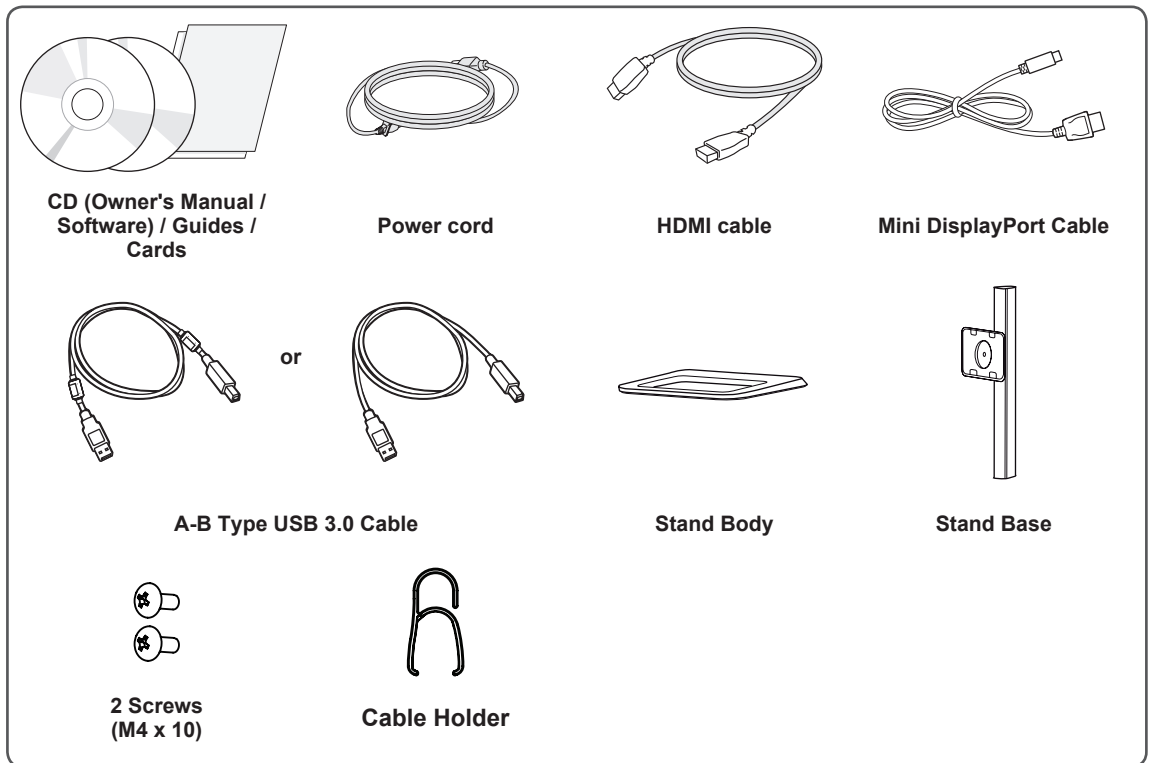

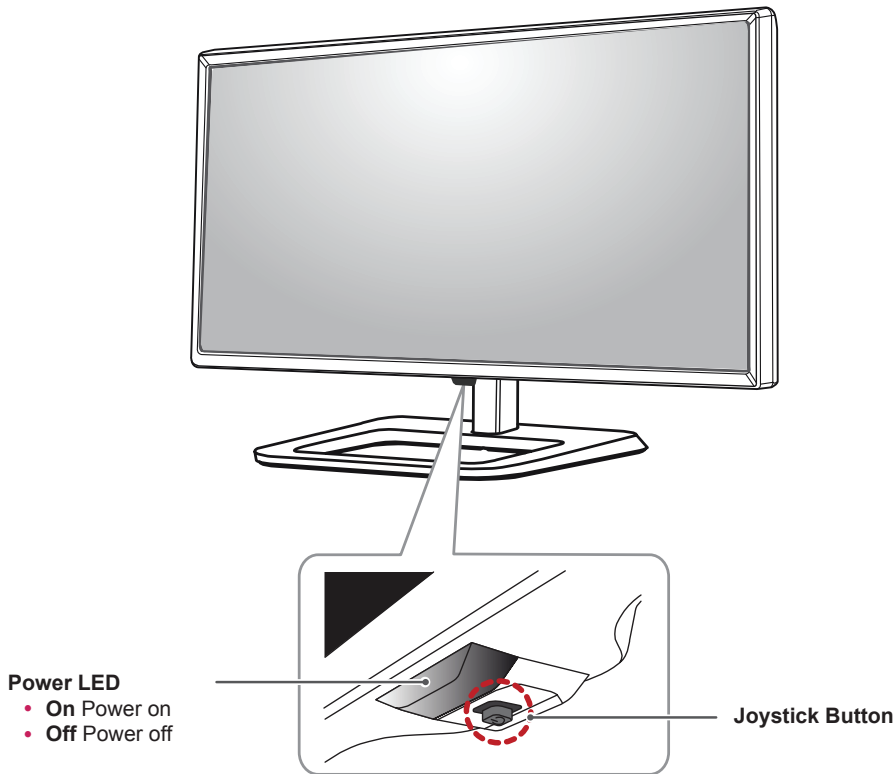

How to Use the Joystick Button

You can easily control the functions of the monitor by pressing the joystick button or moving it left/right with your finger.

