

General setup

IMPORTANT NOTE

■ Most of the illustrations in this User's Guide show the MFC-J870DW.

Memory Storage

(MFC-J870DW and MFC-J875DW)

Your menu settings are stored permanently, and, in the event of a power failure, will not be lost. Temporary settings (for example, Overseas Mode) will be lost. If you have chosen Set New Default for your Fax, Scan, Copy and Photo preferred settings, those settings will not be lost. Also, during a power failure, the machine will retain the date and time and programmed fax timer jobs (for example, Delayed Fax) for approximately 24 hours.

(MFC-J650DW)

Your menu settings are stored permanently, and, in the event of a power failure, will not be lost. Temporary settings (for example, Overseas Mode) will be lost. If you have chosen Set New Default for your Fax, Scan, Copy and Photo preferred settings, those settings will not be lost. However you may have to reset the date and time.

Volume Settings

Ring Volume

You can choose a range of ring volume levels, from High to Off. The machine will keep your new default setting until you change it.


Setting the Ring Volume from the menu

 Press ∭ (Settings).
 Press All Settings.
 Press A or V to display General Setup.
 Press General Setup.
 Press ▲ or V to display Volume.
 Press Volume.
 Press Ring.
 Press ▲ or V to display Low, Med, High or Off, and then press the option you want.
 Press M. 1

Beep Volume

When the beep is on, the machine will make a sound when you press the Touchscreen or Touchpanel, make a mistake, or after you send or receive a fax.

You can choose a range of sound volume levels, from High to Off.



Speaker Volume

You can choose a range of speaker volume levels, from High to Off.



8 Press ▲ or ▼ to display Low, Med, High or Off, and then press the option you want.

9 Press 🏠.

You can also adjust the speaker volume by pressing Hook.

(MFC-J870DW and MFC-J875DW) Do one of the following:

- When Fax Preview is set to Off,

- When Fax Preview is set to On, press

Press Hook.

- Press for to decrease or for to increase the speaker volume level. Each press changes the volume to the next setting.


5 Press Hook.



Automatic Daylight Saving Time

You can set the machine to change automatically for daylight saving time. It will reset itself forward one hour in the Spring and backward one hour in the Fall. Make sure you have set the correct date and time in the Date & Time setting.

The factory setting is Off, so you will have to turn on Automatic Daylight Saving Time as follows.



Sleep Mode


You can choose how long the machine must be idle (up to 60 minutes) before it goes into Sleep Mode. The timer will restart if any operation is carried out on the machine.

Press (Settings). Press All Settings. 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to display General Setup. 4 Press General Setup. Press ▲ or ▼ to display Sleep Mode. 6 Press Sleep Mode. 7 Press ▲ or ▼ to display 1Min, 2Mins, 3Mins, 5Mins, 10Mins, 30Mins or 60Mins to choose the length of time the machine must be idle before entering Sleep Mode. Press the option you want to set. 8 Press 🏹.

Touchscreen LCD


Setting the backlight brightness

You can adjust the brightness of the Touchscreen LCD backlight. If you are having difficulty reading the LCD, try changing the brightness setting.



Setting the Dim Timer for the backlight

You can set how long the Touchscreen LCD backlight stays on after the last finger press.

Security features

TX Lock (MFC-J650DW)

TX Lock lets you prevent unauthorized access to the machine. You will not be able to continue to schedule Delayed Faxes or Polling jobs. However, any pre-scheduled Delayed Faxes will still be sent even if you turn on TX Lock, so they will not be lost.

While TX Lock is On, the following operations are available:

- Receiving faxes
- Fax Forwarding (If Fax Forwarding was already On)
- Paging (If Paging was already On)
- Remote Retrieval (If Fax Storage was already On)
- PC-Fax Receive ¹ (If PC-Fax Receive was already On)
- ¹ While the TX Lock feature is turned on, your machine will receive faxes and store them in its memory. Then, when TX Lock is turned off, the faxes will be sent to your chosen PC.

While TX Lock is On, the following operations are NOT available:

- Operation from the control panel
- PC printing

NOTE

If you forget the TX Lock password, call Brother Customer Service. (See Basic User's Guide: *Brother numbers*.)

Setting and changing the TX Lock password

NOTE

If you have already set the password, you will not need to set it again.

Setting the password

Make a careful note of your password.

6	Press Miscellaneous.
7	Press TX Lock.
8	Enter a 4-digit number for the password using the keyboard on the Touchscreen. Press OK.
9	When the Touchscreen shows Verify, re-enter the password using the keyboard on the Touchscreen. Press OK.

Turning TX Lock off

 TX Lock is turned off.

NOTE

If you enter the wrong password, the Touchscreen shows Wrong Password and stays offline. The machine will stay in TX Lock mode until the registered password is entered.

Memory Security (MFC-J870DW and MFC-J875DW)

Memory Security lets you prevent unauthorized access to the machine. You will not be able to schedule Delayed Faxes or Polling jobs. However, any pre-scheduled Delayed Faxes will be sent even if you turn on Memory Security, so they will not be lost.

While Memory Security is On, the following operations are available:

- Receiving faxes into memory (limited by memory capacity)
- Fax Forwarding (if Fax Forwarding was already On)
- Paging (if Paging was already On)
- Remote Retrieval (if Fax Storage was already On)

While Memory Security is On, the following operations are NOT available:

- Operation from the control panel
- Printing received faxes
- PC printing
- PC Fax Receive
- Disc Print
- Printing with NFC¹
- Scanning with NFC¹
- ¹ See Basic User's Guide: How to print and scan with NFC (Near Field Communication) (MFC-J870DW and MFC-J875DW).

NOTE

- To print the faxes in memory, you must turn off Memory Security.
- You must turn off PC Fax Receive before you can turn on Memory Security.
- If you forget the Memory Security password, call Brother Customer Service. (See Basic User's Guide: *Brother numbers*.)

Setting and changing the Memory Security password

NOTE

If you have already set the password, you will not need to set it again.

