## GETTING STARTED

## Powering Your Player

Your player runs on $1 \times$ "AAA" battery for music playback.

1. Remove the battery compartment cover located on the rear of the player.
2. Insert one "AAA" battery, taking care to match the polarity of the battery with the markings on the inside of the compartment.
3. Replace the battery compartment cover.

(1)


The battery used in this device may present a fire or chemical burn hazard if mistreated. Do not disassemble, incinerate, or heat the battery.

Your player can also be powered over the USB bus when connected to a computer.

## Turning Your Player On/Off

- To turn the player on, press and hold J/MENU until you see the "COBY" screen.
- To turn the player off, press and hold J/MENU until you see the "Goodbye" screen.


## Hold Switch (Key Lock)

The Hold feature disables your player's controls to prevent accidental key presses when it is in your pocket or bag.

- To lock the player, slide the Hold switch up to the lock position. A Lock icon will appear on-screen.

- To unlock the player, slide the Hold switch down.


## GETTING STARTED

## Resetting Your Player

Reset your player if it should freeze and not respond or otherwise malfunction.

1. If the player is connected to a computer, disconnect it.
2. Remove the battery from the player. Wait 30 seconds before replacing the battery.

## Installing an SD/MMC Memory Card (optional)

You can upgrade the memory capacity of your player by adding an Secure Digital (SD) or Multimedia Card (MMC) memory card.

To install an SD/MMC card:

1. Remove the battery compartment cover located on the rear of the player.
2. Insert the SD/MMC card in the card slot, taking care to match the notch on the card with the diagram on the player.
3. Replace the battery compartment cover.

## MAIN MENU OVERVIEW

The Main Menu gives you access to the different function modes of your player.
To select a mode, press $<$ or $\geqslant$ to highlight the mode with the Selection Cursor and then press © 0 .

To return to the Main Menu, press / / MENU. To exit the Main Menu, press $\circlearrowleft$ / MENU again.


## NAV: Navigation Mode

View your media library.
MSC: Music Mode
Play your digital music files (MP3, WMA)

## FM: FM Radio Mode

Listen to FM Radio broadcasts.

## SYS: System Mode

Change the internal settings of your player.

## REC: Record Mode

Record from the integrated microphone or FM Radio.

## BASIC OPERATIONS

## Menu Interface Navigation

To select the different menu options and files on your player:

- Use the Navigation Joystick to move the selection cursor. The cursor highlights the current selection.
- To move the cursor up, press $\widehat{\wedge}$
- To move the cursor down, press $\vee$
- To move the cursor left, press
- To move the cursor right, press $\geqslant$
- To scroll quickly in any direction, press and hold the Joystick in that direction
- To confirm the highlighted selection, press the Joystick [ © ]
- To return to the previous screen or to return to the Main Menu, press $\omega$ / MENU


## Adjusting the Volume

During playback:

- Press Volume $\oplus$ to raise the volume level
- Press Volume $\Theta$ to lower the volume level.

Set the volume to the lowest level before headphone use to avoid damage to your hearing or to your headphones.

## Enter Navigation mode to view your media library.

## File Search

To search for a file in Navigation Mode:

1. Select NAV from the main menu and press © to confirm.
2. Select Music, Voice or SD/MMC Card

- Music: View MP3 and WMA music files

- SD/MMC Card: View files on the optional SD/MMC card (if installed)

3. To select a desired file or folder, press the Joystick $\propto$ or .

- Playback will commence if a compatible file is selected
- Folder contents will be displayed if a folder is selected

4. To return to a previous folder, press 1 / MENU

## MSC MODE

## Enter Music mode to play your MP3 or WMA audio files.

Music Mode will display all compatible audio files on your player regardless of directory

## Music Controls

1. Select MSC from the main menu and press © to confirm
2. To select a track for playback, press the Joystick $<$ or $\geqslant$.
3. To play a track, press the Joystick ©. During playback:

- To pause playback, press $\uparrow$; press $\triangle$ again to resume playback
- To stop playback, press $\vee$
- To play the next track press $\geqslant$
- To play the previous track, press (<).
- To fast-forward through the current track, press and hold $\geqslant$
- To reverse through the current track, press and hold © .


