server.

(2) CONTROLLER

The Controller port provides serial communication with supported devices.

(3) USB

Allows the DMS4 Digital Music Server to communicate with supported USB devices.

(4) ETHERNET

The Ethernet port is used to connect the DMS4 Digital Music Server to a high speed Internet connection.

(5) VGA

The VGA connector may be used to connect a VGA monitor.

6 VIDEO OUT

Connect the composite Video Out of the DMS4 Digital Music Server to the composite input of a suitable PAL/NTSC TV (depending on the supplied configuration) to display the TV User Interface. You may also need to switch the TV to the relevant AUX input to display the picture.

7 S-VIDEO OUT

Connect the S-VIDEO output of the DMS4 Digital Music Server to the S-VIDEO input of a suitable PAL/NTSC TV (depending on the supplied configuration) to display the TV User Interface. You may also need to switch the TV to the relevant AUX input to display the picture.

8 DIGITAL OPTICAL IN

Reserved for future use.

(9) DIGITAL OPTICAL OUT

The digital optical output can be used to transmit high quality audio to a device with a digital optical input (D/A converter, A/V amplifier etc.) using an optical fiber cable without first being converted to analog. Audio sent via this output is the same as that sent via the Analog Audio Out 1 connector.

10 DIGITAL OUT - COAXIAL

By connecting this jack to a digital audio component (D/A converter, A/V amplifier etc.), digital signals from the DMS4 Digital Music Server can be transmitted directly from the system without first being converted to analog. Audio sent via this output is the same as that sent via the Analog Audio Out 1 connector.

11) DIGITAL IN - COAXIAL

Reserved for future use.

(12) ANALOG IN

Analog sources (such as cassette or vinyl LP) may be recorded onto the hard disk of the DMS4 Digital Music Server using this connection. (Not yet supported in the current software release).

(13) ANALOG OUT 1,2,3,4


The DMS4 Digital Music Server is a multi-room device allowing you to listen to different music in up to four different zones all at the same time (depending on the configuration purchased). Each analog output should be connected to the input jacks of a pre-amplifier.

(14) POWER

Connect the supplied power cord to this connector to provide power to the unit.

REMOTE CONTROL

The following diagram explains the function of the keys on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control:



STANDBY key

Puts the television user interface of the DMS4 Digital Music Server in to and out of Standby mode.

(2) Audio Server key

Press this key to select the DMS4 Digital Music Server as the device to be controlled. For more information about using this key, see the section titled Configuring Your Remote to Control Other Devices on page 11.

(3) TV key

Press this key to select the TV as the device to be controlled. For more information about using this key, see the section titled Configuring Your Remote to Control Other Devices on page 11.

4 HOME OUTPUT key

Press this key to select the Home Output.

(5) AMP key

Press this key to select the Amp as the device to be controlled. For more information about using this key, see the section titled Configuring Your Remote to Control Other Devices on page

(6) PAGE SCROLL keys

These keys are used to scroll through menus by page. When editing text, these keys are used to change the character set.

(7)**-X**■ MUTE kev

Provided that the current output volume setting is set to Variable, this button will mute the current output. If the TV or Amp device is selected, this key mutes the volume. See the section called Volume Control on page 12 for more information.

(8) ■ VOLUME keys

Provided that the current output volume setting is set to Variable, this button will increase/decrease the volume of the current output If the TV or Amp device is selected, these keys control the volume of the TV/Amp. See the section called Volume Control on page 12 for more information.

9 AOZ ALPHABETIC SCROLL key

Press this key to access the Initial Letter screen. This screen is only available if the list currently displayed is in alphabetical order.

(10) X CANCEL key

The Cancel key is used to cancel an operation which you no longer wish to continue.

(11)LIBRARY key

The Library key is used to display the Audio Library.

■ MENU key

Press this key to display the Main Menu.

(13) ■ NOW PLAYING key

The Now Playing key is used to view the Now Playing screen for the currently selected audio output.

(14) NAVIGATION **<,>,∧,∨** keys

The navigation keys are used to move up, down, left or right through the menu pages.

(15) ✓ SELECT key

Select is used to activate the currently highlighted option. When browsing the Library this key will start playback of the selected item.

(16) ACTION key

The Action key performs different tasks depending on the screen you are currently viewing. For example, on the Albums screen, this key is used to add the highlighted selection to a playlist.

(17)Q SEARCH key

The Search key can be used to search for music in your Audio Library. If pressing this key has no effect, then the search function cannot be used on the current screen.

OPTIONS key

Press this key on any library screen to view a list of available options. If pressing this key has no effect, then there are no options available on the current screen.

19 ☐ MARK key

This key is used in the Audio Library to select multiple items and then perform an action on them collectively. For more information about using the mark function refer to page 22.

20 NUMERIC (0 to 9) keys

The numeric keys can be used as follows:

- In the library you may jump to an item in the list that begins with one of the letters specified at the top of each key
- In text entry mode these keys can be used as an alphanumeric key pad (similar to a mobile phone)

21 REPEAT (RETURN) key

The **Repeat** key has the following functions:

- During playback this key toggles the repeat play setting on the DMS4 Digital Music Server
- In text entry mode this key can be used to perform a carriage return

② ← SHUFFLE (DELETE) key

The Shuffle key has the following functions:

- During playback this key toggles the random play setting on the DMS4 Digital Music Server
- In text entry mode this key can be used to delete characters

STOP key

During playback the **Stop** key halts playback on the currently selected output of the DMS4 Digital Music Server.

24 ► PLAY key

The **Play** key can be used to resume playback on the currently selected output of the DMS4 Digital Music Server.

②5) **◀** OUTPUT kev

Press this key to change the currently selected audio output.

26 **▶** ▶ key

When this key is pressed briefly during playback, play restarts at the beginning of the next track. When the key is held for a longer period of time the music will fast forward at high speed.

②7 **◀◀ ★** key

When this key is pressed briefly during playback, play restarts at the beginning of the current track. A second brief press moves to the beginning of the previous track. When the key is held for a longer period of time the music will rewind at high speed.

②8 ■ PAUSE key

Press the pause key to interrupt playback temporarily.

SWITCHING ON AND OFF

Your DMS4 Digital Music Server is designed to remain switched on continuously. However, if you are not planning to use your DMS4 Digital Music Server for an extended period of time, you may want to switch it off.

- To switch off, press the STANDBY button on the front panel
 of your DMS4 Digital Music Server. Next, press the action
 button labelled Yes below the LCD display. After a brief
 period, the unit will switch off and the Standby LED will
 glow red
- To switch back on, press the STANDBY button on the front panel of your DMS4 Digital Music Server again. After a brief period, the unit will switch on, the Standby LED will glow green and the TV will display the Audio Library

If you are not using your DMS4 Digital Music Server for a brief period, you may want to switch it to Standby mode.

- Press the **&Standby** key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control. The TV screen will display the Standby screen
- Press the **OStandby** key again to leave Standby mode and return to normal operation

CONFIGURING YOUR REMOTE TO CONTROL OTHER DEVICES

The TV and Amp keys on the remote control may be individually configured to control a range of televisions and amplifiers from well known manufacturers.

To configure the remote to control your television

Press the TV and

✓ Select keys simultaneously; hold them down for 1 second

The TV key will remain lit for 20 seconds; the configuration process must be completed during this time.

- Enter the 3 digit numeric code matching the manufacturer of your television from the list in Appendix A
- Press the TV button again

The TV key will blink twice to indicate that the configuration has been accepted. If the TV key does not blink begin the process again, taking care to enter the number exactly as printed in the list. If the television is switched on during the configuration process, entering the correct code will cause the television to go into standby.

To configure the remote to control your amplifier, follow the above procedure, pressing the AMP key in place of the TV key, and using the appropriate numeric code for your amplifier.

REMOTE CONTROL USE IN A MULTI-ROOM SYSTEM

Your IntelliControl® ICS DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control can be configured so that every button press indicates to the system which output is to be controlled. This means that whenever infrared is received by the DMS4 Digital Music Server the TV display will automatically switch to controlling the appropriate output.

To configure the remote controller with a default output

Press the Audio Server and

✓ Select keys simultaneously
on the remote control; hold them down for 1 second

The Audio Server key will remain lit for 20 seconds; the configuration process must be completed during this time.

 Enter the 3 digit code into the hand-held remote control corresponding to the output you would like to control (valid configurations are listed in Appendix A). For example, to set output 2 as your default output press:

0.0.2

• Press the remote's Audio Server button again

The Audio Server button will blink twice to indicate that the configuration has been accepted. If the Audio Server button does not blink twice begin the process again, taking care to enter the number correctly.

Pressing any navigation key on the remote should now cause the DMS4 Digital Music Server to switch to the correct output. The remote control can still be used to control a different audio output in the normal way; pressing the Home Output key will return it to controlling the default output.

