# CAUTIONS

### Listening precautions

- Do not play your earphones at a high volume.
- · Hearing experts advise against continuous extended play.
- If you experience a ringing in your ears, reduce volume or discontinue use.
- Do not use while operating a motorized vehicle. It may create traffic hazard and is illegal in many areas.
- You should use extreme caution or temporarily discontinue use in potentially hazardous situations.
- Even if your earphones are an open-air type designed to let you hear outside sounds, do not turn up the

volume so high that you cannot hear what is around you. Sound can be deceiving. Over time your hearing "comfort level" adapts to higher volumes of sound. So what

sounds "normal" can actually be loud and harmful to your hearing. Guard against this by setting your equipment at a safe level BEFORE your hearing adapts.

## To establish a safe level:

- Start your volume control at a low setting.
- Slowly increase the sound until you can hear it comfortably and clearly, and without distortion.
- Once you have established a comfortable sound level:
- Set the dial and leave it there.

To prevent damage to the batteries and electrolyte leakage, heed the following points.

- Align the ⊕ and ⊖ polarities properly when inserting the batteries.
- Remove the batteries if you do not plan to use the player for a long period of time.


# **GETTING STARTED**

## POWERING UP

This digital audio player operates on battery.

### **BATTERY POWER**

Remove the battery compartment cover and insert one LR03 (AAA) alkaline battery matching the polarities (+ and –) indicated in the bottom of the battery compartment, then replace the compartment cover.



### On the Battery remain indicator

The battery remain indicator in the display changes as follows.

# Important Battery Information


- If you are not going to use your player for a month or more, be sure to remove the battery in case the battery leaks and causes damage.
- Dispose of batteries in the proper manner, according to federal, state, and local regulations. - Discard leaky batteries immediately. They can cause skin burn or other personal injury.

## **EARPHONES**



## **CONNECTING TO THE COMPUTER**

## For Windows 98SE user:

Before connecting your player to the computer for the first time, be sure to install the USB driver from the supplied CD-ROM into your computer. Place the CD-ROM in your disc drive and follow the instructions displayed on the computer.

- 1. Open the rubber cap of the USB connector.
- 2. Connect the player to a USB port of your computer using the supplied USB cable.



## **DOWNLOADING THE DATA**

- 1. Open the player's folder (removable disk or device) from My Computer or Explorer.
- 2. Copy and paste or drag and drop the MP3/WMA files from the computer into the player's folder.

# REMOVING FROM THE COMPUTER

Disconnect the player from the computer by following the necessary steps according to your computer for safety

## For Windows 2000/Me/XP users:

Left-click the 🏅 icon in the taskbar, and follow the messages appear.

## For Windows 98SE users / When the icon is not displayed in the taskbar:

- 1. Open "My Computer" on your computer.
- 2. Click on "Removable Disk", then right-click to select "Eject". 3. Remove the player from the computer.







# **TURNING ON / OFF THE PLAYER**


To turn the player on, press ►/II (play/pause). The backlight turns on.

# To turn the player off, press and hold ■ (stop).

- The player turns off automatically after 60 seconds without pressing any button.
- When the player is turned on, it resumes the mode it was in when it was last turned off.

### **ABOUT THE MAIN MENU**

The main menu of the player is structured as follows.

# PLAYING A TRACK

**PLAYING A MUSIC TRACK** 1. Press MENU while the player is on.

Main menu is displayed. 

2. Slide ▶►I (forward) / I◄◄ (reverse) to select the "Music Play" icon then press ▶/II (play/pause) twice.



3. Slide ►►I (forward) / I◄◄ (reverse) to select the desired track. 4. Press ►/II (play/pause).

## LISTENING TO FM RADIO BROADCASTS

- 1. Press MENU while the player is on.
- 2. Slide ►►I (forward) / I◄◄ (reverse) to select the "FM Mode" icon.




3. Press ►/II (play/pause).

The frequency will be shown on the display.

### **TUNE IN A STATION**

To tune in the station, slide ▶►I (forward) / I◄◄ (reverse) to set the frequency while in FM mode.

To auto-search up or down the station, slide and hold ▶►I (forward) / I◄◄ (reverse), and release it when the message "Release Key now" appears on the display. The frequency step is 50 kHz interval (for Canada, 100 kHz interval).



The station is being searched. When searching up, the following message appears.



When a strong signal is received, "STEREO" will appear on the display. Now the player is receiving the FM



If the signal is not strong enough, it will automatically be monaural.

## PRESET A STATION

You can preset up to 20 stations.

- 1. Tune in a station to preset.
- 2. Press MENU.
- 3. Slide ►►I (forward) / I◄◄ (reverse) to select the "Save Station" icon.




4. Press ►/II (play/pause).

"Save as M01?", for example, appears on the display.



5. Press ►/II (play/pause) again.



The preset number appears on the display.

If you preset more than 20 stations, the 21st station will overwrite the preset number "01".

## **LISTEN TO THE PRESET STATION**

1. Press ▶/II (play/pause) while in FM mode.



2. Slide ►►I (forward) / I◄◄ (reverse) to select the desired preset station.

## RECORDING A VOICE TRACK

1. Press MENU while the player is on.

2. Slide ►►I (forward) / I◄◄ (reverse) to select the "the Voice Record icon".

3. Press ►/II (play/pause).

5. Press ■ (stop) to stop recording.

• The message "Memory Full!" appears when the player's capacity reaches its maximum. • The recorded voice track is converted into monaural WAV files and stored in the player's internal memory.

## DELETING A FILE

You can delete recorded music, FM broadcast or voice tracks.

- 1. Press MENU while the player is on.
- 2. Slide ►►I (forward) / I◄◄ (reverse) to select the "File Delete" icon and press ►/II (play/pause).

3. Slide ►►I (forward) / I◄◄ (reverse) to select the file to delete.

4. Press ►/II (play/pause).

The message "Delete?" appears in the display. The display figure below is an example of a voice track.

Press ▶/III (play/pause) again to delete the file. To cancel deleting, press ■ (stop).

"No Voice File!" appears in the display when there is no FM broadcast or voice track saved in the player. "No Music File!" appears in the display when there is no music file saved in the player.

• You can only delete one file at a time. To delete all files, use the format function (see "SETTING UP FUNCTION").



• If the player has no files to delete, the "File Delete" icon will not be displayed.

- 1. Press MENU while the player is on.
- 2. Slide ►►I (forward) / I◄◄ (reverse) to select the Setup icon and press ►/II (play/pause).

# TROUBLESHOOTING TIPS

Problem	Solution
The player does not function.	This player provides versatile operations under microcomputer control. If the player cannot be properly operated by pressing any button, remove the battery and insert it again after a while.      Make sure the HOLD switch is off.      Replace the battery.
There is no sound or a lot of noise.	- Make sure the earphone is correctly connected to the player Wipe the earphone plug with a clean cloth Keep the player away from other equipment, such as mobile phones or televisions Turn the volume up.
The player suddenly stops working.	- Take the battery out for about 10 seconds and re-insert it.
The display is too dark or too bright.	- Adjust the contrast.
Your computer does not recognize the player.	- If your operating system is Windows 98SE, be sure to install the USB driver from the supplied CD-ROM in your computer.