Setting a password for the first time

Make a careful note of your password.

- Press III (Settings).
 Press All Settings.
 Press ▲ or ▼ to display Fax.
 Press Fax.
- 5 Press ▲ or ▼ to display Miscellaneous.
- 6 Press Miscellaneous.
- **Press** Memory Security.
- 8 Enter a 4-digit number for the password using the keyboard on the Touchscreen. Press OK.
- 9 When the Touchscreen shows Verify, re-enter the password using the keyboard on the Touchscreen. Press OK.



Changing your Memory Security password

1 Press 🎁 (Settings).

- 2 Press All Settings.
- 3 Press **▲** or **▼** to display Fax.
- 4 Press Fax.
- 5 Press ▲ or ▼ to display Miscellaneous.
- 6 **Press** Miscellaneous.
- **7 Press** Memory Security.
- 8 Press Set Password.
- Enter the registered 4-digit number for the current password using the keyboard on the Touchscreen.
 Press OK.
- Enter a 4-digit number for a new password using the keyboard on the Touchscreen. Press OK.
- 1 When the Touchscreen shows Verify, re-enter the new password using the keyboard on the Touchscreen. Press OK.



Turning Memory Security on/off

Turning on Memory Security

1	Press (Settings).
2	Press All Settings.
3	Press ▲ or ▼ to display Fax.
4	Press Fax.
5	Press ▲ or V to display Miscellaneous.
6	Press Miscellaneous.
7	Press Memory Security.
8	Press Set Security.
9	Enter the registered 4-digit password using the keyboard on the Touchscreen. Press OK. The machine goes offline and the Touchscreen shows Memory Security.

NOTE

If there is a power failure the data will stay in memory for approximately 24 hours.

Turning off Memory Security

Press Unlock.

2 Enter the registered 4-digit password using the keyboard on the Touchscreen. Press OK. Memory Security is turned off.

NOTE

If you enter the wrong password, the Touchscreen shows Wrong Password and stays offline. The machine will stay in Secure mode until the registered password is entered. 3

Additional sending options


Sending faxes using multiple settings

When you send a fax, you can choose a combination of settings, such as Fax Resolution, Contrast, Glass Scan Size, and Real Time TX.

You can also choose: Call History, Address Book, Broadcasting, Preview¹, Color Setting, Delayed Fax, Batch TX, Polled TX, Polling RX, Overseas Mode, Set New Default, **and** Factory Reset.

¹ MFC-J870DW and MFC-J875DW only

Some settings are only available when sending black & white faxes.



(MFC-J650DW)

Press (Fax).

(MFC-J870DW and MFC-J875DW) Do one of the following:

■ When Fax Preview is set to Off,



When Fax Preview is set to On, press

(Fax) and

(Sending Faxes).

The Touchscreen shows:



- **3 Press** Options.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to display the setting you want to change. When the setting is displayed, press it.
- 5 Press the option you want to set.
- 6 Repeat steps 4 and 5 to change additional settings.
- Press OK when you are finished changing settings.
- 8 Enter the fax number.
- 9 Press Fax Start.

NOTE

- Most settings are temporary and the machine returns to its default settings after you send a fax.
- You can save some of the settings you use most often by setting them as the default settings. These settings will stay until you change them again. (See Setting your changes as the new default on page 11.)
- You can also save some of the settings you use most often by setting them as a Shortcut. (See *Saving fax options as a Shortcut* on page 12.)

Stop faxing

To stop faxing, press X.

Contrast

If your document is very light or very dark, you may want to change the contrast. For most documents, the factory setting Auto can be used. Auto chooses the suitable contrast for your document.

Choose Light when sending a light document. Choose Dark when sending a dark document.



- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to display Contrast.
- 5 Press Contrast.
- 6 Press Auto, Light or Dark.
- 7 Press OK.
- 8 Enter the fax number.
- 9 Press Fax Start.

NOTE

Even if you choose Light or Dark, the machine will send the fax using the Auto setting in any of the following conditions:

- When you send a color fax.
- When you choose Photo as the Fax Resolution.

Changing fax resolution

The quality of a fax can be improved by changing the fax resolution.

Load your document.
 (MFC-J650DW)
 Press (Fax).

(MFC-J870DW and MFC-J875DW) Do one of the following:

■ When Fax Preview is set to Off,

press [[Fax).

- When Fax Preview is set to On, press
 - (Fax) and (Sending Faxes).

Press Options.

- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to display Fax Resolution.
- 5 Press Fax Resolution.

6 Press ▲ or ▼ to display Standard, Fine, S.Fine or Photo, and then press the option you want.

- 7 Press OK.
- 8 Enter the fax number.
- 9 Press Fax Start.

NOTE

You can choose four different resolution settings for black & white faxes and two for color faxes.

Black & White

Standard	Suitable for most typed documents.
Fine	Good for small print and transmits a little slower than Standard resolution.
S.Fine	Good for small print or artwork and transmits slower than Fine resolution.
Photo	Use when the document has varying shades of gray or is a photograph. Photo has the slowest transmission.

Color	
Standard	Suitable for most typed documents.
Fine	Use when the document is a photograph. The transmission time is slower than Standard resolution.

If you choose S. Fine or Photo and then send a color fax (choosing Color in Color Setting), the machine will send the fax using the Fine setting.

Setting your changes as the new default

You can store the fax options you use frequently for Fax Resolution, Contrast, Glass Scan Size, Preview¹, Real Time TX and Color Setting by saving them as the default settings. These settings will stay until

you change them again.







Repeat this step for each setting you want to change.

4 After changing the last setting to your preferred option, press ▲ or ▼ to display Set New Default.



6 The Touchscreen asks you to confirm the change to the new default settings. Press Yes to confirm.



Restoring fax options to the factory settings

You can restore all the fax options you have changed back to the factory settings. These settings will stay until you change them again.





Additional sending operations

Sending a fax manually

Manual transmission lets you hear the dialing, ringing and fax-receiving tones while sending a fax.

NOTE

To send a multi-page fax, use the ADF.