VOLUME CONTROL VIA THE REMOTE

In addition to controlling the volume with the IntelliContol® system, your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control is capable of controlling the volume of the music you are listening to. This is done either by controlling the output of the DMS4 Digital Music Server itself, or by reassigning the volume control keys to control the output of your amplifier. Ignore this section if your installer has installed your system such that volume settings are entirely controlled by your in-wall or hand-held IntelliControl® system.

Controlling the Volume of the DMS4 Digital Music Server Directly from the Remote

Each audio output must be configured individually to allow its volume to be controlled by the remote control.

Controlling the volume of an output

- Navigate to the Settings menu
- Use the ▲ and ▼ keys to select Output Configuration and press ▼ Select
- Use the ▲ and ¥ keys to select an audio output and press ✓ Select
- From the menu that appears choose Volume and press
 Edit
- Select Variable and press Save

The **Volume** and **Mute** keys on the remote control will now control the volume of the chosen audio output.

Reassigning the Remote's Volume Control to the Amplifier Output

The Volume and VMMute keys on the remote control can be configured to control the volume on your amplifier while the Audio Server device is selected.

To reassign volume control

- Ensure the Amp device is correctly configured to control your amplifier (as described in Configuring Your Remote to Control Other Devices on page 11)
- Press the Audio Server and Select keys simultaneously; hold them down for 1 second

The Audio Server key will remain lit for 20 seconds; the configuration process must be completed during this time.

- Press the -X-Mute key
- Press the **Vol+** key
- Press the Amp device key

The Audio Server device key will blink twice to indicate that the configuration has been accepted. If the Audio Server key does not blink begin the process again, taking care to press the buttons in the correct sequence. The Volume and Volume keys should now control the amplifier when the Audio Server device is selected.

To return the **Volume** and **Mute** keys to their original configuration repeat the above process, press the **Audio Server** key instead of the **Amp** key.

CONNECTING YOUR DMS4 DIGITAL MUSIC SERVER

BASIC CONNECTIONS

The diagram below illustrates the basic connections required to use your DMS4 Digital Music Server.

Note: Do not make any connections to the DMS4 Digital Music Server while the power supply is connected and switched on.

Connecting the Audio

Connect a stereo RCA audio cable to the Analog Out 1 connectors on the rear of the DMS4 Digital Music Server.
 Connect the other end of this cable to an appropriate input on your pre-amplifier. In the same way connect the other Analog Out connectors to other stereo amplifiers as appropriate. Subsequently, connect the pre-amplifier to your stereo amplifier

Connecting the Video

Connect the yellow plug of the supplied composite video cable to the yellow Video Out socket of the DMS4 Digital Music Server. For most TVs connect the other end of this cable to the ext. 1 or 2 socket on the rear of your TV. For some TVs it may be necessary to use a SCART plug. In this case connect the other end of this cable to the yellow socket on the SCART plug. Now connect the SCART plug to the SCART socket in the rear of the TV

Connecting to the Internet

 Connect an Ethernet cable to a free Ethernet socket on your network device or broadband router. Connect the other end of this cable to the socket marked Ethernet on the back panel of the DMS4 Digital Music Server

Connecting the Power


Connect the supplied power cord to your power supply.
 Note: be sure to use the correct power cord for your country

Switching On

- Switch on your DMS4 Digital Music Server using the button labelled STANDBY on the front panel
- Switch on your television. Select the appropriate video channel to view the DMS4 Digital Music Server TV User Interface display

Your DMS4 Digital Music Server is now connected and ready for use. To take advantage of the DMS4 Digital Music Server's multi-room functionality, refer to the section overleaf entitled Integrating the DMS4 Digital Music Server into an Intellicontrol® ICS System

Note: In order to connect to the Internet in the below example it will be necessary to configure the DMS4 Digital Music Server's settings to connect using Ethernet. See the Quick Start Guide for more information.

INTEGRATING THE DMS4 DIGITAL MUSIC SERVER INTO AN INTELLICONTROL® ICS SYSTEM

A single IntelliControl® ICS DMS4 Digital Music Server is capable of playing different music in multiple rooms, or zones, simultaneously. This section explains how the DMS4 Digital Music Server can be integrated into a multi-room environment and how users in different rooms can access music from the Audio Library.

The below example integrates the DMS4 Digital Music Server with a GXR2 Modular MultiZone Receiver, with four IntelliControl® ICS IM-SERVER Cards, and a number of different control solutions. The following connections are made:

- Stereo RCA audio cables are connected between the DMS4 Digital Music Server's analog outputs and the analog inputs of the IM-SERVER cards in the GXR2
- A CAT-5 network cable is connected between the DMS4
 Digital Music Server's Ethernet socket and the Router.
 Similar connections are made between the four IM-SERVER
 cards in the GXR2 and the Router. The Router is connected
 to the Internet

- CAT-5 network cables are also used to connect between the GXR2's Communication and Control Switch and the zone controllers
- 16/4 speaker wire is connected from zone speaker outputs on the GXR2 to stereo speakers in the four zones.

Control Solutions

In the below example, four different control solutions are integrated with the DMS4 Digital Music Server.

- Zone 1 is connected to the IntelliControl® Single wallmounted keypad
- Zone 2 is connected to the IntelliControl® DISPLAY wallmounted keypad with 2" LCD display
- Zone 3 is connected to the IntelliControl® CONTACT wallmounted keypad with 3.5" color touch screen display
- Zone 4 is connected to the IntelliControl® iREMOTE®; a 2-way handheld wireless remote control




Fig. 2-2 Example connection of a DMS4 in a multi-room audio system

RECORDING AND PLAYING MUSIC

This chapter explains how to operate your IntelliControl® ICS DMS4 Digital Music Server, including recording CDs onto the hard disk, navigating the Audio Library to select music for playback and organizing your music collection.

THE MAIN MENU

The main functions of your DMS4 Digital Music Server are accessible via the **Main Menu**. The **Main Menu** is the first screen to be displayed when your DMS4 Digital Music Server is switched on.

Alternatively:

From any screen of the television user interface, press the
 Menu key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control

The Main Menu will be displayed:




Fig. 3-1 DMS4 TV interface main menu screen

The options available from the Main Menu are as follows:

Audio Library

Select this function to display the **Audio Library** screen. The Audio Library stores all of the music you record on to the hard disk of your DMS4 Digital Music Server.

See page 17 for information regarding the **Audio Library** and navigation techniques.

CD Tray

Select this function to display the **CD Tray** screen. The **CD Tray** function is used to record or play CDs from the CD drive.

See the chapter entitled **Recording Music** on page 16 for more information about the **CD Tray** screen.

Now Playing

Select this function to display the **Now Playing** screen for the currently selected audio output. You can also view this screen by pressing the **BNow Playing** key on the remote control.

The **Now Playing** screen is explained in more detail in the section entitled **The Now Playing Screen** on page 23.

Play Queue

Select the **Play Queue** option to view the library items queued to play on the currently selected audio output.

For details about using the play queue feature see the section entitled **The Play Queue** on page 25.

Output

Select this function to choose which of the available audio outputs you wish to control.

Changing the controlled audio output is explained in greater detail in the section called **Switching Audio Outputs** on page 24

Set Up

Select this option to display the Set Up screen. From here you can access the Settings screen, the Look Up Album Details screen and the Media Back Up and Restore feature.

When you select the **Set Up** option, the following screen is displayed:

The following options are available on this screen:

Look Up Album Details

Select this function to display the Look Up Album Details screen. If you have an Internet connection, use this function to retrieve album details from the Internet.

Refer to the section entitled **Recording Music**, which starts on page 16, for more information about this function.

Network Back Up and Restore

Select this function to display the **Network Back Up and Restore** screen. This function allows you to back up all of the music in your **Audio Library** to a selected location.

The section explaining network back up and restore begins on page $40. \,$

Settings

Select this function to display the **Settings** screen. From here you can view and amend important settings used by your DMS4 Digital Music Server.

For more information refer to the chapter titled **System Settings** on page 34.

RECORDING MUSIC

Your IntelliControl® ICS DMS4 Digital Music Server can make new recordings onto the hard disk by recording music directly from an audio CD placed in the CD tray.

Your DMS4 Digital Music Server can access the Internet to automatically retrieve information about the CD. This information includes the album name, artist name, track names and music genre from the Gracenote Music Recognition Service and an album cover illustration from the XiVA on-line service.

Recording from a CD

- Press the OPEN/CLOSE button on the front panel to open the CD tray
- Place a CD in the tray
- Press the OPEN/CLOSE button on the front panel again to close the CD tray

Your DMS4 Digital Music Server will now automatically attempt to retrieve information about the CD from the Gracenote Music Recognition Service.

If you do not have an Internet connection, or the CD is not listed in the database, it will be given names such as Album 35, Artist 21, and Track 1, Track 2 etc. and it will be classified in genre Unclassified. Accurate album information can be entered manually at a later date using the Edit Album Details screen (see Editing the Audio Library on page 27).