Basic Functions

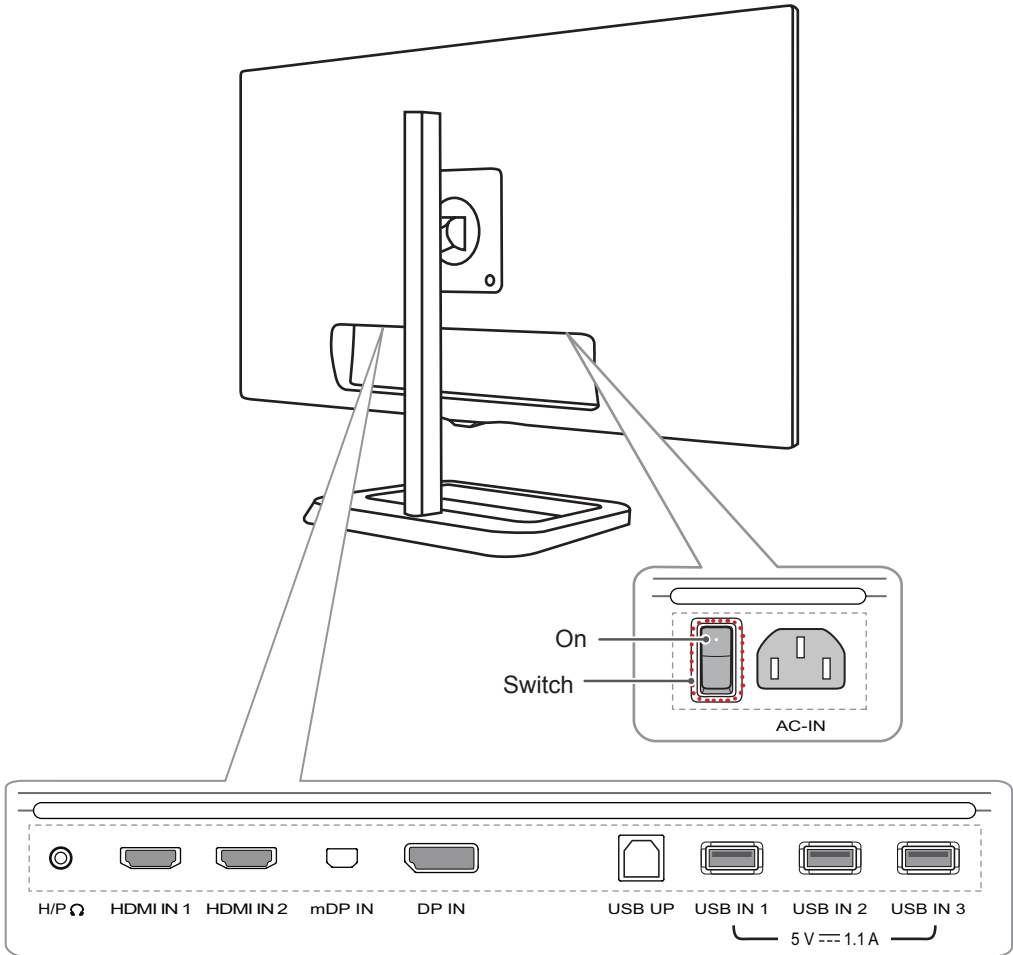

- Before turning on the monitor, please make sure that the switch on the rear side of product is On.

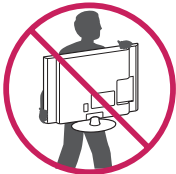
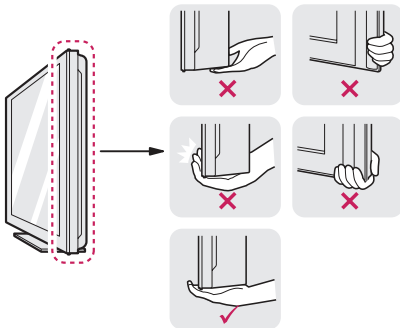

Moving and Lifting the Monitor

When moving or lifting the monitor, follow these instructions to prevent the monitor from being scratched or damaged and to ensure safe transportation, regardless of its shape or size.

- Place the monitor in the original box or packing material before attempting to move it.
- Before moving or lifting the monitor, disconnect the power cord and all other cables.
- Hold the bottom and side of the monitor frame firmly. Do not hold the panel itself.



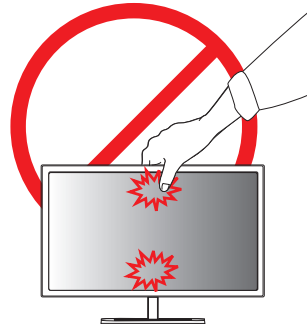
- When holding the monitor, the screen should face toward you to prevent it from being scratched.
- When transporting the monitor, do not expose the monitor to shock or excessive vibration.

- When moving the monitor, keep it upright and never turn the monitor on its side or tilt it sideways.

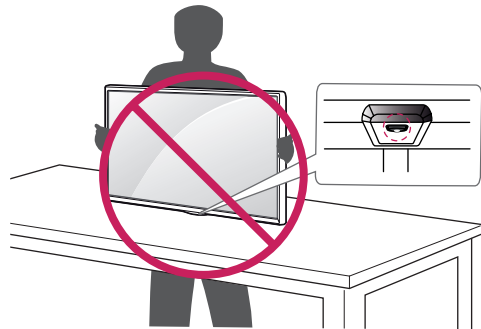


CAUTION

- Avoid touching the monitor screen as much as possible.
 - This may result in damage to the screen or some of the pixels used to create images.



