

# WORTH knowing











Please keep the video machine's guarantee card and receipt safe for warranty purposes.

### **Precautions**

- Read carefully through this manual to familiarise yourself with this highquality televideo.
- Make sure the rating of your household electricity supply matches that shown on the back of the televideo.
- Refer to this chapter and the "Initial installation" chapter (pages 4-9) to help you install and adjust your televideo.

#### Do not.

- expose the televideo to high levels of humidity and heat, to avoid the risk of fire and electric shock.
- open the televideo. Have a qualified technician carry out repairs.
- connect the televideo to the power supply if you have just moved it from a cold to warm environment. This can result in condensation inside the recorder and cause serious damage to the machine and cassettes. Wait around two hours to allow it to reach room temperature.

### Make sure...

- the televideo is placed on a steady, flat surface.
- you place the televideo where there is good ventilation all around.
- you clean the televideo only with a soft, lint-free cloth; do not use aggressive or alcohol-based cleaning agents. (Unplug the set from the mains)
- you disconnect the power supply if the televideo appears to be working incorrectly, is making an unusual sound, has a strange smell, has smoke emitting from it or liquids have got inside it. Have a qualified technician check the televideo.
- you disconnect the power supply and aerial if you will not be using the televideo for a long period or during a thunderstorm.



The power cable must be fitted with a fused plug approved by ASTA or BSI to BS 1362 and provided with a 5A fuse.

The fuse cover must always be securely replaced. If the televideo is not working, the fuse may need replacing (see also "Electrical Connection" on page 4). **(U.K. Only)** 

### For your own safety!



- There are no components in this televideo you can service or repair yourself.
- ◆ Do not open the case of the televideo. Only allow qualified personnel to repair or service your set.



- ◆ This televideo is designed for continuous operation. Switching it off does not disconnect it from the mains (stand-by). To disconnect it from the mains, you have to unplug it.
- Recording any copyright protected material may infringe a copyright.

**NOTE:** If the receiver is moved or placed in a different direction, the main power switch must be switched off for at least 15 minutes in order to take out colour purity errors on the screen.



Before doing anything with the televideo, please read the chapter "Initial installation".




- ◆ The remote control is the principle means of control, but the main playback and record functions are also available on the front of the machine.
- ◆ Press the main power switch on the front panel to turn on the set, then press (1) button.





# Initial INSTALLATION



 For your own safety read the following instructions carefully before attempting to connect this unit to mains.

### Moulded plugs

Should it be necessary to remove a moulded on plug from the mains cable, it should be cut off and replaced with a suitable replacement.

If the terminals in the plug are unmarked or you are in any doubt as to the correct connections, consult a qualified electrician.

The wires in this mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following code

> Blue Neutral Brown Live

As the colour of the wires in the mains lead of this appliance may not correspond with the coloured markings identifying the terminals in your replacement plug proceed as follows.

The wire which is coloured blue must be connected to the terminal which is marked with letter N or coloured black.

The wire which is coloured brown must be connected to the terminal which is marked with letter L or coloured red.

- The moulded plug cannot be used for any other appliance, therefore remove the fuse and dispose immediately and safely to prevent anyone, especially children from plugging it in to a wall socket, which will create a safety hazard.
- After replacement of the fuse in the moulded plug, the fuse cover must be refitted. If the fuse cover is lost a replacement cover must be obtained. The colour of the correct replacement fuse cover is that of the coloured insert in the base of the plug or the colour that is embossed in words in the base of the plug recess or elsewhere on the plug. Always state this colour when ordering a replacement fuse cover.
- Only 5 amp. replacement fuses which are ASTA approved to BS 1362 should be fitted. (U.K. Only)



◆ We recommend the use of a good quality plug.


The buttons to use are marked on the following pages.

### Place your televideo

- horizontally on a flat, steady base so that air can circulate around it for ventilation.
- away from humidity and heat, magnetic fields, such as those from loudspeakers etc., and with no heavy objects placed on top.

### Connecting up the televideo

Switch off all components when connecting or disconnecting cables.



- ◆ Plug the aerial cable into the "ANT" socket of the televideo.
- Make sure the rating of the household mains supply matches the rating shown on the back of the televideo. Now plug in the mains lead.

# Fitting the remote control's batteries



- ◆ Fit the batteries, size 1.5V AAA as shown above.
- Protect your environment by returning used batteries to your dealer. Since batteries contain toxic substances they require special disposal methods.
- Make sure the batteries are always of the same type and age, and remove them from the remote control if you are not using it for a long period.