- Press the Menu key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control to display the Main Menu
- Use the **∧** or **∨** keys to select the **CD Tray** option
- Press the **✓ Select** key

The CD Tray screen will display the contents of the CD:

Press the ORecord key

Depending on the configuration of your DMS4 Digital Music Server, you may now be presented with the Recording Quality options. By default, the Quick Record set up option is set to enabled and the recording quality will be determined by the Default Recording Quality set up option. If you have set the Quick Record option to disabled, you will be asked to choose the recording quality each time you record a CD.

• Use the **A** or **V** keys to choose either **Uncompressed** WAV, or one of the MP3 or WMA compression options

Note: The higher quality options use more space on your DMS4 Digital Music Server hard disk, so you will not be able to record as many CDs. The amount of recording time left is displayed at the bottom of the screen as you scroll the compression options when recording a CD.

Press the

✓ Select key to begin recording

The CD Recording screen, with progress indicator will be displayed:

Once recording is complete the new album will appear in the Audio Library.

Press the OPEN/CLOSE button to remove the disc

If you have selected a recording quality using one of the MP3 or WMA compression settings, the compression process will begin immediately.

If there is no Internet connection present at the time of recording a CD, you can use **Look Up Album Details** from the **Main Menu** to retrieve any missing album details from the Internet.

- Press the Menu key to display the Main Menu
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys and press the √ Select key to display the Set Up screen
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys again to select the Look Up Album Details option
- Press the OStart key to begin

Listening to Music While Recording a CD

You can play music from the **Audio Library** while you are recording a CD.

- If you are already playing music from the Audio Library press the BNow Playing key to return to displaying information about the track you are playing
- If you are not already playing music from the Audio Library
 or wish to change the music you are listening to, press the
 Palibrary key on the DMS4 Digital Music Server remote
 control and select music as normal

At any time you can return to see the progress of your recording by selecting CD Tray from the Main Menu.

Playing a CD

Your DMS4 Digital Music Server can play a CD directly from the CD tray without first recording it to the hard disk.

- Press the OPEN/CLOSE button on the front panel to open the CD tray
- Place a CD in the tray
- Press the OPEN/CLOSE button on the front panel again to close the CD tray
- Press the Menu key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control to display the Main Menu
- Use the **∧** or **∨** keys to select the **CD Drive** option
- Press the ✓ Select key
- Press the ✓ Play key

Note: You cannot record a CD while playing from the CD tray.

PLAYING MUSIC

This chapter explains how to play music that you have recorded onto your DMS4 Digital Music Server. It also explains how to locate the music you wish to play in a number of different ways.

The Audio Library

The television user interface has been designed to allow easy navigation through the **Audio Library** and therefore give quick and easy access to your complete music collection in a number of different ways. Each screen in the **Audio Library** is carefully constructed to provide the most important information about the items you are viewing.

The illustration below shows how the Audio Library screens are structured and describes each part of the screen, the information displayed and the functions available. The example shows the Tracks screen for the album Cold Water Songs, however all navigation screens in the Audio Library are similar in construction.




Fig. 3-5 Explanation of the DMS4 "Tracks" TV interface

PLAYING MUSIC FROM THE AUDIO LIBRARY

The following sections contains a detailed explanation about selecting items in the **Audio Library** for playback.

Displaying the Audio Library

Either:

 Press the VLibrary key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control from any screen

Or:

 Use the A or V keys on the Main Menu to highlight the Audio Library option and press √Select

- Press the > key to display the Albums screen

The TV screen will display the albums in your Audio Library:

 press the
 Add button to add this track to a playlist or the
 play queue

Browsing the Audio Library by Covers

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the Covers option in the Audio Library Menu
- Press the > key to display the Covers screen

The TV screen will display the album covers in your **Audio Library**:




Fig. 3-9 DMS4 TV interface Album Covers screen




Fig. 3-10 DMS4 TV interface Artists screen

- \bullet Use the $\boldsymbol{\Lambda}$ or \boldsymbol{V} keys to step between albums

Either:

 ✓ Play key to begin playback immediately, or press the
 ☐ Add button to add this album to a playlist

Or:

 Press the > key again to select a track from within the album

Or:

Press the

 key to return to browsing by artists

Browsing the Audio Library by Genre

- Use the ▲ or ▼ keys to highlight the Genres option in the Audio Library Menu
- Press the > key to display the Genres screen

The TV screen will display the genres in your Audio Library:




Fig. 3-11 DMS4 TV interface Genres screen

- Use the A or Y keys to step between genres
- Alternatively, press the Q-Search button and select Genres to list just those genres that contain a particular word or group of letters

To play all albums in the selected genre:

Press the

 Add button to add all albums in the selected genre to a playlist

To select a particular album in the selected genre:

- Press the > key to display all artists within the selected aenre
- Use the **∧** or **∨** keys to step between artists
- Press the > key again to display all albums by a particular artist
- Use the **∧** or **∨** keys to step between albums

Either:

Press the

Play key to begin playback immediately, or
press the

Add button to add this album to a playlist or
the play queue

Or:

• Press the < key to return to browsing by genres

Browsing the Audio Library by Year

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the Years option in the Audio Library Menu
- Press the > key to display the Years screen

The TV screen will display the years available in your **Audio Library**:

 Play key to begin playback immediately, or press the

 Add button to add this album to a playlist or the play queue

Or:

• Press the **<** key to return to browsing by eras

Browsing Playlists in the Audio Library

Playlists allow you to create your own selections of tracks and save them with a name of your choice such as *Party Music*. For more information about creating a playlist refer to **Creating a** new Playlist on page 25.

- \bullet Use the \bigwedge or \bigvee keys to highlight the <code>Playlists</code> option in the <code>Audio Library Menu</code>
- Press the > key to display the Playlists screen

The TV screen will display the playlists in your Audio Library:




Fig. 3-14 DMS4 TV interface Playlists screen

- Use the ∧ or ∀ keys to highlight the Presets option in the Audio Library menu
- Press the > key to display the Presets screen

The TV screen will display the presets in your Audio Library:




Fig. 3-15 DMS4 TV interface Presets screen

Playing the Entire Library

In addition to the ability to select individual items in the Audio Library, you can also choose to play your entire music collection with a single button press.

To Play the entire Library

- Press the Menu key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control to display the Main Menu screen
- Press the **OPlay Library** key

Initiating playback of your entire **Audio Library** in this way will automatically enable shuffle and repeat.

Alternatively:

- Press the **DLibrary* key on your remote control to display the Audio Library screen
- Use the ∧ or V keys to highlight the Playlists option and press √Select
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys again to highlight the playlist entitled [Entire Library] and press √Play

Initiating playback of your entire **Audio Library** in this way will not automatically enable shuffle and repeat.

Selecting Items Directly Using Your DMS4 Digital Music Server Remote Control

You can select an item from your **Audio Library** directly by the first letter of its title using the alphanumeric keypad on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control.

To select a library item by name:

- Display the appropriate Audio Library screen for the item you want to find (e.g. Artists)
- Press the alphanumeric keypad key corresponding to the first letter of the item you want to select

For example to find the artist Santessa navigate to the Artists screen, then press the 7 key four times because S is the fourth letter on the 7 key. The TV screen shows the first artist beginning with the letter S.

If there are several artists beginning with the letter S press the $m{V}$ key to step through until you find the artist for which you are looking.

- Press the 1 key to return to the top of the list
 Alternatively, you can use the A&Z function to select a library item by initial letter:
- Display the appropriate library menu for the item you want to find (e.g. Artists)
- Press the Aoz key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control

The TV screen displays a list of letters which correspond to the starting letter of the items available in the chosen list:




Fig. 3-16 DMS4 TV interface showing direct selection screen

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to step between the letters in the list and highlight the starting letter of the item you are trying to locate
- Press the **✓ Select** key

The TV screen will display the first artist beginning with the letter ${\sf S}.$

If there are several artists beginning with the letter S press the \mathbf{V} key to step through until you find the artist for which you are looking.

• Press the 1 key to return to the top of the list

THE SEARCH FUNCTION

The search function can be used from any Audio Library screen to reduce the items in the current list to only those that contain a particular word or collection of characters.

To use the search function, press the Q Search key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control from any screen in the Audio Library. Choose to search either Tracks, Albums, Artists or Genres and press the Select key. The below screen is displayed. Use the alphanumeric keypad to enter text and press the SOK key. A list of items containing your search criteria will then be displayed.




Fig. 3-17 The DMS4 Search function via the TV interface

THE MARK FUNCTION

The mark function can be used to select multiple items within a list in the **Audio Library**. You can then perform a single action to be applied to all of the marked items rather than performing the same action on each item individually.

