

- A channel marked with the "**\P**" mark means the channel has been set as a **Favorite**. The **Delete** from **Favorite** menu only appears for channels with the "**\P**" mark.





Unlike analog channels, which can vary in reception quality from "snowy" to clear, digital (HDTV) channels have either perfect reception quality or you will not receive them at all. So, unlike analog channels, you cannot fine tune a digital channel. You can, however, adjust your antenna to improve the reception of available digital channels.

If the signal strength meter indicates that the signal is weak, physically adjust your antenna to increase the signal strength. Continue to adjust the antenna until you find the best position with the strongest signal.

- The **Default** is "CC1".
- CC1 : The Primary Synchronous Caption Service.

These are captions in the primary language that must be in sync with the sound, preferably matched to a specific frame.

• CC2 : The Special Non-Synchronous Use Captions.

This channel carries data that is intended to augment information carried in the program.

• CC3 : Secondary Synchronous Caption Service.

Alternate program-related caption data, typically second language captions.

- CC4 : Special Non-Synchronous Use Captions. Similar to CC2.
- Text1 : First Text Service. This may be various non-program related data.
- Text2 : Second Text Service. Additional data, usually not program related.
- Text3 / Text4 : Third and Fourth Text Services.

These data channels should be used only if Text1 and Text2 are not sufficient.
