



## **QUICK INSTALLATION**

Before turning on your television set for the first time, be sure to place it on a solid stable surface. To avoid danger, do not expose the TV to water, or a heat source (e.g. lamp, candle, radiator). Do not obstruct the ventilation grid at the rear and be sure to leave sufficient gaps around the unit as shown.



- Connect a TV antenna or a CATV cable to the Antenna Terminal on rear of TV.
- 2. Connect the power cord.
- 3. Press the  $\odot$  / **ON** button to turn on the unit.
- Press the ◀or ▶ button to select "Yes" or "No", then press the ENTER button to confirm
- The unit will enter TV setting screen. Press the ▼ button to highlight Auto Scan, then press the ENTER button to confirm.
- 6. The unit will enter auto scan setting screen. Press the ▼ button to highlight Cable System, then press the ◀ or ▶ button to choose the desired cable system (We recommend you pick "AUTO", however you might find you get improved results using "STD", "IRC" or "HRC" these are different standards used by various Cable Systems.). Then use the ▼ button to move the highlight bar on Start to Scan and press ENTER button to start. The unit will take a few minutes to finish auto scan and all scanned channels will be stored automatically.









#### TURNING ON THE UNIT FOR THE FIRST TIME

The first time you turn on the unit, the unit will enter the setup mode. You can easily follow the prompt message on the screen to complete basic TV settings.

Make sure the TV antenna or CATV cable has been connected properly to the **TV ANTENNA** input jack on the rear of the system.

## **GETTING STARTED**

#### USING THE REMOTE CONTROL

- Point the remote control at the remote sensor located on the unit.
- When there is a strong ambient light source, the performance of the infrared remote sensor may be degraded, causing unreliable operation.
- The recommended effective distance for remote operation is about 16 feet (5 meters).

#### TO INSTALL BATTERIES

1. Open the battery door.



2. Insert 2 "AAA" batteries.



#### **BATTERY REPLACEMENT**

When the batteries become weak, the operating distance of the remote control is greatly reduced and you will need to replace the batteries.




**CAUTION:** Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent type.

#### **NOTES**

- If the remote control is not going to be used for a long time, remove the batteries to avoid damage caused by battery leakage corrosion.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Do not mix ALKALINE, standard (CARBON-ZINC) or rechargeable (NICKEL-CADMIUM) batteries.
- Always remove batteries as soon as they become weak.
- Weak batteries can leak and severely damage the remote control.

## **CONTROL REFERENCE GUIDE**

#### REMOTE CONTROL



#### 1) MUTE Button

Press to turn off the sound.

#### 2) MENU Button

Press to display the on-screen menu or switch back to the previous menu screen.

#### 3) CURSOR (▲, ▼, ◄, ▶) Buttons

Use to highlight selections on a menu screen and adjust certain settings.

#### **ENTER Button**

Confirm selection on a menu screen

#### 4) DISPLAY Button

Press to display information on the current channel

#### 5) VOL + / VOL - Button

Press to increase/decrease the volume.

#### 6) LAST CH

Press to switch repeatedly between the last two channels displayed.

#### 7) STANDBY/ON Button

Press to turn ON the unit or put it in STANDBY (OFF) mode.

#### 8) FUNCTION Button

Press to switch between TV / AV / PC.

#### 9) LCD MODE Button

Press to Select from preset screen display settings to match the type of show you are watching.

#### 10) CH ▲ / CH ▼ Buttons

Press to select the channel upward or downward

#### 11) NUMERIC Buttons





## **CONNECTIONS**

#### CONNECTING A TV ANTENNA

To view television channels correctly, a signal must be received from one of the following sources:

- An indoor or outdoor aerial antenna
- A cable system
- A satellite system



#### NOTE

For optimal reception of over-the-air TV broadcasts, we recommend that you use an external fixed antenna. If using an indoor antenna, please ensure that you purchase an antenna with sufficient ability to receive signals in your home. Orientation and location of the antenna is typically critical for best results – you may find that placement of the antenna near a window, or in an elevated location, improves performance.


## CONNECTING TO A VCR / CAMCORDER / VIDEO GAME SYSTEM / CABLE / SATELLITE SYSTEM

Make sure you connect the cable from the AUDIO/VIDEO OUT jack of the other equipment to AUDIO/VIDEO IN jack of this unit.


## **CONNECTIONS**

#### **CONNECT THE POWER CORD**

- · Connect the AC power cord into a wall outlet.
- Press the **U/I** button on the unit or remote control to turn on the unit.

#### NOTE


- Be sure the AC power cord is disconnected and all functions are off before making connections.
- · Make sure that all the components are connected correctly.
- To prevent electrical shock, match wide blade of plug to wide slot of wall outlet, then fully insert.
- · When you are not going to use the unit for a long period of time, disconnect the power cord.



#### **CONNECT A PC**

Connect the 15-pin D-SUB PC/VGA connector from your computer to the 15-pin D-SUB PC/ VGA input on this unit using a monitor cable and audio cable (not included) as shown.

Make sure you connect the cable from the computer (PC Connector and PC AUDIO) to this unit (PC IN MONITOR / VGA and AUDIO IN).




## **USING HEADPHONES / EARPHONES**

- Turn down the volume before connecting headphones / earphones to the unit, then adjust the volume to your desired level.

Excessive sound pressure from earphones / headphones can cause hearing loss.