For example:

To delete multiple albums from the Audio Library

- Press the VLibrary key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control to display the Audio Library
- Press the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight Albums and press the
 ✓ Select key to display the Albums list
- Use the ♠ or ♥ keys again to highlight an album you wish to delete
- Press the ¬Mark key

The mark symbol will appear next to the marked album:

Place a mark symbol next to the other albums you wish to delete.

- Press the

 ✓ Select key

If there are less than one hundred items in a list, you also have the option to mark all of the items in a list, without having to go through them individually.

For example:

To delete all the albums by a particular artist

- Press the VLibrary key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control to display the Audio Library
- Press the A or V keys to highlight Artists and press the
 Select key to display the Artists list
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys again to highlight an artist and press the ➤ key

A list of all the albums by the chosen artist is displayed.

- Press the Options key and choose Mark all
- Press the Select key
- Press the Select key

Note: If pressing the \square Mark key has no effect, then the mark function is not available on the current screen.

THE NOW PLAYING SCREEN

The illustration below shows the Now Playing screen. Whenever you select an item in the Audio Library for playback, this screen is displayed. You can also choose to display this screen at any time by pressing the Now Playing key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control. When you make this selection, your DMS4 Digital Music Server will display the Now Playing screen for the currently selected audio output. If your DMS4 Digital Music Server has multiple audio outputs, you will also have multiple Now Playing screens which are selectable using the Output key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control (refer to page 24 for more information).




Fig. 3-19 Diagram showing the various aspects of the DMS4's Now Playing screen

Switching Audio Outputs

Depending on the configuration you have purchased, your IntelliControl® ICS DMS4 Digital Music Server may be capable of playing different music in several rooms simultaneously. If you wish to play music in a particular room, you must first choose the correct audio output.

To select an Audio Output

 Press the **dOutput** key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control

The following screen is displayed:




Fig. 3-20 $\,$ Switching the TV user interface to control each of the DMS4's audio outputs

- Use the **∧** or **∨** keys to select an audio output
- Press the ✓ Select key

You are now in control of the audio output you have selected and items you select for playback in the **Audio Library** will play on this audio output.

You can view the playback status of the currently selected output at any time by pressing the **BNow Playing** key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control.

Controlling Playback

Whether you are playing music from the **Audio Library** or directly from the CD you can pause, stop and resume playback as well as seek and skip tracks at any time.

To pause play

 Press the
 ■ key on the front panel or your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control

To stop play

Press the
 ■ key on the front panel or your DMS4 Digital
 Music Server remote control

To resume play

 Press the ▶ key on the front panel or your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control

To skip to the next or previous track

The front panel display shows the number of each track as you skip between them.

To seek within a track

Play resumes from the new position when you release the key.

Shuffle and repeat playback

Your DMS4 Digital Music Server lets you play selections from the **Audio Library** in a shuffled order to add variety to your music. You can also play selections repeatedly.

To shuffle the playback order

- Press the key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control to randomize the order of the selections in the play queue
- Press the 🖨 key a third time to disable shuffle

To repeat the current selection

- Press the
 Q key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control to repeat the currently playing track
- ullet Press the $oldsymbol{\Omega}$ key a second time to repeat the entire play aveve
- Press the \(\omega \) key a third time to disable repeat

The front panel and TV screen both indicate that shuffle and repeat are enabled.

Now Playing Screen Options

There are a number of options available from the Now Playing screen.

- Press the **Options** key

The following screen is displayed:

Jump to album

- Use the ▲ or ¥ keys to select Jump to album
- Press the ✓ Select key

The currently playing album will be displayed.

Jump to artist

- Use the **∧** or **∨** keys to select **Jump to artist**
- Press the

 ✓ Select key

All albums by the currently playing artist will be displayed.

Jump to genre

- Use the ★ or ¥ keys to select Jump to genre
- Press the **✓ Select** key

All artists in the same genre as the currently playing track will be displayed.

From this options screen, you also have the choice to edit album or track details. For instructions regarding the use of

these options, refer to the **Editing the Audio Library** chapter on page 27.

The Play Queue

Any item in your **Audio Library** can be selected for playback in one of two ways:

- Press the

 √ Play key to begin playback immediately, ending playback of any current music selection
- Press the **QAdd** key and select the [Play Queue] option

Alternatively:

 Press the
 Add & Show key to add the selected item to the play queue and display the play queue screen

To display the play queue:

- Press the > key to display the play queue

To remove a selection from the play queue

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the selection you would like to remove from the queue
- Press the XDelete key

To clear the play queue

• Press the Options key and choose Clear Play Queue

To move a selection in the play queue

- Press the ¬Mark key twice to place a ¬Move symbol next to the selection you wish to move
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to move the selection to a new place in the play queue
- Press the ¬Mark key again to remove the ¬Move symbol

To save a play queue as a playlist

You can save a play queue as a playlist so that you can listen to the same collection of music at a later time.

- From the **Play Queue** screen press the **Options** key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control
- Choose Save Play Queue as playlist... and, in the screen that appears, enter a name for the play list using the alphanumeric keypad
- Press the

 √Ok key and the current play queue will now be available as a playlist in the Audio Library

ORGANIZING YOUR MUSIC COLLECTION

This chapter describes the features built into your DMS4 Digital Music Server to help you organize the music in your **Audio Library**, including information about creating playlists of your favorite tracks, deleting albums or tracks you no longer want to store, and naming albums, tracks, and artists.

PLAYLISTS

Your DMS4 Digital Music Server allows you to create your own selections, called playlists, and identify them with a name of your choice. For example, you could select your favorite party tracks from a number of different albums and include them in a playlist called *Party Music*. You can then play your selection simply by choosing the appropriate playlist from the **Playlist** screen.

Creating a New Playlist

- Display the Audio Library by pressing the VIbrary key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control
- Press the A or V keys to highlight the Playlists option and press the ✓ Select key

The following screen will be displayed, listing your existing playlists:




Fig. 4-1 DMS4 TV interface Playlists screen

- Press the **ONew** key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control
- Use the alphanumeric keypad to enter a name for the new playlist and press the

 √Ok key

Your new playlist will now appear in the list.

Adding Music to a Playlist

You can add music from your **Audio Library** to a playlist from any library screen, by using the **O**Add key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control.

For example, to add an album to a playlist:

- Press the Library key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control to display the Audio Library
- Press the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight Albums and press the
 ✓ Select key to display the albums list
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the album you wish to add to a playlist
- Press the **O**Add to... key

The following screen is displayed:

 Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to select the playlist to which you would like to add the selected album

Alternatively, use the **ONew** key to create a new playlist as described in the previous section.

• Press the **OAdd** key to add the album to the playlist

Alternatively:

Press the
 Add & Show key to add the album to the
playlist and display the playlist's contents

You can also use the **Audio Library** and then add them to a playlist using the above method.

Editing Playlists

To edit a playlist name

- From the Playlists screen, use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the playlist you wish to edit
- Press the **Options** key and choose **Edit Playlist Name**
- Use the alphanumeric keypad to edit the playlist name and then press the \checkmark Ok key

To remove an item from a playlist

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the item you would like to remove from the playlist
- Press the XDelete key

To delete multiple items from a playlist use the **Mark** key to mark the items you wish to remove and then follow the process described above.

To move an item in a playlist

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the item you would like to move in the playlist
- Press the Amark key twice to place a Move symbol next to the item you wish to move
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to move the selection to a new place in the playlist
- Press the ¬Mark key again to remove the ¬Move symbol

To delete a playlist

- From the Playlists screen, use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the playlist you wish to delete
- Press the **Yes** key to confirm the deletion

To delete multiple playlists use the **Amark** key to mark the playlists you wish to remove and then follow the process described above.

PRESETS

Presets are simple playlists that can be used in the same way as a preset station on your radio tuner. For example, you may have a preset which plays a random selection from your entire **Audio Library**. Although you can select a preset for playback using the TV user interface, presets are more commonly used by simple multi-room control systems and remote controls to trigger playback without referring to the TV screen. Before a preset can be used a playlist must be assigned to that 'station':

Storing a Preset

- Display the Audio Library by pressing the

 □Library key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control
- Press the ∧ or ∨ keys to select Presets and press the > key

The existing presets will be displayed:




Fig. 4-3 DMS4 TV interface Presets screen

If you have not previously stored a preset all the names will be labelled [Empty].

 Press the A or V keys to select the Preset you would like to program and press the □Set key

The following screen is displayed:

 Press the ∧ or ∨ keys to select the Playlist you would like to assign and press the √Select key

The new preset will automatically be given the same name as the playlist assigned to it.

To clear a preset

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight the preset you would like to clear
- Press the XClear key
- Press the

 Yes key to confirm

EDITING THE AUDIO LIBRARY

Your IntelliControl® ICS DMS4 Digital Music Server labels the albums, artists and tracks in your **Audio Library** with names which identify the track you are listening to, and these help you locate items when you are browsing through the **Audio Library**.