## A-B Repeat

Set a segment of a track to repeat in a continuous loop. During playback:

1. Press © 0 to set the starting point " $A$ " of the loop.
2. Press © again to set the end point "B" of the loop.
3. Press © again to resume normal playback.

## REC MODE

## Enter Record mode to record from the integrated microphone or FM Radio.

## Microphone (Voice) Recording

Make digital voice recordings through the integrated microphone. Recordings are saved to the folder "MICIN.DIR".

1. Press the REC key while the player is in MSC or REC mode. Recording will start immediately. During recording:

- To pause recording, press $\star$; press $\star$ again to resume recording
- To stop and save the recording, press $\vee$.

The recorded file will be named "MICXXXXX.WAV" where XXXXX corresponds to the numerical sequence in which the recording was made (numbering starts from 00001).

## FM Radio Recording

Make digital recordings of FM radio broadcasts. Recordings are saved to the folder "FMIN.DIR".

1. Tune to the broadcast you wish to record in FM mode.
2. Press the REC key. Recording will start immediately. During recording:.

- To pause recording, press $\boldsymbol{\wedge}$; press $\star$ again to resume recording
- To stop and save the recording, press $\vee$.

The recorded file will be named "FMXXXXX.WAV" where XXXXX corresponds to the numerical sequence in which the recording was made (numbering starts from 00001).

## FM MODE

## Enter FM Radio mode to listen to FM Radio broadcasts.

AEarphones (or headphones) must be connected to the player's Headphone jack for Radio operation for use as an antenna.

## FM Radio Controls

Listen to FM Radio broadcasts.

- Select FM from the main menu and press © to confirm
- To tune to a station, press the Joystick © or $\geqslant$.
- To auto-seek the next available broadcast station, press and hold $<$ or $\geqslant$.
- To switch to Preset Tuning, press ©6. A Select Preset indicator will appear on screen.


## Automatic Station Preset

Press and hold the REC key to automatically scan and save all available FM stations to Preset Memory. There are 31 available preset stations.

Automatic Station Preset will overwrite any previously stored stations.

## Manual Station Preset

1. Tune to the station you want to store (e.g., 105.1).
2. Press and hold ©K. A Save Preset indicator will appear on screen.
3. While the Save Preset indicator is active, press $<$ or $\geqslant$ to select a Preset Number (e.g., 23).
4. Press © to confirm and save (e.g., 105.1 has now been saved as Preset 23).

## SYS MODE

## Enter System mode to adjust the internal settings of your player.

## System Menu

The System Menu contains 11 options: Equalizer, Repeat, Language, Contrast, Backlight, Power, Rec Quality, Del File, Format, System Info, and Reset.

- Press © or $\geqslant$ to select a system option and press $\varlimsup_{1}$ to confirm.
- Press J/MENU to exit the System Menu.


## Equalizer

Set a digital equalizer preset. The options are: Normal, Pop, Rock, Classic, Jazz, and Bass.

- Press © or $\geqslant$ to select a System option and press © to confirm.
- Press $\downarrow$ / MENU to return to the System Menu.


## Repeat

Set a Repeat Mode option. The options are:

| H | No Repeat. Play tracks in normal order. |
| :---: | :---: |
| 1 | One. Repeat the current track. |
| (A) | All. Repeat all tracks. |
| (F) | Random All: Play all tracks in random order. |
| $\square$ | Dir Repeat. Repeat all tracks in the current folder. |
| $戸$ | Dir All Repeat. Repeat all tracks in all folders. |
| P | Dir Random All: Play folders in random order. |
| 10.5 | Intro: Play the first 10 seconds of each track. |

- Press $\ll$ or $\geqslant$ to select a Repeat option and press $\omega_{\circledR}$ to confirm.
- Press J/MENU to return to the System Menu.


## SYS MODE

## Language

Set the language that the menus appear in. The language options are: English, French, German, Portuguese, Spanish, Chinese (Trad), and Chinese (Simp).