- ◆ Timer controlled events require the exact time and the correct date.

### Setting time and date





Switch your televideo on.





Call the televideo's MAIN MENU.







Move the cursor down to the "TV TIMER" line.

Confirm by pressing the ENTER/STOP button.









Set the numbers for the exact time and the correct date. Both the On timer and the off timer can be switched ON or OFF but both must be on to enable the timer to function.

DATE : dd/mm/yy TIME : Hour/Min



Store leaving "TV TIMER" Continue with the following page.

### Mistake or change?

Move curson to the position you wish to correct by using  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown \blacktriangleleft/\blacktriangleright$  and RE-ENTER on the remote control.



◆ If you do not set 'DATE' and 'TIME' menu, you can not set 'on/off Timer'.

# **Tuning in stations**



(If you see "AV" instead of "PR", press the ← button)





If not on-screen, call the televideo's "MAIN MENU".

### AUTOMATIC TUNING SYSTEM

Select the PRESET menu at the MAIN MENU.

Place the cursor to "ATSS" with the up/down button.

Press the ENTER button until the tunning screen appears above the PRESET menu.

The cursor will move from left to right on the VHF-L line, then VHF-H, then UHF. Please wait until the EDIT menu appears.

### **EDIT**

### (MAIN MENU → PRESET → EDIT)







The EDIT menus shows you the programme position assignment. You can change this programme position assingment according to your personal preferences.

### **SKIPPING THE CHANNELS**

You can select skip "YES" or "NO" with the SKIP button.

A programme marked with SKIP "YES" is skipped when changing channel using the  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  button .

A skipped programme number selected by NUMBER button 0...9 will be displayed in red.

### **DELETE PROGRAMME POSITION DATA**

Position the cursor to programme number to delete with the up/down. LEFT/RIGHT buttons.

Press the DELETE button. while this is being carried out the "DELETE pro.NO". appears and the "deleted" programme number will transfer to programme no.69 and change skip to "yes".

Any programme that was in No.69 will be transferred to programme No.68.

#### CHANGING THE ORDER OF THE CHANNELS

Position the cursor to programme number to move and press the SWAP button. The "SWAP P01 TO P01" will appear.

Position the cursor to programme number to exchange and press the SWAP button. Two programmes will be exchanged.

### **ENTER A STATION NAME**

Press the stop button at the EDIT MODE.

station name tables appears above the screen.

Select station name in the station name list with  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  button and press ENTER button.

If you want to delete a station name, select "----".

If you can't find the desired name in the list, you can enter your own.

To do so, move the cursor to the "---" and press ENTER button.

Using the  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  button, select the desired, letter, number or blank.

Press the ▶ button to select the next position.

# **Manual Tuning**







You can also call up the PRESET menu at the MAIN MENU.

Press the NUMBER Button 0...9 or PR  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  button to select a programme number you want. The screen will change according to the selected programme number.


### SEARCHING FOR A CHANNEL

Locate the cursor to SEARCH UP or DOWN with 

▲/▼ button at the MANUAL TUNING SCREEN and then press the enter.

The tuning screen will appear and the cursor will move from left to right.

To stop searching, press the MENU button. Pressing and holding down the ◀/▶ button during 3seconds, the band will change as following.



After locating a station, press the menu button. Select station name and memorize programme number with UP/DOWN button or the NUMBER button 0...9.

use ▲/▼ button to set the SKIP to 'NO'
Press the "enter" key when the cursor is put on
the "STORE TO", it is possible to memorise the
searched channel.

If you want to select "SKIP YES" PR. use the digit key.

### **FINE TUNING**

If you are unable to get a good picture or sound because of a poor broadcasting signal, it is possible to adjust the fine tuning.

Select the FINE TUNING at the PRESET MENU and FINE TUNING SCREEN will appear.

Press **◄/** ▶ button to get a good picture and sound you want and to memorize press the ENTER.



# PLAYING cassettes





 Your televideo is swiched on by the main power switch on the front panel and by the ψ button.

# **Playing back**



Load the cassette by pushing it smoothly and squarely into the cassette bay, with its windows pointing up.



Start playback.



Stop playback.



Eject the cassette.



Fast forward or rewind the cassette from stop.



