Installation



Be sure to contact an authorized Service Center when installing your monitor in a location with heavy dust, high or low temperatures, high humidity, and exposed to chemical substances and where it operates for 24 hours such as at airports, train stations etc.

Failure to do so may cause serious damage to your monitor.



- ▶ Ensure that at least two persons lift and move the product.
- Otherwise, it may be dropped and cause personal injury, and/ or damage the product.



- When installing the product in a cabinet or rack, make sure that the front end of the bottom of the product does not project out.
- Otherwise, it may fall or cause personal injury.
- · Use a cabinet or rack of a size appropriate to the product.



DO NOT PLACE CANDLES, MOSQUITO REPELLANT, CIGARETTES AND ANY HEATING APPLIANCES NEAR THE PRODUCT.

Clean



When cleaning the PDP Display case or the surface of the TFT-PDP screen, wipe with a slightly moistened, soft fabric.



- Do not spray cleaner directly onto the surface of the product.
- Otherwise, this may result in the discoloration and distortion of the structure and the screen surface may peel off.



- Clean the product using a soft cloth with a monitor cleaner only.
- If you must use a cleaner other than the monitor cleaner, dilute it with water at a ratio of 1:10.



- ▶ When cleaning the power plug pins or dusting the power outlet, clean it with a dry cloth.
- · Otherwise, it may result in fire.



▶ When cleaning the product, make sure to disconnect the power cord.

Kensington Lock

The Kensington Lock is a device used to physically fix the system when using it in a public place. The locking device has to be purchased separately. The appearance and locking method may differ from the illustration depending on the manufacturer. Refer to the manual provided with the Kensington Lock for proper use.



The location of the Kensington Lock may be different depending on its model.

Using the Anti-Theft Kensington Lock

- 1. Insert the locking device into the Kensington slot on the Monitor ^[]and turn it in the locking direction 4.
- 2. Connect the Kensington Lock cable.
- 3. Fix the Kensington Lock to a desk or a heavy stationary object.






Mechanical Layout(P50HP, P50HP-2)




Installation VESA Bracket



Connecting a Computer



- There are several ways to connect the computer to the monitor. Choose one from the following options.
 - Using the D-sub (Analog) connector on the video card.
 - Connect the D-sub to the 15-pin, [RGB IN] port on the back of your PDP Display and the 15 pin D-sub Port on the computer.



- 1-2 Using the DVI (Digital) connector on the video card.
- Connect the DVI Cable to the [DVI IN] port on the back of your PDP Display and the DVI port on the computer.



- 1-3 Using the HDMI (digital) output on the graphics card.
- Connect the [HDMI IN] port on the PDP Display to the HDMI port on the PC using the HDMI cable.






When the HDMI cable to the PC, ensure that you select **HDMI** from both the **Source List** and **Edit Name** before selecting **PC** or **DVI** device so that normal PC screen and sound can be outputted. Note that sound is only available when connected according to the option that follows.

Using the BNC (Analog) connector on the video card.

 Connect the [BNC/COMPONENT IN] port on the monitor to the BNC port on the PC using the BNC to BNC cable.



- Connect the audio cable for your PDP Display to the audio port on the back of the PDP Display.





Connecting AV Devices



- Connect an audio cable to the audio output port on the external device and [AV/COM-PONENT AUDIO IN[R-AUDIO-L]] port on the monitor, and connect the video output port on the external device to the [AV IN [VIDEO]] port on the monitor.
- 2. Play the DVD, VCR or Camcorder with a DVD disc or tape inserted.
- 3. Select **AV** using the SOURCE button on the front of the PDP display or on the remote.

Connecting to a Camcorder




- Locate the AV output jacks on the camcorder. They are usually found on the side or back
 of the camcorder. Connect a set of audio cables between the AUDIO OUTPUT jacks on
 the camcorder and the [AV/COMPONENT AUDIO IN [R-AUDIO-L]] on the PDP Display.
- Connect a video cable between the VIDEO OUTPUT jack on the camcorder and the [AV IN [VIDEO]] on the PDP Display .
- 3. Select **AV** for the Camcorder connection using the SOURCE button on the front of the PDP Display or on the remote control.
- 4. Then, start the Camcorder with a tape inserted.




The audio-video cables shown here are usually included with a Camcorder. (If not, check your local electronics store.) If your camcorder is stereo, you need to connect a set of two cables.

Connecting the BNC to BNC cable

Troubleshooting

 - Check the displays to see if any of the other displays connected have the same ID. If more than one displays have the same ID, those displays are not properly detected by the program due to data conflict.
 - For monitors that support a Set ID between 0 to 99, you have to set the Set ID to a value between 0 and 99.