- Press © or $\geqslant$ to select a Language option and press © to confirm.
- Press $\circlearrowright$ / MENU to return to the System Menu.


## Contrast

Set the Contrast level of the display. A setting of 00 is lightest; a setting of 14 is darkest.

- Press © or $\geqslant$ to select a Contrast option and press © to confirm.
- Press ( / MENU to return to the System Menu.


## Backlight

Set the Backlight option to change the duration of time (in seconds) that the backlight will remain on after a key press. A setting of "Off" will disable the backlight completely. A setting of "On" will keep that backlight on continuously.

- Press © or $\geqslant$ to select a Backlight option and press © to confirm.
- Press J/MENU to return to the System Menu.


## Power

Set the Power option to change the duration of time (in seconds) that the player will remain on when it is idle. A setting of "Off" will disable the this power-saving feature.

- Press $\ll$ or $\geqslant$ to select a Power option and press © to confirm.
- Press $\downarrow /$ MENU to return to the System Menu.


## Quality

Set the Recording Quality level for Voice and FM recordings. The options are Long Time, Normal Quality, and High Quality. Lower quality recordings will take up less memory than higher quality recordings.

- Press © or $\geqslant$ to select a Quality option and press © to confirm.
- Press $\omega$ / MENU to return to the System Menu.


## SYS MODE

## Delete

Use the Delete function to remove files from your player. To delete a file:

- Select DelFile from the System Menu.
- A Directory Tree will appear. Press the joystick $\boldsymbol{\wedge}$ or to select a folder or file to delete and press © to confirm.
- A Delete Confirmation screen will appear. Select "Yes" or "No" and then press © to confirm.
- If you select "Yes", the folder or file will be deleted.
- If you select "No", the player will return to the Directory Tree.
- If you select "No" and a folder was selected, the player will enter the folder and return to the Directory Tree.


## Format

Use the Format function to format your player. It may become necessary to format your player if data or files become corrupt. Always use the Format function of your player and not your computer's format utility.

- Select and confirm "No" to cancel.
- Select and confirm "Yes" to start the format process.
- Press J/ MENU to return to the System Menu.

Formatting will destroy all data on your player so make sure to backup your data first.
If you have installed an SD/MMC card and have selected "SD/
MMC Card" from the NAV menu, the SD/MMC card will be formatted instead.

## System Info

View Firmware, date, and memory information.

## Reset

Return all of your player's internal options to their factory-default settings.

## COMPUTER CONNECTION (USB)

Connect the MP-C781 to a computer with the USB 2.0 cable provided to:

- Transfer files to and from your player
- Perform basic file management functions.


## USB Driver Installation (Required for Windows 98 SE Only)

It is not necessary to install the USB driver if your computer is running Microsoft Windows ME/2000/XP or newer, or Macintosh OS X. Computers running these operating systems will recognize your player automatically when connected.

If your computer is running Windows 98 SE:

1. Insert the Installation CD into your computer's CD or DVD drive. Make sure to place the mini-CD in the center, recessed well of the drive tray.
2. Navigate to MY COMPUTER and double-click on the CD/DVD drive icon (usually "D:").
3. Double-click on the folder "Win98 USB Drivers" and then on the folder "english".
4. Double-click on the SETUP icon (SETUP.EXE) to start the USB driver installation program.
5. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation and then restart your computer.

Mini-CDs should only be used in normal tray-loading CD/DVD drives. Mini-CDs may be used in slot-loading drives with the proper adapter; please contact your computer or drive manufacturer for more information.

## Connecting to a Computer

Connect the player to your computer with the supplied USB cable. Upon connection:

- Your computer will automatically recognize the player. An icon representing your player will appear as a "Removable
 Disk" when you open "My Computer".
- It may take Windows several minutes to recognize and set up the device the first time it is connected depending on your hardware configuration.

> If you are using Windows Media Player 10 (WMP10), WMP10 can be set to synchronize with your player automatically upon connection. To stop auto-synchronization with WMP10 during connection, press the VOLUME + key.
> For more information and support regarding music transfer and synchronization with Windows Media Player (WMP), please see the help section included with WMP (click Help > Synchronizing Content to Devices).

