INSTALLATION

This Mounting Kit is to be used only for the backhoes and tractors specified in the Installation section of this manual. Any other use or modification of this mounting kit may result in serious injury or death.

Hydraulics must be connected as instructed in this manual. Do not substitute parts, modify, or connect in any other way.

After connecting hoses, check that all control lever positions function as instructed in the Operator's Manual. Do not put into service until control lever and equipment movements are correct.

TRAINING

Safety instructions are important! Read all attachment and power unit manuals; follow all safety rules and safety decal information. (Replacement manuals and safety decals are available from your dealer. To locate your nearest dealer, check the Dealer Locator at www.WoodsEquipment.com, or in the United States and Canada call 1-800-319-6637.) Failure to follow instructions or safety rules can result in serious injury or death.

If you do not understand any part of this manual and need assistance, see your dealer.

Know your controls and how to stop engine and attachment guickly in an emergency.

Keep hands and body away from pressurized lines. Use paper or cardboard, not hands or other body parts to check for leaks. Wear safety goggles. Hydraulic fluid under pressure can easily penetrate skin and will cause serious injury or death.

Make sure that all operating and service personnel know that if hydraulic fluid penetrates skin, it must be surgically removed as soon as possible by a doctor familiar with this form of injury or gangrene, serious injury, or death will result. CON-TACT A PHYSICIAN IMMEDIATELY IF FLUID ENTERS SKIN OR EYES. DO NOT DELAY.

Never allow children or untrained persons to operate equipment.

PREPARATION

Check that all hardware is properly installed. Always tighten to torgue chart specifications unless instructed otherwise in this manual.

Air in hydraulic systems can cause erratic operation and allows loads or equipment components to drop unexpectedly. When connecting equipment or hoses or performing any hydraulic maintenance, purge any air in hydraulic system by operating all hydraulic functions several times. Do this before putting into service or allowing anyone to approach the equipment.

Protective hose sleeves must cover all hydraulic hoses within 20 inches of the operator and be secured onto metal hose fittings. Replace hoses or sleeves if damaged or if protective sleeve cannot be properly positioned or secured.

Make sure all hydraulic hoses, fittings, and valves are in good condition and not leaking before starting power unit or using equipment. Check and route hoses carefully to prevent damage. Hoses must not be twisted, bent sharply, kinked, frayed, pinched, or come into contact with any moving parts. Operate moveable components through full operational range to check clearances. Replace any damaged hoses immediately.

This mounting kit is designed to provide secure mounting and adequate operator clearance when properly installed. Check clearance dimensions shown in Figure 1 to be sure you have installed mounting kit correctly. Follow all mounting instructions in this manual. Do not operate backhoe unless there is adequate clearance. Failure to check and comply with these instructions may result in serious injury or death.

■ Always wear relatively tight and belted clothing to avoid getting caught in moving parts. Wear sturdy, rough-soled work shoes and protective equipment for eyes, hair, hands, hearing, and head; and respirator or filter mask where appropriate.

■ Make sure attachment is properly secured, adjusted, and in good operating condition.

Remove seat and upper support assembly before installing or removing backhoe from tractor. Failure to comply may result in equipment failure and/or personal injury.

Always use original equipment high-strength tractor top link pin when attaching mount to tractor.

■ If tractor is equipped with draft sensing control, set control to "HEAVY" (minimum sensitivity) position.

■ Make sure all safety decals are installed. Replace if damaged. (See Safety Decals section for location.)

■ A minimum 20% of tractor and equipment weight must be on the tractor front wheels when attachments are in transport position. Without this weight, tractor could tip over, causing personal injury or death. The weight may be attained with a loader, front wheel weights, ballast in tires or front tractor weights. Weigh the tractor and equipment. Do not estimate.

OPERATION

■ Do not allow bystanders in the area when operating, attaching, removing, assembling, or servicing equipment.

■ Before operating, make sure stabilizer pads are lowered firmly to the ground. Stabilizer arms provide support for the backhoe and support for the backhoe mounting brackets.

■ Do not operate or transport equipment while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

Always comply with all state and local lighting and marking requirements.

Do not allow riders. Do not lift or carry anybody on the power unit or attachments.

■ The only time the backhoe may be operated from a position other than the operator seat is during backhoe attachment and removal. Operator must: • Read Mounting Kit Manual instructions on attaching and removing backhoe and use extreme care.

• Always stand between rear tire and backhoe stabilizer arms or along side of tractor to avoid being trapped should the boom swing control be accidentally activated.

■ Never leave equipment unattended with engine running or with bucket in raised position. Always engage swing and boom transport locks, relieve system pressure by operating controls, and remove ignition key before leaving equipment.