Load your document.

(MFC-J650DW)

Press 📠 (Fax).



3 To listen for a dial tone, press Hook.

Dial the fax number.


5 When you hear the fax tones, press Fax Start. If you are using the scanner glass, press

Send on the Touchscreen to send the fax.

Sending a fax at the end of a conversation

At the end of a conversation, you can send a fax to the other party before you both hang up.



- 2 Load your document.
- 3 Press Fax Start. If you are using the scanner glass, press Send to send the fax.
- Replace the handset of the external phone.

Dual Access (Black & White only)

You can dial a number and start scanning the fax into memory-even when the machine is sending from memory, receiving faxes or printing PC data. The Touchscreen shows the new job number.

The number of pages you can scan into the memory will vary depending on the data that is printed on them.

NOTE

If the Out of Memory message

appears, press X to cancel or Send Now to send the pages scanned so far.

Broadcasting (Black & White only)

Broadcasting is automatically sending the same fax message to more than one fax number. You can include Groups, Address Book numbers, and up to 50 manually dialed numbers in the same broadcast.

After the broadcast is finished, a Broadcast Report will be printed.

Before you begin the broadcast

Address Book numbers must be stored in the machine's memory before they can be used in a broadcast. (See Basic User's Guide: Storing Address Book numbers.)

Group numbers must also be stored in the machine's memory before they can be used in a broadcast. Group numbers include many stored Address Book numbers for easier dialing. (See Setting up Groups for Broadcasting on page 38.)

How to broadcast a fax

- Load your document.
- (MFC-J650DW)

Press / (Fax).

(MFC-J870DW and MFC-J875DW) Do one of the following:

■ When Fax Preview is set to Off,

press (Fax).

When Fax Preview is set to On, press



(Fax) and



(Sending Faxes).

3 Press Options.

- **Press** ▲ or ▼ to display Broadcasting.
- **Press** Broadcasting.



6 Press Add Number.

You can add numbers to the broadcast in the following ways:

Press Add Number and enter a number using the keyboard on the Touchscreen.

Press OK.

Press Add from Address book. Press ▲ or ▼ to display the number you want to add to the broadcast. Press the check boxes of the numbers you want to add to the broadcast.

After you have checked all the numbers you want, press OK.

Press

Search in Address book. Enter the first letter of the name and press OK.

Press the name, and then press the number you want to add to the broadcast.

8 After you have entered all the fax numbers by repeating steps 6 and 7, press OK.



Press Fax Start.

NOTE

Broadcasting is not available when you select Color in Color Setting.

Faxing from the ADF

The machine starts scanning and sending the document.

Faxing from the scanner glass

When the Touchscreen asks you Next page?, do one of the following:

■ To send a single page, press No.

The machine starts sending the document.

To send more than one page, press Yes and place the next page on the scanner glass.

Press OK.

The machine starts scanning the page. (Repeat this step for each page.)

NOTE

- If you did not use up any of the numbers for Groups, you can broadcast faxes to as many as 250 different numbers.
- The machine's available memory will vary depending on the types of jobs in the memory and the numbers used for broadcasting. If you broadcast to the maximum number available, you will not be able to use dual access and delayed fax.
- If the Out of Memory message appears, press X to cancel or Send Now to send the pages scanned so far.

Canceling a Broadcast in progress

- 1 Press 🗙
 - Do one of the following:
 - To cancel the entire broadcast, press Entire Broadcast. Go to step 3.
 - To cancel the current job, press the number being dialed on the Touchscreen. Go to step 4.
 - To exit without canceling, press X.
- When the Touchscreen asks if you want to cancel the entire broadcast, do one of the following:
 - Press Yes to confirm.
 - To exit without canceling, press No.
- 4 Do one of the following:
 - To cancel the current job, press Yes.
 - To exit without canceling, press No.

Real Time Transmission

When you are sending a fax, the machine will scan the document into the memory before sending it. Then, as soon as the telephone line is free, the machine will start dialing and sending.

Sometimes, you may want to send an important document immediately, without waiting for memory transmission. You can do this by turning on Real Time TX.

Load your document.

(MFC-J650DW)



(MFC-J870DW and MFC-J875DW) Do one of the following:

When Fax Preview is set to Off,



When Fax Preview is set to On, press



- 3 Press Options.
- **Press** ▲ or **V** to display Real Time TX.
- Press Real Time TX.
- Press On (or Off).
- Press OK.
- 8 Enter the fax number.
- Press Fax Start.

NOTE

- If you are sending a color fax or if the memory is full and you are sending a black & white fax from the ADF, the machine will send the document in real time (even if Real Time TX is set to Off).
- In Real Time Transmission, the automatic redial feature does not work when you are using the scanner glass.

Delayed Faxing

(Black & White only)


You can store up to 50 faxes in the memory

to be sent within 24 hours. These faxes will

be sent at the time of day you enter in step (9).

Overseas Mode

If you are having difficulty sending a fax overseas due to possible interference on the telephone line, we recommend that you turn on Overseas Mode. After you send a fax using this feature, the feature will turn itself off.



- 9 To enter the time you want the fax to be sent, do one of the following:
 - If you have set 12h Clock as the format in the Clock Type setting, enter the time (in 12-hour format) using the keyboard on the Touchscreen, and then press AM or PM.

Press OK.

If you have set 24h Clock in the Clock Type setting, enter the time (in 24-hour format) using the keyboard on the Touchscreen.

Press OK.

(For example, enter 19:45 for 7:45 PM.)

NOTE

The number of pages you can scan into the memory depends on the amount of data that is printed on each page.



Enter the fax number.


2 Press Fax Start.

NOTE

Delayed Fax is not available when you select Color in Color Setting.

Delayed Batch Transmission (Black & White only)

Before sending the delayed faxes, your machine will help you economize by sorting all the faxes in the memory by destination and scheduled time. All delayed faxes that are scheduled to be sent at the same time to the same fax number will be sent as one fax to save transmission time.



Press (Fax).