## Transferring Files

The USB 2.0 High-Speed connection makes it easy to transfer music, video, photo, and text files (or any other data) quickly between the player and your computer. Simply use the player as you would a floppy disk using basic operating system commands.

If you need further assistance with transferring files, please refer to your operating system's instruction manual or on-screen help. If you are using media management software such as iTunes, Winamp, or Windows Media Player, please refer to their documentation for support.

1. Double-click the "My Computer" icon on your desktop and then double-click the MP-C781 icon (MTP Multimedia Player).

2. Your player contains two folders: Data and Media.

- Drag your media files to the Media folder (e.g., MP3, WMA files).
- Drag all other types of files to the Data folder for storage (e.g., TXT, DOC, XLS, etc). Data files are only visible from a computer; these files will not be available from within the player itself.


## Macintosh OS X

1. Open a Finder window. Locate the files you would like to transfer from your computer. Select the files/folders with the mouse and press APPLE-C (copy) on the keyboard.
2. Click on the Removable Disk icon located on the left side of the finder window. The computer will display all files and folders currently stored in the player.
3. Press APPLE-V (paste) on the keyboard to transfer the files you selected in Step 1 to the player.

## COMPUTER CONNECTION (USB)

## Disconnecting from a Computer

Disconnect your player as instructed below to prevent data loss or file/firmware corruption.

## Microsoft Windows

1. Double-click the green arrow in the taskbar located on the lower-right side of the computer screen (Safely Remove Hardware).

2. Safely Remove Hardware:

Select "USB Mass Storage Device" from the list that appears and then click on "Stop". Stop a Hardware Device: Select "USB Mass Storage Device" from the list that appears and then click on "OK".
Select "USB Mass Storage Device" from the list that appears and then click on "OK".
3. When the "Safe to Remove Hardware" window appears, click the OK button and disconnect the USB cable from the player and your
 computer.

1. On the left side of the Finder window, identify the

## Windows Media Player 10 (WMP10)

You can use Windows Media Player 10 (WMP10) and a USB-MTP connection to manage your music media library with Microsoft Windows XP or newer.

## Music File Transfers

To transfer files using WMP10:

1. Run Window Media Player 10
2. Connect your player to the computer. A "Device Setup" window will appear.
3. In the "Device Setup" window, choose "Synchronize this device with this library for this session only" and click "Finish".
4. Select "Sync". There are 2 ways to sync your files with your player:

- Drag your songs, photos, or converted video files to the sync list on the left hand side. Click "Start Sync" to start transferring the selected files.



## WINDOWS MEDIA PLAYER 10

- Select a playlist from the "Sync List" drop-down menu. Click "Start Sync" to start transferring the files in the selected playlist.


WMP10 can be set to synchronize with your player automatically upon connection (see Step 3: Device Setup). To stop auto-synchronization with WMP10 during connection, press the VOLUME + key.

For more information and support regarding music transfer and synchronization with Windows Media Player (WMP), please see the help section included with WMP (click Help > Synchronizing Content to Devices).

## Creating Playlists

Playlists are an easy way to organize and store your favorite music mixes so you can listen to them whenever you want.

When a playlist is transferred using Windows Media Player, every song in the playlist will be transferred as well.


## WINDOWS MEDIA PLAYER 10

To create playlists using WMP10:

1. Run Window Media Player 10

2. Select "Library" and then drag the desired song(s) to the "Now Playing List" on the right side.

3. Highlight all of the songs in the "Now Playing List" and then use the mouse to right-click the list. Choose "Add to" and then "Additional Playlists..." An "Add to Playlist" window will appear.
4. Select "New" and enter the playlist name, then click "OK". A new playlist will be created.

## Automatic Windows Media Playlist Synchronization

By default, WMP is set to transfer and synchronize files manually. You can choose to have Windows Media Player automatically synchronize your playlists when you connect your player to the computer.