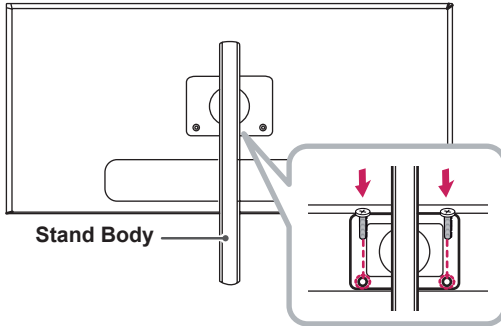
- If you use the monitor panel without the stand base, its joystick button may cause the monitor to become unstable and fall, resulting in damage to the monitor or human injury. In addition, this may cause the joystick button to malfunction.



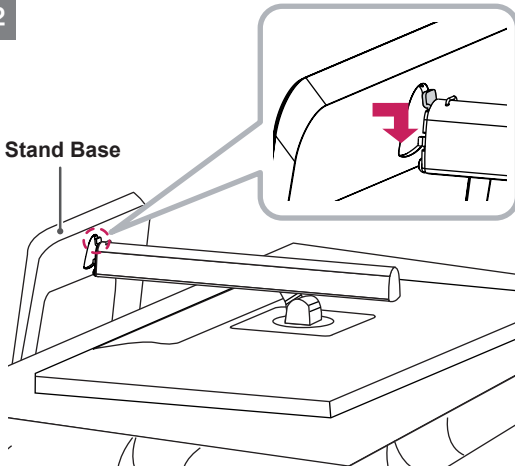

Assembling the Stand

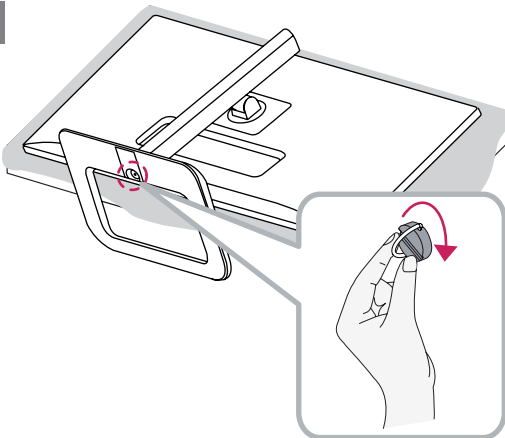

CAUTION

- To protect the screen from scratches, cover the surface with a soft cloth.
- Illustrations in this document represent typical procedures, so they may look different from the actual product.
- When tightening the screws after mounting the stand base onto the stand hinge, be sure to hold the stand base with your hand. Otherwise, the product may fall, causing personal injury or damage to the product.
- Applying excessive force when tightening screws may cause damage to the monitor. Damage caused in this way will not be covered by the product warranty.
- Do not carry the monitor upside down by just holding the base. This may cause the monitor to fall off the stand and could result in personal injury.
- When lifting or moving the monitor, do not touch the monitor screen. The force applied to the monitor screen may cause damage to it.

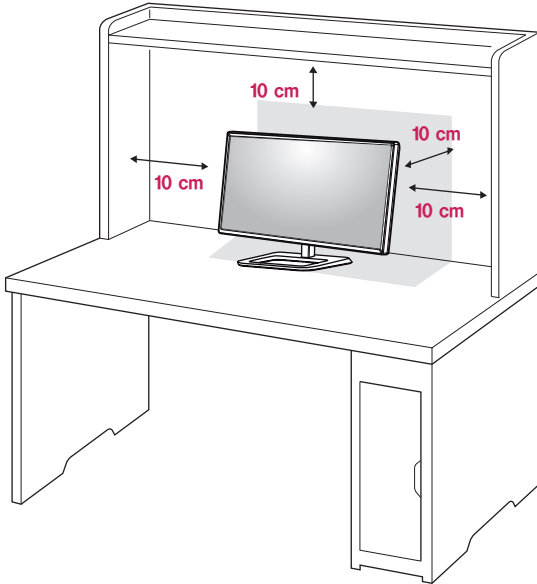

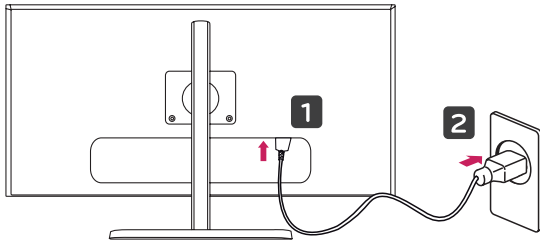
- You can disassemble the stand in the reverse order of the assembly.

Installing on a Table

- 1 Lift the monitor and place it on the table in an upright position. Place the monitor at least 10 cm away from the wall to ensure sufficient ventilation.



- 2 Connect the power cord to the product before connecting it to the wall outlet.



- 3 Press the joystick button on the bottom of the monitor to turn on the monitor.

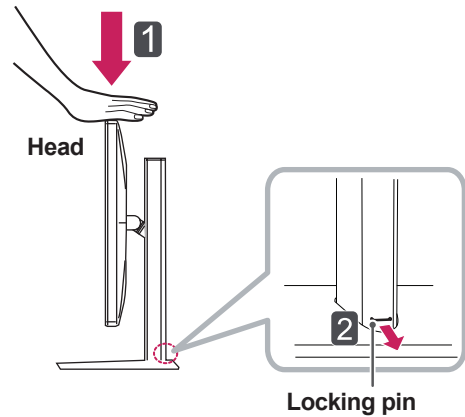

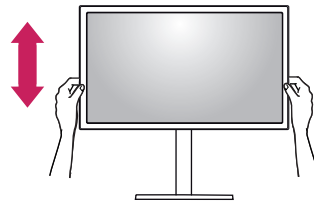
- Unplug the power cord before moving or installing the monitor. There is risk of electric shock.