(MFC-J870DW and MFC-J875DW) Do one of the following:





Checking and canceling waiting jobs

You can check which jobs are still waiting in the memory to be sent and cancel a job. (If there are no jobs, the Touchscreen shows No Jobs Waiting.)



Polling overview

Polling lets you set up your machine so other people can receive faxes from you, but they pay for the call. It also lets you call somebody else's fax machine and receive a fax from it, so you pay for the call. The polling feature needs to be set up on both machines for this to work. Not all fax machines support polling.

Polled Transmit (Black & White only)

Polled transmit lets you set up your machine to wait with a document so another fax machine can call and retrieve it.

The document will be stored and can be retrieved by any other fax machine until you delete it from the memory. (See Checking and canceling waiting jobs on page 19.)





Receiving a fax

Memory Receive (Black & White only)

Memory Receive lets you receive faxes while you are away from the machine.

You can only use one Memory Receive operation at a time:

- Fax Forwarding
- Paging
- Fax Storage
- PC-Fax Receive
- Off

You can change your selection at any time. If received faxes are still in the machine's memory when you change the Memory Receive operation, a message will appear on the Touchscreen. (See *Changing Memory Receive operations* on page 25.)

Fax Forwarding

When you choose Fax Forward, your machine stores the received fax in the memory. The machine will then dial the fax number you have programmed and forward the fax message.

- **Press** Fax Forward.
- 1 Enter the forwarding number (up to 20 digits) using the keyboard on the Touchscreen. Press OK.

Press Backup Print: On or Backup Print: Off. (MFC-J870DW and MFC-J875DW) If Fax Preview is set to Off, press Backup Print: On or Backup Print: Off.

IMPORTANT

- If you choose Backup Print: On, the machine will also print the fax at your machine so you will have a copy. This is a safety feature in case there is a power failure before the fax is forwarded or a problem at the receiving machine.
- When you receive a color fax, your machine prints the color fax but does not forward the fax to the fax forwarding number you programmed.

Paging

When you choose Paging, your machine dials the cell phone or pager number you have programmed. This activates your cell phone or pager so you will know that you have a fax message in the memory.


If you have set Paging, a backup copy of the received fax will be printed at the machine.

- When you print a fax from the memory, the fax data will be erased.

PC-Fax Receive (Windows[®])

If you turn on the PC-Fax Receive feature, your machine will store received faxes in the memory and send them to your PC. You can then use your PC to view and store these faxes.

Even if you have turned off your PC (at night or on the weekend, for example), your machine will receive and store your faxes in its memory.

When you start your PC and the PC-FAX Receiving software runs, your machine transfers your faxes to your PC.



Remote Retrieval

You can call your machine from any touch-tone telephone or fax machine and then use the Remote Access Code and remote commands to retrieve fax messages.

Setting a Remote Access Code

The Remote Access Code lets you access the remote retrieval features when you are away from your machine. Before you can use the remote access and retrieval features, you have to set up your own code. The factory default code is the inactive code (---*).



Do not use the same code as your Fax Receive Code (* **5 1**) or Telephone Answer Code (**# 5 1**). (See Basic User's Guide: Using external and extension telephones.)

Using your Remote Access Code

Retrieving fax messages

As soon as the paper tray becomes empty during fax reception, the Touchscreen shows No Paper Fed. Put some paper in the paper tray. (See Basic User's Guide: Loading paper and other print media.)

If you don't put paper in the paper tray, the machine will carry on receiving the fax, with the remaining pages being stored in the memory, if enough memory is available.

When the memory is full, the machine will stop answering calls. To print the faxes, put fresh paper in the tray.

Printing a reduced incoming fax

If you choose On, the machine reduces each page of an incoming fax to fit on one sheet of Letter, Legal or A4 size paper. The machine calculates the reduction ratio by using the page size of the fax and your Paper Size setting.

At the end of a conversation, you can ask the other party to fax you information before you both hang up. Make sure the ADF is empty.

Polling overview

Polling lets you set up your machine so other people can receive faxes from you, but they pay for the call. It also lets you call somebody else's fax machine and receive a fax from it, so you pay for the call. The polling feature needs to be set up on both machines for this to work. Not all fax machines support polling.

Polling receive

Polling receive lets you call another fax machine to receive a fax.

(MFC-J870DW and MFC-J875DW)

Press # on the machine's Touchpanel. Any digits dialed after this will send tone signals.

When you are finished with the call, the machine will return to the Pulse dialing service.

Fax/Tel mode

When the machine is in Fax/Tel mode, it will use the F/T Ring (pseudo/double-ringing) to alert you to pick up a voice call.

If you are at the extension telephone, you'll need to lift the handset during the F/T Ring and then press # 5 1 between the pseudo/double-rings. If no one is on the line, or if someone wants to send you a fax, send the call back to the machine by pressing *** 5 1**.

If you are at the machine, lift the external telephone's handset, and then press Pickup to answer.

Caller ID

The Caller ID feature lets you use the Caller ID subscriber service offered by many local telephone companies. This service shows the telephone number or name (if available) of your caller as the line rings. Call your telephone company for details.

Once you answer a call, the Caller ID information disappears from the Touchscreen, but the call information stays stored in the Caller ID memory.

You can view the list or choose one of these numbers to fax to, add to Address Book, or delete from the history. (See Caller ID history on page 35.)

- You can see the number (or name).
- The # Unavailable message means the call originated outside your Caller ID service area.
- The Private Call message means the caller has intentionally blocked transmission of Caller ID information.


You can print a list of the Caller ID information received by your machine. (See How to print a report on page 41.)

NOTE

- This feature may not be available in certain areas of the USA and Canada.
- The Caller ID service varies with different carriers. Call your local telephone company to find out about the kind of service available in your area.