Self-Test Feature Check

- 1. Turn off both your computer and the PDP Display.
- 2. Unplug the video cable from the back of the computer.
- 3. Turn on the PDP Display.

The figure shown below ("Check Signal Cable") appears on a black background when the PDP Display is working normally even though no video signal is detected: While in the Self-Test mode, the LED power indicator remains green and the figure moves around on the screen.



4. Turn off your PDP Display and reconnect the video cable; then turn on both your computer and the PDP Display

If your PDP Display screen remains blank after using the previous procedure, check your video controller and computer system; your PDP Display is functioning properly.

Warning Messages

You can even view the screen at a resolution of 1920 x 1080. However, you will receive the following message for a minute; You can choose to change the screen resolution or stay in the current mode during that time. And if the resolution is more than 85Hz, you will see the black screen because the PDP Display does not support over 85Hz.

Maintenance and Cleaning

1) Maintaining the PDP Display Case.

Clean with a soft cloth after disconnecting the power cord.



 Do not use benzene, thinner or other flammable substances, or a wet cloth.

2) Maintaining the Flat Panel Display Screen.

Clean with a soft cloth (cotton flannel) smoothly.



- Never use acetone, benzene or thinner.
 - (They may cause flaws or deformation of the screen surface.)
- The user will be required to pay costs and related expenses for repairing damages caused.

Symptoms and Recommended Actions



A PDP Display recreates visual signals received from the computer. Therefore, if there is a problem with the computer or the video card, this can cause the PDP Display to become blank, have poor coloring, become noisy, and video mode not supported, etc. In this case, first check the source of the problem, and then contact a Service Center or your dealer.

- 1. Check if the power cord and the video cables are properly connected to the computer.
- 2. Check if the computer beeps more than 3 times when booting.

(If it does, request an a service for the main board of the computer.)

- 3. If you installed a new video card or if you assembled the PC, check if you installed the Adaptor(video).
- 4. Check if the scanning ratio of the video screen is set to between 50 Hz ~ 85 Hz.

(Do not exceed 60Hz when using the maximum resolution.)

5. If you have problems in installing the Adaptor (video) driver, boot the computer in Safe Mode, remove the Display Adaptor in the "Control Panel -> System -> Device Administrator" and then reboot the computer to reinstall the Adaptor (video) driver.

- A: Check if the resolution and frequency set for the computer video card falls in the range supported by the PDP Display. If not, reset them referring to the current Information under the PDP Display menu and Preset Timing Modes.
- Q: The image is too light or too dark.
- A: Adjusts the brightness and contrast.

(Refer to the Brightness, Contrast)

- Q: The screen color is inconsistent.

- Q: The color image is distorted by dark shadows.

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Terms

Dot Pitch The image on a monitor is composed of red, green and blue

dots. The closer the dots, the higher the resolution. The distance between two dots of the same color is called the 'Dot

Pitch'. Unit: mm

Vertical Frequency The screen must be redrawn several times per second in

order to create and display an image for the user. The frequency of this repetition per second is called the Vertical

Frequency or Refresh Rate. Unit: Hz

Example: If the same light repeats itself 60 times per sec-

ond, this is regarded as 60 Hz.

Horizontal Frequency The time to scan one line connecting the right edge to the

left edge of the screen horizontally is called the Horizontal Cycle. The inverse number of the Horizontal Cycle is called

Horizontal Frequency. Unit: kHz

Interlace and Non-Interlace

Methods

Showing the horizontal lines of the screen from the top to the bottom sequentially is called the Non-Interlace method while showing odd lines and then even lines in turn is called the Interlace method. The Non-Interlace method is used for the majority of monitors to ensure a clear image. The Interlace method is the same as that used in TVs.

Plug & Play

This is a function that provides the best quality screen for

the user by allowing the computer and the monitor to exchange information automatically. This monitor follows the international standard VESA DDC for the Plug & Play func-

tion.

Resolution The number of horizontal and vertical dots used to compose

the screen image is called the 'resolution'. This number shows the accuracy of the display. A high resolution is good for performing multiple tasks as more image information can

be shown on the screen.

Example: If the resolution is 1360(1920) x 768(1080), this means the screen is composed of 1360(1920) horizontal dots (horizontal resolution) and 768(1080) vertical lines

(vertical resolution).

Multiple Display Control

(MDC)

A Multiple Display Control (MDC) is an application allowing various displays to be easily and simultaneously operated

on a PC. RS-232C, a standard of serial communication, is used for communicating between a PC and a display.

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