If you have an Internet connection, your DMS4 Digital Music Server reads the CD information automatically from the Gracenote Music Recognition Service. You can edit these names at any stage to suit your own preferences.

Editing Album Information

- Press the Dibrary key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control to display the Audio Library
- Press the ∧ or ∨ keys to select Albums and press the > key
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys again to highlight the album you wish to edit
- Press the **⊙Options** key, choose Edit Album Details and press the **√** Select key

The following screen is displayed:

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to highlight either Name, Artists, Genres, Year or Era
- Press the

 ✓ Edit key
- Use the alphanumeric keypad to edit the text and press the
 OK key

When you have finished making changes to an album's details make sure you press the lacktriangle Save key.

If, for example, multiple genres are applicable to an album these can be entered by pressing the **RETURN** key on the remote control between entries, while editing the genre field.

Editing Track Information

- Press the ♥Library key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control to display the Audio Library
- Press the ∧ or ∨ keys to select Tracks and press the > key
- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys again to highlight the track you wish to edit
- Press the Options key and choose Edit Track Details

The following screen is displayed:

- Use the A or V keys to highlight either Name, Artists, Genres, Year, Era or Artwork
- Press the

 ✓ Edit key
- Use the alphanumeric keypad to edit the title and press the
 OK key

When you have finished making changes to a track's details make sure you press the **OSave** key.

Editing Genre, Year and Era names

- Press the VLibrary key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control to display the Audio Library
- Press the ∧ or ∨ keys to select either Genres, Years or Eras and press the ➤ key
- Use the ▲ or ▼ keys again to highlight the genre, year or era you wish to edit
- Press the **Options** key and choose the **Edit name** option
- Use the alphanumeric keypad to enter a new name for the genre, year or era

Selecting Album Artwork

Your DMS4 Digital Music Server stores a number of generic cover art images that can be applied to albums in your Audio Library. You can also choose to apply cover art that has been downloaded from the XiVA Online Service to any album in the Audio Library.

- Highlight the album in your Audio Library to which you would like to apply a cover art image
- Press the Options key
- Use the ★ and ▼ keys to select Edit Album Details and press the ▼ Select key
- Choose the Artwork option and press the ✓Edit key

The following screen, listing all of the cover art images stored on your DMS4 Digital Music Server, is displayed:

- Use the ∧ or ∨ keys to scroll through the cover art images

It is also possible to upload images from your PC to your DMS4 Digital Music Server and apply these to albums in your Audio Library. For more information, refer to the section titled Importing Files To Your DMS4 Digital Music Server on page 30

Deleting Albums and Tracks

- Press the plibrary key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control to display the Audio Library
- Press the ∧, ∨ and > keys to navigate to the album or track you would like to delete
- Press the Options key and choose Delete track or Delete album where appropriate

A confirmation screen will appear:

Press the

✓ Yes key to confirm deletion of the album or track

Note: Any items you choose to delete will be permanently erased from your DMS4 Digital Music Server's hard disk. Anything you delete by accident will need to be re-recorded.

THE FRONT PANEL

In addition to the user interface displayed on your television screen, the IntelliControl® ICS DMS4 Digital Music Server also has a user interface accessible via the LCD display and buttons on the front panel of the unit. This is an abridged version of the television user interface and provides access to a limited number of controls and functions.

Press the button labelled MENU on the front of the unit to display the following screen on the front panel LCD display:




Fig. 5-1 DMS4 front panel display main Menu

The labels at the bottom of the screen (Out, Albums, CD and Setup) correspond to the four action buttons below the LCD display on the front panel. The function of these buttons can change dependent on which screen is displayed on the front panel.

Note: The MENU button can be used at any time to return to the above screen.

DISPLAYING PLAYBACK INFORMATION

The front panel user interface has the ability to display basic information about the status of your DMS4 Digital Music Server's output(s).

 Press the left hand action button on the front panel corresponding to the Out label on the LCD display

The following screen is displayed:




Fig. 5-2 DMS4 front panel showing playback status

- 1. Indicates the current playback status
- 2. Title of the track currently playing
- 3. Name of the audio output currently selected
- The name of the artist associated with the track currently playing
- Press this button to change the audio output currently selected
- 6. Press this button to toggle the Repeat function
- 7. Press this button to toggle the **Shuffle** function

BROWSING ALBUMS IN THE AUDIO LIBRARY

The front panel user interface is also capable of displaying a list of albums present in the **Audio Library** of the DMS4 Digital Music Server

 Press the front panel action button corresponding to the Albums label on the LCD display

The following screen is displayed:




Fig. 5-3 Browsing albums on the DMS4 via the front panel

To Select an Album for Playback

- Use the ▲ and ✔ buttons on the front panel to move through the albums list alphabetically until the name of the album you wish to play is displayed. The artist name is also displayed below each album title
- Press the Out action button to select the audio output
- Finally, press the **Play** action button

RECORDING OR PLAYING A CD

The front panel user interface can be used to control the recording of a CD onto the hard disk of your DMS4 Digital Music Server. It can also be used to play a CD directly from the CD tray.

To begin recording a CD

- Press the button labelled OPEN/CLOSE on the front panel, insert a CD into the CD tray and press the OPEN/CLOSE button a second time to close the tray
- Press the front panel action button corresponding to the CD label on the LCD display

The following screen displays the album details:




Fig. 5-4 Recording a CD via the DMS4 front panel interface

Press the **Rec** action button

The recording quality is determined by the CD Record Settings in the Set Up menu.

Press the Rec action button to begin recording

The LCD display will show the progress of the recording and indicate when the recording process is complete.

To play a CD directly from the CD Tray

- Press the button labelled OPEN/CLOSE on the front panel, insert a CD into the CD tray and press the OPEN/CLOSE button a second time to close the tray
- Press the front panel action button corresponding to the CD label on the LCD display
- Press the **Play** action button

CONFIGURING SETUP OPTIONS

The configuration options available in the **Settings** menu of the television user interface are also available via the front panel user interface.

 Press the front panel action button corresponding to the Setup label on the LCD display

The following screen is displayed:

Use the \wedge and \vee buttons on the front panel to scroll through the following Set Up options:

- Network Settings
- Current Ethernet Settings
- Static Ethernet Settings
- TV Settings
- System Information
- Software Update Settings
- Network Back Up Settings
- CD Record Settings
- Media Transfer Settings
- XiVALink Settings
- Remote Diagnostics
- Online Update

Press the **Select** action button on the front panel to enter any of the above sections and configure settings as you would on the television user interface.

Where you are required to enter text, a screen will appear containing letters, numbers and symbols:

- Use the Select action key on the front panel to select a character

As you select characters they will appear at the top of the LCD display.

 Press the Ok action key when you have finished entering text

ONLINE UPDATES

The software inside the DMS4 Digital Music Server may be improved by Niles in the future. Therefore, periodically, updates become available online that the unit can download. The process is handled automatically; you do not need to know the location of update(s).

The update process is performed via the front panel display, not via the TV interface or via the IntelliControl® wall-mounted or hand-held devices (unless otherwise stated by the device).

Note: To perform an online update your DMS4 Digital Music Server must have an Internet connection present.

Only a few button presses are required to check for, and install, the latest available updates. Please use the following procedure:

- Use the ▲ and ➤ buttons on the front panel to select the Online Update option
- Ensuring your Internet connection is present, press the Select action button

Follow the front panel display instructions in order to check for and install online updates. When the process is complete, your DMS4 Digital Music Server will automatically restart with the new software installed.

INTELLICONTROL® ICS WALL-MOUNTED & iREMOTE® INTERFACES




Fig. 6-1 Common Features for all IntelliControl® User Interfaces

The IntelliControl® ICS DMS4 Digital Music Server can be controlled via the IntelliControl® ICS user interfaces. Refer to Figure 2-2 on page 14 for the system integration and wiring. The IntelliControl® ICS wall-mount and iREMOTE® user interfaces share some common features detailed in Fig. 6-1.

USER INTERFACE DESCRIPTIONS

The Master Keys are labeled for the sources and allow the user to change what is being listened to in that zone. For the examples in this section one of the Master Keys will be labeled DMS4 and allow the user to choose to listen to one of the streams of music coming from the DMS4 Digital Music Server. The PREV & NEXT buttons allow the user to skip to the previous or next song in the play queue of the DMS4. All of the user interface controls have VOLUME UP, VOLUME DOWN and MUTE which allow the user to adjust the volume level of the loud speakers in the room where the control is.

The SINGLE, DISPLAY and CONTACT are wall-mounted keypads. The iREMOTE® is a wireless remote control that can be taken throughout the house to control the IntelliControl® ICS multi-zone system.

NOTE: The CONTACT TT is a CONTACT Keypad in a tabletop caddy. All references to CONTACT include CONTACT TT.