To change the synchronization settings:

1. Connect your player with the computer and run Window Media Player 10.

2. In the SYNC menu, click the "Set up Sync" button. A "Synchronization Settings" window will appear.

3. Check "Synchronize device automatically" and check the playlist(s) you want to sync.
4. Click "OK" to start the synchronization.
5. When synchronization is complete, disconnect your player from the computer.
6. Turn on your player and select "Music".
7. The synchronized playlist(s) from WMP will have been added under the "Playlist" category.

## FIRMWARE UPGRADES

From time to time, COBY may release firmware updates to improve the performance of the MP-C781 or to add additional features. Please check the COBY website periodically at www.cobyusa.com to see if new firmware has been released for your player. If you are experiencing abnormal behavior with your player, you may choose to restore (format) your player before updating its firmware.

1. Download the latest firmware for your player from www.cobyusa.com. Save this file to the computer.
2. Connect your player to the computer. Double-click the Removable Icon that corresponds to your player, and then double-click the FIRMWARE folder to open it.
3. Double-click the downloaded firmware file (you may need a file compression utility installed on your computer). In the window that appears, select the file that ends with ".BIN" and copy it to your player's root directory.
4. Disconnect your player from the computer.
5. Press and hold J/MENU to turn the player on. The player will update its firmware automatically.

Always use a new battery before attempting to upgrade the firmware. Do not interrupt the firmware upgrade -doing so could damage your player and render it inoperable.

## ABOUT DIGITAL MUSIC FILES (MP3)

## What is an MP3?

MP3 (short for MPEG-1 Audio Layer 3) is a compressed digital audio file. MP3 files can deliver audio at a quality that nearly matches compact discs (CDs), but are about one-tenth the size of CD-audio.

## How can I play an MP3?

MP3s may be played on a wide variety of devices. Devices that may play MP3s are: MP3 Players, Portable Media Players (players), Personal Computers, and DVD Players.

## What is an MP3 Player?

MP3 Players are devices (usually portable) that can play back MP3 audio files. Although they are called "MP3 Players", most can play other types of digital audio files (e.g., WMA, OGG, WAV, or AAC). Since modern players can play more than just MP3s, they may also be referred to as Digital Audio Players.

Many MP3 players include other functions such as an FM Radio, Voice Recorder, Photo Viewer, or Video Playback.

## Where Can I Get MP3/WMA files?

You may either download MP3 or WMA files from a music download or subscription service, or you may create ("rip") your own MP3/WMA files.

## Downloading MP3/WMA Files

There are many online stores or subscription services you may choose to purchase and download music from. Most of these stores employ Windows Media Digital Rights Management (WMDRM) and offer encrypted WMA files for download. Due to the encryption, these files cannot be played on all MP3 Players.

Most COBY MP3 Players can play encrypted WMA files-these players will state so on their packaging. If you are unsure of whether or not your player can play encrypted WMA files, you may visit our website at http://www.cobyusa.com for more information about your player.

Please note that music purchased from Apple's iTunes music store employs their proprietary Fairplay-encrypted AAC; purchased iTunes music cannot be played on any MP3 player other than Apple's.

## ABOUT DIGITAL MUSIC FILES (MP3)

## What is Encryption?

Encryption is a way of protecting media with a unique Content ID for the purpose of data security. In order to access the encrypted media, End Users must acquire a license key and that allows for decryption and playback. Without this license key, encrypted media will not play

## Creating MP3/WMA Files

You can create your own digital audio files for personal use by "ripping" your music CDs and converting them to an MP3, WMA, or OGG.

To create your own MP3 files, you will need a computer with an application installed that can rip and encode MP3s or WMAs. Windows Media Player 10 is one software application made available by Microsoft that will rip and convert CDs to an MP3 or WMA file.

- Ripping a CD copies and converts (encodes) the music from the CD to a compressed digital audio file.
- Converting to MP3 and/or deselecting the "Copy Protect Music" option will ensure the widest playback compatibility of your music files.

Some COBY MP3 Players have the ability to create MP3 files without a computer; please see your player's documentation or visit www.cobyusa.com for information about our lineup of MP3 players.

