Step 1: Position the ramp approximately the ramps length out from step, van or platform. Stand ramp up on end with the open ends down and the handle side toward you. Reach down and lift first half of the ramp toward the step or landing area and set it down on top of support. Make sure hook is pressed firmly against step.

Step 2: Open top half of ramp.
Step 3: Unfold top half of ramp towards you and once again make sure that ramp hooks are pressed firmly against landing area.

Next pick up left section of ramp. Step A, with hinges on ramp facing down, first lower ramp so that hinges line up with the bolts on the right section of ramp. Then Step B, slide hinges of left section of ramp into bolts so that both sections are attached again.

## READ BEFORE USING!

2. NEVER exceed a slope greater than 2 " on 12 " with an occupied chair or scooter.
3. ALWAYS make sure that top of ramp is secured on step or landing before using. It may be necessary to anchor top of ramp to landing surface with steel pins provided.

Acceptable grade for portable ramp use by occupied chairs and scooters with a qualified assistant.
3:12 SLOPE (14.5deg)
For loading UNOCCUPIED chairs and scooters.


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