MAINTENANCE

■ Refer to backhoe manual and follow all maintenance safety rules and instructions.

■ Do not modify or alter or permit anyone else to modify or alter the equipment or any of its components in any way.

■ Your dealer can supply original equipment hydraulic accessories and repair parts. Substitute parts may not meet original equipment specifications and may be dangerous.

Always wear relatively tight and belted clothing to avoid getting caught in moving parts. Wear sturdy, rough-soled work shoes and protective equipment for eyes, hair, hands, hearing, and head; and respirator or filter mask where appropriate.

■ Do not allow bystanders in the area when operating, attaching, removing, assembling, or servicing equipment.

■ Make sure attachment is properly secured, adjusted, and in good operating condition.

■ Keep all persons away from operator control area while performing adjustments, service, or maintenance.

■ Before working on backhoe, extend boom and dipperstick and place bucket on ground. Make sure that all system pressure has been relieved by operating controls before performing maintenance or service or before disconnecting any hydraulic lines.


■ Tighten all bolts, nuts, and screws to torque chart specifications. Check that all cotter pins are installed securely to ensure equipment is in a safe condition before putting unit into service.

TRACTOR PREPARATION

NOTE: For installing this 3-point mounting kit, reference to right, left, forward and rearward directions are determined from the operator's position in the backhoe seat.

NOTE: Leave all hardware loose until mounting kit has been fit up.

- **1.** Refer to the WOODS BH90-X Backhoe Operator's Manual for backhoe assembly instructions.
- 2. Remove the tractor top link and top link storage bracket, if equipped.




* Operator's seat must be located in the lowest and most forward position to obtain 40" minimum radius.

Attach Rear Brackets to Backhoe

- Attach rear brackets (4 & 5) to main frame using bolts (6), hardened flat washers (16), and hex nuts (8) as shown in Figure 2.
- 2. Torque hardware to 297 lbs-ft.
 - 4. 37682 Right mount bracket
 - 5. 37683 Left mount bracket
 - 6. 13759 3/4 NC x 2-1/4 HHCS GR5
 - 8. 1450 3/4 NC Hex nut
 - 16. 57798 3/4 Hardened flat washer




Installation 5

Attach Top Link to Backhoe

- 1. Attach top link (1) to the main frame using two cap screws (7), four hardened flat washers (16), and two hex nuts (8).
- Slide double top link (2) over top link (1) and secure using two cap screws (10) and lock huts (12). See Figure 3.

NOTE: To estimate the overall length of the two top link bars; roughly measure from the center of the tractor top link bracket to the center of the lower 3-point lift arm pivot as shown in Figure 3. Final adjustment will be made when backhoe is attached to tractor.

Attach Offset Bars to Backhoe

- **3.** Attach offset bars (3) to right and left rear brackets using sleeves (15), cap screws (10), and lock nuts (12). Do not tighten nuts at this time.





Figure 4. Offset Bar Installation

- Swing offset bars up and attach it to the double top link bar using cap screw (11) and lock nut (12). See Figure 4.

Attach Backhoe to Tractor

- Back tractor up to backhoe and 3-point mount. Center between the tractor rear tires. Position tractor so that the hydraulic system can be connected. Shut off tractor, set brake, and remove key.
- **2.** Attach hydraulic pump to tractor PTO or connect hydraulic hoses.
- **3.** With transmission in neutral, start tractor engine at idle speed and engage PTO or start hydraulic flow.

NOTE: Use the backhoe hydraulics to maneuver the 3-point mount into position. Use care in this procedure to avoid being trapped between tractor and backhoe or between backhoe parts.

4. Raise backhoe with stabilizer controls and level backhoe from side to side and front to back. Set ground clearance between 20-1/2 to 22-1/2 inches. Measure from the center of boom pivot pin to the ground. See Figure 5.





Attach Backhoe to Tractor (Continued)

- 5. Place tractor 3-point lower lift arms between right and left mounting brackets on the backhoe. Secure into position using hitch pins (14), sleeves (13) if needed, and klik pin (17).
- 6. Connect double top link bar to the tractor top link bracket. Use top link pin supplied with your tractor and sleeve (9). If necessary, separate and adjust top link bars IN or OUT to maintain the backhoe vertical position. See "Tractor Connections" on page 11 for tractor top link specifications.

NOTE: Sleeve (9) is for tractors with a 1-inch top link pin.