- A smaller picture may be seen while switching from the SEARCH mode to the PLAYBACK mode. This is NOT a sign of malfunction.
- When you load a protected cassette (e.g. pre-recorded film, see page 21) playback starts automatically.
- ◆ PLAY (▶) switches back to **normal playback**.
- ◆ During still, or search, you don't hear the **sound**.
- ◆ If the still picture is jittering, you can steady it by using the VOL/V-LOCK buttons.
- You can reduce horizontal interference stripes resulting from inaccurate tracking (when playing tapes of poor quality or recorded on other machines) by using the PR/TRK buttons during playback or try auto tracking using A.TRK
- ◆ After approx. 5 minutes in still, the cassette plays back automatically.
- ◆ Search and picture functions -page 20.

# PLAYING cassette

### Still





Still picture from playback.

Each press of the button advances the picture one frame.

PLAY ( ) switches back to normal playback.

### Variable picture search





Starting from playback you can control search speed in 2 steps either forwards ( ) or backwards ( ). Press repeatedly.





PLAY ( ) switches back to normal playback.

## Continuous play





Call the televideo's "MAIN MENU".











Move the cursor down to the "AUTO REPEAT ON" line.

Confirm.





Cassettes with...

...open safety hole: play  $\rightarrow$  end of cassette  $\rightarrow$  rewind  $\rightarrow$  play...



# Simple recording



## One touch recording-OTR

Choose the station you want and press the button once for every 30 minutes of programme you wish to record.

Stop your recording.

 Before setting OTR, MAKE SURE THAT .....
The cassette tape has the safety tab.
The tape is long enough to record the program.

- ◆ During recording you can switch the **screen off** pressing ♂ button.
- ◆ If you want to record from a source connected to your video see page 26.
- Even if you turn off the POWER, REC/OTR will continue for the rest of the time
- ◆ You can release the OTR mode by pressing "STOP" during REC mode.
- ♦ The video stops automatically, if pause exceeds five minutes.
- ♦ If the display shows "AV" instead of "PR" press ⊕ button.
- Search and picture functions -pages 20.


◆ For timer recordings, clock, date, and stations must be set correctly (pages 7-9).

# Timer recording using VideoPlus+



Call the VideoPlus+ menu.

From your TV magazine, type in the number next to the programme you want to record.



Select to record ONCE, DAILY(1x), WEEKLY(2x)

Confirm



If you want to extend the recording time by 1 minutes steps.





Press the menu button to confirm.



You can switch your televideo off.

(Do not use the main power button on the front panel of the set.) The televideo will switch on and off automatically to record the timer event.

- If you do not set the clock, when you press the VideoPlus+ button to set the timer recording, this set automatically changes to the "TV TIMER" menu.
- ◆ If you don't have the VideoPlus+ numbers see page 17 for the normal timer.
- ♦ If you have made a mistake, move back to the relevant position with the ◀ button and change the setting.
- ◆ During recording you can switch the screen off pressing ♂ button.
- ◆ The screen will indicate if the station is not programmed (pages7-9) or if the station has no VideoPlus+ guide number (pages 24).
- ◆ Should programmings **overlap**, you get a warning.
- ♦ In the case of error messages correct the input or check the date and time on your televideo (also check your TV guide).






### When record time overlaps

When setting the Programmable Timer, be careful not to overlap the preset times.

If you happen to overlap the preset Programs, the END Time has priority and the overlapped Programmes cannot be recorded.



### NOTE:

### MAKE SURE THAT ...

The clock is adjusted to current time

The safety tab is not missing on the cassette tape.

The tape is long enough to record the desired programme.

\* If you program events without setting the time, it will be automatically returned to "TV TIMER" mode.

If you program events that overlap, at least one of your events will not record correctly.

If the start time you want to enter does not correspond to the PDC-time or if you just want to record a part of a programme, you have to switch off PDC. Otherwise the recorder won't record.

### Watching programmes while recording (Only 2 Tuners Model)



Just switch over to another programme using PR/PAGE  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  or the NUMBER BUTTONS.





To check the recording switch to the recorder (and back) using the MONITOR/A.TRK button.

- ◆ For timer recordings, clock, date, and stations must be set correctly (page 7-9).
- ◆Load a cassette with its safety tab in place (see page 21) and with sufficient free space for the recording.
- ◆ To enter station numbers using the number buttons, type double digit numbers quickly.

Call the televideo's "MENU", choose "RECORD TIMER"

select a free timer memory.

If necessary erase a memory with clear button.

- station number (or AV, e.g. for satellite stations) and

You can switch your televideo off.

(Do not use the main power button on the front panel of the set.)

The televideo will switch on and off automatically to record the timer event.