Adjusting the Stand Height

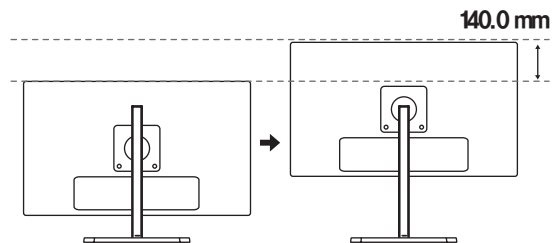
- 1 Place the monitor mounted on the stand base in an upright position.
- 2 Push the Head downward and pull out the Locking Pin.



- 3 Handle the monitor with both hands for safety.

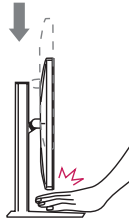


- 4 The height can be adjusted up to 140.0 mm.



**CAUTION**

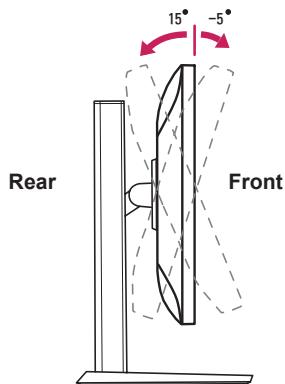
- Once the pin is removed, it is not necessary to re-insert it to adjust the height.

**WARNING**

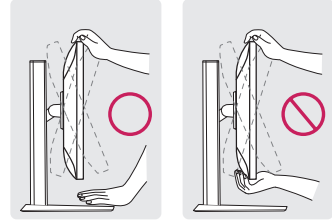
- Do not put your fingers or hand between the screen and the base (chassis) when adjusting the screen's height.

Adjusting the Angle

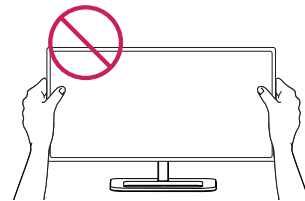
- 1 Place the monitor mounted on the stand base in an upright position.
- 2 Adjust the angle of the screen. The angle of the screen can be adjusted forward or backward from -5° to 15° for a comfortable viewing experience.

**WARNING**

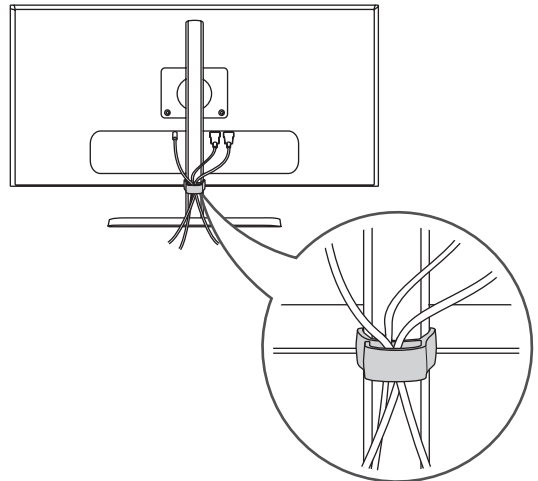
- When you adjust the angle, do not hold the stand as shown on the following illustration. You may injure your fingers.



- Be careful not to touch or press the screen area when adjusting the angle of the monitor.

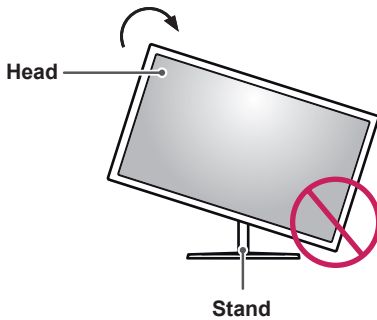
**Tidying up Cables**

Arrange the cables using the cable holder as shown in the illustration.



Pivot Feature

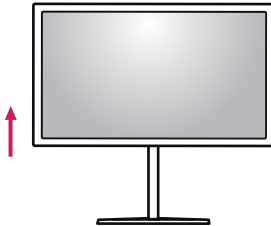
The pivot feature allows the monitor to rotate 90° clockwise.



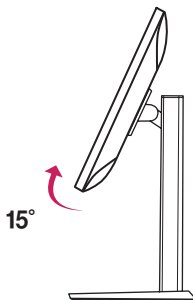
! WARNING

- To avoid scratching the stand base, make sure that when rotating the monitor using the pivot feature, the stand does not make contact with the monitor.

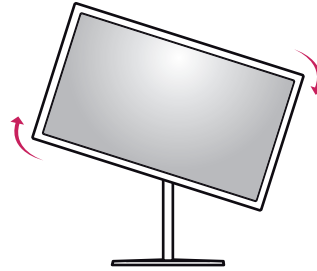
- 1 Raise the monitor to the maximum height.



- 2 Adjust the angle of the monitor in the direction of the arrow as shown in the figure.



- 3 Rotate the monitor clockwise as shown in the figure.

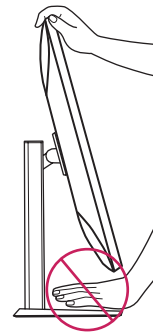


- 4 Complete the installation by rotating the monitor 90° as shown below.