## How Do I Rip My Music CDs Using Windows Media Player 10?

1. Start the Windows Media Player 10 (WMP10) application. (If it is not installed on your computer, you will have to download and install the program from www.microsoft.com).
2. Insert your music CD into your computer's CD-ROM drive.
3. Click the "Rip" tab.
4. Set the appropriate options, and then click "Rip Music" to begin the ripping process.
5. The converted file will be saved to your "My Music" folder unless you have specified otherwise.

## How Do I Transfer MP3/WMA Music Files to my MP3 Player?

When your MP3 Player is connected to a computer, you may transfer music files to your MP3 player using your operating system's basic file management commands (i.e., copy-and-paste or drag-and-drop). Please refer to your computer's documentation for more information and support.

If you have Windows Media Player installed on your computer (or another, similar program), you may choose to use its media management functions to transfer your files.

- COBY MP3 Players with USB-MTP support will enable the advanced media management functions of Windows Media Player.

## How Do I Play Music Purchased Online on my MP3 Player?

Music files you have downloaded from online stores (e.g., Napster, MusicNow, URGE, Walmart.com, and Y! Music) are encrypted with WMDRM. These files will only play on MP3 players with WMDRM support.

In addition to an MP3 player with WMDRM support:

- To transfer and play purchased music, you will need Windows Media Player 9 or newer.
- To transfer and play subscription music, you will need Windows XP and Windows Media Player 10 or newer.
For more information and support, please refer to the documentation provided by the online store or subscription service from which you purchased your music.


## Common Errors Associated with DRM-Encrypted Music Files

## Why is my MP3 player not recognizing the files I have transferred to it?

If your MP3 Player does not display or recognize the files you have transferred to it, the files may not be of a type supported by the player. Make sure your music files are in MP3 or WMA format.

## Why is my MP3 player skipping a file?

The file may be corrupt. Download or transfer the file to your player again.
The file that is being skipped may be DRM-encrypted. If your license has expired, you will not be able to play this file.

- If you believe your license has expired prematurely, please contact the store or service from which you have downloaded this file for support.


## Why is my MP3 player displaying the error message "NO AUTHORITY"?

The player may be trying to read a file that is DRM-encrypted. If your license has expired, you will not be able to play this file.

- If you believe you are receiving this message in error, please contact the store or service from which you have downloaded this file for support.


## How do I transfer and play iTunes files on my MP3 Player?

Music purchased from Apple's iTunes music store employs their proprietary Fair-play-encrypted AAC format. Purchased iTunes music cannot be played on any MP3 player other than Apple's.

However, MP3 files may be transferred from iTunes to your MP3 player. Please see the iTunes documentation for more information and support.

## The player does not turn on.

- The battery level may be too low. Try installing a new battery.
- Ensure that the Lock switch is disengaged.


## There is no sound during playback.

- Check the volume level.
- Ensure that the headphones are attached securely to the player.


## The sound quality of the music is poor.

- Try playing the file on your computer. If the sound quality is still poor, try downloading the file again or re-encoding the file yourself.
- Ensure that the bit rate of the file is not too low. The higher the bit rate of the file, the better it will sound. The minimum recommended bitrate is 128 kbps for MP3s and 96kbps for WMAs.
- Ensure that the headphones are attached securely to the player.


## The buttons do not work.

- Ensure that the battery is charged.
- Ensure that the Lock switch is disengaged.


## TROUBLESHOOTING

## The player will not play my music file.

- Ensure that the file is in a compatible format (MP3, WMA).
- The file may be copy-protected and you no longer have authorization to play this file. If you feel this is in error, please contact the service from which you downloaded the file.


## The LCD characters are corrupted or something is wrong with the display.

- Ensure that the correct language has been selected.
- Remove and replace the battery.


## I cannot transfer files to the player.

- Ensure that your computer is running a supported operating system.
- If you are running Microsoft Windows 98 SE, ensure that the USB driver has been properly installed.
- Ensure that the supplied USB cable is securely attached to the player and the PC, or try using another USB cable.
- If you have connected the player through a USB hub, try connecting the player directly to your computer.
- Ensure that the player's memory capacity is not full.


## The player has malfunctioned.

- Remove and replace the battery.
- Try updating the player's firmware. Please refer to the Firmware Upgrades section of this manual for detailed instructions.