Setting up your area code (USA only)

When returning calls from the Caller ID history, your machine will dial "1" plus the area code for all calls. If your local dialing plan requires that "1" not be dialed for calls within your area code, enter your area code in this setting. With the area code setting, calls returned from the Caller ID history to numbers within your area code will be dialed using 10 digits (area code + 7-digit number). If your dialing plan does not follow the standard 1 + area code + 7-digit number dialing system for calling outside your area code, you may experience problems automatically returning calls from the Caller ID history. If this is not the procedure followed by your dialing plan, you will not be able to automatically return calls.



Special line considerations

Roll-over telephone lines

A roll-over telephone system is a group of two or more separate telephone lines that pass incoming calls to each other if they are busy. The calls are usually passed down or "rolled over" to the next available telephone line in a preset order.

Your machine can work in a roll-over system as long as it is the last number in the sequence so the call cannot roll away. Do not put the machine on any of the other numbers; when the other lines are busy and a second fax call is received, the fax call will be sent to a line that does not have a fax machine. **Your machine will work best on a dedicated line**.

Two-line telephone system

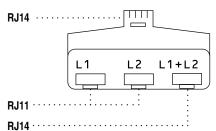
A two-line telephone system is nothing more than two separate telephone numbers on the same wall outlet. The two telephone numbers can be on separate jacks (RJ11) or mixed into one jack (RJ14). Your machine must be plugged into an RJ11 jack. RJ11 and RJ14 jacks may be equal in size and appearance and both may contain four wires (black, red, green and yellow). To test the type of jack, plug in a two-line telephone and see if it can access both lines. If it can, you must separate the line for your machine.

Converting telephone wall outlets

There are three ways to convert to an RJ11 jack. The first two ways may require help from the telephone company. You can change the wall outlets from one RJ14 jack to two RJ11 jacks. Or, you can have an RJ11 wall outlet installed and slave or jump one of the telephone numbers to it.

The third way is the easiest: Buy a triplex adapter. You can plug a triplex adapter into an RJ14 outlet. It separates the wires into two separate RJ11 jacks (Line 1, Line 2) and a third RJ14 jack (Lines 1 and 2). If your machine is on Line 1, plug the machine into L1 of the triplex adapter. If your machine is on Line 2, plug it into L2 of the triplex adapter.

Triplex Adapter



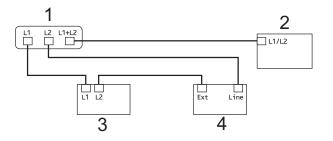
Installing machine, external two-line TAD and two-line telephone

When you are installing an external two-line telephone answering device (TAD) and a two-line telephone, your machine must be isolated on one line at both the wall jack and at the TAD. The most common connection is to put the machine on Line 2, which is explained in the following steps. The back of the two-line TAD must have two telephone jacks: one labeled L1 or L1/L2, and the other labeled L2. You will need at least three telephone line cords: the one that came with your machine and two for your external two-line TAD. You will need a fourth line cord if you add a two-line telephone.



Put the two-line TAD and the two-line telephone next to your machine.

- 2 Plug one end of the telephone line cord for your machine into the L2 jack of the triplex adapter. Plug the other end into the LINE jack inside the machine.
- 3 Plug one end of the first telephone line cord for your TAD into the L1 jack of the triplex adapter. Plug the other end into the L1 or L1/L2 jack of the two-line TAD.
- 4 Plug one end of the second telephone line cord for your TAD into the L2 jack of the two-line TAD. Plug the other end into the EXT. jack inside the machine.




- 1 Triplex Adapter

Your additional two-line telephones on other wall outlets do not require adapters. There are two ways to add a two-line telephone to the machine's wall outlet. You can plug the telephone line cord from the two-line telephone into the L1+L2 jack of the triplex adapter. Or, you can plug the two-line telephone into the TEL jack of the two-line TAD.

Additional dialing operations

Outgoing Call history

The last 30 numbers you sent a fax to will be stored in the Outgoing Call history. You can choose one of these numbers to fax to, add to Address Book, or delete from the history.



Press Yes to confirm.



Caller ID history

This feature requires the Caller ID subscriber service offered by many local telephone companies. (See *Caller ID* on page 32.)

The numbers or names (if available) from the last 30 faxes and telephone calls you received will be stored in the Caller ID history. You can view the list or choose one of these numbers to fax to, add to the Address Book, or delete from the history. When the thirty-first call comes into the machine, it replaces information about the first call.

NOTE

If you are not a Caller ID subscriber, Caller ID history only allows you to view and delete the dates of calls.

- 1 Press 📠 (Fax).
- 2 Press 🛞 (Call History).
- **3 Press** Caller ID history.
- Press the number or the name you want.
- 5 Do one of the following:
 - To send a fax, press Apply.

Press Fax Start.

If you want to store the number, press Edit and then press Add to Address Book.

(See Storing Address Book numbers from the Caller ID history on page 37.)

If you want to delete the number from the Caller ID history list, press Edit and then press Delete.

- (USA only) If you redial from the Caller ID history outside your area code, you must set up your AREA CODE in advance. (See Setting up your area code (USA only) on page 33.)


Dialing access codes and credit card numbers


Sometimes, you may want to choose from several long-distance carriers when you send a fax. Rates may vary depending on the time and destination. To take advantage of low rates, you can store the access codes of longdistance carriers and credit card numbers as Address Book numbers. (See Basic User's Guide: *Storing Address Book numbers*.)

You can store these long dialing sequences by dividing them and setting them up as separate Address Book numbers in any combination.

You can even include manual dialing using the dial pad.

For example, you might have stored '555' on Address Book: Brother 1 and '7000' on Address Book: Brother 2. You can use them both to dial '555-7000' as shown in the following example:





- **7** Press ▲ or ▼ to display Address Book.
- 8 Press Address Book.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to display the number of Brother 2.
- Press the number.
- **1** Press Apply.

12 Press Fax Start. You will dial '555-7000'.

To temporarily change a number, you can substitute part of the number with manual dialing using the dial pad. For example, to change the number to 555-7001, you could enter the number (Brother 1: 555) using

(Address Book), press Apply, and

then press 7001 using the dial pad.