! WARNING

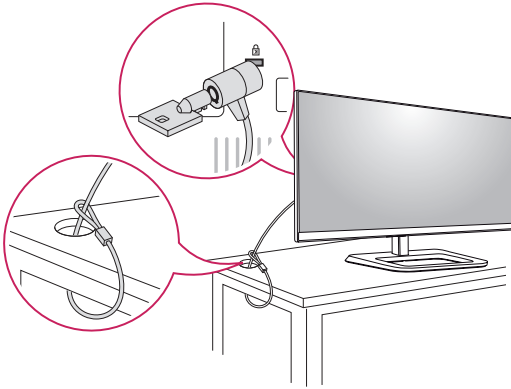
- Take care when rotating the monitor if the cable is connected.
- To avoid injury when rotating the display, do not place your fingers between the display and the stand base.



Using the Kensington Lock

The Kensington security system connector is located at the back of the Monitor set. For more information on installation and usage, refer to the Kensington lock owner's manual or visit the website at <http://www.kensington.com>.

Connect the monitor to a table using the Kensington security system cable.

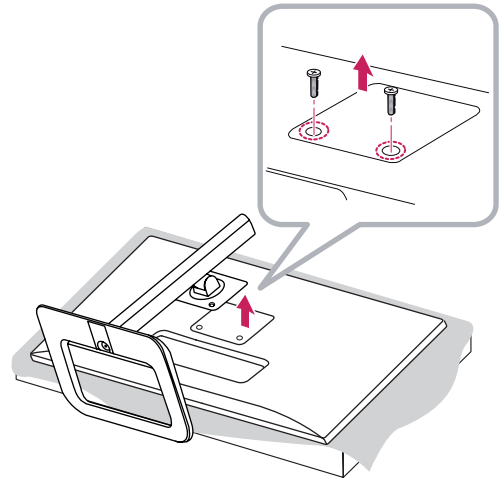

Detaching the Stand Body

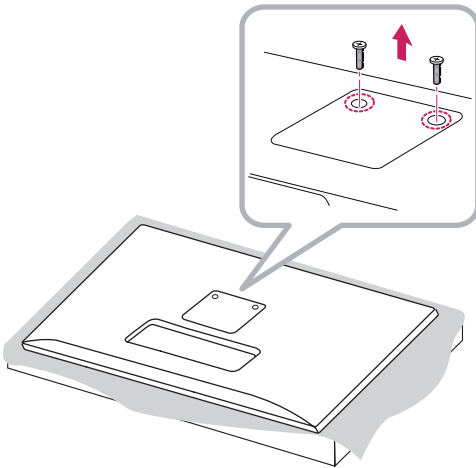
- 1 Place the monitor's screen face down. To protect the screen from scratches, cover the surface with a soft cloth.
- 2 Using a screwdriver, remove the 2 screws and detach the stand from the monitor.



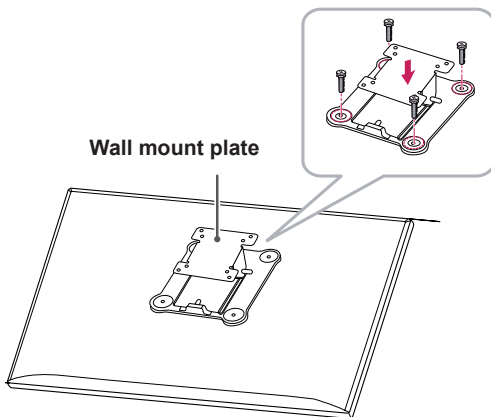
Installing the Wall Mount Plate

This monitor meets the specifications for the wall mount plate or other compatible devices.

- 1 Place the screen face down. To protect the screen from scratches, cover the surface with a soft cloth.
- 2 Using a screwdriver, remove the 2 screws and detach the stand from the monitor.



- 3 Place the wall mount plate onto the monitor and align it with the screw holes.
- 4 Tighten the four screws to fix the plate to the monitor using a screwdriver.

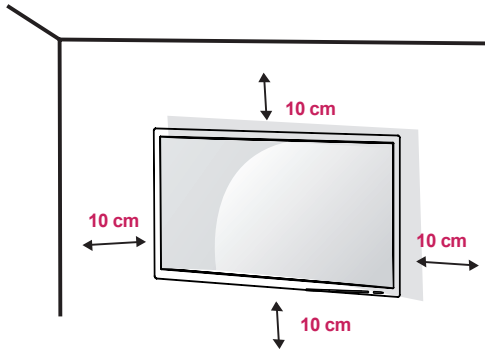


! NOTE

- The wall mount plate is sold separately.
- For more information on installation, refer to the wall mount plate's installation guide.
- Be careful not to apply too much force while mounting the wall mount plate as it may cause damage to the screen.

Installing on the Wall

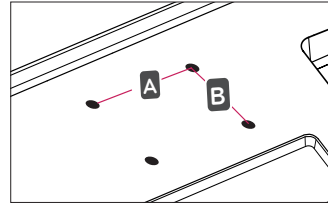
Install the monitor at least 10 cm away from the wall and leave about 10 cm of space at each side of the monitor to ensure sufficient ventilation. Detailed installation instructions can be obtained from your local retail store. Alternatively, please refer to the manual for how to install and set up a tilting wall mounting bracket.



To install the monitor to a wall, attach a wall mounting bracket (optional) to the back of the monitor. Make sure that the wall mounting bracket is securely fixed to the monitor and to the wall.


- 1 If you use screws longer than the standard length, it may damage the inside of the product.
- 2 A non-VESA standard screw may damage the product and cause the monitor to fall. LG Electronics is not liable for any accidents relating to the use of non-standard screws.