## INSTALLATION

#### INSTALLING / REMOVING THE BASE STAND

WARNING: The LCD Display is very fragile, and must be protected at all times when removing the base stand. Be sure that no hard or sharp object, or anything that could scratch or damage the LCD display, comes into contact with it. Do NOT exert pressure on the front of the unit at any time because the screen could crack.

- 1. Disconnect all cables or cords connected to the unit.
- Lay the unit down on a flat surface with the back side facing up. Please make sure to place a soft cushioned material (such as a pillow or thick piece of foam) beneath the screen.
- 3. To install the base stand, place the base stand on the mounting slot, push the stand till it locks.
- To remove the base stand, keep pressing the locking area of the base stand and pull downwards to release the base stand.






#### MOUNTING ON THE WALL

This unit is VESA-compliant, and is designed to be wall-mounted with a VESA-compliant 3" x 3" (75mm x 75mm) mounting kit designed for flat-panel TVs (sold separately). Mount this unit according to the instructions included in the mounting kit.

#### NOTE

Remove the base stand before mounting the unit on the wall.



Note: Some setting items on the menu screen may not activate depending on what mode the unit

is currently in (TV, AV and PC).

#### PICTURE MENU

- 1. Press the MENU button.
- Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select the options (Picture Mode, Contrast, Brightness, Color, Tint, Sharpness, or Color Mode). Adjust them using the ◄ or ► button (Screen will change to your desired setting).
- Repeat step 3 to adjust other options.
- To exit the MAIN MENU and return to the normal screen, press the MENU button repeatedly.



Picture Mode : Select from preset screen display settings to match the type of show you are watching (Standard, Movie, Dynamic, Soft and Personal). Select Personal mode to recall your

custom settings on contrast, brightness, sharpness, tint and color.

Contrast : Adjust to sharpen the picture quality. The black portions of the picture become richer

in darkness and the white become brighter.

Brightness: Adjust the brightness of the picture. Brighten or darken the whole picture.

Sharpness : Adjust the sharpness level to improve detail in the picture.

Tint : Adjust the tint of the picture. (toward purple / toward green)

**Color** : Adjust the color of the picture.

Color Mode : Adjust the 3 color temperature of the picture. Choose from Normal (balanced), Warm

(red white) or Cool (blue white) modes.

#### **AUDIO MENU**

- 1. Press the MENU button.
- Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select AUDIO, then press the ▼ button to enter the AUDIO settings.
- Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select the options (Sound Mode, Bass, Treble, Balance, Audio Language and MTS). Adjust them using the ◀ or ▶ button.
- 4. Repeat step 3 to adjust other options.
- To exit the MAIN MENU and return to the normal screen, press the MENU button repeatedly.

#### NOTE

Experiment with different sound settings until you find the settings you prefer.

Sound Mode : Select from preset sound settings (Standard, Music, Movie, Theatre or Personal) to match the type of show you are watching. Select Personal mode to recall your

custom settings on bass, treble and balance.

Bass : Adjust the bass range.

Treble : Adjust the treble range.

Balance: Adjust the balance level toward the left or right speakers.

Audio Language : Select from English / Spanish / French. (Available for digital channels if multiple

audio languages are broadcasted.)

MTS (Multi Channel Television Sound): Select Stereo / SAP (Secondary Audio Program) / Mono.

Note:

Some TV stations broadcast audio in more than one language, the SAP (Secondary Audio Programs) feature allows you to listen to this, if available.



#### TIME MENU

- 1. Press the MENU button.
- Use the ◀or ▶ button to select TIME, then press the ▼ button to enter the TIME settings.
- Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select the options (Sleep Timer, Time Zone, Daylight Saving Time or Clock).
   Adjust them using the ◀ or ➤ button.
- 4. Repeat step 3 to adjust other options.
- To exit the MAIN MENU and return to the normal screen, press the MENU button repeatedly.



Sleep Timer : Select the length of time before the unit automatically changes to Standby mode : Off -> 5 Min -> 10 Min -> 15 Min -> 30 Min -> 45 Min -> 60 Min ->

90 Min -> 120 Min -> Off.

Time Zone : Select the time zone from Eastern / Central / Mountain / Pacific / Alaska /

Hawaii.

**Daylight Saving Time** : Select On to activate daylight savings time.

Clock : Display the current time.

### **SETUP MENU**

- 1. Press the MENU button.
- Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select SETUP, then press the ▼ button to enter the SETUP settings.
- Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select the options (OSD Language, PC Setup, Closed Caption or Restore Setting). Adjust them using the ◀ or ▶ button (Screen will change to your desired setting); or press the ▶ button to go into the detailed settings.
- Press the MENU button to return to the previous menu.
- 5. Repeat steps 3 and 4 to adjust other options.
- To exit the MAIN MENU and return to the normal screen, press the **MENU** button repeatedly.



OSD (On Screen Display) Language: Select On-screen menu language from English / French / Spanish.

Restore Setting: If you reset the TV to the factory settings, all your present settings on PICTURE and AUDIO will be erased and replaced by the factory's default settings.



- Press the ENTER button to shift between On / Off. (Select On to skip the selected channel. The channel will not appear when you press the CH ▲ / CH ▼ button.)



#### Channel Label

You can edit a label for each channel.

- Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select the number or letter.
   Use the ◀ or ▶ button to move and edit the next character.
- After editing, the Channel and Channel Label will be shown on the screen when you press the DISPLAY button
