# IMPORTANT INFORMATION

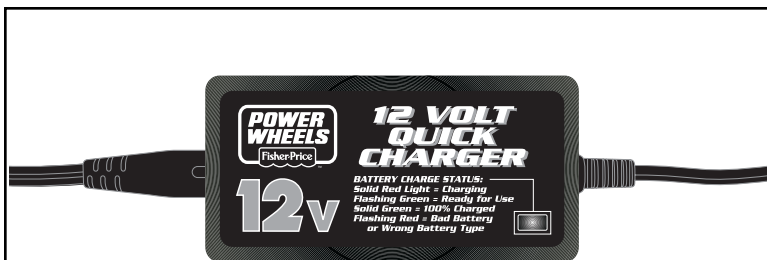
- **IMPORTANT!** Batteries can be severely damaged if they are not charged after each use. **For maximum battery life, charge batteries 100% (solid green) every other charge.**
- If your batteries are new, charge batteries 100% (solid green).
- Do not charge the batteries longer than 30 hours.
- **Adults Note:** Regularly examine the charger for damage to the cord, plug, housing or other parts that may result in the risk of fire, electric shock or injury. In the event of any damage, do not use the charger until the damage has been properly repaired. Please call **1-800-348-0751**.
- Before charging the batteries, examine battery cases for cracks and other damage which may cause sulfuric acid (electrolyte) to leak during the charging process. If damage is detected, do not charge the batteries or use them in your vehicle. Battery acid is very corrosive and can cause severe damage to the surfaces it contacts.
- Do not charge the batteries on a surface (such as a kitchen counter top) which could be damaged by the acid contained inside a battery. Take precautions to protect the surface on which you charge the batteries.
- Do not short circuit the batteries.
- The batteries must be upright while charging.
- Disconnect the charger before cleaning.
- Charger specifications are as follows:
  - Input** 100-240 V AC 50/60Hz 50W
  - Output** 12V DC 2.5A

## **WARNING**

- **PREVENT FIRE**

- Use of the wrong type batteries or charger could cause a fire or explosion resulting in serious injury.
- Use of Power Wheels® components in products other than Power Wheels® vehicles could cause overheating, fire or explosion.
- The batteries must be handled by adults only. The batteries are heavy and contain sulfuric acid (electrolyte). Dropping the batteries could result in serious injury.
- Never allow children to charge the batteries. Battery charging must be done by adults only. A child could be injured by the electricity involved in charging the batteries.
- Read the safety instructions on the batteries.
- Examine the batteries, charger and their connectors for excessive wear or damage each time you charge the batteries. If damage or excessive wear is detected, do not use the charger or the batteries until you have replaced the worn or damaged part.

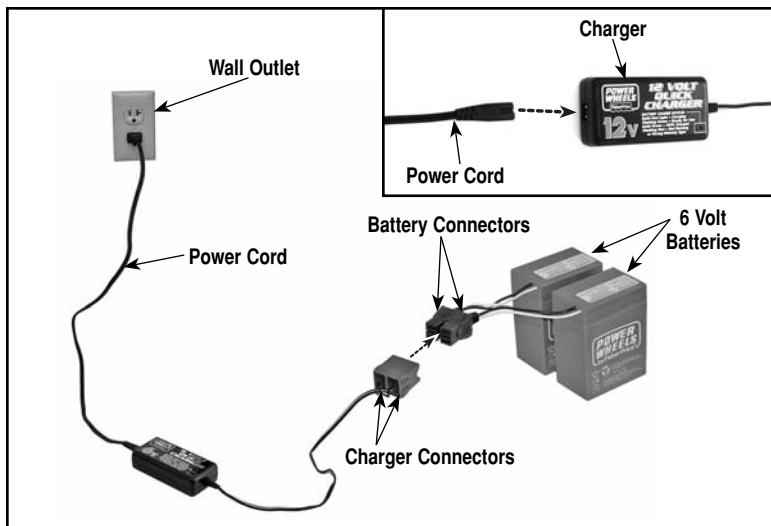


Status	Charge	Approximate Time
Solid Red	Charging	--
Flashing Green	Ready for Use	2 hours
Solid Green	100% (Full)*	6-8 hours
Flashing Red	No Charge**	--

\* For maximum battery life, charge batteries 100% (solid green) every other charge.

\*\* Error - wrong or dead batteries.

# CHARGING INSTRUCTIONS



- Join the charger connectors and the 6-volt battery connectors.
- Plug the power cord into the charger.
- Plug the 6-volt battery connectors into the charger connectors.
- Plug the power cord into a standard 120 volt wall outlet.

**Note:** The charger may be hot to the touch while charging. New batteries may make a “sizzling” or “bubbling” noise and swell slightly. These are normal conditions and do not indicate a problem.

- Charge the batteries 100% (solid green) or Ready for Use (flashing green). For maximum battery life, charge batteries 100% (solid green) every other charge.
- Unplug the charger from the wall outlet when not in use.

# PROBLEMS AND SOLUTIONS

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
No status light	No power to charger	Make sure power flow to the wall outlet is "ON".
	Loose connections	Check connections of all plugs. Make sure the battery connectors are tightly plugged into the charger connectors and the power cord connector is tightly plugged into both the charger and the wall outlet.
	Bad charger	There is no sure way to tell if your charger is working unless you have a volt meter. If you suspect there is a problem with your charger, contact Power Wheels® Consumer Relations.
	Wrong batteries	This charger is intended for use <b>only</b> with a Power Wheels® 12-volt system with two 6-volt lead acid batteries.
Flashing red status light	Loose connections	Check connections of all plugs. Make sure the battery connectors are tightly plugged into the charger connectors and the power cord connector is tightly plugged into both the charger and the wall outlet.
	Undercharged batteries	Batteries need a 100% (solid green) charge every other use.
	Batteries dead	Replace the batteries with a new, Power Wheels® 12-volt system with two 6-volt lead acid batteries.
Solid red status light	Undercharged batteries	Charge batteries 100% (solid green) or Ready for Use (flashing green).

# PROBLEMS AND SOLUTIONS

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Batteries are warm while charging	Normal while quick charging	No action required.
Charger is hot while charging	Normal while quick charging	No action required.
Short vehicle run time or vehicle runs sluggishly	Undercharged batteries	Charge batteries 100% (solid green) or Ready for Use (flashing green).
Flashing green status light - but vehicle does not run	Batteries dead	In rare situations, severely depleted (dead) batteries will give a false, Ready for Use (flashing green) status. Try charging the batteries again for 6-8 hours. If your vehicle still won't run, you will need to replace your batteries with a new, Power Wheels® 12-volt system with two 6-volt lead acid batteries.
Solid green status light - but vehicle does not run	Batteries dead	In rare situations, severely depleted (dead) batteries will give a false, 100% (solid green) status. Try charging the batteries for a full 6-8 hours. If your vehicle still won't run, you will need to replace your battery with a new, Power Wheels® 12-volt system with two 6-volt lead acid batteries.
Flashing green status light does not progress to a solid green status light after 6-8 hours of charging and vehicle does not run	Batteries may be dead	Unplug the charger from the batteries and wall outlet for at least 12 hours. Now, charge the batteries again for 6-8 hours. If the status flashes red or you see the same results, replace the batteries with a new, Power Wheels® 12-volt system with two 6-volt lead acid batteries.