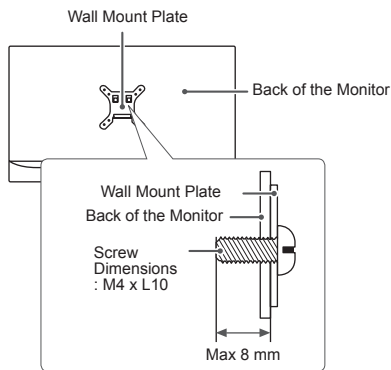

- Use the screws specified by VESA standards.
- The wall mount kit includes the installation guide and all necessary parts.
- The wall mounting bracket is optional. You can obtain optional accessories from your local dealer.
- The length of the screw may differ for each wall mounting bracket. Be sure to use the proper length.

**CAUTION**

- Unplug the power cord before moving or installing the monitor to avoid electric shock.
- Installing the monitor on the ceiling or on a slanted wall may result in the monitor falling off, which could lead to injury. Use an authorized LG wall mount and contact the local dealer or qualified personnel.
- Applying excessive force when tightening screws may cause damage to the monitor. Damage caused in this way will not be covered by the product warranty.
- To prevent injury, this apparatus must be securely attached to the wall in accordance with the installation instructions. (This only pertains to Australia and New Zealand.)
- Use the wall mounting bracket and screws that conform to VESA standards. Damage caused by the use or misuse of inappropriate components will not be covered by the product warranty.
- When measured from the back of the monitor, the length of each installed screw must be 8 mm or less.



USING THE MONITOR

Press the joystick button, go to Menu → Easy control → Input, and then select the input option.



CAUTION

- Do not press the screen for a prolonged time. This may cause image distortion.
- Do not display a still image on the screen for a prolonged time. This may cause image retention. Use a screensaver if possible.



NOTE

- When connecting the power cord to the outlet, use a grounded (3-hole) power strip or a grounded power outlet.
- The monitor may flicker when turned on in an area where the temperature is low. This is normal.
- Sometimes red, green or blue spots may appear on the screen. This is normal.

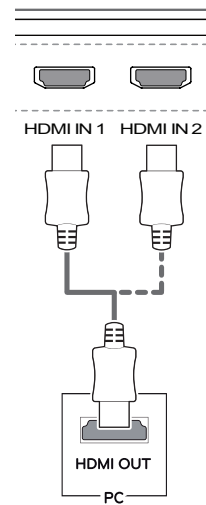
Connecting to a PC

- This monitor supports the *Plug and Play feature.

* Plug and Play: A feature that allows you to add a device to your computer without having to reconfigure anything or install any manual drivers.

HDMI Connection

Transmits digital video and audio signals from your PC to the monitor. Connect your PC to the monitor using the HDMI cable as shown in the illustration below.

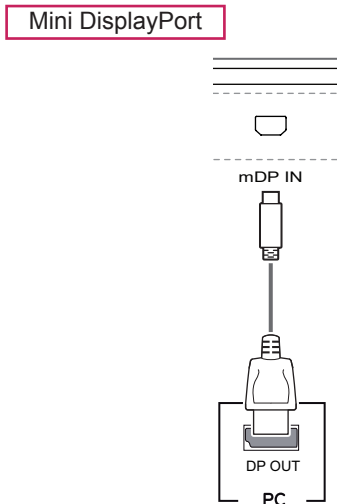
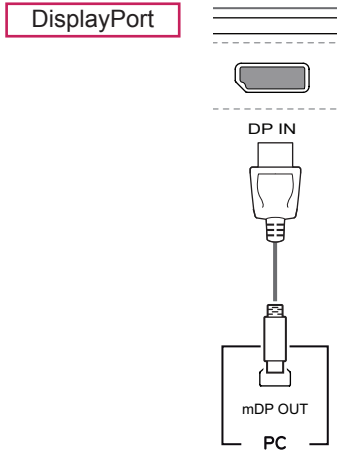


CAUTION

- Make sure to use the supplied HDMI cable of the product. Otherwise, this may cause the device to malfunction.
- Connecting your PC to the monitor using the HDMI cable may cause device compatibility issues.
- Using a DVI to HDMI / DP(DisplayPort) to HDMI cable may cause compatibility issues.

(Mini) DisplayPort Connection

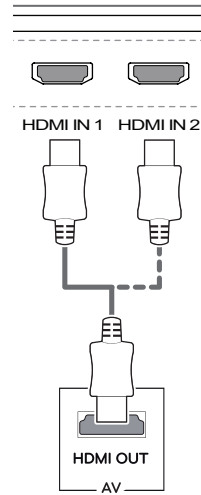
Transmits digital video and audio signals from your PC to the monitor. Connect the monitor to your PC using the displayport cable as shown in the illustration below:



Connecting AV Devices

HDMI Connection

HDMI transmits digital video and audio signals from your AV device to the monitor. Connect your AV device to the monitor using the HDMI cable as shown in the illustration below.



! **NOTE**

- Make sure to use the supplied HDMI cable of the product. Otherwise, this may cause the device to malfunction.
- Using a DVI to HDMI / DP(DisplayPort) to HDMI cable may cause compatibility issues.

! **NOTE**

- There may be no video or audio output depending on the DP (DisplayPort) version of the PC.
- Make sure to use the supplied Mini DisplayPort cable of the product. Otherwise, this may cause the device to malfunction.
- If you use generic cables not certified by LG, the screen may not display or there may be image noises.

Connecting Peripherals

USB Cable connection - PC

The USB port on the product functions as a USB hub.

NOTE

- Make sure to install the most recent Windows OS service pack before using the product.
- Peripheral devices are sold separately.
- A keyboard, mouse, or USB device can be connected to the USB port.