NOTE

If you must wait for another dial tone or signal at any point in the dialing sequence, create a pause in the number by pressing Pause. Each key press adds a 3.5-second delay. You can press Pause as many times as needed to increase the length of the pause.

Additional ways to store numbers

Storing Address Book numbers from the Outgoing Call history

You can also store Address Book numbers from the Outgoing Call history.

- The image file extension must be .JPG (other image file extensions like .JPEG, .TIF, .GIF and so on will not be recognized).
- Direct PhotoCapture Center[™] printing must be performed separately from PhotoCapture Center[™] operations using the PC. (Simultaneous operation is not available.)
- The machine can read up to 999 files ¹ on a memory card or USB Flash drive.
 - ¹ The folder inside memory cards or USB Flash drive is also counted.
- The DPOF file on the memory cards must be in a valid DPOF format. (See DPOF printing on page 61.)

Please be aware of the following:

- When printing an index or image, the PhotoCapture Center[™] will print all the valid images, even if one or more images have been corrupted. Corrupted images will not be printed.
- (memory card users)

Your machine is designed to read memory cards that have been formatted by a digital camera.

When a digital camera formats a memory card, it creates a special folder into which it copies image data. If you need to modify the image data stored on a memory card with your PC, we recommend that you do not modify the folder structure created by the digital camera. When saving new or modified image files to the memory card, we also recommend you use the same folder your digital camera uses. If the data is not saved to the same folder, the machine may not be able to read the file or print the image.

(USB Flash drive users)

This machine supports a USB Flash drive that have been formatted by Windows[®].

Movie printing

You can print images from movie files that are stored on a memory card or USB Flash drive.

A movie file is automatically divided into 9 parts by movie recording times and is placed in 3 lines. You can then see and print the scenes that have been divided.


NOTE

- You cannot choose a particular movie scene.
- You can use AVI or MOV movie file formats (Motion JPEG only). However, if an AVI file size is 1 GB or more (the shooting time is about 30 minutes) or a MOV file size is 2 GB or more (the shooting time is about 60 minutes), these files cannot be printed.
- If the data for a divided scene is corrupted, the part for that scene will be blank.

Print Images

Print Index (Thumbnails)

The PhotoCapture Center™ assigns numbers for images (such as No.1, No.2, No.3, and so on).



The PhotoCapture Center[™] does not recognize any other numbers or file names that your digital camera or computer has used to identify the pictures. You can print a thumbnail page. This will show all the pictures on the memory card or USB Flash drive.





When a memory card (Memory Stick Duo[™], Memory Stick PRO Duo[™], SD Memory Card, SDHC Memory Card, SDXC Memory Card, MultiMedia Card or MultiMedia Card plus) containing DPOF information is put into your machine, you can print the chosen image easily.

Printing photos from a camera

Printing photos directly from a PictBridge camera



Your Brother machine supports the PictBridge standard, allowing you to connect to and print photos directly from any PictBridge compatible digital camera.

If your camera is using the USB Mass Storage standard, you can also print photos from a digital camera without PictBridge. (See *Printing photos directly from a digital camera (without PictBridge)* on page 74.)

PictBridge requirements

To avoid errors, remember the following points:

- The machine and the digital camera must be connected using a suitable USB cable.
- The image file extension must be .JPG (other image file extensions like .JPEG, .TIF, .GIF and so on will not be recognized).
- PhotoCapture Center[™] operations are not available when using the PictBridge feature.

Make sure your camera is in PictBridge mode. The following PictBridge settings may be available from the LCD of your PictBridge compatible camera.


NOTE

Remove any memory card or USB Flash drive from the machine before connecting a digital camera.



Open the media slot cover.

Make sure that your camera is turned off. Connect your camera to the USB direct interface (1) on the machine using the USB cable.

3 Turn on the camera. When the machine has recognized the camera, the Touchscreen shows Camera is connected.

Choose the photo you want to print following the instructions from your camera.

When the machine starts printing a photo, the Touchscreen will show Printing.

IMPORTANT

To prevent damage to your machine, do not connect any device other than a digital camera or USB Flash drive to the USB direct interface.

DPOF printing

DPOF stands for Digital Print Order Format.

Major digital camera manufacturers (Canon Inc., Eastman Kodak Company, FUJIFILM Corporation, Panasonic Corporation and Sony Corporation) created this standard to make it easier to print images from a digital camera.

If your digital camera supports DPOF printing, you can choose the images and number of copies you want to print from the camera's display.

NOTE

An Invalid DPOF File error can occur if the print order that was created on the camera has been corrupted. Delete and recreate the print order using your camera to correct this problem. For instructions on how to delete or recreate the print order, refer to your camera manufacturer's support website or accompanying documentation.

Printing photos directly from a digital camera (without PictBridge)

If your camera is using the USB Mass Storage standard, you can connect your camera in storage mode. This enables you to print photos from your camera.

(If you would like to print photos in PictBridge mode, see *Printing photos directly from a PictBridge camera* on page 72.)

NOTE




Cleaning and checking the machine

Cleaning the outside of the machine

Clean the Touchscreen as follows:

IMPORTANT


- Press and hold down (b) to turn the machine off. The Touchscreen will show Shutting Down for a few seconds before the power goes off.
- DO NOT use any type of liquid cleaners (including ethanol).
- Clean the Touchscreen with a *dry*, soft lint-free cloth.



Clean the outside of the machine as follows:


IMPORTANT

- Use neutral detergents. Cleaning with volatile liquids, such as thinner or benzine will damage the outside surface of the machine.
- DO NOT use cleaning materials that contain ammonia.
- DO NOT use isopropyl alcohol to remove dirt from the control panel. It may crack the panel.
- Pull the paper tray (1) completely out of the machine.






Wipe the outside of the machine with a *dry*, soft lint-free cloth to remove dust.



Lift the output paper tray cover and remove anything that is stuck inside the paper tray.

Wipe the inside and outside of the paper tray with a *dry*, soft lint-free cloth to remove dust.