- ♦ If you have made a mistake, move to the position you want to change using the 
  ✓ buttons and change the setting.
- ◆ The recorder will **eject** cassettes which have the safety tab removed (page 21).
- ◆ During recording you can switch the screen off pressing ♂ button.
- ◆ Press ७ to use your televideo in the meantime.

# Timer Review - erasing or changing







Call the televideo's "MENU", choose "RECORD TIMER".

Select the programming to erase or change.

**If you want to erase** this programming press button CLEAR

**If you wish to make changes :** Confirm.

Move to the position you want to change using the  $\blacktriangledown/\blacktriangledown$ ,  $\blacktriangleleft/\blacktriangleright$  buttons.

Change the settings using the ▲/▼ or number buttons.



If all setting are ok, exit the menu.

# RECORDING c a s s e t t e s



- PDC will not operate if you are not watching the programme you have set on the timer record function, although you set timer recording using PDC function your TV/VCR does not operates 'PDC timer recording' but operates 'normal timer recording'.
- ◆ If you wish to record from a satellite receiver select under "PR" the satellite programme location or AV (depending on the connection with the antenna cable, the SCART-cable). Leave the satellite tuner switched on and to the programme you want.

# MORE functions





Your televideo automatically sets electronic marker (index) at the beginning of each recording and timer recording. It is these markers which the index function detects.

# Accessing the beginning of the next recording





Press the button depending on the number of recordings (index marks) that you wish to wind forward.
E.g. 3x for 3 recordings ahead.

### Accessing the beginning of the previous recording





Press the button depending on the number of recordings (index marks) that you wish to wind backwards. E.g. 3x for 3 recordings back.

### Resetting the counter to zero





Reset the counter.

# Accessing counter zero position





The video will wind to the position 0:00:00 and stop.

When you have finished recording or playing, you can easily return to the point marked in this way.

### Cassettes





Use only good quality tape cassettes with the VHS logo.

- ◆ Keep cassettes away from excessive moisture or dust, magnetic and electrical fields (loudspeakers and computer monitors, for example).
- ◆ Always wind the tape to the beginning when you have finished. Store with the full spool at the bottom and with the cassette in its cover.

You can protect your precious recordings from being wiped by breaking out the safety tab on the side of the cassette (some cassettes have a slide).

Should you wish to re-use the tape after removing the tab, cover the hole with adhesive tape.

### V-Lock





When changing to STILL mode while the tape is playback, the vertical synchronization may sometimes be shaked according to the tape condition. At this time, use this key for the better picture screen.

### Child Lock



Choose "MISCELLANEOUS" of "MAIN MENU".

You can prevent use of the TV set without the remote control.

The set is child-locked after you input any four figure secret number subsequently the TV picture will be overlaid with the words child locked and the sound will be muted.

### Mute

Pressing the MUTE( ♥ ) button once turns the sound off. The sound returns if button is pressed once more. The mute maintains when you press PR ▲/▼

# Picture type selection


When you press the NORMAL button repeatedly you can call up three picture setting;

for NORMAL 1 (hard picture), NORMAL 2 (soft picture). FAVOURITE (adjustable picture).

- ◆ The last set value is automatically stored in FAVOURITE mode.
- ◆ Note that if you set the brightness and contrast values too low, the on-screen-display become dark.

# Changing on-screen displays





◆ You can program your televideo so that it switches on and/or off (with the selected station) at a time you want.

# MORE functions

### **Television timer**





Call up the televideo's main "MAIN"





Choose "TV TIMER".

### Type in:

- the switch on time
- the station number
- the switch off time

N.B, Ensure on timer  $\overline{\text{OFF}}$  is set to on and  $\overline{\text{OFF}}$  timer OFF is set to on.

Store leaving the menu.

You can switch your televideo off (stand-by) (Do not use the main power button on the front panel of the set.)

# POWER

### **Snooze automatic**





You can set your televideo to automatically switch off after a period of 10 to 120 minutes.

Press the button repeatedly.



- In TV mode, if the broadcasing signal is not continuously present, for approx. 30minutes, the TV receiver will automatically power off.
- ◆ The "TV TIMER" only works if no "VIDEO TIMER" is programmed.
- Adjusting the "ON TIMER" once will cause the televideo to switch on every day at the same time (till you clear or change the setting.)
- ◆ You can programme "ON TIME" (including "PR") and/or "OFF TIME".

### M 0 R functions





If you wish to use the VideoPlus+system for programming timer recordings, you must first allocate the 3-digit VideoPlus+quide numbers to each corresponding station number.