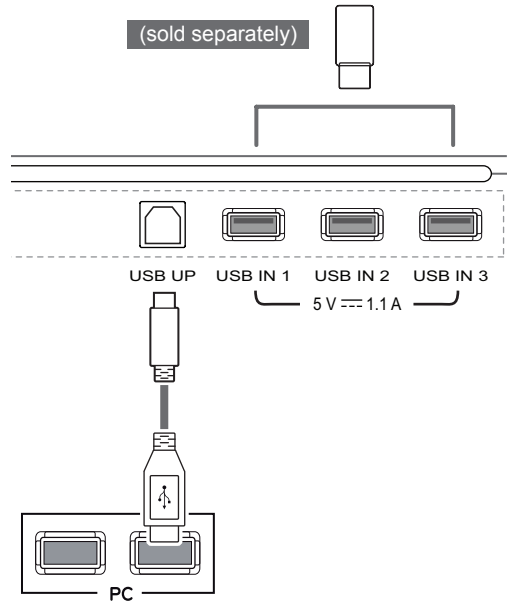
CAUTION

Cautions When Using a USB Device

- A USB device with an automatic recognition program installed, or that uses its own driver, may not be recognized.
- Some USB devices may not be supported or may not work properly.
- It is recommended to use a USB hub or hard disk drive with power supplied. (If the power supply is not adequate, the USB device may not be recognized properly.)

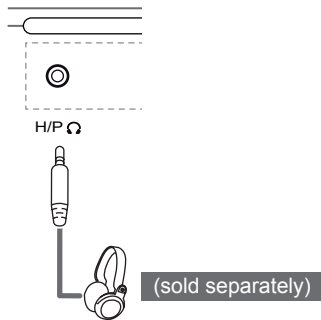
To use USB 3.0, connect the A-B type USB 3.0 cable of the product to the PC.

Peripheral devices connected to the USB IN port can be controlled from the PC.



Connecting Headphones

Connect peripherals to the monitor via the headphones port. Connect as illustrated.



NOTE

- Peripheral devices are sold separately.
- If you use Angled earphones, it may cause a problem with connecting another external device to the monitor. Therefore, it is recommended to use Straight earphones.

- Depending on the audio settings of the PC and external device, headphones and speaker functions may be limited.

INSTALLING THE LG MONITOR SOFTWARE

Insert the software CD included in the product packaging into your PC's CD drive and install the LG Monitor Software.

The installation screen images are for reference only. The actual installation screen images may vary depending on the model.

- 1 Set up Internet Explorer as the default web browser.



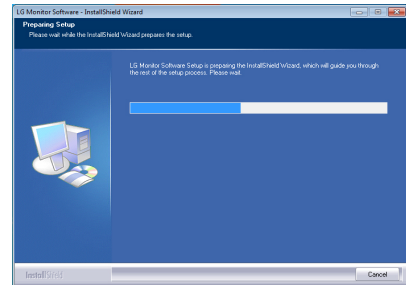
- 2 Click **LG Monitor Software** on the CD's main screen. When the file download window appears, click **Run**. (Although the screen below may differ depending on your operating system or Internet Explorer version, the installation methods are the same.)



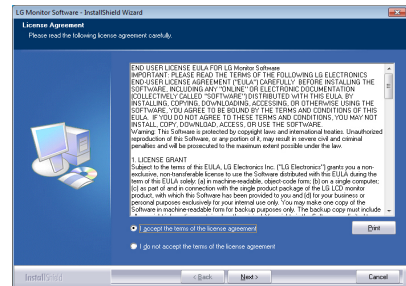

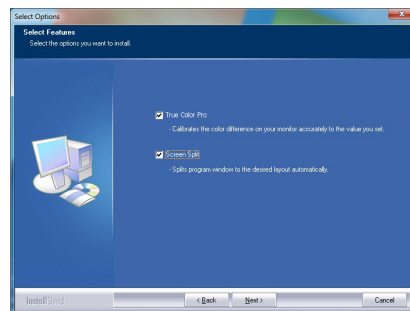
- 3 Follow the instructions to proceed with the installation.



- 4 Check the **I accept the terms of the agreement** checkbox on the License Agreement screen and then click the **Next** button.



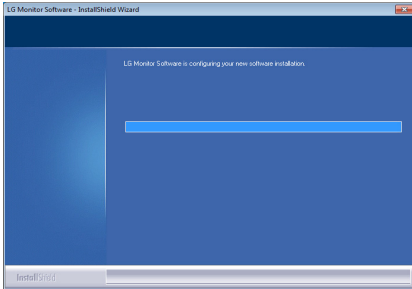

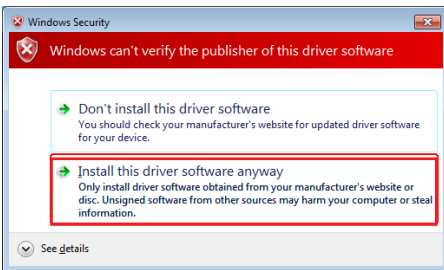
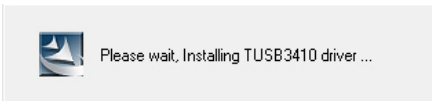
NOTE

- **Screen Split** This program automatically splits the program window as desired.
- **True Color Pro** This program calibrates the precise color output of the monitor to suit your needs.