The DISPLAY, CONTACT keypads and iREMOTE® have a visible feedback area, which will provide the user information (metadata) from the IntelliControl® ICS DMS4. This metadata is the artist, album and song title information contained in the music stored on the DMS4 Digital Music Server. This metadata information also allows the user to navigate their way through all of the music stored on the DMS4. The following sections detail how the user should use the metadata on these control interfaces to navigate and control the DMS4 Digital Music Server.



Fig. 6-2a Now Playing screen on user interfaces




Fig. 6-2b Close-up of the Now Playing screen on user interfaces




Fig. 6-3 User interface navigation on the DISPLAY and iREMOTE®

The DISPLAY and iREMOTE® interface controls are virtually identical in their functionality. Both interface controls have Menu navigation controls, alphanumeric buttons and soft keys (as shown in Fig. 6-3) that allow the user to "move" through the menu screens for control over the DMS4.

The Menu Navigation buttons are the UP, DOWN, LEFT, RIGHT and SELECT, and these buttons are used to cycle through a list of choices in the display area.

The Alphanumeric buttons are laid out like a cell-phone and are used for music search features on the DMS4. The soft keys are buttons just below the LCD screen and change their functionality based on what DMS4 menu the user is on.

The CONTACT keypad has the same areas of control for the DMS4, however it is a touch screen interface, so instead of pressing hard buttons the user will touch the screen for some of the control features. When the CONTACT keypad shows a list of choices, the user does not have to use an UP or DOWN hard buttons, he just touches the screen of his choice.




Fig. 6-5 ICS CONTACT soft keys and touch screen interface

DMS4 AND INTELLICONTROL® ICS USER INTERFACE FUNCTIONALITY

The Master Keys on the IntelliControl® ICS user interface provide "one-touch activation" of the sources on the GXR2 Modular MultiZone Receiver. After a Master Key is pressed and the source starts playing the user is greeted with the Now Playing screen for that source. From this "main screen" the user now has control over the source. With a DMS4 Digital Music Server properly integrated with the GXR2 Modular MultiZone receiver, the user now has at his fingertips the following control;

Advancing the DMS4 to the **Next** or **Previous** song in the play queue

Pausing the current song in the queue along with Play

Putting the DMS4 into a **Shuffle** mode to play the songs in the queue in random order, entering the **Menu** of the DMS4 where the user can now navigate all of the music on the DMS4

PLAYING MUSIC FROM THE DMS4 LIBRARY USING THE CONTACT KEYPAD

Pressing the **Menu** button the user can search through and play the music based on tracks, artists, albums, playlists, genres, years and eras.




Fig. 6-6 ICS CONTACT interface: accessing the DMS4 music library via the menu

To enter the TRACKS menu just press the TRACKS button. The user is now presented with ALL and the TRACKS from the DMS4 in alphabetical order.

If the user wants to play all of the tracks listed he would press and release the ALL button. If music was playing at the time the ALL button was pressed, that music would stop and then music would start playing from the first song of the tracks list (essentially replacing whatever was playing). If the user presses a track listed on the screen, any music that was playing would stop and the chosen track would start playing (essentially replacing whatever was playing).

Press & Hold the All button and all of the listed tracks will be added to the end of the Play Queue of the DMS4. Performing a Press & Hold on any track listed has the same effect of adding that track to the end of the Play Queue.

To enter **ALBUMS** from the main menu just press the ALBUMS button. The user is now presented with ALL and then all of the albums on the DMS4 in alphabetical order. As in the tracks menu if the user presses the ALL button, all of the ALBUMS will now replace whatever was playing in the Play Queue. A Press & Hold of the ALL button will add all of the albums on the DMS4 to the end of the Play Queue.

Press and release any album listed on the screen the user will now be presented will all of the tracks on the chosen album.




Fig. 6-8 ICS CONTACT interface: accessing the DMS4 Albums menu

To enter **ARTISTS** from the main menu just press the ARTISTS button. The user is now presented with ALL and then all of the artists on the DMS4 in alphabetical order. As in the tracks menu if the user presses the ALL button, all of the ARTISTS music will now replace whatever was playing in the Play Queue. A Press & Hold of the ALL button will add all of the albums from all artists on the DMS4 to the end of the Play Queue.

Press and release any artist listed on the screen the user will now be presented with all of the albums for the chosen artists.




Fig. 6-9 ICS CONTACT interface: accessing the DMS4 Artists menu

To enter the **PLAY Q** from the main menu just press the PLAY $\mathbb Q$ button. The user is now presented with all the selections (individual tracks, full albums and Playlists) that will play from the current Play $\mathbb Q$.

To enter **PLAYLISTS** from the main menu just press the PLAYLISTS button. The user is now presented with all of the Playlists on the DMS4 in alphabetical order. Press and release any Playlist listed on the screen the user will now be presented with all of the tracks and albums contained in that Playlist.

To enter **GENRES** from the main menu just press the GENRES button. The user is now presented with ALL and then a list of all of the Genres on the DMS4 in alphabetical order. As in the tracks menu if the user presses the ALL button, all of the music of that Genre will now replace whatever was playing in the Play Queue. A Press & Hold of the ALL button will add all music from all Genres on the DMS4 to the end of the Play Queue.

Press and release any Genres listed on the screen and the user will now be presented will all of the albums for the chosen Genre

Years and **Eras** are listed on the second screen of the Main Menu, to access the second screen press the Page **∨** button.

Entering YEARS the user is presented with ALL and a list of years that the albums were originally released in. Eras will present the user with a list of eras that applies to the music on the DMS4. Below is a CONTACT screen sample for both years and eras Menus.

Within the tracks, album, artists, genres, years and eras menus the user can perform an alphanumeric search for a specific music title contained on the DMS4. When available the menu will present the user with an **ABC**'s button. After pressing the ABC's button the user sees an alphanumeric screen where he can now enter up to 4 characters to refine his search. The user would press the # button to show the music that starts with nonalphabetic characters.




Fig. 6-14 ICS CONTACT interface: accessing the alphanumeric menu

In the above example, if the user wanted to find all of the artists whose first name starts with \mathcal{M} , he would press the letter \mathbf{M} then the **Enter** button. The user interface would then show all artists that start with \mathcal{M} .

PLAYING MUSIC FROM THE DMS4 LIBRARY USING THE IREMOTE® OR DISPLAY USER INTERFACE

The above section detailed how the user would navigate the menus of the DMS4 using the CONTACT keypad. The CONTACT is a touch screen interface where the user just touches his selection on the screen shown. The DISPLAY and iREMOTE® user interfaces have a display area that shows the metadata and instead of pressing selections on the display area the end-user uses the menu navigation, soft keys and alphanumeric hard keys to navigate through the choices in the display area. For example, to navigate the DMS4 to find and start playing music from Mark Knopfler the user would press the soft Key under Menu in the Now playing screen. The user would then use the UP and DOWN arrows to move the highlight bar up and down on the listed items in the display area.

When the user has moved the highlight to the item he wants ARTISTS, the user then presses the SELECT button. Then move the highlight down on the ARTISTS screen to highlight Mark Knopfler, press select. The user then moves the highlight down to the album from that artist and presses select. On the TRACKS menu the user can press SELECT to choose all of the songs from that album.




Fig. 6-16 Navigating the Track, Artist and Album menus on the iREMOTE® and DISPLAY user interfaces

Alphanumeric search is also available on the iREMOTE® and DISPLAY keypad. The user can use the alphanumeric hard buttons like a cell phone by using multiple presses of the 5 number the display area will show "J" and each successive press of the 5 button cycles through the letters then the number. (i.e. multiple presses of the 5 button will show the user "J", "K", "L" then "5") When the user has the letter or number he wants, he then presses the right arrow to move over to enter the next letter/number, left arrow to go back 1 character or SELECT to start the search.

SYSTEM SETTINGS

This chapter describes the advanced settings that you can access from your IntelliControl® ICS DMS4 Digital Music Server's **Settings** menu.

To access the **Settings** menu:

- Use the A and V keys to highlight the Set Up option.
- Press the **✓ Select** key
- Use the ▲ and ▼ keys again to highlight the Settings option
- Press the **✓ Select** key

The following screen is displayed:




Fig. 7-1 DMS4 TV interface Settings main menu screen

The following sections describe each of the options available from the **Settings** menu.

CONNECTION SETTINGS

This section allows you to specify how your DMS4 Digital Music Server accesses the Internet.




Fig. 7-2 DMS4 TV interface Internet Connection Settings screen

Edit Internet Access to choose between Ethernet and None as the connection type and press the OSave key to commit any changes you make.