Remove Backhoe

■ The only time the backhoe may be operated from a position other than the operator seat is during backhoe attachment and removal. Operator must

- Read Mounting Kit Manual instructions on attaching and removing backhoe and use extreme care.
- Always stand between rear tire and backhoe stabilizer arms or along side of tractor to avoid being trapped should the boom swing control be accidentally activated.
- 1. Remove the seat assembly.
- Start the tractor. Engage hydraulics at slow idle speed. Curl the bucket all the way towards the operator.
- **3.** On a hard level surface, center the boom, remove transport lock bar, and extend boom and dipperstick.
- **4.** Rest bucket on the ground and lower stabilizers to take backhoe weight off tractor.
- Remove high-strength tractor top link pin from top link.
- 6. Remove lower 3-point arms from backhoe.




Figure 7. Backhoe Storage Position (Typical)

- **7.** Place 6" blocks under backhoe mainframe and raise stabilizers to lower the backhoe onto the blocks as shown in Figure 7. Adjust blocks to make backhoe stable.
- **8.** Disengage PTO, turn off engine, set brakes, and remove key before leaving tractor seat.
- **9.** Remove the backhoe hydraulic pump from the PTO shaft or disconnect hydraulic hoses from tractor.
- **10.** Start tractor and drive the tractor away.
- **11.** Reinstall seat assembly.

Store Hydraulic Pump (If Equipped)

Store pump on back side of backhoe to prevent dirt and debris from accumulating in pump adapter.

Attach Backhoe to Tractor

A DANGER

■ This mounting kit is designed to provide secure mounting and adequate operator clearance when properly installed. Check clearance dimensions shown in Figure 1 to be sure you have installed mounting kit correctly. Follow all mounting instructions in this manual. Do not operate backhoe unless there is adequate clearance. Failure to check and comply with these instructions may result in serious injury or death.



■ Remove seat and upper support assembly before installing or removing backhoe from tractor. Failure to comply may result in equipment failure and/or personal injury.

- Back tractor up to backhoe and 3-point mount, center between the tractor rear tires. Position tractor so that the hydraulic system can be connected. Shut off tractor, set brake, remove key.
- 2. Connect hydraulic pump or hydraulic hose kit.
- **3.** With transmission in neutral, start tractor engine at idle speed and engage PTO or start hydraulic flow.

NOTE: Very little engine power is required to power hydraulic system in this mode. Should engine pull down excessively, check plumbing hook-up for reversed lines or a control lever stuck in an operating position.

Use the backhoe hydraulics to maneuver the 3point mount into position. Use care in this procedure to avoid being trapped between tractor and backhoe or between backhoe parts.

- 4. Raise the 3-point mount up by lowering stabilizers and boom section until even with tractor 3-point lift arms. Attach tractor 3-point lift arms to right and left rear brackets using hitch pins (14), sleeves (13), and klik pin (17). See page 8.
- Raise backhoe with stabilizer and boom section to establish ground clearance between 20-1/2 to 22-1/2 inches from boom pivot to ground.
- 6. Level backhoe from side to side and front to back with stabilizer control. It may not be possible to obtain the ground clearance on small tractors and also maintain minimum head clearance for tractors with ROPS and cabs. Head clearance must take priority.
- 7. Align 3-point mount top link with tractor top link attachment point using the boom section and stabilizers. Attach top link using only original equipment high-strength tractor top link pin.
- 8. Reinstall seat.
- **9.** Run at idle for 5 minutes, then check oil level. Add fluid as necessary.
- **10.** Operate all functions through full cylinder stroke to purge air from system. Check oil level again and add fluid as necessary.
- **11.** Raise stabilizers and boom section secure in transport position (see Backhoe Operator's Manual).

NOTE: Install swing lock before transporting.

Tractor Connections


There may be more than one hole provided in tractor top link attachment bracket. Select hole A, B, or C that most evenly distributes the load between top link bracket top and bottom mounting bolts. See Figure 8.

For the Massey Ferguson 1455V tractor use hole position D.

NOTE: The maximum width between tractor top link attachment plates must not exceed 2-1/2 inches. This will prevent excessive bending loads to the tractor top link pin.

For tractors with draft control, select hole closest to supporting point of floating link. Block or lock draft control so it is inoperative. Lower manual 3-point lift control to the lowest position to deactivate draft sensing control (refer to tractor manual).

- 1. Original equipment high-strength tractor top link
- 2. Safety pin
- 3. Backhoe top link
- 4. Saf-T-Lok




Seat Installation and Adjustment


Install seat and upper seat support.

The seat may be adjusted fore, aft, up, and down for operator comfort.


Moving the seat down also moves it forward; moving it up also moves it rearward. The fore and aft adjustment may be used with the up and down adjustment to obtain desired position.

Never operate backhoe unless manufacturer's 3-point hitch Saf-T-Lok limiter or sub-frame has been installed and adjusted. Operator's area (shown shaded in Figure 9) must be free from obstructions in a 36.5" to 40" radius from the seat.