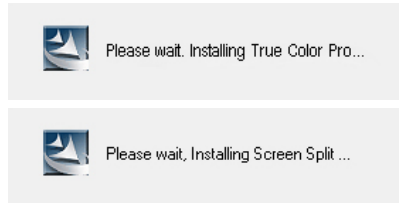
6 The LG Monitor Software starts the installation as shown below:



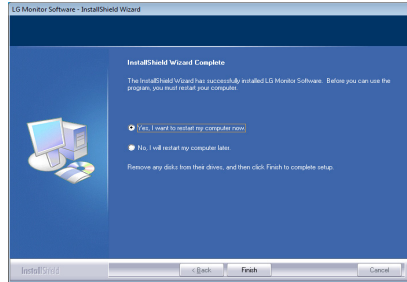
7 If the TUSB3410 driver has not been installed, the driver will be installed automatically. Select **Install this driver software anyway (I)** if the Windows security message is displayed as below.



8 The program you selected on the Select Features page will install automatically.

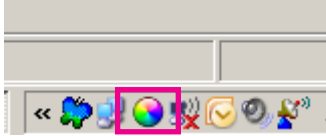


9 When the installation is complete, restart your system.

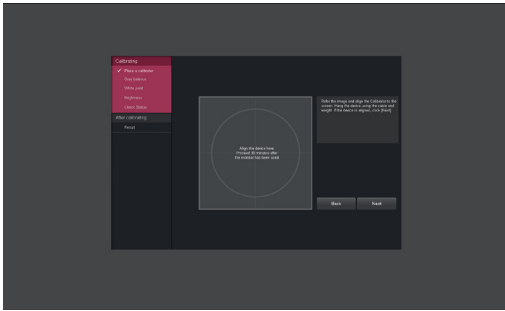


NOTE

- When you run the True Color Pro software, the True Color Pro icon [🌈] appears in the system tray at the right bottom of the PC screen.



- Right-click the True Color Pro icon and select Start Program to start the program.

**CAUTION**

- Once you have completed the monitor calibration with the True Color Pro software, remove the calibrator from the monitor and store it at room temperature away from direct sunlight or put it in the box.
 - If the calibrator's measuring part is exposed to direct sunlight for a long time, this may cause damage to the calibrator.
 - Do not store it in an environment with too low/high temperature and high humidity.
- If any third-party calibration application is already installed on your PC, the image quality may be affected by a conflict between the two applications. For the best performance, it is recommended to uninstall the other calibration application.

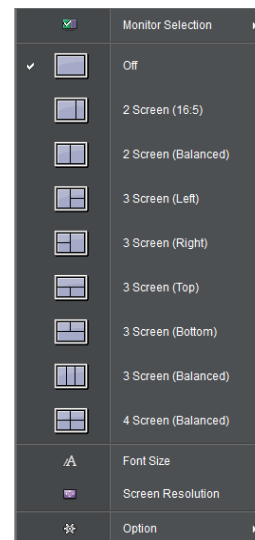
- To use the True Color Pro function, you must purchase the supported calibrator.
- For details on supported calibrators and graphic cards, see the True Color Pro user guide.
- If you have changed the input port, it is recommended that you calibrate the monitor's picture quality again.

NOTE

- When you run Screen Split, the Screen Split icon [🖥️] appears in the system tray at the bottom right of the PC screen.



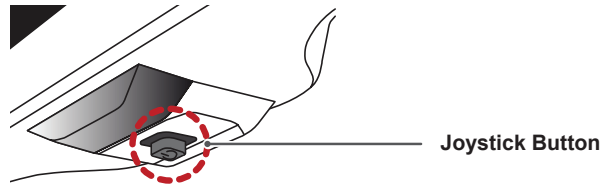

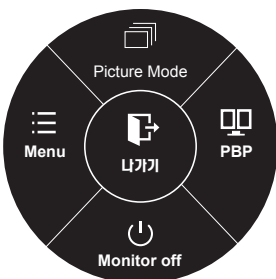
Activating the Main Menu

- **Horizontal Frequency:** The time it takes to display one horizontal line is called the horizontal cycle. If 1 is divided by the horizontal interval, the result is the number of horizontal lines displayed per second. This is called horizontal frequency and is represented by Hz.

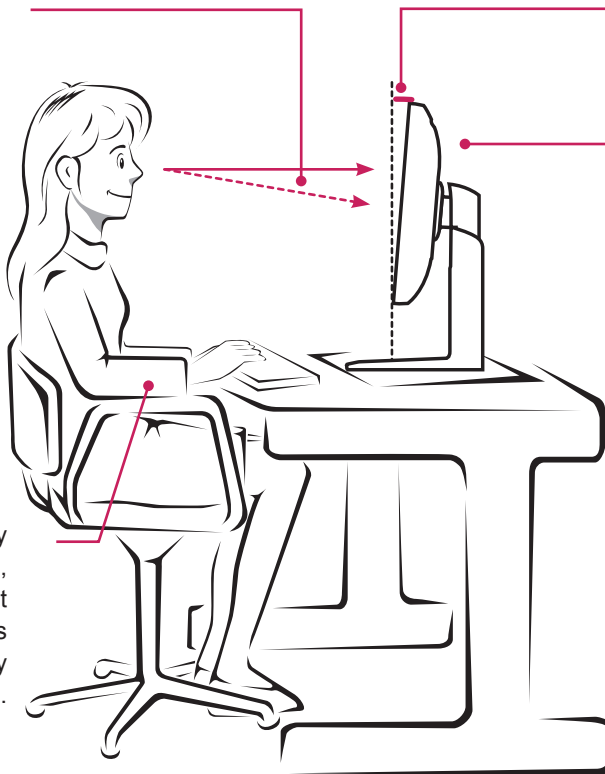