5 Close the output paper tray cover and put the paper tray firmly back in the machine.


Cleaning the machine's printer platen

A WARNING



Be sure to unplug the machine from the AC power outlet before cleaning the printer platen to avoid an electrical shock.

Place both hands under the plastic tabs on both sides of the machine to lift the scanner cover into the open position. Clean the machine's printer platen (1) and the area around it, wiping off any scattered ink with a *dry*, soft lint-free cloth.




IMPORTANT

DO NOT touch the encoder strip (2). Doing this may cause damage to the machine.


Lift the scanner cover to release the lock. Gently push the scanner cover support down and close the scanner cover using both hands.



Cleaning the paper feed rollers

If the paper feed rollers are stained with ink, it may cause paper feed problems.

 Unplug the machine from the AC power outlet. Pull the paper tray (1) completely out of the machine.




NOTE


If the paper support flap is open, close it, and then close the paper support.

2 Clean the front side of the Paper Feed Rollers (1) with a soft lint-free cloth moistened with water, using a side-to-side motion.

After cleaning, wipe the rollers with a *dry*, soft lint-free cloth to remove all moisture.



3 Lift the Jam Clear Flap (2), and then clean the back side of the Paper Feed Rollers (1) with a soft lint-free cloth moistened with water. After cleaning, wipe the rollers with a *dry*, soft lint-free cloth to remove all moisture.



- 4 Put the paper tray firmly back in the machine.
- 5 Re-connect the power cord.

NOTE

Do not use the machine again until the rollers are dry. Using the machine before the rollers are dry may cause paper feed problems.


Cleaning the paper pick-up rollers

- 1 Unplug the machine from the AC power outlet.
 - Pull the paper tray completely out of the machine.


NOTE

If the machine has been feeding multiple pages when there are only a few sheets of paper left in the tray, clean the Base Pad (1) with a soft lint-free cloth moistened with water.

After cleaning, wipe the pad with a *dry*, soft lint-free cloth to remove all moisture.




3 Open the Jam Clear Cover (1) at the back of the machine.



Clean the Paper Pick-up Rollers (1) with a soft lint-free cloth moistened with water.

Slowly turn the rollers so that the whole surface is cleaned.

After cleaning, wipe the rollers with a *dry*, soft lint-free cloth to remove all moisture.



- 5 Close the Jam Clear Cover. Make sure the cover is closed completely.
- 6 Put the paper tray firmly back in the machine.
- 7 Re-connect the power cord.

Checking the ink volume

Although an ink volume icon appears on the Touchscreen, you can use the ink menu to see a large graph showing the ink that is left in each cartridge.




You can also press (Settings) and Ink.



Press Ink Volume.

The Touchscreen shows the ink volume.



NOTE

When the ink cartridge is near the end of life or having a problem, one of the following icons is displayed.

Packing and shipping the machine

When you transport the machine, use the packing materials that came with your machine. If you do not pack the machine correctly, any damage that may occur in transit may not be covered by your warranty.


The machine should be adequately insured with the carrier.

IMPORTANT

It is important to allow the machine to "park" the print head after a print job. Listen carefully to the machine before unplugging it to make sure that all mechanical noises have stopped. Not allowing the machine to finish this parking process may lead to print problems and possible damage to the print head.

- Unplug the machine from the AC power outlet.
- Place both hands under the plastic tabs on both sides of the machine to lift the scanner cover into the open position. Then unplug the machine from the telephone wall jack and take the telephone line cord out of the machine.
- 3 Unplug the interface cable from the machine, if it is connected.

Lift the scanner cover (1) to release the lock. Gently push the scanner cover support down (2) and close the scanner cover (3) using both hands.




A CAUTION

Be careful not to pinch your fingers when the scanner cover closes.

- 5 Open the ink cartridge cover.
- 6 Press the ink release levers to release the ink cartridges, and then take out the ink cartridges. (See Basic User's Guide: *Replacing the ink cartridges*.)





Install the orange protective part, and then close the ink cartridge cover.


· Make sure the plastic tab on the left side of the orange protective part (1) locks securely into place (2).





- · If you are not able to find the orange protective part, ship the machine without it. DO NOT install the ink cartridges as an alternative before shipping.
- 8 (MFC-J870DW and MFC-J875DW) Open the document cover and make sure the Disc Tray is in its storage space, and then close the document cover.

Wrap the machine in the bag.







10 Pack the machine and the printed materials in the original carton with the original packing material as shown in the illustration. Do not pack the used ink cartridges in

the carton.

NOTE

If you are returning your machine to Brother as part of the Exchange Service, pack only the machine. Keep all separate parts and printed materials to use with your "Exchange" machine.





Glossary

This is a comprehensive list of features and terms that appear in Brother manuals. Availability of these features depends on the model you purchased.

2.7" Touchscreen LCD and Touchpanel

The Touchscreen LCD (Liquid Crystal Display) on the machine shows interactive messages and prompts for using the machine. You can operate the Touchscreen by pressing or swiping on the screen.

The Touchpanel, on the right side of the Touchscreen LCD, illuminates its LEDs when they are available for the current operation.

Address Book

Names and numbers you have stored for easy dialing.

Address Book List

A listing of names and numbers stored in the Address Book memory, in alphabetical order.

ADF (automatic document feeder)

The document can be placed in the ADF and scanned one page at a time automatically.

Auto Reduction

Reduces the size of incoming faxes.

Automatic Redial

A feature that enables your machine to redial the last fax number after five minutes if the fax did not go through because the line was busy.

Backup Print

Your machine prints a copy of every fax that is received and stored in its memory. This is a safety feature so you will not lose messages during a power failure.

Batch Transmission

(Black & white faxes only) As a cost-saving feature, all delayed faxes to the same fax number can be sent as one transmission.

Beep Volume

Volume setting for the beep when you press the Touchscreen or Touchpanel, make an error.

Brightness

Changing the Brightness makes the whole image lighter or darker.

Broadcasting

The ability to send the same fax message to more than one location.

Caller ID

A service purchased from the telephone company that lets you see the number (or name) of the party calling you.