Edit Ethernet Settings

If you have selected **Ethernet** as your chosen **Internet Access** method, you will need to choose between **DHCP** and **Static** as the Ethernet **Mode**. Select **Edit Ethernet Settings** and specify **DHCP** as the **Mode** if your DMS4 Digital Music Server is connected to a network with a DHCP server present, and the Ethernet settings should be assigned automatically. Alternatively, select **Static** as the **Mode** and a number of extra fields will appear on the **Ethernet Settings** screen:




Fig. 7-3 DMS4 TV interface Ethernet Settings screen

Enter your own Ethernet details in the IP Address, Subnet Mask, Gateway and DNS fields. Press the Save key to commit any changes you make.

Assigned Ethernet Settings

Select **View Assigned Ethernet Settings** to see the current configuration of your DMS4 Digital Music Server.

If you are experiencing difficulties connecting via Ethernet, or are prompted to do so by a member of the Niles Technical Support Team, press the **©Test** key to perform a series of quick tests that may help diagnose network connectivity problems.

Note: After making changes to any of the **Connection Settings** screens, you may be prompted to restart your DMS4
Digital Music Server in order for the new settings to take effect.

TV SETTINGS

This section is used to specify if your DMS4 Digital Music Server is configured for PAL or NTSC use.

Note: your DMS4 Digital Music Server will be set to **NTSC** by default. You may need to amend this setting if the TV user interface is not displayed, or displayed incorrectly on your television screen.

USER INTERFACE SETTINGS

The options on this menu allow you to change the settings that affect the way the user interface is displayed.

By default, your DMS4 Digital Music Server will be in **Passive** mode; changing to **Active** will add icons to the interface depicting the available options on each screen.

This screen also allows you to enable or disable the hints that appear at the bottom of some of the screens and the button pulse when an option is selected.

In addition, you can also enable or disable Auto Output. This option dictates whether a remote control specifically programmed to control a particular audio output will automatically switch the DMS4 Digital Music Server to control the assigned output when a button is pressed on the remote control. For more information about using this feature, see the section entitled Remote Control Use in a Multi-room System on page 12.

The Screensaver

The DMS4 Digital Music Server is equipped with a screensaver which will activate when the unit remains idle for a specified period of time. On this screen, you may choose to disable the screen saver or alter the time delay before it activates.

Note: It is strongly recommended that you leave the screensaver

enabled if you are using a plasma or rear projection television to display the user interface.

SYSTEM INFORMATION

The **System Information** screen displays information about the configuration of your DMS4 Digital Music Server, such as the serial number and the version number of the software currently running.




Fig. 7-7 DMS4 TV interface System Information screen

You may need to quote this information if you contact your dealer or installer for technical support.

On this screen there is a also a **Reset System** option available by pressing the **O** key on the remote control. Select this option and press the **Reset Defaults** key to return your DMS4 Digital Music Server to its default factory settings. You can also choose the **O**Clear Content option to remove all the music from your Audio Library.

If you choose to clear all the content from your **Audio Library** you will be asked to enter a password to confirm your action. The password is *ResetMyMusic*.

Note: If you perform either of the above two actions, you will not be able to reverse their effects.

SOFTWARE UPDATE SETTINGS

In the unlikely event that a software update attempt fails, you may need to amend these settings. If this scenario arises, contact your dealer or installer for more information.

NETWORK BACK UP SETTINGS

This screen allows you to specify **Username**, **Password** and **Network Location** for performing a Back Up operation.




Fig. 7-9 DMS4 TV interface Network Back-up Settings screen

CD RECORD SETTINGS

On this screen you have the option to change the way in which your DMS4 Digital Music Server records CDs.

Selecting Maximum as the Drive Speed will record your CDs at high speed. If you find this setting makes your DMS4 Digital Music Server too noisy, select Standard for quieter but slower operation.

Choose between Uncompressed WAV, Very High Quality MP3 (320k CBR), High Quality MP3 (192k VBR), Standard Quality MP3 (128k VBR), High Quality WMA (128k CBR) and Standard Quality WMA (96k CBR) as the Default Recording Quality used by both the TV and front panel user interfaces when recording a CD.

The **Quick Record** option allows you to specify if your DMS4 Digital Music Server displays the **Recording Quality** options each time a CD is recorded. By default this option is **enabled**. If you prefer to select the record quality each time you record a CD, change it to **disabled**.

With the Auto Record feature enabled, each time you insert a CD into the CD drive it will begin recording automatically. In addition, enable the Auto Record Eject function to have the CD automatically ejected when it has finished recording.

MEDIA TRANSFER SETTINGS

Here you can enable or disable the media transfer function.

This option is enabled by default.

OUTPUT CONFIGURATION

This screen allows you to enable volume control on each of the available audio outputs.




Fig. 7-12 DMS4 TV interface Output Configuration screen

XIVALINK SETTINGS

Your DMS4 Digital Music Server uses a protocol called XiVALink to communicate with compatible devices and controllers.

It is recommended that you do not attempt to edit these settings unless you are instructed to do so by your installer, or a member of the Niles Technical Support Team.

USING YOUR DMS4 DIGITAL MUSIC SERVER VVITH A HOME COMPUTER

Your IntelliControl® ICS DMS4 Digital Music Server has a number of advanced features which can be accessed via a computer connected to your home network.

THE REMOTE USER INTERFACE

Your DMS4 Digital Music Server's television user interface is accessible via a PC running on your home network. This gives you complete control of your DMS4 Digital Music Server using a keyboard and mouse as opposed to a remote control. This can help make editing items in the **Audio Library** easier and quicker and also allows you to control your DMS4 Digital Music Server from any computer running on your home network.

Accessing the Remote User Interface

- Connect your DMS4 Digital Music Server to your home network and power it on. If no DHCP address is available, your DMS4 Digital Music Server will automatically assign itself an IP address and become accessible on the network
- Navigate to the Current Ethernet Settings screen in the front panel Set Up menu on the DMS4 Digital Music Server and note the IP address. If you are using DHCP this address will be in the same range as the other computers on your network; if not, this address will be in the range 169.254.0.1 - 169.254.255.254
- Next, using a computer on the network, type the IP address
 or host name of your DMS4 Digital Music Server into the
 address bar of a web browser (e.g. http://192.168.0.1
 or http://<hostname>). If you are not using DHCP you
 may need to reconfigure your computer's network settings
 before you can access the Remote User Interface

If you experience any difficulties with the above configuration, contact your network administrator.

Supported Software

Currently, the operating systems and web browsers supported are as follows:

On the Apple Macintosh:

- Mac OS X 10.4.2 and above
- Safari 2.0.1 and above

On the PC:

- Microsoft® Windows® XP (Service Pack 2) and Windows VistaTM
- Microsoft® Internet Explorer 6.0.2 and above

Note: Other operating systems and web browsers, or earlier versions of the above, may not display the Remote User Interface correctly.

Navigating the Remote User Interface

You will notice that the Remote User Interface is identical to the television user interface, but for the addition of some buttons. These buttons have been added to allow you to perform actions normally executed with the DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control, using a standard computer mouse.

When you first connect to the Remote User Interface, you will recognize the Main Menu screen:




Fig. 8-1 DMS4 Remote User Interface Main Menu screen

The screens of the Remote User Interface are identical to those of the television user interface but for the following differences:

- The ▲ and ¥ buttons now appear wherever there is a list that can scrolled. You can use your mouse to press these buttons when you would usually use the ▲ and ¥ buttons on the DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control
- When required to edit or enter text, the Remote User Interface will display the text entry screen just as the television user interface does. However, instead of using the alphanumeric keypad on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control, you can use your computer keyboard to enter text

You will also notice that playback transport controls are available on the left hand side of the **Now Playing** screen:

You can initiate and control playback from the Remote User Interface using these controls.

Note: If you make any changes to the Connection Settings via the Remote User Interface, such as changing the IP Address, you may need to reconnect using the new connection details.

MEDIA TRANSFER

In addition to recording directly from the CD tray, it is also possible to transfer music and cover art images to and from your DMS4 Digital Music Server, using a computer on your home network. This feature allows you to transfer music files from your DMS4 Digital Music Server to a portable device (for example, an Apple® iPod®) to allow you to listen to your music collection while you are away from home

Note: In some countries the copying of material protected by copyright law may require permission of the copyright owners.

Accessing Media Transfer

The illustration below shows a typical home network set up. Connect your DMS4 Digital Music Server to your home network as described in the section entitled Accessing the Remote User Interface on the previous page.

Enabling Media Transfer

- Press the Menu key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control to display the Main Menu.
- Use the ▲ and ▼ keys to highlight Set Up and press the ✓ Select key.
- Use the ▲ and ✔ keys again and choose the Settings option and then highlight Media Transfer Settings and press the ✔ Select key.

The following screen is displayed:

This setting should be set to **Enabled** by default. However, if necessary, press the **√**Edit key and select **Enabled** to activate media transfer. Use the **©**Save key to save this setting.