These are given in those TV guides that publish the VideoPlus+numbers.

### VideoPlus+ quide numbers

Call up the televideo's "MAIN MENÚ".





Choose "MISCELLANEOUS".





Choose "VIDEOPLUS PRESET".



Type in the guide number corresponding to each station (number) you have stored. E.g. if you have stored BBC1 on 01 then put 001 against 01 and if you have stored BBC2 on 02 then put 002 against 02 however. If you wish to record a satellite programme using videoplus+ you have to insert each code against the programme no E.G. If you have SKY1 under station number "TV PR" 06 then type in the guide number for SKY1 which is 101, against 06.

### Teletext

#### SWITCHING TELETEXT ON/OFF

Press the TELETEXT button ( ), the index page viewed last will appear. Press the TELETEXT button to return to the TV mode.

#### COLOUR BUTTONS IN TOP/FLOF TELETEXT

A red, green, yellow and cyan field is shown at the bottom of the screen.

If TOP of FLOF teletex (FASTEXT) is transmitted by the station. pressing the corresponding colour button on the remote controller, you can select the desired page easily.

#### SELECTING PAGES

The NUMBER button 0...9 are used to enter a page number.

The selected page number appears at the top of the screen and the page appears after a short time.

The UP/DOWN buttons incerase or decrease the current page number by 1.

#### **INDES PAGE**

You can switch directly to the programme preview (with TOP text) or the overview page of the station you are currently viewing by pressing the INDEX (FI) button.

#### PAGE HOLD

Several sub pages can be combined under a page number and are scrolled at an interval determined by the TV station.

The presence of sub pages is indicated by, for example, 3/6 beneath the time, which means that you are looking at the 3<sup>rd</sup> page of a total of 6 pages.

If you want to look at a subpage for a longer period of time, press the HOLD (III) button. The contents of the subpage shown are kept on the screen and no longer updated or switched to other subpages. Pressing the HOLD button again, the current subpage appear.

#### CALLING UP SUBPAGE DIRECTLY

Pressing the SUBPAGE ( ) button "Page no/..."

appears at the bottom of the screen. Enter the subpage number that you want to call up with the NUMBER button 0...9, for example the 2nd page. sequence 0002. The desired subpage is sought and displayed. To exit, press SUBPAGE (🖼) button again.

#### WATCHING TELEVISION DURING TELETEXT MODE

Some pages are continually updated, for example, stock market reports, sports announcements, and the latest news. If you want to watch TV and stay informed at the same time, press CANCEL ( ) button.

The regular programme is still visible and the the teletext symbol (
) appears at the top of the screen. Pressing the CANCEL button again, the teletext page appears with the update information.

### REVEAL ANSWER

This function can be used on certain pages to reveal the solution of riddles. Press the REVEAL button ( ) to reveal a hidden answer and press again to hide it.

#### TV/TELETEXT [7]

Watch the TV programme and the Teletext pages simultaneously. The next press returns to the normal display.

#### CONTRAST AND BRIGHTNESS CONTROL IN TELETEXT MODE

Press the MENU button in teletext mode, the contrast and brightness control menu will be displayed in the bottom of the screen. You can adjust contrast and brightness using the corresponding colour button on the remote controller.

#### DOUBLING CHARACTER SIZE

Repeatedly pressing the SIZE button ( ) doubles the character size in the following order:

Upper half of the page → LOWER half of the page → Return to normal size.

### Teletext character set



Choose "CHARACTER SET WEST" press ◀/▶ buttons.



# CONNECTIONS and copying





◆ Switch off all components when connecting or disconnecting cables.

### Copying





To copy to your televideo **from another video machine**, connect the two machines with a cable between their AV sockets and select as programme "AV1" (EURO AV, SCART)

Using the - button.

Set the other video machine to playback and your Daewoo machine to record.

Picture and sound of the selected station is always available on the EURO AV (SCART) socket, e.g. to record with another VCR.

On the other video, select its AV input and set the machine to record.

Switch your televideo to play back at the position you want copying to start.



### Scart socket

This is used to connect: a VCR, a Camcoder and a video game console or satellite TV receiver. In most case, the set changes automatically to AV mode, when the VCR connected is in playback mode. If not, press the AV button on the remote controller.

The AV will be displayed on the screen with the current programme number.

In AV mode, you can change the TV programme number with the  $\triangle/\nabla$  button or the NUMBER button 0-9. Note that it's impossible to control the functions excepting the volume control and mute function in the AV mode. You must turn the external equipment off to return to the TV mode.