CNG tones

The special tones (beeps) sent by fax machines during automatic transmission to tell the receiving machine that a fax machine is calling.

Coding method

Method of coding the information contained in the document. All fax machines must use a minimum standard of Modified Huffman (MH). Your machine is capable of greater compression methods, Modified Read (MR), Modified Modified Read (MMR) and JPEG, if the receiving machine has the same capability.

Color Enhancement

Adjusts the color in the image for better print quality by improving sharpness, white balance and color density.

Communication error (Comm. Error)

An error during fax sending or receiving, usually caused by line noise or static.

Compatibility group

The ability of one fax unit to communicate with another. Compatibility is assured between ITU-T Groups.

Contrast

Setting to compensate for dark or light documents, by making faxes or copies of dark documents lighter and light documents darker.

Delayed Fax

Sends your fax at a specified time later.

Density

Changing the Density makes the whole image lighter or darker.

Distinctive Ring

A subscriber service purchased from the telephone company that gives you another telephone number on an existing telephone line. The Brother machine uses the new number to simulate a dedicated fax line.

Dual Access

Your machine can scan outgoing faxes or scheduled jobs into the memory at the same time it is sending a fax from memory, receiving or printing an incoming fax.

Easy Receive

Enables your machine to respond to CNG tones if you interrupt a fax call by answering it.

ECM (Error Correction Mode)

Detects errors during fax transmission and resends the pages of the fax that had an error.

Extension telephone

A telephone using the same line as your fax but plugged into a separate wall jack.

External telephone

A telephone that is plugged into the EXT. jack of your machine.

F/T Ring Time

The length of time that the Brother machine rings (when the Receive Mode setting is Fax/Tel) to notify you to pick up a voice call that it answered.

Fax Forwarding

Sends a fax received into the memory to another pre-programmed fax number.

Fax Journal

Lists information about the last 200 incoming and outgoing faxes. TX means Transmit. RX means Receive.

Fax Receive Code

Press this code (* **5 1**) when you answer a fax call on an extension or external telephone.

Fax Storage

You can store received faxes in memory.

Fax tones

The signals sent by sending and receiving fax machines while communicating information.

Fax/Tel

You can receive faxes and telephone calls. Do not use this mode if you are using a telephone answering device (TAD).

Fine resolution

Resolution is 203×196 dpi. It is used for small print and graphs.

Gray Scale

The shades of gray available for copying, scanning and faxing photographs.

Group number

A combination of Address Book numbers that are stored in Address Book for Broadcasting.

Innobella™

Innobella[™] is a range of genuine consumables offered by Brother. For best quality results, Brother recommends Innobella[™] ink and paper.

Journal Period

The pre-programmed time period between automatically printed Fax Journal reports. You can print the Fax Journal report on demand without interrupting the cycle.

Manual fax

You can press Hook to hear the receiving fax machine answer before you press Fax Start to begin sending.

Memory Receive

Receives faxes into the machine's memory when the machine is out of paper.

OCR (optical character recognition)

Nuance[™] PaperPort[™] 12SE or Presto! PageManager software application converts an image of text to text you can edit.

Overseas Mode

Makes temporary changes to the fax tones to accommodate noise and static on overseas telephone lines.

Paging

This feature enables your machine to call your cell phone or pager when a fax is received into its memory.

Pause

Allows you to place a 3.5 second delay in the dialing sequence while you are dialing using the dial pad or while you are storing Address Book numbers. Press Pause on the Touchscreen as many times as needed for longer pauses.

PhotoCapture Center™

Allows you to print digital photos from your digital camera at high resolution for photo quality printing.

Photo resolution (B&W only)

A resolution setting that uses varying shades of gray for the best representation of photographs.

PictBridge

Allows you to print photos directly from your digital camera at high resolution for photo quality printing.

Polling

The process of a fax machine calling another fax machine to retrieve waiting fax messages.

Pulse (Canada only)

A form of rotary dialing on a telephone line.

Real Time Transmission

When the memory is full, you can send faxes in real time.

Remaining jobs

You can check which jobs are waiting in memory and cancel jobs individually.

Remote Access Code

Your own four-digit code (---*) that allows you to call and access your machine from a remote location.

Remote Retrieval Access

The ability to access your machine remotely from a touch-tone telephone.

Resolution

The number of vertical and horizontal lines per inch. (See Standard resolution, Fine resolution, Super Fine resolution and Photo resolution.)

Ring Delay

The number of rings before the machine answers in Fax Only and Fax/Tel modes.

Ring Volume

Volume setting for the machine's ring.

Scanning

The process of sending an electronic image of a paper document to your computer.

Scan to Media

You can scan a black & white or color document onto a memory card or USB Flash drive. Black & white images can be in the TIFF or PDF file format and color images can be in the PDF or JPEG file format.

Search

An alphabetical electronic listing of stored Address Book and Group numbers.

Settings Tables

At-a-glance instructions that show all the settings and options that are available for setting up your machine.

Standard resolution

 203×98 dpi (black & white). 203×196 dpi (color). It is used for regular sized text and the quickest transmission.

Station ID

The stored information that appears on the top of faxed pages. It includes the sender's name and fax number.

Super Fine resolution (B&W)

203 \times 392 dpi. Best for very small print and line art.

TAD (telephone answering device)

You can connect an external telephone answering device or answering machine to the EXT. jack of your machine.

Telephone Answer Code (For Fax/Tel mode only)

When the machine answers a voice call, it pseudo/double-rings. You can pick up at an extension telephone by pressing this code (**# 5 1**).

Temporary settings

You can choose certain options for each fax transmission and copy without changing the default settings.

Tone

A form of dialing on the telephone line used for touch-tone telephones.

Transmission

The process of sending faxes over the phone lines from your machine to the receiving fax machine.

Transmission Verification Report

A listing for the last fax sent, that shows its date, time and number.

User Settings

A printed report that shows the current settings of the machine.

WLAN Report

A printed report that shows the result of the WLAN Connection.