Provided that your DMS4 Digital Music Server is connected correctly it should now be accessible by browsing the network from your computer. Alternatively, open Windows® Explorer and type the IP address of your DMS4 Digital Music Server into the Address bar (e.g. \\<IP ADDRESS>). When you attempt to access your DMS4 Digital Music Server on your home network, you will be asked to enter a username and password. These are as follows:

- Username niles
- Password niles

Note: The above username and password are case sensitive.

If you are using a Macintosh computer you can create a new network connection as follows:

- Select Go from the Finder menu and click Connect to Server.
- Click on the Browse button in the Connect to Server window.
- Navigate to your DMS4 Digital Music Server on the network and double-click the appropriate icon.
- If your DMS4 Digital Music Server does not appear in the browse window return to the Connect to Server window and enter: smb://<WORKGROUP><DMS4 Digital Music Server_NAME> (e.g. smb://MSHOME;DMS4 Digital Music Server) into the Server Address box, then click the Connect button

Note: Both the Workgroup and DMS4 Digital Music Server Name should be in upper case.

- In the SMB Mount window click the OK button.
- In the SMB/CIFS Filesystem Authentication window enter the username <username> and the password <password> and then click the OK button.

A window showing the contents of the DMS4 Digital Music Server hard disk will be displayed.

At the top level of the media transfer directory structure are two folders entitled MusicShare and Import.




Fig. 8-4 Connecting the DMS4 to a home computer, the Internet and a portable media player via a router in a home network

Importing Files to your DMS4 Digital Music Server

 Double click on the folder entitled Import. An empty folder window will be displayed

To Import Music Files

- Navigate to the location of the music files on your computer
- Use your mouse to select the files you wish to import and drag them into the Import window

The files will appear briefly in the **Import** window but after a few seconds will disappear. These files should now be accessible in the **Audio Library** of your DMS4 Digital Music Server.

Note: The currently supported audio file types for import are WAV, WMA and MP3 (WMA Lossless and DRM protected files are not supported). Any files of an unsupported type that are dropped into the Import folder will not be imported.

To Import Cover Art Files

- Navigate to the location of the cover art files on your computer
- Use your mouse to select the files you wish to import and drag them into the Import window

The files will appear briefly in the **Import** window but after a few seconds will disappear. These files will now be available when selecting cover art for an album in the **Audio Library**.

Note: The currently supported image file types are BMP and JPEG. Files will be resized automatically. Any files of an unsupported type that are dropped into the Import folder will not be imported.

Exporting Files from your DMS4 Digital Music Server

- Double click on the folder entitled MusicShare. A folder window will be displayed containing a folder for each artist present in the Audio Library of your DMS4 Digital Music Server
- Double click on the folder for an artist. A folder window will be displayed containing a folder for each album by the chosen artist present in the Audio Library
- Double click on the folder for an album. A folder window will be displayed containing all the tracks within the album and a IPEG file containing the cover art for the album

You now have read only access to these files and can drag and drop them to a location on your PC. You are now also able to copy music from your DMS4 Digital Music Server directly to your portable player.

Transferring Music to your Portable Player using iTunes®

The iTunes® Media Player application is specifically designed to simplify the process of synchronizing your music collection with an iPod portable player. Support for other devices is limited; you should check that your portable player is compatible before using this application. iTunes® version 4.6 or later is required.

The **Library** source in iTunes® shows all media files stored on the local hard disk as well as media which has been added from other network drives. You can add the music collection from your DMS4 Digital Music Server to the **Library** as follows:

- Select the Preferences option. This can be found under the Edit menu on the Windows® edition of iTunes® and under the iTunes® menu on the Macintosh version
- Select the Advanced tab
- Ensure that the option labelled Copy files to iTunes® Music folder when adding to library is unchecked
- Click the OK button to confirm any changes

- Making sure you have Library displayed in iTunes®, navigate to your DMS4 Digital Music Server on the network
- Select the music you wish to transfer; you can transfer entire albums, or all the music by a particular artist, by dragging the relevant folder into the iTunes[®] Library and releasing the mouse button. To transfer the entire contents of your Audio Library, drag the folder entitled Albums By Artist into the iTunes[®] Library

Note: the import process may take some time depending on the number of albums and the speed of your computer.

Once the iTunes® Library source has been updated with the music from your DMS4 Digital Music Server you can you can update your iPod as follows:

- Connect your iPod in the normal way
- Click the Browse button in the top right-hand corner of the iTunes® window
- Drag any item from the Genre, Artist, Album lists onto the iPod icon in the Source area

The transfer process will begin shortly afterwards.

Updating the iTunes® Library

If you have removed music from your DMS4 Digital Music Server or edited the names of any items in the library you will need to update the iTunes® **Library** to remove any broken links. To do this, you should first delete all the DMS4 Digital Music Server albums from the iTunes® **Library** as follows:

- Select the View Options item from the Edit menu
- Check the Grouping option, then click the OK button to confirm your changes
- In the iTunes® Library click the new Grouping column heading. The tracks located on your DMS4 Digital Music Server hard disk will be grouped together using the label <-DMS4 Digital Music Server_NAME (e.g. <-NilesDMS4-1234)
- Click on the first track in the list with this grouping label then, holding down the Shift key, click the last track
- Press the Delete key to remove these tracks from the iTunes® Library
- Click Yes to confirm your choice

Repeat the import process described above to add back the DMS4 Digital Music Server information.

Note: iTunes® does not support WMA files.

Transferring Music to your Portable Player using Windows® Media Player

It is also possible to use Windows® Media Player to transfer music from your IntelliControl® ICS DMS4 Digital Music Server to your portable device.

- Firstly, make sure you can navigate to your DMS4 Digital Music Server and view the music in your MusicShare folder
- Display the File drop down menu and select Add to
 Library, followed by Add Folder. In the Explorer window
 that appears navigate to your DMS4 Digital Music Server
 on the network and select the music you wish to transfer;
 you can transfer entire albums, or all the music by a
 particular artist by selecting the relevant folder and clicking
 OK. To transfer the entire contents of your Audio Library,
 select the folder entitled MusicShare

Note: the import process may take some time depending on the number of albums and the speed of your computer.

Once your **Media Library** has been updated with the music from your DMS4 Digital Music Server you can update your portable player as follows:

- Click the Copy to CD or Device option from the Media Player toolbar.
- Select the Album, Artist, Genre or Playlist you wish to copy from the Items to Copy list.
- Under Items on Device select your portable player.
- Click the Copy button.

The transfer process will begin shortly afterwards.

NETWORK BACK UP AND RESTORE

In the unlikely even that your DMS4 Digital Music Server develops a fault you have the option to back up the contents of your DMS4 Digital Music Server's hard disk to a selected location on your home network and then restore this information at a later date.

In order to use Network Back Up and Restore, it is first necessary to configure the appropriate settings on your DMS4 Digital Music Server.

- Press the Menu key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control to display the Main Menu.
- Use the ▲ and ✔ keys to highlight Set Up and press the ✔ Select key.
- Use the ▲ and ▼ keys again to choose Settings and press the ▼ Select key.
- Use the ▲ and ¥ keys a third time to highlight Network Back Up Settings and press the ✓ Select key.

The following screen is displayed:

In the Remote Location field, enter the location on the network to which you wish to back up your Library (e.g. \\192.168.0.1\Share\). Enter Username, Password and Domain where appropriate to access your home network.

The **Replace Back Up** option can be set to **True** to overwrite any existing back up information in the specified location.

Network Back Up

- Press the Menu key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control to display the Main Menu.
- Use the ▲ and ▼ keys to highlight Settings and press the ▼ Select key.
- Use the ∧ and ∨ keys again to highlight Network Back
 Up and Restore and press the √Select key.

The following screen is displayed:

• Press the **Back Up** key.

Network Restore

Prior to performing a **Network Restore**, it is necessary to clear all of the content from your **Audio Library**, using the **Clear Content** function.

- Navigate to the Settings menu and use the $\pmb{\wedge}$ and $\pmb{\vee}$ keys to choose $\mbox{System Information}.$
- Press the

 Reset System key.
- Press the □Clear Content key and confirm your intention by pressing the ✓Yes key.
- Enter the case sensitive password Reset/My/Music and press the ✓Yes key.

Your DMS4 Digital Music Server will now automatically shut down and restart, erasing the contents of your Audio Library in the process. You are now in a position to perform a Network Restore.

- Press the Menu key on your DMS4 Digital Music Server remote control to display the Main Menu.
- Use the ▲ and ▼ keys to highlight Settings and press the ✓ Select key.
- Use the ▲ and ▼ keys again to highlight Network Back
 Up and Restore and press the ▼ Select key.
- Press the **ORestore** key.
- Confirm that you wish to delete all of the existing music in your Audio Library by pressing the
 Yes key and entering the password ResetMyMusic.

Note: When performing a back up, ensure there is enough space available at the destination for the quantity of media being transferred. In the event that there is not enough hard disk space, the back up will not complete successfully and the partially backed up files will be unusable.
